


WEEKEND STORYLINES & NEWS

- Miami will travel north for an ACC road series at NC State from March 17-19 at Doak Field on ACC Network Extra & WVUM.
- Miami leads the all-time series with the Wolfpack 33-14; the Hurricanes topped NC State 8-7 in the lone matchup last year at the 2016 ACC Championship. UM has never lost a series to the Pack in Raleigh, with a 10-4 all-time road mark.
- The Canes swept a midweek pair with visiting Maine (March 14-15), earning a 4-3 win in Game 1 and a 7-2 win in Game 2.
 Led by a 37-hit barrage over three games, the Hurricanes won their opening ACC series, taking two of three games from
- No. 23 Georgia Tech. UM won 10-8 in Game 1, fell 7-5 in exra innings in Game 2, and stormed back for a 17-7 Game 3 win.
 Head coach Jim Morris has the fifth-most wins in Division I history (1,543), the third-most wins among active coaches, a
- .695 winning precentage (sixth among active coaches), and 193 more wins than the next active coach (Mike Fox, UNC).
 The Hurricanes had four different players earn Preseason All-America recognition: Michael Mediavilla. Jesse Lebore and
- Johnny Ruiz were recognized by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper while Carl Chester was honored by Baseball America.
- The Hurricanes made their 25th trip to the College World Series in 2016, finishing with a 50-14 record and a 21-9 mark in
- ACC play. Miami was the No. 3 national seed for the postseason, and won the **2016 ACC Regular Season Championship**.
- The Canes had seven players selected in the 2016 MLB Draft, including Chicago White Sox' first-round pick Zack Collins.

THE HURRICANES SKIPPER

It doesn't matter if his roster is full of rookies or veterans, University of Miami head coach Jim Morris continues to produce some of college baseball's most consistent and dominant teams entering his 24th season in Coral Gables. With a talented staff around him, Morris' Hurricanes are continually the class of collegiate baseball, having won national titles in 1999 and 2001 and the ACC Baseball Regular Season Championship in 2008, 2014 and 2016.

In his 23-season tenure at Miami, no program has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a college baseball-record 44 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 13 of Morris' 23 seasons in Coral Gables - including most recently in 2016, when Miami was awarded the No. 3 national seed for the NCAA postseason.

Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris has won 17 of 23 NCAA Regional appearances at UM, including a record 13 straight to start his tenure in Coral Gables. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 32 years - all 23 at Miami and his final nine at Georgia Tech.

A three-time national coach of the year and 2008 Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year, Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 1,039-428-3 (.707) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,543-672-4 (.695) Division I record in 35 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 39 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,674-711-4 (.701) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 23 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium's renovation prior to its reopening in 2009.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in 2016, as he led the program to its 25th College World Series appearance in history, its third straight ACC Coastal Division title and the program's second ACC Regular Season Championship in a three-year span.

Morris became just the sixth coach in the history of Division I baseball to reach the 1,500-win plateau when Miami topped Louisville 8-4 in dramatic fashion on March 18, 2016. Eight days later, Miami topped Clemson 5-4 in 11 innings - also in walk-off fashion - to send Morris to his 1,000th win at the helm of the Hurricanes.

Under his direction, the Hurricanes set the program record for fielding percentage with a sparkling .983 mark in 2016, a figure that ranked best nationwide. Seven Hurricanes were selected in the 2016 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft, including the program's first first-round selection since 2010 in catcher Zack Collins (No. 10, Chicago White Sox). Morris also helped guide two Hurricanes to a pair of major awards: Collins became the first Hurricane to win the Johnny Bench Award as the nation's top collegiate catcher in 2016, while Bryan Garcia set the program saves record and became the first Hurricane to win the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Award.

Morris entered 2015 as among the winningest active coaches in Division I baseball with 1,435 wins. He wasted little time in moving up the record books, moving into sole



possession of eighth place in all-time wins (1,439) on Feb. 15 with a 25-4 win over Rutgers and then seventh place with a 9-5 win over Louisville on March 7 (1,445).

