## STORY LINES

- After capturing their series finale with then-No. 9 Virginia, the Miami Hurricanes will look to continue momentum as they open a five-game homestand Wednesday with a matchup against in-state foe Bethune-Cookman. First pitch is set for 6 p.m.
- The Hurricanes are looking to extend their run of dominance over the Wildcats, having taken 24 of 27 of the head-to-head matchups (.889 winning percentage), including each of the last five. Miami swept B-CU in a weekend series at home in 2012.
- Junior RHP **Javi Salas** will be making his third consecutive midweek start. Salas allowed just one earned run in five innings of work last time out against FAU (March 27), but was charged the loss in a 6-1 defeat. He is 2-3 with a 4.19 ERA this season.
- Among last season's top performers against the Wildcats: **Chantz Mack** (four steals, three RBI's, .429 OBP), **Brad Fieger** (two doubles, three RBI's), and **Dale Carey** (three runs, four steals).
- Wildcats starter **Montana Durapau** is 3-3 with a 4.56 ERA in eight starts. He has three complete games this season.
- Despite their 5-7 start to Atlantic Coast Conference play, the Hurricanes are ranked No. 12 in the newest WarrenNolan.com Rating Percentage Index (RPI) and No. 2 in strength of schedule.

- Salas will be making his third consecutive start in the midweek role after opening 2013 on the weekend.
- The Coral Gables, Fla., native went five innings last time out against FAU (March 27), scattering three runs in five innings of work.
- Salas delivered one of the best starts of his UM career as a sophomore against FAU, striking out a career-best 10 batters in an April 24, 2012 win over the Owls.

### 3 JIM MORRIS 2001, 1999 & 1994 COACH OF THE YEAR • 2008 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR



In his 20th season at Miami, no other program nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 40 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 19 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

- Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 870-332-3 (.724) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,374-599-4 (.696) Division I record in 31+ years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 34 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,505-640-4 (.701) mark
- In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 19 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

#### MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

- Jim Morris earned his 28th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2012 when he guided the Canes to one of 16 host sites for the first round of the postseason. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 19 seasons (1994-2012), winning 15 of his last 19 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.
- Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2012 Hurricanes to their 40th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five players from the 2012 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft: E.J. Encinosa, Eric Erickson, Steven Ewing, Peter O'Brien and Stephen Perez.

#### MORRIS IN 35th SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

- Morris currently has a 1,374-599-4 (.696) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,505-640-4 (.701) record over 30-plus years.
- Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.
- Morris entered 2013 as the fifth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball history with 1,354 wins. His impressive win total ranks him No. 12 all-time for any coach, regardless of division.
- Including his time at DeKalb C.C., Morris won his 1,500th game as a head coach in Miami's 4-1 upset of No. 1 North Carolina on March 15, 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.



#### JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

- The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with Miami in 11 of 19 seasons and led the Canes to 13 straight NCAA Regional Championships, an NCAA record.
- Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and 2001.

## HOMeward BOUND...

• The Hurricanes now boast an impressive 16-5 record (.762) inside the friendly confines of Alex Rodriguez Park, including an 8-2 mark in midweek contests played in Coral Gables.

• Including road games, the Canes are 18-7 this season inside Florida and have played just three games outside state lines (2-3). During a trip to No. 1 UNC, Miami handed the Tar Heels their first loss of the season (March 15) in Chapel Hill, N.C.

## BUILDING MOMENTUM...

• In the latest Ratings Percentage Index from *WarrenNolan.com*, Miami is ranked No. 11 in RPI and No. 2 in strength of schedule.

• The Hurricanes have a 5-6 record against teams ranked in *Baseball America's* most recent Top 25 poll, including wins over No. 1 UNC, No. 5 Virginia and a series victory over No. 22 Virginia Tech.

• After their matchup with Bethune-Cookman, Miami will host No. 8 Florida State - its fourth straight series against a ranked foe.

## STARTING OFF STRONG...

• Sophomore Chris Diaz has impressed as Friday night starter, delivering five quality starts in seven chances this season.

• The Florida City, Fla., native ranks 10th in the ACC with an ERA of 2.38, and went a career-long eight innings against Virginia Tech (March 22).

• Junior Bryan Radziewski boasts a team-best ERA of 0.98, having surrendered just three earned runs all season. He has also recorded an eye-popping 41:5 strikeout-to-walk ratio through five starts.

## LAST YEAR'S SERIES...

• The Hurricanes swept Bethune-Cookman at Alex Rodriguez in the team's penultimate home series of the 2012 regular season.

• In a pitcher's duel in the Friday opener, Miami's Eric Erickson helped deal the Wildcats their first shutout defeat since a May 2011 loss against Florida.

• Miami's offense faltered in game two, but capitalized on its chances to earn a 5-4 decision. The team recorded only two hits on the night, the fewest in a win since Miami connected for only three in a 1-0 win over UCLA in 2007.

• An up-and-down series ended on a positive note when Miami finished off the sweep of B-CU with a walk-off win in the Sunday finale. A crafty slide from Dale Carey on a ninth-inning sacrifice fly from Michael Broad earned Miami its fifth straight victory over the Wildcats.

## SCOUTING THE WILDCATS...

• B-CU is off to just a 14-17 start in 2013, but has recorded a 7-5 mark in MEAC play.

• Entering Tuesday's matchup with North Florida, the Wildcat offense has been powered by Josh Johnson (.349 average, 12 RBI's), Matt Noble (11 doubles, 23 RBI's) and Eros Modena (.310 average, 19 RBI's).

• On the hill, B-CU has been led by starters Anthony Stokes (2-1, 2.10 ERA) and Montana Durapau (3-3, 4.56).
