STORYLINES

- ▶ UMass returns home to the Mullins Center this weekend where it will play host to Miami (Fla.) on Saturday at 2 p.m. The game will be the first at home since the season-opening win over Harvard 17 days prior.
- ▶ The game will be televised nationally on the CBS Sports Network. Dave Ryan and Pete Gillen have the call, with Scott Brandwein producing. CBS SN is available in the Springfield/Amherst cable market on the following channels: Comcast/Xfinity 261/856 HD, DirecTV 613, DISH 158.
- ▶ UMass is averaging 4.8 blocks per game (t-64th in NCAA) and 9.2 steals per game (50th in NCAA).
- ▶ The Minutemen have won three games decided by five points or less - and all decided in the final four seconds. Since 2007, UMass has won 28 games by similar margins.
- ▶ All three UMass victories this season have been buzzer-beaters. Sampson Carter hit a 3-pointer in the corner with 1.2 seconds left to beat Harvard 67-64 in the ESPN Tip-Off Marathon game in Amherst on Nov. 13, and just two days later, Terrell Vinson tipped-back a Chaz Williams attempt as time expired for a 77-75 win over Providence. On Wednesday, it was Chaz Williams' running layup with 3.3 seconds left that put UMass up for good.
- ▶ This is the 104th season of UMass Basketball. UMass entered the year with an all-time record of 1,186-1,059 (.537) in 2,245 games. UMass is 439-301 (.593) in conference games, including a 275-281 in Atlantic 10 play. The Minutemen have claimed 15 regular-season conference champ. and five tournament titles.

- ▶ Miami leads the series 3-0, which includes last year's 83-75 game in Coral Gables.
- ▶ The Hurricanes won the last game in Amherst, 72-71, on Jan.

Top Tidbits

- UMass and Miami (Fla.) are meeting for the fourth time with the Hurricanes having won all three previous meetings, including the only game in Amherst in 2007.
- Junior G Chaz Williams eclipsed the 1,000-point plateau in Wednesday's win at Siena. He now has 1,014 over 74 combined games at Hofstra and UMass. He scored 325 as a freshman at Hofstra and has 689 at UMass.
- UMass ranks 35th in the nation with 75.5 possessions per game, a year removed from ranking second with 76.6 poss./gm.
- A week after playing three games 1,675 miles from campus at the Puerto Rico Tip-Off in Bayamon, P.R., UMass' next three games off campus (sandwiched around a home game vs. Miami (Fla.) this Saturday) will be three of its shortest trips: 100 miles at Siena, 95 miles at Northeastern and 27 miles to the MassMutual Center in Springfield for the 2012 Hall of Fame Holiday Classic against Elon.
- UMass was picked fifth in the preseason A-10 poll & received two 1st place votes, a year after finishing in a tie for fifth at 9-7.

12, 2007. UMass trailed by as many as eight in the second half before closing to within two on a James Life bucket with 1:21 to play. The Canes hit two-of-four free throws down the stretch and held UMass scoreless until Gary Forbes hit a three as time expired.

- Miami made 13 3-pointers to defeat UMass 80-53 in the first meeting on Dec. 12, 2004 at the Convocation Center. The Hurricanes went into halftime up 37-22 and opened the second half with an 18-2 run.
- UMass is 37-45 all-time against current members of the Atlantic Coast Conference (with 45 against Boston College). Derek Kellogg-coached teams are 1-6 against ACC teams (1-3 vs. BC) since the UMass grad returned to his alma mater prior to the 2008-09 season. Last season, UMass won at BC, 82-46, before falling to then-No. 22 Florida State, 73-53, in the Battle 4 Atlantis and at Miami (Fla.), 83-75. UMass fell to then-No. 6 NC State two weeks ago in the semifinals of the Puerto Rico Tip-Off.

KELLOGG THANKFUL TO LARRANAGA FOR COACHING BREAKTHROUGH

- UMass' Derek Kellogg and Miami's Jim Larranaga have a unique relationship, which goes back to Kellogg's first coaching job out of college. Following a season with the Springfield Skyhawks of the USBL and a year as a graduate assistant at UMass, Kellogg's first full-time coaching position came as an assistant to Larranaga at George Mason for two seasons from 1997-99.

