QUICK HITS

- After playing the last four at home, UM will travel north to play Maryland and Boston College
- Miami has won its last 14 at home and 25 of the last 26 at the Knight Sports Complex
- Last weekend, UM defeated NC State and North Carolina to move into a tie for first place with Florida State in the ACC standings
- Miami snapped NC State's 10-match winning streak with Mourning and Hollins combining for 25 kills
- The Hurricanes defeated North Carolina behind a balanced attack and the third-most blocks (18.0) in school history
- Alexis Mourning was named ACC Co-Player of the Week and a Collegiate Volleyball Update Top Performer after posting 22 kills and 16 total blocks on the weekend
- The Canes won both matches against the the Terrapins and the Eagles last year
- Miami ranks in the top 15 nationally in both blocks (10th, 2.95), kills (14th, 14.44), and assists (14th, 13.51) per set
- This is the fourth of 10 straight weekends in conference play, as the team went 8-2 against non-conference opponents
- UM is ranked first in the ACC in kills (14.44/set), digs (17.14/set), assists (13.51/set), blocks (2.95/set) and opponent hitting percentage (.153)
- Emani Sims was named ACC Player of the Week after recording 32 kills on a .500 hitting percentage against Duke and Wake Forest
- Emani Sims (45 kills, 15 total blocks) and Alexis Mourning (40 kills, 18 total blocks) were named to the all-tournament team in Louisville
- The Canes started ACC play with arguably the best regular season win in program history over then-No. 6 Florida State, the highest ranked team it has ever defeated - the match set a new attendance record (1,129) at the Knight Sports Complex and was televised nationally on ESPNU
- The win over FSU was the 400th in program history
- Alex Johnson was named the ACC Player of the Week on Sept. 10 after posting 16 kills and 16 digs in the 3-1 win over FSU - she was also honored nationally as a Top Performer by the Collegiate Volleyball Update
- Taylor Hollins has 13 double-doubles in 17 matches this season and is ninth in the ACC with 3.30 kills/set (208 total)
- Nrithya Sundararaman and Ryan Shaffer are second in the ACC with 10.73 assists/set and 4.81 digs/set, respectively, while Alexis Mourning ranks second at 1.39 blocks/set
- The Hurricanes have won their last 14 neutral site contests, but are 1-3 in true road contests this season (UM went 10-4 on the road in 2011)
- The Canes won two of three at the Redbird Classic, as Taylor Hollins (43 kills, 37 digs) and Ryan Shaffer (65 digs) were named to the all-tournament team
- Miami started the season winning all four matches at the Hurricane Invitational, including coming back to defeat Ole Miss after trailing 2-0
- Alex Johnson won MVP at the Hurricane Invitational after racking up 48 kills on a .421 hitting percentage; Taylor Hollins and Alexis Mourning were named all-tournament
- Miami was predicted to finish fifth by the ACC coaches in a preseason poll
- Alex Johnson and Emani Sims were selected Preseason All-ACC
- The recruiting class was ranked No. 27 in the nation according to PrepVolleyball.com
- Miami has received votes in every AVCA Coaches Poll this season, moving to as high as the first spot out of the Top 25

THE LAST TIME

OCT. 23, 2011: UM 3, MD 1

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Senior All-America outside hitter Lane Carico registered her second 20-20 effort of the year Sunday, helping the 25th-ranked University of Miami to a 3-1 win over the University of Maryland in an Atlantic Coast Conference volleyball match inside the Comcast Center Pavilion.

Miami (17-3, 8-3 Atlantic Coast Conference) hit .300 in the opening set, followed by a .229 average in the second as the Hurricanes and Terrapins were tied at one set apiece heading into the intermission between sets two and three.

Maryland (9-14, 3-8 ACC) was limited to just a .029 clip in the third frame, while the visiting Hurricanes used a match-high .306 hitting percentage behind four kills each from Alex Johnson, Ali Becker and Carico. Miami also got solid play from libero Ryan Shaffer in the set with six digs to earn the 25-13 win.

The fourth set was the most exciting for all involved.

The Terps led 18-14 in the fourth frame following a kill from Adreene Elliott off the set of Remy McBain. The Hurricanes would trail at 20-17 before Carico registered three consecutive kills to knot the score at 20. In fact, the three kills from the Manhattan Beach, Calif. native would start a 7-0 run that also saw kills from freshman middle blocker Emani Sims and setter Katie Gallagher, allowing UMiami to surge in front, 24-20.

