Miami and Georgia Tech Set for Key ACC Showdown...

A huge Atlantic Coast Conference baseball matchup takes place this weekend, as the University of Miami and Georgia Tech meet for a three-game series at Alex Rodriguez Park, beginning Friday, March 25, at 7 p.m.

Miami (14-8, 6-0 ACC) enters the weekend working on a nine-game win streak, while Georgia Tech (18-4, 6-0 ACC) rides into Coral Gables with a league-leading 13-straight wins. Both UM and Georgia Tech are the only undefeated teams in ACC play – both playing in the league's Coastal Division.

The winner of this weekend's series will have a chance to take sole possession of first place in the ACC if either team sweeps and/or Florida State loses one game in its weekend series. The Hurricanes are ranked No. 29 in the Collegiate Baseball Newspaper poll, and Georgia Tech has its highest ranking at No. 15 in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches Poll – though the Rambling Wreck is ranked in all four major college polls.

In the nine-game winning streak for Miami, they have been led by the resurgence of Harold Martinez who has batted a team-high .467 since moving from third base to first – in a clean swap in freshman Brad Fieger – prior to the start of the Virginia Tech series. The junior Preseason All-American bats .288 overall on the year, catapulting himself to second on the team in hits (21) while leading the squad in RBI (17).

Martinez comes into the series working on a team-leading eight-game hitting streak. His career-long is 10.

The 'Canes are also paced by sophomore outfielder Zeke DeVoss as the team's leading batter, statistically, hitting .295 with 23 hits, 18 runs and 11 steals – all team-highs in each category, respectively. Rony Rodriguez leads the team in home runs (3) and slugging percentage (.484).

While the Miami starting pitchers have been solid in their last two outings each (including the weekday rotation), it has been the Hurricanes bullpen that has shown dominance of its opponents of late. The combination of Adam Sargent, Travis Miller, Sam Robinson and Daniel Miranda (closer) has yet to allow a run over the last six contests in a span of 18 innings.

This weekend, the UMiami rotation will be tested by the Yellow Jackets, as it will be freshman Bryan Radziewski, E.J. Encinosa and Eric Whaley, in order, each taking their turn on the bump. Radziewski (3-1, 1.95 ERA) enters Friday's game with a team-leading 36 strikeouts, with Whaley (4-1, 2.61) leading the team in wins and sitting third in strikeouts (32).

Scouting Georgia Tech...

The Yellow Jackets of Georgia Tech enter the weekend undoubtedly as the hottest team in the ACC, with UMiami a close second. The Rambling Wreck has rolled off a league-leading 13 straight wins, and sits tied with the Hurricanes for a share of the Coastal Division lead at 6-0.

The Jackets are ranked as high as No. 8 in the Perfect Game USA Top-25 poll, while also ranked in the Collegiate Baseball Newspaper (12), USA Today/ESPN Coaches' (15), Baseball America (17) and National Collegiate Baseball Writer's Association (22) polls, respectively.

Georgia Tech is led by its pitching staff, allowing just 2.14 earned runs per game. The staff ace is Friday's starter Mark Pope, a right-hander that enters with a perfect 5-0 record and a league-leading ERA of 0.23, adding 32 strikeouts and just four walks in 38 2/3 innings tossed this season.

The Yellow Jackets carry a .388 batting average into the weekend, behind the strength of Kyle Wren with a team-leading .467 average and 42 hits. He has swiped eight bases on the paths, and totes a perfect fielding percentage. Offensively, he is followed by Jake Davies with a .403 average on 27 hits – including three home runs and four doubles. Like Wren, he has yet to commit a fielding error this year.

Miami Against Georgia Tech...

Miami holds a 47-26 all-time lead in the series. The 'Canes have claimed three of the last five meetings between the two teams, but it has been Rambling Wreck collecting the last two series victories. In 2008, Miami swept the Georgia Tech in Atlanta, as well as defeating GT in a game during the ACC Championships on the way to the ACC Tournament title.

Hurricanes Striking Into the Season...

After starting the season slow at 5-8, the Hurricanes have completely turned things around over the course of the last two-and-a-half weeks, rolling off nine consecutive wins entering the weekend series against ACC Coastal Division foe Georgia Tech. Not only are they back in the Collegiate Baseball Newspaper poll (No. 29), but they are receiving votes in two of the other three remaining major polls.

