NOV. 25—MIAMI 66, NORTHEASTERN ILLINOIS 48

The Hurricanes opened the season with a solid 66-48 non-conference victory over Northeastern Illinois. Steven Edwards scored 20 points and Steve Rich recorded his third career double-double with 16 points and a game-high 11 rebounds to pace the Hurricanes. Junior Mitchell Dunn, making his UM debut, scored 12 points and led the team in both assists (four) and steals (three).

Defense was the real key though for the 'Canes who broke open a close game with a 16-0 run in the second half. Leading 43-40 with 16:37 remaining, UM scored 16 unanswered points over the next 10:25 to take a commanding 59-40 lead. During the decisive run the Golden Eagles missed 20 consecutive field goal attempts.

Miami's defense limited the Golden Eagles to 21.7 percent (15-69) shooting from the floor, including just 13.3 percent (4-30) from three-point range. The Golden Eagles struggled in the second half, scoring just 16 points, as they connected on 6-40 field goal attempts (.150), including 1-16 (.063) from three-point range.

NOV. 28—MIAMI 76, FLORIDA ATLANTIC 59

The Hurricanes used a 12-0 run in the first half and a 21-0 run in the second half to roll to a 76-59 victory over Florida Atlantic in the Miami Arena. Junior Mitchell Dunn scored a team-high 19 points on 8-16 shooting and grabbed seven rebounds and Steve Frazier came off the bench to contribute 13 points and three assists.

Defensively, Miami held the Owls to 35.7 percent (20-56) shooting from the floor and forced FAU to commit 29 turnovers. The 29 turnovers were the most by a UM opponent since the 'Canes forced Barry to commit 29 turnovers on Nov. 23, 1991 in the season opener for both teams.

NOV. 30—MIAMI 66, ROBERT MORRIS 51

The 'Canes improved their record to 3-0 with a 66-51 victory over Robert Morris in the Miami Arena. Steven Edwards tallied 25 points (one shy of his career-high) and Alex Fraser recorded his second career double-double with 10 points and a team-high 11 rebounds. Constantin Popa came off the bench to contribute 14

points and nine rebounds. Miami, which outrebounded the Colonials, 44-41, held Robert Morris to 28.6 (18-63) percent shooting from the floor.

DEC. 6—SYRACUSE 83, MIAMI 65

John Wallace scored 23 points and grabbed 10 rebounds and Lawrence Moten added 20 points and five assists as the 19th-ranked Orangemen (4-1, 1-0) opened the BIG EAST season with an 83-65 victory over the Hurricanes in the Miami Arena. Syracuse, which shot 56.9 percent (33-58) from the floor, also received 19 points and seven assists from Michael Lloyd in his BIG EAST debut and 10 points off the bench from J.B. Reafsnider.

Miami, which shot just 37.5 percent (27-72) from the field, was led by Constantin Popa who gave a gallant effort in defeat. Popa severely sprained his right ankle just four minutes into the contest but came back and played 22 more minutes on the ankle which was later placed in a soft cast for a week. Despite the injury, Popa recorded his 13th career double-double with 17 points and a game-high 13 rebounds. Steven Edwards scored 14 points (all in the second half) and Mitchell Dunn added 10 for the Hurricanes (3-1, 0-1).

DEC. 10—MIAMI 67, FLORIDA A&M 53

Despite having five players miss the game due to assorted injuries the Hurricanes recorded a 67-53 victory over Florida A&M in the Miami Arena. The victory was UM's ninth straight against teams from the state of Florida and the fifth in five meetings versus the Rattlers. Sophomore Alex Fraser led the way for the 'Canes as he recorded his second double-double in three games, finishing with career and team-highs in points (19), rebounds (16) and blocked shots (three). Steven Edwards was Miami's only other double-figure scorer as he tallied 15 points.

DEC. 20—CLEMSON 75, MIAMI 55

Clemson shot 50.9 percent (29-57) from the floor and outrebounded the injury-plagued Hurricanes, 33-23, in recording a 75-55 non-conference victory in Clemson, S.C. Senior Rayfield Ragland came off the bench to pace the Tigers with 26 points

(11-15 FGs) while freshman Greg Buckner connected on all seven of his field goal attempts and finished with 15 points. Buckner also recorded game-highs in both rebounds (eight) and steals (five). Steven Edwards led Miami with 13 points and freshman Kevin Norris, who made his first collegiate start, contributed 11 points and a team-high four assists.

