STORY LINES

- Miami will face Kansas State - the Canes first ranked opponent of 2012 - for the second straight season on Saturday (12 p.m. EDT, FX) and will be playing at Bill Snyder Family Stadium for the first time in program history. It will be UM's first visit to a Big 12 school since defeating Texas A&M, 41-23, on Sept. 20, 2008.
- RB **Duke Johnson** scored his first career touchdown on a 54-yard scamper in the second quarter and added a 56-yard score in the third quarter. He totaled 135 yards for the game, the most by a UM true freshman since **Javarris James** racked up 148 yards against Houston (Sept. 30, 2006).
- Junior QB **Stephen Morris** recorded career highs in both completions and attempts in Miami's season-opening win at BC. In his sixth career start, Morris completed 28 of 45 passes for 207 yards with one TD and one INT. Morris' career record improved to 3-3.
- Senior PK **Jake Wiclaw** - a member of the Lou Groza Award Watch List - connected on both of his field goal attempts (22, 24) and was perfect on on five PATs against Boston College.
- In its season-opener against Boston College, 14 freshmen appeared in their first collegiate game, including 12 true freshmen.
- After last week's win over BC, Miami is 57-29-1 all-time in season openers, winning four of its last five. The Canes improved to 16-12 in road openers.
- Saturday will mark the 2nd series meeting with Kansas State winning the first-ever meeting 28-24 in 2011.
- Nearly 70 of Miami's 2012 roster hails from Florida (67 players), including 21 that hail from Miami-Dade County.
- Four Miami Hurricanes are among 312 seniors named to the 2013 Senior Bowl Watch List, the nation's premier all-star game announced August 23. Senior RB **Mike James**, DB **Brandon McGee**, DT **Darius Smith** and S **Vaughn Telemaque** represent the Hurricanes on the Senior Bowl's inaugural watch list.

NATIONAL TELEVISION COVERAGE

- Saturday's meeting with Kansas State will be televised nationally on FX. **Justin Kutcher** (play-by-play), **Eric Crouch** (color analyst) and **Darius Walker** (sideline reporter) will serve as the talent for the telecast.

KANSAS STATE SERIES HISTORY

- Saturday will mark the second series meeting with Kansas State winning the first-ever meeting 28-24 in 2011.
- Miami is making its first trip to Manhattan, Kan.
- In the third quarter of last season's meeting, UM (**Ramon Buchanan**) blocked a **Anthony Cantele** field goal attempt. It was the first blocked FG since 2004, when the Canes stopped a kick by Thomas Carroll of Florida on Dec. 31.
- Entering the 2011 meeting between the two teams, K-State possessed the nation's No. 1 overall defense, allowing an average of 100 yards through the air and a scant 64 yards on the ground. Miami collected 139 yards on the ground and 272 yards through the air in defeat.
- **Rashawn Scott** recorded his first-career catch in the 2011 meeting, a two-yard reception in the first quarter.

A WIN BY MIAMI WOULD...

- Mark the Hurricanes' first 2-0 start since 2009
- Be the Hurricanes' first at Kansas State
- Improve its record to 4-1 over non-conference opponents under **AI Golden**

ROAD WARRIORS

- For the second consecutive season, Miami opened its schedule on the road. The Hurricanes defeated Boston College, 41-32 on Sept. 1. In 2011, Miami fell at Maryland on Labor Day, 32-24.
- The Hurricanes open the season with two consecutive road contests for the first time since the 2005 season. That year, Miami fell 10-7 to Florida State in the opener, then defeated Clemson, 36-30 in triple overtime.
- The 2012 season will be the eighth time in its 86-year history that Miami has opened the season with two consecutive road or neutral contests ('74, '77, '83, '84, '86, '90, '05).
- The Canes join Rutgers as the only 2012 BCS teams that play on the road at least three times in the month of September. In addition to road games at Boston College and Kansas State, Miami will travel to Atlanta to face Georgia Tech on Sept. 22.
- With the win at Boston College, Miami has won two straight road contests and three of its last four.

#ROOKIECANES

- In Miami's season-opener against Boston College 14 freshmen appeared in their first collegiate game, including 12 true freshmen.
- True freshmen RB **Duke Johnson** and OL **Ereck Flowers** each started the season opener. The duo became the first true freshmen at Miami to start since QB **Jacory Harris** and WR **Aldarius Johnson** started against Charleston Southern in the 2008 opener.
- RB **Duke Johnson** (2) and WR **Malcolm Lewis** (1) accounted for three of the Canes' five touchdowns in their debuts.

A GAME OF FIRSTS

- Miami's win at Boston College was its first season opening road win since defeating Florida State, 38-34, in 2009.
- LB **Denzel Perryman** (2011 Freshman All-American) returned an interception 41 yards for a touchdown against Boston College. The interception and touchdown were career firsts for the sophomore.
- In their first collegiate game, RB **Duke Johnson** (2) and WR **Malcolm Lewis** (1) each scored touchdowns.
- DL **Luther Robinson** and LB **Eddie Johnson** each forced their career-first fumbles against Boston College. DB **Ladarius Gunter** also recovered a fumble in his first game as a Hurricane.