Maryland cut into the Canes' lead with a 3-0 run sparked by an error charged to UMiami, as well as a McBain kill. After a service ace from Caitlin Adams, the Terps trailed by just one, 24-23.

In the end, it was only fitting that UMiami's all-time leader in kills - Carico - place the final shot for the win, 25-23.

In the match, Carico picked up her second 20-20 outing of the year with a match-high 20 kills and season-high 26 digs, one shy of tying her career-high set during her freshman campaign in 2008. Johnson also picked up a double-double with 11 kills and 13 digs, adding three blocks from her right side position. And it was Becker placing 13 kills and three blocks.

Gallagher supplied a match-high 49 assists and season-high tying 19 digs for the double-double, while Taylor Hollins pitched in with 13 digs, four kills and four assists from her outside hitter position.

Maryland was led by Elliott with 11 kills and Adams with 10. McBain handed out 34 assists, and teammate Sarah Harper led the defensive charge with 25 digs.

OCT. 21, 2011: UM 3, BC 1

CHESTNUT HILL, MASS. - The No. 25 Miami Volleyball team got back on track Friday night with its 3-1 victory at Boston College inside Power Gym in an Atlantic Coast Conference match. The 26-24, 25-16, 16-25, 25-25 victory improved the Hurricanes to 16-3 on the season and 7-3 in ACC action, while the Eagles dropped to 7-14 overall and just 3-7 in ACC play.

Senior middle blocker Ali Becker shined for the Hurricanes, powering down a team-high 16 kills on .583 hitting, while fellow blocker redshirt freshman Emani Sims placed a season-high 13 kills on 24 swings for a .458 clip. Senior All-America outside hitter Lane Carico joined them in double-dig-

its with 12 kills while managing a double-double with 17 digs.

The first set was back-and-forth with momentum as the Canes started the match with a 3-0 advantage behind a kill from Alex Johnson and two Boston College attack errors. However, the Eagles countered with a run midway through the set, using Tsvetelina Dureva to help her team out to a 13-9 lead. With UMiami trailing 17-13, the Hurricanes began a 6-1 run behind the efforts of Carico and setter Katie Gallagher who served up back-to-back aces. That allowed the Hurricanes a brief 19-18 edge.

The Canes ended the set on a 3-0 run sparked by blocks from Becker and redshirt senior outside hitter Christine Williamson, allowing UM the set win, 26-24.

After the Eagles took the third set to bring the match to 2-1 in favor of UM, the Hurricanes used five kills and a block from Becker - aided by four kills from Carico - to take the match on the strength of a 25-15 decision in the fourth frame.

Boston College was led by Dureva with a match-high 20 kills and 12 digs for the double-double. Courtney Castle added nine kills and 21 digs for the Eagles.

Gallagher handed out a match-high 44 assists for the Hurricanes while grabbing seven digs and assisting on two blocks. Sophomore libero Ryan Shaffer led all Hurricanes with 20 digs. Williamson ended the night with six kills.

ALMA MATER: MARYLAND '94

Nicole Lantagne Welch is in her 12th season as head coach of the University of Miami volleyball program. Under her guidance since 2001, the team has posted winning records in nine of the last 11 seasons, including ending the 2010 campaign ranked No. 26 in the RPI polls and No. 28 in the Pablo rankings.

Last season Lantagne Welch guided the Hurricanes to a 26-5 overall record and a 16-4 league mark to finish second in the Atlantic Coast Conference. The Canes spent several weeks in the AVCA Top 25. UM qualified for the NCAA Tournament for the third-straight year, defeating Northern Illinois to advance to the Second Round of the Ames [Iowa] Regional. At the end of the campaign, numerous players earned recognition, including Lane Carico becoming the first Hurricane to win ACC Player of the Year. The senior also earned AVCA All-America honors to cap one of the best careers in Miami history.

This past summer, Lantagne Welch traveled to Ohio to work with the A2 program as part of development for Team USA. In addition, two players associated with the program - Ciara Michel and Savannah Leaf - both competed in the Olympic Games for Team GB.

