

MIDWEEK STORY LINES & NEWS

- No. 17 Miami will make the short trip to Boca Raton on March 1 for its first of three games in 2017 against the FAU Owls.
- Miami is ranked in the top 25 of two major college baseball polls; UM checks in at No. 17 in the USA TODAY Coaches
 Poll and No. 21 by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper. Miami was ranked in four major preseason polls entering 2017.
- Miami is looking to snap a four-game losing streak Wednesday; freshman Greg Veliz will make his first start on the hill.
- The Hurricanes made their 25th trip to the College World Series in 2016, finishing with a 50-14 record and a 21-9 mark in ACC play. Miami was the No. 3 national seed for the postseason, and won the ACC Regular Season Championship.
- Head coach Jim Morris has the fifth-most wins in Division I history (1,537), the third-most wins among active coaches, a
 .698 winning percentage (sixth among active coaches), and 194 more wins than the next active coach (Mike Fox, UNC).
- Miami leads the all-time series with the Owls by a 58-14 margin; FAU took part in the 2016 NCAA Coral Gables Regional, but the two teams did not face each other. Miami and FAU split its 2016 head-to-head; a third matchup was cancelled.
- The Hurricanes had four different players earn Preseason All-America recognition; Michael Mediavilla, Jesse Lepore and Johnny Ruiz were recognized by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper while Carl Chester was honored by Baseball America.
- The Canes had **seven** players selected in the 2016 MLB Draft, including Chicago White Sox' first-round pick **Zack Collins.**

THE HURRICANES SKIPPER

It doesn't matter if his roster is full of rookies or veterans. University of Miami head coach Jim Morris continues to produce some of college baseball's most consistent and dominant teams entering his 24th season in Coral Gables. With a talented staff around him, Morris' Hurricanes are continually the class of collegiate baseball, having won national titles in 1999 and 2001 and the ACC Baseball Regular Season Championship in 2008. 2014 and 2016.

In his 23-season tenure at Miami, no program has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a college baseball-record 44 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 13 of Morris' 23 seasons in Coral Gables - including most recently in 2016, when Miami was awarded the No. 3 national seed for the NCAA postseason.

Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris has won 17 of 23 NCAA Regional appearances at UM, including a record 13 straight to start his tenure in Coral Gables. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 32 years - all 23 at Miami and his final nine at Georgia Tech.

A three-time national coach of the year and 2008 Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year, Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 1,033-423-3 (.710) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,537-667-4 (.697) Division I record in 35 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 39 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,668-708-4 (.702) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 23 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium's renovation prior to its reopening in 2009.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in 2016, as he led the program to its 25th College World Series appearance in history, its third straight ACC Coastal Division title and the program's second ACC Regular Season Championship in a three-year span.

Morris became just the sixth coach in the history of Division I baseball to reach the 1,500-win plateau when Miami topped Louisville 8-4 in dramatic fashion on March 18, 2016. Eight days later, Miami topped Clemson 5-4 in 11 innings - also in walk-off fashion to send Morris to his 1,000th win at the helm of the Hurricanes.

Under his direction, the Hurricanes set the program record for fielding percentage with a sparkling .983 mark in 2016, a figure that ranked best nationwide. Seven Hurricanes were selected in the 2016 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft, including the program's first first-round selection since 2010 in catcher Zack Collins (No. 10, Chicago White Sox). Morris also helped guide two Hurricanes to a pair of major awards: Collins became the first Hurricane to win the Johnny Bench Award as the nation's top collegiate catcher in 2016, while Bryan Garcia set the program saves record and became the first Hurricane to win the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Award.

Morris entered 2015 as among the winningest active coaches in Division I baseball with 1,435 wins. He wasted little time in moving up the record books, moving into sole



possession of eighth place in all-time wins (1,439) on Feb. 15 with a 25-4 win over Rutgers and then seventh place with a 9-5 win over Louisville on March 7 (1,445).

