LARRAÑAGA BY THE NUMBERS

5 - Coach Jim Larrañaga is one of five ACC coaches with a Final Four appearance to his credit. In 2006, Larrañaga became the first coach at a mid-major school to take his team to the NCAA Final Four in 27 years.

7 - Larrañaga is no stranger to the ACC. In his seven seasons as an assistant coach at Virginia, the Cavaliers participated in the NCAA Final Four in 1981 and 1984, won three ACC Championships and finished in the Top 5 of the AP rankings.

14 - Larrañaga has made 14 postseason appearances in the past 24 years, including six NCAA tournaments.

31 - Larrañaga is in his 31st year as a head coach and has successfully transitioned three institutions into successful programs: Miami, Bowling Green and George Mason.

500 - Coach L is one of five ACC coaches with 500 or more wins.

LARRAÑAGA - WHY MIAMI?

Along with returning to the best basketball conference in the country, Coach L had a few personal reasons for accepting the head coaching job at Miami. Coach's grandfather was from Cuba, where he produced the Larrañaga [lare-en-YAH-ga] cigar. Coach's father was raised in Key West before moving to The Bronx, N.Y., getting married and raising six children. Coach L was raised in The Bronx, but vacationed to Florida as a boy. He also has owned a house in Sarasota - which he bought from Dick Vitale's daughter and three of his siblings have retired to Florida.

DID YOU KNOW

Coach L became the first Miami coach to win 20+ games in his first two seasons at UM and only the fourth of 12 UM coaches to post two 20-win seasons.

Former Cane Rick Barry was named one of the Greatest Players in NBA History.

Miami native and former Cane James Jones won the 2010-2011 NBA All-Star Weekend 3-Point Contest and the NBA Championship in the 2011-2012 season.

Six-time NBA All Star Amar'e Stoudemire enrolled at UM last year and is taking classes to earn his bachelor's degree.

UM is in its 11th season in the ACC.

Coach L led the George Mason Patriots to the Final Four with big wins over some of basketball's elite teams such as Michigan State, UNC, and UConn. He was the first coach to take a mid-major to a Final Four in 27 years when his team advanced in 2006.

In 14 years at George Mason, Larrañaga led the Patriots to five NCAA Tournament appearances (2011, 2008, 2006, 2001, 1999), including the 2006 Final Four.

Miami basketball received APR (academic progress rate) Public Recognition Awards for being among the top 10 percent in APR in their sport. Miami ranks in the top 10 percent NCAA men's basketball with a 990 APR.

The Miami Department of Athletics recorded a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 92 percent. Miami's department-wide GSR is tied for third among ACC schools and 10th overall among FBS programs. UM has exceeded the NCAA average GSR in each of the last 10 years.

According to latest US News & World Report rankings, the University of Miami is tied as the top academic institution in the state of Florida and ranks 48th nationally.

The Canes have averaged 20+ wins in each of the last eight seasons.

The Hurricanes have made at least one trey in 884 of 890 games since the NCAA adopted the 3-point shot in 1986.

Miami has held 743 of its last 744 opponents to less than 100 points. UNC was the last team to score 100+, defeating UM 105-64 on Jan. 31, 2007.

CANES FACED THREE TOP 15 TEAMS IN FOUR GAMES

Over a 19-day span, Miami faced three teams ranked in the Top 15 and one receiving votes. The Canes started with No. 3 Virginia, a double-overtime loss on Jan. 3. After defeating unranked Boston College, UM downed No. 4 Duke (Jan. 13) by 16 points in Cameron Indoor Stadium, then lost to No. 12 Notre Dame (Jan. 17), after leading for 29 minutes of the game. Miami then hosts RV NC State (Jan. 22). In late February, the Canes will face another tough stretch against ranked teams when Miami plays at No. 10 Louisville (Feb. 21), then comes home to face in-state rival Florida State (Feb. 25) and No. 15 North Carolina (Feb. 28).

COACH L APPROACHING WIN NO. 550

Coach Jim Larrañaga is two wins away from 550 career victories and one ACC win away from 300 conference victories. He started the 2014-15 season with a 536-370 overall and 297-185 conference record in 30 years as a head coach.

NEWTON BREAKS OUT AT NOTRE DAME

After a dunk at Duke that landed him on ESPN's Top Plays, Ja'Quan Newton broke out against Notre Dame with career-best marks of 16 points, five assists, two rebounds, one steal and one blocked shot in 28 minutes.