WILLIAMS JOINS 1,000-POINT CLUB

- Junior G Chaz Williams entered Wednesday's game at Siena needing just nine points to reach 1,000 in his time at UMass and Hofstra. He finished with 23 and none bigger than the game-winning layup with 3.3 seconds left that propelled the Minutemen to their third buzzer-beating victory of the season.
- He is the 43rd player to reach the 1,000-point mark while at UMass and the first since Anthony Gurley two seasons ago (Gurley also reached the milestone over two schools, scoring 199 of his 1,530 career as a freshman at Wake Forest in 2006-07).
- He has averaged 16.7 ppg at UMass and 13.7 for his career. If he maintains his current season clip of 16.2 ppg, he would reach 1,000 points solely as a Minuteman in 23 games (at Xavier on March 2).
- Along those same lines, senior F Terrell Vinson has scored 924 points in 103 career games.

MORGAN, WILLIAMS APPEAR IN INITIAL NCAA STATS REPORT OF 2012-13 SEASON

- Junior G Jesse Morgan's 3.5 3-point field goals per game are tied for 10th nationally and second in the Atlantic 10 behind Butler's Rotnei Clarke (4th with 4.0 3FG/gm).
- Junior G Chaz Williams is dishing out 7.3 assists per contest - a figure that places him tied for eighth in the NCAA and first in the A-10. His 6.2 apg last year were 13th in the nation.

UMASS PRESSURE CAUSING PROBLEMS FOR OPPONENTS

- UMass is averaging 9.2 steals per game through five contests, a figure which isn't high among the national leaders (t-50th), but a deeper examination shows some positive results from what they are getting.
- The Minutemen are forcing their opponents into 15.6 turnovers per game while converting those into 10.2 ppg. Additionally, UMass has forced 16 TOs with its press and four shot clock violations through five games.

MINUTEMEN AT A FREE THROW DISADVANTAGE

- One area of concern for the UMass coaching staff following its first five games has been the opposing team's ability to get to the free throw line at a 2-to-1 ratio over the Minutemen.
- UMass has been outshot by at least seven freebies in all five games. The Maroon & White have closed the margin slightly with a better FT pct., but are still being outscored by an average of 18-10 at the charity stripe.
- UMass' opponents have been in the bonus by the midway point of three of the 10 halves thus far. Conversely, the earliest the Minutemen have secured the bonus at any point was with 8:31 to play in the second half against Tennessee, and neither half at Siena on Wednesday.

UMASS SAAC CONDUCTING TOY DRIVE AT UPCOMING BASKETBALL AND HOCKEY GAMES

- ▶ The University of Massachusetts Student-Athlete Advisory Committee is once again conducting a toy drive at upcoming hockey and basketball games to benefit Shriners Hospital for Children in Springfield.
- ▶ The SAAC will be accepting new, unwrapped toys for children through age 18 inside the entrances of the Mullins Center at the December 1 men's basketball game, and at the November 30, December 7, and December 8 hockey games.
- ▶ Those donating are asked to avoid toys made of latex and foam for allergy purposes. Some of the children seem to favor interactive toys, particularly ones that light up or make sounds.

FOUR STARTERS, 9 LETTERMEN BACK FROM 25-WIN SQUAD

- ▶ UMass welcomes back four starters, including its top four scorers and nine of its top 10 rebounders from last season's team that went 25-12 and reached the NIT Final Four. Led by All-America candidate Chaz Williams at the point guard spot, the Minutemen will look to continue their up-tempo offensive style and full-court pressure defense in head coach Derek Kellogg's (64-65) fifth year at his alma mater.
- ▶ UMass returns the following percentages in 2012-13: Scoring 89.3 pct.; Rebounding 83.2 pct.; Assists 94.7 pct.; Steals 91.7 pct.; Blocks 76.7 pct.; Minutes 85.4 pct.
- ▶ Williams (16.9 ppg, 6.2 apg, 4.4 rpg), a first team NABC all-district and all-conference selection, was one of just three players in Division I last year to average at least 16.0 points, 6.0 assists and 4.0 rebounds per game. The others were Tim Frazier of Penn State and Nate Wolters of South Dakota State.
- ▶ UMass recorded a school-record 326 steals last season (8.8 spg, 7th in NCAA) which aided in its 76.6 possessions per game, ranking the Minutemen second nationally behind Seattle's 77.2.

