NATION'S TOP OFFENSE

With the last national NCAA report - Miami, at 86.9 points per game, is the highest scoring offense among the NCAA's 336 Division I teams. The Canes are also highly ranked in scoring margin (3rd - 31.6), steals per game (2nd - 16.3) and turnover margin (2nd - 10.3).

"EPIC" PERFORMANCE

After rolling her ankle in Miami's win at Michigan State on Dec. 1, it wasn't a guarantee that Riquna Williams would play against No. 11 Rutgers on Dec. 5. Not only did Williams play, she dropped a career-best 36 points on one of the best defenses in the nation. Williams only had five points at halftime, but poured in 31 in the second half and two overtime sessions in helping the Canes erase a 16-point second-half deficit and defeat the Scarlet Knights, 92-81.

EXPLOSIVE DUO

During the 2010-11 season, Riquna Williams and Shenise Johnson combined for 50 or more points on five occasions. Against Rutgers (12/5) the duo combined for 61 points - the most ever for the two seniors.

HIGH PRAISE FOR THE CANES

After Miami defeated Michigan State in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge, Spartan head coach Suzy Merchant said, "I'm not surprised. We knew what they were going to do. We practiced against six and seven guys on our scout team. But from 1 to 5, that's the fastest, most athletic team we've faced in my career. We've played Duke, and it's not even close."

ULM's Mona Martin had even more praise to hand out, saying, "Last year we played Texas A&M, and they end up winning the thing [NCAA title], and I think this UM team could be a big contender for the national championship if they stay healthy," Martin said. "They have so much depth, play so hard. They're going to be way up there this year. I've watched a lot of film, lot of ballgames, and they run the floor better than any team I've watched from point guard to post. Their transition offense is unbelievable. I can't say we've ever played a team that runs the floor that well, and I've been in this business 36 years. There is a lot of desire and fight in those kids."

PROTECTING THE BANKUNITED CENTER

With Miami's season-opening win over Texas-Pan American, the Canes won their 25th-consecutive home contest - setting a new program record. Miami has extended that record to 30 games after its 103-39 victory over ULM on Dec. 16. The streak is currently the third-longest active streak in the nation. Connecticut (91) and Stanford (67) are the two teams with longer active win streaks. Coincidentally, Stanford's Tara VanDerveer, Connecticut's Geno Auriemma and Miami's Katie Meier shared last season's AP National Coach of the Year Award.

The streak began with the team's final regular season home game of the 2009-10 season and continued with a perfect 20-0 home record last season.

The previous record of 24 straight wins at home was set from the 1990-91 through the 1992-93 seasons.

DOUBLE-FIGURE STREAK

With 17 points vs. Holy Cross on Dec. 28, senior Shenise Johnson has now scored in double-figures in 83 straight games. After conducting a nation-wide survey, that streak is the longest of any player in the country.

MORE THAN ANY OTHER

After wins over Rutgers (12/5) - 36 points - and Ole Miss (12/10) - 17 points - Riquna Williams was voted the ACC Player of the Week for the seventh time in her career. No other active player has earned the award more than Williams. Second place on that list with six awards is Shenise Johnson.

THE ACC KNOWS

Johnson, the ACC Preseason Player of the Year and a preseason All-American, scored a game-high 18 points in a 72-55 victory over Alaska Anchorage in the Great Alaska Shootout's first round, earning Player of the Game honors. In the tournament final against USF, Johnson nearly recorded a triple-double with 11 points, nine rebounds and nine assists. For her performance in the two games, Johnson was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player.

The Henrietta, N.Y., native amassed game-highs in points (22), rebounds (6), assists (8) and steals (7) against Longwood in a 92-43 victory to wrap up the week.

The weekly honor is the sixth of Johnson's career, trailing only teammate Riquna Williams for the most active weekly accolades in the conference.

GREAT ALASKA SHOOTOUT CHAMPIONS

The Hurricanes won their first Great Alaska Shootout in their third appearance in the event. A win over host Alaska Anchorage in the opening round and then over USF in the final gave the Canes the championship.

Shenise Johnson was named the Shootout Most Outstanding Player and earned Player of the Game honors against UAA. Riquna Williams was named the Player of the Game against the Bulls.

