FLORIDA STATE PLAY HOST TO MIAMI ON ESPN'S BIG MONDAY

Florida State, which has won six of its last seven home games against Miami, plays host to the Hurricanes on Monday, February 11, 2014 at 7:00 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles' game against the Hurricanes is their first ever appearance on ESPN's Big Monday package and its first of two consecutive weeks appearing on the Big Monday telecast. The Seminoles will play host to North Carolina on February 18 in their second consecutive and second ever Big Monday appearance next Monday in Tallahassee. Florida State's game against Miami is their second of the season with the Seminoles' taking a 63-53 win on January 15 in Coral Gables. The Seminoles most recently swept the regular season series against Miami during the 2011 season with wins in both Coral Gables (January 19, 2011; 55-53) and in Tallahassee (February 26, 2011; 65-59). Following Monday's game against Miami, the Seminoles travel to play at Wake Forest on Saturday, February 15, at 8:00 p.m.

SEMINOLES HONOR SERVICEMEN AND SERVICEWOMEN

The Florida State Seminoles Men's Basketball team will welcome nearly 400 servicemen and servicewomen to the Donald L Tucker Center on Military Night against the Miami Hurricanes. Amongst the members to be honored includes the FSU Student Veterans, National Guard, Reserves, FSU ROTC and their families.

THE UNBALANCED ACC SCHEDULE

Florida State plays host to Miami on Monday as it completes its two-game regular season series against the Hurricanes. At the end of their game against Miami, the Seminoles will have completed their ACC schedules against Clemson (two games), Maryland (two games), Miami (two games), Virginia (two games), Duke (one game), Notre Dame (one game), NC State (one game) and Virginia Tech. Beginning with Wake Forest on Saturday, the Seminoles will play the Deacons (one game), North Carolina (one game), Pittsburgh (one game), Georgia Tech (one game), Boston College (one game) and Syracuse (one game) all for the first time after finishing four two-game series and games against four other ACC teams.

AARON THOMAS AS A STARTER

Sophomore Aaron Thomas has earned starting assignments against Notre Dame (January 21) and in the Seminoles' last two games against Virginia Tech (February 5) and at Maryland (February 9). Thomas is averaging 20.3 points while shooting .733 (11 of 15) from the 3-point line and 1.000 (14 of 14) from the free throw line as a starter.

SEMINOLES' HAMILTON RANKED 11TH IN OVERALL WINS IN ACC HISTORY

Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton, who led the Seminoles to the 2012 ACC Championship, enters Saturday's game ranked 11th in ACC history in overall wins at Florida State. He is one of three current coaches (also Duke's Mike Krzyzewski and North Carolina's Roy Williams) to be ranked in the top 11 for all-time wins as ACC coaches.

WHITE APPROACHING SPECTACULAR TRIPLE DOUBLE

Senior Okaro White needs only nine blocked shots to become the third player in school history with 1,200 career points (he has 1,212), 600 rebounds (he has 618) and 100 blocked shots (he needs nine for 100). Only Douglas Edwards and Randy Allen have attained those numbers.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Miami and gain a regular season sweep of the Hurricanes as ACC opponents for the third time in the last five seasons and for the fifth time in the last eight seasons. The Hurricanes joined the ACC for the 2004-05 season;

...Defeat Miami and win its seventh home game in the last eight meetings against Miami. The Seminoles won six consecutive home games from 2007-2012 and lead the all-time series in Tallahassee by a 27-6 margin.

FLORIDA STATE'S WIN TOTAL IN THE LAST NINE YEARS

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last nine years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played with 188 wins. The Seminoles average 21.8 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12), 18-16 (2012-13) and 14-9 (2013-14).

FLORIDA STATE IN ACC PLAY IN THE LAST SIX SEASONS

In the last six seasons (through February 9, 2014), Florida State is 57-37 (.606 winning percentage) and has finished in third place in the league standings three times in regular season ACC play. The Seminoles average 10.4 ACC regular season wins per season and have finished in the top four of the ACC standings four times in the last five seasons. Florida State is third in the ACC in conference wins with 57, third in winning percentage at .613 and tied for second (with North Carolina) with four top-four league standing finishes in the last five seasons.

FLORIDA STATE FINDING THEIR WAY FROM THE FREE THROW LINE

Florida State enters Monday's game against Miami ranked sixth in the ACC with a .715 free throw shooting percentage. The Seminoles have shot better than 80 percent in each of their last three games and have made better than 80 percent of their free throws seven times in 23 games this season. Florida State ranked second in the ACC statistics during the 2012-13 season with a .735 team free throw shooting mark and has shot .700 or better from the line in six of the last eight seasons.

