SUPER REGIONAL STORYLINES & NOTABLES

- No. 5 national seed Miami will host VCU in the Coral Gables Super Regional beginning Friday, June 5 at noon on ESPNU.
- Miami emerged victorious in the Coral Gables Regional, finishing 3-1 and topping No. 3 seed Columbia 21-3 in the Championship Game (7); No. 4 seed VCU won the Dallas Regional hosted by Dallas Baptist at Horner Ballpark.
- With a 21-3 win in the Coral Gables Regional Championship game, Miami captured its 28th regional title in history.
- The Hurricanes and Rams have met only once in history an NCAA Regional game on June 3, 2005 that Miami won 6-2.
- The Super Regional is Miami's first since 2010 and first at home since 2008; UM has now hosted Super Regionals six times.
- UM clinched the ACC's Coastal Division title for the second straight year, while VCU won the Atlantic 10 Championship.
- . UM led all schools with eight players named All-ACC; UM placed three on the first team, one on the second, and four on third.
- The Canes lead the nation in scoring (8.5 runs per game) and on-base percentage (.426); team batting average (.314) is fifth.
- Junior All-ACC third baseman David Thompson is tied for the nation's home run lead (19) and leads the nation in RBI (85).
- Junior All-ACC second baseman George Iskenderian won the conference regular season batting title with a .391 average.
- Jim Morris is the eighth coach in Division I baseball history to win 1,400 games; his 1,482 wins are seventh-most all-time.
- Miami has a 34-5 record at Mark Light Field this season and has lost just one weekend home series since April 2014.
- Miami Baseball has the longest active postseason streak of any Division I program, with 43 straight postseason appearances.

Entering his 22nd season at Miami, few programs have qualified for the College World Series as much as Jim Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 42 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 21 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 978-379-3 (.719) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,482-646-4 (.694) Division I record in 33 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 36 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,613-686-4 (.698) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 20 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 31st consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2015 when he guided the Canes to one of 16 host spots in the tournament and the No. 5 overall national seed. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 22 seasons (1994-2015), winning 16 of those appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (1994-2006) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to 10 Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2015 Hurricanes to their 43rd straight NCAA Baseball Championship. Despite six signees being drafted in the 2013 MLB Draft, the Hurricanes reeled in a top-five recruiting class by national publications, with Zack Collins named *Baseball America* National Freshman of the Year under his direction in 2014.

MORRIS IN 36th SEASON AS HEAD COACH

Morris entered 2015 as the fourth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball with 1,435 wins. He wasted little time in moving up the record books, moving into sole possession of eighth place in all-time wins (1,439) on Feb. 15 with a 25-4 win over Rutgers and then seventh place with a 9-5 win over Louisville on March 7 (1,445).

Morris won his 1,500th game as a head coach in Miami's 4-1 upset of No. 1 North Carolina on March 15, 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22.

Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 victory on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17.



MAJOR LEAGUE GUIDANCE

Over 150 professional baseball players have played under Morris during their college careers at Miami, Georgia Tech and DeKalb.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that went on to play in the Major Leagues were Yonder Alonso (San Diego), Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Pat Burrell (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Yasmani Grandal (San Diego), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Ryan Jackson (St. Louis), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Eddy Rodriguez (San Diego), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Blake Tekotte (Chicago White Sox), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), Danny Valencia (Minnesota Twins), Jon Jay (St. Louis), Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston).

Standout players under Morris from his days at Georgia Tech were Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jay Payton (Oakland A's) and Jason Varitek (Boston Red Sox).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the International scene.
From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta. In 1987, Morris served as pitching coach under Ron Fraser at the Pan American Games (Silver Medal).

FEELING SUPER!

- Miami will take on VCU in the Coral Gables Super Regional beginning Friday, June 5 at noon. VCU was the No. 4 seed in the Dallas Regional hosted by No. 1 seed Dallas Baptist and included No. 2 seed Oregon State and No. 3 seed Texas.
- With a 21-3 win over Columbia in the Coral Gables Regional Championship Game on Monday, #5 national seed Miami captured the 28th regional title in program history and advanced to the super regional round for the first time since 2010.
- Miami has an all-time record of 14-10 (.727) in the super regional round, and has hosted on five previous occasions: 1999, 2001, 2003, 2004 and 2008. The Hurricanes advanced to the College World Series in each of the five previous years as super regional host.
- Since the NCAA began awarding national seeds prior to the 1999 season, Miami has been among the top-8 five other years: 1999 (No. 1), 2001 (No. 2), 2003 (No. 8), 2004 (No. 3), and 2008 (No. 1).
- Of the 41 teams that have been awarded national seeds since 1999, Miami is one of just 12 programs to have earned the distinction five or more seasons.

