Miami HEADS TO TALLAHASSEE FOR SEASON OPENER AT FSU

► Miami opens its season Labor Day night as the Hurricanes travel to in-state rival Florida State in a nationally televised game on ESPN. It will be the third time the two teams meet on Labor Day since 2005. The scheduled 2004 Labor Day game was delayed four days due to Hurricane Frances.

► Miami opens its 84th season of college football with its 54th game against intrastate and Atlantic Coast Conference rival Florida State. Miami and Florida State have faced each other 11 times to open the season. FSU holds a 7-4 edge in those games. Five of those 11 games have been shutouts: three by Miami and two by FSU.

► Miami is 56-26-1 in season-opening games, including a 37-14-1 mark at home and 19-12 mark on the road.

► Sophomore quarterback Jacory Harris will be Miami's opening-day starter for the second straight season when he leads the 'Canes against the Seminoles. Harris started twice in 2008 and became the first freshman QB at UM to start a season opener since Bernie Kosar in 1983. Even more, 2009 marks the first season since 1974 that a player from Miami-Dade County enters the season as the starting quarterback. Kary Baker from Miami-Edison High School was UM's starter in 1974. Hialeah High's Ryan Collins started the last seven games of the 1993 season.

► Miami's matchup at No. 18/19 Florida State is the first of a tough slate against four teams ranked in the Top 20 as UM faces No. 15/15 Georgia Tech, No. 7/7 Virginia Tech and No. 3/3 Oklahoma in the coming weeks.

► The Hurricanes are the first team since Notre Dame in 2000 to open its season with four ranked opponents and the third team in the last 15 years. Notre Dame started 2000 with No. 23 Texas A&M, No. 1 Nebraska, at No. 13 Purdue and at No. 23 Michigan State. UCF opened 1999 with No. 22 Purdue, at No. 4 Florida, at No. 12 Georgia Tech and at No. 11 Georgia.

The MIAMI-FSU SERIES

► Miami leads the all-time series between the two schools, 30-23. Since Miami joined the ACC in 2004, UM has won two of five match-ups against FSU with the 'Canes winning in 2004 and 2007. The series between the two programs dates back to 1951. In last year's game at Dolphin Stadium, FSU jumped out to a 24-3 halftime lead. However, the 'Canes stormed back, cutting the lead to two before eventually falling short in the end 41-39.

► The last six games in the Miami-Florida State rivalry have been decided by a total of 24 points, with one game going into overtime (a six-point Miami win in 2004).

COVERING THE HURRICANES

For the Florida State game, players are available up to the end of practice on Friday. Interviews with players and coaches must be arranged at least 24 hours in advance. Practices are open to the media from the start through stretch. Head coach Randy Shannon will address the media following each practice.

'Canes IN THE CLASS ROOM

► Miami's APR score in 2009 ranked 7th nationally with a score of 976. This score was the highest among all Florida institutions and second highest in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

► Of the 20 seniors on this year's squad, eight have already earned degrees, while the remaining 11 are all on course to graduate either in December of 2009 or May of 2010.

► The eight players that have already earned degrees include: Jack Byrne (Finance), Joe Joseph (Sports Administration), Eric Moncur (Bachelor of Liberal Arts), Matt Perrelli (Marketing and Management), Matt Pipho (Biology), Darryl Sharpton (Finance), A.J. Trump (Management and Organization), Jimmy Graham (Management).

► Last season, Miami had 13 early graduates, which were the most in the nation.

► Four graduates on the 2009 roster are currently pursuing their master's degrees: Joe Joseph (Master's of Liberal Arts), Jimmy Graham (Master's of Liberal of Arts), Matt Perrelli (Sports Administration) and Jake Byrne (Master's of Business Administration).

GAME DAY PRESS POLICIES

Only working press will be admitted to the Land Shark Stadium press box. Seats will be issued according to the following criteria:

1. State newspapers by circulation, wire services, national publications, newspapers from opponent's area, and student newspapers from UM and opponent's schools.
2. Other daily newspapers, with preference to those that regularly cover UM.
3. Radio and television personnel not broadcasting, but considered reporting.
4. Non-daily newspapers, with preference to those which regularly cover UM.
5. Scouts. Freelance and/or non-daily writers may be asked to produce copies of actual publications in which their work has appeared. In some cases, these materials will be required as verification of the writers' status.