SEMINOLES RANK AS ONE THE OF ACC'S TOP FREE THROW SHOOTING TEAMS

Florida State is the only team in the ACC with two players – Ian Miller (third, .870) and Aaron Thomas (sixth, .839) – ranked in the top 10 for individual free throw shooting percentages. The Seminoles enter Monday's game against Miami with three regulars (Miller, Thomas and sophomore Devon Bookert) all shooting better than 80 percent from the free throw line for the season.

FLORIDA STATE CONTINUES TO SHOOT WELL FROM THE 3-POINT LINE

Florida State, which is shooting .500 from the 3-point line in the last two games, is the second best 3-point shooting team in the ACC. The Seminoles are ranked second in the ACC for all games (119 of 318, .374) and for ACC games only (66 of 157, .420). Florida State has realized one of the most dramatic improvements in its 3-point shooting percentage in league history as it has improved its shooting percentages from long range by more than 10 percentage points in ACC play. Florida State averages 6.0 3-point field goals made in ACC play this season after averaging 5.0 3-point shots made in 18 ACC games in 2012-13.

FLORIDA STATE VS. MIAMI – THE LAST GAME

Florida State scored 13 consecutive points over the final four minutes to pull away from the Miami Hurricanes 63-53 on January 15, 2014 at BankUnited Center in Coral Gables. Miami missed six shots in a row during the decisive stretch and went 3 1/2 minutes without a point. The Seminoles made their final six shots, and also went 8 for 8 from the free-throw line down the stretch. Florida State won its third game in a row. The 14th and final lead change came when Okaro White's two free throws put Florida State ahead to stay, 52-51. Garrius Adams then blew a dunk for the Hurricanes, and that was their last chance to regain the lead. Ian Miller's 3-pointer made it 57-51, and he added two free throws in the final minute to help seal the win. Aaron Thomas led the Seminoles with 12 points. Devon Bookert and Boris Bojanovsky added 11 each. Bookert made three 3-pointers for the Seminoles, who went 7 for 15 from beyond the arc. Florida State went 14 for 17 from the free-throw line, while Miami went only 2 for 6. Miami missed 19 of 28 3-point tries. There were no fast-break points, reflecting the methodical pace with both teams playing stingy zones that forced a lot of long possessions and outside shots. Miami senior Donnavan Kirk shot 9 for 12 and scored a career-high 21 points. Rion Brown also had 21, but the rest of the team shot 1 for 15 from 3-point range. The Hurricanes missed 13 of their first 17 shots, and the Seminoles led for most of the opening half, building an advantage of 18-11.

FLORIDA STATE LEADS THE ACC IN OVERALL BLOCKED SHOTS

Florida State, which blocked seven shots in its win over Virginia Tech on February 5 in Tallahassee, enters Monday's game as the overall leader in blocked shots in the ACC with 135 total blocked shots. The Seminoles have blocked 11 shots in the last two games (seven against Virginia Tech and four at Maryland) and are looking to lead the ACC in blocked shots per game for the fifth consecutive season. Florida State is currently ranked second behind Clemson with a 5.9 blocked shots per game average for the season.

FLORIDA STATE'S STEALS

Florida State earned seven steals against Maryland and has at least seven steals in nine different games this season.

.714 Senior Robert Gilchrist has made five of his last seven free throws in the last three games and is shooting .714 from the free throw line since a perfect two of two performance from the line against Clemson (February 1).

.867 Sophomore Devon Bookert is shooting .867 (13 of 15) from the free throw line in his last three games and has made eight consecutive free throws entering Monday's game against Miami.

2 Two Seminoles – Montay Brandon and Robert Gilchrist – have stared each of the Seminoles' first 23 games of the 2013-14 season.

3 Sophomore Aaron Thomas earned three steals against Maryland on February 8. He is ranked sixth in the ACC with 36 steals and a 1.5 steals per game average.

6 Sophomore Boris Bojanovsky has blocked 43 shots this season – tied for the sixth highest single season total by a sophomore in school history.

7 Senior Okaro White has seven steals in his last six games and earned his season high of three steals against Duke.

10 Aaron Thomas has made 10 consecutive free throws and is shooting a career-high .839 from the free throw line entering Monday's game against Miami.

11 Florida State is 11-2 when it leads at halftime this season.

12 Freshman Marquez White totaled 12 tackles (eight unassisted and four assisted) in helping the Seminoles' football team win the 2013 National Championship. He totaled a career-high four tackles (all unassisted) in Florida State's victory over NC State.