JEKIRI IMPRESSES IN JUNIOR SEASON

Junior forward Tonye Jekiri has nearly doubled his output in points and rebounds each season as a Hurricane. The 7-footer is averaging 7.9 points and 10.1 rebounds this season, up from 4.2 ppg and 5.5 rpg his sophomore year and 1.4 points and 1.6 rebounds his rookie campaign. Through 17 games, he has already surpassed his 22 assists from last year, posting 28 in 2014-15. He is just two blocks short of his sophomore total of 29.

JEKIRI LEADS ACC IN REBOUNDING

Junior Tonye Jekiri is atop the conference in rebounds per game at 10.1 and in ACC games only with 12.5. In ACC games, Angel Rodriguez is No. 7 in scoring with 17.5 ppg and Sheldon McClellan is No. 15 in scoring with 14.5 ppg.

YEARLY IMPROVEMENTS

Manu Lecomte and Tonye Jekiri have drastically improved their stats from a season ago, while transfers Sheldon McClellan and Angel Rodriguez have also improved their averages. The chart below shows 2014-15 overall stats and 2013-14 overall stats for Lecomte and Jekiri and 2014-15 overall vs. 2012-13 for the transfers.

MIAMI DOWNS NO. 4 DUKE AT CAMERON INDOOR STADIUM

Miami defeated No. 4 Duke 90-74 on Jan. 13 at Cameron Indoor Stadium, upsetting the Blue Devils' 41-game home winning streak, and setting various Canes records. See page seven for a complete listing of postgame notes.

POINT GUARDS SCORE 47 OF 90 POINTS AT DUKE

Point guards Angel Rodriguez and Manu Lecomte scored 47 of Miami's 90 points at Duke. Rodriguez was 8-15 from the field, 4-6 from distance and 4-6 at the line for 24 points while Lecomte, who came off the bench, was 5-10 from the field and 3-4 from three, along with 10-11 at the line for 23 points. The last time two Hurricanes scored 20+points was in the ACC Tournament in 2013, when Shane Larkin had 28 and Trey McKinney Jones knocked down 20.

RODRIGUEZ AT HIS BEST AGAINST THE BEST

In Miami's three games against Top 10 teams - No. 3 Virginia, No. 4 Duke and No. 8/7 Florida - Angel Rodriguez has put on a show, averaging 24.3 points and 5.0 assists.

Against Florida, he scored 22 of his 24 points in the final nine minutes, draining five second-half three-pointers to help Miami earn the win.

The junior scored 17 points in the second half against the Cavaliers, knocking down three clutch free throws with 0.9 seconds left in regulation to send the game into overtime. In the two overtimes combined, he scored six points, including 4-4 at the line, and dished out three assists, accounting for 13 of Miami's 17 overtime points.

At Duke, Rodriguez scored eight-straight points – including two from long distance – to give Miami a decisive lead. He tallied 15 points and four steals in the second half at Cameron Indoor Stadium.

RODRIGUEZ SHINES IN THE SECOND HALF

Senior guard Angel Rodriguez knows how to finish a game. In seven games, he has scored double-digit points in the second stanza, including 22 at Florida, 17 against Virginia, 15 at Duke and 14 vs. Boston College.

JEKIRI POSTS BACK-TO-BACK ACC DOUBLE-DOUBLES

Junior forward Tonye Jekiri has posted a pair of doubledoubles in ACC play with 10 points and 10 rebounds at Duke added to 13 points and 15 rebounds against Boston College. Jekiri just missed a double-double against Virginia, with eight points and 12 rebounds. He now has three doubledoubles this season and four for his career. The native of Nigeria has scored 10+ points five times this season, and grabbed 10+ rebounds eight times.

HURRICANES VISIT HOMESTEAD AIR RESERVE BASE

On January 6, the Hurricanes visited the Homestead Air Reserve Base, where the team learned about military procedures, held an interactive basketball practice with airmen, ate dinner with the troops, and took photos with an F-16.

RODRIGUEZ ON ROBERTSON & COUSY WATCH LISTS

Junior PG Angel Rodriguez is one of 36 players listed on the watch list for the 2015 Bob Cousy Collegiate Point Guard of the Year Award and was one of 24 players named to the early-season watch list for the 2014-15 Oscar Robertson Trophy for national player of the year, the U.S. Basketball Writers Association announced Nov. 24.