CREATING TURNOVERS

- Denzel Perryman's interception return for a touchdown was the first by a Miami player since Kelvin Cain returned one 59 yards against Bethune-Cookman on Oct. 1, 2011.
- Prior to the Perryman and Cain interception returns, the last interception returned for a touchdown by a LB occurred when **Darryl Sharpton** accomplished the feat in 2009 against Duke.
- The Hurricanes recovered two fumbles against Boston College. Miami last had two recoveries in an 24-7 win over Georgia Tech on Oct. 22, 2011. The Georgia Tech contest was also the last time UM forced three or more turnovers and the only time the Canes forced three turnovers in a game in 2011.

#DUUKE IS TRENDING

- True freshman RB **Duke Johnson** ran for 135 yards and two touchdowns on seven carries after starting in the season opener against Boston College.
- The 135 yards were the most rushing yards for a Hurricane true freshman since Javarris James up 148 yards against Houston (Sept. 30, 2006).
- He became the first UM freshman RB to rush for 100 or more yards in first college game since **Clinton Portis** in 1999.
- During his debut, Johnson drew the attention of Miami's biggest sports superstar. After his 54-yard scamper, **LeBron James** (@KingJames) tweeted: Duke Johnson is the truth out there for the U! True freshman. #speedkills

40-POINT CLUB

- Miami's 41 points against Boston College were the most against an FBS school in a season opener since scoring 48 against Louisiana Tech in 2003. Miami scored 52 against FCS opponent Charleston Southern in 2008.
- The Hurricanes last scored 40 points against an ACC foe on Nov. 5, 2011, a 49-14 win vs. Duke.

CAREER DAY

- Eight different Hurricanes set career highs in tackles against Boston College in the season opener. **Thurston Armbrister, Deon Bush, Thomas Finnie, Shayon Green, Tracy Howard, Olsen Pierre, Luther Robinson** and **Kacy Rodgers** each set career bests in stops.
- **Stephen Morris** recorded career highs in both completions and attempts. In his sixth career start, Morris completed 28 of 45 passes for 207 yards with one touchdown and one interception.
- Biletnikoff Award candidate WR **Allen Hurns** set career marks in both receptions and yards. The junior caught eight passes for 81 yards in the 41-32 victory.

FOUR CANES NAMED TO SENIOR BOWL WATCH LIST

- Four Miami Hurricanes are among 312 seniors named to the 2013 Senior Bowl Watch List, the nation's premier all-star game announced August 23. Senior RB **Mike James**, DB **Brandon McGee**, DT **Darius Smith** and S **Vaughn Telemaque** represent the Hurricanes on the Senior Bowl's inaugural watch list.
- The top 100 seniors in the nation will be invited to participate in the 2013 Senior Bowl, which is set for Sat., Jan. 26 at Mobile's Ladd-Peebles Stadium. Appearing on the watch list is not a requirement for a player to earn a Senior Bowl invitation.
- The SEC led all conferences with 71 players on the list. The Big Ten had the second-highest amount of honorees with 46, followed by the ACC with 43.

TRIO ON PRESEASON WATCH LISTS

- Junior WR **Allen Hurns** is one of 49 college receivers on 2012 Biletnikoff Award Preseason Watch List — given to the nation's top receiver. Hurns, a native of Carol City, Fla., had a breakout season as a sophomore recording 31 receptions for 415 yards in 2011.
- Senior P **Dalton Botts** is one the Ray Guy Award Watch List (nation's best punter) and senior PK **Jake Wieclaw** earned placement on the Lou Groza Award Watch List (nation's best placekicker).
- Botts, who served as the Hurricanes' punter in all 12 games in 2011 as a junior, finished second in the ACC with a 42.7 yards-per-punt average. Wieclaw converted on 11-of-14 field goals and all 29 PATs in his first season as the starting placekicker to merit status as a Lou Groza Award Semifinalist in 2011.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

- More than half of the Miami Hurricanes' 2012 roster are freshmen and sophomores. All-told, Miami's roster includes 42 freshmen — 34 true freshmen and eight redshirt freshmen — and 22 sophomores (11 redshirt sophomores).

FLORIDA-GROWN TALENT

- Nearly 70 of the Miami Hurricanes' 2012 roster hails from the Sunshine State (67 players), including 21 that hail from Miami-Dade County.

JAMES NOMINATED TO ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

- Senior RB **Mike James** is one of 52 nominees for the 2012 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team. As one of college football's most prestigious off-the-field honors, the award recognizes a select group of college football players committed to making a difference in their communities.
- James has played in every game for the Hurricanes the past three seasons (38) and was named Miami's 2011 Strength Training Athlete of the Year. The Haines City, Fla., native was second on the team with eight total touchdowns in 2011, and has reached the endzone 13 times in his career.
- James is working toward a degree in sport administration with a minor in sociology.