CONFERENCE ROAD GAME CREDENTIALS

Writers covering UM on a regular basis can make all requests for conference road credentials with Mark Pray (mpray@miami.edu) or through the media relations department of the home team.

NON-CONFERENCE ROAD GAME CREDENTIALS

Writers covering UM on a regular basis may make requests for non-conference road credentials with the UM Sports Information Office. Credential requests are faxed to the opponent school by Monday two weeks prior to the contest.

Right BETWEEN THE NUMBERS

- ▶ The UM football team currently consists of 53 freshmen and sophomores and only 37 juniors and seniors.
- ▶ No position on the UM roster is as young as the receiver position, where junior Leonard Hankerson is the lone upper classmen expected to garner significant playing time. Behind Hankerson, the next seven receivers are all entering just their second year in the program.
- ▶ Running back Graig Cooper is fifth among all active returning ACC players with 841 rushing yards in 2008.
- ▶ UM's 12 scheduled opponents this season had a combined record of 93-61 (.604) last season, with eight of the 12 opponents having won at least eight games.
- ▶ Four UM receivers stand at 6-3 or taller: Leonard Hankerson and Aldarius Johnson are 6-3, LaRon Byrd is 6-4 and Tommy Streeter is 6-5.
- ▶ For the second straight year, UM opens the season without an upperclassman at the top two quarterback spots on the depth chart (2008 – Robert Marve and Jacory Harris; 2009 – Jacory Harris and A.J. Highsmith).
- ▶ The margin of victory in the last seven meetings between Miami and FSU has been single digits. The last time one of the teams won by more than 10, the 'Canes won 49-27 in Tallahassee on Oct. 13, 2001.
- ▶ Eleven different players on the 2008 roster finished with double-digit catches, four more than the 'Canes had in 2007. Aldarius Johnson led the 'Canes with 31 catches, while Graig Cooper ranked second with 29 and Thearon Collier ranked third with 26.
- ▶ Hurricane great Edgerrin James (1996-98) recently signed a one-year deal with the Seattle Seahawks. James will begin his 11th NFL season with the Seahawks after seven seasons with the Colts and three with the Cardinals. He enters the season as the NFL's active leading rusher with 12,121 career yards.
- ▶ Wide receiver LaRon Byrd was the only Hurricane to catch a pass in at least 12 games in 2008.
- ▶ Miami led the Atlantic Coast Conference in both red zone offense (93.6 percent) and fourth down conversions (68.4 percent) in 2008.
- ▶ Allen Bailey recorded a team-high five sacks last season, while fellow defensive lineman Marcus Robinson was tied for second on the team with four sacks.
- ▶ Nine different players either led or tied for the team-lead in receptions in a game last season. Of those players returning in 2008, Thearon Collier, Graig Cooper, Aldarius Johnson and Dedrick Epps have led the team in catches more than once.
- ▶ Miami reached its 23rd bowl game in the last 26 years with an Emerald Bowl appearance in 2008.
- ▶ Miami is 6-3 in the month of September under Randy Shannon and 25-7 in September this decade.
- ▶ When Jacory Harris started last year's opener against Charleston Southern, he became the first freshman to start a season-opener for at quarterback for UM since Bernie Kosar did it against Florida in 1983.
- ▶ Prior to the bowl season last year, the 'Canes ranked second in the country in number of different players who scored a touchdown (18) and number of freshmen that scored a touchdown (8).

- Since 1985, the Hurricanes have won 30 of their last 42 games (.714) against Sunshine State opponents.

Shutting OUT THE SEMINOLES

▶ Since Bobby Bowden took over the coaching reigns at Florida State 33 years ago, only one team has managed to shut out the Seminoles - the Miami Hurricanes. Miami has blanked the 'Noles twice during the Bowden era.
 ▶ The Hurricanes shut out FSU 47-0 in the Orange Bowl in Bowden's inaugural season at Florida State in 1976 and then blanked his preseason No. 1-ranked Seminoles 31-0 in the Orange Bowl to start the 1988 season.

The TEAM THAT SCORES FIRST...

▶ When Miami and Florida State play, the team that has scored first has won 16 of the last 18 meetings (the only two times it didn't happen was 2004 and 2007) and 21 of the last 24.
 ▶ FSU scored first in 1992's 19-16 Miami victory at the Orange Bowl, Miami's 2004 16-10 overtime win in the Orange Bowl and 2007's 37-29 UM win in Tallahassee.