In their previous two appearances the Canes had a combined 3-3 record.

CANES BACKCOURT NAMED TO WATCHLISTS

The University of Miami's Shenise Johnson and Riquna Williams have been named to the Women's Preseason Nominee List for the 2011 John R. Wooden Award. The duo has also been selected to the "Wade Watch" list for the State Farm Wade Trophy Division I Player of the Year, as well as the Naismith Player of the Year List.

ON THE DOUBLE

Shenise Johnson and Morgan Stroman have each recorded at least one double-double for the Hurricanes this season. Johnson's third double-double of the season (17 points/10 rebounds) against Holy Cross gave her 30 for her career - tied for 12th in the nation among active players. Central Arkansas' Megan Herbert is the current leader at 50 career double-doubles.

MORE TO COME

National Player of the Year candidate Shenise Johnson ranks in the Top 10 of many categories for UM career records including points (4th), assists (6th), rebounds (5th), and steals (4th). Johnson is the only player in Miami history to be ranked in the Top 10 of all four of those categories.

MOVING UP THE RANKS

Shenise Johnson currently sits in fourth place all-time at Miami with 1,905 career points and needs 280 points to pass Frances Savage (1988-92) for third place. With 1,831 points, Riquna Williams ranks fifth all-time.

With five three-pointers against Holy Cross, the Canes have made at least one three-point field goal in 337 straight games dating back to the 2000-01.

THE BIG TEN/ACC CHALLENGE

The women's 2011 Big Ten/ACC Challenge ended in a 6-6 draw in its fifth year. The ACC won each of the previous four challenges.

Miami earned its first victory in the challenge in three attempts with its 76-60 victory at Michigan State. The Canes fell to Michigan in 2007 and then Indiana in 2008.

BIG-TIME TEAM ON THE SMALL SCREEN

The Nov. 17 meeting with Tennessee was the first of 12 games that will be televised this season - a program record. Miami's next televised contest will be its ACC home-opener when it faces NC State at the BankUnited Center on Jan. 5. ESPN will provide coverage beginning at 7 p.m.

JOHNSON TABBED ACC PRESEASON POY

Shenise Johnson returns as the 2011-12 ACC Preseason Player of the Year. The senior was named the 2010-11 ACC Player of the Year, the first Hurricane player to win the award, and voted to last year's All-ACC First Team and All-ACC Defensive team.

TOP-10 MATCH UP IN TIP-OFF CLASSIC

On. Nov. 15, the seventh-ranked Hurricanes traveled to Knoxville, Tenn. to face the third-ranked Lady Vols in the 19th Annual State Farm Tip-Off Classic.

Miami was led by the performances of seniors Riquana Williams and Shenise Johnson, who scored 24 and 17 points, respectively.

However, an early second-half run from Tennessee broke the halftime tie and in the end, five Lady Vols scored in double-figures in the game, leading to a 92-76 Tennessee victory.

CANES OPEN SEASON RANKED SEVENTH

The Hurricanes, who finished the 2010-2011 season ranked tenth in the final ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Poll, moved up three spots in anticipation of their 2011-12 season. The No. 7 ranking in the Coaches' Poll is the highest rank in program history to begin a season.

The Hurricanes were also ranked No. 7 in the preseason Associated Press Poll.

Miami is currently ranked 12th in the AP Poll and 10th in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll.

MIAMI DUO NAMED PRESEASON ALL-ACC

The Preseason All-ACC Team is highlighted by the Miami senior guard tandem of Johnson and Williams. The two led the Canes to a 20-0 home record last season at the BankUnited Center.

Johnson, the first Associate Press Pre-season All-American in team history, earned 2010-11 ACC Player of the Year honors and her second straight selection to the All-ACC First Team. Williams, who led the conference and finished 11th in the nation in scoring, is also coming off a selection to the All-ACC First Team.

CANE NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

University of Miami senior guard Shenise Johnson was one of five players named to the Associated Press Preseason All-America Team.

