STORY LINES

- In the midst of a seven-game homestand, the No. 24 Miami Hurricanes will look to continue their hot start to the season in their opening Atlantic Coast Conference series with Duke.
- Miami's impressive rotation, which has allowed only seven earned runs in 35.1 innings of work, has helped guide the Hurricanes to 7-2 record during their first three weekend series.
- Head coach Jim Morris and his staff will be looking to continue their stretch of success against Duke. Miami has a 25-5 all-time advantage over the Blue Devils, including a series win last season at Durham Bulls Athletic Park.
- Junior Bryan Radziewski delivered one of the marquee performances of the season in the team's midweek win over UCF, striking out a career-high 11 batters in just five innings of work, leading Miami to a 5-0 shutout victory.
- Junior Brad Fieger, who has helped key the Hurricanes' early success at the plate, is riding a career-best 13-game hitting streak into Friday's series opener. The Naples, Fla., native leads the team in hits (19) and average (.373).
- Junior Dale Carey paced Miami in the team's 2012 series vs. Duke, finishing with four hits and two runs scored.

3 JIM MORRIS 2001, 1999 & 1994 COACH OF THE YEAR • 2008 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR



In his 20th season at Miami, no other program nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 40 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 19 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

- Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 862-323-3 (.710) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,366-590-4 (.697) Division I record in 31+ years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 34 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,497-631-4 (.706) mark
- In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 19 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

- Jim Morris earned his 28th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2012 when he guided the Canes to one of 16 host sites for the first round of the postseason. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 19 seasons (1994-2012), winning 15 of his last 19 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.
- Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2012 Hurricanes to their 40th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five players from the 2012 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft: E.J. Encinosa, Eric Erickson, Steven Ewing, Peter O'Brien and Stephen Perez.

MORRIS IN 35th SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

- Morris currently has a 1,366-590-4 (.697) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,497-631-4 (.706) record over 30-plus years.
- Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.
- Morris entered 2013 as the fifth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball history with 1,354 wins. His impressive win total ranks him No. 12 all-time for any coach, regardless of division.



JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

- The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with Miami in 11 of 19 seasons and led the Canes to 13 straight NCAA Regional Championships, an NCAA record.
- Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and 2001.

STAYING THE COURSE...

- After dropping its most recent weekend series in Gainesville, Miami delivered a pair of midweek wins against Maine and UCF, outscoring the two teams by a combined margin of 11-2.
- Junior lefthander Bryan Radziewski delivered one of the marquee performances of the season against UCF, striking out a career-high 11 batters in only five innings of work, guiding Miami to a 5-0 shutout win. It was the first double-digit strikeout performance by a Miami pitcher since Javi Salas struck out 10 FAU batters in an April 2012 start.
- Junior Brad Fieger, who leads the team with 19 hits and a .373 batting average, is riding a career-best 13-game hitting streak into Friday's series opener against the Blue Devils.

HOME SWEET HOME...

- Miami is in the midst of a season-long seven-game homestand. The Hurricanes have recorded a perfect 10-0 home record to start 2013, including weekend sweeps of Rutgers and Milwaukee.
- The Hurricanes finished 2012 with a home record of 25-10 (.714), including a 10-5 mark in Atlantic Coast Conference play.
- Miami opened its 2012 conference slate with a home sweep of Boston College, and won eight of its first 10 ACC games inside Alex Rodriguez Park.

NEWCOMERS FINDING THEIR WAY...

- Freshman first baseman David Thompson has powered Miami in the early going, leading the team with two homeruns and 18 RBI's. He connected on his first career homerun at home in Wednesday's 5-0 win over UCF.
- Shortstop Brandon Lopez and second baseman Alex Hernandez, both key members of Miami's nationally ranked 2012 recruiting class, have provided Miami with impressive defensive range up the middle. Both have started every game at their respective positions.
- Freshman outfielder Ricky Eusebio, who impressed coaches in the fall with his speed and defensive prowess, has started each of the past three games as the leadoff hitter, and has recorded at least one hit in each game.

