# FLORIDA STATE PLAY HOST TO MIAMI ON ESPN'S BIG MONDAY

Florida State, which has won six of its last seven home games against Miami, plays host to the Hurricanes on Monday, February 11, 2014 at 7:00 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles' game against the Hurricanes is their first ever appearance on ESPN's Big Monday package and its first of two consecutive weeks appearing on the Big Monday telecast. The Seminoles will play host to North Carolina on February 18 in their second consecutive and second ever Big Monday appearance next Monday in Tallahassee. Florida State's game against Miami is their second of the season with the Seminoles' taking a 63-53 win on January 15 in Coral Gables. The Seminoles most recently swept the regular season series against Miami during the 2011 season with wins in both Coral Gables (January 19, 2011; 55-53) and in Tallahassee (February 26, 2011; 65-59). Following Monday's game against Miami, the Seminoles travel to play at Wake Forest on Saturday, February 15, at 8:00 p.m.

# FLORIDA STATE IN ACC PLAY IN THE LAST SIX SEASONS

In the last six seasons (through February 9, 2014), Florida State is 57-37 (.606 winning percentage) and has finished in third place in the league standings three times in regular season ACC play. The Seminoles average 10.4 ACC regular season wins per season and have finished in the top four of the ACC standings four times in the last five seasons. Florida State is third in the ACC in conference wins with 57, third in winning percentage at .613 and tied for second (with North Carolina) with four top-four league standing finishes in the last five seasons.

# FLORIDA STATE FINDING THEIR WAY FROM THE FREE THROW LINE

Florida State enters Monday's game against Miami ranked sixth in the ACC with a .715 free throw shooting percentage. The Seminoles have shot better than 80 percent in each of their last three games and have made better than 80 percent of their free throws seven times in 23 games this season. Florida State ranked second in the ACC statistics during the 2012-13 season with a .735 team free throw shooting mark and has shot .700 or better from the line in six of the last eight seasons.

# SEMINOLES RANK AS ONE THE OF ACC'S TOP FREE THROW SHOOTING TEAMS

Florida State is the only team in the ACC with two players – Ian Miller (third, .870) and Aaron Thomas (sixth, .839) – ranked in the top 10 for individual free throw shooting percentages. The Seminoles enter Monday's game against Miami with three regulars (Miller, Thomas and sophomore Devon Bookert) all shooting better than 80 percent from the free throw line for the season.

# FLORIDA STATE CONTINUES TO SHOOT WELL FROM THE 3-POINT LINE

Florida State, which is shooting .500 from the 3-point line in the last two games, is the second best 3-point shooting team in the ACC. The Seminoles are ranked second in the ACC for all games (119 of 318, .374) and for ACC games only (66 of 157, .420). Florida State has realized one of the most dramatic improvements in its 3-point shooting percentage in league history as it has improved its shooting percentages from long range by more than 10 percentage points in ACC play. Florida State averages 6.0 3-point field goals made in ACC play this season after averaging 5.0 3-point shots made in 18 ACC games in 2012-13.

# FLORIDA STATE VS. MIAMI - THE LAST GAME

Florida State scored 13 consecutive points over the final four minutes to pull away from the Miami Hurricanes 63-53 on January 15, 2014 at BankUnited Center in Coral Gables. Miami missed six shots in a row during the decisive stretch and went 3 1/2 minutes without a point. The Seminoles made their final six shots, and also went 8 for 8 from the free-throw line down the stretch. Florida State won its third game in a row. The 14th and final lead change came when Okaro White's two free throws put Florida State ahead to stay, 52-51. Garrius Adams then blew a dunk for the Hurricanes, and that was their last chance to regain the lead. Ian Miller's 3-pointer made it 57-51, and he added two free throws in the final minute to help seal the win. Aaron Thomas led the Seminoles with 12 points. Devon Bookert and Boris Bojanovsky added 11 each. Bookert made three 3-pointers for the Seminoles, who went 7 for 15 from beyond the arc. Florida State went 14 for 17 from the free-throw line, while Miami went only 2 for 6. Miami missed 19 of 28 3-point tries. There were no fast-break points, reflecting the methodical pace with both teams playing stingy zones that forced a lot of long possessions and outside shots. Miami senior Donnavan Kirk shot 9 for 12 and scored a career-high 21 points. Rion Brown also had 21, but the rest of the team shot 1 for 15 from 3-point range. The Hurricanes missed 13 of their first 17 shots, and the Seminoles led for most of the opening half, building an advantage of 18-11.