Johnson, who earned 25 of 40 potential votes, was joined on the preseason team by Baylor's Brittney Griner (40 votes), Notre Dame's Skylar Diggins (37), Stanford's Nnemkadi Ogwumike (37) and Tennessee's Shekinna Stricklen (21).

Johnson became the first player from Miami to make the preseason All-America team.

Head Coach Katie Meier

Katie Meier enters her seventh season as the head coach of the Hurricanes' women's basketball program in 2011-12. A well known and respected figure in women's basketball, Meier has worked tirelessly to put her mark on Miami's program and to build a winning tradition. All of her hard work was rewarded after the 2010-11 season as she was named the Associated Press National Coach of the Year - sharing the award with Connecticut's Geno Auriemma and Stanford's Tara VanDerveer.

Meier led the Hurricanes into the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2004 and its win over Gardner-Webb in the first round was the first tournament win for the 'Canes since 1993. Miami entered the 2010-11 season with high internal expectations, but were picked eighth in the Preseason ACC Poll and were coming off a season in which it was the No. 12 seed in the ACC Tournament.

However, the Hurricanes exceeded all of the outside expectations and at one point, won 17 straight games. They were a perfect 20-0 inside the BankUnited Center and finished 12-2 in ACC play - earning their first regular season conference title since joining the league in 2004. As a reward, Meier was named the

ACC Coach of the Year and later would be selected as the WBCA/RUSSELL ATHLETIC Region 2 Coach of the Year, as voted on by her peers.

Hired on April 19, 2005, then UM Athletics Director Paul Dee announced the appointment of Meier in front of national and local media, fans, alumni and support staff, signifying the beginning of a new era.

Following an unprecedented career as one of the greatest athletes to ever play in the Atlantic Coast Conference, Meier quickly established herself in the coaching ranks. Upon her appointment at UM, following an impressive four-year tenure as the head coach at Charlotte where she helped bring the 49er program into national prominence, Meier made it clear that her goal is to make Miami one of the premier women's basketball programs in the country.

In her first season, Meier wasted little time in making the first steps towards those goals. After receiving little attention in the ACC preseason polls, the Hurricanes posted an impressive overall record of 17-13. After fighting through a conference that would send nine teams to the postseason, including three to the NCAA Final Four. Miami finished with a sixth-place, 6-8 record in ACC play en route to earning a berth into the second round of the 2006 Women's National Invitation Tournament.

Throughout the season Miami posted wins over ranked teams such as Mississippi (No. 25), Boston College (No. 21) and Virginia Tech (No. 25)--and nearly knocked off then-No. 1 Duke in double-overtime. The Hurricanes also recorded wins over two eventual conference champions in Hartford (America East) and Oakland (Mid-Continent). Under her direction, standout Tamara James produced one of the greatest seasons ever seen by a UM player in 2005-06, including becoming the University's all-time leading scorer before being taken as the No. 8 overall pick in the 2006 WNBA Draft by the Washington Mystics.

In Meier's second season in 2006-07, the Hurricanes got off to a strong start, winning seven of their first eight games--including a 79-70 win over Indiana to claim the UM Thanksgiving Tournament title. On Dec. 1, Meier picked up her 100th career victory as the Hurricanes defeated Jackson State, 77-50. However, with only eight healthy players to call upon by the start of the ACC schedule, Miami faced challenge after challenge competing in a league that ranked among the top-three strongest women's basketball conferences nationally and produced two of the NCAA Tournament's four No. 1 seeds in 2006-07.

Regardless, Renee Taylor emerged as the ACC's leading scorer--upholding Miami's streak of producing the league's leading scorer in all three years it had been a member. The All-ACC Second Team selection set school records in single-game scoring with 42 points at Houston and became the 19th Hurricane to score at least 1,000 points--and just the sixth to do so in her first two seasons. In addition, transfer Maurita Reid emerged as a defensive threat, tying the school record with 10 steals versus Wake Forest and finishing among the ACC's leaders and NCAA's top 10 in steals per game.

The 2007-08 season, Meier's third with the Hurricanes, saw Maurita Reid continue her rise among the ACC elite. The senior was nothing short of impressive shooting beyond the arc and picking opponent's pockets. She hit four or more three-pointers on 10 different occasions and finished the season with 110 steals, good for second in the conference and fifth in the NCAA. The Queens, N.Y. native led the team in points (15.3 ppg) and rebounding (5.6 rpg) and was also named the ACC All-Defensive Team.

