After leading Miami to the 2013 NCAA Sweet 16 **Rebounds per Game** and winning the school's first ACC regular season and tournament championships, Larrañaga was honored as the AP, Naismith, USBWA Henry Iba, Adolph Rupp Cup and ACC Coach of the Year.

LARRAÑAGA BY THE NUMBERS

- 5 Coach Jim Larrañaga is one of five ACC coaches with a Final Four appearance to his credit. In 2006, Larrañaga became the first coach at a mid-major school to take his team to the NCAA Final Four in 27 years.
- 6 In 31 years of coaching, Jim Larrañaga has a winning record in the NCAA Tournament, a 7-5 mark in six appearances.
- 7 Larrañaga is no stranger to the ACC. In his seven seasons as an assistant coach at Virginia, the Cavaliers participated in the NCAA Final Four in 1981 and 1984, won three ACC Championships and finished in the Top 5 of the rankings.
- 10 The 2015-16 marks the 10th anniversary of Larrañaga's Cinderella run to the 2006 NCAA Final Four with George Mason. Both associate head coach Chris Caputo and director of operations James Johnson were on that GMU staff.
- 15 Larrañaga has made 15 postseason appearances in the past 26 years, including six NCAA tournaments.
- 32 Larrañaga is in his 32nd year as a head coach and has successfully transitioned three institutions into successful programs: Miami, Bowling Green and George Mason.
 - 500 Coach L is one of five ACC coaches with 500 or more wins.

LARRAÑAGA - WHY MIAMI?

Along with returning to the best basketball conference in the country, Coach L had a few personal reasons for accepting the head coaching job at Miami. Coach's grandfather was from Cuba, where he produced the Larrañaga [lare-en-YAH-ga] cigar. Coach's father was raised in Key West before moving to The Bronx, N.Y., getting married and raising six children. Coach L was raised in The Bronx, but vacationed to Florida as a boy. He also has owned a house in Sarasota - which he bought from Dick Vitale's daughter - and three of his siblings have retired to Florida.

MIAMI'S STARTERS SHOW EXPERIENCE

In Miami's game at Nebraska, the Hurricanes started three seniors and a pair of juniors who have now combined for 280 career starts and 468 games played. Sheldon McClellan has started 69 games playing in 113, Tonye Jekiri has 60 starts in 111 games, Angel Rodriguez is at 76/104, Davon Reed 38/70 and Kamari Murohy 37/70.

Those five players have been on a Division I team a combined 21 seasons, as McClellan and Rodriguez are both in their fifth year on the court, Jekiri and Murphy are each in their fourth season, and Reed is a true junior.

The average age of the starting five is 21.8 years old: Rodriguez - 23; McClellan - 23; Murphy - 22; Jekiri - 21; Reed - 20.

MCCLELLAN ON THREE NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCH LISTS

Senior shooting guard Sheldon McClellan is turning heads across the country, earning nods on a trio of watch lists for national player of the year awards. He is one of 50 players on the Naismith Trophy Men's College Player of the Year early season watch list, one of 33 players on the watch list for the Oscar Robertson Trophy for Men's National Player of the Year and is among the 20 players named to the watch list for the 2016 Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award.

While leading the Canes to a 6-1 record and No. 21 position in the polls, McClellan is currently ranked nationally in 10 statistical categories. He is No. 44 in free throw percentage (89.7%), No. 50 in field goal percentage (59.7%), No. 81 in total points (119) and No. 96 in field goals made (96). His 59.7 percent shooting is ninth in the nation among guards and fourth-best among players on teams in the top eight basketball conferences (Power Five plus A-10, BIG EAST & American).

LAWRENCE AMPS UP HIS PLAY

Freshman Anthony "Amp" Lawrence Jr. had a breakout game at Nebraska, playing just 14 minutes in Miami's overtime victory. In those 14 minutes, he tallied 13 points and seven rebounds, hitting a pair of shots from long distance and knocking down his and-1 free throw attempt.

NEWTON IMPROVES FROM ROOKIE TO SOPHOMORE SEASON

Miami sophomore Ja'Quan Newton has immensely improved his stats from last year through the first seven games of the season. The Philadelphia native is scoring 11.7 points per game while hitting 49.1 percent of his attempts. A season ago, Newton averged 4.0 ppg on 40.5 percent shooting. This year, he has scored greater than 10 points and played more than 20 minutes in six games, whereas last year he only scored double-digits four times and played more than 20 minutes in seven of his 34 games played

MCCLELLAN TOPS 1,500 CAREER POINTS

Miami senior Sheldon McClellan has scored 1,512 points in his career, tallying 843 in two years at the University of Texas and 669 in a year and seven games at UM.