# FLORIDA STATE LEADS THE ACC IN OVERALL BLOCKED SHOTS

Florida State, which blocked seven shots in its win over Virginia Tech on February 5 in Tallahassee, enters Monday's game as the overall leader in blocked shots in the ACC with 135 total blocked shots. The Seminoles have blocked 11 shots in the last two games (seven against Virginia Tech and four at Maryland) and are looking to lead the ACC in blocked shots per game for the fifth consecutive season. Florida State is currently ranked second behind Clemson with a 5.9 blocked shots per game average for the season.

The Seminoles have built the foundation of their program on a tradition of incredible defense and have held more than 94 percent of their opponents below 50 percent shooting from the field (149 of 158) in the last five seasons while ranking as the No. 1 team in the ACC in field goal shooting defense in three of the last five seasons.

# FLORIDA STATE GOES TO THE OFFENSIVE BOARDS AGAINST MARYLAND

Led by four offensive rebounds each by sophomores Aaron Thomas and Boris Bojanovsky, Florida State pulled down a season-high 20 offensive rebounds (six more than its previous two games) and outscored Maryland 20-12 on second-chance points. It was the most second chance points for the Seminoles since totaling 24 on 16 offensive rebounds against NC State.

# THOMAS FROM THE 3-POINT LINE

Sophomore Aaron Thomas is shooting .550 (11 of 20) from the 3-point line and averaging 16.5 points in his last four games. He made his career-high of six 3-point shots in Florida State's victory over Virginia Tech and followed that performance with a three of five shooting afternoon from long range against Maryland. Thomas has made nearly three times as many 3-point shots this season (25-9) as compared to last season and has made more 3-point shots in the last three games (10) than he did as a freshman in 34 games (nine).

# Seminoles' Brandon Plays Through Pain By Patrick Nohe

It was late on the evening of February 19th. Montay Brandon had his head ducked low in a visiting locker at NC State. Florida State had just lost 84-66 and Brandon was checking his phone to get his mind off going scoreless that night and the fact his team had now lost six of its last ten.

Then he saw the tweet. Josh Level was dead.

Brandon couldn't believe it. The two had kept up with one another all season -- but they hadn't spoken in two weeks. Now Montay was less than an hour and a half from where he'd grown up in Greensboro, NC -- where he'd know Josh since he was nine years old -- yet he couldn't have been further away.

"We had to come right back," said Brandon, who boarded a plane that night and headed back to Florida State with his teammates. "It was [a difficult flight], it really was."

Level died of Myocarditis, a viral infection -not unlike a cold -- that attacks the heart.

The 17 year-old was playing a high school game for New Gardens Friends School on the road in Winston-Salem when he collapsed during a timeout. He was taken to a hospital, but could not be resuscitated and was pronounced dead.

Montay was left grief-stricken, unable to even attend the funeral.

'I stayed here in Tallahassee, I talked to his parents and told them I'd have them in my prayers and everything," recalled Brandon. "I don't know if I'd have been able to handle it, it would have been pretty tough."

Josh had been two years younger than Montay, but -- whether or not Montay had ever told him -- Level's work ethic had been an inspiration to Brandon.

"Josh is somebody that worked really hard, he was one of the players that wasn't as good at first and he developed his game really hard," remembered Brandon.

"Me and him would be in the gym together like every day during the summers, so he became sort of like my little brother."

