MIAMI HEADS TO LANE STADIUM TO FACE HOKIES IN ACC BATTLE

► The Miami Hurricanes will play in their first road game since their season opener at Maryland on Sept. 5 when they head to Virginia Tech's Lane Stadium on Saturday. The game will start at 3:30 p.m. and will be televised on ABC/ESPN. Since the Labor Day loss to the Terrapins, Miami played three straight at home, defeating then-No. 17/16 Ohio State (Sept. 17) and Bethune-Cookman (Oct. 1) and falling to upstart Kansas State (Sept. 24).

► Miami's leading tackler Sean Spence has been named the College Football Performance Awards Honorable Mention Linebacker of the Week in consecutive weeks. The senior first earned the honor in Miami's loss to Kansas State after he tied a career high with 14 tackles with a sack and 2.5 tackles for loss. His second honor came after recording a team-leading eight tackles against Bethune-Cookman. On the year, Spence has tallied a team-best 28 tackles, 17 of those solo.

► Senior Jacory Harris has passed for 570 yards this season with six touchdowns and only three interceptions. He already has cemented his place in the Miami record books as he is likely to surpass everyone but Ken Dorsey in most statistical categories. Harris is also moving up the career charts among ACC quarterbacks. With his 175-yard passing performance against Bethune-Cookman, Harris passed Florida State's Christian Ponder for 25th place in the conference with 6,910 for his career. Harris' 56 career touchdown passes put him in a 13th-place tie with Virginia's Matt Schaub and Boston College's Matt Ryan.

► With his season-best 44-yard punt return against Bethune-Cookman, senior Travis Benjamin bumped his punt return average to 21.2 yards per return, which trails only Oregon's LaMichael James (22.8). Only three student-athletes average 20 or more yards per return, the other being Jeff Scott of Ole Miss (20.14), for the best mark in the nation.

► Redshirt sophomore running back Lamar Miller became the first Miami running back to reach 100 yards rushing in the first four games of a season after he recorded 102 against Bethune-Cookman. Miller currently ranks eighth nationally in rushing yards per game at 127.75.

HURRICANE HOTLINE

The MIAMI-VIRGINIA TECH SERIES

- ▶ The Canes will arrive in Blacksburg sporting an all-time record of 17-11 against the Hokies, with their first ever meeting coming in 1953.
- ▶ Miami is looking for its first win in Blacksburg since 2005.
- ▶ Since both joining the ACC, the Canes have gone 2-5 against Virginia Tech.

A CANES WIN OVER THE HOKIES WOULD...

- ▶ Be the Canes' second win over a Top 25 opponent this season.
- ▶ Level Miami's conference record at 1-1.
- ▶ Give Al Golden his first road victory as head coach of the Hurricanes.
- ▶ Give Al Golden his first Atlantic Coast Conference victory.

The COACHES

▶ Al Golden is in his first year as Miami's head coach and owns an overall record of 29-36. Hokies' head coach Frank Beamer is in his 25th season at Virginia Tech and owns a record of 202-96-2, leading the Hokies to 18 straight bowl appearances while ranking second in wins among active NCAA head coaches.

Scouting THE HOKIES

- ▶ Junior running back David Wilson currently ranks third in the nation in rushing yards with 639 on 107 attempts and five scores.
- ▶ Florida native CB Jayron Hosley is tied for second in the nation with three interceptions.
- ▶ Virginia Tech enters the contest with the fourth-best defense nationally and the second-best rush defense, allowing a scant average of 58.2 yards on the ground per game.
- ▶ The Hokies' offense spreads the wealth, as nine different players have scored a touchdown this season.

Up NEXT...

▶ The Hurricanes will play on the road for the second straight week, traveling to Chapel Hill to take on the Tar Heels on Oct. 15 before heading back to Sun Life Stadium to face the Yellow Jackets of Georgia Tech on Oct. 22.

Streak CONTINUES

- ▶ Former Hurricanes and current proCanes Santana Moss (Washington), Jimmy Graham (New Orleans), Devin Hester (Chicago), Greg Olsen (Carolina) and Frank Gore (San Francisco) all scored touchdowns in Week 4 of the NFL season.
- ▶ At least one former Cane has now scored a touchdown every NFL week since Week 15 of the 2002 season - a span of 143 straight weeks.

