QUICK HITS

- The Canes continue their homestand this weekend and take on NC State and North Carolina after being at home the last two matches
- Miami has won its last 12 at home and 23 of the last 24 at the Knight Sports Complex
- Last Friday, UM defeated Duke 3-1 behind an 18 kills by sophomore middle blocker Emani Sims
- The Hurricanes dominated Wake Forest on Sunday, by set scores of 25-11, 25-17, and 25-15
- Sims won ACC Player of the Week (Oct. 1) after posting 32 kills on a .500 hitting percentage last week
- The Canes won both home matches against the Wolfpack and Tar Heels last season, and beat NC State and lost to North Carolina on the road
- North Carolina lost in the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 2011
- In the first RPI rankings of the season released on Oct. 1, Miami is No. 23 in the nation and second in the Atlantic Coast Conference, trailing only No. 19 North Carolina, while NC State is ranked No. 28
- UM leads the league in kills (810), assists (757) and digs (976)
- Nationally, the Canes are sixth in assists per set (13.76) and seventh in kills per set (14.73)
- NC State is 5-0 in the ACC, while UM, North Carolina and two other teams are right behind at 4-1
- This is the third of 10 straight weekends in conference play, as the team went 8-2 against non-conference opponents
- Emani Sims (45 kills, 15 total blocks) and Alexis Mourning (40 kills, 18 total blocks) were named to the all-tournament team in Louisville
- The Canes started ACC play with arguably the best regular win in program history over then-No. 6 Florida State, the highest ranked team it has ever defeated - the match set a new attendance record (1,129) at the Knight Sports Complex and was televised nationally on ESPNU
- The win over FSU was the 400th in program history
- Alex Johnson was named the ACC Player of the Week on Sept. 10 after posting 16 kills and 16 digs in the 3-1 win over FSU - she was also honored nationally as a Top Performer by the Collegiate Volleyball Update
- Miami is NC State's first ACC road opponent of the season (NC State has left Raleigh once this season, going 3-0 at the Hampton Inn & Suites West Ashley Invitational in Charleston, S.C.)
- Taylor Hollins has 12 double-doubles in 15 matches this season
- The Hurricanes have won their last 14 neutral site contests, but are 1-3 in true road contests this season (UM went 10-4 on the road in 2011)
- UM is 42-24 (.636) all-time against teams from the state of North Carolina
- The Canes won two of three at the Redbird Classic, as Taylor Hollins (43 kills, 37 digs) and Ryan Shaffer (65 digs) were named to the all-tournament team
- Miami started the season winning all four matches at the Hurricane Invitational, including coming back to defeat Ole Miss after trailing 2-0
- Alex Johnson won MVP at the Hurricane Invitational after racking up 48 kills on a .421 hitting percentage; Taylor Hollins and Alexis Mourning were named all-tournament
- Miami was predicted to finish fifth by the ACC coaches in a preseason poll
- Alex Johnson and Emani Sims were selected Preseason All-ACC
- The recruiting class was ranked No. 27 in the nation according to PrepVolleyball.com
- Miami has received votes in every AVCA Coaches Poll this season, moving to as high as the first spot out of the Top 25
- The Canes are 115-86-1 (.572) all-time against teams currently in the ACC

THE LAST TIME

NOV. 6, 2011: UM 3, NCSU 0

CORAL GABLES, Fla. - The University of Miami volleyball team enjoyed a "Senior Day" victory as the Hurricanes defeated NC State, 3-0, in Atlantic Coast Conference action at the James L. Knight Sports Complex. Miami took the match on scores of 27-25, 25-19 and 25-20. With the win, the Hurricanes earned their sixth consecutive victory.

After a tough five-set thrilling victory for UM in Raleigh a month before, NC State proved resilient once again.

UM led 14-11 in the opening set following a service ace from Katie Gallagher. However, the Wolfpack would later tie things up at 17-all when Rachel Buckley and Brie Merriwether combined for a block at the net. The Pack would take its first lead of the set, 22-21, following a block by Margaret Salata. After a UMiami timeout, the Hurricanes reclaimed the lead at 24-23 with the help of a service error charged to NC State and a kill from sophomore right side Alex Johnson off the feed of Gallagher.