LARRAÑAGA CLOSING IN ON 100 WINS AT MIAMI

In just his fifth year at UM, Jim Larrañaga is closing in on 100 wins at The U. He is currently 97-50. Bruce Hale was the Miami coach who won 100 games the quickest, earning 100 victories in just 159 games. Hart Morris took 163 games, Frank Haith 174 and Leonard Hamilton took 230 games.

QUICK HITS

- As a team, Miami is hitting 50.7 percent from the field and 41.8 percent from three.
- Miami has posted 14.6 assists per game in the first seven outings.
- Miami's bench has scored 27.6 points per game. The Canes' bench players have outscored the opponent's bench 193-142.
- The Canes have scored 33.1 points per game in the paint, including 50 paint points against Northeastern and 46 against Mississippi State.
- Miami is averaging 17.3 points off of turnovers, compared to 10.6 from the opponent. Miami is averaging just 10.3 turnovers per night, while forcing opponents to give it up 13.4 times per game.
- Miami trailed by only three points in its first two games, two points against Mississippi State and never trailed against nationally ranked Utah or Butler.
- Five Hurricanes are averaging at least 9.4 points per game.
- Five Canes pull down at least 3.0 rebounds per game.
- Five players are averaging at least 21.0 minutes per game.
- Eight Canes have knocked down a 3-pointer and 10 have attempted a three.
- Eight players are shooting better than 45 percent from the field and four are better than 45 percent from long distance.
- Every Cane has scored 10+ points in at least one game.
- UM is averaging 8.7 threes made per game and 20.3 made free throws per game.
- Miami has won six early-season tournaments since 2000: 2015-16 Puerto Rico Tip-Off, 2014-15 Charleston Classic, 2010-11 Las Vegas Holiday Hoops Classic, 2009-10 Charleston Classic, 2007-08 Puerto Rico Tip-Off and the 2001-02 Paradise Jam (Virgin Islands).

- Miami won ACC regular season and ACC tournament championships in 2013.
- Miami has 29 overall road wins, the most in the conference, leading 28 from North Carolina and Virginia and 26 from Duke.
- Miami has posted a 7-5 combined record against Duke (3-2) and North Carolina (4-3).
- Miami has the fourth-most ACC wins (41) in league play, behind Duke (55), Virginia (52) and North Carolina (50).
- Miami has the fourth-most ACC road wins (19) in league play, behind Duke (24), North Carolina (23) and Virginia (21).
- Miami is tied for the fourth-most ACC home wins (22), behind Duke and Virginia (31), North Carolina (27) and tied with Florida State and NC State (22).
- Miami is one of four schools with six or more wins in the ACC Tournament: North Carolina 7, NC State 7, Miami 6, Florida State 6.

Ivan Cruz Uceda has knocked down at least one 3-pointer in every game except it Nebraska.

Tonye Jekiri has pulled down at least 10 rebounds in six games, including four games with 12. He has at least one assist in every outing.

Sheldon McClellan has scored 16+ points in five of seven games, has a steal in every game, and has shot better than 50 percent from the field in all but two games.

Ja'Quan Newton has scored double-digit points in six of seven games after only scoring 10+ in four games as a rookie. He has already scored 82 points as a sophomore after 135 points in 34 games a season ago.

Davon Reed has grabbed at least three rebounds in every game.

COMING OFF THE BENCH

Miami's bench is averaging 27.6 points per game. Against Mississippi State, the reserves tallied 50 points, followed by 31 against No. 22/20 Butler and 27 vs. UTRGV. Miami's bench low was 17 against Northeastern. Canes' opponents are averaging 20.3 bench points per game.

HOMECOMING FOR RODRIGUEZ, EARNS MVP

Senior guard Angel Rodriguez was named the Puerto Rico Tip-Off Most Valuable Player. He averaged 13.7 points and 4.0 assists, including 19 points in the championship game. The native of Cupey, P.R., just 20 minutes from San Juan, was greeted by friends and family at each game.

THREE CANES ALL-TOURNEY IN PUERTO RICO

Sheldon McClellan, Angel Rodriguez and Tonye Jekiri were named to the Puerto Rico Tip-Off All Tournament Team. This is the first time three players from the same team were on the tournament squad.