Miami captured the 2014 ACC Regular Season Championship under his watch, recording 24 wins in conference play for the first time in program history.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that have gone on to play in the Major Leagues are Peter O'Brien (Kansas City), Chris Hermann (Arizona), Yasmani Grandal (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jemile Weeks (Boston), Danny Valencia (Oakland), Jon Jay (Chicago), Yonder Alonso (Oakland), Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Ryan Jackson (St. Louis), Pat Burrell (Philadelphia), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston), among many others. CANES TO FACE WOLFPACK IN RALEIGH

• The Hurricanes travel to Raleigh, N.C., for a weekend series with host NC State from March 17-19 at Doak Field. First pitch for the series opener is set for 6:30 p.m. on ACC Network Extra and WVUM.

• Miami captured a thrilling **8-7 win** in the lone matchup between the two programs in 2016 at the **ACC Championship** in Durham, N.C. Edgar Michelangeli connected on a three-run, ninth-inning home run to put Miami ahead late at Durham Bulls Athletic Park.

• UM carries a commanding 33-14 all-time lead in the head-tohead series, including a **10-4 lead in games played at Doak Field.** Miami is **7-1** in its last eight games against NC State dating to 2014. and swept the Pack in its last trip to Raleigh from March 28-30, 2014.

• Miami junior righthander Jesse Lepore (1-2, 3.33 ERA) will oppose NC State senior lefthander Sean Adler (2-2, 4.64 ERA) in the series opener on **Friday. March 17** at 6:30 p.m (ACC Network Extra).

LAST TIME OUT: MIAMI TOPS MAINE TWICE

• Miami earned a **midweek sweep** against the Maine Black Bears from March 14-15, earning back-to-back wins at Mark Light Field.

 Miami received seven strong innings from freshman Evan McKendry and a clutch two-inning save from sophomore Andrew Cabezas to close out a 4-3 win in Game 1.

• Freshman **Greg Veliz** picked up his first win on the hill in Game 2 with five shutout innings, while Miami's offense took advantage of 13 walks issued by Black Bears pitchers in a 7-2 victory.

OFFENSE SPARKS SERIES WIN VS. JACKETS

• Miami had 37 hits against the Yellow Jackets in its most recent ACC series win. The Hurricanes totaled 23 walks. reached base at a .486 clip as a team, and slugged .532 to win their third straight series against Georgia Tech dating to 2015.

• Junior Carl Chester batted .500 for the week (10-for-20) for Miami, including a .615 (8-for-13) average against the Jackets. He recorded a .666 on-base percentage and .846 slugging percentage.

 Junior James Davison started at leadoff all three games against the Jackets and thrived: he reached base at a .588 clip and scored a team-best seven runs. He batted .417 for the weekend.

 Miami's 37 hits agains Georgia Tech were more than its combined total in the previous seven games (36). UM had double-digit hit totals in each game - 10 in Game 1, 12 in Game 2 and 15 in Game 3.

LOOKING FOR A FOUR-PEAT

 Miami won its third straight ACC Coastal Division title in 2016, posting a **21-7 record in ACC play** to earn the division crown.

 The Hurricanes have won 67 ACC games in the previous three seasons - the most wins in a three-year stretch by any program since ACC expanded to a 30-game conference schedule in 2005.

• Miami has won the ACC Regular Season Championship three times, most recently in 2016 when the Canes finished 21-7; UM won the ACC regular season crown & ACC Tournament in 2008.

 The Hurricanes have won four ACC Coastal Division titles (2008. 2014, 2015, 2016) in history and **one ACC Championship** (2008).

• Since the beginning of the 2014 season, Miami has won 25 of its past 31 ACC series. The Hurricanes went 8-2 in ACC series in 2014, 7-3 in 2015, 9-1 in 2016 and are 1-0 in 2017.

WEEKEND NEWS & NOTES

HEATING UP: LAST FIVE GAMES

• With its midweek sweep against Maine from March 14-15, the Hurricanes have won four of their past five games heading into the weekend series at NC State.

 Miami is batting .294 over the past five games with a .463 team on-base percentage and a .454 team slugging percentage.

• Among Miami's top performers over that stretch: junior Carl Chester (.421, eight hits, three doubles), junior Michael Burns (.400, eight hits, team-best 11 RBI) and sophomore Romy Gonzalez (.389, eight runs, nine RBI, .500 OBP).

