Series: Former Big East foes Pitt and Miami meet for the 34th time in series history with the Panthers holding a slim 17-16 advantage in a series which dates back to Dec. 26, 1947.

The last time Pitt traveled to Miami was on Jan. 10, 2004, an 84-80 win in double overtime.

Pitt owns a 6-10 record in games played in Coral Gables, including a 1-0 mark at the BankUnited Center.

No. 25/22 Pitt (18-3, 6-2 ACC) travels to Miami (11-10, 2-6 ACC) for a Wednesday, Feb. 5, contest at the BankUnited Center. Tipoff is at 7:00 p.m. ET.

The game will be televised on RSN/Root with Wes Durham (play-by-play) and Cory Alexander (color analysis) making the call. Joe Vencius will handle production.

At 6-3 in ACC competition, Pitt enters the game in a third place tie with Duke, two full games behind Virginia in the standings. Miami sits in a tie for 13th at 2-6, while undefeated Syracuse is the league's leader with a perfect 8-0 record.

In the NCAA's updated RPI rankings re-

leased on Monday, Feb. 3, Pitt ranked No. 26. Six ACC teams are ranked among the nation's top-60 in RPI: Syracuse (3), Duke (11), Virginia (16), Pitt (26), Florida State (40) and North Carolina (42).

Pitt has won its 18 games by an average margin of 14.7 points per game. Sixteen of Pitt's 18 wins have come by nine or more points and 12 of its 18 are by 17 points or more. Offensively, the Panthers are averaging 74.4 points per game, converting 47.8 percent (569-1190) of field goals, 35.4 percent (105-297) of 3-point field goals and a solid 71.8 percent (394-549) of free throw attempts. Pitt is also outrebounding its opponents by a sizable plus-

8.1 margin. Defensively, Pitt is holding its opponents to 60.5 points per game and yielding a 40.6 (471-1161) field goal percentage. Eighteen of Pitt's 22 opponents have been held to 70 points or less and 12 have been limited to 60 points or less.

18.1 points, 5.2 rebounds and 4.4 assists per game and Talib Zanna nearly averages a double-double in points (14.3) and rebounds (8.1).

At home, Pitt is 12-2 this year, has won 14 of its last 16 games and owns a 19-game consecutive win streak against non-conference opponents. In its 12th season in the Petersen Events Center, Pitt owns a 192-24 overall record in the arena and a 78-21 conference record (3-2 vs. ACC/75-19 vs. Big East). Pitt also owns a 110-3 record vs. non-conference opponents at the

Petersen Events Center and has won 131 of its last 135 home games against regular season non-conference opponents.

Miami hosts Pitt for the first time since 2004. At 2-6 in the ACC, the Hurricanes sit in 13th place in the conference and are on a three-game ACC losing streak. Miami recently stepped out of conference to pick up a 64-49 win over Norfolk State on Feb. 1. For the year, the Hurricanes have been paced by Rion Brown who is averaging 14 points and 6.2 rebounds per game.

Pitt returned three starters—Lamar Patterson, Talib Zanna and James Robinson—and two of its top three scorers from a 2012-13 team that finished 24-9 overall, 12-6 and in fourth place in its final year in the Big East Conference. Pitt also earned an 11th NCAA Tournament appearance in the last 12 seasons. In addition, Pitt won 20-plus overall games for the 12th consecutive season. Pitt's 24 victories rank as the 12thmost wins in school history. In 2012-13, Pitt's defense was one of the nation's best. The Panthers allowed

PITT'S 12-YEAR SUCCESS (2001-13)

The following is a list of accomplishments achieved by the Pitt Basketball program over the last 12 seasons:

- Compiled a 319-96 record over the last 12 seasons and .769 winning percentage, which ranks among the nation's top five best winning percentages during that span. The record also ranks second in the ACC from 2001-12.
- Advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight/Regional Final in 2009 for the first time since 1974.
- Advanced to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen five times in the last 12 seasons. Only seven programs (Duke-9, Kansas-9, Michigan State-7, Connecticut-6, Syracuse-6, Arizona-6 and North Carolina-6) have advanced to more Sweet Sixteens during that span.
- Won two Big East Tournament championships (2003 and 2008).
- Captured four Big East regular season titles: 2001-02 Big East West Division, 2002-03 Big East West Division, 2003-04 Big East regular season, 2010-11 Big East regular season.
- Advanced to the NCAA Tournament for a Big East-leading 10 seasons, one of only eight programs nationwide to advance to the NCAA Tournament during that span.
- Ascended to the program's firstever No. 1 national ranking and earned two No. 1 seeds in 2008-09 and 2010-11.
- Achieved 12 straight 20-plus win seasons from 2002-13.
- Averaged 26.6 victories per season over the last 12 years.
- Advanced to the Big East Championship title game in seven of the last 13 seasons and appeared in three straight seasons from 2001-04.
- Compiled a Big East-best 141-63 (.691) record in league regular season games.
- Finished ranked among the nation's top-10 programs in six of the last 12 seasons and ranked among the nation's top-25 in 10 of the last 12 years.
- Appeared on television 352 times in the last 12 years.
- Set the school record with a 40-game win streak, which spanned two years and 68 days.
 - spanned two years and 68 days. Opened the Petersen Events Center with a 34-game win streak, a streak which ranks as the third all-time longest win streak to open a new arena in NCAA Division I history.
- Concluded its 10th year in the Petersen Events Center with an 180-22 record and .891 winning percentage.
- Sold out the Petersen Events Center in each of the 12 seasons in operation and has enjoyed a string of 205 consecutive regular season sellouts dating back to the 2002 season.

oree. Since ACC play began, his numbers have improved. Through nine Atlantic Coast Conference games, Lamar Patterson has averaged 18.1 points, 5.2 rebounds and 4.4 assists per game, while shooting 44.3 percent (54-122) from the floor and a spectacular 41 percent (18-44) from 3-point range. What's even more amazing is that Patterson has played a role in 44 percent of Pitt's ACC field goals.

A versatile, all-around player Lamar Patterson is attempting to become just the third player in Pitt basketball history to score 1,000 points, grab 500 rebounds and dish out 400 assists in a career. Currently he needs just 29 assists to achieve that feat. Only two players in school history have achieved those marks: Carl Krauser (2006-01), who finished with 1,642 points, 526 rebounds and 568 assists and Brad Wanamaker (2007-11), who amassed 1,070 points, 525 rebounds and 454 assists.

PITT PICKED TO FINISH SIXTH IN PRESEASON ACC MEDIA POLL

CHARLOTTE, N.C.—Pitt was selected by media members to finish sixth out of 15 schools at its first-ever Atlantic Coast Conference Operation Basketball preseason media day held Wednesday at the Ritz Carlton in downtown Charlotte. Over 300 writers, television broadcasters, radio producers and other assorted media members attended the ACC's 52nd annual event.

In a vote of the league's attending media members, Pitt finished sixth with 477 total points. Duke was selected to capture first place with 805 points and 50 first place votes, followed by No. 2 Syracuse (753 points/three first place votes), No. 3 North Carolina (668/one first place vote), No. 4 Virginia (612), No. 5 Notre Dame (608) and then Pitt. Syracuse's C.J. Fair was selected the preseason player of the year, while Duke's Jabari Parker was named preseason rookie of the year.

The preseason All-ACC team included Fair, Parker, Virginia's

Joe Harris, Duke's Rodney Hood and Notre Dame's Jerian Grant. Fifty four media members participated in the voting.

In preparation for its inaugural season in the ACC, Pitt was making its first appearance at the event. Pitt Head Coach Jamie Dixon and seniors Lamar Patterson and Talib Zanna represented the Panthers in Charlotte.

Robinson currently has a nation and ACC-leading 4.74 assist:turnover ratio (90 assists/19 turnovers).

Currently, Robinson has a 3.43 career assist:turnover ratio, which currently ranks as the No. 1 mark in school history. Robinson also has the

potential to be one of the best-ever closers in school history as he sports an 81.4 percent career free throw percentage.

He is also scoring more, as evidenced by his career-high of 16 points at Georgia Tech. Since a season-ending injury to Durand Johnson, Robinson has averaged 9.2 points per game in Pitt's last six contests.

On Nov. 20 against Lehigh, Robinson finished the game with a career-high 11 assists and no turnovers, which ranked tied for second place on Pitt's all-time assist:turnover contests in school history. He also had an eight assist, zero turnover day against Clemson, Jan. 21.

