### MISCELLANEOUS AND SERIES NOTES

- Nebraska now leads the series against Miami 6-5. The Canes matchup with the Cornhuskers was their first meeting since the 2001 National Championship game at the Rose Bowl.
- The 91,585 fans in attendance was the largest crowd in school history at Memorial Stadium. The game was eighth-highest attended game in Miami Hurricanes history.

### TEAM NOTES

- The Hurricanes' defensive starters were Calvin Heurtelou, Anthony Chickillo, Tyriq McCord, Thurston Armbrister, Deon Bush, Denzel Perryman, Raphael Kirby, Artie Burns, Dallas Crawford, Ladarius Gunter and Olsen Pierre.
- Miami's offensive starters were Phillip Dorsett, Standish Dobard, Duke Johnson, Malcome Lewis, Brad Kaaya, Clive Walford, Shane McDermott, Ereck Flowers, Jon Feliciano, Danny Isidora and Taylor Gadbois.
- The first Canes touchdown drive was a nine-play, 75-yard drive, which was capped by a two-yard run by Duke Johnson. Miami has now scored on its first offensive series in each of the past three games.
- Miami trailed 17-14 at the half.
- Miami went 2-for-2 in the red zone in the first half.
- The Hurricanes forced a fumble in the first quarter. Prior to tonight, the Cornhuskers had only lost one fumble this season.
- Nebraska's first quarter fumble led to a Miami touchdown, which gave the Canes a 14-7 lead in the second quarter. Prior to tonight, Nebraska had only trailed once this season in the first half.

### INDIVIDUAL NOTES - OFFENSE

- Brad Kaaya finished the game with a career-high 359 yards passing, going 28-of-42 through the air. His previous high was 342 yards vs. Arkansas State on Sept. 13. It was the most passing yards for a Miami true freshman quarterback in a single game in Hurricanes history.
- Duke Johnson had a career-high 66 yards receiving in the first half. His previous career-high receiving total was 57 yards back on Sept. 15, 2012 against Bethune-Cookman. Johnson finished the game with
- Johnson finished the game with 93 yards and in the process surpassed former Hurricanes Javarris James and Danyell Ferguson on the all-time UM rushing list. Johnson currently has 2,237 career rushing yards.
- Standish Dobard recorded his first catch of the season (second of his career) on a 20-yard reception in the third quarter, which gave the Canes first and goal inside the 10-yard line.

### INDIVIDUAL NOTES - DEFENSE

- Deon Bush forced a fumble for the second-consecutive week. Anthony Chickillo recovered the fumble as he collected his second fumble recovery on the year.
- Linebacker Raphael Kirby finished the game with a career-high seven tackles. He surpassed his previous single game career high with five stops in the first half.
- Defensive back Tracy Howard's third quarter interception was the fifth pick of his career. Howard's interception was his first since last year's matchup with Virginia (Nov. 23, 2013).

### INDIVIDUAL NOTES - SPECIAL TEAMS

- Kicker Michael Badgley's 34-yard field goal in the third quarter was his first field goal on the year.