MIAMI LANDS HUELL, BROWN AND MILLER

The Miami men's basketball team landed a pair of top-30 players in Dewan Huell and Bruce Brown, and top 100 player Rodney Miller.

With the addition of these three players, Miami would have six top 100 players next season: Huell (25), Brown (44), Ja'Quan Newton (52), Miller (90), James Palmer (98).

Huell, at 6-10 and 218 pounds, is a five-star, top-25 power forward from Miami Norland High School. Nationally, he is ranked the No. 21 player by ESPN, No. 23 by Rivals and No. 25 by Scout. ESPN and Scout rank him fifth at his position, and Scout says he's the top player in the state of Florida, while ESPN and Rivals have him second in the state. A fluid player who finishes around the rim, Huell runs the floor and can beat his man off the dribble. He can hit the open 15-footer, as well as play with his back to the basket, scoring with a jump hook. Huell has the ability to elevate quickly, giving him the ability to block shots and grab offensive rebounds.

Brown, from Wakefield, Mass., is a four-star shooting guard at Vermont Academy in Saxton's River, Vt. At 6-4 and 205 pounds, Brown is ranked No. 30 by ESPN, No. 44 per Scout and No. 49 by Rivals. A combo guard with a 6-9 wingspan, Brown is one of the best defenders in the country and plays with tremendous energy. He is physical, has the ability to score off the dribble and can play multiple backcourt positions.

Miller is a 6-foot-11-inch, 245-pound center playing prep ball at Oak Hill Academy in Virginia. A native of Laurelton, N.Y., Miller is a consensus four-star recruit, ranked No. 90 overall by Scout.com and No. 114 by Rivals.com. As a center, he is ranked No. 17 by Scout.com and No. 15 by ESPN. Miller, with a 7-foot-1-inch wingspan, has the ability to alter shots defensively, is a blue-collar rebounder and has good offensive touch around the rim.

CANES SIGN TOP 10 RECRUITING CLASS

The 2016 recruiting class of Dewan Huell, Bruce Brown and Rodney Miller is being named a top-10 recruiting class in the country, with 247Sports ranking the class No. 7, Scout at No. 8, ESPN at No. 9 and Rivals at No. 10.

The 2016 class rankings top Miami's best mark from 2005, when the Canes signed four fourstar recruits — Jimmy Graham, Brian Asbury, Adrian Thomas and Denis Clemente — in a class that was ranked No. 12 in the nation by Scout.

In 2009, Miami's signing class was nationally ranked No. 19 by Scout and No. 24 by ESPN. That Hurricanes' heralded 2009 class was comprised of ESPNU 100 picks Durand Scott, Garrius Adams and Donnavan Kirk, in addition to May signee Antoine Allen.

Since 2002, Miami has signed 16 Scout.com top 100 players, including three five-star, top-25 players in DeQuan Jones (22, 2008), Huell (25) and Durand Scott (25, 2009). Since Larrañaga's arrival, his staff has signed five top-100 players in Huell (25), Brown (44), Ja'Quan Newton (52, 2014), Rodney Miller (90) and James Palmer (98, 2014).

Huell is the most lauded signee for Miami since Scott in 2009, Jones in 2008, No. 32 Guillermo Diaz in 2003 and McDonald's All-American Darius Rice in 2000.

MIAMI WINS PUERTO RICO TIP-OFF

Miami defeated Mississippi State 105-79, then downed No. 16 Utah 90-66 and dropped No. 22/20 Butler 85-75 to win the 2015 Puerto Rico Tip-Off. The Canes outscored their opponents by 20.0 points per game, and out rebounded opponents by 8.7 rebounds per game. Miami also won the event in 2007-08.

POLL VAULT - CANES UNRANKED TO NO. 15/19 ON NOV. 23

Fresh off its championship run through the Puerto Rico Tip-Off, Miami made its season debut in the top 20 of both major college basketball polls on Nov. 23. Miami checked in at No. 15 in the Associated Press top 25, and earned a No. 19 ranking in the USA TODAY Coaches Poll. According to the AP, Miami becomes the sixth program in the last 10 years to be unranked in the AP Top 25 one week and rise to at least No. 15 in the following week's poll, joining Connecticut, Syracuse, Florida, Villanova and Minnesota. It is also the highest ranking for Miami during the month of November in the history of the AP poll; the Hurricanes reached No. 17 in November in the 2008-09 and 2014-15 seasons.