That continued into Brandon's freshman year. The two maintained regular correspondence, Josh following Montay at Florida State while Montay tried to keep up with Josh's high school games.

"He was a hard worker, tireless worker, played hard, competed in everything," said Brandon. "I mean he just wanted the same opportunity to play college ball."

He never got that opportunity.

But this season -- and for the rest of his career -- Brandon plans to honor him by wearing his number, 32.

It will be a constant reminder of Level's drive and determination.

"While I'm out there and I have that jersey on I won't take anything for granted," said Brandon. "I'll play hard the whole time, no plays off, just to represent him in that way and just show like -- his thing was hard work, you could do anything through hard work -- so I want to do that too as well."

- ...He earned one assist against Maryland to bring his season total to 27 a number which ties his career-best of 27 assists which came during his junior season;
- ...He is averaging 13.4 points per game in his last nine games. He has scored in double figures in seven of the last nine games including a 20-point performance against NC State (January 29);
- ...He has earned seven steals in his last six games with a season high three coming against Duke (January 25);
- ...He was a perfect nine of nine from the free throw line in Florida State's victory over Virginia Tech (February 5). He became only the seventh player in school history to finish perfect from the free throw line on at least nine shots in an ACC game.

# WHITE ONLY NINE FROM CENTURY MARK IN BLOCKED SHOTS

Senior Okaro White has blocked at least one shot in seven of the last 10 Seminole games and has blocked 24 shots (1.0 blocked shots per game) this season. He enters Monday's game against Miami ranked 13<sup>th</sup> in school history with his 91 career blocked shots and needs only nine blocked shots to become the 13<sup>th</sup> player in school history to block 100 or more career shots.

# Game 10 -- Florida State 106 Charlotte 62

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Florida State defeated Charlotte, 106-62, at the Donald L. Tucker Center. It was the first time that FSU had eclipsed the 100-points plateau in a single game since the program hung 108 on Campbell in 2005. Charlotte, a squad that won the Puerto Rico Tip-Off last month with a triumph over then-No. 13 Michigan, had no answer for the Seminoles' top-to-bottom total team effort -- especially Aaron Thomas' performance. Florida State's sophomore swing man registered a career-best 26 points on 10-of-14 shooting from the field and 3-of-5 shooting from 3-point range. Thomas also was effective on the defensive end, grabbing four of his seven total rebounds and notching a steal and a block. He also had two assists. For a Florida State team that shot 54 percent from the field and nearly 41 percent from long range, Thomas wasn't the only one to reach double figures on the stat sheet. Senior guard lan Miller was 6-of-11 from the field for 18 points while Robert Gilchrist and Boris Bojanovsky had 11 points each. Okaro White slid into the role of small forward and contributed a double-double wi0th 14 points and 11 rebounds. Montay Brandon also had 14 points. Florida State's bench scored 52 points while the entire 49ers team scored 62. Shawn Lester scored 16 of those points for Charlotte and Pierria Henry added 13 before being ejected in the second half. The Seminoles held Charlotte to 35 percent and out rebounded the visitors 45-33. The 49ers also had 19 turnovers that led to 30 FSU points. Florida State had just nine giveaways and had 22 assists compared to just nine by Charlotte.

But a 13-2 run by the 'Noles counteracted that slow start and the visitors eventually built a 16-point advantage in the second half and never led by less than nine points the rest of the night.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Ian Miller scored 20 as Florida State knocked down a season-high 16 three-point baskets en route to an 85-61 Atlantic Coast Conference victory against Maryland. Dez Wells led Maryland with 15 points while Nick Faust added 14. The Seminoles were 16 of 24 from behind the arc after hitting 10 in the previous four games combined. The 16 3-pointers were the third-most in school history and the most by Florida State in ACC play. Okaro White scored 15 and Aaron Thomas finished with 14. Montay Brandon added 13 points and eight rebounds. The Seminoles entered the game shooting 31.2 percent from three-point range and ranked No. 13 in the ACC. That team was nowhere to be found as Florida State hit 9-of-12 attempts in the first half. Devon Bookert struck first with the game's opening three points from the left wing. Then it became the White and Miller show during a 20-4 run where Florida State took a 37-19 lead.

