Coach Jim Larrañaga ranks in the top 60 on the list of winningest coaches all-time, and top 15 amongst active coaches vs. major schools. After leading Miami to the 2013 NCAA Sweet 16 and winning the school's first ACC regular season and tournament championships, Larrañaga was honored as the AP, Naismith, USBWA Henry Iba, Adolph Rupp Cup and ACC Coach of the Year.

THE COACH

Head coach Jim Larrañaga has a 581-387 overall record in his 32nd season as a head coach. He is 111-53 in his fifth season at the University of Miami, with a 50-32 mark in ACC play.

Miami's 13-consecutive weeks in the polls top the school record of 12 from 2001-02.

UM has been ranked in the AP's top 15 for 10 weeks this season, tying the school record 1959-60 season, and topping the 2012-13 season.

The Canes are ranked 12-or-better in the AP for the fourth time this season, 11th time under Coach L, 15th time since 1985-86 and 22nd time since 1959-60.

THE WEATHER

Game day temperatures: Coral Gables - 81/57; Blacksburg, Va., - 41/25.

THE SERIES

Miami is 17-12 in the all-time series against Virginia Tech, which dates back to the 2000-01 season. The Canes are 8-4 at home against the Hokies, 6-6 on the road and 3-2 at neutral sites. UM is 7-2 against VT under Coach L. Miami won the last matchup with Virginia Tech, defeating the Hokies, 59-49, on Mar. 11, 2015 at the Greensboro Coliseum in Greensboro, N.C.

THE NOTE

Senior guard Sheldon McClellan is the most efficient offensive player in the country among players used in 20 percent of possessions, according to KenPom.com on Feb. 15. McClellan has posted the ninth-best shooting percentage (51.9%) in the country among guards, and has the top shooting percentage among guards in the ACC, according to stats on NCAA.org on Feb. 15. McClellan's 2-point shooting percentage is 60.3 percent this season.

LARRAÑAGA BY THE NUMBERS

5 - Coach Jim Larrañaga is one of five ACC coaches with a Final Four appearance to his credit. In 2006, Larrañaga became the first coach at a mid-major school to take his team to the NCAA Final Four in 27 years.

6 - In 31 years of coaching, Jim Larrañaga has a winning record in the NCAA Tournament, a 7-5 mark in six appearances.

7 - Larrañaga is no stranger to the ACC. In his seven seasons as an assistant coach at Virginia, the Cavaliers participated in the NCAA Final Four in 1981 and 1984, won three ACC Championships and finished in the Top 5 of the rankings.

10 - The 2015-16 marks the 10th anniversary of Larrañaga's Cinderella run to the 2006 NCAA Final Four with George Mason. Both associate head coach Chris Caputo and director of operations James Johnson were on that GMU staff.

15 - Larrañaga has made 15 postseason appearances in the past 26 years, including six NCAA tournaments.

32 - Larrañaga is in his 32nd year as a head coach and has successfully transitioned three institutions into successful programs: Miami, Bowling Green and George Mason.

500 - Coach L is one of five ACC coaches with 500 or more wins.

LARRAÑAGA - WHY MIAMI?

Along with returning to the best basketball conference in the country, Coach L had a few personal reasons for accepting the head coaching job at Miami. Coach's grandfather was from Cuba, where he produced the Larrañaga [lare-en-YAH-ga] cigar. Coach's father was raised in Key West before moving to The Bronx, N.Y., getting married and raising six children. Coach L was raised in The Bronx, but vacationed to Florida as a boy. He also has owned a house in Sarasota - which he bought from Dick Vitale's daughter - and three of his siblings have retired to Florida.