With a No. 21 incoming recruiting class, Meier and the Hurricanes saw significant improvement during the 2008-09 season. The freshman class was highlighted by McDonald's All-American Shenise Johnson - out of Henrietta, N.Y. and Riquna Williams - from nearby Pahokee, Fla.

Johnson lived up to the hype as she was the team leader on the season in points, rebounds, assists and steals. Under Meier's guidance, Johnson was named the ACC Rookie of the Week on three occasions and was named to the ACC All-Freshmen team as well as ACC Honorable Mention. The versatile guard/forward also led the U19 USA team to a gold medal finish in the 2009 World Championships in Bangkok, Thailand.

The 2009-10 season was one of the most successful in program history. Under Meier's vision, the Hurricanes advanced to the WNIT Championship game. Miami posted a 22-14 overall record - the first 20-win campaign since the 2002-03 season and just the eighth all-time.

In her sophomore season, Johnson was joined by a healthy Riquna Williams and the duo racked up accolades throughout the season. Johnson was named First Team All-ACC, while Williams garnered second-team honors. The tandem led Miami to a 5-1 WNIT record - the deepest postseason run in team history - with both earning all-tournament honors along the way.

Following the 2009-10 campaign, University of Miami Director of Athletics Kirby Hocutt announced that Meier signed a contract extension through 2015.

"We are excited about the tremendous progress our women's basketball team achieved this past season," said Hocutt. "Coach Meier continues to assemble a special group of talented young women at the University of Miami and we look forward to the future success of our program."

MIAMI 107, PRAIRIE VIEW A&M 26 - NOV. 17, 2011

CORAL GABLES, Fla. (AP) - The start of a stretch against top-tier conference teams started dreadfully for Prairie View.

After a season-opening win against Rice, the Panthers lost 107-26 at No. 7 Miami on Thursday night. The Hurricanes (2-1) ran off to a 19-0 start in the opening 5:17 and eventually built a 39-2 lead with 10:30 remaining in the first half. Johnson scored 10 points in Miami's early surge and finished the half with 17 points.

Prairie View, a 2011 NCAA tournament qualifier from the Southwest Athletic Conference, was held without a field goal until Jeannette Jackson's short jumper with 9:40 remaining that made the score 39-4. "They played at a different speed," Panthers coach Toyelle Wilson said. "The girls were shell shocked a little bit. It's hard to prepare for a team like the University of Miami in practice."

Miami led 60-9 at halftime. The Hurricanes forced 26 Panthers turnovers and allowed three field goals on 22 attempts in the first half. Their pressure defense also resulted in 17 first half steals.

The 81-point margin of victory set a Miami school record, beating the time the Hurricanes beat Homestead Air Force Base, 100-20, on Jan. 14, 1976.

"I thought that was a tremendous performance by our bench but it was initially a statement from our starters," Miami coach Katie Meier said. They played very angry, very determined and with a ton of confidence but with an absolute focus of fixing what we didn't do well at Tennessee."

Tennessee outscored the Hurricanes by 16 in the second half and defeated Miami, 92-76. Meier praised her team's defensive effort against Prairie View.

"We didn't like having 92 points scored against us," Meier said. "So we had a mission we were going to shut down and play defense."

Meier substituted freely early. The Miami reserves played 52 minutes and the starters 48 in the first half.

"Those veterans, the starters, set the tone. They were the teachers."

Johnson struggled offensively against Tennessee and made up for it by shooting 10-of-12, including 5-of-5 from 3-point range. Johnson played only 20 minutes.

"I was disappointed with my effort at Tennessee," said Johnson, who shot 8-of-19 and converted only one 3-pointer against the Volunteers. "I was just focused on hitting shots."

The Hurricanes (2-1) ran off to a 19-0 start in the opening 5:17 and eventually built a 39-2 lead with 10:30 remaining in the first half. Johnson scored 10 points in Miami's early surge and finished the half with 17 points.