CANES WIN 10 NON-CONFERENCE GAMES

Miami won 10 games on the non-conference slate, marking the seventh time since joining a conference (BIG EAST in 1991-92) that the Canes have tallied 10-or-more non-conference wins. In Larrañaga's first three seasons at The U, Miami was 9-4, 9-3 and 9-4.

MCCLELLAN TOPS 1,000 CAREER POINTS

Early in the second half on Dec. 8 against Savannah State, junior Sheldon McClellan knocked down a jumper in the paint to score his 1,000th career point. The guard scored 843 of his career points in two seasons at Texas.

BURNETT BREAKS OUT IN BACK-TO-BACK GAMES

Redshirt freshman Deandre Burnett broke out for 40 points off the bench over two games for the Hurricanes, after missing the previous four contests due to an injury. He hit six shots from long range and shot 46.9 percent from the field, and added 5.5 rebounds and 1.5 steals, in 26.5 minutes per game. Against No. 24/25 Illinois, Burnett notched 19 points and 8 rebounds in 24 minutes, hitting 7-16 from the field and knocking down a trio of 3-pointers. Against Green Bay,

Burnett scored 21 of Miami's 55 points, adding three rebounds, two steals and a block in 29 minutes. He hit 50 percent (8-16) of his shots, again draining three shots from distance.

LARKIN WITH KNICKS IN SECOND NBA SEASON

Former Cane Shane Larkin is in his second season in the NBA, playing for the New York Knicks after being traded from the Dallas Mavericks. Larkin is averaging 5.8 points, 2.1 rebounds, 2.6 assists and 1.3 steals in 23.1 minutes per game, through 39 games. He's shooting 41.9 percent from the field.

SEASONS OF CHANGE

Miami faced back-to-back seasons with roster turnover after losing six players from the 2012-13 ACC Championship season - five to graduation, one to NBA - then six seniors (5 scholarship) after the 2013-14 campaign.

MCCLELLAN TABBED ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Junior guard Sheldon McClellan was named the Atlantic Coast Conference Player of the Week, the league announced Dec. 1. McClellan hit 73.9 percent (17-of-23) from the field, 75 percent (6-of-8) from 3-point range and 100 percent (8-of-8) from the foul line in two Miami wins this week. The Houston native averaged 24.0 points, 6.5 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 1.0 steals in 31.5 minutes per game. On the 10th day of an 11-day road trip, McClellan notched a doubledouble with 31 points and 11 rebounds while shooting 11of-17 (64.7 percent) from the field and 5-of-7 (.714) from beyond the arc in Miami's 77-74 win at Charlotte. In an 87-75 win over South Alabama, McClellan scored 17 points on a perfect 6-of-6 performance from the field.

RODRIGUEZ NAMED ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Angel Rodriguez was named Atlantic Coast Conference Player of the Week, the league announced Nov. 24. Rodriguez opened his week by scoring 22 points in the final nine minutes at No. 8/7 Florida, draining five second-half three-pointers to help Miami earn an impressive win. Rodriguez also demonstrated his defensive prowess by drawing a charge with three seconds remaining in the game against the Gators.

For the week, Rodriguez averaged 16.8 points, 5.3 assists, 3.8 rebounds, 3.0 steals and 1.3 blocks per game. He hit 45.8 percent from the field, including 45.5 percent from three, and 76.5 percent from the line. The junior scored 13 plus points in all four games this week, and despite standing 5-foot-11, blocked five shots over four games. He drained a three-pointer in every game, including five against UF.

COACHING COORDINATORS FOR MIAMI

Miami's assistant coaching staff is set up in a coordinator system, with Eric Konkol as the offensive coordinator and schedule coordinator, Michael Huger manning the defense and Chris Caputo handling the scout for every opponent.

ANTHONY LAWRENCE, JR. SIGNS NLI WITH CANES

Anthony Lawrence, Jr. has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball for the University of Miami.

Nicknamed "Amp," Lawrence is a 6-7, 200-pound guard/ forward from Saint Petersburg, Fla., who led his Lakewood Senior High School team to the Class 5A state championship game as a junior. Lawrence scored 18 points in the championship game and totaled 25 rebounds in two state tournament games.

