#5THINGS

- 1 Interim head coach Larry Scott will be coaching his first game at the helm of the Hurricanes against No. 18/22 Duke.
- 2 Miami carries a 10-2 all-time record against the Blue Devils into Saturday's matchup, including a 5-1 all-time mark in Durham.
- 3 QB Brad Kaaya's 1,846 passing yards are tops among ACC quarterbacks; he is averaging an ACC-best 263.7 yards per game.
- 4 Miami's +11 turnover margin is the secondbest mark in the nation; Miami has lost just five turnovers, sixth-fewest in FBS.
- 5 Both redshirt senior WR Rashawn Scott (1,019) and junior WR Stacy Coley (1,042) surpassed 1,000 career receiving yards last time out against Clemson.

CANES TRAVEL TO DURHAM TO BATTLE BLUE DEVILS

- Miami travels to Wallace Wade Stadium to face off against ACC Coastal Division foe Duke on Saturday, Oct. 31. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. (ESPNU).
- The Hurricanes carry a commanding 10-2 all-time series lead against Duke, including a 5-1 mark in Durham. UM won the 2014 matchup between the schools, a 22-10 decision at Sun Life Stadium.
- Duke, ranked No. 18 in the USA Today Coaches Poll & No. 22 by the Associated Press, represent Miami's third ranked opponent of 2015; the Hurricanes played at No. 8/12 Florida State on Oct. 10 and played No. 6/6 Clemson last weekend (Oct. 31).
- Interim head coach Larry Scott will be coaching his first game at the helm of the Hurricanes; former head coach Al Golden was relieved of his duties on Sunday, Oct. 25.

INSIDE THE NUMBERS

Heading into the eighth week of the college football season, the Hurricanes rank among the top 10
in five national statistical categories. The Canes are also rank second nationally in turnover margin.

YIPPEE KAAYA

- Sophomore QB Brad Kaaya remains near the top of the ACC in a number of individual categories, including passing yards (1,846, first), passing yards per game (263.7, first) and total offense (1,789 yards, fourth).
- Kaaya has thrown just five interceptions in his last 431 attempts. He has thrown for more than 200 yards in 14 of his 20 career games at Miami and has five career 300-yard performances.
- Kaaya's career home numbers (11 games) stand out: 2,719 passing yards, 24 TDs & just 6 INTs.
- Kaaya set personal bests in completions (29), attempts (49) and pass yards (405) at Florida State (Oct. 10), tossing three touchdowns with no interceptions. His passer efficiency rating was 148.8.
- Kaaya's 405 yards were the most by a Miami quarterback vs. Florida State in the modern era of Miami football (since 1980), and represent just the 11th 400-yard game in that same timespan.
- The California native was one of only 15 quarterbacks in the country to throw for more than 3,000 yards, 26-or-more touchdowns and 12-or-fewer interceptions in 2014; he was the only true freshman quarterback in the country to accomplish this feat.
- As a freshman in 2014, Kaaya was named the ACC Offensive and ACC Overall Rookie of the Year after a stellar first campaign with the Hurricanes.
- Kaaya ranked second in the ACC in passing yards (3,198), and led the ACC in passing touchdowns (26), passing efficiency (145.9) and passing yards per completion (14.5) during his freshman year.

GREAT SCOTT

- After missing the entire 2014 campaign with an injury, redshirt senior wide receiver Rashawn Scott
 has made a strong return to Miami's wide receiver corps in 2015.
- Scott ranks third in the ACC in receiving yards per game heading into the ninth week of the season, averaging 66.7 yards. The redshirt senior has started all seven games in 2015 and leads the team in receptions (35), receiving yards (467) and receiving touchdowns (4).
- Scott ranks fifth in the ACC in receptions per game (5.0) and fifth in total receptions (35).
- The Melbourne, Fla., native had his second career multi-TD game (2) vs. Virginia Tech on Oct. 17.

THIRD TIME'S A CHARM

- Miami's defensive unit has made a habit this season of dominating the third quarter.
- In seven games this season, Miami has outscored its opponents by a 44-13 count and has allowed
 just one touchdown in third quarters.
- Hurricane opponents have averaged just 62.5 yards of total offense in the third quarter.