CBS Sports' Jon Rothstein called Robinson one of the "least appreciated" point guards in the nation. Pitt's lone two-time international Gold Medalist with Team USA, Robinson has the opportunity to build one of the best careers for a point guard in Pitt history.

Pitt freshman power forward Michael Young became just the 14th all-time freshman first game opening day starter at Pitt since freshmen were sanctioned to compete by the NCAA in 1972-73. On the year, Young has not disappointed, starting all 22 games and averaging 6.0 points and 4.8 rebounds per game. Young is also a superb free throw shooter as he has converted 82.8 percent on the year (48-58). On Jan. 4, he scored a career-high 13 points at NC State.

DURAND JOHNSON OUT FOR SEA-SON WITH ACL/TORN MENISCUS INJURY

Sophomore sixth man Durand Johnson is out for the season with a right knee injury (ACL/torn meniscus) suffered against Wake Forest on Jan. 11.

A 3-point and dangerous scoring threat off the bench, Johnson was emerging as one of Pitt's top scorers and playmakers. He was averaging 8.8 points and ranked second on the squad in 3-point field goals made (22-65).

Pitt's student cheering section, the Oakland Zoo and UPMC combined to honor Johnson on Jan. 21 against Clemson by ordering white headbands for all the students in attendance.

BENCH PRODUCTION KEY FOR PANTHERS

Pitt has a productive four-player bench. Each player provides the team different intangibles and skills:

- Before his season-ending injury on Jan. 11 against Wake Forest in which he tore his ACL and meniscus in his right knee, sophomore Durand Johnson was Pitt's scorer and 3-pointer shooter.
- Freshman Josh Newkirk is ultra-quick, athletic and plays at a different tempo at both guard positions. He also shown consistent shooting, slashing and defensive ability.
- Freshman Jamel Artis backs up Young at power forward and gives Pitt a finesse/skilled look at the position. Artis can hit perimeter shots, play down low and is one of Pitt's best passers.
- Junior transfer Derrick Randall is a tough, physical player who

PANTHERS EXCEL AT HOME

Pitt is in its 12th season in the Petersen Events Center with a 192-24 all-time record and .889 winning percentage. The .889 winning percentage ranks among the nation's best homecourt records over the last 12 years (see chart page 8).

Pitt has won 83 of its last 104 league home games. Only one opponent (Louisville) has defeated Pitt three times at the Petersen Events Center, while four programs (Rutgers, Georgetown, Cincinnati and West Virginia) have defeated the Panthers two times in the arena. Pitt has lost four straight games on one occasion and two consecutive games only five times in the history of the Petersen Events Center. Only two programs have defeated Pitt in backto-back games at the Petersen Events Center: Louisville and Cincinnati.

At home, Pitt has won 67 of its last 80 games, 45 of its last 58 games against conference regular season opponents, 98 of its last 112 overall games and recently completed home win streaks of 20 games (Jan. 28, 2010-Jan. 24, 2011) and 15 games (Feb. 29, 2012-Dec. 31, 2012). The 20-game win streak ranks as the fourth longest streak of its kind in school history.

Pitt is 78-21 vs. league regular season opponents at the Petersen

Events Center (3-2 vs. ACC, 75-19 vs. Big East). In addition, Pitt recently completed a 58-game win streak against non-conference opponents at home (Nov. 19, 2005-Nov. 16, 2011).

Pitt also owns an impressive 110-3 record vs. non-conference opponents in the Petersen Events Center and has claimed 131 of its last 135 home games against regular season non-conference opponents. Pitt's three non-conference losses at the PEC are to Bucknell (Jan. 2, 2005), Long Beach State (Nov. 16, 2011) and Wagner (Dec. 23, 2011).

Winners of 14 of its last 16 home games, Pitt has also won 33

of its last 38 home games.

Since the Petersen Events Center opened in 2002, Pitt owns a 54-1 record in November non-conference home games and has a 55-1 record in December non-conference matchups at the PEC.

