MIDWEEK STORY LINES

- After wrapping up a four-game road swing in Atlanta, No. 25 Miami returns home for a midweek matchup against UCF Tuesday (6 p.m.) before traveling to Fort Myers, Fla., for a battle with FGCU at Hammond Stadium (Wednesday, 6:30 p.m.)
- Miami won the first game of its weekend at Georgia Tech 10-8, but dropped the last two games in a doubleheader.
- The Canes hold a combined all-time series advantage of 25-5-0 against UCF & FGCU, including a 17-4 lead over UCF.
- The Hurricanes won the lone matchup against UCF in 2013, coming away with a 5-0 victory at Mark Light Field. Miami hasn't played Florida Gulf Coast since 2012, when it split a midweek series with the Eagles.
- After struggling to hit for power in 2013, Miami is tied for the ACC lead with 12 home runs this season. Dale Carey ranks fourth in the conference with four homers, and three other Hurricanes have two home runs.
- Head coach Jim Morris won his 1,400th game at the Division I level in Miami's opening ACC series with Boston College. He is two wins away from #900 with the Hurricanes, with a career mark of 898-354-3.

3 JIM MORRIS HEAD COACH

THE HURRICANES SKIPPER

In his 21st season at Miami, few programs have qualified for the College World Series as much as Jim Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 41 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 20 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 898-354-3 (.717) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,402-621-4 (.693) Division I record in 32 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 36 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,533-661-4 (.698) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 20 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 29th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2013 when he guided the Canes to a No. 2 seed in the Louisville [Ky.] Regional. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 20 seasons (1994-2013), winning 15 of those appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2013 Hurricanes to their 41st-straight NCAA Tournament. Despite six signees being drafted in the 2013 MLB Draft, the Hurricanes reeled in a top 5 recruiting class by national publications.

MORRIS IN 36th SEASON AS HEAD COACH

Morris entered 2014 as the fifth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball with 1,391 wins. His impressive win total ranks him No. 12 all-time for any coach, regardless of division. Including his time at DeKalb C.C., Morris won his 1,500th game as a head coach in Miami's 4-1 upset of No. 1 North Carolina on March 15, 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.

Morris currently has a 1,402-621-4 (.693) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,533-661-4 (.698) record over 30-plus years.

Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern in March 2001



MAJOR LEAGUE GUIDANCE

Over 150 professional baseball players have played under Morris during their college careers at Miami, Georgia Tech and DeKalb.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that went on to play in the Major Leagues were Yonder Alonso (San Diego), Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Pat Burrell (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Yasmani Grandal (San Diego), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Ryan Jackson (St. Louis), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Eddy Rodriguez (San Diego), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Blake Tekotte (Chicago White Sox), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), Danny Valencia (Minnesota Twins), Jon Jay (St. Louis), Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston).

Standout players under Morris from his days at Georgia Tech were Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jay Payton (Oakland A's) and Jason Varitek (Boston Red Sox).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the International scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta. At the Goodwill Games, his USA squad won two of three games against Cuba, marking the first time in history a senior-level team won a series with Cuba. In 1987, Morris served as pitching coach under Ron Fraser at the Pan American Games (Silver Medal).

WEEKEND NEWS & NOTES

DOUBLING UP...

• **No. 25 Miami** continues its challenging nonconference slate with a pair of **midweek games**: at home against **UCF** (March 18) and on the road at **FGCU** (March 19).

• The Hurricanes captured a **5-0 victory** at Mark Light Field in the lone matchup against **UCF** in 2013 (March 6), which featured an **11-strikeout** performance from starter **Bryan Radziewski**.

• Miami did not play **FGCU** in 2013, but split a home-and-home with the Eagles in 2012. The Hurricanes won **3-0** on the road at Hammond Stadium (Feb. 22), but **dropped** a home contest **4-2** (April 11).

POWER SURGE...

• Miami is tied for **first** in the **ACC** with **12 home runs** through its first 20 games of the regular season. **Dale Carey** leads the team with **four homers**, while **Zack Collins**, **Garrett Kennedy** and **Tyler Palmer** have two each.

• The offense already has **three multi-homerun games** this season after recording **just two** in all of 2013: games one and two against **Florida** (Feb. 21 & 22) and game one against **Georgia Tech** (March 14). Miami is **3-0** in 2014 when hitting **more than one home run**.

• In addition to its impressive home run total, Miami ranks **second** in the ACC with **40 doubles** this season and **tied for fourth** in triples with **four**.

