- 2** **APPROACHING A MILESTONE**
Katie Meier is two (2) wins away from joining Ferne Labati as the only head coaches to record 250 victories at Miami.
- 8** **ONE AWAY**
The Hurricanes' next ACC win will give them eight (8) straight years with at least a .500 mark in conference play.
- 10** **DOUBLE-DIGIT W'S**
Miami, Duke, Notre Dame and Florida State are the only teams with 10-plus ACC wins in five of the past eight years.
- 10.6** **DOMINANT DOWN LOW**
In the paint, the Hurricanes have outscored opponents by 264 points this year, good for a +10.6 margin, and have led in paint scoring in 17 of their 25 outings, tying in another.
- 20** **HEATING UP**
Erykah Davenport has 20-plus points in three of the past four games, matching her total from the rest of her career.
- 20** **VICTORIES**
The Hurricanes have recorded 20-plus wins in seven of the past eight seasons after doing so once in the prior 16 years.
- 30** **BACK-TO-BACK**
Keyanna Harris had 10-plus points in consecutive games for the first time, with 30 points her most in a two-game span.
- 43** **LOCKDOWN DEFENSE**
The 43 points the Hurricanes allowed at Boston College are the fewest they have ever conceded in an ACC road game.
- .698** **CONSISTENT CANES**
With a 176-76 record since the start of the 2010-11 season, Miami's .698 winning percentage is the third-best of any team that has been in the ACC for that entire stretch.

SERIES HISTORY

The Hurricanes are 20-9 all-time against the Panthers, including 13-3 over the past 16 meetings, 8-1 in the last nine and 4-1 since Pittsburgh joined the ACC. Most recently, Miami tallied an 82-50 road victory on Jan. 2, 2017.

NEWS & NOTES

SILENCING SCORERS

Pittsburgh's Yacine Diop is the only one of the 13 players averaging at least 15 points per game Miami has not faced this year. Only four of the prior 14—the Hurricanes played Florida State's pair twice—have reached their current season average, with just three totaling 20 points. The group has combined to shoot 42.5 percent.

REUNITED

Mykea Gray will be facing a fellow freshman out of National Christian Academy (Md.) for the second time this season, in Pittsburgh's Jaala Henry. The Hurricanes previously took on Amani Ball of Bethune-Cookman.

PICKING UP THE PACE

In her first 15 outings, Kelsey Marshall was sixth on Miami at 6.9 points per game while shooting 28.9, 25.0 and 66.7 percent clips. In her last nine, she is second with 11.0 points per game and is posting 46.4, 45.2 and 80.0 percent marks. She had four double-digit performances in her first 15 games and has seven over the past nine.

STELLAR SEASON

Of the 23 games she has played at least 10 minutes this year, Erykah Davenport has led Miami in rebounding 17 times, doing so outright on 15 occasions. She has paced the Hurricanes in scoring nine times, solely atop the list in eight games. The senior has nine double-doubles, tied for fifth in the ACC. Davenport has double-digit points 17 times, with 20-plus in six outings, and 10-plus boards 10 times, the latter tied for fifth in the ACC. She is fifth in the conference with 8.9 rebounds per game and leads the way with 3.5 offensive boards per contest.

QUITE THE QUARTET

Miami's Katie Meier, Jim Larrañaga, Mark Richt and Jim Morris form the lone group of active coaches in their respective sports at the same school who have all won ACC Coach of the Year. It is the sixth such occurrence—fifth different school—in league history in those four sports and first since Florida State and Virginia in 2009.

POSTSEASON PLAY

Miami has made the postseason in eight straight seasons, far more than doubling the previous program record (2002-04) and surpassing its total (six) from the prior 16 years. Additionally, the Hurricanes have reached the NCAA Tournament six times in the last seven years after making three appearances in the previous 17 seasons.

PITTSBURGH

The Panthers, 10-15 (2-10 ACC) are paced by redshirt junior forward Yacine Diop's 15.6 points per game, No. 10 in the ACC. Pittsburgh, picked No. 13/14 in the ACC preseason poll, posted a 13-17 (4-12 ACC) record last year.

