THE OPENING TIP

- No. 18 Duke returns home to face Miami Saturday after dropping a pair of road games against ranked teams last week. ESPN will open the 2017 season of College GameDay from Cameron Indoor Stadium prior to the contest.

- Duke has utilized seven different starting lineups in 18 games this season and has had eight players miss time due to injury.

- Led by **Luke Kennard** (20.2), Duke has five players averaging double figures. Duke has an effective field goal percentage of .549 and ranks ninth nationally in offensive efficiency (119.1).

- Kennard and **Jayson Tatum** score a combined 37.0 points per game, making them the second-highest scoring duo in the ACC. They shoot a combined .863 from the free throw line.

- Kennard leads the ACC in minutes played, averaging 35.4 per game. Despite his heavy workload, he has the best field goal percentage (.534) among ACC guards.

- **Grayson Allen** has assumed primary point guard duties in Duke's reconfigured rotation. In ACC games, he ranks second in the league with an average of 6.5 assists per game.

- Tatum leads Duke in blocks (1.5) and steals (1.9) per game. He is averaging a team-high 2.2 per game in ACC play.

- Tatum is the second-leading freshman scorer in ACC play with an average of 18.2 per night. Over Duke's last four games, he is averaging team-highs of 18.3 points and 2.5 steals.

- **Matt Jones** is 9-of-19 (.474) from outside the arc in Duke's last four games.

112TH SEASON OF BASKETBALL

• The 2016-17 campaign marks the 112th season of Duke basketball. The Blue Devils have compiled a 2,101-868 all-time record to rank fourth all-time in victories.

• Only Kentucky (2,221), Kansas (2,203) and North Carolina (2,191) have more all-time wins than Duke (through Jan. 19).

• Duke's all-time .708 winning percentage is also the fourth-best in NCAA history, behind only Kentucky (.764), North Carolina (.737) and Kansas (.723).

COACH 1K

• Mike Krzyzewski owns a 1,057-325 (.765) record over 41-plus seasons as a head coach, including a 984-266 (.787) mark at Duke (36-plus seasons).

• Coach K became the first men's coach in Division I college basketball to record 1,000 career victories with a 77-68 win over St. John's on Jan. 25, 2015 at Madison Square Garden.

• Krzyzewski has also won a record 447 ACC games (regular season and tournament), having passed Dean Smith (422) on Feb. 4, 2015.

• Coach K owns 984 of Duke's 2,101 all-time wins, translating to 46.8 percent of the wins in the history of Duke men's basketball.

• Duke has won at least 20 games in 20 consecutive seasons, making Coach K the third coach in Division I men's history to do so.

MILESTONES ON THE HORIZON

• Duke head coach Mike Krzyzewski already holds the NCAA record for wins at one school with 984 in his tenure at Duke.

• Coach K, the only men's coach in Division I history to win 1,000 games overall, needs just 16 victories to get to 1,000 at Duke.

• Coach K also has 498 wins at Cameron Indoor Stadium, placing him two shy of 500 victories at Duke's legendary home venue.

SUSTAINED SUCCESS

• Duke has won 20 or more games 51 times in its 111-plus years of basketball. Including its 25-10 mark last season, Duke has won at least 20 games for 20 consecutive seasons.

• The Blue Devils have recorded 30 or more wins 14 times under Coach K, the most by a coach in NCAA history.

• Duke is one of eight programs nationally to win at least 25 games in each of the last four seasons along with Arizona, Gonzaga, Kansas, Michigan State, Stephen F. Austin, VCU and Wichita State.

A LEADER IN OFFENSIVE EFFICIENCY

• Duke ranks ninth nationally in adjusted offensive efficiency (points scored per 100 possessions) at a rate of 119.1.

• The Blue Devils are the only team to finish in the nation's top 10 in adjusted offensive efficiency in each of the last eight years.

TAKING IT AWAY

- Duke is forcing teams into an average of 14.4 turnovers per game this season and converting them into an average of 17.2 points.
- The Blue Devils have an average margin of +5.3 points per game off of turnovers.
- Duke is 12-0 this season when it turns the ball over less than its opponent.

