#### MIDWEEK STORY LINES

- After completing its sixth straight series victory by taking two of three games against Alabama State, Miami wraps up
  its nonconference schedule Wednesday with a midweek matchup against FGCU. First pitch is set for 7 p.m.
- The Hurricanes have won 21 of their past 23 games, and will be playing for a season sweep of the Eagles Wednesday.
   Miami won the first matchup at Hammond Stadium 5-2 in extra innings, and won 4-0 last time out at Mark Light Field.
- Miami is ranked in the top 20 of every major college baseball poll. The Hurricanes check in at No. 5 in Collegiate
   Baseball Newspaper's rankings, No. 8 in Baseball America, No. 15 in the USA Today Coaches Poll and No. 15 by NCBWA.
- Having captured five straight ACC series victories, Miami is in sole possession of first place in the conference standings. Miami has 19 conference wins - five more than the team accumulated in all of 2013 (14) - and 34 wins overall.
- Miami is rated No. 18 in the latest WarrenNolan.com RPI (May 5), with 16 wins against top 100 RPI teams.
- Head coach Jim Morris won his 900th game as Hurricanes skipper in the team's series-opening victory over No. 3 Virginia (March 22). He also won his 1,400th game as Division I coach during Miami's sweep of Boston College (March 8).
- The Hurricanes have not lost a game started by junior lefthander Chris Diaz dating back to May 24, 2013 a stretch of 13 consecutive starts, including his first 12 of the 2014 season. Diaz is 8-0 and ranks 7th in the ACC with a 2.15 ERA.







### JIM MORRIS HEAD COACH

### THE HURRICANES SKIPPER

1999 & 2001 National Coach of the Year (*Collegiate Baseball*)

In his 21st season at Miami, few programs have qualified for the College World Series as much as Jim Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 41 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 20 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 921-359-3 (.717) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,425-626-4 (.693) Division I record in 32 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 36 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,556-666-4 (.698) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 20 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

### MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 29th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2013 when he guided the Canes to a No. 2 seed in the Louisville [Ky.] Regional. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 20 seasons (1994-2013), winning 15 of those appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2013 Hurricanes to their 41st-straight NCAA Tournament. Despite six signees being drafted in the 2013 MLB Draft, the Hurricanes reeled in a top 5 recruiting class by national publications.

#### MORRIS IN 36th SEASON AS HEAD COACH

Morris entered 2014 as the fifth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball with 1,391 wins. His impressive win total ranks him No. 12 all-time for any coach, regardless of division. Including his time at DeKalb C.C., Morris won his 1,500th game as a head coach in Miami's 4-1 upset of No. 1 North Carolina on March 15, 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22.

Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern in March 2001



### **MAJOR LEAGUE GUIDANCE**

Over 150 professional baseball players have played under Morris during their college careers at Miami, Georgia Tech and DeKalb.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that went on to play in the Major Leagues were Yonder Alonso (San Diego), Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Pat Burrell (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Yasmani Grandal (San Diego), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Ryan Jackson (St. Louis), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Eddy Rodriguez (San Diego), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Blake Tekotte (Chicago White Sox), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), Danny Valencia (Minnesota Twins), Jon Jay (St. Louis), Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston).

Standout players under Morris from his days at Georgia Tech were Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jay Payton (Oakland A's) and Jason Varitek (Boston Red Sox).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the International scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta. At the Goodwill Games, his USA squad won two of three games against Cuba, marking the first time in history a senior-level team won a series with Cuba. In 1987, Morris served as pitching coach under Ron Fraser at the Pan American Games (Silver Medal).

- The Hurricanes hold a commanding all-time series advantage of 10-1-0 over the Eagles. Miami has played **24 non-conference games** in 2014, and has gone 15-9 in those games.

#### STREAKING SUCCESS...

- Miami is the hottest college baseball team in the nation, having won 21 of its last 23 games and is now in sole possession of first place in the ACC.
- With Monday's No. 8 ranking from Baseball America, Miami has earned its highest ranking from the publication since March 2009.
- The Hurricanes' current 12-game road winning streak is the second-longest in program history, short of a 16-game run during the team's 2001 national championship-winning season.
- With its impressive run, which included the nation's longest winning streak at 14 games, Miami moved into the top five of a national poll for the first time since March 2009 when it was ranked **No. 4** by *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper* on April 28.
- Miami set a new program record with 10 consecutive ACC wins during the 14-game winning streak, besting the previous long (nine consecutive) by one win.

#### **MILESTONES FOR MORRIS...**

- Head coach Jim Morris became just the eighth coach in the history of Division I baseball to accumulate 1,400 wins when Miami beat Boston College 5-2 on March 8.
- Two weeks later, Morris won his 900th game with the Hurricanes in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22. Morris ranks second in wins in Miami history behind the late Ron Fraser (1,267).
- Morris ranks fourth among active Division I coaches in career victories (1,423) and eighth all-time in the category. He is also the second-winningest coach in ACC history.

### THE 300 CLUB...

- Redshirt junior Bryan Radziewski became just the 13th pitcher in Miami history to record 300 career strikeouts during his start against then-No. 20 Clemson (April 27).
- Radziewski (308) moved into sole possesion of 10th place in program history with seven more strikeouts against Alabama State (May 4). He is the first pitcher to reach 300 since Chris Hernandez did so in 2010.
- Facing the conference's top statistical offense at Clemson, Radziewski struck out nine batters - just one shy of his season high including a swinging strikeout of Clemson's Chris Okey in the fifth inning to officially reach the milestone.

