
### **WEEKEND STORY LINES & NEWS**

- No. 6 Miami returns to Mark Light Field for a series with the Manhattan Jaspers beginning Friday, March 4 on ESPN3.
- UM leads the all-time series against the Jaspers 5-1, with a 3-1 lead in games at The Light, but have not met since 2010.
- Miami is ranked in the top 10 of every major college baseball poll. The Hurricanes check in at No. 5 in Collegiate
  Baseball Newspaper, No. 6 in NCBWA, the USA Today Coaches Poll and Baseball America & No. 10 by D1Baseball.com.
- Led by two home runs from Zack Collins & a career outing by Jesse Lepore, Miami topped FGCU 6-2 Tuesday at The Light.
- Miami handed top-ranked Florida its first loss of the season on Feb. 27, but UF won the series by taking Games 1 & 3.
- The Hurricanes made their 24th trip to the College World Series in 2015, finishing with a 50-17 record and a 22-8 mark
  in ACC play. Miami was the No. 5 national seed for the postseason, and won its second straight ACC Coastal Division title.
- Miami returns several hitters from an offense that ranked No. 1 nationwide in runs scored in 2015, including Preseason All-America Zack Collins, two-time All-ACC outfielder Willie Abreu and CWS All-Tournament selection Jacob Heyward.
- Head coach Jim Morris entered 2016 with the sixth-most wins in Division I history (1,485) and the fourth-most among
  active skippers. With 18 more wins in 2016, Morris will move into fifth place in all-time Division I wins (Larry Hays, 1.508).
- In a preseason poll of ACC head coaches, the Hurricanes were picked to win the ACC Coastal Division in 2016.

### **JIM MORRIS**

### **HEAD COACH**

#### THE HURRICANES SKIPPER

It doesn't matter if his roster is full of rookies or veterans, University of Miami head coach Jim Morris continues to produce some of college baseball's most consistent and dominant teams in his 23rd season in Coral Gables. With a talented staff around him, Morris' Hurricanes are continually the class of collegiate baseball, having won national titles in 1999 and 2001 and the ACC Baseball Regular Season Championship in both 2008 and 2014.

In his 22-season tenure at Miami, no program has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a college baseball-record 43 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 12 of Morris' 22 seasons in Coral Gables - including most recently in 2015, when Miami was awarded the No. 5 national seed heading into the NCAA postseason.

Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris has won 16 of 22 NCAA Regional appearances at UM, including a record 13-straight to start his tenure in Coral Gables. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 31 years - 22 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

A three-time national coach of the year and 2008 Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year, Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 987-407-3 (.706) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,491-651-4 (.694) Division I record in 33 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 37 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,622-692-4 (.698) mark.


In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 22 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium's renovation prior to its reopening in 2009.

In 2015, Morris led the Hurricanes to their second straight ACC Coastal Division title, the 24th College World Series appearance in program history, and reached the 50-win mark for the 12th time in his 22 seasons.

Morris entered 2015 as among the winningest active coaches in Division I baseball with 1,435 wins. He wasted little time in moving up the record books, moving into sole possession of eighth place in all-time wins (1,439) on Feb. 15 with a 25-4 win over Rutgers and then seventh place with a 9-5 win over Louisville on March 7 (1,445).

Miami captured the 2014 ACC Regular Season Championship under his watch, recording 24 wins in conference play for the first time in program history. The conference win total set a new record for the program and tied the ACC's all-time single-season win total.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22. The Hurricanes, who have never missed the Atlantic Coast Conference Championship since joining the ACC in 2004, qualified for their 10th straight conference tournament under Morris and earned a Regional host spot for their 42nd consecutive postseason trip.



Morris has reached a number of other coaching milestones in his time in Coral Gables. His 1,000th Division-I game on April 4, 2004, at his old stomping grounds at Georgia Tech. He also achieved another milestone during the 2004 season, winning his 500th game at the helm of the Miami program. Morris' 500th win came just a few weeks following his 1,000th overall win as a Division-I head coach by beating Florida State 7-3 on April 17.

