NEWS and NOTES

PLAYER TO WATCH: Greg Gantt scored a team high 17 points in the meeting between the two teams last season.

SCOUTING THE HURRICANES: Miami has a perimeter oriented attack led by the duo of Malcolm Grant and Durand Scott. Grant leads the Hurricanes in scoring (15.8), with Scott second at 11.9 points per outing. Scott also averages five rebounds per contest to the lead the team in that category. Grant and Scott combined for 42 points in UM's 85-62 win over the Owls in last season's postseason NIT.

TAKING CARE OF THE BALL: FAU finished the 2010-11 season 29th in the nation in turnovers per game at 11.3 per game. This season, the Owls are averaging 12 turnovers a game. The point guard tandem of Alex Tucker and Raymond Taylor are currently 1st and 2nd in the conference, respectively in assist/turnover ratio. Tucker and Taylor are 1st and 2nd in school history in career assist turnover ratio and 2nd and 3rd in career assists.

FATHER AND SON: In 1992-93 FAU's associate head coach Mike Jarvis II began his collegiate coaching career as a first-year assistant working with his father, Mike Jarvis, at George Washington. Jarvis has made 9 NCAA Tournament appearances and from 1992-00 his teams (GW & STJ) advanced to post-season play in each season. As a coach, Jarvis II has reached the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16 four times. He was essential in the Red Storm's run into the NCAA Tournament's South Regional Final (Elite 8) in 1999. The Jarvises are one of only two African-American father-son coaching duos in Division I, the other is Tubby and Saul Smith at the University of Minnesota. With FAU's Sun Belt regular season title, the Jarvises have been together for postseason appearances at four different schools, including Jarvis II playing for his father at Boston University.

VARIETY OF WEAPONS: The Owls have three players (Gantt, Richardson, Taylor) who have averaged at least 10 points a game for an entire season and nine (adding Bertone, Tucker, Mavin, McCoy, Grier and White) who have scored 15 points in a game during their career. Richardson, Tucker, Gantt and Taylor all have more than 600 career points.

GETTING THE POINT: The Owls have one of the best point guard tandems in the nation with senior Alex Tucker and junior Raymond Taylor. Tucker holds the school record for assists in a game with 16 and is on pace to become the FAU all-time assists leader. Tucker should also join Ernest Crumbley as the only players to have at least 100 assists in four straight seasons. Taylor holds the school record for assists in a season with 177. Taylor should have 100 assists for the third straight season, joining Crumbley and Tucker as the only Owls to do that. The two have combined for an assist/turnover ratio of 2.90/1 so far this season.

SIGN ON THE DOTTED LINE: Mike Jarvis signed Chris Bryant and Stefan Moody to National Letters of Intent. Bryant, a 6-8 guard/forward was a two-time state champion and 3A Player of the Year at Rickards High School in Tallahassee, FL. He is currently enrolled at Fishburne Military Academy. Stefan Moody is a 5-10 guard with a 44-inch vertical leap who plays for the same AAU program (Team Breakdown) that produced current FAU guard Raymond Taylor.



NEWS and NOTES (cont.)

WORK ETHIC: Dennis Mavin and Greg Gantt have frequently attended FAU volleyball matches during the last two seasons. Why? After the facilities staff converts the court back to basketball, Gantt and Mavin get extra work in on the court after the match was over. When the team held a Christmas Day practice during his freshman season, Gantt was in the gym two hours early working on his jumper.

RECORD BREAKERS: FAU has several players climbing up the school record page: **Alex Tucker:** 461 career assists (FAU record: 505 Ernest Crumbley) Tucker holds the school record with 16 assists in a game. **Raymond Taylor's** 177 assists as a freshman set a single season school record.

FAMILIAR FACES: The Owls return 1,912 of last season's 2,191 points (87.2%), 854 of last year's 1,070 rebounds (79.8%) and all but 9 of last season's 396 assists.

DYNAMIC DUO: The junior backcourt of Raymond Taylor and Greg Gantt is one of the most accomplished backcourts in FAU history. Taylor finished 11th in the nation in assists as a freshman and is already among the program's all-time leaders in career assists and Gantt was 5th in the conference in scoring, and led the league in three-pointers made. Both were named Third-Team All-Sun Belt as freshmen. Taylor was named First Team All-Sun Belt as a sophomore, while Gantt made the Second Team. Gantt and Taylor were both named preseason 1st Team All-Sun Belt prior to the season.

A HISTORIC WEEK: Entering last season, FAU had only defeated three teams from one of the "Big Six" BCS conferences in its entire history. On November 30 2010, the Owls beat Mississippi St. 61-59 and then defeated USF 50-42 on December 4. It was Coach Jarvis' first win over a Big East team since a 70-67 win over Georgetown on April 3, 2003 as part of the NIT.

VIRTUAL GUIDE: FAU has produced a virtual guide complete with bios, stats and videos. The interactive guide also includes links to even more information about the FAU men's basketball team. It can be found on the official website of FAU athletics, www.fausports.com, logging on to the men's basketball page and clicking the link named "Virtual Guide".

