UNIVERSITY ADMINISTRATION



DR. JULIO FRENK

UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT UNIVERSIDAD NACIONAL AUTÓNOMA DE MÉXICO, 1979

Dr. Julio Frenk, a noted leader in global public health and a renowned scholar and academic, was named the sixth president of the University of Miami in April 2015. He assumed his leadership post on August 16, 2015.

Prior to joining the University of Miami, Dr. Frenk was Dean of the Faculty at the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health since January 2009. While at Harvard, he was also the T & G Angelopoulos Professor of Public Health and International Development, a joint appointment with the Harvard Kennedy School of Government.

Dr. Frenk served as the Minister of Health of Mexico from 2000 to 2006. He pursued an ambitious agenda to reform the nation's health system and introduced a program of comprehensive universal health insurance, known as Seguro Popular, which expanded access to health care for tens of millions of uninsured Mexicans.

Dr. Frenk was the founding director-general of the National Institute of Public Health in Mexico, one of the leading institutions of health education and research in the developing world. In 1998 Dr. Frenk joined the World Health Organization (WHO) as executive director in charge of Evidence and Information for Policy, WHO's first-ever unit explicitly charged with developing a scientific foundation for health policy to achieve better outcomes.

He also served as a senior fellow in the global health program of the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation and as president of the Carso Health Institute in Mexico City. He is the founding chair of the board of the Institute for Health Metrics and Evaluation at the University of Washington. He also co-chaired the Commission on the Education of Health Professionals for the 21st Century, which published its influential report in the leading journal The Lancet in 2010, triggering a large number of follow-up initiatives throughout the world.

Dr. Frenk holds a medical degree from the National Autonomous University of Mexico, as well as a master of public health and a joint doctorate in Medical Care Organization and in Sociology from the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor. He has been awarded honorary doctorates from several institutions of higher learning. In September of 2008, Dr. Frenk received the Clinton Global Citizen Award for changing "the way practitioners and policy makers across the world think about health."

He is a member of the U.S. Institute of Medicine, American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and National Academy of Medicine of Mexico.

In addition to his scholarly works, which include more than 140 articles in academic journals, as well as many books and book chapters, he has written two best-selling novels for youngsters explaining the functions of the human body.



DR. MARVIN DAWKINS

FACULTY REPRESENTATIVE EDWARD WATERS COLLEGE, 1970

Dr. Marvin Dawkins, a distinguished professor in the Department of Sociology at the University of Miami, is in his fifth year as the Faculty Athletics Representative. He was named to the post in April 2012, replacing Clyde McCoy after his 17 years of service in that role.

In his FAR post, Dawkins is responsible for ensuring the academic integrity of students participating in University athletic programs and helping to oversee institutional control of the Department of Athletics. The Faculty Athletics Representative serves as a liaison between the University and the athletic department. This individual is the University's voting delegate to the ACC and represents UM with the NCAA and ACC.

Dawkins received his doctorate from Florida State and completed his postdoctoral research fellowships at Howard University and The Johns Hopkins University. He previously served on the faculties of the University of Maryland, Old Dominion University and the University of Wisconsin-Parkside.

His research focuses on issues of race and social equity in such areas as education, career aspirations and mobility, substance abuse prevention, and sports. He has published widely in these areas, including his most recent article titled "Race and Pathways to Power in the National Football League" (with Jomills H. Braddock and Erica Smith), which appears in *American Behavioral Scientist* (2012). His research on golf includes book chapters, scholarly articles, and the book *African American Golfers During the Jim Crow Era* (Praeger 2000), coauthored with Graham C. Kinloch. Dawkins was recently appointed to the United States Golf Association Museum Committee and is currently completing a study on the media treatment of black golfers from the Jim Crow era to the present.



BLAKE JAMES

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS MINNESOTA STATE-MANKATO, 1992

Since taking over as the University of Miami's Director of Athletics in 2013, Blake James has led a transformation at Miami on the field, in student-athlete support, in facilities and in student academic achievement.