Close CALLS TEND TO FAVOR THE 'CANES

▶ If the Miami and Florida State final score is close, history has favored the Hurricanes. Since 1973, the Hurricanes are 10-3 against FSU in games decided by four points or fewer.
 ▶ However, FSU has won the last three close games, 10-7 in 2005, 13-10 in 2006, and 41-39 last year.

Success AGAINST THE SEMINOLES

▶ Thirteen of Florida State's last 52 losses, dating back to 1987 have been to the Hurricanes. The 13 UM wins are the most by any team in the nation vs. Florida State over the last 20 seasons.
 ▶ Miami is one of only six schools to defeat the Seminoles more than once since 1987 (nine by Florida, five by NC State, three by Clemson and Wake Forest and two each by Maryland and Virginia).
 ▶ In addition, FSU has had eight one-loss seasons since 1987, with five of the losses coming at the hands of the Hurricanes.

The MIAMI-FSU SERIES SINCE 1983

DECEPTIVE PASSING ATTACK

▶ In the last 27 games against FSU, Miami has passed for more yards 16 times. The team that has passed for more yards has lost 12 of the last 21 meetings.
 ▶ The teams have combined for nine 300-plus yards passing games since 1983 (Miami - 5, FSU - 4).

PENALTIES HAVE LED TO WINS

▶ For some reason, the team that has had the most penalties has won 16 of the last 27 games including 15 of the last 23 games.
 ▶ The team that garnered the most penalty yards had won 13-straight meetings before Miami broke that streak at the 2004 Orange Bowl Classic when the Hurricanes had just 40 yards in penalties and FSU had 85 yards.
 ▶ The team that has had the most penalty yards has won 17 of 27 games overall since 1983. UM had more penalty yards in 2006 (75-38), but lost 13-10.
 ▶ In 2007, the trend was back on track as UM had one more penalty than FSU (8-to-7) but the Hurricanes still came away with the victory.
 ▶ Last year, the Seminoles racked up 12 penalties to UM's 10 and came away with the two-point victory.

▶ **IN THE 16 GAMES MIAMI HAS WON:** UM outscored FSU 446-310 (27.8-19.4, UM +8.4)

▶ **IN THE 11 GAMES FSU HAS WON:** FSU outscored UM 333-137 (30.3-12.5, FSU +17.8)

Rushing LEADS TO WINS VS. FSU

► Since 1988, the team that rushes for more yards in the Miami-Florida State series has won the game 17 of 22 times. The five exceptions were: 2007 in Tallahassee when FSU edged out UM on the ground 158-153; 2006 in Miami, when oddly enough Miami outrushed FSU, 2-1, and lost 13-10; 2002 in Miami, when FSU outrushed UM by a 296-115 margin and lost a 28-27 decision; in 2001 in UM's 49-27 win in Tallahassee where FSU outgained UM 214-142 on the ground but still lost, and the first time in 1992, when FSU narrowly out-gained Miami on the ground 67 to 65, but lost 19-16.

Miami-Florida State: A MADE FOR TV MATCHUP

► The 2009 game with Florida State marks the 26th consecutive season and the 30th time in 54 meetings that the UM-FSU clash will be shown on regional or network television.

► The Hurricanes have been involved in the three most watched regular season college football games to air on ESPN. First on that list is the UM-Florida State game on September 4, 2006 (9,120,000 household impressions) and the second most viewed game ever is the Hurricanes contest against the Seminoles on October 8, 1994 (7,667,000 household impressions).

► The University of Miami's football game at Florida in 2008 was the third most watched regular season game in the history of the network's college football coverage. The game drew a 5.0 rating and had 6,954,000 household impressions.

Miami-FSU SCORING MARGINS

► Of the 53 meetings between these two teams, 17 have been decided by five or fewer points (UM leads 11-6 in those games), 11 have been decided by 6-10 points (UM leads 8-3), and 25 have been decided by 11 or more points (FSU leads 14-11). Only 12 points separate these teams in all-time scoring in the series, with FSU holding a 1,025-1,013 edge.