The Hurricanes served for set point three times before outside hitter Christine Williamson placed a kill followed by a block from Ali Becker to give the Canes a 27-25 victory in the opener. Williamson laid down three of her five kills on the match in the opening set, and it was Becker picking up two of her three blocks in the frame.

There would be just a single lead change in the following two frames as the Hurricanes held the Wolfpack at bay, despite the efforts of NC State's

outside hitter Salata who finished with a match-high 19 kills and hitting at a .467 clip.

At least three Canes reach double digits in kills in consecutive matches as Johnson led all performers with 12 for the Orange and Green. All-America outside hitter Lane Carico staked 11 kills as well as redshirt freshman middle blocker Emani Sims with 11 kills and two blocks while posting a .368 hitting percentage. Becker chipped in with 10 kills on 21 swings for a team-high .429 hitting percentage while adding three blocks (two solo).

Carico registered the double-double for the Canes with 14 digs and teammate Gallagher setup the offense with a match-high 43 assists and bringing in eight digs and contributing on a block. Sophomore libero Ryan Shaffer laid out for 11 digs.

NOV. 4, 2011: UM 3, UNC 1

CORAL GABLES, Fla. - Three University of Miami players registered double-digit kills to help the homestanding Hurricanes take down the University of North Carolina, 3-1, in Atlantic Coast Conference action inside the James L. Knight Sports Complex. The Canes took down the Tar Heels on scores of 25-21, 25-21, 25-27 and 25-20.

Miami looked to avenge an earlier loss on the year to UNC in a five-set thriller in Chapel Hill back on Oct. 9.

The Hurricanes came out of the gate fast in the opening set, surging to a 15-7 advantage behind kills from redshirt freshman middle blocker Emani Sims and redshirt senior outside hitter Christine

Williamson. North Carolina would prove resilient as Chaniel Nelson and Emily McGee came alive to bring the visiting Tar Heels to within 23-20. However, a kill from senior middle blocker Ali Becker, combined with blocks from Sims and redshirt senior setter Katie Gallagher, allowed the Canes the 25-21 win in the opener.

Miami would move out to a two-set advantage heading into the break as senior All-America outside hitter Lane Carico picked up six of her team-high 17 kills in the second frame - aided by five from Becker - to give UMiami the 25-21 win.

The Canes took an early 11-7 lead in the third before the Heels leaned on Emily McGee to provide a 4-1 run that allowed UNC to take a 19-17 advantage late in the set. UMiami reclaimed the lead at 23-22 following back-to-back kills from Sims off the set of Gallagher. But moments later it was Kayla Berringer placing one of her 12 kills on the night to knot the score at 23. Miami served for match point twice until a McGee kill was followed by a pair of Hurricanes attack errors to allow UNC to grab the win, 27-25.

There were only two lead changes early-on in the fourth frame as a trio of UM players stepped up, led by the play of sophomore right side Alex Johnson with three of her eight kills coming in the set, as well as a solo block. Carico would add another three kills and the UNC offense was limited to a match-low .219 hitting percentage as UMiami grabbed the set and match victory, 25-20.

ALMA MATER: MARYLAND '94

Nicole Lantagne Welch is in her 12th season as head coach of the University of Miami volleyball program. Under her guidance since 2001, the team has posted winning records in nine of the last 11 seasons, including ending the 2010 campaign ranked No. 26 in the RPI polls and No. 28 in the Pablo rankings.

Last season Lantagne Welch guided the Hurricanes to a 26-5 overall record and a 16-4 league mark to finish second in the Atlantic Coast Conference. The Canes spent several weeks in the AVCA Top 25. UM qualified for the NCAA Tournament for the third-straight year, defeating Northern Illinois to advance to the Second Round of the Ames [Iowa] Regional. At the end of the campaign, numerous players earned recognition, including Lane Carico becoming the first Hurricane to win ACC Player of the Year. The senior also earned AVCA All-America honors to cap one of the best careers in Miami history.

This past summer, Lantagne Welch traveled to Ohio to work with the A2 program as part of development for Team USA. In addition, two players associated with the program - Ciara Michel and Savannah Leaf - both competed in the Olympic Games for Team GB.