Just one season ago, Miami went from unranked to No. 17/20 in the Nov. 24 polls, following a win over No. 8/7 Florida and a championship run in the Charleston Classic. The Canes were ranked five weeks last season. The Hurricanes were last ranked the week of Jan. 26, 2015, when the Canes were No. 23 in both polls.

Prior to the arrival of Coach L, Miami had not been ranked in the top 15 in either poll since Feb. 18, 2002 when the Canes were No. 17/13.

JEKIRI NAMED ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Senior forward Tonye Jekiri was named the Atlantic Coast Conference Player of the Week on Nov. 23. Jekiri was named to the Puerto Rico Tip-Off All-Tournament Team, where in three games, he averaged 13.3 points, 11.3 rebounds, 1.3 assists and 1.3 blocks in 28.0 minutes. He was 15-21 (71.4%) from the field and 10-11 (90.9%) at the line. Against No. 16 Utah and national center of the year nominee Jakob Poeltl, Jekiri posted his career high 20 points and grabbed 12 rebounds. He was 8-10 from the field and 4-5 from the stripe in 32 minutes. He also had a steal, assist and block.

MIAMI'S WINS VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

In 10 wins over ranked opponents since the arrival of Coach L in 2011-12, Miami has won five games by 10+ points, including 27 points over No. 1 Duke in 2013 and 24 points over No. 16 Utah in 2015. Miami has also scored 90+ points against a ranked team in three outings: 90-63 over No. 1 Duke in 2013, 90-74 over No. 4 Duke in 2015 and 90-66 over No. 16 Utah in 2015.

THE LAST TIME OUT - MIAMI VS. NORTHEASTERN...

Miami's starting lineup for the sixth-straight game: Angel Rodriguez, Sheldon McClellan, Davon Reed, Ivan Cruz Uceda and Tonye Jekiri ... Miami trailed at the half, 35-30, for the first time this season. UM trailed by as much as 13 in the game ... The Canes took their first lead against Northeastern with 7:42 minutes left in the game. In its previous two games, Miami never trailed ... Miami is 2-1 in the all-time series against Northeastern, all of which are home contests ... Miami is 79-36 overall when ranked in the Top 25, 61 -30 since the rebirth of basketball at Miami (1985), and 31-16 since joining the ACC. Under Coach Larrañaga, Miami is 20-9 when the Canes are ranked in the Top 25 ... Tonye Jekiri scored the first eight points of the game for Miami. In his 109 previous games played, Jekiri had scored eight-or-more points in the entire game 25 times last season, five times as a sophomore and never as a rookie ... Jekiri was halfway to double-digit rebounds at the break, recording five boards in the first half. He finished with a game-high of 12 rebounds ... Tonye Jekiri moved into a tie for 11th on Miami's career blocks list, tying Kenny Kadji (2011-13) with 97 career blocks ... Sheldon McClellan scored in double-digits for the 36th time of his Miami career, tallying 18 against Northeastern. He has 10+ points in five-of-six games this season ... JaQuan Newton went on a 3-of-3 field goal run in the first half, and ended the game with 13 points

... Miami senior Sheldon McClellan has scored 1,498 points in his career, tallying 843 in two years at the University of Texas and 655 in a year and six games

Senior Tonye Jekiri returns from Miami's 2012-13 ACC Championship and NCAA Sweet 16 team. Sheldon McClellan (Texas), Kamari Murphy (Oklahoma State) and Angel Rodriguez (Kansas State) also have played in the NCAA Tournament, each with their previous schools.

BALANCED SCORING IN FIRST THREE GAMES

In the first three games of the 2015-16 season, Miami had five, six and seven players score in double digits, respectively. Against UT Rio Grande Valley, Sheldon McClellan (18), Ivan Cruz Uceda (16), Davon Reed (14), Ja'Quan Newton (11) and James Palmer (11) notched double-digit points, while Reed (19), Angel Rodriguez (18), McClellan (16), Cruz Uceda (13), Anthony Lawrence Jr. (12) and Newton (11) did against Louisiana. Mississippi saw seven Canes with double digits: McClellan (18), Newton (15), Palmer (14), Izundu (11), Rodriguez (11), Cruz Uceda (10), Lawrence (10).