Lawrence averaged 20 points and 13 rebounds as a junior at Lakewood, and in his sophomore campaign, averaged 21 points, eight rebounds and four steals. Listed as a fourstar recruit by ESPN, the long wing can finish on the break or knock down the three. He brings a complete game to the Hurricanes with the ability to handle the ball, pass, shoot, rebound and play defense with great intensity.

Lawrence, who played AAU ball for Each 1 Teach 1 Elite, chose Miami over offers from USC, Clemson and Texas, among others. Anthony's father, Anthony Lawrence Sr. was a two-year letterman at Miami from 1991-93. After college, he played overseas in Portugal, Mexico and the Dominican Republic. His brother, Patrick, also played at Miami from 1991-94.

CANES IN SPAIN

In August, the University of Miami embarked on a 10-day educational and competitive tour to Spain. The Canes were 4-0 against teams from Barcelona, Valencia and Madrid. In four games in Spain, Miami outscored its opponent 89.8 to 65.8 ppg and pulled down nearly twice as many rebounds, 51.8 to 27.0 per night. The Canes hit 51.8 percent from the field, 27.8 percent from three and 62.4 percent at the line. UM also averaged 17.8 assists and 13.3 steals per night.

Individually, four Canes averaged double digits, led by Sheldon McClellan (20.0), followed by Dre Burnett (14.3), Ja'Quan Newton (13.5) and James Palmer (11.5). Spaniard Ivan Cruz Uceda averaged 11.0 rebounds per game while Tonye Jekiri averaged 8.5 rpg. Senior Angel Rodriguez did not play any games in Spain due to injury.

LARRAÑAGA CONTRACT EXTENDED THROUGH 2022

The University of Miami extended Coach Jim Larrañaga's contract through May 31, 2022, Director of Athletics Blake James announced in September 2014. Larrañaga first signed a five-year contract in April 2011, then was granted a three-year extension in 2012.

LECOMTE NAMED TO U20 ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

Manu Lecomte was named to U20 Men Division B 2014 All-Tournament Team after leading Belgium to the championship game of the FIBA U20 European Championships, held in Sarajevo, Bosnia & Herzegovina.

The Canes sophomore averaged 20.0 points, 5.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists, 1.1 steals in 30.4 minutes per game in the tournament. In his eight games, he averaged 47.1 percent from the field, including 53.8 percent from 2-point range, and was 79.5 percent at the line. He ranked second in the tournament in points per game, fourth in field goals made and free throw percentage and seventh in free throws made. He posted a 34-point night against Belarus, also recording four assists, three steals and three rebounds in the 21-point win. Against Cyprus, Lecomte hit 11-of-13 from the line. He drained four shots from long distance in two outings and had six or more rebounds in four games.

Lecomte has been part of Belgium's national team program for most of the past decade. He was a member of the U16 team for two years, the U18 team for two years and is in his second year with the U20 squad. With the appearance in the title game, the Belgian team will move from Division B to the top league, Division A.

NEW SCOREBOARD HUNG IN BANKUNITED CENTER

Miami Hurricanes home basketball games will be more exciting this year as a new state-of-the-art center-hung scoreboard – made possible by a \$1 million Momentum2 campaign gift from FMSbonds, Inc. – will be unveiled for the 2014-15 season.

The gift was made possible by FMSbonds, Inc. President James A. Klotz and Chairman Paul Feinsilver. Klotz is a longtime University of Miami Athletics donor and is a member of the Athletics Visiting Committee.

The center-hung scoreboard is 24 feet wide by 17 feet tall (including ring). The main screen is 10' 8.8" in height and the ring is 2' 5". The main screen has 2,848 columns of resolution.

COACH L TIES TO THE ACC

Coach Jim Larrañaga was an assistant coach at Virginia from 1979-1986, under the leadership of Terry Holland. In those seven seasons, Larrañaga helped the Cavaliers to five NCAA appearances: Final Four twice, Elite Eight once, Sweet 16 once and Round of 64 once, as well as two NIT appearances, including the Championship and Quarterfinal round.

MIAMI BASKETBALL – THE EARLY YEARS

The University of Miami basketball program was dormant for 14 years from 1971-1985. In 1983 Director of Athletics Sam Jankovich announced the resurrection of men's basketball at Miami, with the reinstatement vote by the UM Board of Trustees on Oct. 12, 1983. Head coach Bill Foster was hired March 21, 1984, adding assistants Clint Bryant, Seth Greenberg and Cesar Odio by July 1. Tim Harvey was the staff's first recruit, a 6-10, 240-pound center from Plainfield, N.J., who transferred from Georgia Tech. On Oct. 15, 1984 the first men's basketball practice in 12 years was held on the patio in the center of campus, viewed by more than 200 students. Miami defeated The Citadel, 85-77, on Nov. 22, 1985, in the first game of the new era of UM basketball.

