- He was 12-for-22 from the field and 5-for-11 from beyond the arc.
- Senior **Dennis Clifford** finished with 12 points and six rebounds.
- Boston College started the game with a 10-2 run, but Pittsburgh responded with a 15-2 stretch over 5:13 to take a 17-12 lead.
- Pitt was on top, 28-19, but the Eagles went on a 17-9 run over 5:27 to cut the deficit to 37-36 with 1:55 left in the half. Carter had eight of the points and redshirt freshman Idy Diallo had six.
- The Panthers took a 43-36 lead into halftime.
- Pitt extended the lead with an 11-2 run to make it a 58-44 advantage with 13:16 left in the game.
- The lead never went under double digits the rest of the way.

LAST TIME VS. MIAMI

- Olivier Hanlan scored 32 points while adding eight rebounds and four assists as Boston College lost to Miami in double overtime on February 16, 2015, 89-86.
- He only had one turnover in 49 minutes of play.
- Hanlan was 13-for-26 from the floor and also had three steals.
- Patrick Heckmann recorded 13 points, eight rebounds and six assists.
- Will Magarity matched a career high with 10 points, which all came in the first half.
- Miami opened the game with a 10-4 run over the first five minutes.
- Boston College responded after the first media timeout with a 17-5 run to build a 21-15 lead with 8:37 left in the half. Magarity scored the first seven points of that stretch.
- The Eagles took a 30-28 lead into halftime.
- Boston College scored seven unanswered points to build a 54-47 lead with 8:27 to play in regulation.
- The Hurricanes responded with a 7-1 run to pull within a point.
- Brown hit a pair of free throws with 40 seconds left which tied the game at 66-66 and sent the game to overtime.
- BC held a 75-71 lead with 25 seconds left in the first overtime, but Miami battled back and Deandre Burnett hit a pair of free throws with 12 seconds left that sent it into the second overtime.
- The game was tied for the 15th time, 82-82, with

2:03 left in the second OT, then Miami scored the next five points to seal the win. Tonye Jekiri hit four free throws to help build the lead.

- · Boston College battled back from 13 down in the second half, but its comeback fell short as Miami held on for a 60-56 win on January 10, 2015 at the BankUnited Center.
- Olivier Hanlan led all scorers with 19 points while adding four rebounds and four assists.
- Eddie Odio scored a career-high 13 points in his last game in his hometown of Miami. He also had six rebounds.
- Aaron Brown added five points, seven rebounds and four assists.
- · Miami scored seven unanswered points in the early going to take a 10-5 lead.
- The Hurricanes held an 18-14 advantage and then went on a 9-0 run over 3:40 to build a 27-14 lead.
- Hanlan then sparked a personal 7-2 run to close out the half to pull the Eagles to within 29-21 at the break.

- He has averaged 19.0 points, 4.4 rebounds and 4.6 assists in his last eight outings.
- In the win against Maine, he had 16 points, nine assists and eight rebounds.
- 4-2 • He then had 20 points, 10 assists and eight rebounds in the victory over Delaware. He also committed 0-0 just two turnovers in 36 minutes of work.
 - Carter was the first Eagle to record a double-double with points and assists since Reggie Jackson in
- 3-4 • He is also one of just seven ACC players to record 10 assists this year.

- Senior Dennis Clifford has been producitive on the glass this year, securing at least nine rebounds in the first three games.

- The Bridgewater, Mass., product had a career-high 11 rebounds against Central Connecticut and then set a new career high with 12 vs. Harvard.
- He scored a season-high 17 points, two short of his career high, and had six rebounds vs. Penn State.
- Clifford ranks 13th in the ACC in rebounding (6.9).

FRESHMEN PRODUCTION

- Ten freshmen (including redshirts) have seen the court this year for Boston College.
- Jerome Robinson is averaging 11.2 points, 4.1 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 1.5 steals per game.
- Six of the top 10 scorers on the team are freshmen or redshirt freshmen.
- Freshmen have accounted for 51 percent of the scoring, 54 percent of the rebounding and 50 percent of the assists.
- The 10 freshmen have also accounted for 60 percent of the team's minutes.

BENCH HELP

- BC has averaged 17.3 points off the bench in the first 17 games of the season.
- The Eagles had 20 points off the bench in the season-opener against St. Francis Brooklyn, led by freshman Sammy Barnes-Thompkins' nine points.
- Boston College then had 31 vs. Central Connecticut with freshman Matt Milon adding 11 points.
- Milon and classmate Ervins Meznieks combined for 28 of the 30 bench points against Harvard.
- The Eagles' reserves scored a season-high 35 points against Maine.
- BC averaged 26.3 off the bench in the first four games of the season.
- The Eagles averaged just 8.6 points off the bench last season. The game-high was 33 but that was on Senior Night when Olivier Hanlan came off the bench to score 19.
- The next highest number was a 20-point performance by the bench against Marist.