Canes OPEN NEW ERA UNDER HEAD COACH AL GOLDEN

- ▶ First-year head coach Al Golden won his second game as a Hurricane when Miami defeated Bethune-Cookman, 45-14, at Sun Life Stadium on Oct. 1.
- ▶ Golden owns an overall record of 29-36 and is in his sixth season as a head coach.
- ▶ Golden arrived in Coral Gables after spending the last five seasons as the head coach at Temple University. Over five seasons at Temple, Golden took the Owls to unprecedented heights. Before his arrival, TU had just two winning seasons over its previous 26 years and had only won 22 percent of its games over the previous 30 years. Quickly, Golden made the Owls a contender, leading the team to a combined record of 17-8 his last two years there. The 2009 season marked Temple's first winning season since 1990, and Golden was rewarded with MAC Coach of the Year honors.

GAME DAY PRESS POLICIES

Only working press will be admitted to the Sun Life Stadium press box. Seats will be issued according to the following criteria:

1. State newspapers by circulation, wire services, national publications, newspapers from opponent's area, and student newspapers from UM and opponent's schools.
2. Other daily newspapers, with preference to those that regularly cover UM.
3. Radio and television personnel not broadcasting, but considered reporting.
4. Non-daily newspapers, with preference to those which regularly cover UM.
5. Scouts. Freelance and/or non-daily writers may be asked to produce copies of actual publications in which their work has appeared. In some cases, these materials will be required as verification of the writers' status.

Travis BENJAMIN STEPPING UP

- ▶ Senior WR/PR/KR Travis Benjamin is putting up some gaudy numbers this season. The Belle Glade, Fla. native is currently ranked second nationally in punt return yardage with 21.2 yards per return.
- ▶ After his performance against Bethune-Cookman, Benjamin has surpassed teammate Lamar Miller as the Canes' leading kick returner, gaining 24.7 yards per attempt in his seven chances for a total of 173 yards.
- ▶ His all-purpose yards are also on the rise. Benjamin is third on the squad with 170 receiving yards and leads all players with 85 punt return yards and 173 kick return yards. In all, he averages 145.7 yards per game, trailing only Lamar Miller's 166.2

Players RETURN TO THE LINEUP

- ▶ DB Ray-Ray Armstrong and TE Dyron Dye will return to the lineup against Virginia Tech after serving their four-game suspension imposed by the NCAA.
- ▶ DL Olivier Vernon will be required to sit out two more contests.

Canes SCHEDULE AMONG THE TOUGHEST

- ▶ According to Phil Steele's College Football Preview, Miami will face the 10th-toughest schedule of any FBS school this season. Only Colorado, Iowa State, Baylor, Oregon State, LSU, Boston College, USC, Washington and Auburn face a tougher road according to the publication.
- ▶ After traveling to Maryland for the season-opener, the Canes returned home to host non-conference foes Ohio State and Kansas State and Bethune-Cookman in three consecutive weeks at Sun Life Stadium. In the coming weeks, Miami will face a pair of difficult tests on the road in consecutive trips to Virginia Tech (Oct. 8) and North Carolina (Oct. 15). The yearly rivalry game with Florida State will also come on the road, as the Canes will travel to Tallahassee to face the Seminoles on Nov. 12.
- ▶ UM was only one of six FBS programs to play its first three games against BCS-conference opponents. The others are USC, FAU, Rice, Notre Dame and BYU.

Spence AND ROBINSON EARN WEEKLY AWARDS

- ▶ Seniors LB Sean Spence and DE Marcus Robinson were named College Football Performance Awards Honorable Mention Performers of the Week at their respective positions after their performance in Miami's 45-14 win over Bethune-Cookman on Oct. 1.
- ▶ Spence recorded a team-best eight tackles in the win, while Robinson sacked the quarterback a career-best three times, totaling five tackles overall.
- ▶ Spence also earned the honor after his performance against Kansas State, when he tied a career-high with 14 tackles. He also was in on one sack and 2.5 tackles for loss.