SENIOR LEADERSHIP: Seniors **Shavar Richardson** and **Alex Tucker** are 12 wins away from being the winningest senior class since FAU joined Division I. The duo has won 45 games since arriving on campus. FAU won 56 games from the 2004-05 to the 2007-08 seasons. The FAU program won 62 games in its first four years of existence.

THREE OF A KIND: Three Owls have a chance to join the 1,000 point club. Greg Gantt scored his 1,000 point on November 22nd against Hofstra. Shavar Richardson (842) and Raymond Taylor (870) also have an opportunity to score their 1,000th career point this season.

COACH'S DIARY: Assistant Coach Tim Kaine is taking part in the Coaches' Diary Series on CollegeChalkTalk.com. The series features entries from more than 80 assistant and head coaches around the country, including former FAU assistant Matt McCall.

ROYSTER NOW A RIDER: Former FAU forward and two-time Sun Belt Defensive Player of the Year **Brett Royster** signed with the Leicester Riders of the British Basketball League this summer. Royster had 11 points and two blocks in his first game as a Rider, less than 24 hours after landing in England.

NEWS and NOTES (cont.)

YEAR OF FIRSTS: Last season, the Owls had their first back-to-back wins over BCS schools, their best start since the 1990-91 season and won their first two Sun Belt games for the first time since the 2006-07 season. Raymond Taylor became FAU's Sun Belt Player of the Week since 06-07. The Owls were also ranked a program-high #34 in the RPI. FAU also had its best conference start in school history. The team enjoyed an eight game winning streak which was the longest since moving to Division I. The Owls also had a home game televised nationwide (1/22 vs. UALR on ESPN2) for the first time in school history. FAU had its most conference wins (13) since joining the Sun Belt. Coach Jarvis led the team to its first 20-win season at the Division I level and just its second postseason berth in program history.

CLOSE CALLS: FAU has a 16-8 record in games decided by single digits over the last two seasons.

FINISHING THEM OFF: The Owls are 20-1 over the last two seasons when leading at the half.

PRIMETIME OWLS: The Owls will be on TV eight times this season, FAU is 1-3 in television games this season, losing to American, Kansas and Mississippi State and defeating Hofstra.

HOME SWEET HOME: Since the beginning of the 2009-10 season, the Owls are 21-7 at the Burrow. Of the seven losses, two (1/2/10 vs. South Alabama and 2/25/10 vs. WKU) came in overtime and another was a three point loss in regulation (12/29/09 vs. Hofstra).

SUNSHINE BOYS: Mike Jarvis and his coaching staff have made a dedicated effort to recruit the state of Florida. Six players on the Owls' current roster hail from the state of Florida.

OWLS CLIMBING THE RPI: The Owls had a program high RPI of #34 early last season. FAU ended the season with an RPI of 115, which was the best among Sun Belt teams.

DEFENSIVE-MINDED: FAU has held 16 opponents to less than 40% shooting from the field over the last two seasons. The Owls are 14-2 in those contests. The Owls finished last year second in the Sun Belt in field goal defense, holding the opposition to 42.4% shooting from the field on the season.

RUNNIN' OWLS: The Owls had runs of 21-0 (Florida Memorial), 18-0 (Arkansas State), 14-0 (North Texas), 13-0 (at Western Kentucky) and 10-0 (Mississippi State) last season. FAU had a 13-0 run against Hofstra this season.

INCREASED INTEREST: In the three seasons prior to Coach Jarvis' arrival, FAU averaged 920 fans for their home games. In the three plus seasons since he was hired, FAU averaged more than 1,280 fans for each home game. The Owls were mentioned on ESPN.com several times last season. They earned Dick Vitale's "Shock of the Week" for their victory over Mississippi St. and Andy Katz has recognized the job Coach Jarvis has done in putting the program on the map.

BUILDING A PROGRAM: FAU's 35 wins is the most successful two-year stretch at Division I level. The Owls won 36 games over two years while playing at the D-II level.

MR. CONSISTENCY: Alex Tucker joined Earnest Crumbley as the only players in program history to dish out 100 assists in three straight seasons. Tucker is on track to pass Crumbley as FAU's all-time assist leader in the early portion of this season.

RED MENACE: The Owls are 4-1 all-time when wearing red jerseys. FAU defeated USF and FIU twice last season, and beat George Mason this season in their red jerseys. Their only loss in the red jerseys came against Miami in the Postseason NIT last year.

BENCH PRODUCTION: The Owls bench has outscored the opponents' bench in all but one game this season (11/12/11 vs. Portland).

TUCKER EARNS RECOGNITION:

Senior **Alex Tucker** was named a nominee for the Bob Cousy Award last season which goes to the nation's top collegiate point guard.

TAYLOR, GANTT SHINE: Junior guards Raymond Taylor and Greg Gantt both earned Sun Belt Player of the Week honors last season. Taylor averaged 22 points while helping FAU to its first 2-0 conference start since the 2006-07 season. Gantt was named Player of the Week on Feb. 7 after averaging 17 points in the Owls' wins over North Texas and FIU. Taylor was named to the All-Sun Belt First Team, while Gantt made the Second Team.