In 2010, Lantagne Welch helped guide the Canes to their second 20-win season in the last three years, and the second consecutive year in which UMiami advanced to the NCAA Tournament. Miami ended the season with a 23-9 overall mark (13-7 Atlantic Coast Conference) and finished third in the conference regular season standings. Along the way, the Hurricanes defeated NCAA Tournament participants Florida State, Middle Tennessee State, Georgia Southern, Wichita State and North Carolina. At the end of the year, Lantagne Welch saw her first-ever AVCA All-American honored in the form of Carico, collecting third team accolades following a record-breaking year. Carico became the first player in school history with 1,000 kills and 1,000 digs in a career, as well as leading the ACC in double-doubles - and later being the only player in the league to amass at least 400 kills and 400 digs on the campaign. Carico and teammate Katie Gallagher each claimed AVCA All-East Region Team honors, while freshman libero Ryan Shaffer set a new school record for digs by a freshman (539 / 4.53 per set). As for Carico, she would also earn her third consecutive All-ACC Team nod and All-East Region honor.

In 2009, Lantagne Welch helped the Hurricanes to their second NCAA Tournament appearance, competing in the Gainesville [Fla.] Regional. UM earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament after holding the 33rd toughest schedule in the nation according to the end-of-year RPI rankings. Earlier in the season, Lantagne Welch guided the Hurricanes to the Hampton Inn & Suites Northern Colorado Classic championship. She would add to her growing list of All-Atlantic Coast Conference student-athletes, as well as All-America honorable mention performers, seeing senior libero Cassie Loessberg and sophomore outside hitter Lane Carico named to both lists. Carico and Loessberg each collected AVCA All-America Hon-

orable Mention selections, while both were tabbed to the AVCA All-East Region Team. During the 2008 campaign, Lantagne Welch led the Hurricanes to a tie for third place in the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) standings, and the team's best regular season record since 2002.

During the year, Lantagne Welch collected her 150th career victory when the 'Canes defeated NC State, 3-0, on November 21, 2008. It was just two seasons ago that she posted her 100th career victory in the 2006 season-opener for UM with a 3-2 win over Alabama. The 2008 season was special for UM as the team posted a record of 26-6 overall (14-6 ACC), finishing just one match shy of tying for an ACC Championship. Not to be overlooked was Lantagne Welch leading the 'Canes to three in-season tournament titles, including a tournament title at NCAA Tournament participant University of San Francisco as part of the Asics/Coca-Cola Invitational in San Francisco, Calif. For those achievements and more, Lantagne Welch was tabbed ACC Coach of the Year, as well as American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) East Region Coach of the Year. It was her first ACC coaching honor, while being the second AVCA Regional honor, collecting the award in 2002 during Miami's historic run to the Round of 16 in the NCAA Tournament.

Under her guidance, Lantagne Welch would later see freshman Lane Carico named ACC Freshman of the Year, as well as AVCA East Region Freshman of the Year. Carico would go on to be named to the All-ACC Second Team, as well as teammates Angelica Ellis and Genny Mayhew. Carico would represent the first-ever ACC Freshman of the Year coached by Lantagne Welch, while Ellis and Mayhew would become the seventh and eighth players in school history to be named to the All-ACC Volleyball Team. Overall, her career at UM is highlighted in part by four seasons with at least 20 wins (2003-04, '08, '10) and a trip to the "Sweet 16" in the Hurricanes' first-ever appearance at the NCAA Tournament in 2002. In her 10 years at the helm in Coral Gables, Lantagne Welch has averaged 19.2 wins per seasons with a career record of 192-109.

PIONEERING THE FIRST SEASON

On Feb. 28, 2000, then University of Miami Athletic Director Paul Dee proclaimed the return of women's volleyball as the Hurricanes newest fully funded varsity sport at UM. On Sept. 12, 2000, Dee took the next major step in the evolution of the program by announcing the hiring of Lantagne Welch as head coach of the Hurricanes.

A WINNING HISTORY

A native of Encinitas, Calif., Lantagne Welch grew up in a family where volleyball had been a major part of their livelihood. Her parents, Joe and JoAnn, owned and operated a highly regarded volleyball scouting service that evaluated high school players, covering the regions of California, Nevada and Arizona. Lantagne Welch's sister, Jenelle Duvall, was an All-American at the University of Pittsburgh and served as an assistant coach at Northern Arizona and Northern Illinois. She also served as head coach at Metro State College of Denver.