Over 150 professional baseball players have played under Morris during their college careers at Miami, Georgia Tech and DeKalb.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that went on to play in the Major Leagues were Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Pat Burrell (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), and Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston). Several more Hurricanes during the Morris tenure are right on the cusp of making the show, including Mike Rodriguez (Houston), David Gil (Cincinnati) and Jon Jay (St. Louis). Standout players under Morris from his days at Georgia Tech were Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jay Payton (Oakland A's) and Jason Varitek (Boston Red Sox).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the International scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta.

### CANES HOSTING JASPERS AT THE LIGHT

- Miami continues its season-opening, 13-game homestand Friday, March 4 when Manhattan arrives at Mark Light Field for Miami's last nonconference weekend before ACC play begins. First pitch for the series opener is set for 7 p.m. on ESPN3 / WatchESPN.
- The Canes, who topped FGCU 6-2 Wednesday night, own a 5-1 alltime series lead against the Jaspers. Miami is 3-1 in games played at home and won both meetings at the 2006 NCAA Lincoln Regional.
- Senior lefthander Thomas Woodrey (1-1, 5.40 ERA) will oppose Jaspers lefthander Tom Cosgrove (0-0, 0.00 ERA).

### **LAST TIME OUT**

- Led by a multi-home run effort from Zack Collins and a career outing from Jesse Lepore, Miami topped FGCU 6-2 Wednesday.
- Collins connected on a solo shot and a two-run home run to give Miami leads of 1-0 and 3-2. It was his fourth career multi-HR game.
- Lepore earned his first career win in his second start; he tossed 5.2 innings, had a career-high seven strikeouts and allowed two runs.
- The Hurricanes improved to 14-2 all-time against FGCU with the win; Miami will travel to Fort Myers on April 5 and will host the Eagles once again on May 17.

### MIAMI HANDS #1 FLORIDA FIRST LOSS

- Miami dropped two of three in its weekend series with No. 1 Florida at Mark Light Field from Feb. 26-28; the Hurricanes won Saturday's Game 2 by a final score of 5-3, but dropped Game 1 (5-0) and Game 3 (7-3).
- The Hurricanes got five strong innings from lefthander Michael Mediavilla (2-0) Saturday and four RBI from sluger Zack Collins.
- Saturday's win was played in front of a sellout crowd of 4,999. Over 13,000 fans passed through the Mark Light gates for the series.

### **OPENING WEEKEND SWEEP**

- Led by dominant performances from the starting rotation, Miami opened its 2016 season with a sweep of visiting Rutgers Feb. 19-21.
- Lefthanders Thomas Woodrey (5 IP, 1 ER), Michael Mediavilla (6 IP, O R, 7 K) and Danny Garcia (7 IP, O R, 4 K) combined for a 0.50 ERA with two walks and 15 strikeouts in 18 innings of work.
- Junior Johnny Ruiz led the offense with a .667 (6-for-9) average against the Scarlet Knights.

### **HEATING UP**

- Among Hurricanes delivering on offense over the last five games: junior Johnny Ruiz (.353 AVG, 6-for-17, nine RBI), junior Zack Collins (.400 AVG, .591 OBP, two homers, eight RBI), and sophomore leadoff man Carl Chester (.389 AVG, five runs scored, .522 OBP).
  - Ruiz leads the team in hits (12), doubles (four) and RBI (11).
- Collins homered twice against FGCU on March 2, marking the fourth multi-home run game of his career. He has 28 career home runs in two-plus seasons with the Hurricanes.
- Those who have impressed on the mound through the season's first seven games include freshman Frankie Bartow (1-0, 1.04 ERA, 8.2 IP, 1 ER), junior **Bryan Garcia** (0.00 ERA, 3 saves, 7 K's) and sophomore starter Michael Mediavilla (2-0, 0.82 ERA, .136 B/AVG).

### **MIDWEEK MATCHUP NEWS & NOTES**

### MILESTONES IN SIGHT FOR MORRIS

- With nine more victories in 2016, head coach Jim Morris will become just the sixth coach in the history of Division I baseball to reach the **1,500-win milestone** (1,491).
- With 18 more wins, Morris will move past Larry Hays (1,508) as the fifth-winningest coach in Division I baseball history by victories.
  - Since his arrival in 1994, Miami's 987 wins are sixth-most in D1.
- Morris, who has won 987 games during his illustrious 22-year-plus tenure, is 13 wins away from becoming the second coach in Miami history to reach 1,000 wins at the helm (Ron Fraser - 1,267).