DEC. 28—UNLV 56, MIAMI 55

Clayton Johnson's three-point field goal with 49 seconds remaining gave the Runnin' Rebels a 56-55 victory over the Hurricanes in the first annual Orange Bowl Basketball Classic. Miami had two attempts to win the game but Mitchell Dunn's pull-up baseline jumper with three seconds remaining caromed off the rim and Constantin Popa's follow-up tip did not drop.

Johnson and Patrick Savoy each finished with 16 points to lead the Runnin' Rebels while Kebu Stewart recorded a double-double with 11 points and 12 rebounds. Constantin Popa recorded his 14th career double-double for the 'Canes with a game-high 17 points and 11 rebounds.

DEC. 30—MIAMI 55, FORDHAM 43

The Hurricanes overcame a second-half deficit and outscored the Rams, 18-3 over the final 8:58, to close out the 1994 calendar year the way it started, with a non-conference victory. Trailing, 40-37, after David Mascia nailed Fordham's only three-point field goal of the game, the Hurricanes went on an 11-0 run over the next 6:37 and took command of the contest en route to recording a 55-43 victory.

Constantin Popa came off the bench to lead UM with 12 points while Steve Frazier and Mitchell Dunn each added 10 points. Ryan Hunter paced the Rams, who were held to 16 second-half points on 7-24 shooting (.292), with 11 points and Mascia added 10.

Defense and a deeper bench were keys to the UM victory. The 'Canes bench outscored the Rams' reserves by a 30-10 margin. Miami also receive 14 rebounds, five blocks and four steals from its bench.

The 43-point output was the lowest by a UM opponent since the 'Canes downed St. John's, 45-42 in January of 1992.

JAN. 2—SETON HALL 72, MIAMI 54

Dwight Brown scored 16 points (6-9 FGs, 4-5 3-PT FGs) to lead a balanced scoring attack for the Pirates, who placed four players in double figures, en route to recording a 72-54 victory over visiting Miami. The loss was the 20th consecutive BIG EAST defeat for the Hurricanes, establishing a league record.

Mitchell Dunn, Steven Edwards and Kevin Norris each scored nine points to top the Hurricanes, who jumped out to an 11-2 lead just 5:24 into the contest and trailed 23-20 at the half. Constantin Popa recorded game-highs in both rebounds (12) and blocked shots (four).

JAN. 7—GEORGETOWN 71, MIAMI 64

Allen Iverson scored 26 points as Georgetown (#12 AP, #13 USAT/CNN) had to rally from eight points down in the final seven minutes to record a 71-64 victory over Miami in the USAir Arena. Iverson's jumper with 2:39 to play snapped a 60-60 tie and put the Hoyas ahead to stay. John Jacques made his first start of the season and added 11 points and Jerome Williams contributed 10 points and a game-high 15 rebounds.

Constantin Popa recorded his third double-double of the season with team-highs in both points (15) and rebounds (13) to lead the Hurricanes. Steven Edwards and Alex Fraser each added 13 points for Miami which held a 36-34 halftime lead. The halftime lead was Miami's first in its last 28 BIG EAST contests.

JAN. 11—MIAMI 82, ST. JOHN'S 79

Kevin Norris, Steven Edwards and Steve Rich combined to score 57 points as the Hurricanes made history by recording their first BIG EAST Conference road victory. Miami jumped out to a 17-2 lead, holding the Red Storm without a field goal for the first 7:38 of the contest (0-9 FGs), before rallying from four points down in the second half (59-55) to score an 82-79 upset win at Alumni Hall.

Norris, who put the 'Canes ahead to stay when he hit three free throws with 8:35 remaining in the contest, scored 16 of his team-high 21 points in the second half, including six of UM's final eight. His jumper with 1:16 left

Steven Edwards scored a season-high 25 points in UM's 66-51 victory over Robert Morris on Nov. 30, 1994.

gave UM a 76-70 lead and his two free throws with 14.7 seconds remaining put the 'Canes ahead by three and closed the scoring. Norris also recorded career-highs in rebounds (eight) and blocked shots (game-high two). His three steals were a game-high and his three assists tied for the UM lead.

Edwards and Rich each added 18 points. Rich, who converted 8-11 field goal attempts, made a key defensive play when he blocked a Felipe Lopez follow-up shot with 29 seconds left. He then grabbed the rebound and was fouled three seconds later. Rich converted one of two from the line to put the 'Canes on top, 80-76.