LAST TIME OUT - #12/11 MIAMI 67, FLORIDA STATE 65

Sheldon McClellan scored 20 points and No. 12 Miami fought off a second-half rally from Florida State to win 67-65 on Sunday night. The Hurricanes led by four with less than a minute remaining when Dwayne Bacon's 3-pointer brought the Seminoles to 66-65. After Davon Reed missed a 3, Florida State had a chance to go ahead but Devon Bookert was short on a 3-pointer from the corner. Ja'Quan Newton hit one of two free throws for Miami, leaving Florida State one last chance, but Malik Beasley missed a 30-footer that would have won it. Reed had 14 points and Angel Rodriguez scored 11 for the Hurricanes (20-4, 9-3 Atlantic Coast Conference), who secured their fourth 20-win season in Jim Larrañaga's five years as coach. Bookert led Florida State (16-9, 6-7) with 14 points, and Xavier Rathan-Mayes had 12. Bacon and Beasley, who came into the game averaging a combined 33.2 points as the ACC's top freshman duo, were held to 15 — nine for Bacon. Miami jumped out to an 11-2 lead and was up by seven before Florida State scored eight straight points — consecutive 3-pointers by Benji Bell and Terance Mann's jumper — to take a 15-14 advantage with 10:13 remaining. After the score was tied at 17, the Hurricanes regained control with a 17-5 run and built their largest lead of the half (34-22) with 1:49 remaining. Tonye Jekiri's layup gave Miami its biggest lead (39-26) before Florida State started coming back. After trailing 45-36, the Seminoles made a 14-5 run to tie it at 50 on Bookert's 3-pointer with 8:44 remaining. Florida State, though, was never able to regain the lead.

RODRIGUEZ HANDING OUT 7.0 ASSISTS PER GAME

In the past six games, point guard Angel Rodriguez has recorded 7.0 assists per game with just 1.3 turnovers per outing. Against Duke, he tallied 11 assists with just one miscue, and against Pitt, he recorded eight dimes. In those six games, he has also averaged 11.3 points and 3.3 rebounds in 29.8 minutes, while hitting 42.9 percent from the field and 81.8 percent at the line.

MCCLELLAN MOST EFFICIENT PLAYER IN THE NATION

Sheldon McClellan is the most efficient offensive player in the nation, among players with 20 percent-or-more possessions used, according to KenPom.com. He is also the sixth-most efficient player in the ACC overall, and No. 10 in the nation. McClellan is third in the ACC in 2-point field goal percentage (61.1), fourth in true shooting percentage (63.7) and 10th in free throw percentage (85.9). He is also ninth in the ACC in turnover rate (10.9).

The Houston native is currently on three national player of the year midseason watch lists: Naismith Trophy Men's College Player of the Year, Oscar Robertson Trophy for Men's National Player of the Year and Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award.

CANES 11TH IN NATION IN FT PERCENTAGE

Miami ranks 12th in the nation in free throw percentage, connecting on 414-of-546 (75.8%) shots at the free throw line. UM averages 17.3 points per game at the line, and has posted a +11.5 scoring margin overall this season. The Canes have drawn 470 fouls, while committing only 403, which ranks UM No. 17 in the country in fewest fouls. Opponents have just 396 attempts at the charity stripe.

NEWTON BEST SIXTH MAN IN THE COUNTRY

Dick Vitale has lauded Miami sophomore Ja'Quan Newton as the "best sixth man in the country." Newton has immensely improved his stats from last year, and has scored in double digits 18 times this season.

In Miami's nine ACC victories Newton has averaged 12.0 points and 2.3 assists per game, hitting 51.4 percent from the field. In the Canes' three losses he has put up 8.0 points and 1.3 assists per outing, knocking down 30.8 percent of his shots.

FOUR IN A ROW FOR THE CANES

Miami has won four league games in a row, the longest winning streak in ACC play since the 2012-13 season. UM is outscoring opponents by just 5.0 ppg in those four games, including two-straight two-point victories. The Canes won their first five ACC games by 13.0 points per game, with the closest margin an 11-point win over Duke.

MCCLELLAN CLOSING IN ON 1,000 POINTS AT MIAMI

Sheldon McClellan has tallied 941 points in 62 games at Miami. Added to his 843 points at Texas, he is also closing in on 2000 career points.