LARRAÑAGA AMONG THE BEST IN COLLEGE BASKETBALL

Entering the 2015-16 season, Coach Larrañaga is tied for 12th on the list of Winningest Active Coaches at Major Schools and is tied for 57th on the NCAA's list of All-Time Winningest Coaches. See page 9 of the notes for a complete listing.

MIAMI PREDICTED TO FINISH FIFTH IN ACC

Miami was predicted to finish fifth out of 15 teams in the Atlantic Coast Conference this season, as announced by the league during Operation ACC Basketball in Charlotte, N.C., Oct. 28. North Carolina was picked to win the league, followed by Virginia, Duke and Notre Dame.

In 2012-13, the Canes were picked to finish fifth, then won the league's regular season and tournament championship. In all four of Larrañaga's seasons at Miami, the Canes have finished the season better than predicted at ACC media day.

AMONG UNIVERSITY OF MIAMI COACHES, LARRAÑAGA ...

- has the highest winning percentage of a Miami coach in the NCAA Tournament, a .667 mark with a 2-1 record.
- is one of two Miami coaches to post three 20-win seasons. Larrañaga has recorded three 20-win seasons in four years at Miami
- .647 winning percentage is the best mark since Bruce Hale posted a .663 mark from 1955-67, including three seasons led by Rick Barry.
- has led the Canes to 41 ACC wins in just four seasons. Miami won 43 ACC games the previous seven seasons.
- Under Coach L, Miami has posted three of the Canes' top five finishes in ACC play, including the 2013 championship, tied for fourth in 2012 and tied for sixth in 2015. In 2008, Miami tied for fifth in league play, and in 2005, tied for sixth.
- In four seasons under Coach L, Miami has tallied six wins in the ACC Tournament. In the previous seven seasons, Miami went 6-7.
- In two NIT appearances under Coach L, Miami is 5-2 for a .714 winning percentage. In Miami's other 10 NIT appearances combined, the Canes went 6-10 for a .375 winning percentage.

DID YOU KNOW ...

Coach L became the first Miami coach to win 20+ games in his first two seasons at UM and only the third of 12 UM coaches to post three 20-win seasons.

Former Cane Rick Barry was named one of the Greatest Players in NRA History

Miami native and former Cane James Jones won the 2010-2011 NBA All-Star Weekend 3-Point Contest and the NBA Championship in the 2011-2012 and 2012-13 seasons.

Six-time NBA All Star Amar'e Stoudemire enrolled at UM in 2013 and took classes to earn his bachelor's degree.

UM is in its 12th season in the ACC.

Coach L led the George Mason Patriots to the 2006 Final Four with big wins over some of basketball's elite teams such as Michigan State, UNC and UConn. He was the first coach to take a mid-major to a Final Four in 27 years (Penn '79) when his team advanced in 2006.

In 14 years at George Mason, Larrañaga led the Patriots to five NCAA Tournament appearances (2011, 2008, 2006, 2001, 1999), including the 2006 Final Four.

Miami basketball received APR (Academic Progress Rate) Public Recognition Awards for being among the top 10 percent in APR in its sport. Miami ranks in the top 10 percent NCAA men's basketball with a 990 APR.

The Miami Department of Athletics recorded a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 89 percent. Miami's department-wide GSR is 16th overall among FBS programs. UM has exceeded the NCAA average GSR in each of the last 10 years.

The Canes have averaged 20.0 wins over the last 11 seasons.

The Hurricanes have made at least one trey in 910 of 916 games since the NCAA adopted the 3-point shot in 1986. The last time Miami was held without a 3-pointer was Feb. 26, 2014 at Virginia.

Miami has held 769 of its last 770 opponents to less than 100 points. North Carolina was the last team to score 100+, defeating UM 105-64 on Jan. 31, 2007.

MIAMI BASKETBALL - THE EARLY YEARS

The University of Miami basketball program was dormant for 14 years from 1971-1985. In 1983 Director of Athletics Sam Jankovich announced the resurrection of men's basketball at Miami, with the reinstatement vote by the UM Board of Trustees on Oct. 12, 1983. Head coach Bill Foster was hired March 21, 1984, adding assistants Clint Bryant, Seth Greenberg and Cesar Odio by July 1. Tim Harvey was the staff's first recruit, a 6-10, 240-pound center from Plainfield, N.J., who transferred from Georgia Tech. On Oct. 15, 1984 the first men's basketball practice in 12 years was held on the patio in the center of campus, viewed by more than 200 students. Miami defeated The Citadel, 85-77, on Nov. 22, 1985, in the first game of the new era of UM basketball.