LARRAÑAGA MEMBER OF UM FACULTY

Coach Jim Larrañaga is an Adjunct Assistant Professor of Kinesiology and Sport Sciences at the University of Miami. Due to his head coaching responsibilities, Larrañaga is a guest lecturer at several different classes in the School of Education and Human Development throughout the semester.

2014-15 QUICK HITS

- UM opened the season with nine scholarship players available. This is the second-straight season the Canes open the campaign with eight or more new players and only nine available scholarship players.
- Miami has 10 new players on the roster for 2014-15: Eight scholarship newcomers, one D-I transfer who must sit out and one walk-on.

• UM opened the 2014-15 campaign with just two players from the 2013-14 season, in sophomore Manu Lecomte and junior Tonye Jekiri. Sophomore Davon Reed was out through Dec. 5 with a lower extremity injury.

- Seven players didn't wear a Miami uniform last season.
- Miami's 14-man roster includes players from five countries
- Belgium, Nigeria, Puerto Rico, Spain, U.S. six states -Florida, Texas, New York, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, New Hampshire - and Washington, D.C.
- There are no seniors playing for the Canes: One graduate student, five juniors, three sophomores and five freshmen.
- Three D-I transfers are eligible to play in 2014-15: Sheldon McClellan (Texas), Angel Rodriguez (Kansas State) and Joe Thomas (Niagara).
- The Canes lost six players including three starters and the team's top two scorers from the 2013-14 season, five to graduation and one transferred.
- Miami lost five of its top seven players from 2013-14. To open the 2013-14 season, Miami had lost its top six players from the 2012-13 campaign.
- Without Reed, the Canes returned 11.9 points, 7.6 rebounds, 3.0 assists, 1.3 steals and 0.9 blocks per game from the 2013-14 season. A year ago, Miami opened the 2013-14 season returning 9.3 points, 5.1 rebounds, 1.1 assists, 0.8 steals and 0.5 blocks per game.
- For the second-straight season, Miami returned the fewest points per game (18.4) and rebounds per game (9.2) of all ACC schools.
- The Canes held opponents to just 59.5 points per game in 2013-14, which was ranked No. 11 of 345 teams in Division I. Miami also averaged 61.5 ppg, which was ranked No. 337.
- The Canes lost 10 games by five points or less, or in overtime, during the 2013-14 season, on their way to a 17-16 overall record.

RECAPPING MIAMI AT DUKE, JAN. 13, 2015

*With Miami's 16-point win at Cameron on Jan. 13, UM ended Duke's 41-game home winning streak, the longest active streak in Division I. The last team to defeat Duke at home was North Carolina on March 3, 2012, with an 18-point victory.

* Miami also snapped Duke's 19-game ACC home game winning streak.

* According to the Associated Press, Duke's loss to unranked Miami marked just the seventh home loss the Blue Devils have sustained in the last 242 games against unranked teams.

* Miami's 90 points scored against Duke are the most points scored by an unranked opponent in a regulation win in Cameron Indoor Stadium since NC State's 96 points on Feb. 23, 1983.

* Miami has dealt Duke its last two regular-season losses by 16-or-more points: 27 (90-63) on Jan. 23, 2013 at Miami, and 16 (90-74) on Jan. 13, 2015 at Duke.

* In a span of six days, Miami's men's and women's basketball teams both beat teams ranked No. 4 in the country with the men defeating Duke by 16 points, and the women taking down Notre Dame by 15 points. Miami and North Carolina are the only schools in the country with wins over top five teams in men's and women's basketball this season. Miami is the only one with wins over a top four team in both.

With back-to-back wins over Duke by NC State and Miami ...

*Duke was beaten in back-to-back regular season games for the first time since 2009 (Feb. 11, 101-87 to UNC; Feb. 15, 80-74 to Boston College).

*Duke was defeated in back-to-back games by 12+ for the first time since 1995-96 (March 8, 82-69 to Maryland; March 14, 75-40 to Eastern Michigan).

