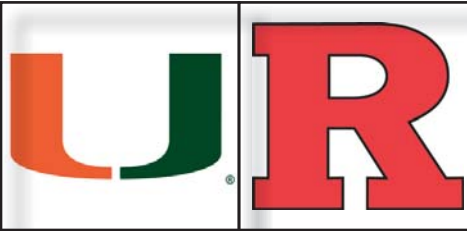

Opening Day for the Hurricanes

The University of Miami opens the 2011 season against Rutgers, the second time in as many years the 'Canes have opened the season against the Scarlet Knights. Miami swept Rutgers last season in the season-opening three-game stretch for both teams.

Miami enters the season ranked in the Top 25 of all six preseason polls, including a No. 18 mark in both the Collegiate Baseball poll and USA Today/ESPN poll. The 'Canes enter 2011 with a 14-3 record on opening day under Jim Morris, including winning the last three.

Miami has had the luxury of playing at home to open the season in 16 of the 17 years Jim Morris has been head coach (the only year not at home was in 1997 when UM went to Hawai'i), with this year serving as the 17th season at home for the season-opener.

Rookie Gets the Ball

Freshman left-hander Bryan Radziewski will start the game on the mound for the Hurricanes Friday night, marking the first time in the 18-year tenure under head coach Jim Morris to start a rookie on opening day. Radziewski, a Florida Christian School alum, was named the Florida Class 1-4A Player of the Year in 2010 as a senior in high school.

Scouting Rutgers

Entering 2011, the Scarlet Knights have all the pieces in place to build on the accomplishments of a 30-win season and appearance in the semifinals of the BIG EAST Conference Championship last spring. Rutgers welcomes back 20 letterwinners and five starters from last season, including a nucleus headlined by All-Americans Steve Nyisztor and Tyler Gebler. The sophomore duo will be joined by a talented class of newcomers with the ability to offset the loss of four players who moved on to professional baseball last summer.

Three of RU's top five hitters from 2010 return to the lineup this spring, highlighted by Nyisztor, who hit .410 with 17 doubles and four home runs in his freshman All-American campaign last spring. He will move from second base to shortstop this season next to veteran third baseman Russ Hopkins. In his first season as an everyday player, Hopkins hit .333 and drove in 25 runs in 47 games last spring. Senior right fielder Michael Lang will once again provide power in the Scarlet Knights' lineup after a season where he hit 18 doubles, four triples and 12 home runs to go along with a .317 average from the leadoff spot in 2010.

Miami Against Rutgers

The Hurricanes hold a commanding 44-11 all-time series advantage against the Scarlet Knights dating back to 1967. Miami has won 11 of the last 12 meetings against Rutgers, including four consecutive dating back to 2009.

Pitching Matchup for the Weekend

The Hurricanes will be throwing a freshman and two sophomores this weekend. Rutgers counters with two sophomores and a junior. Collectively, the Hurricanes' returning pitchers who will take the mound this weekend (E.J. Encinosa & Eric Whaley) turned in a 6-2 record.

UNIVERSITY OF MIAMI HEAD COACH JIM MORRIS - 18TH SEASON

2001, 1999, & 1994 National Coach of the Year • 2008 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR



In his 18th season at Miami, no other program, nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a NCAA-record 38 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 17 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 26 years, 17 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 776-298-3 (.721) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,280-542-4 (.701) Division I record in 29 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 32 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,411-583-4 (.706) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 18 years, Morris has personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and has logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the new stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 26th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2010 when he guided the 'Canes to the NCAA Coral Gables Regional. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 17 seasons (1994-2010), winning 15 of his last 17 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris has led the 2010 Hurricanes to their 38th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five players from the 2010 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft. In 2008, the 'Canes reached the College World Series after winning the Atlantic Coast Conference, widely considered one of the toughest - if not the toughest - collegiate baseball conference in the country.

MORRIS IN HIS 33RD SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

Morris currently has a 1,279-540-4 (.703) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,410-581-4 (.708) record over 30-plus years.

Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.

Prior to his 17 seasons in Coral Gables, Morris went 504-244-1 at Georgia Tech from 1982-1993. In his first stint as a head coach, he guided DeKalb Junior College to a 131-41 mark from 1976-79.

JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

- Guided the Miami Hurricanes to College World Series National Championship in 1999 and 2001.
- The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with Miami in 11 of 17 seasons and led Miami to 13 straight NCAA Regional Championships, an NCAA record.
- Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami, by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and 2001.

SHORTSTOPS AND JIM MORRIS

Morris, who played shortstop during college at Elon and then in the Boston Red Sox organization, has had great success developing the position while a head coach. Over the last decade Morris has taught prominent shortstops such as Nomar Garciaparra at Georgia Tech and Bobby Hill and Alex Cora at Miami.

Morris worked with Javy Rodriguez, who entered 2002 as a preseason All-American. Rodriguez led UM in just about every category as a junior in 2001, including a national-high 66 stolen bases. He currently works with sophomore Stephen Perez, a slick-fielding switch-hitter expected to bat near the upper-half of the order this year for the 'Canes.

Morris coached Hill, who played for the San Diego Padres, from 1997-99. Before Hill, it was Cora and Mike Metcalfe. Both players went on to play at the Major League level with the Los Angeles Dodgers. Cora is currently with the Mets. Garciaparra played under Morris during the coaches' final two seasons in Atlanta and went on to become an All-Star with the Red Sox and played for the Oakland A's in 2009.