MIAMI POSTS 20-WIN SEASON

Coach Jim Larrañaga has posted his fourth 20-win season in five years at the U, and his 10th career 20-win season. This is Miami's seventh 20-win season since joining the ACC for the 2004-05 campaign. Larrañaga is just the second coach in Miami history with four 20-win seasons, joining Bruce Hale (1954-67).

NINE ACC WINS FOR THE FOURTH TIME UNDER COACH L

Just 12 games into the league schedule, Miami has won nine games in ACC play. In five seasons under Coach Jim Larrañaga, the Canes have won seven-or-more ACC games each season. Prior to the arrival of Coach L, Miami had never won nine ACC games in a season.

JEKIRI ON THE BOARDS

In 128 games at Miami senior Tonye Jekiri has grabbed 836 rebounds, eighth-most in Miami history. He has improved his rebounds per game from 1.6 as a rookie to 9.8 as a senior. He also has grabbed double-digit rebounds in 37 games over the past two seasons (61 games played), after doing so just three times in his first 67 outings.

MIAMI'S STARTERS SHOW EXPERIENCE

Miami starts two redshirt seniors, one true senior, a redshirt junior and a true junior. Those players combine for 364 starts and 552 games played. Sheldon McClellan has started 85 games playing in 130, Tonye Jekiri has 77 starts in 128 games, Angel Rodriguez is at 93/121, Davon Reed 55/87 and Kamari Murphy 54/87.

Those five players have been on a Division I team a combined 21 seasons, as McClellan and Rodriguez are both in their fifth year on the court, Jekiri and Murphy are each in their fourth season, and Reed is a true junior. The average age of that starting five is 21.8 years old: Rodriguez - 23; McClellan - 23; Murphy - 22; Jekiri - 21; Reed - 20.

COACHING COORDINATORS FOR MIAMI

Miami's assistant coaching staff is set up in a coordinator system, with Jamal Brunt as the offensive coordinator, Chris Caputo manning the defense and Adam Fisher handling the scout for every opponent. James Johnson is the Dean of Discipline.

LARRAÑAGA AMONG THE BEST IN COLLEGE BASKETBALL

BODY CHANGES FOR CRUZ UCEDA AND JEKIRI

Seniors Ivan Cruz Uceda and Tonye Jekiri have spent the summer in the weight room. Cruz Uceda has dropped 20 pounds from 237 to 217, and his body fat has slimmed down from 24 percent to nine percent in just a year in Miami. Jekiri has added 20 pounds to his 7-foot frame, now weighing 250 pounds.

COACH L TIES TO THE ACC

Coach Jim Larrañaga was an assistant coach at Virginia from 1979-1986, under the leadership of Terry Holland. In those seven seasons, Larrañaga helped the Cavaliers to five NCAA appearances: Final Four twice, Elite Eight once, Sweet 16 once and Round of 64 once, as well as two NIT appearances, including the Championship and Quarterfinal round.

MIAMI LANDS HUELL, BROWN AND MILLER

The Miami men's basketball team landed a pair of top-30 players in Dewan Huell and Bruce Brown, and top 100 player Rodney Miller.

With the addition of these three players, Miami would have six top 100 players next season: Huell (25), Brown (44), Ja'Quan Newton (52), Miller (90), James Palmer (98).

Huell, at 6-10 and 218 pounds, is a five-star, top-25 power forward from Miami Norland High School. Nationally, he is ranked the No. 21 player by ESPN, No. 23 by Rivals and No. 25 by Scout. ESPN and Scout rank him fifth at his position, and Scout says he's the top player in the state of Florida, while ESPN and Rivals have him second in the state. Brown, from Wakefield, Mass., is a four-star shooting guard at Vermont Academy in Saxton's River, Vt. At 6-4 and 205 pounds, Brown is ranked No. 30 by ESPN, No. 44 per Scout and No. 49 by Rivals. Miller is a 6-foot-11-inch, 245-pound center playing prep ball at Oak Hill Academy in Virginia. A native of Laurelton, N.Y., Miller is a consensus four-star recruit, ranked No. 90 overall by Scout.com and No. 114 by Rivals.com. As a center, he is ranked No. 17 by Scout.com and No. 15 by ESPN.