For Miami, this is the first time the Hurricanes have started an ACC season 6-0 since 2006 – and their first six-game conference winning streak since 2008. The 2006 team began the ACC slate 7-0, before advancing to

In his 18th season at Miami, no other program, nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a NCAA-record 38 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 17 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 26 years, 17 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 790-306-3 (.719) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,294-550-4 (.700) Division I record in 29 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 32 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,425-591-4 (.705) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 18 years, Morris has personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and has logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the new stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 26th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2010 when he guided the 'Canes to the NCAA Coral Gables Regional. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 17 seasons (1994-2010), winning 15 of his last 17 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris has led the 2010 Hurricanes to their 38th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five players from the 2010 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft. In 2008, the 'Canes reached the College World Series after winning the Atlantic Coast Conference, widely considered one of the toughest - if not the toughest - collegiate baseball conference in the country.

MORRIS IN HIS 33RD SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

Morris currently has a 1,294-550-4 (.700) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,425-591-4 (.705) record over 30-plus years.

Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.

Prior to his 17 seasons in Coral Gables, Morris went 504-244-1 at Georgia Tech from 1982-1993. In his first stint as a head coach, he guided DeKalb Junior College to a 131-41 mark from 1976-79.

JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

- Guided the Miami Hurricanes to College World Series National Championship in 1999 and 2001.
- The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with Miami in 11 of 17 seasons and led Miami to 13 straight NCAA Regional Championships, an NCAA record.
- Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami, by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and

2001.

- Sent 150 players to the Pro's, including Yonder Alonso (Cincinnati Reds), Pat Burrell (Rays), Ryan Braun (Brewers), Danny Graves (Astros), Alex Cora (Mets), Nomar Garciaparra (Dodgers), Jon Jay (St. Louis Cardinals), Gabby Sanchez (Florida Marlins), Danny Valencia (Minnesota Twins) and Jason Varitek (Red Sox).

- Has served three stints with the U.S. National Team: Assistant Coach for 1987 Pan American Games (Silver), Head Coach for 1989 Presidential Cup (Silver) and Head Coach for 1990 Goodwill Games (Bronze).

SHORTSTOPS AND JIM MORRIS

Morris, who played shortstop during college at Elon and then in the Boston Red Sox organization, has had great success developing the position while a head coach. Over the last decade Morris has taught prominent shortstops such as Nomar Garciaparra at Georgia Tech and Bobby Hill and Alex Cora at Miami.

Morris worked with Javy Rodriguez, who entered 2002 as a preseason All-American. Rodriguez led UM in just about every category as a junior in 2001, including a national-high 66 stolen bases. He currently works with sophomore Stephen Perez, a slick-fielding switch-hitter expected to bat near the upper-half of the order this year for the 'Canes.

Morris coached Hill, who played for the San Diego Padres, from 1997-99. Before Hill, it was Cora and Mike Metcalfe. Both players went on to play at the Major League level with the Los Angeles Dodgers. Cora is currently with the Nationals. Garciaparra played under Morris during the coaches' final two seasons in Atlanta and went on to become an All-Star with the Red Sox and played for the Oakland A's in 2009.

* Bryan Radziewski laid claim to his third win of season while striking out a season-high 10 batters in 6 1/3 tossed on Friday night.

* Eric Whaley collected his team-leading fourth win of the season with six innings pitched, accounting for nine strikeouts and allowing three earned runs [a three-run homer].

Recapping the Virginia Tech Series...

* The 'Canes opened up ACC play last Friday night with a win against the Virginia Tech Hokies. Miami has dominated Virginia Tech in Coral Gables, winning six of the seven match-ups on its home field. The 'Canes are now 5-3 all-time in ACC-opening games.

* **Nathan Melendres** returned to the lineup as well, playing center field after a four-game absence due to a hand injury.

* **Playing Small Ball** — Miami looked to manufacture runs against the Hokies, bunting six different times throughout the game — with four resulting in bunt singles and one in a sacrifice. UM also had three steal attempts on the night, with two successful tries by sophomore **Stephen Perez**. As a team, Miami improved to 17-22 with stolen bases on the season.

the College World Series in Omaha, Neb. The 2008 team, ranked atop almost every major poll for two-thirds of the season, rolled off 11 consecutive ACC wins (including four two-game series sweeps) from March 21 through April 18.

Welcome Back, Welcome Back...

Carrying a team-best eight-game hitting streak into the weekend, junior Preseason All-American **Harold Martinez** has come back to life after head coach **Jim Morris** decided to move the third baseman to first—in a clean switch with freshman **Brad Fieger** making the transition to the hot corner. Martinez has raised his batting average by more than 105 points over the last nine games, previously batting below .175 for the first time in his career just 13 games into the campaign.