• Miami did not record its 12th home run in 2013 until an **8-3 win over Wake Forest on May 12** - the team's **53rd game** of that season. The Hurricanes hit just 14 home runs collectively last season.

He also recorded home runs in an exhibition with the **Marlins** (solo HR, Feb. 26) and on the road at **Florida State** (two-run HR, March 2).

HEATING UP...

• After struggling through the first month of the season, sophomore slugger **David Thompson** has turned it up a notch. Thompson is **hitting at a .424 clip** over the past **10 games** with two doubles, one triple and six RBI. He has recorded a **.525 on-base percentage** over that span.

• Over his last two starts, redshirt sophomore **Andrew Suarez** has allowed **two earned runs** in 16.0 innings of work (**1.12 ERA**). He went **9.0 innings against Georgia Tech** but earned a **no-decision**.

• Senior **Dale Carey** is 7 for his last 18 (**.389**) over the last five games entering Tuesday's matchup with UCF. He has **team-high totals of eight hits, nine runs, four doubles** and **one home run** over that stretch.

• Freshman **Willie Abreu** has settled into a groove entering the middle of March. The Hialeah, Fla., native, **hitting third** in the lineup, is **batting .353** with **18 hits** and **13 runs scored** in the last **15 games**.

• Freshman reliever **Cooper Hammond** has made seven appearances in the last 15 games and has recorded a **2.25 ERA** with a **2-0 record**. Hammond has yielded **two earned runs** in his last 8.0 innings of relief.

WEEKEND NEWS & NOTES

SIMPLY PERFECT...

- Senior RHP **Javi Salas** twirled just the **second perfect game** in program history and the **23rd in modern NCAA Division I history** (since 1957) in a 17-0 shutout of **Villanova** on **March 4**.
- Salas needed just **113 pitches** to get through his outing, **scattering six strikeouts** across his night of perfection. His perfect game was the first for a Miami pitcher since **Kevin Sheary** accomplished the feat on **March 4, 1987**.
- Miami's two perfect games are tied with **Auburn and Iowa** for the **second-most of any program all-time** behind Washington State's three. Salas' perfect game was the first for any **Division I pitcher** since Will Roberts (Virginia) in **2011**.
- Salas, a **Coral Gables native and graduate of nearby Christopher Columbus High School**, was selected in the **38th round** of the **2013 MLB Draft** but elected to return for his senior season.

FRESHMEN PHENOMS...

- **Three freshmen** were in head coach Jim Morris' **Opening Day lineup**: Zack Collins (first base), Willie Abreu (designated hitter) and Johnny Ruiz (second base). Laz Rivera, Jacob Heyward and Brad Zunica have also earned starts through the first three weekends of the season.
- **Willie Abreu leads the Canes** with a **.328 batting average**.
- **Freshman reliever Bryan Garcia** recorded the first two saves of his career in back-to-back wins over Florida (Feb. 21-22). He ranks **second in the ACC** with **five saves** this season.
- Lefthander **Danny Garcia** earned his career-first start in March 5 tilt with Villanova, **striking out eight batters** across 4.0+ innings. He went 4.2 innings in his second start against Stetson.
- **Abreu, Collins and Zunica** found themselves on the **same lineup card** for the first time in the **series finale against FSU** (March 2), and combined for **seven hits, two doubles, one home run, four RBI and four runs scored**.

- Junior LHP **Chris Diaz** picked up his **fourth straight win** to open the 2014 season in a **6-2 victory over Boston College** (March 7).
- Diaz, who ranked **second in the ACC in ERA** in 2013 (1.64), did not pick up his **fourth win of the 2013 season until May 3** against St. John's. He finished 2013 with a **7-5 record**.
- The Hurricanes have **won every single one of Diaz' starts** in 2014, including a **10-8 win against Georgia Tech** last time out.

CANES LEGENDS RECOGNIZED...

- **Alex Fernandez** and **Mike Fiore** will be among the seven-member **Class of 2014** to be inducted into the **College Baseball Hall of Fame**, the College Baseball Foundation announced.
- They will join Ron Fraser (2006), Skip Bertman (2006) and Neal Heaton (2009) as College Baseball Hall of Fame inductees.
- **Fernandez was named Freshman of the Year and a first-team All-American in 1989**, where he won 15 games with a 2.01 ERA and 177 strikeouts in 147 innings. A four-year UM starter, **Fiore set 12 UM career batting marks**, including hits (341) and runs (258).