COACHING COORDINATORS FOR MIAMI

Miami's assistant coaching staff is set up in a coordinator system, with Jamal Brunt as the offensive coordinator, Chris Caputo manning the defense and Adam Fisher handling the scout for every opponent. James Johnson is the Dean of Discipline.

COACHING CHANGES FOR THE HURRICANES

After having the same assistant coaching staff his first four years in Miami, Larrañaga has two new assistant coaches in 2015-16 in Jamal Brunt and Adam Fisher, following the departure of Eric Konkol (Louisiana Tech) and Michael Huger (Bowling Green). Konkol had been an assistant with Coach L 11 seasons and Huger was an assistant coach for eight years and player for four seasons.

Due to the lack of turnover, Coach L has only had nine assistant coaches in the last 14 seasons. Five of his assistants left for a D-l head coaching job, and two others who have worked their way into head coaching jobs. In those 14 seasons, only twice two assistants left at the same time, 1996 (Stan Heath and Steve Merfeld) and 1989 (Jeff Snyder and Ricky Stokes).

Chris Caputo, in his 14th season on Larrañaga's staff and fifth in Coral Gables, was promoted to associate head coach in the summer of 2015.

COACH L REUNITED WITH JAMES JOHNSON

Larrañaga completed his 2015-16 staff with the addition of James Johnson as the team's director of basketball operations. Johnson, who was on Larrañaga's staff for two seasons at George Mason University, including the historic NCAA Final Four run in 2006, came to Miami after seven seasons on staff at fellow Atlantic Coast Conference school Virginia Tech, where he was the head coach for two seasons after five years as an assistant coach.

LARRAÑAGA CONTRACT EXTENDED THROUGH 2022

The University of Miami extended Coach Jim Larrañaga's contract through May 31, 2022, Director of Athletics Blake James announced in September 2014. Larrañaga first signed a five-year contract in April 2011, then was granted a three-year extension in 2012.

PROCANES REPORT

Former Hurricanes James Jones and Shane Larkin have taken their talents onto NBA rosters this season, as Jones is in Cleveland with the Cavaliers and Larkin joins a new team, the Brooklyn Nets, after playing across town with the Knicks last season.

Miami has 17 former players in professional basketball at this time. A complete list is on page five of the notes.

LARRAÑAGA MEMBER OF UM FACULTY

Coach Jim Larrañaga is an Adjunct Assistant Professor of Kinesiology and Sport Sciences at the University of Miami. Due to his head coaching responsibilities, Larrañaga is a guest lecturer at several different classes in the School of Education and Human Development throughout the semester.

COACH L TIES TO THE ACC

Coach Jim Larrañaga was an assistant coach at Virginia from 1979-1986, under the leadership of Terry Holland. In those seven seasons, Larrañaga helped the Cavaliers to five NCAA appearances: Final Four twice, Elite Eight once, Sweet 16 once and Round of 64 once, as well as two NIT appearances, including the Championship and Quarterfinal round.

ATTITUDE, COMMITMENT AND CLASS

Attitude, commitment and class are the cornerstone values of the Miami basketball program. Attitude: Be positive. Life is 10% what happens to you and 90% how you react to it. Commitment: Make a total and unconditional commitment to our program. Be passionate about what you do. Class: Show pride and respect in yourself and our program. Be the best you can be in thought, word and deed.

CORAL GABLES AND MIAMI FACTS

The Florida city of Coral Gables, situated just a few miles southwest of Miami, is part of Miami-Dade County. Incorporated in 1925, Coral Gables was created as a fully-planned community by George Merrick, who envisioned an upscale Miami suburb with large elements of Mediterranean-style architecture to highlight the region's Spanish influence. In 1925, roughly simultaneous to the founding of Coral Gables, the city was selected as the home to the University of Miami, which was constructed that year on 240 acres of land just west of U.S. Route 1, approximately two miles south of downtown Coral Gables.

The average temperature in Coral Gables is 75 degrees.

Coral Gables averages 300 days of sunshine per year.

The Venetian Pool, located in Coral Gables, is acclaimed as "the world's most beautiful public swimming pool."

Miami has 84 miles of beaches.

Miami is the most southerly major city in the continental United States.