SHARING THE BALL

- In four games since moving **Grayson Allen** into the primary point guard role, Duke is averaging 15.5 assists with a 1.03 assist-to-turnover ratio.
- Prior to that switch, Duke was averaging 13.4 assists with a 1.21 assist-to-turnover ratio.
- Duke is 7-2 this season and 23-8 in his career when Allen leads the team in assists.

NOTHING EASY OUTSIDE THE ARC

- Duke's perimeter defense has been stifling in 2016-17, holding teams to a .296 mark from three-point range that ranks 14th nationally and sixth among major-conference teams.
- The Blue Devils are allowing opponents to make an average of only 5.2 three-pointers per game.
- Duke has outscored teams by 147 points (429-282), an average of 8.2 points per game, from three-point territory.

READY TO PLAY FROM THE JUMP

- Duke has held a lead at the half in 13 games this season, outscoring opponents by an average of 9.7 points (742-568) in the opening period.
- The Blue Devils have held seven teams to less than 30 opening-half points.

LETHAL SCORING DUO

- With a combined average of 37.0 points per game, **Luke Kennard** (20.2) and **Jayson Tatum** (16.8) are the second-highest scoring duo in the ACC.
- Kennard has scored in double figures 17 times in 18 games, while Tatum has reached double digits in each of the 10 games he's played. The two have combined for 12 20-point games on the year.
- Kennard and Tatum have teamed up to shoot .494 from the floor, .406 from outside the arc and .863 from the free throw line.

- With 2016 McDonald's All-Americans Marques Bolden, Frank Jackson and Jayson Tatum arriving on campus, Duke will have eight McDonald's All-Americans on its roster in 2016-17.
- Duke has now had seven or more McDonald's All-America selections on its roster 12 times under head coach Mike Krzyzewski, including five of the last 10 years.

INTERNATIONAL EXPERIENCE

- Duke has a total of seven players on its 2016-17 roster who have international basketball experience, including six who have played in the USA Basketball system.
- Harry Giles and Jayson Tatum have both won three gold medals representing the U.S. in international competition, while Chase Jeter and Luke Kennard have one gold medal apiece.
- Marques Bolden and Frank Jackson made their USA Basketball debuts in 2016, helping the U.S. win the 2016 Nike Hoop Summit.
- Jack White has represented Australia at three international competitions since 2013.

GOING OUT WITH GOLD

- Mike Krzyzewski finished his tenure as U.S. National Team head coach with a flourish on Aug. 21, 2016, as the USA defeated Serbia for the gold medal at the Rio Olympics.
- With the win, Coach K became first coach - man or woman - to lead a country to three Olympic basketball gold medals (and did so consecutively).
- Coach K was 24-0 in the Olympics as head coach of the U.S. National Team. He was part of five Olympic gold medal-winning coaching staffs for the U.S., helping his country compile a 40-0 record in those tournaments.
- Krzyzewski concluded his tenure as U.S. National Team head coach with an 88-1 record, finishing it off with a National Team-record 76-game winning streak intact. He led the team to six gold medals and one bronze.

RACKING UP MAJOR TITLES

- Duke head coach Mike Krzyzewski has won five NCAA titles, three Olympic gold medals and two FIBA World Cup/World Championship crowns for a total of 10 major championships.
- Coach K's 10 titles tie him for the second-most major championships all-time (NBA titles, NCAA titles, Olympic gold medals, FIBA World Cup titles).

RECENT RECRUITING SUCCESS

- Duke, Arizona, Kansas and Kentucky are the only programs nationally to post top-10 classes in ESPN's recruiting class rankings in each of the last three seasons.
- The Blue Devils' 2014 and 2015 classes were both ranked No. 1 nationally by ESPN.
- Since 2009, Duke has signed 20 ESPN top 25 recruits and 27 ESPN top 100 recruits, totals that both rank second nationally.