### CLIMBING UP THE RECORD BOOKS

- Closer Bryan Garcia entered the year with the fifth-most saves in Miami history (25), and recorded back-to-back saves against Rutgers (Feb. 19-20) on Opening Weekend. He added one vs. Florida on Feb. 27.
- Garcia is chasing the all-time record for saves in a career, which is 39 - held by George Huguet (2001-2004). Garcia's 15 saves as a freshman in 2014 tied for the seventh-most in a single season.
- Garcia needs one more save to tie Danny Graves (1992-94 for fourth (29), six more to tie Robbie Morrison (1996-98) for third (34), nine more to tie **Rick Raether** (1984-86) for second (37) and is 11 behind **Huguet** for first.

#### HIGH EXPECTATIONS

- Miami was ranked in the top 10 in preseason polls from nearly every major college baseball outlet, including a No. 4 ranking from Collegiate Baseball Newspaper and a No. 6 ranking from several outlets.
- The Hurricanes, who have won back-to-back ACC Coastal Division titles, were projected to once again win the division in 2016 in a preseason poll of ACC head coaches.
- Miami's preseason ranking of No. 4 from Collegiate Baseball Newspaper was its highest from the publication since 2005; its No. 6 ranking from Baseball America was its highest from BA since 2007.

#### **DESTINATION: OMAHA**

- Miami made its return to the College World Series in 2015, marking the program's first trip to Omaha, Neb., since 2008. Miami's 24 College World Series trips are the second-most of any program in the country.
- The Hurricanes have won 48 games in the College World Series, the fourth-most of any program nationwide; Miami's four national championships (1982, 1985, 1999, 2001) rank fifth-most.
- Since the NCAA began award national seeds prior to the 1999 season, Miami has been among the top eight six seasons: 1999 (#1), 2001 (#2), 2003 (#8), 2004 (#3), 2008 (#1) and 2015 (#5).

#### LOOKING FOR A THREE-PEAT

- Miami won its second straight ACC Coastal Division title in 2015, posting a 22-8 record in ACC play to earn the division crown.
- The Hurricanes, who were picked to win the ACC Coastal Division once again in 2016, have won 46 ACC games over the past two seasons - the second-best two-year stretch by any program since ACC expanded to a 30-game conference schedule prior to 2005.
- Miami has won the ACC Regular Season Championship twice, most recently in 2014 when the Canes finished 24-6.

- Two Hurricanes picked up 2016 Preseason All-America honors: junior catcher Zack Collins and junior closer Bryan Garcia.
- Collins, a unanimous Preseason All-America candidate, was among the 50 players named to the initial watch list for the Golden Spikes Award by USA Baseball. He was also named to last year's list.
- Garcia, who was recognized by Louisville Slugger and Perfect Game, was named to the watch list for the **Stopper of the Year Award** by NCBWA for the second straight year.
- Both players have earned All-America recognition in their two-year Hurricane careers; Collins was a third-team ABCA/Rawlings All America choice last season, while Garcia was a NCBWA third-team All American after his freshman year in 2014.
- UM had three All-Americans in 2015: David Thompson (unanimous), George Iskenderian (NCBWA) & Collins (ABCA).

- O'Brien joined a 2015 group that included now Oakland A's teammates Yonder Alonso and Danny Valencia, new San Diego Padres outfielder Jon Jay, Dodgers All-Star catcher Yasmani Grandal, new D-Backs catcher/outfielder Chris Herrmann, infielders Rvan Jackson and Jemile Weeks and Milwaukee All-Star Ryan Braun.
- Miami had five players selected in the 2015 MLB Draft: lefthander Andrew Suarez, third baseman David Thompson, infielder George Iskenderian, catcher Garrett Kennedy and outfielder Ricky Eusebio.

- MLB All-Star Yasmani Grandal, former Marlins first-round Draft pick and retired number honoree Charles "CJ" Johnson and 2015 Miami staff ace Andy Suarez, with about 50 others, were introduced.
- Alumni taking part in the game included "Downtown" Kevin Brown, former MLB outfielder Brian Barton, fan favorite Jose Trujillo and sidewinder Sam Abrams, who was a key member of Miami's 2015 CWS team.