REGIONAL CHAMPIONS AGAIN

- Miami made a successful championship run through the Coral Gables Regional, topping No. 4 seed FIU 6-2 in its opener and beating Columbia twice, including 21-3 in the championship game.
 - The title was the 28th in UM program history and first since 2010.
- The Hurricanes played the Lions three times during the regional, winning 8-3 (May 30) and 21-3 (June 1) but losing its second game 3-0 (May 31), marking the first time UM's offense was shut out all season.
 - Miami did not play No. 2 seed **East Carolina**, who finished 0-2.
- The Hurricanes had five players selected to the Coral Gables Regional **All-Tournament Team**: David Thompson (third base), Brandon Lopez (shortstop), Ricky Eusebio (outfield), Willie Abreu (outfield) and Andy Suarez (pitcher); Thompson also earned Regional MVP honors.

GOING STREAKING

- Miami closed the regular season & ACC Championship by winning **14 of its final 15 games**, including 13 straight during one stretch, en route to the No. 5 national seed for the NCAA postseason.
- The Hurricanes batted .362 over the 14-1 run (beginning April 26) and had a team ERA of 2.10; Miami's offense scored 189 runs (compared to 36 by its opponents), while the team hit .362 (opponents hit .184). Opposing team ERA was a whopping 11.87
- Among Miami's top offensive performers during the critical stretch: Zack Collins (.455, 10 HR, 40 RBI), George Iskenderian (.442, 18 runs, .547 OBP) and **David Thompson** (.368, 9 HR, 29 RBI).
- The Hurricanes are 17-3 over their last 20 games including four games in the Coral Gables Regional (3-1).

POWER SURGE

- UM's 8.5 runs-per-game average marks the most prolific offense in the country; UM has scored 525 runs in its 62 games.
- After connecting for six homers in its series with Georgia Tech, and three more in the ACC Championship, Miami now has 61 home runs in 2015 - the most of any ACC team & 12th-most nationwide.
- The Hurricane bats combined to hit just .261 in the 2014 regular season, but are hitting over 50 points higher (.314) for the highest team batting average in the ACC and fifth-highest nationwide.
- Only four players had more than one home run in 2014, and the team had just 25 total. Eight different players have multiple home runs this spring, with UM home runs up 144% (from 25 to 61).
- Miami's offense is averaging 8.5 runs per game (compared to **5.5** in 2014), and its slugging is up over 100 points to .471 (from .362 in 2014).

A SEASON TO REMEMBER

- With the 2015 NCAA Regional round wrapped up, junior David **Thompson** extended his lead in the nationwide RBI race with 85. The gaudy total already marks the fourth-best single-season output by a Cane in **UM history** and the most since **Aubrey Huff had 95 in 1998**.
- An All-ACC First-Team selection at third base, Thompson rebounded from an injury-riddled 2014 to rank in the top 10 of nearly every ACC offensive category in 2015 during the regular season, including: average (.336, 9th), runs scored (52, T-6th), total bases (147, 1st), slugging percentage (.697, 2nd), hits (71, T-7th), RBI (78, 1st) and home runs (19, 1st).
- Thompson was among 21 semifinalists for the USA Baseball Golden Spikes Award & 35 semifinalists for the Dick Howser Trophy.

SAVING THE BEST FOR LAST

- Senior Garrett Kennedy has been one of Miami's top contributors as a senior, hitting .340 through 62 games - the seventh-highest average in the ACC.
- Kennedy's on-base percentage (.448) was also the seventh-best. in the ACC; his .372 average in ACC play was the fifth-best mark.
- The Davie, Fla., native has started 32 games at catcher and 22 games at designated hitter, splitting those duties with Zack Collins.
- The performance marks a sharp turnaround for Kennedy, who hit just .231 as a junior with two home runs and 16 RBI.