FRESHMAN PHENOM...

- Freshman David Thompson has played a key role in Miami's early success, ranking first on the team and tied for fourth in the conference with 18 RBI's.
- The Miami, Fla., native connected for his first homerun at The Light, an opposite field two-run shot, in Miami's 5-0 win over UCF. The homerun proved to be Thompson's fourth gamewinner of the season.
- Thompson ranks first in the Atlantic Coast Conference with seven doubles, leads the team in slugging at a robust .592, and ranks third on the team with 16 hits.

STARTING OFF STRONG...

- Sophomore lefthander Chris Diaz has been one of the brightest spots this season for the Hurricanes, sporting a team-best 0.47 ERA in three starts.
- Diaz has delivered quality starts in all three of his outings this season, including a career-best seven-inning showing in Miami's March 1 win over Florida.

GETTING DEFENSIVE...

• Miami's defense has been one of the many brightest spots on the season, boasting a .973 fielding percentage - the fifth-best mark in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

• Miami's 2013 infield features three newcomers: freshman first baseman David Thompson, junior second baseman Alex Hernandez and freshman shortstop Brandon Lopez. Junior third baseman Brad Fieger completes the infield quartet.

• Thompson, who had never played first prior to this season, has zero errors in 14 starts at first base. The Miami, Fla., native played third base in high school, where he may project down the road for Coach Morris' staff.

LIMITING THE DAMAGE...

• The Hurricanes have allowed one run or less in six of their 14 games this season.

• In addition to strong defensive play, Miami's pitching staff as a whole is boasting a 2.10 ERA - the fourth-best mark in the ACC.

• Despite scoring only 71 runs offensively through their first 14 games, Miami pitchers have held opposing lineups to only 38 runs.

PICKING IT UP...

• Senior outfielder Chantz Mack is hitting .444 in the team's past five games, with eight hits and seven runs scored. The Homestead, Fla., native has connected for two doubles and is slugging .556 over that span.

• Boosted by his recent seven-game hitting streak, freshman shortstop Brandon Lopez is hitting .389 over his past five games. He had a career-best three-hit performance against Florida on March 1.

• Freshman Ricky Eusebio has made the most of his recent opportunities, hitting .357 over his three starts as the leadoff hitter. The Miami, Fla., native has five hits and three runs scored over that stretch.

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH...

• A number of the Hurricanes' most important contributors have been underclassmen, many of whom were part of a recruiting class ranked in the top 10 by national publications.

• Freshman Ricky Eusebio recorded his first career multi-hit game in Miami's 6-3 loss to Florida on March 3, while sophomore catcher Garrett Kennedy connected on his first career homerun.

• Freshman RHP Frank Grandinette ranks among the conference's tops in appearances (eight), freshman LHP Thomas Woodrey delivered a dominant start in a victory over Maine, and RHP Alexander Fernandez has opened his sophomore campaign with a personal-best 6.2-inning scoreless streak.

STAYING HOT IN THE SUNSHINE STATE...

• Miami's series against Duke will continue the team's season-opening stretch of games inside the Sunshine State.

• The Hurricanes do not leave Florida until March 15 for a weekend series at North Carolina, after 19 regular season games.

• 15 of the team's first 19 games will have been played at Alex Rodriguez Park at Mark Light Field, three at McKethan Stadium and one at FAU Baseball Stadium.

During a special tribute night against Milwaukee on Feb. 23, head coach Jim Morris called for the "Grand Illusion," a trick play for which Fraser became instantly famous after the 1982 College World Series. A new outfield banner portraying the legendary coach was also unveiled by Fraser's wife Karen, his three daughters and five grandchildren during the game.

The Hurricanes are wearing patches in remembrance of Fraser; #1 patches adorn the right breast of each and every jersey, while #1 decals have been placed on the back of each player's batting helmet.