"I told (the players) we were going to throw them in the fire early," said Prairie View coach Toyelle Wilson coach. "Miami is ranked number seven for a reason."

Johnson's 3-pointer with 4:16 remaining gave the Hurricanes their first 80-point lead, 101-19. Johnson finished 5-of-5 from behind the arc.

For the game, the Hurricanes converted on 10-of-17 3-pointers.

Stefanie Yderstrom scored 13 points and Stroman finished with 12 points for the Hurricanes

Before the game, the Hurricanes players and coaches were presented with their 2010-11 ACC regular season championship rings. Two new banners also were displayed from the rafters recognizing the team's the conference regular season title and its berth in the 2011 NCAA tournament.

MIAMI 72, ALASKA ANCHORAGE 55- NOV. 55, 2011

ANCHORAGE, Alaska (AP) - Shenise Johnson scored 18 points and No. 9 Miami beat Alaska-Anchorage 72-55 on Wednesday night in the opening round of the Carrs-Safeway Great Alaska Shootout.

The Hurricanes (3-1) shot just 27 percent in the first half against the Division II Seawolves (4-1) and trailed much of the period. Alaska-Anchorage's biggest lead of the half was four, but Johnson's 3-pointer just before the first-half buzzer gave Miami a 28-26 lead.

MIAMI 92, LONGWOOD 43 - NOV. 27, 2011

CORAL GABLES, Fla. (AP) - A 20-hour trip from Alaska failed to affect No. 9 Miami.

Still shaking off jet-lag from their return home early Saturday morning, the Hurricanes wore down Longwood in a 92-43 rout Sunday afternoon.

Shenise Johnson scored 22 points on 9-of-11 shooting and had six assists to lead the Hurricanes (5-1). Morgan Stroman finished with 20 points, shooting 8 of 10 from the field.

"We handled a very difficult travel situation, getting home at 1:30 in the morning and having practice later," Miami coach Katie Meier said. "Flying through the night, grabbing a nap wherever you could, I'm really in awe of the maturity of this team. I'm really proud of them for how they handled it."

The Hurricanes, who defeated Alaska Anchorage and South Florida in the Great Alaska Shootout Nov. 23 and 24, dealt with a return flight to Coral Gables that was plagued by delays before takeoff and subsequent flight connections.

"It was chaotic, we were on the plane for two hours figuring out when we were going to leave," Johnson said. "I thought we did a great job of not complaining. Coach did a great job of keeping us calm. We were going to get home at some point."

Longwood (1-5) could not capitalize. The Hurricanes kept the Lancers scoreless for a 7:54 stretch of the first half and built a 48-22 lead with 2:01 remaining. Stroman scored six consecutive points on fast-break layups during the stretch.

"I knew once I had the ball I could beat my defender so I just ran out in front," Stroman said. Miami expanded a 50-28 lead at halftime with a 16-4 spurt in the first 5:08 of the second half. Stroman's two free throws with 8:34 remaining gave the Hurricanes their first 40-point lead at 76-35. Miami had 20 steals and forced 28 Longwood turnovers and increased its home winning streak to 27.

"I challenged the team at halftime to get their legs underneath them a little bit on defense," Meier said. "We had a goal that we wanted to hold Longwood under 40. To regroup at halftime and lock down on a 15-point performance I was very impressed with my team."

Mina Jovanic scored 12 points to lead the Lancers. "They were much better than us," Longwood coach Bill Reinson said. "We couldn't stop them in transition. We didn't quit and fought down to the end. We continued to make plays. I feel we can build from this game."

The Hurricanes enjoyed a 17-2 run early in the first half. Krystal Saunders' basket with 13:22 remaining capped the run and gave Miami a 25-8 lead.

Longwood rallied and outscored Miami 14-5 in the next 5:43. Brittani Billups' layup with 8:39 remaining ended the run and got the Lancers within eight at 30-22.

MIAMI 76, MICHIGAN STATE 60 - DEC. 1, 2011

EAST LANSING, Mich. (AP) - Morgan Stroman scored 20 points in a near-perfect shooting night to lead No. 9 Miami past Michigan State 76-60 Thursday night in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge.