St. John's, playing without leading rebounder and second leading scorer Charles Minlend due to an NCAA imposed one-game suspension, were led by Lopez who scored a game-high 22 points. Zendon Hamilton added 14 points and a game-high 16 rebounds for the Red Storm and Roshown McLeod also finished with a double-double totaling 13 points and 10 rebounds.

The Hurricanes shot a season-best 48.2 percent (27-56) from the floor and outrebounded the Red Storm, 41-39. Miami's bench also outscored the St. John's bench by a 22-15 margin.

JAN. 15—NORRIS HONORED BY BIG EAST

Kevin Norris was named BIG EAST Conference Rookie of the Week after leading the Hurricanes to their first BIG EAST Conference road victory, an 82-79 win at St. John's on Jan. 11. In that contest, Norris scored a career-high 21 points, grabbed eight rebounds, had three assists, three steals and two blocks. Norris was the first Hurricane named BIG EAST Rookie of the Week since Steven Edwards earned the honors on Feb. 27, 1993.

JAN. 18—MIAMI 81, PROVIDENCE 75

The Hurricanes tied their record for consecutive BIG EAST wins (two) and set a new record for consecutive BIG EAST road wins (two) as they defeated the Friars, 81-75, in the Providence Civic Center handing PC only its third home loss in the last 32 games.

Steven Edwards broke a 48-48 tie with a three-point field goal with 12:35 remaining that put Miami ahead to stay. The junior finished with a team-high 22 points (14 in the second half). All

five Hurricane starters scored in double-figures marking the first time since Feb. 10, 1993 that the 'Canes had five double-figure scorers. Joining Edwards in double figures were Constantin Popa (13), Mitchell Dunn (12), Kevin Norris (11) and Alex Fraser (10).

The 'Canes connected on 78.3 percent (18-23) of their free throw attempts, including 80 percent (12-15) in the second half. It marked only the second time this season UM had connected on at least 70 percent of its free throw attempts. The 'Canes also outrebounded the Friars by a 43-35 margin.

Eric Williams led Providence with 19 points while Michael Brown added 17, Franklin Western contributed 14 and Troy Brown totaled 13.

JAN. 21—MIAMI 69, BOSTON COLLEGE 68

Constantin Popa and Steven Edwards each made key plays down the stretch as the Hurricanes won their school-record third straight BIG EAST game with a 69-68 victory over Boston College in the Miami Arena. The victory snapped UM's 10-game BIG EAST home losing streak.

Popa scored a game-high 20 points and it was his hook shot with 23.4 seconds left that broke a 65-65 tie and put Miami ahead to stay. Edwards added 17 points and it was his steal of Marc Molinsky with 7.4 seconds left and subsequent slam dunk three seconds later that sealed the UM victory. The win, in Miami's 100th game at the Miami Arena, left the Hurricanes with a 3-3 record in league play. It marked only the second in school history that the 'Canes were .500 in league play.

Miami used a 14-0 run in the first half to take a 12-point lead (28-16), its largest of the game and a 10-0 run in the second half to take a nine-point (59-50) lead with six minutes remaining. The 'Canes who shot a season-high 84.6 (11-13) percent from the foul line outrebounded the Eagles, 37-32.

Boston College had three players score in double-figures, led by Kevin Hrobowski who tallied 19 points. Danya Abrams added 18 points and a game-high eight rebounds and Molinsky chipped in 14.

JAN. 25—VILLANOVA 92, MIAMI 62

Villanova, ranked 22nd nationally in the Associated Press poll and 25th in the USA Today/CNN poll, jumped out to a 13-0 lead and never looked back en route to recording a 92-62 win over the Hurricanes in the Miami Arena. The Wildcats extended their winning streak to four games and snapped UM's school-record three-game BIG EAST winning streak.

Junior All American Kerry Kittles connected on 9-13 from the floor and scored 23 points to lead the Wildcats. Eric Eberz added 20 points on 7-10 shooting from the floor (6-8 3-PT FGs).

Miami, which played without the services of Alex Fraser (infected right foot), was led offensively by Mitchell Dunn and Lorenzo Pearson. Dunn scored a team-high 14 points and Pearson, starting in place of Fraser, recorded his first career double-double with 13 points (matching his career-high) and a career-high 10 rebounds.