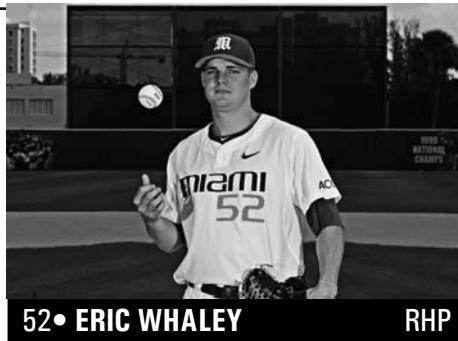

HURRICANES DROP SERIES OPENER TO DUKE

DURHAM, N.C. - In a highly-anticipated pitcher's duel to open a three-game series at Durham Bulls Athletic Park, the Duke University Blue Devils came out on top with a 4-1 win over the Hurricanes.

Lefthander Eric Erickson started the game for tenth-ranked Miami (14-4, 3-1), pitching efficiently through his 6.1 innings of work. The Sarasota, Fla. native, who has pitched six innings or more in four of his five starts in 2012, allowed four earned runs on the night to go along with four strikeouts.

Though they entered with only a 7-12 overall record, the Blue Devils started ace Marcus Stroman in the opener, and the junior righthander was every bit as good as advertised. The Medford, N.Y. native recorded the sixth double-digit strikeout performance of his career, punching out 13 Hurricane batters in his seven-inning stint.

The Blue Devils would be the first team to strike, scoring single runs in the second and third inning to build a 2-0 lead. After Erickson allowed a lead-off single to Jordan Betts, Andrew Istler drove him with an RBI double to left center. It was Duke outfielder Will Pivnic-Worms who gave the Devils a 2-0 advantage with an RBI single of his own in the very next inning.

Miami came close to scoring on a number of occasions early in the game, but were unable to convert. After captain Peter O'Brien singled in the first inning, leftfielder Rony Rodriguez smacked a double to left field that gave O'Brien a chance to score. The senior was tagged out at home plate, however, to end the inning and the early surge.

The Hurricanes stranded at least one batter in each of the next three innings, as Stroman began to find his groove. Miami once again came up short in the fifth inning, after Tyler Palmer reached via base on balls and advanced to third on a stolen base and throwing error. Though a strikeout from Dale Carey ended that threat, the Hurricanes managed to score in the seventh.

After a flyball from pinch-hitter Julian Santos was misread in shallow left field, the sophomore made his way to second base with a double. Two plays later, freshman shortstop Jarred Mederos knocked in Santos with an RBI single. It would be the only run the Hurricanes would score on the night, however, as Istler pitched two impressive innings of relief of Stroman, moving on to the hill from his original position of left field.

No. 10 MIAMI BOUNCES BACK WITH 2-1 WIN

DURHAM, N.C. - After dropping game one of their series with Duke University in disappointing fashion, the tenth-ranked Hurricanes returned to Durham Bulls Athletic Park Saturday for a 2-1 over the Blue Devils.

Behind the strong pitching of starter Eric Whaley, the Hurricanes (15-4, 4-1 ACC) took home a key conference win, setting the table for Sunday's rubber match at 1 p.m. Whaley (2-1), who allowed only one earned run in the team's win over Boston College last weekend, pitched 8.1 innings in his second victory of the year, marking a new career-long outing in the process. He struck out two Duke batters and walked three others.

After struggling with runners in scoring position in game one, the Hurricanes finally broke through in the top of the fourth on Saturday. After back-to-back singles from first baseman Brad Fieger and third baseman Esteban Tresgallo, Stephen Perez bunted his way on base on a ball that snuck under the pitcher's glove to load the bases.

Michael Broad, next to bat in the inning, hit a ball deep down the rightfield line that was caught in foul territory. The ball was hit just far enough to plate Fieger, as the game's scoring opened in Miami's favor.

Duke lefthander Trent Swart would set down the next seven Canes batters, however, as he matched Whaley in effectiveness through his seven innings of work. Featuring a combination of pitches that kept the Hurricane line-up off-balance, Swart struck out seven batters and allowed only six hits, including his lone run allowed in the fourth inning.

The Blue Devils managed to break through in the bottom of the seventh inning, as Jordan Betts hit a lead-off double down the left field line. Betts would move to third base after a throwing error from Whaley on a pick-off attempt, and was later driven in on an RBI bloop single from Andrew Istler.