*Coach K lost consecutive conference games by 12+ for the first time since 1982-83. That same season, Duke lost its last two games by 12+ points, including a 43-point loss in the ACC Tournament to No. 2 Virginia, where Coach Jim Larrañaga was an assistant coach.

Miami's 16-point win over Duke ...

* is the most lopsided loss an unranked visitor has handed to a ranked Duke team in the ACC era.

* is the third time in the past 25 years Duke has lost a home game by more than 16 points. The other two were 88-70 vs. UNC on March 3, 2012 and 77-60 vs. NC State on Jan. 18, 1995.

* is the Blue Devils' worst defeat since the 18-point loss to Louisville on March 31, 2013 in the NCAA Tournament.

* is the fifth-largest home margin of defeat of Coach K's Duke career. In 526 home games, his worst home losses are: 24 to D. Smith ('83), 20 to D. Smith ('89), 18 to R. Williams ('12), 17 to Valvano ('83), 16 to Larrañaga ('15).

Since Coach L's arrival at Miami in 2011-12 ...

* Miami is the only team in the country to beat Duke three times.

* Miami is the only team in the country to play Duke multiple times and have a winning record.

* Duke has five losses by 16-plus - two of them are to Miami.

* Duke is 1-4 when allowing its opponent to score 90 points. Miami has two of those victories: 27 (90-63) on Jan. 23, 2013 at Miami, and 16 (90-74) on Jan. 13, 2015 at Duke. Syracuse and Kansas also won by scoring 90 points, both in 2013-14.

* In Miami's eight wins over ranked teams, the Canes have outscored their opponents by 10.4 points per game (621-538).

* Miami is the only ACC school with three wins over Duke and one of five ACC schools with multiple wins over the Blue Devils.

* Miami is the only ACC school with a winning record over Duke after playing multiple games. (ND is 1-0).

Since 2009-10 (Duke's last national championship year) ...

*Miami is the only team to win at Cameron Indoor Stadium twice.

*Duke has lost four home games - half of them are to Miami.

*Duke has three ACC losses by 16-plus points - two of them are to Miami.

With wins over No. 6/7 Florida and No. 4 Duke ...

* Miami has defeated a pair of Top 8 teams in the same season, both on the road.

* Miami has won two true road games against ranked opponents for the first time since 1998-99, when the Canes downed No. 9/10 St. John's 73-70, No. 18/17 Syracuse 76-63 and No. 2 Connecticut 73-71, all on their home courts.

Team Notes

* Miami's win over Duke marked its second win on the road over a Top 10 opponent. Earlier this season, Miami defeated then No. 8/7 Florida.

* The Hurricanes' win over No. 4 Duke is the highest ranked opponent Miami has defeated on the road since its 73-71 win over No. 2 Connecticut.

* Since the arrival of Jim Larrañaga at Miami, the Hurricanes have posted a 3-2 mark against Duke, earning three of UM's five all-time wins against the Blue Devils.

* Miami has outscored Duke 380-357 in those five games. The Canes have made 46.1 percent (135-293) of their shots while the Blue Devils have hit only 40.4 percent (127-314). From distance, Miami is 34-93 (36.6%) and Duke is 38-123 (30.9%). The Canes have out-rebounded Duke 196-194 and scored more points in the paint (164-152).

* In the three games played at Cameron Indoor Stadium, Miami has outscored Duke 244-227. Unranked Miami defeated the No. 7/5 Blue Devils 78-74 in overtime in 2012, fell 79-76 to No. 3/3 Duke in 2013, when Miami was ranked No. 6/7, and defeated No. 4 Duke 90-74 in 2015. In those three games, there were 28 lead changes and 23 times the score was tied.

* Miami's 90 points against Duke were a season high. The Hurricanes' 56 second-half points were the most points Miami has scored in one half of play all year.

* Miami's matchup with Duke marked the Canes' third Top 10 opponent it has faced this season (No. 7 Florida, No. 3 Virginia and No. 4 Duke).

* With the win, Miami improved to 4-7 in ACC road openers since joining the league in 2004-05. They also hold a 3-5 mark against ranked teams in ACC road openers.

* Miami led by as many as 20 points with 1:09 remaining in the game.

* The Hurricanes outrebounded the Blue Devils by a 41-31 count and held a 51.8-43.9 shooting advantage.

* Miami scored 90 points for the fifth time in Coach L's UM career, and the third time in ACC play.

* The Canes shot 51.8 percent from the field and 50.0 percent (10-20) from three in the game, the sixth time this season Miami has hit more than 50 percent of its shots.