ROUNDING INTO FORM

- An All-ACC First-Team selection at DH/Utility, Zack Collins was a catalyst for UM's 14-1 stretch over the last 15 games heading into the NCAA postseason, hitting .455 (25-for-55) with eye-popping totals of 10 home runs and 40 RBI. His slugging percentage was 1.164 & OPS (on-base plus slugging) is 1.737.
- Beginning with the second leg of a doubleheader against Pitt on May 2 · a stretch of 17 games · Collins has 10 multi-hit performances, 26 total runs, six doubles, nine home runs & 43 RBI.
- Prior to that game against the Panthers, Collins was hitting .265 with six home runs and 27 RBI in 45 games. He now ranks No. 5 nationwide in RBI with 70, and is batting .311 on the year.
- Collins ended the regular season ranked second in the ACC in RBI, only to teammate David Thompson. In less than two full college seasons, Collins has compiled 26 home runs and 124 RBI.
- Collins was named 2014 ACC Rookie of the Year and Baseball America National Freshman of the Year, when he hit .298 with 54 RBI.

"HITS"-KENDERIAN

- Junior George Iskenderian has been one of Miami's most reliable offensive contributors in his first season with the Hurricanes: Iskenderian took home the ACC batting title with a .391 average.
- Iskenderian led the ACC in both total hits (81) and runs scored (61), and ranked third in steals (22) and on-base percentage (.482). His .387 average in conference play was the best in the ACC.
- Iskenderian set a new career high with five hits in a 14-6 win over FAU on May 12. It was the first five-hit game for a Cane since Nathan Melendres on April 23, 2011 vs. North Carolina.

STRIKE EARLY, STRIKE OFTEN

- 205 of Miami's 525 runs scored this season (39.0%) have come in the first three innings of the game - Miami is 36-5 when scoring first in 2015. The Hurricanes have a 11-10 record in games when their opponent scores first.
- When scoring in the **first inning**, Miami has a **25-3 record**. When its opponent scores in the first inning, Miami is 7-6.
- The Hurricanes have jumped over pitching at home this season, outscoring opponents 146-40 in the first three innings of games played at Mark Light Field: UM led the nation with 31 wins at home in 2015.

THE LIGHT - THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE IT!

- Miami finished 2015 regular season & NCAA postseason with a 34-5 mark at home (87.1 win %), including a 13-2 record in ACC play.
- UM's streak of nine straight home series wins was snapped against Florida State (April 24-26), but the Hurricanes have still managed to win 11 of their last 12 home series dating to March 2014.
 - Miami batted .335 at home with a .454 on-base percentage.
- Senior Garrett Kennedy batted .389 in 38 games at home, with four homers, nine doubles and 38 RBI. Junior George Iskenderian batted .407 at home with 38 RBI and 48 runs scored.
- Miami's staff ERA is over 1.5 runs better at home (2.47) than on the road (4.09), while its batting average is over 50 points higher (.284).
- UM finished the 2014 season with a 11-4 home record in ACC play; Miami has won 48 of its last 63 ACC games dating to mid-May 2013 (.761).



MILESTONES FOR MORRIS

- After leading his team to a 44-19 record in 2014, head coach Jim Morris moved into ninth place all-time in college baseball history (regardless of Division, four-year colleges) with 1,435 wins.
- Morris wasted little time in moving up that list in 2015, taking over sole possession of eighth place when Miami topped Rutgers 25-4 on Feb. 15, 2015 - his 1,439th win as head coach. **He moved into** seventh place (1,445) when Miami beat Louisville on March 7.
- Morris ranks as the fourth-winningest among active Division I coaches by career victories (1,482) and fifth in winning percentage (.694). He is also the **second-winningest coach in ACC history**.
- Morris became just the eighth coach in the history of Division I baseball to accumulate 1,400 wins when Miami beat Boston College 5-2 on March 8, 2014.

DEATH, TAXES & THE NCAA POSTSEASON

- The Miami Hurricanes extended their own college baseball record with their 43rd consecutive trip to the NCAA postseason in 2015, when they were announced as one of 16 host sites. Miami has not missed the postseason since making it in 1973.
- The Hurricanes' 43 straight trips to the NCAA postseason are the longest active postseason streak of any Division I program in any sport nationwide.
- Jim Morris has led teams to the NCAA postseason in 31 straight years - all 22 years at Miami and his final nine years at Georgia Tech..
- Miami is the only school in the state of Florida to have won a national championship; UM won titles in 1982, 1985, 1999 & 2001.