MILON AND MEZNIEKS SPARK BC WIN AGAINST HARVARD

- Freshmen Matt Milon and Ervins Meznieks had their best games of their young careers on November 22 against Harvard.
- The two combined for 28 points off the bench, going 8-for-12 form the field and 7-for-11 from 3-point land.
- Milon scored a team-high 16 points and went 3-for-5 from long range.
- Milon is shooting .483 (28-for-58) on the year and is .465 (20-for-43) from beyond the arc.
- Meznieks had 12 points and two assists vs. the Crimson, going 3-for-5 from three.

EAGLES OUTLAST UNH IN OVERTIME

- Graduate student Eli Carter finished with a season-high 28 points while adding five rebounds and four assists as Boston College beat New Hampshire in overtime, 72-67, on Wednesday at Conte Forum.
- · He scored 20 points in the second half and overtime, and had seven of the 12 points in the overtime session.
- Freshman Jerome Robinson added 14 points and five rebounds.
- Senior Dennis Clifford posted 10 points, seven rebounds and matched a career high with four blocks.
- Freshman Ervins Meznieks also scored 10 points.
- Boston College scored eight unanswered points over 1:54 to take a 15-6 lead at the 13:31 mark. Carter and Robinson hit 3-pointers in that stretch.
- With the Eagles on top, 17-8, New Hampshire went on a 10-2 run to cut the BC lead to 19-18 with 7:37 left in the half.
- The Wildcats closed the half with nine unanswered points to take a 29-27 lead at the break. It was their first lead of the game.
- UNH led, 50-49, when BC scored seven unanswered points to regain a 56-50 lead with 3:40 left in regulation.
- The Wildcats responded with seven of their own to take that lead back. Jaleen Smith hit a 3-pointer with eight seconds left to force overtime.
- After UNH's Jacoby Armstrong hit a jumper, Carter converted on an and-one to push BC's overtime lead to 70-67 with 16 seconds left.

EAGLES GET THIRD-STRAIGHT WIN

- Freshman Jerome Robinson matched season highs with 19 points and six rebounds to lead Boston College to a 64-55 win vs. Fordham on December 22 at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn.
- Graduate student Eli Carter recorded 12 points, five rebounds, three assists, two blocks and two steals.
- Redshirt freshman Idy Diallo matched a season high with eight points in 20 minutes off the bench. He was 4-for-4 from the field.
- With the game tied, 8-8, Boston College went on a 10-2 run to take an 18-10 lead with 8:41 left in the half. Diallo had six of the points in that stretch.
- Fordham responded immediately with a 7-1 run of its own to cut the lead to 19-17 at the 4:25 mark.

- Senior Dennis Clifford tallied eight points and 10 rebounds.
- Boston College went on the first run of the game, a 12-2 one to take an 18-9 lead at the 13:47 point. Five different Eagles scored in the run.
- Delaware responded with seven-straight points to cut the lead to 18-16.

- Freshman A.J. Turner recorded 11 points and six rebounds to go along with two blocks and two steals. He was 5-for-9 from the field.
- Sophomore Darryl Hicks tallied 11 points, five assists and three boards off the bench. He also had a pair of steals.
- Senior Dennis Clifford had 10 points and six rebounds.
- Boston College started the game with a 16-3 run over the first 5:15. Robinson had seven points in the opening stretch.
- The Eagles led, 27-17, when Maine scored seven unanswered points to make it a 27-24 game with four minutes left in the half.
- BC responded with a 17-3 run over the next 2:54 to build a 44-27 lead with less than a minute left and took a 44-29 lead into the locker room.

- Boston College's 10 blocks against the Black Bears were the most since it stuffed Miami 11 times back on January 15, 2008.