RAISING CANES COLLABORATION EARNS RECOGNITION

- In June, *HurricaneSports.com* and 3Penny Films were honored with two medals of distinction at the 33rd annual Telly Awards for the "Raising Canes" series.
- "Raising Canes" earned bronze awards in two categories: Internet/Online Programs, Segments or Promotional Pieces — Sports, and Internet/Online Video — Documentary. The series, which documents the Hurricanes' football team and its student-athletes on and off the field, debuted in August 2011. "Raising Canes" has released more than 50 episodes since its inception, all telling the unique stories of the Hurricanes' players, coaches and staff with presentation of "behind-the-scenes" footage and exclusive interviews with various members of the team.

MIAMI FOOTBALL RANKED EIGHTH NATIONALLY IN APR

- When the NCAA's Academic Progress Report (APR) was announced in May, the Canes' football program headlined an outstanding academic showing by the University of Miami for the 2010-11 year. The football team (along with baseball, men's basketball and men's tennis) improved upon its APR score for an impressive seventh straight season. In fact, the UM football program's APR score (978) ranked eighth among all FBS schools.

MIAMI FOOTBALL RECOGNIZED FOR OUTSTANDING GSR

- The University of Miami was one of only 17 institutions recognized for an outstanding NCAA Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of over 90 percent for their football student-athletes in the latest six-year window, as announced by the American Football Coaches Association.
- The GSR is based on a six-year graduation window for student-athletes which is a change from the five-year window used by the CFA and AFCA. The GSR was developed by the NCAA as part of its academic reform initiative to more accurately assess the academic success of student-athletes. The GSR holds institutions accountable for transfer students, unlike the federal graduation rate. The GSR also accounts for midyear enrollees.
- Only sixteen other institutions — Air Force, Army, Boise State, Boston College, Central Florida, Duke, Florida, Iowa, Miami (Ohio), Navy, Northern Illinois, Northwestern, Notre Dame, Penn State, Rice, Stanford — achieved a rate of 90 percent or better.

GSR SCORES SHOW CONTINUED SUCCESS OF MIAMI ATHLETICS

- In what has become an annual upward trend, student-athletes at the University of Miami continue to excel in the classroom at a record pace. According to the NCAA’s Graduation Success Rates (GSR), Miami established a new athletics department-wide record with a GSR of 89 percent.
- In 2010-11, the athletics department-wide GSR was at its then-record high of 86 percent.
- The athletics department has exceeded the NCAA average for GSR in each of the last seven years.

KENNEDY ENSHRINED IN PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

- Former All-American **Cortez Kennedy** was officially enshrined into the Pro Football Hall of Fame on August 4. The defensive tackle is the fifth Hurricane to earn the honor, joining **Jim Otto** (1980), **Ted Hendricks** (1990), **Jim Kelly** (2002) and **Michael Irvin** (2007) in Canton.
- Kennedy registered 58 sacks and scored one touchdown on a fumble recovery in his 11-season career with the Seattle Seahawks. The No. 3 overall pick in the 1990 NFL Draft, Kennedy had a streak of 116 games played, earned selection to eight Pro Bowls (1992-97, 1999, 2000) and missed just nine games out of a possible 176 in his career.
- As a senior defensive tackle in 1989, he emerged as a dominant force on what many considered to be the nation’s top defensive line unit. Kennedy started all 12 games and his tenacious defense helped lead UM to a 11-1 season, a victory in the Sugar Bowl over Alabama and the 1989 National Championship. He earned second team AP All-American honors.

‘MAD STORK’ ON ACC LEGENDS CLASS OF 2012 ROSTER

- Former Hurricanes DE and Pro Football Hall of Fame DE **Ted Hendricks** is a member of the Atlantic Coast Conference’s Class of 2012 Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game Legends.
- Hendricks, known as the “Mad Stork” for his tall (6-7), angular build and his dominating defensive play, started three seasons at defensive end for the Miami Hurricanes under coach Charlie Tate. A three-time All-America for the Hurricanes, he earned consensus, first-team All-America honors in 1967 and 1968, and led Miami to a 20-11-1 record. He ended his collegiate career as Miami’s all-time leading tackler with 318 hits in 1968. That year, he was named UPI National Lineman of the Year and finished 5th in the Heisman Trophy balloting.
- He went on to a spectacular 15-year NFL career as an outside linebacker playing in 215 consecutive games with the Baltimore Colts, Green Bay Packers, Oakland and L.A Raiders. During his time in the NFL, he helped lead his teams to four Super Bowl championships, was an eight-time Pro Bowl selection, four times selected as an All-Pro and five times named second-team All-Pro. He was inducted into the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame in 1987 and was named to the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1990. He was named to the NFL’s 75th Anniversary All-Time team and to the NFL’s All-Decade team of the 1970’s. He was inducted into the University of Miami Hall of Fame in 1980, to its Ring of Honor in 1997 and had his jersey number—number 89—retired, also in 1997.

GAME NOTES

- **Denzel Perryman's** interception return for a touchdown was the first for the Hurricanes since Oct. 1, 2011, when **Kelvin Cain** returned one 59 yards against Bethune-Cookman.