SUPER SOPHOMORES: CABEZAS & BARTOW

• Two of Miami's top contributors out of the bullpen have been sophomore righthanders Frankie Bartow and Andrew Cabezas.

 Over the past 10 games, Cabezas has made five appearances and has 15 strikeouts compared to two walks in his last 9.0 innings. He is holding opponents to a .188 average over that stretch, and earned his first save with two scoreless innings on March 14 vs. Maine.

 Bartow leads UM with four saves and has a 2.57 ERA in 7.0 innings. He was a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-America in 2016.

ONE OF THE GAME'S TOP SKIPPERS

 Jim Morris' 1.543 wins at the Division I level are fifth-most in the history of college baseball and **third-most** among active skippers.

• Last weekend's series against Georgia Tech pitted two of the winningest coaches in college baseball history: Morris (1,543 wins) and Georgia Tech's **Danny Hall** (1,176), who replaced Morris in Atlanta when Morris was named Miami's head coach prior to the **1994** season

• Morris reached two major milestones in 2016 - he became the fifth coach to reach 1,500 wins on March 18 against Louisville and won his 1,000th game at Miami on March 26 vs. Clemson.

WELCOME TO THE LIGHT!

• Miami has made College World Series trips in back-to-back seasons (2015 and 2016) thanks in large part to its **dominant play** inside the confines of Alex Rodriguez Park at Mark Light Field.

 Since the start of the 2015 season, Miami is a whopping 76-13 in its last **89 home games**, including its 2017 Opening Weekend series against Rutgers and opening ACC home series against Georgia Tech.

• Miami finished **36-5** at home in 2015 and **34-6** at home in 2016. The Hurricanes went 13-2 in ACC play at The Light in 2015 and 12-3 at home in ACC play in 2016.

HIGH EXPECTATIONS

• Miami was ranked in the top 25 in preseason polls from three major college baseball outlets, including a No. 8 ranking from Collegiate Baseball Newspaper, No. 17 the USA Today Coaches Poll and a No. 21 ranking from D1Baseball.

• The Hurricanes have won three straight ACC Coastal

Division titles and have won the ACC Regular Season Championship in two of the past three seasons (2014, 2016).

 Miami made its second straight trip to the College World Series in 2016, marking the program's 25th all-time trip to Omaha, Neb.

 Miami's 25 College World Series trips are the second-most of any program in the country. The Hurricanes have won **48** games in

the College World Series, the **fourth-most** of any program; Miami's four national championships rank fifth-most.

• Since the NCAA began award national seeds prior to 1999, Miami has been among the top eight seven seasons: 1999 (#1), 2001 (#2), 2003 (#8), 2004 (#3), 2008 (#1), 2015 (#5) and 2016 (#3).

FOUR TO WATCH

• Four Hurricanes picked up 2017 Preseason All-America honors: junior outfielder Carl Chester. junior righthander Jesse Lepore, junior lefthander Michael Mediavilla and senior infielder Johnny Ruiz.

 Chester, a Baseball America Preseason All-America third-team selection, was among 55 players named to the initial watch list for the 2017 Golden Spikes Award by USA Baseball on Feb. 15.

• Sophomore reliever Frankie Bartow, who was recognized as a Louisville Slugger Freshman All America last season, was named to the watch list for the **2017 Stopper of the Year Award** by NCBWA: former closer Bryan Garcia won the prestigious award in 2016.

• UM had three All-Americans in 2016: Zack Collins (several publications), Garcia (NCBWA) & Mediavilla (ABCA/Rawlings).

DEATH, TAXES & THE NCAA POSTSEASON

• The Miami Hurricanes extended their own college baseball record with a 44th consecutive trip to the NCAA postseason in 2016. Miami has made the postseason each year since 1973.

• The Hurricanes' 44 straight trips to the NCAA postseason are the longest active postseason streak of any Division I program in any sport nationwide.

 Miami's 25 College World Series trips are the second-most of any program all-time, trailing only Texas.

 Miami is the only school in the state of Florida to have won a national championship; UM won titles in 1982, 1985, 1999 & 2001.
