THE MATCHUP

The No. 12-ranked University of Miami men's basketball team returns to the hardwood on Wednesday at 7 p.m., as it welcomes Newberry College to the Watsco Center for its lone exhibition game of the 2017-18 campaign.

WHAT'S BACK

The Hurricanes welcome back 10 players from last year's squad, including starters Bruce Brown, Jr., Anthony Lawrence II and Ja'Quan Newton. In addition, the Hurricanes return 40.5 percent of their scoring and 40.8 percent of their rebounding from a year ago.

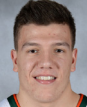
WHAT'S NEW

Miami also added three high-touted newcomers in the form of Deng Gak, Chris Lykes and Lonnie Walker IV. On Oct. 17, Walker IV was among 20 players named to the preseason watch list for the 2018 Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award. The 6-foot-5-inch guard was also named a McDonald's and Jordan Brand All-American and was regarded as a consensus top-20 prospect coming out of high school. Walker is the first Hurricane to be named to the Jerry West Award watch list since Sheldon McClellan in 2015.

SCOUTING NEWBERRY COLLEGE

Newberry College enters Wednesday night's game in the hopes of building off of last year's 18-11 campaign. The Wolves have won 18-or-more games in each of the last four seasons. Newberry led NCAA Division II in steals per game (13.1) and three-point field goals per game (14.2). 2017 South Atlantic Conference Freshman of the Year Marshall Lange, who averaged 12.8 points per game a year ago, leads the way for Newberry.

CANES DEBUT AT NO. 12 IN USA TODAY COACHES POLL

The University of Miami men's basketball team will begin the season as No. 12 in the USA TODAY Sports men's basketball coaches poll, which was released on Oct. 19.

BROWN JR. NAMED TO JULIUS ERVING AWARD WATCH LIST

Bruce Brown Jr. was among 21 players named to the watch list for the 2018 Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year Award, the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced on Oct. 18. Brown returns for his second year in Coral Gables after one of the best freshman seasons in school history. The 6-foot-5-inch guard from Boston set freshman single-season records in points (391), field goals made (134) and minutes played (1,053) and recorded the program's second-ever triple-double.

2016-17 TEAM HIGHLIGHTS

-Miami played in back-to-back NCAA Tournaments for the first time since going to three straight from 1997-98 to 1999-2000.

-The Hurricanes were one of two (Georgia Tech) unranked teams to defeat eventual national champion North Carolina last season. UM's 15-point victory over then-No. 9/6 UNC was the Tarheels' worst defeat of the season.

-Miami has given the eventual national champs their worst loss two of the past three seasons (UNC 2017, Duke 2015).

-Miami defeated three ranked teams last season, downing No. 9/6 North Carolina, No. 10/11 Duke in Coral Gables, and No. 18/19 Virginia on the road. This is the third-straight year and the fifth time in Coach L's six seasons that the Canes have defeated two top 15 teams.

-After receiving votes in at least one poll each of the first 16 weeks, Miami entered the national rankings for the first time in the 2016-17 season at No. 25 in both the AP and USA TODAY Coaches Poll on Feb. 27.

-Miami won its third-straight ACC-Big Ten Challenge matchup, defeating Rutgers in Coral Gables, Fla.

-Coach Jim Larrañaga has posted five 20-win seasons in six years at The U and the Canes have won seven or more ACC games each season under Coach L.

-Former Hurricane guard Senior Davon Reed was the recipient of the ACC's 2017 Skip Prosser Award, presented annually to the top scholar-athlete in ACC men's basketball. Reed graduated last May with a degree in sports administration and double minors in communications and marketing.

-Bruce Brown, who is majoring in sports administration, was named to the All-ACC Academic Team as a freshman.

-Brown recorded a triple-double with 11 points, 11 rebounds and 10 assists against South Carolina State on Dec. 6. It was the second triple-double in program history at Miami.

-Coach Larrañaga recorded his 600th career win on Jan. 14 at Pitt. With 600 wins, he is one of five ACC coaches with 600 victories, and the other four men are in the Basketball Hall of Fame.

-In Miami's 21st game of the season vs. Florida State on Feb. 1, Larrañaga coached his 1,000th career game.

-Miami's game against Georgia Tech was Coach L's 200th career game at UM.

-With a 78-67 win over Columbia on Dec. 28, 2016, the University of Miami men's basketball program earned its 1,000th program victory.

-In his 109th game at The U, Davon Reed scored 17 points against George Washington, solidifying his name in Miami's 1,000-point club.

-For two straight seasons, Miami has sold out its season ticket allotment for all home games at the Watsco Center.