Miami VS. AP-RANKED TEAMS

- Miami has won 24 of its last 39 games against ranked teams, dating back to the 2000 season.
- Miami is 85-113-1 vs. AP-ranked teams since its first game against a ranked opponent in No. 18 Alabama in 1941.
- Miami is 39-57 vs. AP top-10 teams since playing No. 6 Alabama in 1947.
- Miami is 22-33 against AP top-5 teams since playing No. 3 Maryland in 1953.
- Miami's victory over No. 1 Florida State on Oct. 7, 2000, extended UM's record to 10-7 against No. 1-ranked teams. Of those 16 meetings with No. 1, six of the past eight were against FSU.

Miami VS. RANKED/UNRANKED SINCE 1980

► Since 1990, Miami has registered a 45-36 mark against Associated Press ranked teams and a 119-11 record against unranked opponents. Miami's loss to North Carolina in 2004 marked the first loss to an unranked team since losing to East Carolina in 1999, a span of 65 games.

Running FOR RECORDS

Here is a quick look at some individual UM career rushing records to watch out for during the 2009 season:

▶ Javarris James is currently 8th all-time in rushing attempts. With 73 attempts this season, he would move into sole possession of third place behind Ottis Anderson (691) and James Jackson (541).

▶ Both Javarris James (1,670) and Graig Cooper (1,523) have a chance to move into the all-time Top 10 in rushing yards (Alonzo Highsmith is currently 10th with 1,914 career yards). If Graig Cooper runs for more than 1,000 yards this season, he would rank in the Top 4 in UM history.

▶ Graig Cooper also ranks in a tie for ninth all-time with five career 100-yard games. (Javarris James ranks 12th with four).

Other RECORDS TO WATCH

▶ Jason Fox has started 36 games in his career. He could tie William Joseph for a UM record 50 career starts if the 'Canes play in the ACC Championship game and a bowl game and Fox starts all 14 games. (Ed Reed is second on the list with 48 career starts).

▶ Matt Boshier is 7th all-time in consecutive PATs (40) and 10th in both field goals (18) and points scored by a kicker (94).

Big BAILEY INSIDE

▶ First a linebacker, a year later, a defensive end, now, at 6-4 and nearly 300 pounds, junior Allen Bailey has made the move to defensive tackle in 2009. Bailey, who led the 'Canes with five sacks in 2008, played mostly on special teams as a freshman linebacker in 2007 before moving to defensive end last season becoming the team's sack leader and ranking second in tackles for loss (9.0).

Old WISE MEN

▶ Safety Randy Phillips and defensive end Eric Moncur return in 2009 as the senior citizens of the Hurricanes' defense. Moncur came to UM in 2004 and redshirted that season before Phillips joined him on the field in 2005. The pair has combined to play in 70 games (Moncur – 36, Phillips -34).

The NORTHWESTERN SEVEN

Last season's freshman class included seven players from Northwestern High School in Miami. Here is a look at how each fared their first season at UM:

QB JACORY HARRIS

▶ Played in all 13 games, starting two; Threw for 1,195 yards and 12 touchdowns; also ran for 101 yards

LB SEAN SPENCE

▶ Earned numerous Freshman All-America honors; Named ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year; Recorded 65 tackles

WR ALDARIUS JOHNSON

▶ Led the 'Canes in catches (31) and receiving yards (332); Caught eight passes for 84 yards and a TD at Duke

DT MARCUS FORSTON

▶ Earned numerous Freshman All-America honors; Had 4.5 tackles for a loss, including three sacks

WR TOMMY STREETER

▶ Sat out the 2008 season with a wrist injury

WR KENDAL THOMPKINS

▶ Played in the first two games before an injury forced him to miss the remainder of the season.

OL BEN JONES

▶ Redshirted; Participated on the scout team

Jimmy, JIMMY

▶ With five national championships and decades of success on the gridiron, football players at "The U" are usually the most recognizable athletes. However, one of the most recognizable names on the 2009 roster is former UM basketball player Jimmy Graham.

▶ Graham, who is among the program's all-time Top 10 in career blocks, opted to join the football team in lieu of pursuing a professional basketball career after his basketball eligibility expired at the conclusion of the 2008-09.

▶ At 6-8, Graham is the second-tallest player on the UM football team (reserve offensive lineman Ian Symonette stands at 6-9).