UMASS TO RETIRE MARCUS CAMBY'S NO. 21 JERSEY

- ▶ The Massachusetts athletic department announced Tuesday that it will retire the jersey of 1996 Naismith National Player of the Year Marcus Camby on Jan. 19, 2013 when the Minutemen host George Washington at the Mullins Center.
- ▶ One of the most decorated athletes UMass has ever produced, Camby lettered from 1993-96 and led the Minutemen to the 1996 NCAA Final Four and a 35-2 record, the most successful season in program history. He was named a consensus first-team All-American that season as he averaged 20.5 points to lead the Atlantic 10. In his three seasons at UMass, he was a two-time NABC All-District selection, an Atlantic 10 First-Team pick twice and the league's Freshman of the Year in 1994.
- ▶ He left UMass as the school's all-time leader in blocked shots in a career (336) and single-season (128). Camby scored 1,387 points in his career to rank in the top 10 after his final season for the Maroon & White.
- ▶ This will be the fifth men's basketball jersey retired at UMass and ninth in school history. Previous hoops numbers to be hung at the South end of the Mullins Center include George "Trigger" Burke (#32), Julius Erving (#32), Lou Roe (#15) and Al Skinner (#30). Additionally, Dick Bergquist in baseball (#26), Danielle Henderson in softball (#44), Greg Minton in water polo (#6) and Eric Sopracasa (#43) in men's lacrosse have had their jerseys retired in their respective sports.


UMASS SELECTED FIFTH IN A-10 PRESEASON POLL

- ▶ UMass was selected fifth in the preseason Atlantic 10 Poll in a vote by media and coaches. Saint Joseph's was picked to win the league followed by Saint Louis, VCU, Temple and UMass. The Hawks had 11 first place votes, while the Billikens had 10 votes. Temple, UMass and Butler all had two first place votes in the poll.
- ▶ Junior Chaz Williams was named to the preseason First Team. Williams had a banner campaign in 2011-12 in leading UMass to the NIT Semifinals. The Brooklyn native was named to the All-Atlantic 10 First Team, the A-10 All-Championship Team and the NABC All-District 4 First Team.
- ▶ Among national publications, Athlon picked the Minutemen to finish fourth and make a return trip to the NIT. They also tabbed Chaz Williams as the Preseason Player of the Year and one of the top 10 Floor Leaders in the nation. Lindy's had UMass seventh but listed it as a team folks may want as an A-10 sleeper team. Williams was bestowed the honor of being the Most Entertaining player in the league.

UMASS AMONG TOP 3-POINT SHOOTING TEAMS IN 2011-12

- ▶ UMass averaged 8.1 3-point field goals per game a year ago, which ranked first in the Atlantic 10 and 31st nationally. The Minutemen made 288 triples to rank second all-time in school history.

This Date In UMass History December 1: 6-3 record

1954: The Redmen score 88 points to (at the time) top the school-record for a single game, a record set in the last game of the '53-54 season. Massachusetts goes on to beat Vermont, 88-78.

1970: UMass opens up the 1970-71 season with a 98-63 win over St. Anselm's behind 32 points and 23 rebounds from Julius Erving.

1971: The post-Julius Erving era beings as Al Skinner leads the Redmen in scoring (16 points) and rebounds (13) as UMass crushes St. Anselm's, 101-53.

1998: UMass' second all-time leading scorer Monty Mack sets a career-high with 34 points in a 77-75 loss vs. the College of Charleston.

- UMass was one of just four schools in Division I with four players who made at least 50 treys. The others were Florida, Iowa State and Youngstown State.

MULLINS CENTER TURNS 20 IN 2012-13

- UMass is in its 20th season of play at the William D. Mullins Memorial Center and has posted an all-time record of 193-75 (.719). The Minutemen also own a 103-49 (.676) all-time record in regular-season Atlantic 10 Conference games at the Mullins Center, and a 4-2 mark in Atlantic 10 Tournament contests. The first game was played on Feb. 4, 1993 as UMass defeated West Virginia 64-59 in overtime.
- UMass was dominant at home last season, posting a 15-1 record in Amherst, which included a 14-1 record at the Mullins Center (1-0 at historic Curry Hicks Cage) and a renewed home-court advantage with the student-based Mullins Militia. UMass averaged 4,359 fans in 15 dates last season. Those numbers got increasingly higher as the season evolved to 5,411 for eight A-10 home games and 6,614 for the last five regular-season home dates. The Minutemen saw four crowds of more than 6,200 in the final six games, with a season-high 8,399 in the victory over Saint Louis.