-Jim Larrañaga and his staff signed three ESPN Top 100 players for the 2017 class in McDonald's All-American and Jordan Brand Classic All-American guard Lonnie Walker (No. 18) and Jordan Brand Classic Regional Team honorees guard Chris Lykes (46) and forward Deng Gak (92). New Zealander Sam Waardenburg also joins the class, and practiced with the team this spring.

SELLING OUT THE WATSCO CENTER

Miami SOLD OUT the season ticket allotment for all home games last year at the Watsco Center. This marked the second consecutive year the Hurricanes sold out their season ticket allotment.

For two straight years, fans have bought over 5,500 season tickets, more than doubling the total number of season tickets sold in Coach Jim Larrañaga's first season in Coral Gables. When Coach L began his reign in Miami, fans bought 2,251 season tickets for the 2011-12 campaign.

After a record-breaking season on the court in 2012-13, season tickets peaked at 3,674 for 2013-14, prior to this year's 5,750 mark.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

In six seasons under Coach L, Miami is 77-22 overall at home, 40-7 in non-conference play at home and 38-15 in ACC action at home. In both 2012-13 and 2015-16, the Canes had just one loss overall at the Watsco Center.

LARRAÑAGA WINS 600TH CAREER GAME

Coach Jim Larrañaga won his 600th career game at Pittsburgh on Jan. 14. In 33 seasons as a head coach, Larrañaga's 600 wins place him at 47th in all-time NCAA victories and 14th among active coaches (as of games through Jan. 12). Of those 14, five are in the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame, including four from the Atlantic Coast Conference. In his career, Coach L has won 27 games at American International, 170 at Bowling Green, 273 at George Mason and 139 at Miami. He is one of 15 coaches all-time with 100 or more wins at three D-I schools, four of whom are actively coaching.

LARRAÑAGA GRADUATES CANES

Kamari Murphy and Davon Reed both graduated from the University of Miami during their careers. Murphy graduated in May 2016 with B.A. in sociology and minor in communications while Reed earned his undergraduate degree in sports administration with a minor in marketing and

communications in May 2017.

MIAMI IN TOURNAMENT PLAY UNDER COACH L

Miami made at least seven shots from long range in 121 of Larrañaga's 208 games at UM. The Canes are 93-28 when making at least seven from 3-point range. Last season, Miami was 11-5 when hitting seven from deep. 2015-16: 17-3; 2014-15: 18-5; 2013-14: 9-6; 2012-13: 19-3; 2011-12: 19-6.

MIAMI EARNS 20TH REGULAR SEASON WIN AND 10TH ACC VICTORY

Coach Jim Larrañaga has posted five 20-win seasons in his first six years at The U, and 11 career 20-win seasons. This was Miami's eighth 20-win season since joining the ACC for the 2004-05 campaign. Larrañaga is just the second coach in Miami history with five 20-win seasons, joining Bruce Hale (1954-67).

Also in six seasons under Coach Jim Larrañaga, the Canes have won seven or more ACC games each season and have had 10 or more league victories in four years. Prior to the arrival of Coach L, Miami had never won 10 ACC games in a season.

MILESTONES FOR THE CANES

600 Victories - Coach Larrañaga recorded his 600th career win on Jan. 14 at Pitt. With 600 wins, he is one of five ACC coaches with 600 victories, and the other four men are in the Basketball Hall of Fame.

1,000 Games Overall, 200 at Miami - Coach Larrañaga opened the 2016-17 season just 21 shy of 1,000 career games coached. Miami's 21st game of the season was vs. Florida State on Feb. 1. Prior to Miami, he coached 53 games

at American International, 314 at Bowling Green and 437 at George Mason. Miami's game against Georgia Tech was Coach L's 200th career game at UM.

1,000 Program Wins - With a 78-67 win over Columbia on Dec. 28, 2016, the University of Miami men's basketball program earned its 1,000th program victory. Larrañaga has helped UM to both its 900th victory, a 73-58 win over Hawaii on Dec. 22, 2012, and the 1,000th win, over Columbia.

CANES NEED 70 POINTS

Last season Miami was 17-1 overall and 8-1 in ACC play when scoring 70+ points. UM scored fewer than 60 points in eight of its 12 losses.

PLAYING AS THE UNDERDOG

Miami is 11-24 under Coach Larrañaga when entering a game as the underdog against an AP top-25 ranked team. The Canes are 6-12 when the opponent is in the AP top 10.

LARRAÑAGA AND CAPUTO TOGETHER 15 YEARS

Last season head coach Jim Larrañaga and associate head coach Chris Caputo completed their 15th season on sidelines together, dating back to their time at George Mason University.