Martinez, a star-studded Miami native, batted .295 in 2010, driving in 69 runs on 71 hits and crossing the plate 48 times. In the NCAA Gainesville Super Regional, Martinez suffered an injury in which he spent the entire summer rehabilitating and getting ready for the 2011 campaign.

Miami Predicted to Finish Third In Coastal Division

Miami baseball has been predicted to finish third in the Coastal Division of the Atlantic Coast Conference Coaches Preseason Poll. The poll is voted on by the league's 12 head coaches. Capturing a 20-10 league record in 2010, the Hurricanes finished the year third in the Coastal Division behind Virginia and Georgia Tech, respectively. Miami posted a 43-20 overall record en route to claiming the NCAA Coral Gables Regional title, and advancing to the NCAA Gainesville Super Regional.

Encinosa Returns as All-American

Sophomore right-hander E.J. Encinosa registered a 1-1 record in 2010, posting an ERA of 2.20 in 29 appearances on the hill. For his efforts, Encinosa was named to the *Louisville Slugger* Freshman All-America Team. On the year, Encinosa turned in 61 strikeouts in 49 complete innings of work.

To Be the Best. Play the Best

According to Boyd's World RPI [strength of schedule], the UMiami Hurricanes have the 33rd toughest schedule in the nation. The 'Canes not only play the top-ranked University of Florida Gators on the road in the third series of the year, but there is the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) schedule. The ACC has been ranked as one of the top three toughest leagues in the nation the past five years by multiple collegiate baseball publications.

Hurricanes On the Net

University of Miami baseball games this season will be broadcast live on HurricaneSports.com with video webcasts for every home game, courtesy of Hurricanes All-Access. All road games will feature a live audio broadcast through WVUM—the student voice of all things UMiami.

New Era Behind the Plate

Three catchers will be battling for playing time behind the plate this year, including junior David Villasuso. A season ago, Villasuso batted .245 with 20 RBI and five home runs while serving as a backup to MLB First Round Draft selection and 2010 ACC Player of the Year, Yasmani Grandal.

Others battling for playing time this season will be freshmen Corey Janson and Shane Rowland. Rowland comes from a baseball family, as his father Donny played baseball at the "U". Thus, making Shane and Donny to become the school's first-ever "Father/Son" tandem to have played baseball at UMiami.

Fresh Faces In the Dugout

This season, head coach Jim Morris has one of his youngest teams in recent memory. UMiami has 13 newcomers on this year's roster (12 freshman and one sophomore transfer). The 'Canes lost 2010 ACC Player of the Year, Yasmani Grandal, to the MLB Draft—Grandal was selected 12th overall in the Draft.

MIAMI IN THE ACC

The 2011 season marks the seventh season the 'Canes have played in the Atlantic

Coast Conference, and last year's 20-10 regular season mark in league play was the program's second-best behind the 2008 ACC championship squad that won 23 regular season league games.

MORRIS SIGNS EXTENSION

On Sept. 20, 2009, University of Miami Director of Athletics Kirby Hocutt announced that head baseball coach Jim Morris signed a contract extension through 2015. Morris, who is in his 17th season at the helm of the Miami baseball program, has led the Hurricanes to the College World Series in 11 of his 16 seasons in Coral Gables - including National Championship runs in 1999 and 2001.

Staying Power

Miami is ranked 18th in this year's Collegiate Baseball Newspaper preseason poll. The Hurricanes have been ranked in the top 20 in every CBN preseason poll since 1999, something only one other school (Cal State Fullerton) has achieved this. Miami has won two national titles in that time period to CSF's one.

Miami Gets Them Drafted

Over the last three years, Miami has produced four first round MLB draft picks, more than any other school in the nation. Last year, Yasmani Grandal was selected in the first round by the Cincinnati Reds, with four other players—David Gutierrez (Minnesota Twins), Chris Hernandez (Boston Red Sox), Scott Lawson (Houston Astros) and Iden Nazario (Washington Nationals) all taken on the second day of the Draft.

Last Year's ERA

Last season, from March 12 vs. Boston College, the Hurricanes never had a team ERA higher than 3.92.

Melendres Looks to Keep It Hot

Junior outfielder Nathan Melendres was hitting just .260 on April 20 (vs. Bethune-Cookman), but he ended the season hot and finished with a .301 batting average. He finished with 35 hits in his last 29 games.

Canes In the Classroom

During the fall semester of 2010, the University of Miami baseball team recorded its highest team GPA ever. Freshman catcher Corey Janson collected a 4.0 GPA last semester, giving him one of the highest GPAs in the entire UMiami Athletic Department.

ALEX RODRIGUEZ PARK INFORMATION

Renovations to Alex Rodriguez Park are thanks in large part to a \$3.9 million contribution by New York Yankees third baseman and 11-time MLB All-Star Alex Rodriguez. The gift - the largest ever to the University of Miami baseball program - has assisted the program in continuing to develop first-class facilities. The official announcement of his gift was made on Oct. 10, 2002.

Alex Rodriguez Park has taken form in a three-phase process:

- Phase I called for seating modifications, new dugouts, new stadium lighting and utility infrastructure and new rest rooms.
- Phase II entailed renovating below the grand stand area in addition to adding new concession areas.
- The final phase included adding a new clubhouse, weight room, training room, meeting room, video room and academic area. In addition, a new press box – along with four VIP suites – have been built atop the grandstand. This past offseason, addition seating was added down both lines while a new scoreboard was constructed in left field.