In 2010, Lantagne Welch helped guide the Canes to their second 20-win season in the last three years, and the second consecutive year in which UMiami advanced to the NCAA Tournament. Miami ended the season with a 23-9 overall mark (13-7 Atlantic Coast Conference) and finished third in the conference regular season standings. Along the way, the Hurricanes defeated NCAA Tournament participants Florida State, Middle Tennessee State, Georgia Southern, Wichita State and North Carolina. At the end of the year, Lantagne Welch saw her first-ever AVCA All-American honored in the form of Carico, collecting third team accolades following a record-breaking year. Carico became the first player in school history with 1,000 kills and 1,000 digs in a career, as well as leading the ACC in double-doubles - and later being the only player in the league to amass at least 400 kills and 400 digs on the campaign. Carico and teammate Katie Gallagher each claimed AVCA All-East Region Team honors, while freshman libero Ryan Shaffer set a new school record for digs by a freshman (539 / 4.53 per set). As for Carico, she would also earn her third consecutive All-ACC Team nod and All-East Region honor.

In 2009, Lantagne Welch helped the Hurricanes to their second NCAA Tournament appearance, competing in the Gainesville [Fla.] Regional. UM earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament after holding the 33rd toughest schedule in the nation according to the end-of-year RPI rankings. Earlier in the season, Lantagne Welch guided the Hurricanes to the Hampton Inn & Suites Northern Colorado Classic championship. She would add to her growing list of All-Atlantic Coast Conference student-athletes, as well as All-America honorable mention performers, seeing senior libero Cassie Loessberg and sophomore outside hitter Lane Carico named to both lists. Carico and Loessberg each collected AVCA All-America Hon-

orable Mention selections, while both were tabbed to the AVCA All-East Region Team. During the 2008 campaign, Lantagne Welch led the Hurricanes to a tie for third place in the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) standings, and the team's best regular season record since 2002.

During the year, Lantagne Welch collected her 150th career victory when the 'Canes defeated NC State, 3-0, on November 21, 2008. It was just two seasons ago that she posted her 100th career victory in the 2006 season-opener for UM with a 3-2 win over Alabama. The 2008 season was special for UM as the team posted a record of 26-6 overall (14-6 ACC), finishing just one match shy of tying for an ACC Championship. Not to be overlooked was Lantagne Welch leading the 'Canes to three in-season tournament titles, including a tournament title at NCAA Tournament participant University of San Francisco as part of the Asics/Coca-Cola Invitational in San Francisco, Calif. For those achievements and more, Lantagne Welch was tabbed ACC Coach of the Year, as well as American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) East Region Coach of the Year. It was her first ACC coaching honor, while being the second AVCA Regional honor, collecting the award in 2002 during Miami's historic run to the Round of 16 in the NCAA Tournament.

Under her guidance, Lantagne Welch would later see freshman Lane Carico named ACC Freshman of the Year, as well as AVCA East Region Freshman of the Year. Carico would go on to be named to the All-ACC Second Team, as well as teammates Angelica Ellis and Genny Mayhew. Carico would represent the first-ever ACC Freshman of the Year coached by Lantagne Welch, while Ellis and Mayhew would become the seventh and eighth players in school history to be named to the All-ACC Volleyball Team. Overall, her career at UM is highlighted in part by four seasons with at least 20 wins (2003-04, '08, '10) and a trip to the "Sweet 16" in the Hurricanes' first-ever appearance at the NCAA Tournament in 2002. In her 10 years at the helm in Coral Gables, Lantagne Welch has averaged 19.2 wins per seasons with a career record of 192-109.

PIONEERING THE FIRST SEASON

On Feb. 28, 2000, then University of Miami Athletic Director Paul Dee proclaimed the return of women's volleyball as the Hurricanes newest fully funded varsity sport at UM. On Sept. 12, 2000, Dee took the next major step in the evolution of the program by announcing the hiring of Lantagne Welch as head coach of the Hurricanes.

A WINNING HISTORY

A native of Encinitas, Calif., Lantagne Welch grew up in a family where volleyball had been a major part of their livelihood. Her parents, Joe and JoAnn, owned and operated a highly regarded volleyball scouting service that evaluated high school players, covering the regions of California, Nevada and Arizona. Lantagne Welch's sister, Jenelle Duvall, was an All-American at the University of Pittsburgh and served as an assistant coach at Northern Arizona and Northern Illinois. She also served as head coach at Metro State College of Denver.