CANES SIGN TOP 10 RECRUITING CLASS

The 2016 recruiting class of Dewan Huell, Bruce Brown and Rodney Miller is being named a top-10 recruiting class in the country, with 247Sports ranking the class No. 7, Scout at No. 8, ESPN at No. 9 and Rivals at No. 10. The 2016 class rankings top Miami's best mark from 2005, when the Canes signed four four-star recruits – Jimmy Graham, Brian Asbury, Adrian Thomas and Denis Clemente – in a class that was ranked No. 12 in the nation by Scout. In 2009, Miami's signing class was nationally ranked No. 19 by Scout and No. 24 by ESPN. That Hurricanes' heralded 2009 class was comprised of ESPNU 100 picks Durand Scott, Garrus Adams and Donnavan Kirk, in addition to May signee Antoine Allen. Since 2002, Miami has signed 16 Scout.com top 100 players, including three five-star, top-25 players in DeQuan Jones (22, 2008), Huell (25) and Durand Scott (25, 2009). Since Larrañaga's arrival, his staff has signed five top-100 players in Huell (25), Brown (44), Ja'Quan Newton (52, 2014), Rodney Miller (90) and James Palmer (98, 2014). Huell is the most lauded signee for Miami since Scott in 2009, Jones in 2008, No. 32 Guillermo Diaz in 2003 and McDonald's All-American Darius Rice in 2000.

COACH L REUNITED WITH JAMES JOHNSON

James Johnson is the team's director of basketball operations. Johnson, who was on Larrañaga's staff for two seasons at George Mason University, including the historic NCAA Final Four run in 2006, came to Miami after seven seasons on staff at fellow ACC school Virginia Tech, where he was the head coach for two seasons after five years as an assistant coach.

LARRAÑAGA CONTRACT EXTENDED THROUGH 2022

The University of Miami extended Coach Jim Larrañaga's contract through May 31, 2022, Director of Athletics Blake James announced in September 2014. Larrañaga first signed a five-year contract in April 2011, then was granted a three-year extension in 2012.

PROCANES REPORT

Former Hurricanes James Jones and Shane Larkin have taken their talents onto NBA rosters this season, as Jones is in Cleveland with the Cavaliers and Larkin joins a new team, the Brooklyn Nets, after playing across town with the Knicks last season. Miami has 17 former players in professional basketball at this time. A complete list is on page four of the notes.

AMONG UNIVERSITY OF MIAMI COACHES, LARRAÑAGA ...

- has the highest winning percentage of a Miami coach in the NCAA Tournament, a .667 mark with a 2-1 record.
- is one of two Miami coaches to post three 20-win seasons. Larrañaga has recorded three 20-win seasons in four years at Miami.
- .647 winning percentage is the best mark since Bruce Hale posted a .663 mark from 1955-67, including three seasons led by Rick Barry.
- has led the Canes to 41 ACC wins in just four seasons. Miami won 43 ACC games the previous seven seasons.
- Under Coach L, Miami has posted three of the Canes' top five finishes in ACC play, including the 2013 championship, tied for fourth in 2012 and tied for sixth in 2015. In 2008, Miami tied for fifth in league play, and in 2005, tied for sixth.
- In four seasons under Coach L, Miami has tallied six wins in the ACC Tournament. In the previous seven seasons, Miami went 6-7.
- In two NIT appearances under Coach L, Miami is 5-2 for a .714 winning percentage. In Miami's other 10 NIT appearances combined, the Canes went 6-10 for a .375 winning percentage.

DID YOU KNOW ...

Coach L became the first Miami coach to win 20+ games in his first two seasons at UM and only the third of 12 UM coaches to post three 20-win seasons.

Former Cane Rick Barry was named one of the Greatest Players in NBA History.

Miami native and former Cane James Jones won the 2010-2011 NBA All-Star Weekend 3-Point Contest and the NBA Championship in the 2011-2012 and 2012-13 seasons.