Now the Miami native is batting .288 on the year — including a team-leading .500 over the last eight contests. Against Wake Forest, he had the game-winning RBI in games two and three, while finishing the series 5-for-12 at the plate with two sac bunts.

One Whale of a Game...

Sophomore pitcher **Eric Whaley** picked up his team-best third win of the year in Miami's series finale win (and series sweep) of Virginia Tech on Sunday, March 13, going a season-long tying seven innings — allowing just three hits and striking out three with zero walks issued to the Hokies. The Pompano Beach native has earned wins in all three home series finales on the campaign.

Position Change...

In the second game of the series against Virginia Tech, Miami head coach **Jim Morris** elected to move All-American third baseman **Harold Martinez** to first, in a straight switch with freshman **Brad Fieger**. Since the move, Martinez has a .964 fielding percentage and has a .550 batting average. Fieger has also embraced the change well, committing just a single error in six games at the hot corner.

* Miami claimed its the sixth consecutive conference win with a sweep of the Demon Deacons on the road. It's the first time Miami has started the Atlantic Coast Conference season 6-0

* Funk Continues — Runners left on base plagued the Hurricanes once again in the opening game of the series, as they left 11 men on the base paths in tonight's game. The 'Canes left the bases loaded in three different innings, and two on in another, with each four of the innings ending in a strikeout.

* Pitching Dominates Again — Freshman starter **Bryan Radziewski** pitched another gem in the series-opener, going seven shutouts innings to earn his second career victory. It was the longest start of his career; the second time he has gone 5-plus innings without giving up a run; and his third quality start of the season. Junior **Sam Robinson** pitched a perfect eighth, and has yet to give up a run on the season. Closer **Daniel Miranda** came in and pitched a bumpy ninth, allowing his first run of the season, before closing the door on the Hokies.

* Game-Saving Catch — **Dale Carey** made a diving catch in the top of the ninth inning to rob shortstop Tim Smalling of a potential extra-base hit. The hit would have brought the tying run to the plate with nobody out. Carey was inserted into the game in the bottom of the eighth as a pinch-runner and later on **Stephen Perez's** RBI double. He stayed in the game as the right fielder, where he proceeded to make his clutch play.

* The Long Haul — Sophomore right-hander **E.J. Encinosa** threw 96 pitches in eight and two-thirds innings of work. Encinosa earned his first win of the season and now stands at 1-2.

* Saturday's Starters — **Harold Martinez** and **Brad Fieger** swapped positions at the corners Friday night and were back at the positions tonight. It is Fieger's second career start at third and Martinez' second start of the season at first. Martinez played 10 games at first base during the 2009 season.

* Hits Parade — **Harold Martinez** recorded two singles in tonight for his second multi-hit game this season.

* A one, a two... — Southpaw hurler **Sam Robinson** earned his second save of the season, throwing only two pitches to seal Miami's 2-1 win over Virginia Tech.

* Making a Cameo — **Sam Robinson** made his 10 appearances to date, including a string of the last six of eight contests this month.

Runs Come Across

Sunday's 11 runs scored was the highest runs production for the Hurricanes all season. The previous high was 10 against Appalachian State in the series finale on February 26.

* Sunday's Starters — Six of today's starters collected hits, while all nine starters reached base safely. **Harold Martinez** posted multiple hits for the second time in as many games (third time this year), knocking in a season-high four RBI. **Nathan Melendres** registered a season-high three hits, adding a RBI and scoring twice. **Rony Rodriguez** and **Stephen Perez** both tallied multiple RBI.

* Start Your Engines — Sophomore right-hander **Eric Whaley** had another solid production in his fourth start of the year. The Pompano Beach native went seven innings on the hill, spreading out three hits with no runs, no walks and striking out eight batters. Whaley has a team second-best 23 strikeouts on the year.

* Playing Miami Baseball — Scoring 11 runs on nine hits meant Miami scored runs with guys on base, moving them over with bunts and driving them in with timely hits. Miami began the game with three consecutive bunt singles. UM has tallied five-plus hits in each of the last six games, including 14 against Illinois State (March 8).

* Walking the Line — Miami showed great plate awareness on Sunday, drawing 10 walks from six Virginia Tech pitchers. The 10 walks taken was a season-high for the 'Canes.

Catch Me If "U" Can...