SECOND HALF SURGE LEADS BC PAST HARVARD

- Freshman Matt Milon scored a team-high 16 points off the bench to lead BC to a 69-56 win against Harvard on November 22 at Conte Forum.
- Milon went 5-for-7 from the field and 4-for-6 from beyond the arc.
- Graduate student Eli Carter scored all 15 of his points in the second half. He also had five assists, three rebounds and two steals.
- Freshman Ervins Meznieks chipped in with 12 points and two assists off the bench. He was 3-for-5 from 3-point land.
- Senior Dennis Clifford had a career-high 12 rebounds.
- Boston College scored the first eight points of the game over the first 5:10. Freshmen A.J. Turner and Milon both hit 3-pointers in that span.
- · Harvard responded with the next eight points to tie it up.
- BC led, 16-13, but the Crimson scored the final seven points of the half in the last 4:03 to take a 20-16 halftime lead.
- The Eagles started the second half with a 12-4 run to take a 28-24 lead. Carter had eight of the 12 points.

CARTER, ROBINSON LEAD THE WAY AGAIN AGAINST CENTRAL CONNECTICUT

- Graduate student Eli Carter led Boston College with 18 points and five assists as the Eagles beat Central Connecticut, 82-57, on November 19.
- Carter scored 16 of those points in the second half.
- Freshman Jerome Robinson filled the stat sheet up again with 15 points, four rebounds, four assists and three steals. He was 7-for-11 from the field.
- Freshman Matt Milon scored 11 points, going 3-for-5 from beyond the arc.
- Senior Dennis Clifford recorded nine points and nine rebounds.
- Central Connecticut led for the bulk of the first 13 minutes and had a 20-17 lead at the 8:42 mark.
- Boston College then went on a 16-2 run over 4:33 to take a 33-22 lead with 3:23 left in the half. Milon capped the run with consecutive 3-pointers.
- The Eagles took a 45-33 lead into halftime, outscoring CCSU 28-13 in the final eight minutes.
- · Boston College held a 55-45 lead and then went on a 21-1 run over 10 minutes to build a 76-46 advantage with 5:45 left in the game.
- CCSU was held scoreless for nearly eight minutes during that stretch.

CARTER, ROBINSON SHINE IN WIN OVER ST. FRANCIS BROOKLYN

- Graduate student Eli Carter had a game-high 23 points to go along with seven rebounds as Boston College won its season opener vs. St. Francis Brooklyn on November 14, 75-49.
- · Carter was 10-for-19 from the field.
- Freshman Jerome Robinson added 19 points, six rebounds, five assists and three steals in his Boston College debut. He was 7-for-13 from the floor.
- Senior Dennis Clifford secured a career-high 11 rebounds and had seven points.
- Freshman Sammy Barnes-Thompkins scored nine points off the bench.
- Boston College started by scoring the game's first 13 points. Carter led the attack with six points. St. Francis Brooklyn missed its first 15 shots from the floor.
- With the Eagles on top, 21-8, they went on an 11-1 run over 3:21 to build a 32-9 lead with 4:02 left in the first half. Clifford scored four of those 11 points.
- BC took a 41-16 lead into the locker room.
- The Eagles' lead reached as high as 28 points early in the second half and never got below 19 the rest of the way.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

- There are 10 newcomers on the Boston College team, including nine freshmen.
- Eli Carter is a graduate student who played at Rutgers and Florida before coming to The Heights. He is already a career 1,000-point scorer.
- The nine freshmen are the most in the ACC this season.
- Syracuse has eight freshmen on its roster while Duke has seven.

THE LEADERS

- Graduate student Eli Carter and senior Dennis Clifford are a pair of fifth-year players that bring a lot of experience to a young team.
- · Carter began his career at Rutgers where he stormed onto the scene to lead the team in scoring as a freshman and sophomore.
- He averaged 13.8 points, 3.1 rebounds and 2.1 assists as a freshman and then increased his scoring to 14.9 points as a sophomore before breaking his leg.
- The Paterson, N.J., product elected to transfer to Florida after Mike Rice was fired and was eligible to play immediately. His injury nagged him, though, and he could only play seven games in Gainesville in 2013-14 before receiving a medical redshirt.
- Carter returned last year and averaged 8.8 points per game in 28 games last season for Billy Donovan.
- Clifford suffered from chronic knee issues in 2012-13 and 2013-14 which limited his time on the court, but he was fully healthy last season and played in 31 games with 28 starts.
- · He averaged 6.9 points and 5.5 rebounds last year in his first healthy season since he was a freshman. Clifford received a medical redshirt in the 2013-14 season.