Lantagne Welch played at the University of Maryland from 1990-1993. In her role as a four-year starting setter, she guided the Terrapins to their first-ever At-

lantic Coast Conference Championship (ACC) title and an automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament in 1990. As a top collegiate setter, Lantagne Welch garnered First Team All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors in 1992 and '93, and earned Second Team All-ACC accolades in 1991. She would also be named AVCA National Player of the Week (Oct. 12, 1993) following an upset victory over Florida State.

Serving as a team captain through her final two seasons, Lantagne Welch finished her outstanding collegiate career as Maryland's all-time assists, digs and matches played leader. Throughout her career in College Park, Lantagne Welch accumulated various academic honors including ACC Honor Roll and district academic All-America as a senior. She graduated in 1994 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Marketing. For her accomplishments as a student-athlete, Lantagne Welch was named to the Atlantic Coast Conference 50th Anniversary Volleyball Team along with five other Terrapins from teams of the 1990s.

Lantagne Welch began her coaching career in 1994 as an assistant coach on the Maryland staff before becoming a graduate assistant coach at Ohio University in 1995. At Ohio, she developed training sessions for setters and assisted in the scouting of opponents and in the development of game plans. Lantagne Welch arrived at Miami after serving as an assistant coach at Texas A&M. During her three seasons there, the Aggies finished ranked in the top 20 and qualified for the NCAA Tournament each season (1997-99). In 1999, Texas A&M advanced to the elite eight of the NCAA Tournament, compiling a 28-6 record and a No. 9 final ranking. Under Lantagne Welch's training, Aggie setter Jenna Moscovic was named the 1999 Big 12 Conference Freshman of the Year and named to the All-American Freshman Team by Volleyball Magazine. As a sophomore, Moscovic was selected to the 2000 All-Big 12 Team and All-District 5 Team. Lantagne Welch also played a major role in bringing the Aggies back-to-back Top 10 recruiting classes. The 1999 class was ranked in the Top 10 by Student Sports Magazine and the 1998 class was ranked sixth by Volleyball Magazine.

In 2002, she married Wesley Paul Welch of Denver City, Texas, in her hometown of Encinitas, Calif. On Dec. 7, 2004, the couple celebrated the birth of their daughter, Riley Jaye and on April 8, 2007, son Ayden Fletcher was born. Lantagne Welch and her family reside in Miami.

EMANI SIMS NAMED PLAYER OF THE WEEK

GREENSBORO, N.C. - Sophomore middle blocker Emani Sims of the University of Miami volleyball team has been named the Atlantic Coast Conference Player of the Week, the league office announced Monday. She recorded 32 kills on a .500 hitting percentage over the weekend to help lead the Hurricanes to two home conference victories.

"Emani had an outstanding weekend for us coming up big attacking and blocking in both matches," head coach Nicole Lantagne Welch said. "She was a force at the net and made it difficult for our opponents to slow her down. It also shows the strong effort our passers, defenders and setters put forth enabling us to get the ball to her frequently. This is a well-deserved honor."

In the team's 3-1 win over Duke, Sims matched her career high with 18 kills, while notching seven total blocks at the net. Against Wake Forest, she picked up 14 kills in three sets on a .722 hitting percentage, a new career best. The sophomore made only one error in 18 total attempts against the Deacons.

For the season, Sims has 148 kills on a .343 hitting percentage (ninth-best in the ACC). In addition, the middle blocker is fourth in the league with 1.20 blocks/set. She was named to the Preseason All-ACC Team.

This marks the second career ACC weekly honor for Sims, who was also named Freshman of the Week on Oct. 31, 2011. She follows junior right side Alex Johnson as the second Hurricane to win Player of the Week (Sept. 10) this season.

MIAMI ROLLS PAST WAKE FOREST

In one of its more dominating performances of the season, the University of Miami volleyball team took care of Wake Forest in three sets on Sunday at the Knight Sports Complex. Sophomore middle blocker Emani Sims continued her strong play with 14 kills on the day, bringing her weekend total to 32.

UM won by set scores of 25-11, 25-17 and 25-15 to improve to 12-3 on the season and 4-1 in the Atlantic Coast Conference, while Wake Forest dropped to 6-10 and 0-4. The 43 points allowed were the fewest permitted this season by the Canes, playing in their second of seven broadcasted matches this season (ESPN3).