Stroman had 13 points at the break, hitting all four of her shots from the field and all five at the line for the much quicker Hurricanes (6-1). She finished 7 for 7 and 6 for 7, respectively. Shenise Johnson added 13 points and Stefanie Yderstrom had 11 in Miami's second-closest game this season.

Porsche Poole had 17 points for the foul-plagued Spartans (5-3), who played without starters Lykendra Johnson and Taylor Alton for most of the first half. Michigan State trailed 38-26 at halftime.

Courtney Schifffauer and Jasmine Hines each had nine points for Michigan State, while Becca Mills grabbed nine rebounds, all in the first 20 minutes.

Miami forced the Spartans into 19 turnovers and had 11 steals. That was more than enough when Michigan State shot just 3 for 16 on 3s.

The Hurricanes shot 45 percent from the field, 30 percent on 3s (6 for 20) and 75 percent (12 for 16) on free throws. They had 15 assists and just 10 turnovers while running at every opportunity.

The Spartans shot 42 percent from the field and 78 percent (7 for 9) at the line, and had a 37-34 edge in rebounds.

Miami point guard Riquna Williams went down with a left knee injury and was helped off the court with 1:16 left before halftime. She returned briefly in the second half and finished with nine points.

The Hurricanes built a 36-20 edge with pressure defense, drives to the basket and a steady procession to the foul line. The Spartans had 13 turnovers in the first 20 minutes, when they were outscored 11-3 at the line.

With Johnson and Alton back in the lineup, Michigan State pulled to 46-36 on an off-balance jumper by Poole and made it an eight-point game on a layup by Alton.

Miami kept the Spartans at bay with five of their six 3s in the second half, two from deep in the right corner and one from up top by Yderstrom.

But Michigan State rallied again behind Schifffauer's aggression and Hines' strength inside. Annalise Pickrel's jumper with 6:14 to go pulled the Spartans to 59-52 with 6:14 left.

Stroman finally missed a free throw but made her second attempt, then converted a layup on a pass from Shenise Johnson to make it a 40-point game. On the Hurricanes' next possession, Yderstrom connected again from 21 feet to make it 65-52.

MIAMI 92, RUTGERS 81, 2OT - DEC. 5, 2011

CORAL GABLES, Fla. (AP) - Riquna Williams said her stomach was still burning nearly an hour after the final whistle. Shenise Johnson limped with every step. Miami coach Katie Meier said she was looking for some oxygen.

A comeback for the ages left No. 9 Miami drained - but still perfect at home. Williams scored a career-high 36 points, Johnson added 25 points and 12 rebounds and the Hurricanes knocked No. 11 Rutgers from the ranks of the unbeaten with a 92-81 double-overtime win Monday night, Miami's 28th straight in its own building. The Hurricanes trailed by 16 points with 17 minutes left in the second half, then started a most improbable rally against one of the nation's top defensive clubs.

"You've got to be really cocky and have some really confident kids to think that you're coming back from that one," Meier said. "You really do. Especially when you look over on the other bench and it's Rutgers, one of the best defensive teams in the history of women's basketball."

A clash of styles - Miami's offense vs. Rutgers' defense - was all Scarlet Knights for the first 25 minutes. Rutgers (8-1) was up 40-24 early in the second half, and Meier acknowledged afterward that she thought the Hurricanes were in real trouble.

Miami outscored Rutgers 68-41 the rest of the way. "I don't think we played scared at all," Rutgers coach C. Vivian Stringer said. "I don't think we played very smart."

The Scarlet Knights got a layup from Erica Wheeler with 1.5 seconds left in regulation to force overtime and another game-tying shot from Betnijah Laney just before the buzzer and sending it to send it to a second OT.

But Williams took over for Miami in the second OT, hitting a pair of 3-pointers to get the Hurricanes going, and they survived. It was the first time Rutgers allowed 90 points since Jan. 2, 2003, and given the way the first 25 minutes of the game went, no one would have figured that was happening Monday night.

Of course, the next 25 minutes were the ones that told the story. "Awesome game," Johnson said. "My heart rate is still pumping. Credit goes to Rutgers. It was just a fun, fun game."