In 2015-2016, Miami was the only school in NCAA Division I athletics to have its football team play in a bowl game, men's and women's basketball teams reach the NCAA tournament and baseball team advance to the College World Series. Overall, Miami had 10 sports programs advance to postseason competition to secure its highest finish in the Learfield Directors' Cup standings in twelve years, an indication of broad-based athletic department success.

Miami sold out its entire men's basketball season ticket allotment in 2015-2016, marking the first time in Hurricane athletics history that a team has sold out on a season-ticket basis. For fans who chose to watch the Canes on media platforms, the Hurricanes' live streaming video platform took a giant leap, as Miami aired more than 115 live events on ESPN3 – a figure that ranked first among all ACC schools.

In the classroom, three Miami teams were honored nationally for being among the top 10 percent in the Academic Progress Rates (APR) during the 2015-2016 academic year. In addition, eight Hurricane teams scored 990 or better out of a possible 1,000 points - men's cross country (1000), men's diving (1000), men's tennis (991), golf (1000), soccer (991) and women's swimming (996), women's tennis (992) and women's track and field (994).

In the department's continuing efforts to better support student-athletes and coaches, the Miami Hurricane Club set an all-time annual fund record of \$12 million raised for the Student-Athlete Excellence Fund—an increase of 21 percent over the prior year. The Hurricane Club also announced a record 8,100 active members in May 2016, an 80 percent increase in active membership since 2010.

Under James' leadership, Miami has completed several facility enhancements, beginning with the opening of the Schwartz Center for Athletic Excellence, the completion of the student-athlete training table, fueling station, dining hall, new artificial and natural playing surfaces and lights on the Greentree Practice Fields and a center-hung scoreboard inside the Hurricanes' basketball arena. Prior to the 2015 athletics season, James was instrumental in helping Miami strike one of the largest apparel deals in the country with adidas.

Prior to being named AD, James served Miami athletics in the roles of Interim AD and Senior Associate AD for Development and Ticket Operations, where he oversaw the day-to-day operations of development, ticket sales and ticket operations. He also was a member of the Hurricanes' senior staff and provided sport supervision.

James came to UM after spending seven years the University of Maine, where he first served as Senior Associate Athletic Director before serving as Director of Athletics from 2005 to 2010. During his tenure at Maine, athletics experienced tremendous success, including three trips to the Frozen Four for the men's ice hockey program and NCAA playoff berths for football, baseball (two), women's basketball and softball. Additionally, James implemented a comprehensive \$17 million facility improvement plan, which included an indoor practice facility and numerous other facility upgrades and renovations. Academically, the program flourished, earning the conference academic cup twice and student-athletes maintaining better than a 3.0 GPA.

Prior to his stint at Maine, James worked in athletic development at Providence College, where he established the "Friars Forever" campaign and the Friar Athletic Fund.

James is no stranger to South Florida, beginning his athletic career with the University of Miami, working in ticket sales, corporate sales and athletic development. In 1995, he was hired as Miami's Director of Ticket Sales, serving in that capacity until 1997, when he was named an athletic development officer at the University of Nebraska. He returned to Miami in 1998 as the Director of Major Gifts and Corporate Sales and was promoted to the Director of Athletic Development at Miami in 2000 before moving on to Providence in 2002.

James graduated from Minnesota State University - Mankato with a Bachelor's Degree in Marketing in 1992 and later received his Master's degree in Sports Administration from St. Thomas University in 1994.

He and his wife, Kelly, have two children: daughter, Haley, and son, Ryan.



JENNIFER STRAWLEY

DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS SENIOR WOMAN ADMINISTRATOR PENNSYLVANIA, 1998

Jennifer Strawley joined the University of Miami on June 18, 2012 and currently serves as Deputy Director of Athletics and Senior Women's Administrator.