"It was nice to really come out and be ready to play today," head coach Nicole Lantagne Welch said. "We did a nice job with our serving and passing to get them out of system and give us a chance to run all of our options offensively."

Sims, who totaled 18 kills against Duke on Friday, followed with a match-high 14 in three sets today. She hit at a career-high .722 clip with just one error in 18 total attempts, as the Hurricanes had their best hitting percentage against an ACC opponent this season (.433).

On the front line, sophomore middle blocker Alexis Mourning had five block assists to help UM collect eight total blocks. Miami had eight service aces in the match.

"The blocking today was a testament to how well we served," Lantagne Welch continued. "That got them out of position and our blockers stayed disciplined to make the plays."

Junior libero Ryan Shaffer notched 14 digs to bring her total to 265 for the season, while senior setter Nrithya Sundararaman had 34 assists (568 for the season).

In addition, junior right side Alex Johnson picked up nine kills and nine digs on a .692 hitting percentage.

In a match that saw just two lead changes on the day, Miami went on a 19-4 run to win the first set after the score

was tied at six. The second was more of the same, with UM never falling behind and running away after starting up 11-4. The match was won with the Canes hitting .522 in the third.

Anna Carley recorded 10 kills for the Demon Deacons.

CANES TAKE DOWN DUKE

CORAL GABLES, Fla. - Behind a match-high 18 kills by sophomore middle blocker Emani Sims, the University of Miami volleyball team defeated Duke, 3-1, on Friday at the Knight Sports Complex. The Canes have now won 11 straight at home and 22 of the last 23.

UM won by set scores of 25-18, 19-25, 29-27 and 25-21 to improve to 11-3 on the season and 3-1 in the Atlantic Coast Conference, while Duke dropped to 9-6 and 0-3.

"I thought it was a high-level volleyball match tonight," head coach Nicole Lantagne Welch said. "Duke forced us to raise our level of with their great defense. We had to be patient and our middles played really well. It is always challenging to win an ACC match."

Sims tied her career high with 18 kills, a mark she also reached earlier this season against Middle Tennessee (Sept. 15). In addition, the middle blocker recorded seven total blocks on the front line to keep the pressure on the opponent and had a hitting percentage of .395.

"Emani is hard to stop when she is on," Lantagne Welch commented. "She was able to make herself available on both transition and serve-receive to be a force in the middle."

Sophomore Alexis Mourning concurrently matched her career high with 16 kills on the night. Also a middle blocker, she combined for five total blocks, as Miami recorded five more total team blocks than Duke (12.0-7.0).

Defensively, junior libero Ryan Shaffer picked up 22 digs to lead the Canes, while sophomore outside hitter Savannah Leaf had 20 digs of her own. Senior setter Nrithya Sundararaman put up a match-high 46 assists.

In the first set, the Canes won three-straight points after breaking a 10-10 tie and never looked back to win the opener, 25-18. Sims had six kills in the set. However, the Blue Devils responded by putting together an 11-4 run in the middle of the second and pulled away to even the match at one.

The pivotal third set, which included eight ties, proved to be the difference in the contest. Miami surged ahead late to go up 23-20, but Duke won the next three points to even. UM had a chance to win it after a kills by Sims, but a Blue Devil block forced extra points. Duke then took the next point to give themselves set point and nearly won it on a kill, but a great defensive effort by UM led to another Sims kill. The Canes fended off two more set points and rallied to seal it on an ace by junior right side Alex Johnson. It was the seventh set this year that went extra points for UM.

"That set was a good challenge for us," Lantagne Welch said. "It was a situation we can refer back to when we are facing set points in the future. We held our composure and stayed steady throughout and took advantage of the opportunities when they presented themselves."

The fourth set was just as taxing and featured 11 ties and five lead changes. After winning a point to go up 17-16, the Canes slowly edged away and took advantage of some opposing hitting errors to win the set and the match.

For the match, Miami collected 56 kills and 83 digs. Junior outside hitter Taylor Hollins recorded her 12th double-double of the season with 10 kills and 14 digs.

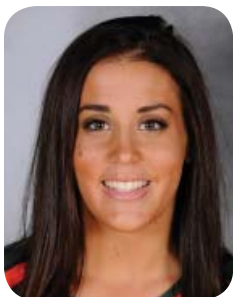