2012-13 SLATE ONE OF STRONGEST UNDER KELLOGG

- The 2012-13 UMass schedule has the potential to be one of the strongest since Derek Kellogg took over prior to the 2008-09 season. The ledger has 14 games against teams that participated in the postseason last year (8 NCAA, 5 NIT, 1 CBI). Eight of the 14 home games fall on Saturdays with one Sunday contest.
- The schedule features 16 games against schools that finished 2011-12 in the top 100 of the RPI.
- UMass will look to improve upon its 2-6 A-10 record away from Amherst, but will do so against one of the tougher slates. The Minutemen will travel to Charlotte, Fordham, La Salle, Rhode Island, St. Bonaventure, Saint Louis, VCU and Xavier in 2012-13. That group, which includes VCU's 8-1 CAA home record, combined to go 44-21.

UMASS A POPULAR TV CHOICE IN 2012-13

- UMass is scheduled to appear on television 11 times this season with nine current match-ups slated for national broadcasts. That marks the most regular-season showings since the 1997-98 year.

UMASS POSTSEASON HISTORY

- UMass has an all-time postseason record of 24-21 in 18 combined appearances in both the NCAA and NIT tournaments. The Minutemen have made eight NCAA Tourney showings, with the last in 1998. The first came in 1962 before a string of seven-consecutive from 1992-98 in which it ran its all-time record to 11-8 with an Elite Eight showing in 1995 and the only Final Four appearance in A-10 history in 1996. Last season the Minutemen collected their 11th NIT appearance and ran their record to 13-13, which included Final Fours in 1991 (fourth), 2008 (runner-up) and 2012 (tied-third).

ATLANTIC 10 CONFERENCE

- The A-10 ranked seventh among all conferences in the final RPI in 2011-12. The league boasted eight Top 100 teams, third among all leagues behind only the Big East and Big 10. The eight teams matched the SEC and was more than the ACC, Big 12, Pac-12 and Mountain West.

A-10 IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

- For the fifth year in a row, the Atlantic 10 Conference earned at least three bids into the NCAA Tournament while it marked the 27th time in the league's 35-year history that the conference received multiple bids to participate in the national tournament. The A-10 also received multiple at-large bids for the fifth year in a row and 18th time overall. Over the last six years, the league has had 12 at-large selections - the seventh most among Division I conferences - behind only the Big East (42), Big Ten (29), ACC (26), Big 12 (26), SEC (23) and the Pac-10 (22). In fact, the A-10 is one of eight conferences to receive at least one at-large selection over each of the last six seasons.

Derek KELLOGG

HEAD COACH

Fifth Year as UMass Head Coach • UMass '95

UMass brought one of its own home to run the men's basketball program in 2008-09, the 100th season of UMass Basketball, and four years later has put the Minuteman program back on solid ground and poised for the next step.

Former Minuteman point guard and Springfield native Derek Kellogg was named the 21st head coach in University of Massachusetts men's basketball history, on April 23, 2008. The 1995 UMass graduate returned to his alma mater for his first head coaching job after serving as an assistant coach for 12 years, the last eight at the University of Memphis under former UMass head coach John Calipari. The energetic and hard-working Kellogg is largely credited for recruiting many of the Tigers which helped Memphis reach the NCAA Championship game in 2008 and eight consecutive 20-win seasons and eight consecutive postseason berths.

Last season, UMass went 25-11 and advanced to the semifinals of both the Atlantic 10 Championship and the National Invitation Tournament. The Minutemen finished tied for fifth in the Atlantic 10 after being picked 12th in the preseason polls. Kellogg also installed an up-tempo offense to go along with a pressure defense that resulted in a team breaking the school record for steals, while ranking in the top five nationally in possessions per game.

Leading the way was Chaz Williams, who was named First Team All-Atlantic 10 and NABC All-District after averaging 16.9 points, 6.2 assists and 4.4 rebounds per game. Williams set UMass sophomore records for assists (231) and steals (81).