DECADE-PLUS OF EXCELLENCE

Over the last 13 years, Pitt has proven to be the winningest basket-ball program in the Big East Conference and one of the top-5 winningest programs nationally. From 2001-12, Pitt has continued to rank second among the nation' top records for overall games (337-99), league regular season games (147-65), Big East

championships (six) and NCAA Tournament appearances (11).

When comparing Pitt's success with other ACC schools (2002-13), the Panthers rank No. 2 in overall winning percentage, league regular season winning percentage, NCAA Tournament appearances (11 of last 12) and homecourt winning percentage (192-23, .893). The Panthers also rank No. 4 in most league championships during that timeframe.

During that period, Pitt has averaged 11.8 league wins and 26.5 overall victories per year. Pitt is also the only former Big East Conference program to win 20 or more overall games and 10 or more league contests in 11 of the previous 12 sea-

sons (2001-13). Pitt's previous streak of 10 consecutive 10-win Big East regular seasons (2001-11) during that timeframe ranks second only to Syracuse's run of eleven 10-plus win seasons set from 1985-96. Pitt has won 20 or more games 20 times in school history.

In addition, Pitt was one of only three programs nationwide to advance to the NCAA Tournament and win 20 overall games and 10 league games in a 10-year span from 2001-11. Those programs include Gonzaga, Kansas and Pitt. That streak ended for Pitt two years ago.

Since 2001, Pitt has earned 11 NCAA Tournament berths. During that span, Pitt is one of only seven schools nationwide and one of two ACC programs to advance to the NCAA Tournament in at least 11 of the last 12 seasons. Those schools include Duke, Gonzaga, Kansas, Michigan State, Texas, Wisconsin and Pitt.

Pitt has advanced to NCAA Sweet Sixteen play in five of the last 12 seasons. Only seven programs na-

tionally (Duke-9, Kansas-9, Michigan State 7, Connecticut-6, Arizona-6, Syracuse-6 and North Carolina-6) have surpassed that accomplishment, while eight other programs have matched it. Pitt also ranks among national leaders in NCAA Tournament wins over the last 12 seasons with 15.

PITT TO ACC NOTES

- On January 4, 2014, Pitt began its first basketball season in the Atlantic Coast Conference. Syracuse, Pitt and Notre Dame join the league this year, while Louisville will enter next season.
- Jamie Dixon now owns a 17-2 record vs. members of the old ACC (not including Notre Dame and Syracuse).
- Additionally, Dixon also owns a 33-13 overall record in head-tohead matchups vs. current ACC teams. Here is Dixon's breakdown: Boston College 3-0, Clemson 1-0, Duke 1-1, Florida State 3-0, Georgia Tech 1-0, Maryland 3-0, Miami 1-0, NC State 1-0, Notre Dame 6-6, Syracuse 10-5, Virginia 0-1, Virginia Tech 2-0, Wake Forest 1-0.

Pitt is 3-1 on the road this season.

Success on the road is nothing new for the Panthers who concluded its 2012-13 regular season with a 6-3 road record. The 6-3 record ranks as one of the best road records in Pitt's Big East history.

Over the last 12 seasons (2001-13), Pitt owned one of the Big East's best road winning percentages (.578) with a 59-43 record. In addition, Pitt has won 34 its last 54 road games

PITT BASKETBALL SOLD OUT FOR 12TH CONSECUTIVE SEASON

Pitt announced on Nov. 2, 2013 that it has sold out its entire allotment of men's basketball season tickets for the 12th consecutive season.

This year, Pitt was able to sell more season tickets than in prior seasons, since ACC rules reduced the number of tickets available to opponents. Half of that allotment was sold as season tickets this season with the other half being offered on a single game basis to waiting list members

Pitt Basketball has enjoyed a string of 218 consecutive regular season home sellouts dating back to a January 12, 2002 Fitzgerald Field House game vs. Notre Dame. In addition, Pitt has a total of 11,000 names on its season ticket waiting list.

D.C.'s Verizon Center. Washington D.C. and the Verizon Center is a four-hour, 250-mile drive from Pittsburgh. The Verizon Center is familiar to Pitt fans as the Panthers own a 9-5 record in 14 games at the facility, including an 8-4 record in head-to-head contests with Georgetown.

Three current Pitt underclassmen are Washington D.C.-Baltimore natives including James Robinson (Mitchellville, Md./DeMatha Catholic), Durand Johnson (Baltimore, Md.) and Jamel Artis (Baltimore, Md.).