A GAME OF FIRSTS - BETHUNE-COOKMAN RECAP

- ▶ Freshman DE Anthony Chickillo made his first career start against Bethune-Cookman, recording 1.5 sacks and four tackles on the day.
- ▶ In the first quarter, DT Micanor Regis recorded UM's first sack of the game and his first of the season. The senior started the game with 3.5 career sacks.
- ▶ Wide receiver Tommy Streater reeled in his second TD of the game with a 27-yard reception from Harris to put the Canes ahead 30-14. This is the first game Streater has recorded multiple TDs. He ended the game with two receptions for 83 yards.
- ▶ Linebacker Nantambu Fentress and DB Kacy Rodgers recorded their first tackles of their careers against B-CU.
- ▶ Linebacker Kelvin Cain recorded his first-career interception and returned it for a touchdown for the Canes.
- ▶ Several players saw their first action of the year...Akil Craig, Darion Hall, Keion Payne, Nate Gholston, Tyrone Cornileus, Shayon Green, Sean Goldstein, Fentress, Sean McNally, Sean Harvey, Seanrel Henderson, Chris Dunckel and Cain.

Star POWER

- ▶ Miami (20) and Virginia Tech (5) have combined for 25 national award winners. Miami (44) and Virginia Tech (23) also have a combined 67 former players currently on NFL rosters.

Combined BOWL DOMINANCE

- ▶ Miami (19) and Virginia Tech (9) have combined for 28 bowl wins. The Hurricanes have made 36 bowl appearances all-time, while the Hokies have played in the postseason 23 times.

Canes ROCK-TOBER

- ▶ The Canes are 194-96-8 all-time during the month of October. The Canes kicked off the month of October with a 45-14 win over Bethune-Cookman.
- ▶ Last year UM finished the month with a 3-2 record with wins at Clemson, at Duke and home against North Carolina. The Canes dropped a pair of contests to Florida State at home and at Virginia.

The BUCK STOPS HERE

► Coming into the Sept. 17 game, Ohio State had not allowed a sack in any of its last 90 pass attempts, the third-longest active FBS streak at the time. The Hurricanes ended that streak at 95, as Canes defensive lineman Darius Smith sacked OSU QB Braxton Miller to end the first quarter, then freshmen defensive end Anthony Chickillo recorded his first career sack in the second half.

► The UM defense held the Ohio State quarterbacks to 4-for-18 passing, marking the lowest number of completed passes against a UM defense since the Canes held Wake Forest to just three completions in 2008. Ohio State had only four passing yards in the first half and ended the night with 35 yards.

► The Hurricanes didn't allow Ohio State to score a touchdown in the game, a feat last accomplished by Penn State in 2008.

J12 AMONG THE BEST

▶ Jacory Harris is among the nation's best 25 quarterbacks with a passing efficiency of 155.89. Harris has connected on 49 of 79 passes with six touchdowns and three interceptions.

▶ Harris entered the season ranked among Miami's top signal callers as he appears in six different career records categories.

▶ Harris is ranked second all-time in pass completions and touchdowns thrown, while ranking third in completion percentage, attempts, passing yardage and total offense. Harris is on track to upend Ken Dorsey in two categories, needing to complete 102 passes and attempt 213 passes to surpass Dorsey as the record holder. Last season he connected on 148 passes and attempted 270.

▶ He moved into sole possession of second place all-time in career passing TDs on Oct. 23, 2010 when he threw touchdown passes to LaRon Byrd, Travis Benjamin and Leonard Hankerson against the Tar Heels.

▶ With his two TD passes against Bethune-Cookman, Harris moved into a tie for 13th place on the ACC's Career TD passes list with 56. The senior is now tied with Matt Schaub (Virginia - 2000-03) and Matt Ryan (Boston College - 2004-07). NC State's Phillip Rivers is the all-time leader with 95.

▶ Harris passed Florida State's Christian Ponder (2007-10; 6,882), with his 175-yard performance against Bethune-Cookman, for 25th place on the ACC's career passing yardage stats, as he now has 6,910 career passing yards.

▶ Miller is the only RB (in FBS) with a rush of at least 40 yards in every game this season.

▶ Miller trails Virginia Tech's David Wilson by 0.2 yards per game for the ACC lead in rushing, averaging 127.8 yards per contest. The conference's third-place rusher, UNC's Giovani Bernard trails Miller by 18.2 yards per game.