GETTING DEFENSIVE

- Miami's +11 turnover margin is second-best in FBS; its five turnovers lost are sixth-fewest.
- Miami's defense has recorded 11 interceptions on 207 pass attempts (one every 18.8 attempts).
- Miami's defensive unit held Bethune-Cookman to just 79 yards in its 2015 season opener and tallied its first shutout since 2010.
- Miami ranked No. 14 nationally in total defense in 2014, allowing an average of just 329.6 yards per game · the fourth-best mark in the ACC.
- Of the 12 FBS teams on Miami's 2014 schedule, the Hurricanes defense held 11 of them under their season average on offense. Miami's defense held teams to an average of 81.0 yards under their respective season averages, all while facing the ninth-toughest schedule in the country.

PAVING THE WAY

- UM entered the season with one of the youngest offensive lines in the ACC, totaling 23 starts.
- Through seven games this season, Miami's youthful offensive line, which has consisted of a combination of one redshirt freshman, three sophomores & two juniors, has allowed the Hurricanes to average 401.3 yards per game in total offense.
- Miami's offensive line has allowed just seven sacks, which is second-fewest in the ACC.
- In addition, the Hurricanes are second in the nation in tackles for loss allowed (3.2).



ARTIE AND RAYSHAWN ISLAND

- Junior cornerback Artie Burns leads the ACC and is tied for third nationally with five interceptions this season; his two picks vs. Virginia Tech on Oct. 17 marked the first multi-interception performance by a Hurricane since Tracy Howard had two picks at North Carolina in 2013.
- Burns' five picks are already the most by a Hurricane in one year since Sean Taylor had 10 in 2003.
- Redshirt junior safety Rayshawn Jenkins is one of just four players in the ACC (including Burns) with at least 3 interceptions in 2015; only 58 players at the FBS level have at least 3 picks.
- Burns became the first Hurricane player with an interception in three-consecutive games since Sean Taylor in 2003 (via AP) after having one pick in each of Miami's first three games.
- In addition, Burns became the sixth Cane in the last 20 years with three interceptions over a threegame span joining, Sean Taylor, Ed Reed, Phillip Buchanon, Kenny Phillips & Kelly Jennings (via AP).
- Burns also is an accomplished track and field athlete. He finished second in the 110m hurdles with a time of 13.70 seconds at the ACC Championships. He also competed in the NCAA Championships.
- Jenkins missed the entire 2014 season with an injury and has made 15 career starts.

KIRBY, OWENS TO MISS REMAINDER OF 2015 SEASON

- Senior linebacker and team captain Raphael Kirby suffered a lower extremity injury against Virginia Tech on Oct. 17 and will miss the remainder of 2015.
- Kirby, who has started 19 straight games dating back to the 2014 season opener, was Miami's leading tackler (44) at the time of the injury.
- Fellow starting linebacker Darrion Owens suffered a season-ending knee injury Week 2 at FAU.

CAN OF CORN

- Junior cornerback Corn Elder has emerged among Miami's top playmakers in 2015.
- Elder leads the ACC and ranks No. 22 nationally with nine passes defended (1.29 per game).
- Elder had a dominant outing in the Canes' meeting with Nebraska, recording a career-best four pass breakups and a crucial INT on the Cornhuskers' first drive in OT, which helped clinch the win.
- Elder ranks fifth in the ACC in punt return yards and 18th nationally in punt return average (13.8).
- Elder totaled one tackle, one fumble recovery and one PBU at FAU; he leads the team with 8 PBUs.
- The Nashville, Tenn. native opened the 2015 campaign on a high note as he tallied three tackles, one sack, two tackles for loss and one pass breakup in a win over Bethune-Cookman.
- In addition, Elder also recorded his first career punt return for a touchdown on an electric run against the Wildcats. He nearly had a second punt return for a TD, but the play was called back.
- Against Cincinnati, Elder had another punt return for a touchdown recalled following a penalty.