Miami captured the 2014 ACC Regular Season Championship under his watch, recording 24 wins in conference play for the first time in program history.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that have gone on to play in the Major Leagues are Peter O'Brien (Kansas City), Chris Hermann (Arizona), Yasmani Grandal (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jemile Weeks (Boston), Danny Valencia (Oakland), Jon Jay (Chicago), Yonder Alonso (Oakland), Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Ryan Jackson (St. Louis), Pat Burrell (Philadelphia), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston), among many others. From his days at Georgia Tech include Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles), Jay Payton (Oakland) and Jason Varitek (Boston).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the international scene. From 1989-90. Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta.

MIDWEEK NEWS & NOTES

CANES MAKE SHORT TRIP TO PLAY AT FAU

- The No. 17 Miami Hurricanes will play their first midweek game of the season Wednesday, March 1 against **FAU**. First pitch is slated for 6:30 p.m. from FAU Baseball Stadium on WVUM 90.5.
- The two teams will play **three games** against each other in 2017, with the final two being played at Mark Light Field. The Hurricanes and Owls split a pair of regular season games in 2016. FAU took part in the 2016 NCAA Coral Gables Regional but did not face Miami.
- Miami carries a commanding 58-14 all-time series lead, including an **8-3 advantage** in games played on the road. Freshman righthander **Greg Veliz** will make his first college start on the hill.

LAST TIME OUT: CANES DROP SERIES AT #2 UF

- Miami fell in three straight games in its annual rivalry series with No. 2 Florida from Feb. 24-26 at McKethan Stadium in Gainesville. The sweep was the first by either team in the series since **2012**.
- Junior righthander **Jesse Lepore** delivered a strong start in Game 1 but was outdueled by Gators' ace **Alex Faedo**, who tossed 8.2 shutout innings in a 1-0 win for Florida.
- Making his second start in Game 2, **Jeb Bargfeldt** tossed six strong innings but did not receive enough support in a 2-0 defeat.
- Sophomore **Romy Gonzalez** recorded the first multi-homer game of his career in Game 3, but Miami ultimately fell 6-2 in the finale.

HIGH EXPECTATIONS

- Miami was ranked in the **top 25 in preseason polls** from three major college baseball outlets, including a **No. 8** ranking from Collegiate Baseball Newspaper, No. 17 the USA Today Coaches Poll and a No. 21 ranking from D1Baseball.
- The Hurricanes have won three straight ACC Coastal Division titles and have won the ACC Regular Season Championship in two of the past three seasons (2014, 2016).
- Miami had four players earn **Preseason All-America** distinction: Carl Chester (Baseball America), Jesse Lepore (Collegiate Baseball Newspaper, NCBWA), Michael Mediavilla (Collegiate Baseball. NCBWA) and **Johnny Ruiz** (Collegiate Baseball, NCBWA).

DESTINATION: OMAHA

- Since the NCAA began award national seeds prior to the 1999 season, Miami has been among the top eight seven seasons: 1999 (#1), **2001** (#2), **2003** (#8), **2004** (#3), **2008** (#1), **2015** (#5) and 2016 (#3).

LOOKING FOR A FOUR-PEAT

- Miami won its third straight ACC Coastal Division title in 2016, posting a **21-7 record in ACC play** to earn the division crown.
- The Hurricanes have won 67 ACC games over the past three seasons - the most wins in a three-year stretch by any program

- Miami has made College World Series trips in back-to-back seasons (2015 and 2016) thanks in large part to its **dominant play** inside the confines of Alex Rodriguez Park at Mark Light Field.
- Since the start of the 2015 season, Miami is a whopping **72-12** in its last **84 home games**, including its 2017 Opening Weekend series against Rutgers.
- Miami finished **36-5** at home in 2015 and **34-6** at home in 2016. The Hurricanes went 13-2 in ACC play at The Light in 2015 and 12-3 at home in ACC play in 2016.

NEW CANES MAKE DEBUTS AGAINST RUTGERS

- There were a number of debuts and firsts in Miami's opening series victory over visiting Rutgers from Feb. 17-19.

- Alumni taking part in the game included "Downtown" **Kevin** Brown, All-American third baseman and Mets prospect David Thompson as well as Mariners prospects Chantz Mack and Ricky Eusebio, who both hit solo home runs.
- Redshirt senior **Edgar Michelangeli** finished the Alumni game 3-for-4 with four RBI, including a two-run home run, while junior lefthander Michael Mediavilla tossed five strong innings.