▶ He is one of four former college basketball players making the switch to the gridiron in 2009 - Arizona forward-turned-Houston tight end Fendi Onobu, Michigan point guard-turned-slot receiver Kelvin Grady and Duke point guard-turned Syracuse quarterback Greg Paulus.

Shields SHIFTING GEARS

▶ After three seasons as a wide receiver, veteran Sam Shields has made the move over to cornerback for his senior season.

▶ Shields, who had just 470 receiving yards combined the last two seasons after tallying 501 yards as a freshman, is UM's fastest player (4.2 40-yard dash) and will instantly add another dimension to the UM secondary.

All-Purpose YARDS RETURN

▶ Miami returns nine of its top 10 players in terms of all-purpose yards gained in 2008, with only Kayne Farquharson (280 yards) not back this season.

▶ Graig Cooper (1,133) led the team in all-purpose yards in '08.

▶ Travis Benjamin (1,012) ranked second on the team in all-purpose yards. It marked the second time a UM freshman recorded at least 1,000 all-purpose yards in the last three seasons, after Javarris James tallied 1,002 yards as a freshman in 2006.

▶ Javarris James (404), Thearon Collier (359), Aldarius Johnson (332), Dedrick Epps (304) and Brandon Harris (299) ranked 3rd through 7th.

▶ After Farquharson, LaRon Byrd (228) and Sam Shields (159) ranked 9th and 10th respectively.

Its ALL ABOUT THE BENJAMIN

Freshman receiver/returner Travis Benjamin had his best game of his young career last year against FSU, collecting an impressive 274 all-purpose yards against the Seminoles. Benjamin, who had 183 all-purpose yards through Miami's first four games (45.75 ypg) last season, finished with 185 yards on kick returns, 71 yards receiving and 18 yards rushing in an increased role against FSU.

- ▶ Benjamin's 274 all-purpose yards against FSU in 2008 was the most by a Hurricane since Edgerrin James had 310 all-purpose yards (299 rushing, 11 receiving) against UCLA in 1998.
- ▶ He scored his first two touchdowns of his career against the Seminoles with an 18-yard rushing TD and a 51-yard receiving TD on a pass from running back Graig Cooper.
- ▶ Despite an injury that slowed him late in the season, Benjamin would go on to finish the season with 1,012 all-purpose yards, second on the team to only Graig Cooper's 1,133 yards.
- ▶ He was also named a Rivals.com Freshman All-American after finishing the season with team-highs in punt return yardage (181), kick return yardage (496) and yards per reception (16.3).

Fox ON SPORTING NEWS TODAY

- ▶ University of Miami offensive tackle Jason Fox is among 18 college football stars writing weekly diaries throughout the season in Sporting News Today, the world's first digital daily sports newspaper.
- ▶ The diaries, which will cover topics on the field and off it, began a week before the season-opener at FSU. To sign up for the free digital newspaper, which is no fewer than 30 pages a day, go to sportingnewstoday.com. At 7 a.m. ET each day, subscribers are sent an e-mail directing them to that day's edition.

Miami ON THE BIG STAGE

- ▶ The Hurricanes come right out of the gate in 2009, playing each of their first two games in Primetime on ESPN. UM opens its season Labor Day night in Tallahassee against the Seminoles at 8 p.m., before hosting Georgia Tech in the home-opener at Land Shark Stadium on Thursday, Sept. 17 at 7:30 p.m.
- ▶ Although it has yet to be determined, the 'Canes in all likelihood will play their third and fourth games (at Virginia Tech – Sept. 26; vs. Oklahoma – Oct. 3) on national TV.

Fox IN THE FLAT

- ▶ Miami's anchor on the offensive line - left tackle Jason Fox - is one of a number of players on the UM roster that played multiple positions in high school. Fox, who stands 6-foot-7 and weighs 314 pounds, was recruited as an offensive lineman but also spent time as a tight end during his prep playing days. His versatility was on display late in the Florida State game last season when, after quarterback Robert Marve rolled right, Fox slid back behind Marve on the left side, caught a backwards pass, and ran it in for a five-yard touchdown.

Coop AND BABY J

- ▶ So much of Miami's success offensively comes from the running back tandem of junior Graig Cooper and senior Javaris James. In the rushing duo's time together at UM, the Hurricanes have a 6-2 record when the two combine to get at least 25 carries, and a 3-9 record when they both play and are under the 25-carry mark.
- ▶ In 2007, reaching this mark was extremely important to the team's success as all five of UM's victories came when the two combined to reach the 25-carry mark.
- ▶ Last year, James missed the better part of five games with a high ankle sprain, and the only time the pair combined for more than 25 carries the 'Canes won at Virginia when Cooper and James ran 33 times for 186 yards.