As a member of the department's executive leadership team, Strawley provides strategic direction for the department and assists the Athletic Director with the day-to-day operations. She is the sport administrator for football, women's basketball and women's tennis. She leads the department's strategic planning initiatives, policy development and implementation, coordination of department and coaches meetings and gender equity and inclusion initiatives. Strawley oversees the areas of sports medicine, student-athlete drug testing, academic services, compliance, student-athlete development, and serves as a liaison to various campus groups, as well as to the ACC and the NCAA.

Strawley played a key role in the hiring of head football coach Mark Richt, serving on the selection committee. In addition, she was instrumental in the development of Miami's Celebration of Women's Athletics and spearheaded the Department's "It's on Us Campaign."

Actively engaged in intercollegiate athletics nationally, Strawley has served on various committees within the NCAA and the ACC. Strawley currently serves on the ACC Television Committee, the ACC Women's Basketball foresight committee, the ACC Equity Committee, the ACC Women's Tennis Committee, the ACC Infractions and Sportsmanship Review Committee, the ACC Football Schedulers Group, the NCAA Division I Council Football Recruiting Ad Hoc Working Group and the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Oversight Advancement Committee.

Prior to UM, Strawley concluded her second tour with the NCAA as the Director of Academic and Membership Affairs. In this role, Strawley was instrumental in providing leadership in the areas of academic governance and development of academic policy. She was the staff liaison to the NCAA Division I Committee on Academic Performance and the NCAA Division I Academic Cabinet. Strawley served on the senior management team and was involved in a variety of other internal operations, including coordinating the internal operations for the department's senior management team.

Strawley rejoined the NCAA after serving as the Associate Athletics Director for Intercollegiate Sport Programs and Senior Woman Administrator at Columbia University from 2007-10. While at Columbia, she oversaw numerous varsity sport programs including football and was the athletics program liaison for gender equity and diversity initiatives. Strawley was a member of the department's Executive Management Team.

Prior to her tenure at Columbia, Strawley was the Director of Membership Services and Student-Athlete Reinstatement at the NCAA. In this role, she provided oversight of the student-athlete reinstatement process and was instrumental in the implementation of the student first philosophy. Strawley served as a liaison to numerous NCAA committees and task forces, including the NCAA Divisions I, II and III Student-Athlete Reinstatement Committees, the NCAA Olympic Sports Liaison Committee, and the working group appointed to review trends in initial eligibility.

Strawley first joined the NCAA in 1998 as an enforcement services intern. She is a 1998 graduate of the University of Pennsylvania where she earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in history. During her time at Pennsylvania, she was a two-year captain for the Quakers' softball team. Strawley was inducted into the William Tennent High School Athletics Hall of Fame in January of 2014.

TIM WISE

Tim Wise is in his sixth year as the Senior Associate Athletic Director for Facilities and Event Operations at the University of Miami. Wise joined the UM staff in June 2012.

Wise was an event operations manager intern at Michigan State University from August 1998 to May 1999. His first position upon graduation from college was as a conference coordinator at the University of South Carolina from December 1996 to January 1998.

Wise has extensive experience working at NCAA and conference championship events. At Wisconsin he served on the department's Diversity Integration Group and was the representative to the City of Madison and UW Campus Joint Southeast Campus Area Committee. In the past, he served on Connecticut's Environmental Compliance Team as well as the schools Environmental Policy Advisory Council. He also served on the NCAA Woman of the Year Selection Committee and the NCAA Minority Opportunities and Interests Committee, three years as the vice chair. Wise earned the University of Denver Center for Multicultural Excellence Outstanding Staff Award in 2002-03.

He is a member of the Collegiate Event and Facility Management Association and was named to the Board of Directors in September 2011. Wise is currently serving as the President of the association for 2015-16 and was previously 1st Vice President 2014-15, 2nd Vice President 2013-14, and 3rd Vice President 2012 -13. Wise also has membership in the Minority Opportunities Athletic Association, the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics and the Stadium Managers Association.