* UM scored 56 points (66.7 FG%) in the second half against the Blue Devils, a team that only allows opponents 62.7 points per game, on the average.

Player Notes

* Angel Rodriguez scored a game-high 24 points on 8-of-15 shooting. He fell just one point shy of his career-best point total of 25 points, which he set earlier this year against Virginia.

* Rodriguez scored in double figures for the 13th time this season and the fifth-consecutive game.

* Rodriguez also scored 20-or-more points for the third time this season.

* Manu Lecomte finished with a career-high 23 points on 5-of-10 shooting from the field.

* Lecomte finished in double figures for the ninth time this season.

* Sheldon McClellan also scored in double figures as he finished with 14 points. McClellan has scored in double figures in 13 straight games. He has scored in double figures in 14 games this season.

* Tonye Jekiri finished the game with a team-high 10 rebounds. Jekiri has pulled down 10-ormore rebounds in eight games this season, including the last three games.

Head Coach Jim Larrañaga Notes

* Coach Jim Larrañaga is two wins away from 550 career victories and one win away from 300 conference victories. He started the 2014-15 season with a 536-370 overall and 297-185 conference record in 30 years as a head coach.

* Larrañaga has a 548-374 overall record in his 31st season as a head coach, one of five ACC coaches with 500+ wins.

* He is 78-40 in his third season at the University of Miami, with a 33-22 mark in ACC play.

* Miami improved to 3-2 against Duke since the arrival of Coach Jim Larrañaga in 2011-12. Miami has outscored Duke 380-357 in those five games. Larrañaga has three of UM's five alltime wins against the Blue Devils.

Jim Larrañaga was named the 12th head coach of the University of Miami men's basketball program on April 22, 2011.

After leading UM to the 2013 NCAA Sweet 16, and winning the school's first ACC regular season and tournament championships, Larrañaga was honored as the AP, Naismith, USBWA Henry Iba and ACC Coach of the Year. The Bronx native helped Miami to a No. 2 national ranking by both the AP and USA TODAY, and a No. 2 seed in the NCAA tournament. He is the 10th

coach in the last 10 years to lead two top-10 programs, as Miami was No. 2 on Feb. 18, 2013, and George Mason was No. 8 in the final Top 25 poll in 2006.

Larrañaga directed the Canes to a 27-point win over No. 1 Duke and three other 20+ point wins over ACC opponents that season, including North Carolina (+26), Florida State (+24) and Boston College (+22). UM's 29 overall and 15 ACC wins in 2012-13 were program-bests, as was the 14game winning streak and 13-0 start in conference play. Other program firsts include defeating all three teams in the North Carolina Triangle in the same season, beating a trio of teams in the Top 20 since joining the ACC and hosting five home sellouts at the BankUnited Center.

Individually, Coach L saw Shane Larkin earn the ACC Player of the Year and Lute Olson National Player of the Year awards, as well as All-American status and finalist nods for the Bob Cousy, John Wooden and James Naismith player of the year honors before declaring early for the 2013 NBA Draft. Larkin was also the ACC Tournament MVP, on the All-ACC Defensive team and a defensive All-American. Durand Scott was the ACC Defensive Player of the Year, three players - Larkin, Scott and Kenny Kadji - were listed on all-conference teams and four were on the ACC All-Tournament Team – Larkin, Scott, Julian Gamble and Trey McKinney Jones. All six seniors on the Sweet 16 team earned academic degrees from the University of Miami and one player was listed on the All-ACC Academic Team.

Larrañaga came to Miami after serving as the head coach at George Mason for 14 seasons. He guided that program to five NCAA Tournament appearances (1999, 2001, 2006, 2008, 2011) - including an unprecedented run to the 2006 Final Four that captured the nation's attention, defeating Michigan State, North Carolina, Wichita State and UConn along the way. Following that run, he was selected the 2006 Clair Bee Coach of the Year. Larrañaga built the GMU Patriots' program into a perennial contender in the highly-regarded Colonial Athletic Association, winning more games (273) than any other coach in program and conference history en

route to three conference titles (1999, 2001, 2008). A two-time CAA Coach of the Year honoree, Larrañaga earned the accolade in 2011, leading the Patriots to a 27-7 overall record and 16-2 conference mark en route to the CAA regularseason title and their fifth NCAA Tournament appearance under his leadership. Seeded a program-best eighth in the NCAA Tournament, George Mason rallied from a double-digit deficit to defeat ninth-seeded Villanova, 61-57, before falling to overall No. 1 seed Ohio State in the third round. In 2006, Larrañaga became the first coach at a mid-major school to take his team to the Final Four in 27 years and earned an at-large berth for a CAA team for the first time in 20 years. Along the way, he led Mason to a school record in wins, the school's first national ranking, George Mason's first appearance in the Top 10 and the school's first wins over Top 10 teams.