This year's UMiami team is full of speed from all areas of the lineup, and through the first 22 games it's quite prevalent. Head coach **Jim Morris** has preached aggressive base running throughout his illustrious career, with the 'Canes swiping 36-of-44 bases this season. **Zeke DeVoss** leads the way with 11 steals, followed by **Nathan Melendres (7)** and **Stephen Perez (6)**.

In the last series against Wake Forest, Miami swiped eight bases over the course of the weekend, including steals of third base and home in the opening game of the three-game road trip.

The First Father/Son Duo...

Freshman catcher **Shane Rowland** has stepped right into the UMiami starting lineup and taken charge. He belted his first home run over the weekend against Appalachian State. The Tampa native is the son of former UMiami second baseman and current international scout for the New York Yankees, Donny Rowland. They are the first father/son duo to ever play baseball at the "U".

Miami Predicted to Finish Third In Coastal Division...

Miami baseball has been predicted to finish third in the Coastal Division of the Atlantic Coast Conference Coaches Preseason Poll. The poll is voted on by the league's 12 head coaches. Capturing a 20-10 league record in 2010, the Hurricanes finished the year third in the Coastal Division behind Virginia and Georgia Tech, respectively. Miami posted a 43-20 overall record en route to claiming the NCAA Coral Gables Regional title, and advancing to the NCAA Gainesville Super Regional.

Encinosa Has a Career Day in Gainesville...

Sophomore starting pitcher **E.J. Encinosa** went a career-long seven innings against top-ranked Florida (March 5). In a 1-0 loss to the Gators, Encinosa allowed just the one run on five hits and struckout three in a pitchers' duel with UF's Hudson Randall. Though not giving up the game-winning hit, Encinosa walked the first batter he faced in the eighth

The 40-40 Club in Miami...

Once again, the Hurricanes achieved a 40-win season, finishing 43-20 and a spot in the NCAA Super Regional. All-time at UMiami, the 'Canes have achieved at least 40 wins 32 seasons – including 13 times under **Jim Morris**. In fact, UM has claimed 50-plus wins 19 times in school history, and 60-plus wins on three occasions. Miami posted at least 40 wins from 1973-1986, marking one of the longest streaks in NCAA history with a school collected 40 or more wins in consecutive years.

To Be the Best, Play the Best...

According to Boyd's World RPI [strength of schedule], the UMiami Hurricanes have the 33rd toughest schedule in the nation. The 'Canes not only play the top-ranked University of Florida Gators on the road in the third series of the year, but there is the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) schedule. The ACC has been ranked as one of the top three toughest leagues in the nation the past five years by multiple collegiate baseball publications.

Miami in the ACC...

The 2011 season marks the seventh season the 'Canes have played in the Atlantic Coast Conference, and last year's 20-10 regular season mark in league play was the program's second-best behind the 2008 ACC championship squad that won 23 regular season league games.

Last Meeting With Georgia Tech: Georgia Tech Takes Rubber Match for the Series...

Leading 3-0 after five innings of play, No. 5 Miami was unable to hold onto its lead or mount late rally against No. 6 Georgia Tech, falling 6-3 Sunday afternoon in the rubber game of the three-game series at Russ Chandler Stadium.

The Yellow Jackets used a four-run sixth to take a one-run lead before adding an insurance run an inning later to earn the series win and tie the two teams up in second place in the ACC Coastal Division behind leader Virginia.

The Hurricanes (37-13, 19-8 ACC) were held off the scoreboard after the fourth and were plagued defensively by three errors - including one that led to the go-ahead run scoring.

Starter David Gutierrez pitched well, but allowed three runs on five hits while walking four and striking out four in 5 1/3 innings. Taylor Wulf (0-2) was tagged with the loss, allowing just one unearned run.

Chris Pelaez and Scott Lawson each went 2-for-4 for the 'Canes, while Harold Martinez drove in all three of Miami's runs with his team-leading 17th homer of the season.

Jed Bradley (9-2) earned the win, allowing three runs on five hits in six innings of work for the Yellow Jackets (41-10, 19-8 ACC). Patrick Long and Kevin Jacob each tossed a scoreless inning to set up Andrew Robinson, who tossed a scoreless ninth to earn his sixth save. Matt Skole and Derek Dietrich each had three hits for Georgia Tech while Cole Leonida scored a pair of runs.

For the second straight day, Martinez started the scoring with a home run - this time hitting an opposite field three-run shot to score Lawson and Yasmani Grandal in the fourth to give the 'Canes the lead.