OWLS THE FAVORITE: The Owls were picked to repeat as Sun Belt Regular Season Champions in the preseason poll. FAU received 11 of the 12 first place votes from the league's head coaches.

FAMILIARITY BREEDS CONTEMPT:

Of the 13 nonconference games this season, the Owls will play nine opponents that they played last season, including postseason NIT opponent Miami in the Orange Bowl Classic.

ROAD WARRIORS: The Owls play 10 of their first 13 games on the road, including eight games in 18 days in six different cities to open the season. Last season, the Owls played five games in five cities in a 13-day road trip right before Christmas.

Mike Jarvis is entering his 23rd season as a Division I men's basketball head coach and his fourth as coach of the Florida Atlantic University Owls. Jarvis' long record of success places him among the nation's elite basketball coaches. He has taken three universities, Boston University (1985-90), George Washington University (1990-98) and St. John's University (1998-04) to the Big Dance.

Boston University (BU) offered Coach Jarvis the opportunity to begin a collegiate head coaching career in 1985. Immediate success ensued when Jarvis guided the Terriers to a 21-10 record and a berth into the National Invitation Tournament (NIT) in his first season. He won two ECAC North Atlantic Conference Championships (1988 and '90) and made three postseason tournament appearances at BU.

In 1990, Jarvis accepted his first coaching position outside the state of Massachusetts, taking over at George Washington University (GW) in Washington D.C. Jarvis immediately transformed GW into one of the nation's best teams, finishing 19-12 in his first season (1990-91) and earning an invitation into the NIT. In his third season at GW, Jarvis led the Colonials to its first 21-win season in 38 years. That 1992-93 team qualified for the first of four NCAA Tournament appearances during Jarvis' tenure at GW and went on to advance into the tournament's Sweet 16. It was also the first year that Mike Jarvis Sr and Jr. Would coach together. In fact it was the first time an African American father and son would coach together in Division I.

Jarvis compiled a 152-90 record in eight consecutive winning seasons at GW, leading the Colonials to seven postseason tournament appearances and three 20-win seasons. He became just the second men's basketball coach in the program's history to be elected to the George Washington University Athletic Hall of Fame.

After outstanding tenures at BU and GW, the 13-year coaching veteran accepted the challenge of coaching a storied St. John's University program in Queens, New York that had enjoyed just one winning season in the five years prior to his appointment. That same season, Jarvis was elected president of the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC).

Again success was immediate as Jarvis led the Red Storm to a 28-9 record in his first season at St. John's and his first appearance in an NCAA Regional Final - just one basket away from the Final Four. His coaching efforts were rewarded when the Black Coaches Association (BCA) presented him with the National Coach of the Year Award.

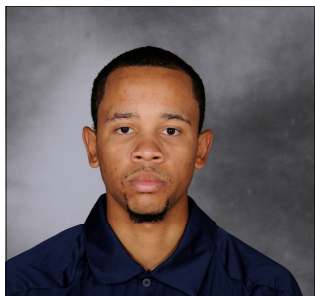
FAU offered Coach Jarvis head fourth Division I coaching stop. Despite not taking over the FAU program until May 2008, Jarvis was able to sign a class that included Shavar Richardson, who led all Sun Belt freshmen in scoring and Alex Tucker, who set school records for assists in a game and a season. For his second season, Jarvis signed a seven-player class that included Raymond Taylor, who broke Tucker's school record for assists in a season and Greg Gantt, who was among the league leaders in scoring and three-point percentage. Both players were named Third-Team All-Sun Belt at the season's end.

In his third season at FAU, Jarvis continued his remarkable turnaround of the program. FAU garnered national attention with a 61-59 win over Mississippi State, the first win over an SEC team in school history and followed that up with a 50-42 win over USF of the Big East. Prior to the season, FAU had just three wins over teams from the "Big Six" conferences in its history, Jarvis led the team to two such victories in less than a week. Over the course of the season, the Owls had their best conference start in school history (8-0), and tied the school record for the longest winning streak (eight). The Owls had their most wins in a season at the Division I level (21). The Owls also won the Sun Belt regular season title and appeared in the postseason NIT, just the second time in school history that the team made a postseason appearance. For his efforts, Jarvis won the Sun Belt and NABC District 24 Coach of the Year Awards and was named a finalist for the Ben Jobe Award, given to the best minority coach in the nation.

Jarvis and his wife, Connie live in Boca Raton and have two adult children, Mike II, his Associate Head Coach, and his daughter Dana Shaiyen, along with two grandchildren, Geoffrey and Ian.

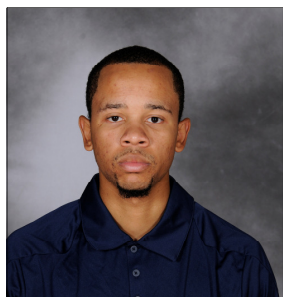