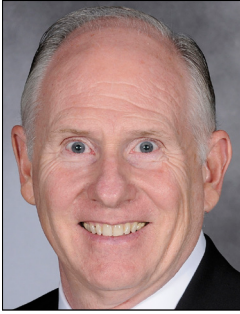
Caputo started on Coach L's staff as the video coordinator for the 2002-03 season, and along the way, the native of Elmhurst, N.Y., was an assistant coach and is now the associate head coach for the Hurricanes. Caputo helped the 2006 GMU team to the NCAA Final Four and has made five total NCAA Tournament appearances with Larrañaga. Both Caputo and Larrañaga attended Archbishop Molloy High School (N.Y.) and played for legendary head coach Jack Curran.

LARRAÑAGA CONTRACT EXTENDED THROUGH 2022

The University of Miami extended Coach Jim Larrañaga's contract through May 31, 2022, Director of Athletics Blake James announced in September 2014. Larrañaga first signed a five-year contract in April 2011, then was granted a three-year extension in 2012.

MIAMI BASKETBALL TEAMS MAKE SCHOOL HISTORY

The UM men's and women's basketball teams both landed in the NCAA Tournament for the second straight season, the first time both Miami basketball teams play in The Dance in consecutive years.

HEAD COACH | SEVENTH SEASON AT MIAMI, 139-69 | 34TH SEASON OVERALL, 609-403

In his six seasons at The U, Coach Jim Larrañaga has led the Hurricanes to a trio of NCAA Tournament appearances, including two trips to the Sweet 16, and won the 2013 ACC regular season and ACC Tournament titles. He has been named the AP, Naismith, USBWA and Henry Iba National Coach of the Year, twice and was both the ACC and USBWA District Coach of the Year. He was also named the 2013 NABC District Coach of the Year.

Larrañaga has posted three 25-win seasons at UM – the only Miami coach to do so – and five in his career. He also has recorded five 20-win campaigns at The U and 11 in his career. In conference action, the Canes have won nine or more league games in five of six seasons, while prior to the arrival of Coach L, Miami had never won more than eight ACC games in a season. Larrañaga has helped the Canes to 17 postseason victories, including four in the NCAA Tournament (three appearances), eight in the ACC Tournament (six) and five in the NIT (two).

Miami's 39 road wins in the past six seasons are the third-most among league teams, and in that time, the Canes are fourth in the conference in wins (64), ACC home victories (38) and ACC road victories (26). In the six years prior to Coach L's arrival, when the ACC had only 12 teams, Miami was tied for ninth in ACC victories (36), and won just 10 total ACC road games.

The 2016-17 campaign was filled with career milestones for Larrañaga. He recorded his 600th career victory, on Jan. 14 at Pitt, making him one of five ACC coaches with at least 600 wins. Larrañaga also coached his 1,000th career game, on Feb. 1 vs. Florida State. Miami's victory against Georgia Tech was Coach L's 200th career game at UM, and with a 78-67 win over Columbia on Dec. 28, 2016, the University of Miami men's basketball program earned its 1,000th program victory.

Larrañaga came to Miami after serving as the head coach at George Mason for 14 seasons. He guided that program to five NCAA Tournament appearances (2011, 2008, 2006, 2001, 1999) - including an unprecedented run to the 2006 Final Four that captured the nation's attention, defeating Michigan State, North Carolina, Wichita State and UConn along the way.

Following that run, he was selected the 2006 Clair Bee National Coach of the Year.

Larrañaga built the GMU Patriots' program into a perennial contender in the highly-regarded Colonial Athletic Association, winning more games than any other coach in program and conference history (273) en route to three conference titles (2008, 2001, 1999).

In 2006, Larrañaga became the first coach at a mid-major school to take his team to the Final Four in 27 years and earned an at-large berth for a CAA team for the first time in 20 years. Along the way, he led Mason to a school record in wins, the school's first-ever national ranking, George Mason's first-ever appearance in the Top 10 and the school's first wins over Top 10 teams.

The native of Bronx, N.Y., previously served as the head coach at Bowling Green for 11 seasons (1986-1997) and at Division II American International for two seasons (1977-79). His first coaching opportunity came at Davidson College, where he served as an assistant coach to Terry Holland then reunited with Holland as an assistant at Virginia from 1979-86. In 1976, he left Davidson and spent one season as player-coach for the Geronimo Basketball Club in Belgium.

A 1971 graduate of Providence College with a degree in economics, Larrañaga was a four-year letterman for the Friars. He graduated as the school's fifth all-time leading scorer with 1,258 points and was selected in the sixth round of the draft by the Detroit Pistons of the National Basketball Association. He was inducted into the Providence College Hall of Fame in 1991.

Larrañaga, 67, and his wife, Liz, have two sons, Jay and John, and four grandchildren, Tia, James, Jon Temple and Henry. Their son Jay played for his father at Bowling Green, was the head coach of the NBDL's Erie Bayhawks, and is now an assistant coach with the Boston Celtics. Jon was a member of his father's George Mason teams from 1999-2003, earning first team academic All-American honors for NCAA Division I-AAA schools.