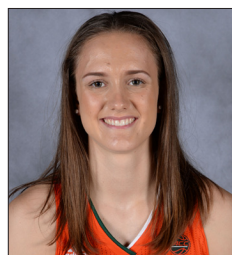

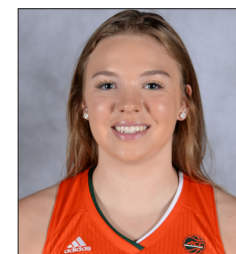

ALL IN THE FAMILY

Four Hurricanes, three of whom are newcomers, have older brothers who play(ed) college basketball. Kelsey Marshall's brother, Khyle, was a three-year starter at Butler and made the 2011 NCAA title game. Taylor Mason's brother, Nate, is a senior at Minnesota and was a First Team All-Big Ten pick in 2016-17. Beatrice Mompremier's brother, Wadly, is a senior at Arkansas-Little Rock after playing three seasons at Ohio. Sarah Mortensen's brother, Daniel, is a junior at Barry and made the SSC All-Newcomer Team last year after transferring from Wright State. Both of Mortensen's parents also played basketball growing up. In addition, four other Miami players have direct relatives who play(ed) basketball. Keyanna Harris' sister, Shamar, played at Lynn. Emese Hof's parents both played and her sister, Roos, is a professional player in the Netherlands. Khaïla Prather's father, Craig, was a teammate of David Robinson at Navy and was on the 1986-87 team that went 30-5. Rebecca Ripley's mother, Jen, played at UMass Dartmouth. Eight of the 15 Hurricanes have a sibling and/or parent who played basketball in college and/or professionally.

FROM NEAR AND FAR

Miami has four players from South Florida in Keyanna Harris (Riviera Beach), Kelsey Marshall (Davie), Beatrice Mompremier (Miami) and Neydja Petithomme (Boca Raton), plus a fifth in-state player in Shaneese Bailey (Callahan). The Hurricanes also have four players born outside the United States in Laura Cornelius (Netherlands), Serena-Lynn Geldof (Belgium), Emese Hof (Netherlands) and Sarah Mortensen (Denmark).

MAYOR JAMES

Miami's all-time leading scorer, Tamara James, is the mayor of Dania Beach, Fla. In 2006, the three-time conference scoring champion and UMShoF member was an All-American and went No. 8 in the WNBA Draft.

TV TIME

This season, for the first time ever, all of Miami's games will be televised, with five set to be on RSN and one on ESPN2. Additionally, for the third straight year, each of the Hurricanes' home games will be broadcast live.

PRESEASON PICKS

Miami was one of seven schools—four were from the ACC—with its men's and women's basketball teams in the preseason USA TODAY Coaches Poll, along with Baylor, Duke, Louisville, Notre Dame, UCLA and West Virginia.

ERYKAH'S ACCOLADE

MEIER AT MIAMI

One of two coaches with over 200 wins at Miami, Katie Meier has led the team to a 198-90 (.688) mark since 2009-10, including 176-76 (.698) since 2010-11. Her nine postseason appearances in 12 seasons with the Hurricanes are two fewer than the program's six other coaches combined for in 33 years.

WELCOME TO THE HALL

Katie Meier was a part of the University of Miami Sports Hall of Fame's Class of 2017. The fourth Miami basketball coach, male or female, to be inducted, Meier was joined by Ryan Braun, Jeremy Shockey and six others in the class. She is one of five female coaches in the UMShoF, three of whom are still active at Miami. Chanivya Broussard (2000-04) will soon become the 10th former Miami women's basketball player to make the UMShoF, as one of nine Class of 2018 honorees, along with Frank Gore, Devin Hester, John Salmons and five other greats.

MEIER'S PROCANES

Twenty of Katie Meier's players at Miami have played professionally: Diane Barnes, Maria Brown, Charmaine Clark, LaToya Drake, Keyona Hayes, Tamara James, Shenise Johnson, Suriya McGuire, Adrienne Motley, Laura Quevedo, Maurita Reid, Necole Sterling, Morgan Stroman, Renee Taylor, Jessica Thomas, Carla Williams, Jassany Williams, Riquana Williams, Shawnice Wilson and Stefanie Yderstrom. Of those 20, James, Johnson and Williams have all played in WNBA regular season games. Motley was also a WNBA draftee, while Hayes, Thomas and Wilson signed WNBA contracts.

DIFFERENT DYNAMIC

In 2016-17, Miami returned over 90 percent of its scoring, rebounding and blocks and at least 80 percent of its assists, steals and starts. This year, it brought back under 70 percent in all those areas, including below 45 percent in half of them.