Red ZONE RESULTS

- ▶ The Hurricanes had an impressive success rate of 93.6-percent (44-for-47) when reaching the red zone in 2008.
- ▶ The 93.6-percent rate led the Atlantic Coast Conference (NC State was 2nd - 90.9, FSU was 3rd - 90.6).
- ▶ UM scored 29 touchdowns (15 rush, 14 pass) and kicked 15 field goals when reaching the end zone.

Fourth DOWN FORTUNE

- ▶ One of the team's strengths in 2008 was its success rate on both sides of the ball on fourth down.
- ▶ Offensively, UM led the ACC and ranked 13th nationally in converting 68.4 percent of its fourth down attempts.
- ▶ On the defensive side, the 'Canes ranked fourth in the ACC and 23rd nationally with a 38.1 percent success rate on fourth down.
- ▶ The 'Canes came in ahead of Boston College (64.0) and Maryland (53.3) on offense and trailed only Duke (26.3), UNC (26.3) and Virginia Tech (35.3) on defense.

Coaches AT THEIR ALMA MATERS

- ▶ Miami's Randy Shannon is one of 15 head coaches working at their alma maters this season. The Hurricanes are scheduled to face two coaches coaching at their alma maters this season (Frank Beamer - Virginia Tech; Al Groh - Virginia).

- ▶ Sophomore quarterback Jacory Harris enters the season snapping a streak of at least 16 years since a player from Miami-Dade County quarterbacked a University of Miami team. Hialeah High School's Ryan Collins started the last seven games of the 1993 season, but did not go into the season as the starter. Kary Baker was the last Miami-Dade County quarterback to enter the season as the starting quarterback. Baker, from Miami-Edison High School, was UM's starter in 1974 and also was Miami's first African-American quarterback.

The TOUGH BIG FOUR TO OPEN

- ▶ The University of Miami's first four games are against Florida State, Georgia Tech, Virginia Tech and Oklahoma. Those teams were all ranked in the final polls last year, are all ranked in the 2009 preseason polls and had a combined 2008 record of 40-14.
- ▶ Not only are Miami's first three games against ACC schools, but it's against the top three ACC teams going into the season as predicted by the Atlantic Coast Conference media. (Florida State 1st in Atlantic, Virginia Tech 1st in Coastal and Georgia Tech 2nd in Coastal).
- ▶ If that's not difficult enough, the University of Miami opens up nonconference play with Oklahoma who was the National Championship runner-up and returns Heisman trophy winning quarterback Sam Bradford.

Butkus BOYS

- ▶ Senior Darryl Sharpton and sophomore Sean Spence were named to the initial watch list for the 2009 Dick Butkus Award, given annually to the nation's top linebacker.
- ▶ Eight Atlantic Coast Conference linebackers were among the 35 selected to the list while Miami was one of eight schools nationally with two players represented on the list, along with Penn State, Georgia, USC, Alabama, Oklahoma, North Carolina and Iowa.
- ▶ Spence was named 2008 ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year last season while Sharpton returns after starting 10 of 13 games a season ago.

Bosher NAMED TO GROZA WATCH LIST

- ▶ Junior Matt Bosher was named to the preseason watch list for the Lou Groza Award, given annually to the nation's top collegiate kicker.
- ▶ Nine 2008 semifinalists – including Bosher – are named to the list. As a sophomore in 2008, Bosher earned second team All-ACC honors as a kicker and punter and also was awarded Miami's Jack Harding Award, given to the team's most valuable player.
- ▶ Bosher led Miami with 94 points while connecting on 18-of-20 field goal attempts and 40-of-40 PAT's.

Best BEHAVIOR

- ▶ Through head coach Randy Shannon's first 25 games at the helm of the University of Miami football program, the statistics have shown a drastic change in the Hurricanes' discipline on the field. The last two seasons, the Hurricanes are close to even when it comes to penalty differential. The last time the Hurricanes finished the season with fewer penalty yards than their opponents was 1994, when UM was penalized for 775 yards compared to 807 for its opponents.