Jason Layton joined the University of Miami in December of 2014 as the department's Senior Associate Athletics Director for Communications and Sales.

In his current position, Layton is responsible for managing the department's ticket sales, marketing, communication, website and social/digital media areas.

Layton's primary focus centers on generating revenue through ticket sales, marketing, corporate sponsorships, promotions and licensing and multi-media rights.

Since his arrival, Miami has already seen exceptional growth in ticket sales and digital streaming with ESPN3.

Under his watch, Miami has seen an increased level of season ticket sales in football and men's basketball, while transitioning to a new ticketing system in Paciolan.

Under Layton's guidance, Miami sold out its entire 2015-16 men's basketball season ticket allotment, marking the first time in Hurricane athletics history that a team has sold out its entire season ticket allotment.

Layton also serves as the primary point of contact with ESPN in establishing the department's new digital network. During the 2015-16 athletics campaign, Miami aired over 115 live events on ESPN3 – a figure that ranked first among all ACC schools.

Layton, a Florida native, arrives in Miami after spending the previous two years at Colorado State University where he served as the department's Senior Associate Athletics Director for Sales and Marketing.

During his time in Fort Collins, Colorado, Layton's ticket sales plans drove double-digit increases in football, volleyball, men's basketball and women's basketball revenue and tickets sold.

In addition, Layton managed the implementation of the Mountain West Digital Network for CSU online streams, which achieved more than 70,000 views during its first year.

His oversight of CSURams.com saw a complete redesign. Under Layton's redesign, CSURams.com included a fan loyalty rewards program that rewarded fans for social activity, ticketing attendance and sponsorship engagement.

Before his arrival at Colorado State, Layton spent 13 years with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. In his 13 years with the club, he handled a variety of responsibilities from ticketing and luxury suite operations to advertising and business management.

Layton began his career with the Buccaneers as a customer service representative in 1999 before elevating to the role of Senior Director of Business Administration in 2011.

Craig Anderson begins his third year as the department's Senior Associate Athletic Director for Compliance in 2016.

In his current capacity, Anderson oversees the Hurricanes' five-person compliance office and serves as the departmental liason between the NCAA and all rules educational matters.

Anderson was hired as Associate AD for Compliance at the University of Miami on Feb. 27, 2013. He came to UM after spending three years as the Assistant Athletics Director for Compliance at NC State.

At UM, Anderson is responsible for managing all aspects of the compliance unit's effort, including educating the athletics department and university staff, boosters, coaches and student-athletes about NCAA and ACC regulations. In addition, he is responsible for overseeing the compliance monitoring systems related to recruiting, certification and eligibility. Anderson is also the Sport Supervisor for the women's golf program.

At NC State, he was charged with many roles, including monitoring all amateurism and eligibility issues, serving as the liaison to the academic support program for studentathletes, monitoring all initial eligibility/continuing eligibility processes and conducting NCAA rules education for coaches, staff, boosters and general public.

Before moving to NC State, Anderson served in a nearly three-year role as Director of Compliance at the University of Virginia from September 2007-July 2010. While in Charlottesville, he assisted with eligibility process, interpreted and researched NCAA rules for coaches and institutional staff members, monitored camps and clinics for all sports, coordinated annual coaches certification exams and coordinated transfer issues.

Anderson began his career as an Assistant Director of Compliance, spending 14 months at UNLV from July 2006-September 2007.

SENIOR ASSOCIATE AD DEVELOPMENT MIAMI, 2005

Jesse Marks was promoted to Senior Associate Athletic Director for Development in August 2016. He was previously promoted to associate AD for development in November 2012 following two years as assistant athletics director for major gifts.

Under the guidance of Director of Athletics Blake James, Marks is responsible for all development operations for the department of athletics, including campaign oversight, major giving, annual fund, donor stewardship, event hospitality and coordination with central advancement efforts.