TREMENDOUS TRIO

Three members of Miami's 2016-17 senior class—Keyona Hayes, Adrienne Motley and Jessica Thomas—signed WNBA contracts, becoming the first graduating trio in program history to do so. They were also the second trio of active Hurricanes to all have 1,000 points, finishing their careers with a combined total of 4,266. Motley and Thomas, All-ACC honorees who went on to be teammates in Sweden, placed sixth and No. 16, respectively, on the Hurricanes' all-time scoring list. Meanwhile, Hayes ended her career at No. 21 on the Hurricanes' leaderboard. Each finished top-10 all-time at Miami in at least three statistical categories. In both 2015-16 and 2016-17, Hayes, Motley and Thomas were Miami's top three scorers, averaging a combined 36.6 points per game last year and 36.5 the prior season. The three also combined for 194 of a possible 198 starts the past two years.

TWO YEARS TO REMEMBER

During the 2015-16 and 2016-17 seasons, the Miami men's and women's basketball teams combined to go 96-38, a .716 winning percentage. The 96 victories tied with 2011-12 and 2012-13 for the most the two teams have combined to post in a two-year span. The .716 mark ranks second behind 2011-12 and 2013-13 (.722) for the best two-year winning percentage between the two. In addition, 2015-16 and 2016-17 was the first time both Miami teams reached the NCAA Tournament in back-to-back campaigns.

WATSCO CENTER

After 13-plus years as the BankUnited Center, Miami's on-campus arena is now the Watsco Center. Watsco, Inc., based in Miami, is traded on the NYSE and is the largest distributor of air conditioning, heating and refrigeration products with annual sales of more than \$4 billion, 5,000 employees and 563 locations in North America. Watsco has provided funding to Miami since the 1990s through its "Watsco's Kids" program, giving kids in the community free access to performance arts, sports and other events at UM.

FACILITY UPGRADES

The Miami basketball facility has undergone a multimillion-dollar renovation. The project featured upgrades to the locker rooms, student-athlete lounges, office spaces, weight room, practice facility hallways and concourse. The coaches' offices and hallways of the facility now showcase highlights from great moments in program history, plus photos of select stars from both the men's and women's teams. Also on display are large-scale images of UM's ProCanes, as well as the newest Miami adidas gear. The players' lounge has a gaming center with couches and televisions. The walls of the practice facility show photos of celebrity Canes fans throwing up the U. Student-athletes have custom lockers and the sound system in the locker room, film room, lounges and coaches' offices were upgraded, too. The concourse features a variety of changes and has new displays.

HERE TO STAY

On April 10, 2017, Miami Director of Athletics Blake James announced a three-year contract extension for Katie Meier through the 2023-24 season.

FIVE FANTASTIC FRESHMEN

Miami's 2017 signing class was one of the best in program history and includes five talented prospects. The group was ranked as a top-20 class by both ProspectsNation.com and espnW HoopGurlz. Four of Miami's signees were at least four-star, top-70 recruits according to both outlets, while all were four-star, top-125 players on at least one site.

PERSONAL

Hometown: Wheaton, Ill.

Katie Meier completed her 12th season at the helm of the Hurricanes' women's basketball program in 2016-17. A well-known and respected figure in women's basketball with 16 years of head coaching experience, Meier has worked tirelessly to put her mark on Miami's program and to build a winning tradition.

In 2016-17, Meier guided her team to an eighth consecutive postseason, a sixth trip to the NCAA Tournament in the last seven years, and a seventh 20-plus win season in the last eight years, all extending program records. The Hurricanes finished with a 24-9 record, tied for the fifth-most wins in a single campaign in program history, and made the ACC Tournament semifinals for the second straight year.

Following the season, Meier was inducted into the University of Miami Sports Hall of Fame, becoming the fourth basketball coach, male or female, to garner the prestigious honor.

In January 2014, Meier was named a co-recipient of the 2013 USA Basketball National Coach of the Year award after leading the USA U19 team to a gold medal and perfect 9-0 record at the 2013 FIBA U19 World Championship.

All of her hard work was rewarded after the 2010-11 season when she was named the Associated Press National Coach of the Year - sharing the award with Connecticut's Geno Auriemma and Stanford's Tara VanDerveer.

That season, Meier led the Hurricanes into the NCAA tournament for the first time since 2004 and their win over Gardner-Webb in the first round was the first tournament win for Miami since 1993. The Canes entered the 2010-11 season with high internal expectations, but were picked eighth in the Preseason ACC Poll after a season in which they were the No. 12 seed in the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament.