14 Florida State is undefeated, 14-0, when it outscores its opponent.

16 Florida State made 16 3-point field goals in its 85-61 win over Maryland on January 12. The 16 shots made from the bonusphere rank as the most made by the Seminoles in an ACC game and the most made by one ACC team against another ACC team in league history.

18 Aaron Thomas leads Florida State with 18 double figure scoring games and a career-high 13.2 points per game scoring average.

25 Senior Okaro White enters Monday's game against Miami with 1,204 points – he is one of only 25 players in school history to score 1,200 or more career points.

55 Sophomore Aaron Thomas has 58 career steals in 57 career games for a 1.1 steals per game average for his career.

91-92 Senior Okaro White has 91 career blocked shots and 92 career steals. He is looking to become only the fourth player in school history with 100 career blocked shots and 100 career steals.

FLORIDA STATE'S FIELD GOAL PERCENTAGE DEFENSE

Florida State enters Monday's game against Miami ranked third in the ACC in field goal percentage defense, having held 22 of its 23 opponents under 50 percent shooting from the field. The Seminoles have built the foundation of their program on a tradition of incredible defense and have held more than 94 percent of their opponents below 50 percent shooting from the field (149 of 158) in the last five seasons while ranking as the No. 1 team in the ACC in field goal shooting defense in three of the last five seasons.

FLORIDA STATE GOES TO THE OFFENSIVE BOARDS AGAINST MARYLAND

Led by four offensive rebounds each by sophomores Aaron Thomas and Boris Bojanovsky, Florida State pulled down a season-high 20 offensive rebounds (six more than its previous two games) and outscored Maryland 20-12 on second-chance points. It was the most second chance points for the Seminoles since totaling 24 on 16 offensive rebounds against NC State.

THOMAS FROM THE 3-POINT LINE

Sophomore Aaron Thomas is shooting .550 (11 of 20) from the 3-point line and averaging 16.5 points in his last four games. He made his career-high of six 3-point shots in Florida State's victory over Virginia Tech and followed that performance with a three of five shooting afternoon from long range against Maryland. Thomas has made nearly three times as many 3-point shots this season (25-9) as compared to last season and has made more 3-point shots in the last three games (10) than he did as a freshman in 34 games (nine).

AARON THOMAS IN HIS LAST FOUR GAMES...

...Is averaging 16.5 points scored per game while shooting .550 from the 3-point line (11 of 20), .400 from the field (20 of 50) and .938 from the free throw line (15 of 16). He scored his ACC career-high of 24 points in Florida State's victory over Virginia Tech on February 5 in Tallahassee.

BOOKERT OFF THE BENCH IN THE LAST TWO GAMES

Sophomore Devon Bookert is averaging 10.5 points (21 total points), shooting .385 from the 3-point line (three of eight) and is shooting a perfect 1.000 from the free throw line (four of four) as a starter in the last two games. He averages 8.3 points as a starter as he was in the starting line-up during the first 21 games of the season as Florida State's starting point guard.

BOOKERT SIZZLING FROM THE 3-POINT LINE

Sophomore Devon Bookert is shooting .571 (16 of 28) from the 3-point line in the last nine games with multiple 3-point shots made in five of those nine games. He has made at least one 3-point field goal in eight of those nine games and made three each against Maryland (January 12), at Miami (January 15) and at Virginia (January 18).

BOOKERT STEALING

Sophomore Devon Bookert enters Monday's game against Miami with a career-high 27 steals and a career-high 1.2 steals per game average. He has at least one steal in each of the last five games and has moved into second place among his Seminoles teammates with his single-season career-high 27 steals. Bookert has six steals in his last five games including two at NC State. He ranked sixth on the team with 19 steals as a freshman in 2013-14.

BOOKERT IS TIED FOR FIRST IN SCHOOL HISTORY

Sophomore Devon Bookert is tied for first in school history with a .457 (58 of 127) career mark from the 3-point line. He is looking to become just one of six players in school history to shoot 40 percent or better from beyond the arc

BOOKERT'S SCORING IN THE LAST 10 GAMES

Sophomore Devon Bookert has scored in double figures in seven of the last 10 games and is averaging 9.7 points scored per game since totaling 10 against Clemson on January 9. More than half of his 97 points (49) have come from the bonusphere during that span of 10 games.

Seminoles' Brandon Plays Through Pain By Patrick Nohe

It was late on the evening of February 19th. Montay Brandon had his head ducked low in a visiting locker at NC State. Florida State had just lost 84-66 and Brandon was checking his phone to get his mind off going scoreless that night and the fact his team had now lost six of its last ten.

Then he saw the tweet. Josh Level was dead.