THE SPECIALIST

- Junior punter Justin Vogel has picked up where he left off in 2014 and is off to a great start after six games. Vogel ranks third in the ACC in punting average (44.6 yards) and 20th nationally.
- He also has dropped 13 punts inside-the-20 yard line and has nine punts of 50+ yards.
- Vogel, a finalist for the Ray Guy Award in 2014, boomed a career-best 73-yard punt vs. Clemson.
- After spending the 2013 season at Florida, Vogel averaged 42.8 yards per punt & 62.1 yards on kickoffs in 2014. He was named third-team All-ACC by Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association.

BADG-O-MATIC

- Sophomore kicker Michael Badgley is 16-of-19 this year in field goal attempts. His OT field goal made against Nebraska served as the game-winner. His 16 made field goals and average of 2.67 FGM per game leads the NCAA.
- Badgley leads the ACC in scoring, averaging 11.7 points per game. His 11.7 points per game average also puts him seventh in the NCAA in scoring.
- In a Sept. 19 win over the Nebraska Cornhuskers, Badgley drilled a career-high and tied a school record with five field goals made (41, 27, 23, 28 and 28).

TOOLBOX TRENT

- Sophomore outside linebacker Trent Harris, nicknamed "Toolbox Trent" by the Miami defensive coaches for his consistency and mental error-free play, has started all seven games at OLB in 2015.
- Harris ranks fourth on the team with 27 tackles and leads the team with 4.0 TFLs for 36 yards.
- The Winter Park, Fla., native also leads the team with 2.5 sacks totaling 32 yards.

SHUTTING THEM DOWN

- Miami's defense held Bethune-Cookman scoreless and logged its first shutout since Sept. 2, 2010.
- Miami's shutout against Bethune-Cookman was the Hurricanes' first since and eighth since 2000.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

- Miami's offense of the past two seasons, both under the direction of offensive coordinator James Coley, has ranked among the most explosive in program history.
- Miami's 5,594 yards of total offense in 2014 were the second-most in program history, trailing only the 6,074 yards gained in 2002.
- UM compiled 5,536 total yards in 2013, which ranks as the third-best total in history.
- Miami's 2012 total of **5,282 ranks as the seventh-best** total in program history.

#PROCANES CONTINUING TRADITION

- Miami had seven players selected in the 2015 NFL Draft beginning in late April, the most since
 eight Hurricanes were drafted in 2011 and the fourth-most of any program nationwide in 2015.
- OT Ereck Flowers (1st round, NYG), WR Phillip Dorsett (1st, IND), LB Denzel Perryman (2nd, SD), TE Clive Walford (3rd, OAK), RB Duke Johnson (3rd, CLE), OL Jon Feliciano (4th, OAK) and DL Anthony Chickillo (6th, PIT) were all selected.
- The Hurricanes have had five or more players taken in the NFL Draft on 24 separate occasions since 1980.
- 93 Hurricanes have been picked in the NFL Draft since the start of the 2000 season, a figure that is tied for second-most among all NCAA programs.
- Miami's 28 NFL first-round draft picks since 2000, including Ereck Flowers (No. 9 overall) and Phillip Dorsett (No. 29) in 2015, are the most among all NCAA programs, seven more than the next-highest total.
- Miami had 57 #ProCanes on NFL training camp rosters heading into 2015; 27 of 32 NFL teams
 had at least one former Cane on their roster, while the Miami Dolphins led all teams with five.

ALMOST PERFECT 10

- Teams don't beat Miami when scoring only 10 points.
- The Hurricanes are now 158-2 in their last 160 games when holding opponents to 10 points or less, after winning 45-0 in its 2015 season-opener against Bethune-Cookman. That run goes back to Oct. 1, 1977, ironically, a season that began with Miami holding its first two opponents to exactly 10 points apiece and still losing both of those games.
- The only 10 points allowed-or-less losses since: Nov. 8, 2003 to Tennessee (10-6) and Sept. 5, 2005 to Florida State (10-7).

- Miami had 26 players make their Hurricane debuts against Bethune-Cookman. Among those 26 players, 12 were true freshmen.

 Three Miami Hurricanes were chosen as team captains prior to the start of the 2015 season: sophomore quarterback Brad Kaaya, senior linebacker Raphael Kirby and senior defensive back Dallas Crawford. A fourth team captain will rotate weekly during the 2015 season.