- ▶ Over the last four games of last season (vs. Virginia Tech, at Georgia Tech, at NC State, vs. California), Robinson averaged 6.5 tackles, 1.75 tackles for a loss and one sack per contest.

Recapping THE SPRING GAME

- ▶ Rising junior running back Damien Berry carried 14 times for 114 yards including a 54-yard touchdown run and quarterback Jacory Harris completed 9-of-16 passes for 141 yards as the Miami offense shined in a 52-3 win over the defense at Lockhart Stadium on March 28 in the annual UM Spring game.
- ▶ Miami's offense racked up 406 total yards on 71 total plays while scoring 52 points in a scoring system put together by the Hurricane coaching staff. The offense scored six points on a touchdown, three points on a field goal, one point on a PAT, one point for crossing the 50-yard line and one point for every first down.
- ▶ UM's defense was able to score six points for any defensive touchdown, two points for a fumble, two points for an INT and one point for a three-and-out. The defense scored its three points on an INT by safety Randy Phillips and one point for a three-and-out.

Coordinators ON TAP

► Randy Shannon's 2009 staff has two new assistant coaches – assistant head coach Mark Whipple and defensive coordinator John Lovett.

► **Mark Whipple, Assistant Head Coach/Quarterbacks/Offensive Coordinator** - Whipple is a veteran of 27 seasons as a coach on both the collegiate and professional levels.

Whipple spent the 2008 season as an offensive assistant coach with the Philadelphia Eagles helping the team to an appearance in the NFC championship game. Before joining the Eagles, he served as the quarterbacks coach of the Pittsburgh Steelers from 2004-06 where he was instrumental in the development of Ben Roethlisberger, who became the youngest starting quarterback to win a Super Bowl. In 2004, Roethlisberger became the first NFL quarterback to finish a season undefeated with a 13-0 record in games he started. Prior to his move to the NFL, Whipple coached 16 seasons as a head coach at the collegiate level compiling an overall record of 121-59 (.672) at stops at the University of Massachusetts, Brown and New Haven.

While at UMass, he posted a 49-26 (.653) record in six years (1998-2003) leading the Minutemen to a Division I-AA National Championship in his first season with the team in 1998. He also won a pair of conference championships. His 1998 national championship team finished with a school record in wins finishing the season 12-3. He was named National Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association and Don Hansen's National Weekly Football Gazette in 1998 and earned Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year honors in 2003. He posted five winning seasons in only six years as head coach. He coached nine different players who won first team All-America honors.

► **John Lovett, Defensive Coordinator**– Lovett has 18 years of experience as a defensive coordinator with stops at Clemson, Auburn and Mississippi, Lovett inherits a unit that returns 15 players with starting experience, including three Freshman All-Americans. Lovett spent the last two seasons as the special teams coordinator and a defensive assistant at North Carolina, where the kickoff coverage unit ranked among the nation's top 15 and the Tar Heels blocked six kicks in 2008. He coached the NCAA all-time leader in combined kick return yards in Brandon Tate. Tate also established the ACC career mark for kickoff return yards. Kicker Connor Barth set the school career mark for field goals.

Prior to going to North Carolina, Lovett was the defensive coordinator at Bowling Green from 2005-06. In addition to coordinating the defense at Bowling Green, Lovett coached linebackers in 2005 and defensive backs in 2006. In his first year with the Falcons, Lovett's defense ranked 20th in the country in turnover margin. Lovett served as the defensive coordinator at Clemson from 2002-04 and helped develop one of the ACC's top defenses. In 2004, Clemson was 11th in the nation in pass defense efficiency (103.4) and 26th in total defense (327.3). In 2003, his defense allowed just 19.2 points per game as Clemson finished the year with nine wins and a top 25 national ranking.

'Canes IN THE NFL IN 2008

► Tune into nearly any NFL game on a Sunday or Monday, and you're likely to see several former Hurricanes excelling at the next level. No school in the country has as many former players in the NFL than the University of Miami, and that is evident by the number of current Pro Bowl players and Super Bowl champions that hail from "The U". The following list is the top performances by former UM players last season in the NFL:

► Tied for the league-lead with 7 INTs; Set NFL record with a 108-yard INT return for a TD

Andre Johnson - Houston Texans WR

► Third in the NFL in rushing yards (1,407); eight rushing TDs and 218 yards receiving