However, the Hurricanes exceeded all of the outside expectations and, at one point, won 17 straight games. They were a perfect 20-0 inside the BankUnited Center and finished 12-2 in ACC play - earning their first regular season conference title since joining the league in 2004. As a reward, Meier was named the ACC Coach of the Year and later would be selected as the WBCA/RUSSELL ATHLETIC Region 2 Coach of the Year, as voted on by her peers.

Meier continued that success into the 2011-12 season, a year in which the Canes accomplished many firsts for the program.

Miami defeated Maryland - the eventual ACC Tournament champ - twice during the regular season, the first when the Terrapins were ranked fifth in the nation. It was the first time in program history that the Hurricanes had defeated a top-five team. Later in the year, UM ascended to its highest ranking ever, also at No. 5.

The Hurricanes have proved to be formidable on the court in the BankUnited Center, as the 2011-12 season saw Miami go undefeated at home for the second consecutive season. Their 16-0 mark on the year pushed the Canes record home win streak to 40 straight games. Only Stanford ended the season with a longer active streak.

For her dedication to the University of Miami and the athletic department, Meier was signed to a two-year contract extension, securing the Wheaton, Ill., native through the 2017-18 season. Prior to the 2014-15 season, Meier received another extension, through the 2020-21 campaign, and donated \$75,000 back to the school to go towards women's athletics as well as challenged to community to contribute as well.

Meier earned another well-deserved extension after a 2016-17 season that included the Hurricanes hosting NCAA Tournament play for the first time since 1993. The new deal added three years to her contract, which now runs through the 2023-24 season.

Five people who have been assistants for Meier during her head coaching career have gone on to earn Division I head coaching positions: Lynn Bria (Stetson), Amanda Butler (Florida), Darrick Gibbs (North Florida), Carolyn Kieger (Marquette) and Stephanie McCormick (Western Carolina). Additionally, 20 of Meier's players at Miami have signed professional contracts after their college careers.

Through the 2016-17 campaign, Meier has a career record of 307-197, including a 231-152 mark at Miami.

A New Era

Hired April 19, 2005, Meier was appointed by then-Miami AD Paul Dee in front of national and local media, fans, alumni and support staff, signifying the beginning of a new era.

Following an unprecedented career as one of the greatest athletes to ever play in the Atlantic Coast Conference, Meier quickly established herself in the coaching ranks. Following an impressive four-year tenure as the head coach at Charlotte where she helped bring the 49er program into national prominence, Meier made it clear that her goal was to make Miami one of the premier women's basketball programs in the country.

Creating a Winning Program

In her first season, Meier wasted little time in making the first steps towards those goals. After receiving little attention in the ACC preseason polls, the Hurricanes posted an impressive overall record of 17-13. They fought through a conference that would send nine teams to the postseason, including three to the NCAA Final Four. Miami finished with a sixth-place, 6-8 record in ACC play en route to earning a berth into the second round of the 2006 Women's National Invitation Tournament.

During the season, Miami posted wins over ranked teams such as No. 25 Mississippi, No. 21 Boston College and No. 25 Virginia Tech, and nearly knocked off then-No. 1 Duke in double overtime. The Hurricanes also recorded wins over two eventual conference champions in Hartford (America East) and Oakland (Mid-Continent). Under Meier's direction, in 2005-06, standout Tamara James produced one of the greatest seasons ever seen by a UM player, becoming the Miami's all-time leading scorer. James was selected with the eighth overall pick in the 2006 WNBA Draft by the Washington Mystics.

In Meier's second season in 2006-07, the Hurricanes got off to a strong start, winning seven of their first eight games--including a 79-70 win over Indiana to claim the UM Thanksgiving Tournament title. On Dec. 1, Meier picked up her 100th career

victory as the Hurricanes defeated Jackson State, 77-50.

Renee Taylor emerged as the ACC's leading scorer, upholding Miami's streak of producing the league's leading scorer in all three years it had been a member. The All-ACC Second Team selection a set school records in single-game scoring with 42 points at Houston. In addition, transfer Maurita Reid emerged as a defensive threat, tying the school record with 10 steals versus Wake Forest and finishing among the ACC's leaders and NCAA's top 10 in steals per game.