PITT-VIRGINIA POST-GAME NOTES

- •Pitt dropped to 18-4 on the season and 6-3 overall in the Atlantic Coast Conference with this afternoon's 48 45 loss to Virginia. The Panthers are now 13-2 at the Petersen Events Center this season.
- •The back-to-back losses marked the first time Pitt dropped consecutive home games since the 2011-12 sea

son (Feb. 19 vs. USF; Feb. 16 vs. West Virginia).

- •Neither team led by more than four points in the 40-minute contest. There were 17 ties and seven lead changes in the game. The 17 ties are a Petersen Events Center high for the Panthers, topping the previous high of 10 ties versus Louisville on Jan. 16, 2010. Pitt posted an 82-77 win in that contest, which also fea tured three lead changes.
- Virginia's Malcolm Brogdon delivered the game-winning shot from beyond-the-arc with 0.4 seconds left in the contest, securing a 48-45 Cavaliers win. Brogdon led all scorers with 16 points.
- •The Panthers recorded a season-low 14 paint points. The previous sea son-low was 16 (occurred twice, vs. Duke and vs. Cincinnati).
- •The 45 points were the second-few est by the Panthers this season (43 is

fewest, versus Cincinnati on Dec. 17). In addition, the 31.9 percent field goal percentage marked Pitt's next-to-lowest on the season (.314 was the lowest, also against Cincinnati).

•Pitt (23) and Virginia (21) combined for 44 points in the first half, the second-fewest combination of

points by the Panthers and their op ponents in a half this season. The lowest total of combined points this season came on December 17 vs. Cincinnati in the Jimmy V Classic in New York, N.Y. (40).

time for the 17th time this season. The loss was the first of the season for Pitt when leading at the half (16-1).

- •Freshman Jamel Artis scored a ca reer-high 11 points to go along with a career-matching seven rebounds. He paced the team in scoring for the first time in his career and rebounds for the second time (Loyola was the first). The contest marked the first time Artis registered double figures as a Panther.
- •Senior Lamar Patterson tallied 10 points, scoring in double digits for the 21st time this season and the 58th time over his career.
- •Talib Zanna's career-best streak of nine consecutive games in double digit scoring came to an end against Virginia after just two points in 27 minutes played.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

With a 12-1 start to its 2013-14 season, Pitt surpassed the 10-plus win mark for non-conference games for the 13th consecutive year.

Prior to this run and since Pitt joined the Big East Conference in 1982-83, Pitt had won 10 or more non-conference games in only three previous years. Here is Pitt's non-conference record over the last 13 seasons:

Pitt has compiled a 152-13 nonconference record over the last 13 years

Pitt has also won 107 of its last 118 overall games against non-conference opponents dating back to a January 2, 2005 loss to Bucknell. In addition to Bucknell, the 11 losses are to Cincinnati in the Jimmy V Classic (Dec. 17, 2013), No. 4 Michigan on Nov. 21, 2012 in the NIT Season Tip-Off, Wagner (Dec. 23, 2011), Long Beach State (Nov. 16, 2011), No. 11 Tennessee at Consol Energy Center on Dec. 11, 2010, Indiana

on Dec. 8, 2009 in the Jimmy V Classic in New York City, No. 3 Texas in Kansas City, Mo. on Nov. 24, 2009, at Wisconsin (2006), vs. Oklahoma State in Oklahoma City (2006) and at Dayton (2008).

Since the 2001-02 season, Pitt is 66-9 in December games and has won 65 of its last 67 November games. Jamie Dixon owns a 64-3 career November record.

PITT SUCCESS REVOLYES AROUND REBOUNDING, REBOUND MARGIN

Once again, Pitt is ranked among national leaders in rebound margin (plus-8.1). Pitt also leads the ACC in that statistical category. It has become the norm as the Panthers have ranked among the nation's top-10 rebounding teams in six of the last 11 seasons under Jamie Dixon. The Panthers also set a school record for lowest opponent rebound average (28.5) in 2012-13.