THE NEW GUYS

- Head Coach Jim Christian has welcomed seven freshmen to The Heights this season and they hail from all over the world.
- The seven freshmen are the second-most in the ACC behind Syracuse's eight. Duke also has seven freshmen on its roster.
- Guard Sammy Barnes-Thompkins (Phoenix, Ariz./Sunnyslope) was ranked the No. 3 shooting guard in the state of Arizona and was a first-team all-stater as a junior, averaging 23.5 points per game. A McDonald's All-America nominee, he scored 40 points in the second half of a game vs. Cesar Chavez.
- Guard/forward Gordon Gehan (Dallas, Texas/Episcopal School of Dallas) was named all-state as a junior and senior. He averaged 24.2 points, 9.3 rebounds and 4.5 assists as a senior.
- Forward Ervins Meznieks (Riga, Latvia/Rigas Teikas) has plenty of international experience, playing for the U20, U18 and U16 Latvia National Teams. He played for the U20 team that finished fifth at the 2015 European Championship, averaging 8.3 points and 3.7 rebounds in 10 games.
- Guard Matt Milon (Oviedo, Fla./Oviedo) was the Florida Class 7A Player of the year as a junior and senior, and was a McDonald's All-America nominee. He was ranked the 23rd-best prospect in Florida and played for legendary coach Ed Kerschner.
- Forward/center Johncarlos Reyes (Lawrenceville, Ga./Sound Doctrine Christian Academy) averaged 18.4 points, 8.7 rebounds and 3.8 blocks in his one season at Sound Doctrine. He also averaged 20.3 points, 6.0 rebounds and 4.6 blocks in the previous year at Kingdom Christian Academy and had a school record 124 blocks in his junior season.
- Guard Jerome Robinson (Raleigh, N.C./Needham Broughton) was named Cap-8 Conference Player of the Year as a senior after averaging 19 points and five assists. He was ranked as the sixth-best player in North Carolina and was a McDonald's All-America nominee.
- ESPN's Jeff Goodman tweeted about Robinson while at practice: "The more I watch BC frosh Jerome Robinson, the more I love him. So versatile, poised. Good size. Can't believe he got out of North Carolina."
- Forward A.J. Turner (Mt. Clemens, Mich./New Hampton School (NH) was ranked as the fourth-best recruit from Michigan by ESPN. He is the first Rivals150 recruit that BC landed since Rakim Sanders in 2007. Turner transferred to New Hampton after averaging 20 points and six assists as a junior at De La Salle in Warren, Mich. He earned first team all-state honors that year. He was then named All-NEPSAC as a senior after averaging 15 points and six rebounds.

NUMBERS LOST

- While adding eight newcomers, it is also important to note what was lost from last season.
- The Eagles return just three players who saw action last season and five overall (redshirt freshman Idy Diallo and sophomore Darryl Hicks both missed the season with injuries).
- Boston College lost 84 percent of its scoring, 73 percent of its rebounds and 88 percent of its assists from last season.
- Fifth-year senior Dennis Clifford is the only returning starter and BC only returns a total of 30 starts of a possible 160 from last season.
- The Eagles also lost 79 percent of their minutes from a year ago.

FINALLY HEALTHY

- Fifth-year senior Dennis Clifford averaged 6.9 points and 5.5 rebounds in his first fully heatly year since he was a freshman in 2011-12.
- The Bridgewater, Mass., product had two 19-point games last December, which were career highs.
- He had identical games scoring in the wins over Maine and UMass Lowell. He was 9-for-11 from the free throw line in both games and 5-for-6 from the floor.
- Clifford recorded his first career double-double in the overtime win over Harvard on January 14. He had 13 points and 10 rebounds to go along with a pair of blocks.
- Clifford led the Eagles in rebounding and blocks (37) last season, and ranked second in field goal percentage (.497).

EAGLES ADD THREE IN EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

EAGLES IN THE NBA


- There are currently two former Eagles playing professionally in the NBA.

SECOND SEASON AT BOSTON COLLEGE 14TH SEASON OVERALL 263-182 CAREER RECORD

Jim Christian, who was hired as the 12th head basketball coach at Boston College on April 3, 2014, enters his second season on The Heights.

Christian was a two-time Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year and led teams to eight postseason appearances in his 12 seasons as a head coach at Ohio, TCU and Kent State. He has coached four All-Americans, three MAC Players of the Year and 31 all-conference honorees.

In his first season at Boston College, Christian guided guard Olivier Hanlan to First Team All-ACC and honorable mention All-America honors. Hanlan was the leading scorer in the ACC (19.5) which ranked 22nd in the country. He also led all major conference players in scoring average during league play (21.9). In addition, Hanlan led the ACC in 3-point percentage (.436) and ranked third in 3-pointers made (2.83), fifth in free throw percentage (.810), sixth in field goal percentage (.483) and 10th in assists (4.00) during conference action.

Hanlan was drafted by the Utah Jazz in the second round (42nd overall) of the 2015 NBA Draft.