The 2007-08 season, Meier's third with the Hurricanes, saw Maurita Reid continue her rise among the ACC elite. The senior was nothing short of impressive shooting beyond the

arc and picking opponent's pockets. She hit four or more 3-pointers on 10 different occasions and finished the season with 110 steals, good for second in the conference and fifth in the NCAA. The Queens, N.Y. native led the team in points (15.3 ppg) and rebounding (5.6 rpg) and was named to the All-ACC Defensive Team.

With the No. 21-ranked incoming recruiting class, Meier and the Hurricanes saw significant improvement during the 2008-09 season. The freshman class was highlighted by McDonald's All-American Shenise Johnson of Henrietta, N.Y., and Riquna Williams from nearby Pahokee, Fla.

Johnson lived up to the hype, as she was the team leader on the season in points, rebounds, assists and steals. Under Meier's guidance, Johnson was named the ACC Rookie of the Week on three occasions and was named to the ACC All-Freshmen team as well as ACC Honorable Mention. The versatile guard/forward also led the U19 USA team to a gold medal finish in the 2009 World Championships in Bangkok, Thailand.

The 2009-10 season was one of the most successful in program history. Under Meier's vision, the Hurricanes advanced to the WNIT Championship game. Miami posted a 22-14 overall record - the first 20-win campaign since the 2002-03 season and just the eighth all-time in history.

In her sophomore season, Johnson was joined by a healthy Riquna Williams and the duo racked up accolades throughout the season. Johnson was named first team All-ACC, while Williams garnered second-team honors. The tandem led Miami to a 5-1 WNIT record - the deepest postseason run in team history, with both earning all-tournament honors along the way.

Following the 2009-10 campaign, then-Miami AD Kirby Hocutt announced that Meier signed a contract extension through 2015.

Miami's success proved to be immediate, as it earned a conference regular season title in 2010-11 and returned to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in seven seasons.

Johnson and Williams turned out to be the All-America candidates that they were expected to become. In fact, Johnson was named to four different All-America squads and became the second player in program history to be named the conference player of the year (Frances Savage - BIG EAST - 1992). Johnson also garnered All-ACC Defensive Team honors for the second straight season and was named to the ACC All-Tournament Team. Williams, along with Johnson, was named First Team All-ACC and was the conference scoring leader, posting 21.7 points per game.

The duo combined for seven ACC Player of the Week accolades on the season as Williams took home the award on four occasions. No other team in the league was recognized more than twice for the weekly honor.

Miami's success continued into the 2011-12 season. The Canes finished second in the conference standings with a record of 14-2 and were 26-6 overall. UM also defeated the eventual conference tournament champion, Maryland, both times they played in the regular season.

Seniors Shenise Johnson and Riquna Williams continued to live up to the hype of being the nation's top backcourt duo as they were second and third in the league in scoring and each were again named First Team All-ACC. The accolade was the third straight honor for Johnson and the second for Williams. Johnson was also named to the All-ACC Defensive Team for the third consecutive season. Johnson earned a place on five different All-America teams, including the WBCA squad for the second straight year. Williams earned AP All-America third team recognition in her final collegiate campaign as well.

Unfortunately, junior forward Morgan Stroman, a former McDonald's All-American who was a Third Team All-ACC pick in 2010-11 after posting a team-best 11 double-doubles, suffered a season-ending injury midway through the conference schedule. However, junior guard Stefanie Yderstrom stepped up and ended the season with more 3-pointers than any other player in the league and was rewarded with a Third Team All-ACC nod.

Miami once again advanced to the NCAA Tournament as a No. 3 seed. The Canes traveled to Spokane, Wash., and defeated the No. 14 seed, Idaho State in the first round, but fell to host Gonzaga in the second.

The Hurricanes went to a school record third straight NCAA Tournament in 2012-13, earning a No. 8 seed. Miami dropped its first round contest to ninth-seeded Iowa, the host school, but picked up two top-10 wins during the season. Meier's Hurricanes defeated No. 6/7 Penn State and knocked off No. 5/4 Duke on senior day, marking the first win over a team in the top four of either poll in program history and the school's first win over the Blue Devils, who went 20-1 against ACC opponents that season, including winning the ACC Tournament. Stroman averaged 12.9 points and 8.8 rebounds, while Yderstrom posted 11.7 points per game, and both received First Team All-ACC honors.

After reaching the WNIT in 2014, Meier guided the Hurricanes back to the NCAA Tournament in 2015 and the 11th-seeded Hurricanes defeated No. 6 seed Washington in the first round, before dropping their second round matchup against third-seeded Iowa, the host school. The victory over the Huskies made Meier the first coach in program history to win an NCAA Tournament game in three different years.