▶ Miller ranks eighth nationally in rushing yards per game, trailing only LaMichael James (Oregon), Ronnie Hillman (SDSU), Ray Graham (Pittsburgh), Denard Robinson (Michigan), Marcus Lattimore (South Carolina), Henry Josey (Missouri) and David Wilson (Virginia Tech).

▶ Miller recorded 102 rushing yards on 14 carries against B-CU, posting his fourth-straight game with at least 100 yards rushing. Miller is the first Cane to open the season with four-straight 100-yard rushing games. The closest to the record was Willis McGahee, who started the 2002 season with 100-plus in four of the first five games. The last time a Cane recorded four straight 100-yard rushing games was Damien Berry in 2010, from Oct. 2-23.

▶ Miller joins former Canes Stephen McGuire (1989-91) and Graig Cooper (2007-10) with six career 100-yard rushing games. Edgerrin James (1995-98) is the all-time leader with 15 games of 100 or more yards on the ground.

▶ Of his nine career rushes/receptions of 25-yards or more, six have come after halftime.

▶ Miller has seven plays of 25-yards or longer this season: 5 rushes and two kick returns.

▶ Against this weekend's opponent - Virginia Tech - Miller had a breakout game last season with 163 yards and two long runs. One run was for 47 yards and another for 28 yards. Both came in the third quarter of that game. Until the Ohio State game this season (184 yards), Miller's output against Tech was a career best.

UM LEADS STATE & NO. 38 IN U.S. NEWS & WORLD REPORT RANKINGS

► In the 2012 edition of the *U.S. News & World Report's* annual "Best Colleges" issue, released today, the University of Miami has risen to number 38 - up from 47 last year, a nine point rise. UM remains the highest ranked school in the state of Florida.

► In an impressive ascent, UM has moved up 29 slots in the last 10 years, making it one of the fastest-rising institutions among national universities in recent times. UM is the only school currently in the top 50 to move up nine spots in one year and 29 spots in the past 10 years.

Home SWEET SUNSHINE STATE HOME

► This Saturday's game will be the second of three three games that the Canes will play outside of the Sunshine State this season.

► Miami traveled to Maryland to open the season and will travel to North Carolina the next week.

► Nine games this season will be played in Florida, including a trip to Tallahassee to face Florida State on Nov. 12 and to Tampa for a tilt with USF on November 19.

Miami FOOTBALL RANKED EIGHTH NATIONALLY IN APR

► When the NCAA's Academic Progress Report (APR) was announced in May, the Canes' football program headlined an outstanding academic showing by the University of Miami this past school year. The football team (along with baseball, men's basketball and men's tennis) improved upon its APR score for an impressive seventh straight season. In fact, the UM football program's APR score (978) ranked eighth among all FBS schools.

Eight CANES GO IN 2011 NFL DRAFT

► The University of Miami's success in the NFL Draft continued this past spring, as eight Canes were selected in 2011. Orlando Franklin (2nd round to Denver), Brandon Harris (2nd round to Houston), Leonard Hankerson (3rd round to Washington), DeMarcus Van Dyke (3rd round to Oakland), Allen Bailey (3rd round to Kansas City), Colin McCarthy (4th round to Tennessee), Richard Gordon (6th round to Oakland) and Matt Boshier (6th round to Atlanta) were all taken off the board in the Top 200 picks.

► Miami's eight draftees trailed only USC (9) and North Carolina (9) for the most in the country in 2011.

► Since 2000, only Ohio State (78) and USC (77) have had more players drafted than the Canes (75).

► Miami continues to comfortably lead the nation in first round draft picks in recent years, as 26 Canes have been selected in the first round since 2000. Ohio State (17) remains a distant second.

Honoring A LEGEND

► UM honored Russell Maryland in an on-field ceremony in the Sept. 17 contest against Ohio State to commemorate the defensive tackle's upcoming induction into the College Football Hall of Fame in December.

► Maryland finished his college career with 279 tackles, 25 tackles for losses and 20.5 quarterback sacks. He was the Jack Harding Most Valuable Player Award winner in 1990 and led the Hurricanes to four consecutive bowl berths, two national championships and an overall record of 45-3 during his career.