Prior to moving to Chestnut Hill, Christian spent the previous two seasons as head coach at Ohio, leading the Bobcats to a 49-22 record in that time. In his first season at the helm, Ohio went 24-10 and earned a bid to the NIT. The Bobcats won their first regular season MAC title since 1994 and they tied a program record with 14 league wins and seven road victories. He was named the NABC District 14 Coach of the Year.

Ohio led the nation in assists per game (17.5) in 2012-13 and ranked seventh in the country in turnover margin (+4.7). Under his guidance, guard D.J. Cooper ranked seventh in the nation in assists and was the first MAC Player of the Year from Ohio since 1995.

In 2013-14, the Bobcats went 25-12 and advanced to the quarterfinals of the College Insider Tournament. It was just the third time in school history that an Ohio team reached 25 wins.

Christian, who also spent six seasons at Kent State from 2002-08, is the all-time leader in winning percentage (.700) in Mid-American Conference history and reached 20 wins in all eight of his seasons in the conference.

Prior to his time at Ohio, Christian was the head coach at TCU from 2008-12. While in Fort Worth, he had a record of 56-73 (.434) and led the Horned Frogs to their first postseason appearance since 2005 when they played in the 2012 College Basketball Invitational. He coached six All-Mountain West players while in Fort Worth.

One of those players was guard Hank Thorns, Jr., who earned first team honors after ranking in the top 12 in the country in both assists and assist/turnover ratio, the only player in the nation to accomplish that feat in 2010-11.

Christian began his head coaching career at Kent State where he compiled a record of 138-58 (.704). He led the Golden Flashes to five postseason appearances in his six seasons at the helm. He earned MAC Coach of the Year accolades in 2006 and 2008, both times leading Kent State to the conference title and an appearance in the NCAA Tournament. The Golden Flashes earned NIT berths in each of his first three seasons.

Kent State won 20 games every year that Christian was the head coach and he guided it to its first-ever top 25 ranking in both the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today polls.

The 2007-08 season was one of the best in Kent State history. The Golden Flashes finished 28-7 with a school-record 25 regular-season wins and won the Mid-American Conference regular-season and tournament championships. Christian guided Kent State to a No. 9 seed in the NCAA Tournament which was the best seed in program history.

While in Kent, Christian mentored two honorable-mention All-Americans (Antonio Gates, DeAndre Haynes), two MAC Players of the Year (DeAndre Haynes, Al Fisher), three MAC Defensive Players of the Year (Demetric Shaw, John Edwards, Haminn Quaintance), one MAC Sixth Man of the Year (Kevin Warzynski) and a total of 19 All-MAC selections, including six first teamers.

Christian served as an assistant coach for the Golden Flashes in 2001-02 when they advanced to the Elite Eight. Prior to his time in Kent, Christian was a college basketball talent evaluator at Octagon Sports Marketing and Management.

Christian served as an assistant coach at Pittsburgh from 1996-99 under Ralph Willard. He guided the development of Vonteego Cummings, a two-time All-Big East player who went on to play for the Philadelphia 76ers and Golden State Warriors.

Christian served as an assistant coach under former Miami (Ohio) and current Arizona State head coach Herb Sendek during the 1995-96 campaign. The RedHawks recorded a 21-8 overall record, including a 12-6 mark in conference action, and earned a berth in the NIT

Christian worked at Western Kentucky for the 1994-95 season as the Hilltoppers went 27-4, including a 17-1 record in the Sun Belt Conference. That season, Western Kentucky recorded the fourth-most wins in program history and earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament after winning the conference tournament.

Christian's first full-time assistant coaching position came at St. Francis (Pa.). In his two seasons with the Red Flashes, Christian guided the development of two-time All-Northeast Conference performer Deon George and Jason Roberts.

A native of Bethpage, N.Y., Christian was an all-state guard at St. Dominic High School while playing under Ralph Willard. Christian was recruited by current Louisville head coach Rick Pitino to Boston University where he played two seasons before transferring to Rhode Island.

Christian played his final two campaigns under Tom Penders at the University of Rhode Island where he helped the Rams reach the Sweet Sixteen in the 1988 NCAA? Tournament.

The standout guard led the Rams to victories over Missouri and Syracuse before losing a 73-72 game to Duke for the right to advance to the Elite Eight. After graduation, Christian spent one season playing professionally in Australia for the Sydney City Comets

Christian earned his bachelor's degree in consumer affairs from the University of Rhode Island in 1988. He and his wife, Patty, have three children, MacKenzie, Zach and Jay.