Brandon couldn't believe it. The two had kept up with one another all season -- but they hadn't spoken in two weeks. Now Montay was less than an hour and a half from where he'd grown up in Greensboro, NC -- where he'd know Josh since he was nine years old -- yet he couldn't have been further away.

"We had to come right back," said Brandon, who boarded a plane that night and headed back to Florida State with his teammates. "It was [a difficult flight], it really was."

Level died of Myocarditis, a viral infection -- not unlike a cold -- that attacks the heart.

The 17 year-old was playing a high school game for New Gardens Friends School on the road in Winston-Salem when he collapsed during a timeout. He was taken to a hospital, but could not be resuscitated and was pronounced dead.

Montay was left grief-stricken, unable to even attend the funeral.

"I stayed here in Tallahassee, I talked to his parents and told them I'd have them in my prayers and everything," recalled Brandon. "I don't know if I'd have been able to handle it, it would have been pretty tough."

Josh had been two years younger than Montay, but -- whether or not Montay had ever told him -- Level's work ethic had been an inspiration to Brandon.

"Josh is somebody that worked really hard, he was one of the players that wasn't as good at first and he developed his game really hard," remembered Brandon.

"Me and him would be in the gym together like every day during the summers, so he became sort of like my little brother."

That continued into Brandon's freshman year. The two maintained regular correspondence, Josh following Montay at Florida State while Montay tried to keep up with Josh's high school games.

"He was a hard worker, tireless worker, played hard, competed in everything," said Brandon. "I mean he just wanted the same opportunity to play college ball."

He never got that opportunity.

But this season -- and for the rest of his career -- Brandon plans to honor him by wearing his number, 32.

It will be a constant reminder of Level's drive and determination.

"While I'm out there and I have that jersey on I won't take anything for granted," said Brandon. "I'll play hard the whole time, no plays off, just to represent him in that way and just show like -- his thing was hard work, you could do anything through hard work -- so I want to do that too as well."

OKARO WHITE RECENTLY BY THE NUMBERS...

...He earned one assist against Maryland to bring his season total to 27 -- a number which ties his career-best of 27 assists which came during his junior season;

...He is averaging 13.4 points per game in his last nine games. He has scored in double figures in seven of the last nine games including a 20-point performance against NC State (January 29);

...He has earned seven steals in his last six games with a season high three coming against Duke (January 25);

...He was a perfect nine of nine from the free throw line in Florida State's victory over Virginia Tech (February 5). He became only the seventh player in school history to finish perfect from the free throw line on at least nine shots in an ACC game.

WHITE ONLY NINE FROM CENTURY MARK IN BLOCKED SHOTS

Senior Okaro White has blocked at least one shot in seven of the last 10 Seminole games and has blocked 24 shots (1.0 blocked shots per game) this season. He enters Monday's game against Miami ranked 13th in school history with his 91 career blocked shots and needs only nine blocked shots to become the 13th player in school history to block 100 or more career shots.

BOJANOVSKY'S DEFENSIVE IMPROVEMENT

Sophomore Boris Bojanovsky enters Monday's game against Miami ranked first on the team (and fifth in the ACC) in blocked shots with 43 and a 1.9 blocked shots per game average, with a career-high 78 rebounds and a 3.4 rebounds per game average and with a single season career-high 11 steals.

BOJANOVSKY FROM THE FREE THROW LINE

Sophomore Boris Bojanovsky has made 10 of his last 13 free throws (.769) including four made free throws in each of the last two games. He has already made and attempted more free throws in the first 23 games of the 2013-14 season (35 of 52) than he did in 33 games as a freshman (25 of 33).

BRANDON IN DOUBLE FIGURES FOR THE NINTH TIME THIS SEASON

Sophomore Montay Brandon scored 11 points against Maryland on Saturday and has now scored in double figures in 9 different games this season. He scored in double figures a total of three times as a freshman.

NOTES ON MONTAY BRANDON...

...He has been Florida State's starter at the point guard position in the Seminoles' last two games against Virginia Tech and Maryland. He has now started 45 career games (22 in 2012-13 and 23 in 2013-14) with 24 starts coming at the point guard position and 21 coming at the two-guard position;

...He has made nine 3-point field goals this season in 23 games -- he made nine 3-point field goals in 33 games as a freshman last season;

...He is ranked second on the team in rebounds (115, career-high 5.0 rpg) from a guard spot. He pulled down 11 rebounds in Florida State's victory over then No. 10/10 VCU in the first round of the 2013 Puerto Rico Tip-Off;

...He is ranked fourth on the team in scoring with 197 points and a career-high 8.6 points per game scoring average. He has scored in double figures in eight different games this season and has more than doubled his scoring average this season as compared to his freshman season.