Lantagne Welch played at the University of Maryland from 1990-1993. In her role as a four-year starting setter, she guided the Terrapins to their first-ever At-

lantic Coast Conference Championship (ACC) title and an automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament in 1990. As a top collegiate setter, Lantagne Welch garnered First Team All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors in 1992 and '93, and earned Second Team All-ACC accolades in 1991. She would also be named AVCA National Player of the Week (Oct. 12, 1993) following an upset victory over Florida State.

Serving as a team captain through her final two seasons, Lantagne Welch finished her outstanding collegiate career as Maryland's all-time assists, digs and matches played leader. Throughout her career in College Park, Lantagne Welch accumulated various academic honors including ACC Honor Roll and district academic All-America as a senior. She graduated in 1994 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Marketing. For her accomplishments as a student-athlete, Lantagne Welch was named to the Atlantic Coast Conference 50th Anniversary Volleyball Team along with five other Terrapins from teams of the 1990s.

Lantagne Welch began her coaching career in 1994 as an assistant coach on the Maryland staff before becoming a graduate assistant coach at Ohio University in 1995. At Ohio, she developed training sessions for setters and assisted in the scouting of opponents and in the development of game plans. Lantagne Welch arrived at Miami after serving as an assistant coach at Texas A&M. During her three seasons there, the Aggies finished ranked in the top 20 and qualified for the NCAA Tournament each season (1997-99). In 1999, Texas A&M advanced to the elite eight of the NCAA Tournament, compiling a 28-6 record and a No. 9 final ranking. Under Lantagne Welch's training, Aggie setter Jenna Moscovic was named the 1999 Big 12 Conference Freshman of the Year and named to the All-American Freshman Team by Volleyball Magazine. As a sophomore, Moscovic was selected to the 2000 All-Big 12 Team and All-District 5 Team. Lantagne Welch also played a major role in bringing the Aggies back-to-back Top 10 recruiting classes. The 1999 class was ranked in the Top 10 by Student Sports Magazine and the 1998 class was ranked sixth by Volleyball Magazine.

In 2002, she married Wesley Paul Welch of Denver City, Texas, in her hometown of Encinitas, Calif. On Dec. 7, 2004, the couple celebrated the birth of their daughter, Riley Jaye and on April 8, 2007, son Ayden Fletcher was born. Lantagne Welch and her family reside in Miami.

MOURNING NAMED ACC CO-PLAYER OF THE WEEK

GREENSBORO, N.C. - Sophomore middle blocker Alexis Mourning of the University of Miami volleyball team has been named Atlantic Coast Conference Co-Player of the Week, the league office announced Monday. She recorded 22 kills and 16 total blocks in two matches over the weekend to help the Hurricanes move into first place tie in the league standings.

"Alexis has been a very consistent player for us all season," head coach Nicole Lantagne Welch said. "She really helped to impact our two big wins this weekend. On Friday, she led us in kills while hitting an outstanding .440 - the type production out of the middle that we need from her. Sunday, her blocking really affected UNC's offense and was one of the keys to our victory. She was a wall at the net."

Against NC State, Mourning collected a match-high 13 kills to go with six blocks, as Miami snapped the Wolfpack's 10-match winning streak. She recorded 10 block assists versus North Carolina on Sunday, a career-best and one short of the school record set by Ciara Michel in 2004. The Canes had 18.0 total blocks in the win, tying for the third-most in program history.

For the season, Mourning is second in the ACC with 1.39 blocks per set and is second on the Canes with 172 (2.77 k/s) with a .318 hitting percentage.

The sophomore becomes the third Hurricane to earn the league honor this season, joining junior right side Alex Johnson (Sept. 10) and sophomore middle blocker Emani Sims (Oct. 1). Mourning shares the award this week with Sareea Freeman of Florida State.

MIAMI THROWS BLOCK PARTY

CORAL GABLES, Fla. - Behind a balanced attack and the third-most total blocks in school history, the University of Miami volleyball team defeated North Carolina, 3-1, on Sunday at the Knight Sports Complex. The Canes won their 14th straight at home and are currently riding a four-match winning streak.

