
# **WEEKEND STORY LINES**

- After dropping its midweek pair with Bethune-Cookman and Stetson, No. 13 Miami travels to Russ Chandler Stadium for an
  ACC weekend series against Georgia Tech. Miami took two of three from the Yellow Jackets in the 2013 matchup.
- After not sweeping an ACC series in 2013, the Hurricanes opened their conference schedule by winning all three games
  against Boston College at Mark Light Field, while Georgia Tech lost two of three to Wake Forest in its opening ACC set.
- Miami has won back-to-back series against Tech, including two of three to clinch a 2013 ACC Championship berth. UM
  tagged Buck Farmer for seven runs in game one's 8-3 win, and David Thompson had five RBI in an 11-7 game two victory.
- The Hurricanes are ranked in the top 25 in every college baseball poll. Miami checks in at No. 13 in Baseball America,
   No. 17 by Perfect Game, No. 18 by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper, and No. 24 in the USA Today Coaches Poll.
- Miami's #13 rating from Baseball America matches its best ranking from the publication since April 2012.
- Head coach Jim Morris won his 1,400th game as a Division I head coach in the team's opening ACC series against Boston College. Morris ranks eighth all time and fourth among active coaches with 1,401 Division I wins.
- After struggling to hit for power in 2013, Miami has 10 home runs through its first 17 games tied for the most of any ACC team. Dale Carey leads the team with three homers, while Zack Collins and Garrett Kennedy have two apiece.



In his 21st season at Miami, few programs have qualified for the College World Series as much as Jim Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 41 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 20 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 897-352-3 (.717) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,401-619-4 (.693) Division I record in 32 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 36 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,529-657-4 (.698) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 20 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

# MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 29th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2013 when he guided the Canes to a No. 2 seed in the Louisville [Ky.] Regional. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 20 seasons (1994-2013), winning 15 of those appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2013 Hurricanes to their 41st-straight NCAA Tournament. Despite six signees being drafted in the 2013 MLB Draft, the Hurricanes reeled in a top 5 recruiting class by national publications.

# MORRIS IN 36th SEASON AS HEAD COACH

Morris entered 2014 as the fifth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball with 1,391 wins. His impressive win total ranks him No. 12 all-time for any coach, regardless of division. Including his time at DeKalb C.C., Morris won his 1,500th game as a head coach in Miami's 4-1 upset of No. 1 North Carolina on March 15, 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.

Morris currently has a 1,401-619-4 (.693) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,532-659-4 (.698) record over 30-plus years.

Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern in March 2001



# **MAJOR LEAGUE GUIDANCE**

Over 150 professional baseball players have played under Morris during their college careers at Miami, Georgia Tech and DeKalb.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that went on to play in the Major Leagues were Yonder Alonso (San Diego), Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Pat Burrell (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Yasmani Grandal (San Diego), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Ryan Jackson (St. Louis), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Eddy Rodriguez (San Diego), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Blake Tekotte (Chicago White Sox), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), Danny Valencia (Minnesota Twins), Jon Jay (St. Louis), Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston).

Standout players under Morris from his days at Georgia Tech were Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jay Payton (Oakland A's) and Jason Varitek (Boston Red Sox).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the International scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta. At the Goodwill Games, his USA squad won two of three games against Cuba, marking the first time in history a senior-level team won a series with Cuba. In 1987, Morris served as pitching coach under Ron Fraser at the Pan American Games (Silver Medal).

# **WEEKEND NEWS & NOTES**

# **ROAD TRIPPING...**

- No. 13 Miami continues ACC play this weekend with a three-game set on the road at Georgia Tech. Miami won two of three against the Yellow Jackets at home in 2013, and holds a 51-32-2 all-time advantage over the Jackets.
- The Hurricanes scored five runs in the first three innings of an 8-3 game one victory in 2013, tagging Tech ace Buck Farmer for seven runs on nine hits. David Thompson scored three runs and set a career high with five RBI to clinch the series in an 11-7 game two win.
- The road trip holds special significance for head baseball coach Jim Morris, who was the head coach of the Yellow Jackets for nine years. He won over 500 games and took the team to seven consecutive NCAA postseason appearances during his tenure.

