#### Hurricanes Face USF in Florida Four Showcase...

The 24th-ranked University of Miami Hurricanes travel to Tampa on Tuesday, March, 1, taking on the USF Bulls at Steinbrenner Field in the Second Annual Florida Four Showcase at 4 p.m. The event also features a game between top-ranked Florida and Florida State in the nightcap.

Miami faced USF last year in this same event, defeating the Bulls by a score of 15-2. In that contest, three 'Canes collected multi-hit performances, including Yasmani Grandal who was 3-for-4, while Michael Broad registered a triple and was 2-for-4.

The Hurricanes enter Tuesday's contest having won their last series against Appalachian State over the weekend, taking two-of-three from the Mountaineers inside Alex Rodriguez Park. Miami is hitting .292 over the last three games, and carries a slugging percentage of .438 over the span with seven doubles, two triples and a home run. On Sunday, Miami defeated the Florida Marlins by a 9-8 count in an exhibition game played at Roger Dean Stadium in Jupiter, Fla.

Sophomore infielder Joey Porro, a team manager last season for UMiami, has stepped into the starting lineup as a second baseman, and is batting .500 on the year with two hits in four trips. Porro earned the start in the series finale against Appalachian State. Freshman first baseman Brad Fieger leads all Hurricanes at the dish with a .345 average and slugging at 44.8 percent.

Sophomore outfielder Zeke DeVoss is also batting above the .300 plateau for the 'Canes, now holding a .308 average. He has a perfect fielding percentage on the year, playing as both a left- and center fielder. Infielder Michael Broad bats .261 for UM, but did not start in the last contest against Appalachian State. Against the Marlins on Sunday, Broad became the first collegiate player to hit a grand slam against the Marlins, helping carry the 'Canes to their first win over the Miami pro team since 2005.

As a team, UM has swiped 12 bases in 14 attempts, and the starting pitchers have been dominant over the last three contests. The rotation of Bryan Radziewski, E.J. Encinosa and Eric Whaley compiled an ERA of 1.67 against the Mountaineers. Whaley leads the staff with a 2-0 record and an ERA of 2.13, while Radziewski has a team-low ERA of 0.82 on the bump with a 1-0 mark.

#### The Starting Five...

the mound in their first two series of the year against Rutgers and Appalachian State, respectively.

#### Scouting USF...

USF (1-5) will throw junior left-hander Matt Reed on Tuesday, as he enters working on a 6.75 ERA and no decision in two appearances on the year. Reed has worked just 2 2/3 innings, giving up two earned runs on four hits and walking one batter.

The Bulls are hitting .209 as a team, while their opponents are batting at a .252 clip. USF lost two-of-three against Elon over the weekend, including a tough 16-inning setback in the longest game in USF history at Tampa.

First baseman Todd Brazeal leads the Bulls' batting with a .333 average, with junior shortstop Sam Mende and outfielder Junior Carlin both sitting at an even .250 clip, respectively. USF has no stolen bases on the season, but opponents have compiled nine swipes in 16 attempts.

In his 18th season at Miami, no other program, nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a NCAA-record 38 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 17 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 26 years, 17 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 776-298-3 (.721) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,280-542-4 (.701) Division I record in 29 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 32 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,411-583-4 (.706) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 18 years, Morris has personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and has logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the new stadium project.

#### **MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR**

Jim Morris earned his 26th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2010 when he guided the 'Canes to the NCAA Coral Gables Regional. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 17 seasons (1994-2010), winning 15 of his last 17 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris has led the 2010 Hurricanes to their 38th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five players from the 2010 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft. In 2008, the 'Canes reached the College World Series after winning the Atlantic Coast Conference, widely considered one of the toughest - if not the toughest - collegiate baseball conference in the country.

MORRIS IN HIS 33RD SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

Morris currently has a 1,279-540-4 (.703) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,410-581-4 (.708) record over 30-plus years.

Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.

Prior to his 17 seasons in Coral Gables, Morris went 504-244-1 at Georgia Tech from 1982-1993. In his first stint as a head coach, he guided DeKalb Junior College to a 131-41 mark from 1976-79.

Morris, who played shortstop during college at Elon and then in the Boston Red Sox organization, has had great success developing the position while a head coach. Over the last decade Morris has taught prominent shortstops such as Nomar Garciaparra at Georgia Tech and Bobby Hill and Alex Cora at Miami.

Morris worked with Javy Rodriguez, who entered 2002 as a preseason All-American. Rodriguez led UM in just about every category as a junior in 2001, including a national-high 66 stolen bases. He currently works with sophomore Stephen Perez, a slick-fielding switch-hitter expected to bat near the upper-half of the order this year for the 'Canes.

Morris coached Hill, who played for the San Diego Padres, from 1997-

99. Before Hill, it was Cora and Mike Metcalfe. Both players went on to play at the Major League level with the Los Angeles Dodgers. Cora is currently with the Mets. Garciaparra played under Morris during the coaches' final two seasons in Atlanta and went on to become an All-Star with the Red Sox and played for the Oakland A's in 2009.

#### From Manager to Starter...

Sophomore infielder Joey Porro made his first collegiate start and played in his first-ever game at the "U" over the weekend in the series finale against Appalachian State. In that game, Porro went 2-for-4 with three RBI. Last season, Porro was a student manager for the 'Canes, and is now living a dream and getting playing time for the Orange and Green.

#### Freshman Has His Day...

Freshman pitcher Bryan Radziewski has been solid in his first two starts at Miami. Last week he took the mound against Appalachian State in the series-opener, collecting his first collegiate win by going five innings and allowing three unearned runs while spreading out five hits and seven strikeouts.