Whaley matched his career long when he finished out the eighth inning, as the Hurricanes came to bat in the top of the ninth looking for a clinching run. Broad was once involved in the scoring, as he was hit by a pitch to lead off the inning. After Mederos moved Broad over to second with a sacrifice bunt, Tyler Palmer laced an RBI single to right field that gave the Canes a 2-1 advantage late in the game.

Whaley would set a personal record for longest outing when he recorded his first out of the ninth. But after allowing two baserunners, he was subsequently replaced by Jim Morris in favor of closer E.J. Encinosa. The junior reliever, who had already recorded three saves in the past week, earned his fifth save of the season by getting the next two Blue Devils batters out, including Friday night starter Marcus Stroman pinch-hitting on a strikeout.

The Hurricanes were led offensively by junior second baseman Stephen Perez (2-for-4, 2B) and sophomore centerfielder Dale Carey (2-for-4, BB). Duke was led on offense by Andy Perez (2-for-4) and Andrew Istler (2-for-4, RBI). The series finale at Durham Bulls Athletic Park is set for Sunday at 1 p.m.

HURRICANES TAKE SERIES FINALE 7-1

DURHAM, N.C. -- The tenth-ranked University of Miami Hurricanes finished off the Duke Blue Devils in impressive fashion on Sunday, clinching their second consecutive series victory with a 7-1 win at Durham Bulls Athletic Park.

After scoring only three combined runs in the first two games of the series, the Hurricanes plated a series-high seven runs on 12 hits in Sunday's rubber game. Catcher Peter O'Brien led the way offensively for Miami, finishing the day 4-for-5 with four RBI.

Miami struck in the game's first inning, as Dale Carey got the action started with a walk. O'Brien then crushed a pitch to the gap in right-center, which easily plated Carey and gave Miami an early 1-0 lead. Unfortunately for Duke starter Robert Huber, the Canes' electric combination of Carey and O'Brien wasn't done quite yet.

After Carey reached in the third inning on his first triple of the season, O'Brien unloaded on a pitch from Huber that cruised over the wall in left field for his team-leading seventh homerun of the year. With the homerun, O'Brien tied Daniel Palka of Georgia Tech for the Atlantic Coast Conference lead.

Just as impressive as the Hurricane offense was the man making his weekend debut on the mound for the Hurricanes: Steven Ewing. After Eric Whaley whirled a gem against the Blue Devils on Saturday afternoon, the junior lefthander provided the Hurricanes with their second-straight dominant start. Though Ewing was pulled in the sixth, he was able to keep Duke hitters off-balance and off the scoreboard, finishing with five strikeouts and only five hits allowed in his 5.2 innings of work.

With the bases loaded in the sixth inning, reliever Adam Sargent entered the game in a key spot for Miami. Sargent promptly extended his personal scoreless streak to four innings (dating back to Feb. 24), as he induced a harmless groundout to get out of the jam. Sargent would stay in the game for the seventh, pitching a scoreless frame after Miami had extended their lead earlier in the inning.

After Brad Fieger led off the seventh with a single, Esteban Tresgallo advanced the Naples, Fla. native to second on a sacrifice bunt. A single from second baseman Stephen Perez would drop into shallow right field, before an RBI groundout from Michael Broad extended the Hurricanes lead to five runs. Perez would score later in the inning on a wild pitch from Duke reliever David Putman, as Miami increased its lead to 6-0.

It was O'Brien who once again came through in the eighth, knocking in outfielder Chantz Mack (triple) with an RBI single to right field. With his fourth RBI of the day, O'Brien matched his personal-best in a Hurricanes uniform.

Eric Nedeljkovic entered the game in the eighth inning, allowing a double and walk to the first two Duke hitters. The Folsom, Calif. native retired the next two batters before allowing an RBI single to Andrew Istler, giving Duke their first run of the game. A.J. Salcines pitched a scoreless ninth inning to close the game out for Miami.