THE LAST TIME OUT AGAINST CHARLOTTE - NOV. 25, 2014

After being down by nine at the 7:36 mark, the Canes went on a 21-11 run to go up 38-37 at intermission ... Six Canes scored in the first half and shot 7-14 (50%) from the perimeter ... The Canes started the second half on a perfect 7-7 from the field and a 4-4 from behind the three-point line. Miami's first missed shot of the second stanza came at the 12:46 mark ... The Canes hit a season high 14 three-point field goals, one short of the school record set in 2013 ... Three Canes scored in double figures: Sheldon McClellan (31), Manu Lecomte (18), and Angel Rodriguez (14) ... Three Canes had multiple three-point field goals: Sheldon McClellan (5), Manu Lecomte (4), and Angel Rodriguez (4) ... The Canes held Charlotte to a season low 27.3 percent (6-22) from the three-point line .. Starters: Angel Rodriguez, Manu Lecomte, Sheldon McClellan, Joe Thomas and Tonye Jekiri ... Sheldon McClellan hit two free throws giving Miami a 77-74 lead with 8 seconds left in the game to ice a Charlotte comeback ... Sheldon McClellan had a career night in multiple categories. His game high 31 points for the Canes on 11-17 shooting, tops his previous career-high 27 against Texas Tech (3/9/13) when he played for Texas. With his 11 made field goals McClellan has also set a new career-high. His previous high was 10 against Oklahoma (1/21/13). He also had 11 rebounds setting a new career-high. His previous career-high was 9, which came against Rice (12/29/12) when he played at Texas. Sheldon McClellan also hit a career-high 5 three-pointers. His previous career high was 4 against Mississippi State (11/21/12) when he also played at Texas ... Angel Rodriguez has now scored in double figures in all six games this season for the Hurricanes, with 16, 24, 15, 15, 13, and 14 ... With six assists against Charlotte, Angel Rodriguez has 3+ assists in all six games for the Canes ... Tonye Jekiri finished with 13 rebounds and has now finished with 8+ rebounds in five of six games this season. Jekiri has also recorded a block in all six games this season ... Angel Rodriguez and Manu Lecomte have hit a three-point field goal in all six games this season.

CANES POST 20+-WIN SEASON

With a victory at Virginia Tech on March 7, 2015, Miami posted its third 20-win season in four years since the arrival of Jim Larrañaga. Since 2011-12, Coach L has tallied seasons of 20-13, 29-7, 17-16 and 25-13, for an average of 22.8 wins per season. Since joining the ACC in 2004-05, Miami posted three 20-win seasons before Larrañaga, 23-11 in 2008, 20-13 in 2010 and 21-15 in 2011.

MIAMI'S ROAD WINS RANK TOP 11 NATIONALLY

Miami was one of 38 teams in the country, and one of 11 teams from a Top 8 conference, to win 10+ games away from its home arena last regular season. Gonzaga led the way with 14 road and neutral site victories.

The Canes have posted 10+ wins away from home in two of Coach L's four seasons at Miami. In 2012-13, Miami won 15 on the road, including five neutral-site games. Last year, Miami was 10-5 away from the BankUnited Center, with a 3-1 neutral-site record, in the regular season.

CANES IN NATIONAL STATS, VIA NCAA.COM

Miami was 13th in the country in turnovers per game (10.1), committing less than 15 turnovers in 35 of 38 outings.

The Canes knocked down 292 shots from 3-point range, good enough for 20th in the nation. UM hit at least seven shots from long range in 23 games, and tied a school record of 15 made in a game, going 15-of-25 at Virginia Tech on March 7.

UM shot 74.6 percent from the free throw line, which was the 22nd-best mark in the country. Miami drained at least 70 percent of its free throws in 28 games last year. The Canes' 544 free throws made were No. 39 in the NCAA.

Miami averaged just 15.6 fouls per game, a mark that was 22ndbest in the nation, grabbed 1317 total rebounds (29th) and posted a 1.27 assist-to-turnover ratio (44th).

CANES FINISH SIXTH IN ACC AFTER BEING PICKED 10TH

Miami finished sixth in the 2014-15 ACC rankings after being projected to finish 10th by the media at Operation Basketball in October. In each of Coach L's four seasons at Miami, the Canes have exceeded preseason expectations. In his first season, Miami was picked fifth and finished tied for fourth. In just his second season, UM won the ACC after being projected to finish fifth. A year ago, the Canes were selected 12th, but ended 10th.