Villanova shot 60 percent (33-55) from the floor, the highest single-game percentage by a UM BIG EAST opponent, including 12-14 (.500) from three-point range. The Wildcats, who outrebounded the 'Canes, 38-31, also set a record for steals by a UM BIG EAST opponent with 21.

JAN. 28—SYRACUSE 76, MIAMI 51

For the second straight game the Hurricanes found themselves behind big to a nationally ranked opponent early. Syracuse (#6 AP, #6 USAT/CNN) jumped out to a 21-6 lead, eleven minutes into the contest, and cruised to a 76-51 victory before 25,799 spectators in the Carrier Dome, the third largest crowd to ever witness a Hurricane game. John Wallace led the victors with a game-high 20 points and 12 rebounds while Lawrence Moten added 18 points and Otis Hill contributed 14 points off the bench.

The Hurricanes, who shot a season-low 28.3 percent (19-67) from the floor, were led offensively by Steve Frazier who scored 12 points off the bench. Constantin Popa recorded his fourth double-double of the year (and second against the Orangemen) with 11 points and a team-high 12 rebounds and Lorenzo Pearson totaled 10 points and eight rebounds in 17 minutes.

Miami set new BIG EAST school records with 33 defensive rebounds and 53 total rebounds.

JAN. 31—CONNECTICUT 82, MIAMI 57

Ray Allen hit a school-record eight treys and scored 25 points (8-14 FGs, 8-12 3-PT FGs) to lead Connecticut (#4 AP, #5 USAT/CNN) to an 82-57 victory over Miami before a sellout crowd of 16,294 at the Hartford Civic Center. UConn, which connected on 13 of 26 attempts from behind the three-point arc, also received 16 points and eight rebounds from Donny Marshall, 12 points and eight assists from Kevin Ollie and 12 points off the bench from Brian Fair.

Miami, which shot just 30.1 percent (22-73) from the floor and 16.7 percent (4-24) from three-point range, was led by Constantin Popa who scored 14 points and grabbed six rebounds. Steven Edwards added 10 points and a team-high seven rebounds for the 'Canes.

The victory was UConn's 14th consecutive BIG EAST regular-season triumph, tying the league record set by St. John's during the 1984-85 campaign. It was also the 26th straight home win for the Huskies.

FEB. 4—MIAMI 67, GEORGETOWN 61

Constantin Popa scored 19 points and Mitchell Dunn added 13 as the Hurricanes posted a 67-61 victory over 13th-ranked Georgetown before 5,084 spectators at the Miami Arena. The win was Miami's first over a nationally ranked opponent since downing 25th-ranked St. John's, 82-77, on Feb. 20, 1993.

The 'Canes dominated the first half, using a 14-0 run early in the game to snap a 5-5 tie and grab control of the contest. The crowd, which was the 10th largest home crowd for the 'Canes since the program's rebirth in 1985, watched Miami jump out to a 19-point lead (30-11) in the opening 20 minutes and take a UM BIG EAST record 16-point lead (34-18) into the locker room at the half.

Georgetown pulled to within five points, 49-44, in the second half when Allen Iverson hit a pair of free throws with 6:21 remaining, but got no closer. Miami responded with a 13-5 run over the next 3:18 which was capped by a beautiful Steve Frazier back door layup. Frazier finished with 10 points for the 'Canes.

Iverson scored 15 points to lead the Hoyas, but shot just 6-21 from the floor, including 0-4 from three-point range. Don Reid added 13 points for the Hoyas, who suffered their first loss of the season to a team not ranked in the Top 25. Miami held Georgetown starting center Othella Harrington scoreless in 18 minutes of action.

FEB. 7—VILLANOVA 73, MIAMI 63

Kerry Kittles recorded game-highs in both points (25) and rebounds (eight) and Jason Lawson added 21 points as Villanova (#16 AP, #18 USAT/CNN) defeated Miami, 73-63, before a sellout crowd of 6,500 in the John E. duPont Pavilion. The victory was the eighth straight for the Wildcats and the 100th career win for Wildcat Head Coach Steve Lappas.

Constantin Popa, who was held to just one field goal attempt and five points in 22 minutes for the 'Canes, became the 19th player in school history to reach the 1,000-point plateau when he converted a free throw with 5:40 remaining in the opening half.