Since Marks' arrival in 2010, the Hurricane Club has seen significant growth in major giving and annual giving participation. Following the department's restructure in 2010, the Hurricane Club's development results have increased significantly across the board. Major Giving is up more than 70 percent since 2010, including eight gifts over \$1 million and more than 35 gifts in excess of \$250,000 or more. In 2013, UM opened the fully funded \$18-million, 30,000-square foot Schwartz Center for Athletic Excellence featuring new football, academic, and athletic training facilities as well as a Gallery of Champions showcasing the proud championship tradition of UM Athletics. Additionally in 2013, The newly created Football Victory Fund has raised over \$3 million to enhance the football practice facilities including, new artificial and grass fields, new lighting and a training table dining hall for all 400 plus student-athletes.

Annual giving has also seen unprecedented growth through extensive marketing, philanthropic re-branding and digital strategy. Since 2010, Hurricane Club Membership has increased by more than 84 percent to an all-time record of 8,076 active members. The Hurricane Club is consistently recognized nationwide for their use of cutting edge technology and unique campaigns to drive annual support.

Marks has been a part of two major capital campaigns at the University of Miami. The Momentum Campaign (2000-2008) which raised over \$1 billion for the University. Athletics exceeded its goal of \$68 million and raised more than \$85 million dollars. Currently, Marks is leading athletics efforts for university wide \$1.6 billion Momentum2 Campaign. UM Athletics has raised over \$110 million to date and is on pace to exceed their goal of \$125 million by the end of 2016.

Prior to his return to UM Athletics, Marks served as assistant director of development at Wake Forest University, where he managed relationships for over 150 athletic donors in the southeast, including South Carolina, Georgia, North Carolina and Florida. Prior to Wake Forest, Marks was as assistant thletics director for development at Florida International University, where he managed all fundraising operations related to the opening of their new football stadium in 2008.

Marks is an active member of the National Association of Athletic Development Directors (NAADD) and is an adjunct professor in the School of Education Sports Administration Program teaching Sport Promotions and Sales.

A two-time Miami graduate, Marks earned his bachelor's degree in 2005 and his master's degree in 2008.

HEAD COACH MARY-FRANCES MONROE

FIFTH SEASON | UCLA, 2003

Hometown: Northport, N.Y. | Head Coach: Miami (2013-present) and Albany (2006-12)

Mary-Frances Monroe completed her fourth season at the helm of a rising Atlantic Coast Conference soccer power in Coral Gables, Fla., in 2016.

The Hurricanes have tallied a trio of top-five victories with Monroe at the helm, defeating third-ranked Notre Dame, 2-0, in 2013, downing No. 14/4 Notre Dame, 1-0, in double overtime in 2015 and knocking off second-ranked Virginia, 2-1, in 2016.

Miami posted a 10-8-1 mark in 2016, marking the seventh time in program history the team won double-digit games, including the fourth time in a 15-year span. The Hurricanes also went 5-5 in ACC play, setting a new program record for conference victories and winning three ACC matches in a row for the first time. Led by goalkeeper Phallon Tullis-Joyce, one of three Hurricanes to earn NSCAA College Player of the Week during the season, Miami set new program records for fewest goals against (16) and lowest goals against average (0.82).

The 2016 season saw the Hurricanes defeat multiple ranked teams (No. 2 Virginia and No. 25 Virginia Tech) for the first time since 2012. Miami, picked last in the ACC preseason poll, finished in the top half of the conference and earned the No. 7 seed in the ACC Championship, where it played to a 1-1 road tie at No. 14 Clemson, the second seed, before falling in penalty kicks. In addition, of the 332 Division I teams, Miami was one of just 30 to win at least five more games in 2016 than it did in 2015.

Also in 2016, Gracie Lachowecki became the second Hurricane to earn First Team All-ACC recognition and the second to garner NSCAA Second Team All-Region distinction. Kristina Fisher became the second Hurricane to make the ACC All-Freshman Team and Emily Auld was the fifth Hurricane tabbed to the CoSIDA Academic All-District Team.