Georgia Tech took the lead for good in the sixth. Skole led off the frame with a solo shot to left-center, putting the Yellow Jackets on the board for the first time. A walk and a single then put runners on the corners with one out for Jay Dantzler, who singled to center to cut UM's lead to 3-2. Another single and a strikeout later, Dietrich hit an infield single to second with the bases loaded, scoring one before another runner came across on a UM throwing error to give the Jackets the lead.

A bases loaded walk in the seventh by Jason Garofalo gave Georgia Tech its fifth run of the contest and its second straight unearned run after another error earlier in the inning.

The 'Canes best chance to rally late came in the eighth. Miami put runners on first and second with one out but Jacob induced a foul out and a strike out to get out of the jam.

Miami Jumps 12 Spots in Latest RPI Poll...

Sitting at No. 42 just a week ago in the RPI standings, the University of Miami made a leap 12 spot this week to No. 30, with wins against UCF and Wake Forest – two teams with high strength of schedules and RPIs. The sweep of Wake Forest by the 'Canes definitely helped after the Demon Deacons took two-of-three in the series victory over the Tar Heels two weeks ago in Winston-Salem, N.C.

Three Seconds with Georgia Tech...

• Junior Mark Pope (5-0), the Jackets Friday starter, leads the ACC in five different categories: Wins (5), Innings Pitched (38.2), ERA (0.23), Complete games (2) and shutouts (2) ... Pope has allowed just one earned run all season, and has tossed 34 consecutive

scoreless innings since last allowing an earned run to cross the plate ... His 0.23 ERA is the third lowest in the NCAA ... All three weekend starters have combined for an 11-1 record, and a 1.28 ERA.

- Freshman centerfielder Kyle Wren leads the ACC in batting average (.467), hits (42) and runs scored (30) ... Wren's 42 hits are the second most in the nation, while his batting average ranks 10th.

- Georgia Tech currently leads the Atlantic Coast Conference in hitting (.338), while second in pitching (2.14 ERA) ... Entering the week, the Jackets rank fourth nationally in both statistics.

No Ordinary Joe...

When the 'Canes visited Gainesville in early March, UMiami assistant coach **Joe Mercadante** returned to his old stomping grounds where he earned varsity letters in baseball for the University of Florida during the 2002 and '03 seasons. The former Gators catcher and Gainesville native appeared in 37 games for UF, holding a .312 (10-for-32) batting average and 19 runs batted in. Mercadante is in his seventh year with the Hurricanes program, coaching at P.K. Yonge High School (also his alma mater) prior to his arrival in Coral Gables.

Recapping Miami's Last Game - Florida Gulf Coast (3/23)...

Travis Miller saw action in his second game of the year and recorded his first win of the campaign, helping the University of Miami extend its winning streak to nine games with a 5-2 victory at home over Florida Gulf Coast University at Alex Rodriguez Park.

At the beginning of the 2011 season, there was a lot of hype surrounding Miami junior Harold Martinez – and rightfully so – after leading the ACC with 21 home runs as a sophomore. Wednesday night, Martinez continued an eight-game hit streak in which he has lived up to every bit of those expectations, hitting .467 over the 'Canes recent nine-game surge.

Martinez went 1-for-3 to drive in three runs and propel the Miami Hurricanes (14-8) in a come-from-behind win in five straight games now for UMiami.

The 'Canes looked to be in trouble early-on for the second straight night, as Florida Gulf Coast (12-10) scored two runs in the top of the third off of Miami's freshman starter A.J. Salcines. Salcines finished the night without factoring into the decision, leaving the game after four innings tossed – and the Hurricanes trailing in the contest.

In the bottom of the fourth, Miami narrowed the gap as Zeke DeVoss doubled to lead off the inning, then stole third with no outs. After Nathan Melendres walked, Martinez came to the plate, and hit a hard grounder to third that allowed DeVoss to score.

The bottom of the sixth followed a similar script with DeVoss walking to start the inning; later trotting to second after Melendres took his second walk of the game to bring up Martinez.

Martinez then ripped a single to right field to knot the game at 2-all as he drove in DeVoss from third. The Hurricanes then took the lead for good as Rony Rodriguez singled through the right side two batters later to bring Melendres home.

The 'Canes stretched their lead in the eighth as freshman Dale Carey singled to right and advanced on a balk, and Martinez tallied his third RBI of the game with another hard hit ground ball, this time to second base. Martinez then scored his first run of the game on Rodriguez' second RBI of the night for the final margin.