April Sykes scored 19 points and grabbed 10 rebounds for Rutgers, Erica Wheeler scored 13 and Khadijah Rushdan added 10.

Miami trailed for all but 2:35 of regulation, and still had plenty of chances to win before the over-times. Johnson went 2 for 4 from the foul line in the final 38 seconds of regulation, so the Hurricanes' lead was never larger than two - giving Rutgers life.

The Scarlet Knights took advantage. Taking possession with 10.7 seconds left in regulation, Rutgers got the ball down low to Oliver. She missed a layup, but Wheeler was there for the putback with 1.5 seconds to play in regulation, tying the game at 63.

"We made a couple mistakes down the stretch," Wheeler said. "But it's a learning experience. We definitely are getting better from this situation."

Stefanie Yderstrom's 3-pointer gave the Hurricanes the lead with 1:47 left in the first overtime. She appeared to cramp up on the next possession, so Williams simply waited for her chance, connecting from beyond the arc to push the Miami lead to 71-67. And once again, Rutgers rallied - Sykes' 3 with a half-minute to play got the Scarlet Knights to 73-72, and when Laney knotted it, the Rutgers bench leaped for joy.

It was the Scarlet Knights' final celebration of the night. "They've got to grow up - yesterday," Stringer said, unhappy that the chance was wasted.

Rutgers came into the game having allowed only 70 points once - in the season opener - and on a six-game streak of not allowing any more than 52 points. Opponents were shooting 31 percent and committing more than 20 turnovers a game against the Scarlet Knights through eight games, so the Hurricanes knew exactly what to expect.

So predictably, Rutgers' man-to-man gave Miami fits. But the Hurricanes did little to help their own cause, missing at least nine shots near the rim in a 9-minute span of the first half alone, falling behind 31-22 going into the locker room - after the Scarlet Knights held them to 27 percent shooting. And when Rutgers started the second half on a 9-2 run, capped by a jumper from Sykes, the lead was 40-24 with 17:23 left.

With that, Meier called timeout, and something clicked, just in time. "Gutsy," Meier said. "How are you gutsy when you're down 16? ... They were missing free throws they never miss, missing layups they never miss, and somehow still had the confidence. That's beyond me. That's them."

GEORGETOWN 71, MIAMI 46 - DEC. 21, 2011

WASHINGTON, D.C. (AP) - Seventh-ranked Miami and its high-powered offense finally met its match.

No. 17 Georgetown held the nation's highest-scoring team to nearly half its average and 21 percent shooting in a 71-46 rout Wednesday night.

"(Georgetown) smacked us in the face and we ran and called our moms and asked for help instead of turning to each other," said coach Katie Meier.

Sugar Rodgers scored 24 points - including a trio of 3-pointers - to lead the Hoyas (10-2), who stifled the Hurricanes (9-2) from the start. Miami had averaged 87 points per game, and its worst offensive outing had been a 92-76 loss at Tennessee on Nov. 15.

"Credit to Georgetown," Shense Johnson said. "They did a great job of dismantling us."

The Hoyas led 34-21 at halftime while holding Miami to just one field goal in the last six minutes while going on an 11-5 run, and maintained a double-digit lead the rest of the way.

"I think we rattled them a little bit, showed them that we were serious this year, and we got em," Alexa Roche said.

With just over seven minutes remaining, Suriya McGuire hit a 3-pointer to bring Miami within 15. But the Hoyas answered with a 12-0 run, highlighted by Tia Magee's three-point play, to take a 66-39 lead, their largest of the game.

Johnson led Miami with 10 points - her fewest of the season - on 1-for-13 shooting. Georgetown also limited the Hurricanes' second-leading scorer, Riquna Williams, to a season-low six points.

"Every time I got the ball there were two defenders running at me - when I did get the ball," Johnson said. "A lot of times I had to just go get the rebound and try to go back up with it."

Magee scored 13, Rubylee Wright added 10, and Sydney Wilson grabbed 12 rebounds for Georgetown, which snapped a seven-game losing streak to Miami since 2000.

"They handed us a huge lesson," Meier said. "I'm regretful that it happened but I'll be more regretful if we don't take it and learn from it."