In 2015, Monroe helped guide Lachowecki to Second Team All-ACC honors. The junior forward ranked second in the ACC and No. 13 nationally in goals per game, en route to becoming the sixth Hurricane to garner all-conference recognition since Miami joined the ACC.

Miami closed the 2014 campaign by winning two of its final three games, including registering a 3-1 road victory at NC State behind a hat trick from Natalie Moik.

The Hurricanes finished 9-8-1 in 2013, Monroe's first season, ending with a perfect 5-0-0 mark through their non-conference slate and putting forth an impressive season in a challenging ACC schedule.

Monroe joined Miami after seven years as the head coach of the University of Albany in the America East Conference. A wellrespected player and instructor, Monroe competed on the field with the Boston Breakers of the WPSL Elite League as recently as the 2012 season.

Charged with building the Great Danes program from the ground up, Monroe and her coaching staff won 2009 America East Co-Coaching Staff of the Year honors in just her fourth year at the helm. During that season, the Great Danes earned the first Division I postseason berth in program history.

Just one year later in 2010, the Great Danes finished with a 10-8-2 record under Monroe's direction – the first winning season for the program since 1988. Albany would win its first postseason tournament match in program history that season, advancing to the America East semifinals.

HEAD COACH MARY-FRANCES MONROE

Her success would continue in 2011, as the Great Danes won seven consecutive games heading into their first-ever appearance in the America East Conference Championship game. Four of Monroe's players were selected all-conference, among 13 who earned that recognition over her seven years as leader of the Danes.

A four-year college All-American at the University of Connecticut and UCLA, Monroe has served as liaison for U.S. Soccer's National Training Centers covering the New England area, including regions of New York, Massachusetts, Connecticut, New Hampshire, Vermont, Rhode Island and Maine,

During her time as a student-athlete at UConn and UCLA, Monroe was a candidate for the Hermann Trophy - awarded to the best female college soccer player in the country. As a freshman with the Huskies, the Northport, N.Y., native set the program's single-season record with 65 points. Monroe was rewarded for her spectacular debut with BIG EAST Rookie of the Year honors and first-team all-conference recognition.

Monroe also achieved succes on the international level as a player, earning several caps with the United States Women's National Team.

The former Soccer America Freshman of the Year earned her bachelor's degree in sociology from UCLA in 2003.

Fifth Season | UNC Greensboro, 2002

Kate Dylag enters her fifth season as an assistant coach with the Miami Hurricanes as a member of head coach Mary-Frances Monroe's staff.

Dylag arrived in Miami after spending the previous two seasons as an assistant coach under Monroe at the University of Albany, where she helped guide the Great Danes to the best season in program history in 2011.

Prior to her two seasons at Albany, Dylag was an assistant coach with Clemson University in 2010, where she had duties in the areas of practice organization and player recruitment. Dylag was an assistant coach at Duquesne University in 2009, where, in addition to recruiting and practice activities, she developed individualized skill training and organized youth camps.

Dylag, native of Strongsville, Ohio, has also had assistant coaching stints at North Carolina State University (2007-08) and Central Michigan University (2003-07).

A 2002 graduate of University of North Carolina at Greensboro with a bachelor of arts degree in communication studies, Dylag was a four-year starter for the Spartans. She earned second team all-conference honors in 2001, and the Spartans qualified for the postseason in three of her four years at UNC Greensboro (1998, 2000, 2001).

Dylag, who holds an NSCAA Premier Coaching Diploma and a USSF B license, graduated from Central Michigan with a master's degree in administration with an emphasis in sport administration.





Assistant Coach

Fourth Season | Holy Names, 2007

Tim Hart enters his fourth season as an assistant coach with the Miami Hurricanes as a member of head coach Mary-Frances Monroe's staff.

Hart joined the Hurricanes after serving for three years as assistant men's soccer coach at Albany, where his primary focus was with the Great Danes goalkeepers. He carries the same responsibility for the Hurricanes.