Steven Edwards and Steve Rich (team-high seven rebounds) led Miami offensively with 12 points each. Edwards hit two treys to tie Kevin Presto for first place on UM's all-time list with 170. He also extended his consecutive game streak with at least one three-point field goal made to 22.

FEB. 11—MIAMI 69, PROVIDENCE 63

In a day which featured many Miami milestones, the Hurricanes defeated Providence, 69-63, in the Miami Arena to complete their first BIG EAST Conference regular-season sweep. The victory was the 100th career win for UM Head Coach Leonard Hamilton.

Alex Fraser led the Hurricanes with 14 points and six rebounds. Miami also received 13 points from Steven Edwards, who became the school's all-time leader in three-point field goals made when he nailed his 171st career trey 39 seconds into the second half, and 11 points from Anthony Rosa. Rosa kept UM in the game in the opening half as he scored 11 of UM's 28 first half points.

Trailing 54-53 with 4:30 remaining, Edwards hit a pair of free throws to put UM ahead to stay and then 40 seconds later he rattled home his third trey of the

game to put the 'Canes up by four. Providence pulled to within three, 66-63, when Austin Croshere hit a trey with 36.5 seconds remaining. After Kevin Norris traveled two seconds later, Croshere had a chance to tie the game but his three-point field goal attempt with 24 seconds left was short. Mitchell Dunn hit a pair of free throws and Steve Frazier, who recorded a team-high five assists, added one to close the scoring.

Miami, which trailed 30-28 at the half, snapped a string of 26 consecutive BIG EAST losses in games in which it trailed at the break.

FEB. 13—MIAMI 71, ST. JOHN'S 69

After going three and a half years without recording a BIG EAST series sweep, the Hurricanes registered their second series sweep in three days as they downed the Red Storm, 71-69, before 3,739 spectators in the Miami Arena. The victory improved UM to 6-0 this season in BIG EAST games decided by six points or less. Constantin Popa recorded his 17th career double-double with team-highs in points (22) and rebounds (10) and also set a UM single-game BIG EAST record with seven blocked shots. Kevin Norris added 16 points (6-7 FGs) and a game-high five assists and Steve Rich contributed 10 points (6-6 FTs) in 12 minutes.

Felipe Lopez, who scored a game-high 27 points, missed a three-point field goal with six seconds remaining that would have put the Red Storm up by one. After Popa missed the front end of a one-and-one with 1.6 seconds left, Maurice Brown's desperation heave from three-quarter court was off target and the Hurricanes won their sixth BIG EAST game against seven losses. Charles Minlend recorded a double-double for the Red Storm with 12 points and 11 rebounds and Zendon Hamilton added 11 points.

Miami's six-win improvement in BIG EAST play tied their school record set in the 1992-93 campaign.

FEB. 18—PITTSBURGH 67, MIAMI 61

Andre Alridge and Garrick Thomas combined to score 43 points as Pittsburgh recorded a 67-61 victory over Miami before a sellout crowd of 6,798 at Fitzgerald Field House. The

Panthers converted 14 of 26 attempts from behind the three-point arc (9-11 in the second half) to tie the school single-game record and set a record for most treys by a UM opponent. In addition to his game-high 23-point effort (6-9 FGs, 4-7 3-PT FGs), Alridge tallied a game-high 10 assists with only one turnover in 38 minutes. Thomas, who scored 20 points on 7-12 shooting (6-10 treys), added five assists and had only one turnover in a 32-minute stint off the bench.

Steven Edwards scored 15 points to lead the Hurricanes, who also received 13 points and six assists from Kevin Norris and 10 points from Constantin Popa.

Steve Rich came off the bench to score nine points and grab a team-high nine rebounds. Rich also tallied team and career-highs in both blocks with four and steals with three.

The loss snapped Miami's modest two-game winning streak and denied the Hurricanes a chance to reach the .500 level in conference play. Miami is now 11-10 overall and 6-8 in the BIG EAST.

FEB. 22—MIAMI 61, SETON HALL 57

The Hurricanes sent the third largest home crowd in school history (7,566) home happy with a 61-57 victory over Seton Hall. Constantin Popa recorded his 18th career double-double (sixth this year) with team-highs in both points (14) and rebounds (11). Steven Edwards added 11 points and six rebounds and Mitchell Dunn contributed 10 points and a season-high five assists. Kevin Norris totaled nine points and a game and career-high eight assists while turning the ball over only once in 31 minutes. UM, which was outrebounded 47-41, recorded a season-high 18 assists.