Bookert ended a Maryland 7-0 run that left the Terrapins trailing 17-15 with a triple from the right bend. White scored the next five with a strong left-handed lay-up off a dribble-drive then knocked down a 3-pointer from the wing. Miller followed with a long-range bucket from the top of the key on the next possession and hit another 3-pointer from the wing for Florida State's next points. White, Miller and Thomas took turns for the next three before it was Miller's turn again. That was six consecutive three-point baskets for the Seminoles.

Devon Bookert and Boris Bojanovsky added 11 each. Bookert made three 3-pointers for the Seminoles, who went 7 for 15 from beyond the arc after sinking 16 3-pointers in Sunday's win over Maryland. Florida State went 14 for 17 from the free-throw line, while Miami went only 2 for 6. Miami missed 19 of 28 3-point tries. There were no fast-break points, reflecting the methodical pace with both teams playing stingy zones that forced a lot of long possessions and outside shots. Miami senior Donnavan Kirk shot 9 for 12 and scored a careerhigh 21 points. Rion Brown also had 21, but the rest of the team shot 1 for 15 from 3-point range. # Game 19 -- Duke 78, Florida State 56

DURHAM, N.C.- Rodney Hood scored 18 points to help Duke beat Florida State 78-56, giving Mike Krzyzewski his 900th victory in his 34th season at the school. Jabari Parker added 14 points for the Blue Devils who shot 31 percent but nearly doubled the Seminoles on the glass while scoring 29 points off both turnovers and offensive rebounds. Krzyzewski is the all-time leader in career victories in men's Division I with 973. He joins Syracuse's Jim Boeheim as the only coaches with at least 900 wins at one program. Duke used an 11-0 spurt late in the first half to build a 20-point lead on the Seminoles (13-6, 4-3), who didn't get the margin below double figures again. But Duke's shooting percentage and its 18 field goals were both season-lows. The Blue Devils had a 47-24 rebounding advantage, including 27-7 on the offensive glass. Parker finished with 14 rebounds, while Hood had nine. Okaro White scored 14 points for Florida State, which shot 50 percent but saw the rebounding and turnover troubles undermine that.

# Game 20 -- NC State 74 Florida State 70

RALEIGH, N.C.- T.J. Warren, the ACC's leading scorer, totaled 30 points and grabbed seven rebounds to lead North Carolina State over Florida State 74-70. The Wolfpack held on at the end after Warren fouled out with 1:36 remaining and his team holding a 72-68 lead. Florida State's Okaro White made two of four free throws but N.C. State got a tip in by Desmond Lee (11 points, and five of the Pack's final seven) with 12.1 seconds left to preserve its third straight win. White led Florida State with 20 points, Ian Miller added 17 and Aaron Thomas chipped in 12. The Seminoles shot 43 percent, 7 of 19 from beyond the arc. N.C. State led 39-33 at the break behind Warren's hot hand. He scored 15 of N.C. State's first 24 points and the Wolfpack led by as many as seven. Warren ended up with 20 points before intermission. The Wolfpack maintained their lead for the first 9 minutes of the second half, pushing it to as much as eight at 44-36 on a Lee drive, despite losing the services of 7-1 center Jordan Vandenberg, who picked up his third foul just 1:30 into the second half. Florida State started taking advantage of its size, driving the ball inside to White. However, it was a 3-pointer by Miller that gave Florida State its first lead, 56-54, with 10:27 remaining. Guard Tyler Lewis and forward Kyle Washington hit jumpers to put the Wolfpack up by two at 61-59. However, Warren picked up his fourth foul with 6:58 remaining and went to the bench with his team trailing 62-61. Vandenberg replaced Warren and buried two dunks, the second coming after Lee's three-point play, as N.C. State led 72-67 with 3:15 left. Florida State used its size advantage in the first half, especially with Vandenberg out with foul trouble and backup Beejay Anya sent to the sideline with an apparent right leg injury with 13:39 left in the half. White scored five points and helped the Seminoles pull into a 28-28 tie with about 4 minutes left in the half.