With 29 years of head coaching experience, the native of The Bronx, N.Y., previously served as the head coach at Bowling Green for 11 seasons (1986-1997) and at Division II American International for two seasons (1977-79). His first coaching opportunity came at Davidson College, where he served as an assistant coach to Terry Holland. Davidson captured three Southern Conference regular-season championships and an NIT berth in his five years there, and he compiled a 47-12 record doubling as the freshman team coach. In 1976, he left Davidson and spent one season as player-coach for the Geronemo Basketball Club in Belgium. A 1971 graduate of Providence College with a degree in economics, Larrañaga was a four-year letterman for the Friars. As the team captain in his senior season, he led Providence to a 20-8 record and an NIT appearance. He graduated as the school's fifth all-time leading scorer with 1,258 points and was selected in the sixth round of the draft by the Detroit Pistons of the National Basketball Association. He was the team's top scorer as a sophomore and junior and was named New England's Division I Sophomore of the Year in 1969. He was inducted into the Providence College Hall of Fame in 1991.

Larrañaga, 65, and his wife, Liz, have two sons - Jay, who played for his father at Bowling Green and is an assistant coach with the Boston Celtics, and Jon, who was a member of his father's George Mason teams from 1999-2003 - and four grandchildren.

THE LAST TIME OUT (MARCH 13, 2014)

Recap: Rion Brown's fifteenth straight double-digit scoring game was not enough for Miami Thursday night, as they fell in the second round of the ACC Tournament to NC State, 67-58. T.J. Warren scored 24 points for North Carolina State. Ralston Turner added 16 of his 22 points after halftime for the seventh-seeded Wolfpack (20-12), who trailed 53-51 with about 4 minutes left before going on a 12-0 run that kept Mark Gottfried's team alive in the tournament. Turner came up big during that spurt. Warren hit a turnaround for the lead at the 2:23 mark, then Turner knocked down a tough 3-pointer over Rion Brown that gave the Wolfpack a 58-53 lead with 1:42 to go. Davon Reed added 9 points for Miami, a day after scoring 14 in his first tournament appearance. The freshman also added a steal to his stat line. Reed's three-pointer with 3:52 left in the game gave Miami their first lead of the second half. However, NC State closed the game on a 13-5 run and eliminated the defending champions.

Noteworthy: Miami ends the season 17-16 overall, 7-11 in the ACC and 1-1 in the ACC Tournament. Coach Jim Larrañaga ends the season with an overall record od 536-370, and a mark of 66-36 in his three seasons at Miami. Miami is 11-9 in ACC Tournament play since joining the league for the 2004-05 season. Under head coach Jim Larrañaga, Miami is 5-2 in the ACC Tournament. Miami has won five of its last seven games in the ACC Tournament. Miami is 8-4 in tournament games played in Greensboro. Miami is now 7-11 in the all-time series against NC State, 3-4 against the Wolfpack at home, 1-1 at neutral sites and 2-6 on the road. Miami is 1-2 against the Wolfpack this season. Starters against NC State: Tonye Jekiri, Erik Swoope, Manu Lecomte, Garrius Adams and Rion Brown. Rion Brown hit one 3-pointer against NC State, tying him with Guillermo Diaz' 174, for No. 7 on Miami's all-time list of 3-point shots made in a career. Brown has played 136 career games, which is the most in UM history, surpassing Durand Scott, who played in 132 games. Rion Brown scored in double-figures (22) for the 15th-straight game and 28th time overall this season. Rion Brown scored a personal ACC Tournament career high 22 points, surpassing his previous high of 15 on March 12 against Virginia Tech. Tonye Jekiri grabbed nine rebounds, marking the 17th time with five or more boards. Raphael Akpejiori scored for the first time since Feb. 19, recording two points, which were his first career points in the ACC Tournament. Garrius Adams pulled down seven boards, recording 5+ rebounds for the 15th time this year.