The Minutemen saw a resurgence at home as the team went 15-1 in Amherst while averaging 4,359 fans in 15 dates at the Mullins Center. Those numbers got increasingly higher as the season evolved to 5,411 for eight A-10 games and 6,614 for the last five regular-season contests. The Minutemen played before four crowds of more than 6,200 in the final six games, including a season-high 8,399 in the victory over Saint Louis.

Kellogg has also infused life into the community relations campaign among the entire basketball program. He serves as the Honorary Co-Chairman of the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation for the Northern Connecticut/Western Massachusetts chapter, while participating with the entire team in the JDRC Walk to Cure Diabetes. He has also lent his time to the Clarke Schools for Hearing and Speech and Baystate Children's Hospital of Springfield/Children's Miracle Network.

In 2010-11, Kellogg led UMass to its best start since the 1995-96 Final Four season as the Minutemen opened the year with a 7-0 mark. UMass also posted its first seven-game win streak since 1998. UMass finished 15-15 in 2010-11.

Kellogg finished his second season at his alma mater with a 12-20 record. But that including the Minutemen's first Atlantic 10 Tournament victory in eight years as UMass knocked off No. 6 seed Charlotte, 59-56. The Minutemen had lost its first journey game in each season dating to 2002.

In his first season as the head coach at UMass, Kellogg led the Minutemen to a 12-18 record including an epic win over defending NCAA Champion Kansas in Kansas City before a nationally-televised audience on ESPN. UMass senior Tony Gaffney was honored as the Atlantic 10's Defensive Player of the Year in 2009 as well as being named to the A-10 Second Team. Gaffney led the A-10 in rebounding and averaged a double-double with 11.5 points and 10.2 rebounds per game. Gaffney was UMass' first player to average a double-double in 30 years.

Ricky Harris was named to the Atlantic 10 Third Team after he averaged 18.2 points per game, the highest scoring average for any returning player in 2009-10.

Kellogg has led UMass to one of the nation's top recruiting classes in the nation and the consensus best class in the Atlantic 10 according to publications. The group of Sampson Carter, Javorn Farrell, Raphiael Putney, Freddie Riley and Terrell Vinson make up the highly-talented class.

As a four-year letterwinner at Massachusetts from 1992-95, Kellogg played on four Atlantic 10 Conference regular season and tournament championship teams. The Minutemen were just the second team in NCAA history to win four-straight outright season and tournament championships. During his four-year career at UMass under Calipari, the Minutemen were 111-24, including 51-11 in the Atlantic 10, and advanced to the NCAA Tournament each year, including the Elite Eight in 1995. Kellogg was named the team's captain as both a junior and senior. He was named a 1995 Atlantic 10 All-Conference selection and was a three-time All-Atlantic 10 Academic honoree. On UMass' career lists, he is fifth in assists (453), seventh in all-time three-pointers (138), as well as seventh in three-point percentage (38.1). Kellogg played his high school basketball at Springfield Cathedral where he was a two-time Massachusetts All-State player and McDonald's honorable mention All-American.

Kellogg spent eight years on the Memphis staff under Calipari where he brought his "coach on the floor" mentality at UMass to the sidelines, and it has paid huge dividends for the Tiger program. In Kellogg's eight seasons in Memphis, he has helped lead the Tigers to eight-straight 20-win seasons and eight-consecutive postseason berths (2003, 2004, 2006, 2007, 2008 NCAA; 2001, 2002, 2005 NIT). Prior to this recent run, the last time Memphis had eight-straight 20-win seasons was from 1982-89. This current stretch of eight-consecutive postseasons is a first for the Tiger basketball program, breaking the previous mark of six-straight postseason tournaments from 1988-93.

In 2007-08, Kellogg was an integral part of another magical Tiger campaign, which continued through the 2008 NCAA Tournament championship game. The NCAA Final Four appearance was the Tigers' first since 1985, and the NCAA title contest was the program's first since 1973. Memphis set an NCAA single-season record for victories with 38 wins (38-2 mark) and held down the No. 1 spot in both national polls for five-straight weeks during the season. The Tigers finished 2007-08 ranked No. 2 in both national polls, the highest final ranking in school history. Memphis also won a school-record 26-straight games, and swept the Conference USA regular season and tournament titles for a third-consecutive season.