# **HEATING UP...**

- Freshman Willie Abreu has a team-high .438 batting average over the last five games (7-for-16). He has scored five of his team-leading 17 runs over the same stretch.
- Senior **Dale Carey** enters Miami's second ACC series **riding a six-game hitting streak**. The Marietta, Ga., **is hitting .381** during his streak (8-for-21) with **seven runs**, **one triple** and **one home run**.
- Freshman closer Bryan Garcia has not allowed a run since Feb. 21 against Florida, and has accumulated three saves since that game. He ranks second in the ACC with five saves.

# **POWER SURGE...**

- Miami is tied for first in the ACC with 10 home runs through its first 17 games of the regular season.
- The Hurricane offense exploded for six home runs in its series with Florida (Feb. 21-23), the most for a Miami team in a single series since an April 2010 weekend set at Virginia Tech.
- Collins became the first Hurricane since current San Diego Padres slugger Yonder Alonso (2006) to record a home run as his first collegiate hit a three-run blast against Florida (Feb. 22). He also recorded home runs in an exhibition with the Marlins (solo HR, Feb. 26) and on the road at Florida State (two-run HR, March 2).
- Miami did not record its 10th home run in 2013 until an 8-3 win over Wake Forest on May 10 - the team's 51st game of that season.

# SIMPLY PERFECT...

- Senior RHP Javi Salas twirled just the second perfect game in program history and the 23rd in modern NCAA Division I history (since 1957) in a 17-0 shutout of Villanova on March 4.
- Salas needed just 113 pitches to get through his outing, scattering six strikeouts across his night of perfection. His perfect game was the first for a Miami pitcher since Kevin Sheary accomplished the feat on March 4, 1987.
- Miami's two perfect games are tied with Auburn and lowa for the second- most of any program all-time behind Washington State.
- Salas, a Coral Gables native and graduate of nearby
   Christopher Columbus High School, was selected in the 38th round of the 2013 MLB Draft but elected to return for his senior season.

# FOUR UP, FOUR DOWN...

- Junior LHP Chris Diaz picked up his fourth straight win to open the 2014 season in a 6-2 victory over Boston College (March 7).
- Due to a lack of run support, Diaz, who ranked second in the ACC in ERA in 2013 (1.64), did not pick up his fourth win of the 2013 season until May 3 against St. John's. He finished 2013 with a 7-5 record.
- The Florida City, Fla., native went a season-long 7.1 innings and allowed just two earned runs against Boston College. The lefthander has a 2.05 ERA through his first four starts of 2014 and is tied for first in the ACC with four wins.

# RISING UP...

- Bolstered by their 5-0 record last week, the Hurricanes rose to No. 13 in Monday's Baseball America's top 25 rankings matching the team's highest ranking from the publication since April 2012.
- Miami also jumped two spots to No. 18 in *Collegiate Baseball* Newspaper's weekly poll, and rose three spots to No. 17 in Perfect Game's top 25 rankings.
- Miami was one of six teams from the ACC ranked in the newest Baseball America top 25, joining: Florida State (No. 2), Virginia (No. 3), NC State (No. 5), Clemson (No. 14), and North Carolina (No. 19).

# FRESHMEN PHENOMS...

- Three freshmen were in head coach Jim Morris' Opening Day lineup: Zack Collins (first base), Willie Abreu (designated hitter) and Johnny Ruiz (second base). Laz Rivera, Jacob Heyward and Brad Zunica have also earned starts through the first three weekends of the season.
- Righthander Bryan Garcia ranks second in the ACC with five saves, including four requiring more than one inning of work.
- Lefthander Danny Garcia made his second career start against Stetson Wednesday, going a career-long 4.2 innings.
- Abreu, Collins and Zunica found themselves on the same lineup card for the first time in the series finale against FSU (March 2), and combined for seven hits, two doubles, one home run, four RBI and four runs scored.
- Four players from the recruiting class were selected in the 2013 MLB Draft but opted to play collegiately: Abreu, Collins, Heyward and righthanded pitcher Derik Beauprez.

# CANES LEGENDS RECOGNIZED...

- Alex Fernandez and Mike Fiore will be among the seven-member Class of 2014 to be inducted into the College Baseball Hall of Fame, the College Baseball Foundation announced.
- Fernandez and Fiore join former head coach Ron Fraser (Class of 2006), assistant coach/player Skip Bertman (2006) and pitcher Neal Heaton (2008) as University of Miami inductees.
- Fernandez was named Freshman of the Year and a first-team All-American in 1989, where he won 15 games with a 2.01 ERA and 177 strikeouts in 147 innings. A four-year UM starter, Fiore set 12 UM career batting marks, including hits (341) and runs (258).