WELCOME TO THE BROTHERHOOD

- Duke signed three student-athletes to National Letters of Intent during the 2016 early signing period: Wendell Carter Jr., Alex O'Connell and Gary Trent Jr.
- The trio stands at No. 3 on the ESPN RecruitingNation Class Rankings.
- Carter is rated as the No. 3 prospect in the class by ESPN and owns a pair of gold medals with USA Basketball.
- O'Connell is ranked as the No. 88 prospect in the class by ESPN. His father, David, played at Duke from 1973-76.
- Trent is rated as the No. 8 player in the class by ESPN and also owns two gold medals with USA Basketball. He was named MVP of the 2015 FIBA Americas U16 Championship.

TOP-10 PICKS OVER LAST FIVE YEARS

- Duke has produced six top-10 picks in the NBA Draft since 2011, the second-most nationally over that time frame.
- In 2016, Brandon Ingram (2nd overall) joined Kyrie Irving (1st in 2011), Austin Rivers (10th in 2012), Jahliil Okafor (3rd in 2015), Jabari Parker (2nd in 2014) and Justise Winslow (10th in 2015) on that list.

FINANCIAL SUCCESS IN NBA

- Mike Krzyzewski's Duke players who went on to play in the NBA have collectively earned more than \$1.2 billion in NBA salaries.
- Of those 50 players, 37 have posted multi-million dollar NBA earnings, while 10 have cracked the \$50 million mark and four have earned more than \$100 million.

FORMER CAPTAINS ON STAFF

- Duke's 2016-17 coaching staff once again features three former team captains in Jeff Capel (associate head coach), Nate James (assistant coach) and Jon Scheyer (assistant coach).
- Head coach Mike Krzyzewski has had three former Duke captains on his staff every year since 1996-97, a period in which the Blue Devils have won three NCAA championships, 10 ACC Tournament titles and eight regular season ACC crowns.

A GLOBAL BRAND

- In early August, Colin Cowherd listed Duke as the only college basketball program he considers to be a global sports brand.

CHAMPIONS CLASSIC VIEWERSHIP

- The Duke-Kansas game at the 2016 Champions Classic in New York earned a live audience of 2,444,000 viewers (TV and streaming).
- The contest is the most-viewed game in college basketball so far this season.
- The Duke-Kansas game was also ESPN's most-streamed college basketball game ever, earning 83,000 viewers per minute.
- Duke has averaged 2.8 million viewers in its Champions Classic games, the best average among the four programs in the event.

NO. 1 IN PRESEASON AP POLL

- For the eighth time in program history, Duke was ranked No. 1 in the preseason AP poll. The Blue Devils' eight preseason No. 1 rankings are the second-most in poll history.
- Duke has been ranked No. 1 in the AP poll a total of 129 weeks, the second-most in NCAA history.
- Under Coach K, Duke has played more games as the nation's top-ranked team (222) than it has as an unranked team (145).
- Coach K has a record of 193-29 (.869) in the top spot of the AP poll, marking the second-most games and wins in that position.

ATOP THE PRESEASON COACHES POLL

- Duke was ranked No. 1 in the preseason USA Today Coaches Poll on Oct. 20, marking the sixth time in program history the Blue Devils have earned the coaches' top spot in the preseason.
- Duke garnered 27 of the 32 first-place votes in the preseason rankings.

ACC/BIG CHALLENGE SUCCESS

- Duke moved to 16-2 (.889) all-time in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge with its win over Michigan State on Nov. 29, marking both the most wins and best winning percentage of any team in the event.
- The Blue Devils are 8-0 in Challenge games at Cameron Indoor Stadium.
- Duke is in the midst of a five-game Challenge winning streak.

KB PATCHES

- The Blue Devils are wearing KB patches on its jerseys this season to honor former Duke University president Dr. Keith Brodie, who passed away on Dec. 2, 2016.
- Brodie was Duke's president from 1985-93, a period during which Mike Krzyzewski led the Blue Devils to two national titles.
- Coach K called Brodie "the best man (he) ever met at Duke."