Adrian Griffin led the Pirates with 14 points while Donnell Williams recorded a double-double with 11 points and a game-high 12 rebounds. Danny Hurley chipped in 11 points and a team-high six assists for The Hall, but threw an errant pass for a turnover with 11 seconds remaining in the game and the Pirates down two.

Anthony Rosa, who finished with five points in nine minutes off the bench, sealed the game when he hit both ends of a one-and-one with nine seconds remaining to close the scoring.

The victory, in a game televised nationally by ESPN, improved the Hurricanes record to 12-10 overall and 7-8 in the BIG EAST. The seven league victories tied UM's single-season record and the seven-victory improvement over last season matched the best turnaround in BIG EAST history.

FEB. 25—MIAMI 77, BOSTON COLLEGE 71 (OT)

The Hurricanes kept their post-season aspirations alive with a thrilling 77-71 victory over Boston College before a sellout crowd of 8,606 in the Silvio O. Conte Forum. The victory was Miami's first in the Conte Forum and gave the 'Canes their first season sweep of the Eagles.

Miami trailed the Eagles, 57-51, with 2:45 remaining and 58-53 with 54.6 seconds left before rallying to force overtime. Steve Rich's 10-foot jumper with 14.6 seconds remaining tied the game at 60 and sent UM into overtime for the first time since March 4, 1992, a span of 79 games.

The 'Canes opened the extra session with a 9-2 run and converted 11-14 free throw attempts en route to the league victory. The win left Miami at 8-8 in league play and 13-10 overall.

Steven Edwards led the 'Canes with 18 points, Rich added 13 (all in the second half or overtime), Mitchell Dunn contributed 12 (nine in the final 2:25 of regulation or overtime) and Constantin Popa scored 10.

Danya Abrams led the Eagles with 23 points while Marc Molinsky (16), Paul Grant (14) and Kevin Hrobowski (11) each scored in double figures.

FEB. 28—MIAMI 76, PITTSBURGH 68 (OT)

For the second consecutive game the 'Canes rallied from a five-point deficit in the final minute of regulation to win a conference battle in overtime. Miami downed Pittsburgh, 76-68, before a crowd of 3,311 in the Miami Arena as Steve Rich turned in a season-high 19-point, six-rebound performance.

Constantin Popa's layup with 12 seconds left in regulation sent the game to overtime and his dunk with 3:16 left in the extra session put UM ahead to stay. Miami held the Panthers to just two field goals in the final 10 minutes of regulation and pressured the Panthers into 1-10

shooting from the floor in overtime. Kevin Norris, who finished with 11 points and a team-high six assists, added five points in the overtime all from the line in the final 32 seconds. Steven Edwards added 16 points (9-10 FTs) and Mitchell Dunn contributed 10.

Pitt, which had four players score in double figures, received 15 points and 10 rebounds from Chris Gant and 14 points and 10 rebounds from Orlando Antigua.

The victory assured Miami of at least a .500 season for the first time since the 1988-89 campaign and its first ever .500 BIG EAST season. The win was also Miami's fifth straight BIG EAST home triumph, establishing a school record and its third consecutive BIG EAST win, tying the school record.

MARCH 2—MIAMI 80, FLORIDA ATLANTIC 70

The Hurricanes jumped out to a 21-point lead early in the second half and cruised to an 80-70 non-conference victory at Florida Atlantic. The victory gave the 'Canes a four-game win streak for the first time in four years and assured them of their first winning season since the 1988-89 squad went 19-12.

Steven Edwards scored 21 points (5-10 treys) and amassed four assists (tied for the team-high) and Constantin Popa recorded his seventh double-double of the season with 15 points and a game-high 11 rebounds.

Four Owls scored in double figures led by the 20-point

performance of Craig Buchanan. Marlon Jemerson contributed 15 points and Cedric Peoples and Rob Ritter each chipped in 10.

The 'Canes controlled the boards, outrebounding the Owls by a 46-28 margin. In addition to Popa's 11 rebounds, Kevin Norris grabbed a career-high nine caroms. The victory left the 'Canes with a 15-10 overall record and allowed them to finish the season with a 6-2 non-conference record. It also gave UM a sweep of the season series with FAU. The Hurricanes extended their streak to 10 straight wins against teams from the state of Florida.