Prior to his three-year stint with the Great Danes, Hart spent three seasons as the head coach of Holy Names University, an NAIA school located in Oakland, Calif.

As a collegiate soccer player, Hart attended Rio Grande University (Ohio) for two years before transferring to Holy Names. Originally from Coventry, England, he grew up playing in the Aston Villa and Derby County Football Club academies before signing an apprentice contract with Shrewsbury Town.

A two-time graduate of Holy Names, Hart received his B.A. in psychology in 2007, and earned a master's degree in education in 2010. He has earned National, Advanced National and Premier Diplomas from the NSCAA.

Jamie Giger joined the University of Miami soccer team as the program's volunteer assistant coach prior to the start of the 2017 season.

Giger served as the head coach at Elmira College from 2007-08 before moving on to Pacific Lutheran University, where she spent two years as an assistant. While there, she began working with the Washington State Youth Soccer ODP.

During her seven years with ODP, Giger was also the head coach for the Pacific Northwest Soccer Club. After moving to South Florida in the summer of 2015, Giger spent nearly two years as the head coach of Weston FC before joining the Hurricanes.

Giger has multiple NSCAA diplomas and a USSF 'A' coaching license. The Buckley, Wash., native is also part of the National Training Center staff in South Florida.

A 2004 graduate of Portland State University, Giger was an All-Big Sky selection as a freshman, before suffering a career-ending injury as a sophomore. She added bachelor's degree from Central Washington University in 2006.

In addition, Giger became of the first 100 people to receive master's degree in sports science with a concentration in coaching soccer when she graduated from Ohio University in 2017.

Lesley-Anne King is in her eighth year serving as an assistant athletic trainer for the University of Miami, working primarily with the soccer program. She also works with the Hurricane men's tennis tem and has previously served as the athletic trainer for the golf team.

Prior to her arrival in Coral Gables, Fla., King worked as a graduate assistant athletic trainer at nearby Florida International University, handling the daily medical care of the women's soccer and softball teams. She also previously served as a certified athletic training intern at Villanova University, covering the volleyball and softball programs.

A native of Farmington, Conn., King graduated from Boston University in 2007 with a bachelor's degree in athletic training. She added a master's degree in physical education/sport and fitness from FIU in 2010.





STEVE FELDE STRENGTH & CONDITIONING COACH

Fifth Season | Concordia, 2003

In May 2013, Steve Felde joined the University of Miami as an assistant strength and conditioning coach, focusing on soccer and men's basketball. In June 2016, he was promoted to director of Olympic sports performance, and now also works with women's tennis.

Felde came to Miami after a year at Minnesota where he was the assistant director of strength and conditioning for the Gophers, who played in the third round of the 2013 NCAA men's basketball tournament. In that position he oversaw all aspects of men's basketball weight lifting, plyometric and conditioning programs. He also monitored nutritional needs for basketball student-athletes and implemented strength programs for men's and women's hockey, men's swimming and men's golf.

Prior to his time in Minneapolis, Felde was the director of strength and conditioning at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee from 2007-12. While there, he oversaw strength and conditioning programs for 13 NCAA Division I sports including baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's soccer, track and field, men's and women's swim/dive, tennis, cross country and volleyball. He contributed to 34 Horizon League Championships in a variety of sports and helped the women's soccer team to two consecutive years in the national rankings.

A native of Milwaukee, Felde also spent time with Minnesota in 2005 as an assistant strength coach, training student-athletes in Olympic lifting techniques and implementing strength and speed development programs for 25 teams.

Felde earned his degree in athletic training and exercise leadership from Concordia University (Wis.) in May 2003. As an undergrad, he was an athletic trainer for football and wrestling, and a strength and conditioning coach for men's basketball and men's soccer.

In addition, Felde, who is married to the former Wendie Parchim, is certified through the National Strength and Conditioning Association (NSCA) and has been a certified club coach for USA Weightlifting since 2004. In 2010, Felde obtained a master's of sport science from the United States Sports Academy.