BRANDON ENJOYS BEST GAME FROM FREE THROW LINE

Sophomore Montay Brandon was a perfect seven of seven from the free throw line against Maryland -- the second time in his career that he has been perfect on at least five free throws in a single game. He was a perfect five of five from the free throw line in his career debut against South Alabama on November 9, 2012. Brandon's seven free throws made against Maryland tied his career high -- he also totaled seven in the first game of the 2013-14 season (seven of nine) to help the Seminoles top Jacksonville. Brandon has shot .857 (12 of 14) from the free throw line in the two season openers in which he has played as a Seminole.

MILLER AMONG FLORIDA STATE'S ALL-TIME LEADING 3-POINT SHOOTERS

Senior Ian Miller enters Monday's game against Miami ranked 13th in school history with 116 career 3-point field goals made and 12th in school history with 344 career 3-point field goals attempted.

OJO IN THE STARTING LINE-UP

Sophomore Michael Ojo has been in Florida State's starting line-up in each of the last two games, against Virginia Tech and Maryland. He has totaled 10 points and two blocked shots while shooting .625 from the field (five of eight). He is also averaging 16.0 minutes played in both of those games with a career-high tying 19 minutes coming in the Seminoles' victory over Virginia Tech (February 5).

OJO ON THE BLOCKS

Sophomore Michael Ojo has blocked a single season career-high 24 shots this season with eight coming in Florida State's first 11 ACC games of the season. He blocked two shots against Virginia and has at least one blocked shot in seven of the Seminoles' 11 ACC games.

Thomas embraces key defensive role for FSU

Sophomore guard picking up where Snaer left off

Aaron Thomas already is showing flashes of what he could mean to Florida State's defense this season.

After just three games, the sophomore has a team-high 12 steals. But to understand the integral role the 6-foot-5, 195-pound guard plays in head coach Leonard Hamilton's trademark "Junkyard D" defensive system, you have to look beyond the stat sheet.

Thomas, much like former FSU star Michael Snaer, provides his team with instant energy on defense. Coming off the bench, it is his job to disturb the opposition's primary ball-handler — like Snaer did so well the last four seasons.

"He's like Mike Snaer, but a little bit better because he's quicker," said senior guard Ian Miller, who says the Seminoles' offense also is faster and more fun when Thomas is on the floor.

"He gives us a lot of opportunities to get steals, and just gives us a heart — a guy who sets the tone. As soon as he comes in the game he's clapping, he's up in them, and you have no choice but to respond and to do the same thing."

Senior forward Okaro White compares the lift Thomas gives FSU men's basketball (3-0) to what Snaer provided the Seminoles in 2012, leading the program to its first — and only — ACC championship.

"We all think he has that ability in him," White said. "He's kind of proving it out here."

When Hamilton recruited the Cincinnati native, he felt Thomas had a skill set that could make him an elite defender, in large part because of his lateral quickness.

"He told me he saw a lot of potential in me. Last year I was shying away from it a little bit," Thomas said. "But over the summer, I gained my confidence and now I'm trying to be that elite defensive player."

With new foul rules this season limiting physical play, including hand-checking, Thomas not only faces the challenge of being FSU's defensive leader, but adjusting the way he creates havoc.

"What he's doing is invaluable," Hamilton said. "Aaron's taken an awful lot of pride in wanting to become an elite defender. It's challenging him more because the way the game is being officiated now, so he has to be really careful."

In FSU's most recent victory against UT-Martin, the guard had a career-high six steals for the Seminoles.

“I think his instincts are really good,” Skyhawks head coach Jason James said following FSU’s 89-61 victory. “He was able to shoot some gaps, and when he was guarding the ball, his hands were very quick.”

With Snaer, a member of the ACC All-Defensive team, exhausting his four years of eligibility, FSU has full confidence in Thomas’ ability to maintain his contributions on the defensive end of the floor.

“Coach Ham told me at the beginning of the year, he was going to need me to step up and take that defensive role, which Mike Snaer did his last three, four years here,” Thomas said. “I’m just trying to come in and do what I can do, and disrupt the offense and the point guards, so we can have more fast-break opportunities.”

Thomas’ commitment to defense is not only helping his team, but also serving to improve his play on the other end of the court. Against UT-Martin, he had a career-high 19 points.

“I think the fact that he’s energized defensively is making him a little bit more aggressive offensively, and a little more relaxed,” Hamilton said.

“I think he’s taking the ball to the hole a lot better, his free-throw shooting has been very good, and he’s improved his perimeter shooting. I’m very pleased with the progress he’s making.”