The Tigers won 30 games for a third-straight year in 2007-08, becoming the second school in NCAA Division I history to accomplish the feat. Kentucky was the first to do so from 1947-49 and 1996-98. UCLA joined the elite group later in 2007-08. From 2005-06 to 2007-08, Memphis won 104 games (104-10 record) and tied the 1996-98 Kentucky squads for the most victories in a three-year period in NCAA Division I history.

In 2006-07, Kellogg helped lead Memphis to another record-setting campaign. The Tigers won 33 games for a second-straight season (33-4 record) and captured their second-consecutive Conference USA regular season and tournament titles. The back-to-back outright regular season crowns were a first for the Memphis program, and the consecutive tournament championships were the Tigers first since they won two-straight Metro Conference Tournaments in 1984 and 1985. Memphis advanced to the NCAA Tournament Elite Eight for a second-straight year (2006, 2007), marking the first time in school history that happened.

The 2006-07 Tigers also pulled a first in Conference USA history. Memphis posted a perfect 16-0 regular season mark and captured the league's postseason tournament. The Tigers were the second squad in C-USA history to go 16-0 in the regular season as Cincinnati did so in 1999-2000. That Bearcat team, though, did not win the Conference USA Tournament title. The Tigers received a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament and finished in the top 10 in both national polls (No. 5/AP; No. 7/ESPN-USA Today).

Kellogg also played an integral role in the Tigers' 2005-06 remarkable season. Memphis posted a 33-4 record and won the Conference USA regular season and tournament titles. The conference regular season crown was the Tigers' second in three years. The 2005-06 Memphis squad earned the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament No. 1 seed and advanced to the Elite Eight for the first time since 1992. The Tigers finished the season ranked in the top 10 of both national polls (No. 4/AP; No. 6/ESPN-USA Today). Those final rankings were the highest in Memphis basketball history.

From when Kellogg joined the Memphis staff in 2000-01, the Tigers won the 2002 National Invitation Tournament championship, claimed a share of the 2004 Conference USA regular season crown and took home the 2002 and 2003 C-USA National Division titles. The Tigers have posted 219 overall victories (27.3 wins per year) and 101 conference wins (12.6 league victories per year) in his eight seasons. The eight years prior to that span, the Tigers had 140 total wins and 66 conference victories.

In addition to the 2006, 2007 and 2008 final national rankings, the Tigers also finished the 2003 (No. 19) and 2004 (No. 24) seasons ranked in the final Associated Press poll. Prior to the 2002-03 and 2003-04 seasons, the last time Memphis was ranked in the final polls in consecutive years was the 1984-85 and 1985-86 campaigns.

Kellogg was an off-campus recruiter for the Tigers, and also assisted in scouting opponents. His hard work — especially on the recruiting trail — gained him national recognition. In the summer of 2007, Rivals.com listed Kellogg (No. 7 spot) as one of the nation's 10 assistants "ready to move up." A year earlier in 2006, the same web site named Kellogg as one of the nation's top 25 recruiters, and HoopScoop magazine tabbed him as one of the nation's top assistant coaches.

Prior to joining Calipari's staff, Kellogg spent one season at Youngstown State. In his lone year at Youngstown State, Kellogg was a member of a coaching staff led by former UMass assistant John Robic that re-energized a community about Penguin basketball. Youngstown State finished fourth in the Mid-Continent Conference regular season standings, but were in first place in the league before losing their top scorer, Elmer Brown, with seven games left in the regular season. Youngstown State signed a freshman class which included three top-100 recruits during Kellogg's tenure.

Kellogg joined the Youngstown State staff after two seasons at George Mason University in Fairfax, Va., where he worked for Jim Larranaga. The Patriots posted a 19-11 record during the 1998-99 season, captured both the Colonial Athletic Association regular-season and tournament championships and earned an automatic bid to the 1999 NCAA Tournament.

Kellogg began his coaching career at his alma mater. He was a graduate assistant and part-time radio broadcaster at UMass for the 1996-97 season. Kellogg also played a season with the Connecticut Skyhawks in the United States Basketball League in 1995.

Kellogg, 37 (born June 20, 1973), is a 1995 graduate of Massachusetts with a degree in Real Estate/Finance. In May of 2005, he married Nicole Flory, who graduated from UMass in 1997. The couple welcomed their first child Maximus Antonio Kellogg on April 28, 2008 (five days after he was hired at UMass. Kellogg's parents George and Ruth Kellogg currently reside in Belchertown, Mass.