The Canes and Notre Dame both made a jump of four spots: Miami from 10th to sixth and Notre Dame from seventh to third. Wake Forest and Virginia Tech were the only schools who were slotted in the correct spots. In order of preseason projections, here are the final mis-projections of each team: Duke -1, North Carolina -3, Louisville -1, Virginia +3, Syracuse -3, Pittsburgh -4, Notre Dame +4, Florida State -3, NC State +2, Miami +4, Clemson +2, Wake Forest +0, Georgia Tech -1, Boston College +1, Virginia Tech +0.

LARRAÑAGA POSTS FOURTH 25-WIN SEASON

With a 25-13 mark last season at Miami, Coach Jim Larrañaga has posted four 25-win seasons as a head coach. His first was a 27-8 mark at George Mason in 2005-06, when he led the team to the NCAA Final Four and in 2010-11 he was 27-7 with a 1-1 mark in the NCAA Tournament. At Miami, Coach L led the Canes to a 29-7 mark in 2012-13, winning the ACC regular season and tournament, then taking UM to the NCAA Sweet 16.

CARDIAC CANES - YEAR TWO

Miami played 16 games last season that were decided by five points-or-less. The Canes had five losses by a total of 22 points in the month of February. Three of those games were decided by a total of five points. Miami and Georgia Tech each had 13 games decided by four points or less last season. Miami and Notre Dame led the ACC with nine wins in close games. In 2013-14, Miami led the ACC having played 13 games decided by five points-or-less or in OT.

MIAMI VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

Miami was 3-6 against ranked teams in 2014-15, including 1-1 against top-5 teams and 2-2 against top-10 teams. Of the six losses, one was a double-overtime defeat against Virginia, and the Canes came up 6.1 ppg short in the other five outings. The Canes were 1-3 at home, 2-2 on the road and 0-1 at neutral sites vs. Top 25 opponents. See a complete list vs. ranked opponents since the arrival of Coach L on page 10.

LARRAÑAGA RETURNS HOME, NY COACHES IN NIT

Coach Jim Larrañaga returned to his roots for the NIT, playing in his home state of New York. Larrañaga grew up in the Parkchester neighborhood of The Bronx, playing high school basketball for Jack Curran at Archbishop Molloy High School in Queens.

Since 2000, only four coaches originally from the state of New York have led their team to the championship game of the NIT. In 2015, coach Jim Larrañaga is from The Bronx. In 2014, Larry Brown (Brooklyn) was the runner up with SMU. John Beilein (Burt) won the event in 2007 with West Virginia. In 2000, Matt Doherty (East Meadow) was runner up with Notre Dame.

COACH L IN MADISON SQUARE GARDEN

In Larrañaga's 31 years of coaching, he had never been the head coach of a team playing a game in Madison Square Garden, until March 31 against Temple. He played in the World's Most Famous Arena multiple times while playing college ball for Providence, and was an assistant coach for Virginia when the Cavaliers won the NIT in 1980. Larrañaga's final collegiate game as a Friar was played against UNC in 1971, an 86-79 loss for PC in the NIT Elite 8.

MARCH WAS HURRICANE SEASON

Miami was 7-1 in the month of March last season, and Jim Larrañaga is 19-8 in the month of March while coaching at Miami.

BALANCED ATTACK IN THE POSTSEASON

In five NIT games Miami presented a balanced attack with ...

*Six players averaging more than 7.6 points per game: McClellan (13.2 ppg), Reed (10.8), Jekiri (8.0), Lecomte (8.0), Newton (7.8), Burnett (7.6).

*Nine guys knocking down a 3-pointer: Burnett (7), Cruz Uceda (6), McClellan (6), Reed (4), Lecomte (3), Newton (2), Sherman (1), Jekiri (1), Palmer (1).

*Five players grabbing 3.8 or more rebounds per game: Jekiri (7.5), Reed (7.0), McClellan (5.0), Cruz Uceda (4.8) and Newton (3.8).

SECOND-HALF SCORING FUELS CANES

In five NIT games, Miami scored 40.4 points per game in the second stanza after just 25.6 per game in the first half. For the season, Miami averaged 30.0 points in the first and 37.0 in the second period. Miami scored 35+ in the second period in all five NIT games, led by 45 at Richmond after scoring just 18 in the first half against the Spiders.