UM won by set scores of 25-18, 27-25, 23-25 and 25-14 to improve to 14-3 on the year and 6-1 in the Atlantic Coast Conference, while UNC dropped to 13-4 and 4-3. Miami sits in a tie for first in the standings with Florida State, a team the Canes defeated earlier in the season.

"A critical point in the match today was coming back in the second set after UNC took a lead," head coach Nicole Lantagne Welch said. "We showed a lot of resiliency there to take a 2-0 advantage, which was important. They put together a strong set in the third, but we were able to regroup with strong blocking and serving to win the fourth."

After winning the first handily, Miami fell behind 23-20 in the second. The Tar Heels then committed an attack error and sophomore middle blocker Alexis Mourning and junior outside hitter Taylor Hollins each put down kills to even the score at 23. Junior right side Alex Johnson recorded a service ace to give UM set point, but UNC won the next two exchanges to put themselves a point from evening the match. However, the Hurricanes fought back with a kill by Mourning, an attack error and a kill by Johnson to take a commanding 2-0 lead. The set included 12 ties and seven lead changes.

Up against the wall, North Carolina jumped out to a 16-10 advantage in the third and held off a furious UM rally to take a set. The visiting momentum would not carry over, as Miami took a 10-4 lead and regis-

tered six blocks in the fourth to take the match.

Mourning registered a career-high 10 block assists in the match, one off the school record set by Ciara Michel at Virginia Tech in 2004. As a team, the Canes had 18.0 total blocks, tied for the third-most in a match in program history. Senior setter Nrithya Sundararaman (seven) matched her career high and sophomore middle blocker Emani Sims set a new season best (eight) at the net.

Johnson and Sims led Miami with 10 kills on the day, while Hollins and Mourning had nine each. Hollins also led the team with 10 digs and Sundararaman registered 40 assists. Twelve different players saw action for the Canes.

"We had some little adjustments throughout the match that we wanted to throw out there to spark a run," Lantagne Welch said. "Our bench played great today and they have continued to lift us."

Chaniel Nelson had a match-high 12 kills for UNC, while Cora Harms recorded 40 assists, 13 digs and six kills.

CANES TAKE DOWN FIRST-PLACE NC STATE

CORAL GABLES, Fla. - The University of Miami volleyball team defeated North Carolina State, 3-1, on Friday at the Knight Sports Complex to move into a tie for first place in the Atlantic Coast Conference standings. The Canes won their 13th straight at home to snap the Wolfpack's 10-match winning streak.

UM won by set scores of 25-23, 25-17, 20-25 and 25-15 to improve to 13-3 on the year and 5-1 in the ACC, while NCSU dropped to 15-2 and 5-1.

"We just beat a great team that was on a huge winning streak and knows how to win," head coach Nicole Lantagne Welch said. "I thought we played some nice volleyball and put together a nice defensive effort."

Sophomore middle blocker Alexis Mourning had a match-high 13 kills to lead the Hurricanes, while junior Taylor Hollins recorded her 12th double-double of the season with 12 kills and 10 digs. Senior setter Nrithya Sundararaman had 36 assists.

Defensively, junior libero Ryan Shaffer notched a season-high 30 digs in the back row to help hold the Wolfpack to a .089 hitting percentage. Miami hit at a .214 clip for the match.

In the first set, NC State went up 23-20 and seemed poised to take the opener, but the Canes rallied to win the next five points to go up 1-0 in the match. That momentum continued in the second, as Miami went on a 16-6 run to take a commanding advantage that would not be relinquished.

NC State, who had played their previous 13 matches at home, responded after the intermission to win the third set to cut the deficit to 2-1. The Wolfpack then even the score at 10 in the fourth with sights set on forcing a deciding fifth frame. However, the Hurricanes reeled in 11 of the next 13 points to go up 21-12. UM sealed the win on an attack error from NCSU.

Brie Merriwether led the visitors with 10 kills, while Alston Kearns had 21 digs.

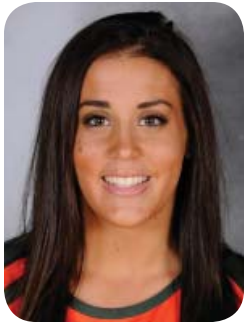