Earlier in the 2014-15 season, Meier also led the Hurricanes to the program's first win over a team in the top four of the AP Poll. They defeated No. 4/4 Notre Dame, 78-63, the Fighting Irish's only loss in their first two years in the ACC. Sophomore guard Adrienne Motley went on to be named a consensus First Team All-ACC pick after averaging 16.9 points on 49.2 percent shooting. Meier also earned her 250th career win during the season.

In 2015-16, Meier led Miami to a 24-9 record to tie for the fifth-most wins in a season in program history. The Hurricanes defeated No. 14/10 Florida State, 74-56, to reach the ACC Tournament semifinals for the second time. Miami received a No. 5 seed the NCAA Tournament and made its fifth appearance in the field in the past six years.

The 2015-16 campaign also saw the Hurricanes beat both Duke and North Carolina in the same year for the first time. The victory at North Carolina was good for the 200th of Meier's tenure at Miami. Adrienne Motley was also tabbed as a consensus First Team All-ACC honoree for the second straight year, in addition to garnering WBCA All-America Team Honorable Mention recognition.

In 2016-17, Meier guided the Hurricanes to a second straight 24-9 record. In the quarterfinals of the ACC Tournament, Miami again defeated a Florida State team ranked in the top 10, downing the No. 8/12 Seminoles, 56-54, to earn back-to-back semifinal appearances for the first time. The Hurricanes beat four top-25 teams, defeating three ranked teams - two of which were in the top 10 - away from home for the first time in the ACC era. Miami earned a No. 4 seed in the NCAA Tournament, hosting the first two rounds of play, and reached the second round for the fourth time in seven years.

Adrienne Motley and Jessica Thomas were both consensus Second Team All-ACC picks in 2016-17, with Motley becoming Miami's fifth WNBA Draft pick. In addition, Motley, Thomas and Keyona Hayes formed the second Miami teammate trio to all reach 1,000 points and each signed a WNBA contract, the first time three Hurricanes in the same class did so.

Establishing Her Legacy as a Player

Meier's success as a coach is a direct reflection of her playing career as a standout at Duke University. A four-year letter winner for the Blue Devils under head coach Debbie Leonard from 1986-90, Meier's name is scattered throughout the Duke record books.

She currently ranks among the school's all-time career leaders in scoring average (16.2 points per game), steals (232), free throws made (447) and free throws attempted (624). She is also listed among Duke's leaders in career points (1,761), field goals made (653), field goals attempted (1,283), assists (409) and rebounding average (6.1 rebounds per game).

Meier wasted no time making her mark at Duke, earning ACC Rookie of the Year and Basketball Yearbook Freshman All-America honors in 1986. Meier injured her knee in 1988 during her junior season and ultimately missed the entire 1988-89 campaign while recovering.

Meier returned to Duke for her senior season in 1990 without missing a beat, earning Kodak/WBCA District 2 All-America and All-ACC first team accolades while being named the Blue Devils' most valuable player.

In 2002, Meier was honored by Duke for her efforts as a player when she was named to the inaugural induction class in the Blue Devils' Hall of Honor. That same year, Meier was named to the ACC's 50th Anniversary Team. In 2006, she was once again honored by the conference when she was named an ACC Legend at the 2006 ACC Women's Basketball Tournament.

Meier's success on the court was only outdone by her accomplishments in the classroom. She was named to the Dean's List from 1986-88. In 1988 she also earned GTE Academic All-America Second Team honors.

After receiving a bachelor's degree in English literature with cum laude honors in 1989, Meier went on to earn a master's degree in teaching English from Duke in 1990.

Following her career at Duke, Meier moved overseas to play three seasons with BBC Mini-Flat Waregem in Belgium from 1990-93. There, she helped lead her team to three First Division regular season titles and one Belgian Cup Championship. While in Belgium, Meier also spent time teaching classes of conversational English while coaching teams of 15- to 17-year-olds.

A native of Wheaton, Ill., Meier graduated from Wheaton Central High School in 1985 and in October 2009 was inducted into her high school's athletic hall of fame.

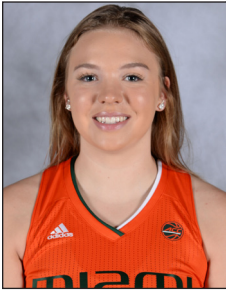