MARCH 4—CONNECTICUT 75, MIAMI 67

The Hurricanes closed out the regular season with a heartbreaking 75-67 defeat against Connecticut (#4 AP/#5 USAT/CNN) before a school record 11,263 fans at the Miami Arena. The victory allowed Connecticut (23-3 overall, 16-2 BIG EAST) to become the first team in BIG EAST history to record back-to-back regular season outright championships and the loss left Miami with a 15-11 overall record and a 9-9 BIG EAST mark, best in the 'Canes brief tenure in the BIG EAST.

Steve Rich led Miami with 14 points and Steven Edwards tallied 13 points, including the 1,000th of his career on a trey with 8:43 left in the second half. Edwards, scored 10 straight points in a 74 second span midway through the second half, including UM's only four-point play of the season. Constantin Popa, playing in his final home game for the Hurri-

canes, tallied 12 points and Kevin Norris contributed 10 points and a game-high six assists.

All five UConn starters scored in double figures led by 16 points from Kevin Ollie, who put the Huskies ahead to stay with a trey with 6:36 remaining. Ollie scored 14 of his 16 points in the second half. Travis Knight added 15 points for the victors, Doron Sheffer added 14, Donny Marshall totaled 12 and Ray Allen was held to 11 points on 5-17 shooting.

UConn won despite the ejection of head coach Jim Calhoun, who received his first technical foul at the 12:05 mark of the opening half and his second two seconds later.

MARCH 9—HAMILTON HONORED BY BIG EAST

Miami Head Coach Leonard Hamilton was honored as the BIG EAST Conference Coach of the Year after leading Miami to its greatest single-season in conference history.

MARCH 10—GEORGETOWN 69, MIAMI 58

Freshman sensation Allen Iverson scored a career and team-high 31 points to pace the Hoyas (#24 AP) to a 69-58 BIG EAST Tournament quarterfinal round victory over Miami before a sellout crowd (19,544) at Madison Square Garden. Iverson also set the Hoya BIG EAST Tournament single-game scoring record and his 23 free throw attempts established a conference single-game tournament record. Othella Harrington added 17 points for Georgetown and Jerome Williams recorded a double-double with 11 points and a team-high 10 rebounds.

Constantin Popa led Miami with 20 points (all in the second half) and a game-high 14 rebounds while Kevin Norris contributed 12 points, a team-high four assists and a game and UM BIG EAST Tournament record five steals.

For the first time in their four-year tenure in the BIG EAST, the Hurricanes did not have to play a BIG EAST Tournament opening round game. The fifth-seeded Hurricanes opposed the fourth-seeded Hoyas.

The game started out sluggish with the two teams combining to connect on just one of the first 21 field goal attempts. After six minutes of play the score was knotted at two apiece. Unfortu-

nately for the Hurricanes it was a sign of bad things to come. Miami trailed at the break by a 31-15 margin. The 15 first-half points set a new BIG EAST Tournament low for a half.

MARCH 15—PENN STATE 62, MIAMI 56

For the first time since 1964 (31 years) the University of Miami earned an invitation to a post-season tournament as it traveled to Penn State for a National Invitation Tournament opening round game.

Penn State jumped out to a 10-2 lead just four minutes into the contest and forced the Hurricanes to call an early timeout. The Nittany Lions still led by eight (14-6) when the Hurricanes erupted for 17 unanswered points over the next 4:26 to take a 23-14 lead. The cushion got as high as 15 points (33-18) before the 'Canes settled for a 13-point (33-20) halftime advantage.

Miami increased its lead to a game-high 20 points (48-28) when Steven Edwards nailed a pair of free throws with 14:07 remaining in the contest. The Nittany Lions then outscored the 'Canes, 34-8, the remainder of the contest. Penn State took the lead for good when John Amaechi converted two free throws after fouling out Mitchell Dunn with 2:07 left in the contest. Miami was held without a field goal for a span of 8:30 until Edwards scored on a driving layup with 19 seconds remaining.

Edwards paced the 'Canes with 15 points and nine rebounds while Constantin Popa, who fouled out of his final collegiate contest with 4:03 remaining (UM led 51-45), added 13 points. Steve Rich led the 'Canes with a season-high 12 rebounds off the bench.

Amaechi led the Nittany Lions, who eventually finished third in the NIT, with 21 points and eight rebounds while former Syracuse Orangeman Glenn Sekunda was the only other Nittany Lion to score in double figures (10). The loss ended UM's season with a 15-13 overall record.