Six-time NBA All Star Amar'e Stoudemire enrolled at UM in 2013 and took classes to earn his bachelor's degree.

UM is in its 12th season in the ACC.

Coach L led the George Mason Patriots to the 2006 Final Four with big wins over some of basketball's elite teams such as Michigan State, UNC and UConn. He was the first coach to take a mid-major to a Final Four in 27 years (Penn '79) when his team advanced in 2006.

In 14 years at George Mason, Larrañaga led the Patriots to five NCAA Tournament appearances (2011, 2008, 2006, 2001, 1999), including the 2006 Final Four.

Miami basketball received APR (Academic Progress Rate) Public Recognition Awards for being among the top 10 percent in APR in its sport. Miami ranks in the top 10 percent NCAA men's basketball with a 990 APR.

The Miami Department of Athletics recorded a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 89 percent. Miami's department-wide GSR is 16th overall among FBS programs. UM has exceeded the NCAA average GSR in each of the last 10 years.

The Canes have averaged 20.0 wins over the last 11 seasons.

The Hurricanes have made at least one trey in 927 of 933 games since the NCAA adopted the 3-point shot in 1986. The last time Miami was held without a 3-pointer was Feb. 26, 2014 at Virginia.

Miami has held 786 of its last 787 opponents to less than 100 points. North Carolina was the last team to score 100+, defeating UM 105-64 on Jan. 31, 2007.

MIAMI BASKETBALL – THE EARLY YEARS

The University of Miami basketball program was dormant for 14 years from 1971-1985. In 1983 Director of Athletics Sam Jankovich announced the resurrection of men's basketball at Miami, with the reinstatement vote by the UM Board of Trustees on Oct. 12, 1983. Head coach Bill Foster was hired March 21, 1984, adding assistants Clint Bryant, Seth Greenberg and Cesar Odio by July 1. Tim Harvey was the staff's first recruit, a 6-10, 240-pound center from Plainfield, N.J., who transferred from Georgia Tech. On Oct. 15, 1984 the first men's basketball practice in 12 years was held on the patio in the center of campus, viewed by more than 200 students. Miami defeated The Citadel, 85-77, on Nov. 22, 1985, in the first game of the new era of UM basketball.

LARRAÑAGA MEMBER OF UM FACULTY

Coach Jim Larrañaga is an Adjunct Assistant Professor of Kinesiology and Sport Sciences at the University of Miami. Due to his head coaching responsibilities, Larrañaga is a guest lecturer at several different classes in the School of Education and Human Development throughout the semester.

MIAMI PREDICTED TO FINISH FIFTH IN ACC

Miami was predicted to finish fifth out of 15 teams in the Atlantic Coast Conference this season, as announced by the league during Operation ACC Basketball in Charlotte, N.C., Oct. 28. North Carolina was picked to win the league, followed by Virginia, Duke and Notre Dame.

In 2012-13, the Canes were picked to finish fifth, then won the league's regular season and tournament championship. In all four of Larrañaga's seasons at Miami, the Canes have finished the season better than predicted at ACC media day.

COACHING CHANGES FOR THE HURRICANES

After having the same assistant coaching staff his first four years in Miami, Larrañaga has two new assistant coaches in 2015-16 in Jamal Brunt and Adam Fisher, following the departure of Eric Konkol (Louisiana Tech) and Michael Huger (Bowling Green). Konkol had been an assistant with Coach L 11 seasons and Huger was an assistant coach for eight years and player for four seasons.

Due to the lack of turnover, Coach L has only had nine assistant coaches in the last 14 seasons. Five of his assistants left for a D-I head coaching job, and two others who have worked their way into head coaching jobs. In those 14 seasons, only twice two assistants left at the same time, 1996 (Stan Heath and Steve Merfeld) and 1989 (Jeff Snyder and Ricky Stokes).

Chris Caputo, in his 14th season on Larrañaga's staff and fifth in Coral Gables, was promoted to associate head coach in the summer of 2015.