Travis Miller (1-0, 0.00) got his first win of the year in relief, as closer Danny Miranda recorded his sixth save of the year.

FGCU starter Kevin Bryant went 3 2/3 innings, but it was reliever Austin Gaines (2-1, 1.29 ERA) who took the loss.

Free Baseball...

The Hurricanes are 2-1 in extra-inning games this year. UMiami began the year accomplishing a task that has never been achieved in school history – back-to-back games to open a season. The 'Canes went 1-1 in the opening two days against Rutgers.

Morris Has Surgery to Remove Gall Bladder...

On Friday, March 25, 18th-year head coach **Jim Morris** received surgery to remove his gall bladder at the University of Miami Hospital. He stayed in the hospital a few extra days due to an infection stemming from the surgery. The skipper returned faster than expected to the 'Canes dugout, coaching against Illinois State (March 8) after missing a total of seven games - six consecutive.

Morris Signs Contract Extension...

On Sept. 20, 2009, former University of Miami Director of Athletics Kirby Hocutt announced that head baseball coach **Jim Morris** signed a contract extension through 2015. Morris, who is in his 17th season at the helm of the Miami baseball program, has led the Hurricanes to the College World Series in 11 of his 17 seasons in Coral Gables – including National Championship runs in 1999 and 2001.

Miami Gets Them Drafted...

Over the last three years, Miami has produced four first round MLB draft picks, more than any other school in the nation. Last year, Yasmani Grandal was selected in the first round by the Cincinnati Reds, with four other players—David Gutierrez (Minnesota Twins),

Two of a Kind...

University of Miami head coach **Jim Morris** entered the season with 776 career wins with the Hurricanes and registered 504 wins at Georgia Tech prior to his arrival in Coral Gables. Morris is one of only two head coaches to ever amass 500 or more wins at two separate Division I schools. Augie Garrido at the University of Texas entered the year with 602 wins with the Longhorns program. Garrido logged 928 wins as head coach at Cal State Fullerton before his current stint in Austin.

Closing In On the Luck "8"...

Jim Morris is enjoying his 18th year at the helm in Coral Gables, and the skipper is closing in on his 800th career win. Morris sits at 790 wins at UMiami entering the weekend against his former school – Georgia Tech.

New Era Behind the Plate...

Three catchers will be battling for playing time behind the plate this year, including junior **David Villasuso**. A season ago, Villasuso batted .245 with 20 RBI and five home runs while serving as a backup to MLB First Round Draft selection and 2010 ACC Player of the Year, Yasmani Grandal.

Others battling for playing time this season will be freshmen **Corey Janson** and **Shane Rowland**. After the fall season, Villasuso will probably make the start to begin the season, but don't be surprised if and when Rowland takes the spot behind the dish with improved confidence and skill.

Athletics Gets a Changing of the Guard...

On March 3, the University of Miami Department of Athletics and UMiami President Dr. Donna E. Shalala announced that Tony Hernandez would succeed Kirby Hocutt as Interim Director of Athletics. Hocutt resigned a week prior to take a similar position at Texas Tech University. Hernandez has served in a variety of areas within the Department of Athletics at UM in his 13 years of service, including the last year and a half as Deputy Athletic Director.

Fresh Faces In the Dugout...

This season, head coach **Jim Morris** has one of his youngest teams in recent memory. UMiami has 13 newcomers on this year's roster (12 freshman and one sophomore transfer). The 'Canes lost 2010 ACC Player of the Year, Yasmani Grandal, to the MLB Draft—Grandal was selected 12th overall in the Draft.

ALEX RODRIGUEZ PARK INFORMATION

Renovations to Alex Rodriguez Park are thanks in large part to a \$3.9 million contribution by New York Yankees third baseman and 11-time MLB All-Star Alex Rodriguez. The gift - the largest ever to the University of Miami baseball program - has assisted the program in continuing to develop first-class facilities. The official announcement of his gift was made on Oct. 10, 2002.

Alex Rodriguez Park has taken form in a three-phase process:

- Phase I called for seating modifications, new dugouts, new stadium lighting and utility infrastructure and new rest rooms.
- Phase II entailed renovating below the grand stand area in addition to adding new concession areas.
- The final phase included adding a new clubhouse, weight room, training room, meeting room, video room and academic area. In addition, a new press box – along with four VIP suites – have been built atop the grandstand. This past offseason, addition seating was added down both lines while a new scoreboard was constructed in left field.