Will Johnston scored 12 points for Virginia Tech while Cadarian Raines added 13. The Hokies entered the game as the worst shooting team in the conference with a field goal percentage of 37.3 in conference play. They shot 34 percent in the loss. COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Seth Allen scored 21 of his careerhigh 32 points in the decisive first half, and Maryland beat Florida State 83-71. Playing in his 12th game of the season after being sidelined with a fractured left foot, Allen went 11 for 15 from the floor and 7 for 10 beyond the arc in topping his previous career best of 21 points. The 6-foot-1 sophomore guard also had four rebounds and two assists. Dez Wells scored 15 and Jake Layman added 12 for Maryland which avenged a 24-point defeat at Florida State last month.

# Thomas embraces key defensive role for FSU

Aaron Thomas already is showing flashes of what he could mean to Florida State's defense this season.

After just three games, the sophomore has a team-high 12 steals. But to understand the integral role the 6-foot-5, 195-pound guard plays in head coach Leonard Hamilton's trademark "Junkyard D" defensive system, you have to look beyond the stat sheet.

Thomas, much like former FSU star Michael Snaer, provides his team with instant energy on defense. Coming off the bench, it is his job to disturb the opposition's primary ball-handler — like Snaer did so well the last four seasons.

"He's like Mike Snaer, but a little bit better because he's quicker," said senior guard Ian Miller, who says the Seminoles' offense also is faster and more fun when Thomas is on the floor.

"He gives us a lot of opportunities to get steals, and just gives us a heart — a guy who sets the tone. As soon as he comes in the game he's clapping, he's up in them, and you have no choice but to respond and to do the same thing."

Senior forward Okaro White compares the lift Thomas gives FSU men's basketball (3-0) to what Snaer provided the Seminoles in 2012, leading the program to its first — and only — ACC championship.

"We all think he has that ability in him," White said. "He's kind of proving it out here."

When Hamilton recruited the Cincinnati native, he felt Thomas had a skill set that could make him an elite defender, in large part because of his lateral quickness.

"He told me he saw a lot of potential in me. Last year I was shying away from it a little bit," Thomas said. "But over the summer, I gained my confidence and now I'm trying to be that elite defensive player."

With new foul rules this season limiting physical play, including hand-checking, Thomas not only faces the challenge of being FSU's defensive leader, but adjusting the way he creates havoc.

"What he's doing is invaluable," Hamilton said. "Aaron's taken an awful lot of pride in wanting to become an elite defender. It's challenging him more because the way the game is being officiated now, so he has to be really careful."

In FSU's most recent victory against UT-Martin, the guard had a career-high six steals for the Seminoles.

"I think his instincts are really good," Skyhawks head coach Jason James said following FSU's 89-61 victory. "He was able to shoot some gaps, and when he was guarding the ball, his hands were very quick."

With Snaer, a member of the ACC All-Defensive team, exhausting his four years of eligibility, FSU has full confidence in Thomas' ability to maintain his contributions on the defensive end of the floor.

"Coach Ham told me at the beginning of the year, he was going to need me to step up and take that defensive role, which Mike Snaer did his last three, four years here," Thomas said. "I'm just trying to come in and do what I can do, and disrupt the offense and the point guards, so we can have more fast-break opportunities."

Thomas' commitment to defense is not only helping his team, but also serving to improve his play on the other end of the court. Against UT-Martin, he had a career-high 19 points.

"I think the fact that he's energized defensively is making him a little bit more aggressive offensively, and a little more relaxed," Hamilton said.

"I think he's taking the ball to the hole a lot better, his free-throw shooting has been very good, and he's improved his perimeter shooting. I'm very pleased with the progress he's making."