#### Eric Whaley Stepping It Up...

Sophomore pitcher Eric Whaley is 2-0 after his first two collegiate starts, and is looking solid in his new role. The Pompano Beach native owns a 2.13 ERA with 12 2/3 frames on the mound, and went a career-long seven innings and staked a career-best nine strikeouts in his last outing against Appalachian State.

#### Catch Me If "U" Can...

The UMiami team is full of speed this year, and through the first seven games it is prevalent. Jim Morris has preached stealing bases throughout the year, and the 'Canes swiped 12-of-14 bases on the campaign. Nathan Melendres is 4-for-4 on the path, and Chantz Mack is 2-for-2 to lead the way for UMiami.

#### The First Father/Son Duo...

Freshman catcher Shane Rowland has stepped right into the UMiami starting lineup and taken charge. He belted his first home run over the weekend against Appalachian State.

The Tampa native is the son of former UMiami second baseman and current international scout for the New York Yankees, Donny Rowland. They are the first father/son duo to ever play baseball at the "U".

#### Harold Back for an Encore...

Junior third baseman Harold Martinez has been named to the Louisville Slugger Preseason All-America Third Team after leading the Atlantic Coast Conference in home runs (21) a season ago. Martinez, a star-studded Miami native, batted .295 in 2010, driving in 69 runs on 71 hits and crossing the plate 48 times. In the NCAA

Gainesville Super Regional, Martinez suffered an injury in which he spent the entire summer rehabilitating and getting ready for the 2011 campaign.

#### <u>Miami Predicted to Finish Third In Coastal</u> <u>Division...</u>

Miami baseball has been predicted to finish third in the Coastal Division of the Atlantic Coast Conference Coaches Preseason Poll. The poll is voted on by the league's 12 head coaches. Capturing a 20-10 league record in 2010, the Hurricanes finished the year third in the Coastal Division behind Virginia and Georgia Tech, respectively. Miami posted a 43-20 overall record en route to claiming the NCAA Coral Gables Regional title, and advancing to the NCAA Gainesville Super Regional.

#### **Hurricanes On the Net...**

University of Miami baseball games this season will be broadcast live on HurricaneSports.com with video webcasts for every home game, courtesy of Hurricanes All-Access. All road games will feature a live audio broadcast through WVUM—the student voice of all things UMiami.

#### New Era Behind the Plate...

Three catchers will be battling for playing time behind the plate this year, including junior David Villasuso. A season ago, Villasuso batted .245 with 20 RBI and five home runs while serving as a backup to MLB First Round Draft selection and 2010 ACC Player of the Year, Yasmani Grandal.

Others battling for playing time this season will be freshmen Corey Janson and Shane Rowland. Rowland comes from a baseball family, as his father Donny played baseball at the "U". Thus, making Shane and Donny to become the school's first-ever "Father/Son" tandem to have played baseball at UMiami.

#### Fresh Faces In the Dugout...

This season, head coach Jim Morris has one of his youngest teams in recent memory. UMiami has 13 newcomers on this year's roster (12 freshman and one sophomore transfer). The 'Canes lost 2010 ACC Player of the Year, Yasmani Grandal, to the MLB Draft—Grandal was selected 12th overall in the Draft.

#### **MIAMI IN THE ACC...**

The 2011 season marks the seventh season the 'Canes have played in the Atlantic Coast Conference, and last year's 20-10 regular season mark in league play was the program's second-best behind the 2008 ACC championship squad that won 23 regular season league games.

#### **MORRIS SIGNS EXTENSION...**

On Sept. 20, 2009, University of Miami Director of Athletics Kirby Hocutt announced that head baseball coach Jim Morris signed a contract extension through 2015. Morris, who is in his 17th season at the helm of the Miami baseball program, has led the Hurricanes to the College World Series in 11 of his 16 seasons in Coral Gables including National Championship runs in 1999 and 2001.

#### Staying Power...

Miami is ranked 20th in the latest edition of the Collegiate Baseball Newspaper poll. The Hurricanes have been ranked in the top 20 in every CBN preseason poll since 1999, something only one other school (Cal State Fullerton) has achieved this. Miami has won two national titles in that time period to CSF's one.

#### Miami Gets Them Drafted...

Over the last three years, Miami has produced four first round MLB draft picks, more than any other school in the nation. Last year, Yasmani Grandal was selected in the first round by the Cincinnati Reds, with four other players—David Gutierrez (Minnesota Twins), Chris Hernandez (Boston Red Sox), Scott Lawson (Houston Astros) and Iden Nazario (Washington Nationals) all taken on the second day of the Draft.

#### Canes In the Classroom...

During the fall semester of 2010, the University of Miami baseball team recorded its highest team GPA ever. Freshman catcher Corey Janson collected a 4.0 GPA last semester, giving him one of the highest GPAs in the entire UMiami Athletic Department.

#### **ALEX RODRIGUEZ PARK INFORMATION**

Renovations to Alex Rodriguez Park are thanks in large part to a \$3.9 million contribution by New York Yankees third baseman and 11-time MLB All-Star Alex Rodriguez. The gift the largest ever to the University of Miami baseball program - has assisted the program in continuing to develop first-class facilities. The official announcement of his gift was made on Oct. 10, 2002.

Alex Rodriguez Park has taken form in a three-phase process:

- Phase I called for seating modifications, new dugouts, new stadium lighting and utility infrastructure and new rest rooms.
- Phase II entailed renovating below the grand stand area in addition to adding new concession areas.
- The final phase included adding a new clubhouse, weight room, training room, meeting room, video room and academic area. In addition, a new press box – along with four VIP suites - have been built atop the grandstand. This past offseason, addition seating was added down both lines while a new scoreboard was constructed in left field.