- Running back Joseph Yearby, offensive guard Danny Isidora, defensive lineman Chad Thomas and safety Deon Bush each earned a place on Phil Steele's Preseason All-ACC third team.
- Sophomore quarterback Brad Kaaya and wide receiver Braxton Berrios were fourth-team choices.

LARRY SCOTT

Interim Head Coach, Third Season USF. 2000

Florida native Larry Scott is in his third season as the Miami Hurricanes tight ends coach. He joined the UM staff in February 2013, and was named interim head coach of the Miami Hurricanes on Oct. 25, 2015.

In 2014, Scott oversaw a tight end unit that combined for 52 receptions and 833 yards receiving. He also mentored Clive Walford, who had a breakout 2014 campaign where he led the team in receptions with 44.

Under Scott's watchful eye, Walford earned third team All-America and second team All-ACC honors. Following the year, Walford was selected in the third round of the NFL Draft by the Oakland Raiders.

Prior to coming to Coral Gables, Scott, a native of Sebring, Fla., spent the previous eight seasons at USF, beginning in 2005 as the director of high school relations. In 2006, he moved to a graduate assistant role before coaching tight ends in 2007-08 and again in 2010-11. Between tight end coaching stints, he coached the offensive line in 2009. In 2012, he coached the running backs and became an offensive assistant.

During his second stint as the Bulls' TE coach, Scott and his group helped USF to its fifth-straight eight-win season, making it one of only 15 programs nationally and one of just 10 in BCS leagues to accomplish the feat.

Scott's biggest impact on USF came in recruiting within Miami-Dade and Broward counties. USF's 2008 class was considered to be among the best in program history until the Bulls' 2009 class was ranked No. 21 nationally.

His coaching career began in the high school ranks as the run game coordinator and offensive line coach at Tampa's Wharton HS from May 2001-August 2001. From there, he was the offensive coordinator and O-line coach from 2001-03 at Freedom HS before returning to his prep alma mater - Sebring HS - in 2004 as an exceptional education teacher and the co-offensive coordinator.

Scott was a three-year letterwinner (1997-99) as an offensive tackle for USF and was a member of the first recruiting class that began practicing in 1996, the year before the first USF Football game. He arrived at USF after a successful three-sport career at Sebring High School, where he was a four-year letterwinner for the football team and also earned a pair of varsity letters in baseball as a freshman and sophomore and in wrestling as a junior and senior.

A 2000 graduate from USF with a bachelor's degree in communications, Scott and his wife Shakiera have three children: sons, Larry and Jalen, and daughter Jurnee.

Mark D'Onofrio is in his fifth season as Miami's defensive coordinator. In 2014, D'Onofrio guided Miami to a No. 14 overall ranking in total defense. Under D'Onofrio's leadership, the Hurricanes held opponents to just 329.6 yards per game in 2014, which was nearly 100 yards fewer than the 2013 campaign.

In his first season at Miami, D'Onofrio's defense finished the season ranked ninth in the nation in red zone defense and 21st in scoring defense, holding opponents to an average of 20.08 points per game. The defense, under D'Onofrio's guidance, finished strong and proved stingy, giving up an average of only 13.5 points in the last five games of the season.

Prior to the 2011 season, D'Onofrio saw two of his Temple standouts drafted, now are active on NFL rosters. Defensive end Muhammad Wilkerson was taken in the first round by the New York Jets and free safety Jaiqwaun Jarrett went in the second round to the Philadelphia Eagles. In all, three Owls were drafted during D'Onofrio's tenure and five former players are active in the NFL.

James Coley is in his third season as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for the Hurricanes.

In 2014, Coley directed an offensive unit that averaged 430.3 yards per game, which ranked fourth in the ACC. Following the 2014 campaign, seven of Coley's offensive players earned All-ACC honors with running back Duke Johnson and Shane McDermott receiving first team recognition.

Coley spent five seasons in Tallahassee on Jimbo Fisher's staff – all five as tight ends coach and the last three as the offensive coordinator. As the recruiting coordinator at Florida State in 2008 and 2009, he was instrumental in the Seminoles landing back-to-back Top 10 signing classes and was also named the ACC's top recruiter in 2010 by ESPN.com.

He also earned All-ACC honors first team honors for the second-consecutive season after he finished the 2014 campaign with a team-best 110 total tackles (79 solo).