### MIDWEEK NEWS & NOTES

#### **BUILDING A RESUME...**

- Miami has won 21 of its past 23 games, including four sweeps in its last five conference weekends, to vault to No. 18 in the latest Warren Nolan Top 25 RPI (May 5).
- Miami has 16 wins against teams in the Warren Nolan Top 100 RPI, including four against teams in the top five RPI: one against No. 1 RPI Virginia, one against No. 3 Florida State, and a series victory (two wins) against No. 2 Florida.
- The Hurricanes' remaining schedule includes a midweek matchup against No. 84 RPI FGCU, a road series with No. 73 Duke and a home weekend against No. 55 North Carolina. Miami's strength of schedule is rated No. 32 by Warren Nolan.

#### DIAZ DOMINATING...

- The Hurricanes have won every one of Chris Diaz' starts in 2014, including victories over No. 6 Florida (2/14), No. 4 FSU (2/28), No. 1 Virginia (3/22), then-No. 25 NC State (3/28) and then-No. 20 Clemson (4/25). Miami has not lost a game started by Diaz since the 2013 ACC Tournament in a 7-1 loss to NC State (May 24).
- Diaz picked up his fourth win over a ranked opponent this season in a 5-2 victory over No. 20 Clemson (April 25). Diaz has earned a win in eight of his 12 starts and is tied for first in the ACC with eight wins. He ranks seventh in the ACC with a 2.15 ERA.
- Diaz, who ranked second in the ACC in ERA in 2013 (1.64), did not pick up his seventh win of the 2013 season until an NCAA matchup against Oklahoma State (May 31) and finished 2013 7-5.

### SIMPLY THE BEST...

- During an impressive 5-0 week in which he hit .526 with nine RBI, freshman slugger Zack Collins was recognized with ACC Player of the Week honors on April 28.
- The award culminated an impressive April for Collins, who batted .424 for the month and moved into the team-lead in batting average (.306). He leads the team in a number of offensive categories. including home runs (seven), RBI (39), on-base percentage (.414) and slugging percentage (.563).
- Collins also stacks up well against his peers in the ACC. The freshman ranks 19th in the ACC in batting average, fourth in home runs, sixth in triples, third in RBI, fifth in total bases and second in slugging percentage.

#### **CALLED UP CANES...**

- Miami's current nine Major League players are the second-most of any school in the ACC (North Carolina) and the fourth-most of any program nationwide. The Hurricanes trail, Arizona State (11), Long Beach State (10) and UNC (10) in Major League players.
- Seven former Miami Hurricanes found themselves on 2014 MLB Opening Day rosters: Yonder Alonso (San Diego), Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Yasmani Grandal (San Diego), Jon Jay (St. Louis), Chris Perez (Los Angeles Dodgers), Gaby Sanchez (Pittsburgh) and Danny Valencia (Kansas City).
- Jemile Weeks (Baltimore) and Chris Herrmann (Minnesota) opened the season on their respective team's 40-man rosters, and were called up from AAA within the first two weeks of the season.

### **MIDWEEK NEWS & NOTES**

#### **#CARDIACCANES...**

- Miami is 11-2 in one-run games in 2014, including wins in a road sweep of Virginia Tech (April 4+5), an extra-innings win over Pittsburgh (April 12) and its recent 3-2 win over Clemson in extra innings (April 26).
- Through their first 48 games (34-14), the Hurricanes have **scored** 127 of their 272 runs (46.7%) in the sixth inning or later. Miami is 10-8 when its opponent scores first and have played five extra inning games (3-2).
- Senior captain Tyler Palmer has come through for the Hurricanes, delivering two game-winning hit and one game-tying hit during Miami's most recent perfect 5-0 week (April 21-27). He has four game-winning hits this spring.

### **POWER SURGE...**

- Miami ranks eighth in the ACC with 19 home runs after hitting
  just 14 in all of 2013. Freshman Zack Collins leads the team and is
  tied for fourth in the ACC with seven homers, while Dale Carey ranks
  second on the team with five.
- The Hurricanes (84) are one of just five teams in the ACC that will enter the week with 80 or more doubles, joining Clemson (94), Florida State (94), Georgia Tech (83) and Maryland (81).
- The offense already has **four multi-homerun games** this season (after recording **just two in all of 2013**): games one and two against **Florida** (Feb. 21 & 22), game one against **Georgia Tech** (March 14) and game three against **NC State** (March 30). **Miami is 4-0** when hitting **more than one home run**.
- Zack Collins recorded the first multi-home run game for the Hurricanes since Peter O'Brien accomplished the feat in 2012 in Miami's 12-5 win over NC State (March 30). He drove in six runs in the win.

#### **CONFERENCE CONFIDENCE ...**

- Despite playing in one of the **toughest college baseball conferences** in the nation, the Hurricanes have managed to **perform better** against **teams from the ACC** than their nonconference counterparts.
- Miami's team ERA in conference play is second-best at 2.77 (3.20 overall), defensive fielding percentage is second-best at .980 (.972 overall), and offensively Miami has managed to match its production (.261/.261).
- Individually, Zack Collins has the fourth-best average among all ACC hitters in conference play (.338), while fellow freshman Bryan Garcia has the second-most saves of any reliever in ACC play (9).

### CANES LEGENDS RECOGNIZED...

- Alex Fernandez and Mike Fiore will be among the seven-member Class of 2014 to be inducted into the College Baseball Hall of Fame, the College Baseball Foundation announced.
- They will join **Ron Fraser** (2006), **Skip Bertman** (2006) and **Neal Heaton** (2009) as College Baseball Hall of Fame inductees from Miami.
- Fernandez was named Freshman of the Year and a first-team All-American in 1989, where he won 15 games with a 2.01 ERA and 177 strikeouts in 147 innings. A four-year UM starter, Fiore set 12 UM career batting marks, including hits (341) and runs (258).