STELLAR ASSIST:TURNOVER RATIO

Once again, Pitt is doing an outstanding job of taking care of the basketball and sharing the ball. Point guard James Robinson currently leads the nation in assist:turnover ratio and the Panthers currently own a 1.60 assist:turnover ratio figure, which ranks sixth nationally. On the year, Pitt has assisted on 63.4 percent (361 of 569) of its field goals made.

According to the final 2012-13 NCAA statistics, Pitt ranked No. 3 nationally with a stellar assist:turnover ratio of 1.48. Robinson ranked No. 9 nationally with a 2.83 assist:turnover ratio.

In last year's final NCAA Statistics report, Pitt ranked No. 3 nationally in assist:turnover ratio, No. 7 in assists per game, No. 21 in fewest turnovers per game and No. 48 in turnover margin, all remarkable

improvements over the previous season's performance.

JAMIE DIXON ETCHES HIS NAME ALL OVER NCAA DIVISION I ALL-TIME COACHING TENURE RECORDS

Through each of Jamie Dixon's first 11 seasons as a head coach, he has ranked among the all-time NCAA Division I top-10 best career starts (by wins). The charts can be found in the NCAA recordbook coaches section on page 14-15.

In the midst of his 11th season, Dixon currently ranks fifth on the all-time wins list after 11 full years as a head coach (see chart on page 5).

DIXON: ONE OF FASTEST ALL-TIME TO 200 COACHING WINS

With a 61-46 victory over American on Dec. 22, 2010, Dixon reached the 200-career victory plateau. Dixon tied the NCAA Division I record for quickest to 200 wins in only eight seasons, matching the record held by Gonzaga's Mark Few and Kansas' Roy Williams. He ranks No. 13 among the all-time NCAA Division I coaches in quickest to 200 victories in regards to total games (see charts on page 4) and tied the NCAA record in fastest to 200 career wins by years (8). He also became the fastest coach in school history to reach the 200-win plateau and only the second coach to reach that mark in school history (see chart on page 6). The only other coach in school history to win over 200 games is H.C. "Doc" Carlson, who recorded a 367-247 record over 31 years from 1922-53.

In addition, Dixon has guided Pitt to three combined Big East titles (2003-04 regular season, 2008 tournament and 2010-11 regular season), two No. 1 seeds upon entering the NCAA Tournament (2009 and 2011), led Pitt to six consecutive 25-win seasons and has winning records or .500 records against 13

of the 15 previous Big East schools.

JAMIE DIXON: FOUR-TIME NA-TIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR

Jamie Dixon has earned four National Coach of the Year awards. Dixon was named the 2011 Sporting News National Coach of the Year after leading Pitt to the Big East regular season outright title. He was named the 2010 Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year after guiding Pitt to a 25-9 overall record, second place finish in the Big East and No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament after his squad was picked to finish ninth in the Big East preseason coaches' poll. Dixon also earned USA Basketball National Coach of the Year honors for guiding the Americans to the Under-19 FIBA World Championship Gold Medal.

Following the 2008-09 season, Dixon was named the Naismith National Coach of the Year recipient, Pitt's second all-time Naismith National Coach of the Year recipient

PITT IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

For the fourth consecutive week, Pitt is listed in both national rankings, at No. 25 in the Associated Press poll and No. 22 in the USA Today coaches' poll (as of Feb. 3, 2014).

For the first 10 weeks of the 2013-14 season, Pitt had been listed on the poll's "Also Receiving Votes" list. That was an uncommon place for Pitt, which has been ranked among the nation's top-25 in 78 percent of the national polls since the 2001-02 season.

Since January 7, 2002, Pitt has been ranked among the nation's top-25 in 79 percent and 177 of the last 225 national polls. In addition, Pitt has been ranked among the nation's top-10 teams for at least one week in 11 of the past 12 seasons (2002-13).

In 2008-09, Pitt ascended to the No. 1 national ranking for the first time in school history. It spent a total of three weeks as the nation's consensus No. 1. The 2008-09 Pitt men's basketball team became the first Pitt team to hold the No. 1 national ranking since the 1982 Pitt football season. The 1982 Pitt football team entered the season ranked No. 1 and held the top spot for three weeks during the year (Sept. 7, Oct. 26, Nov. 2).

CLOSE QUALITY LOSSES





Over the last 11 years under Jamie Dixon, Pitt's 90 losses have come by a combined 681 points for a 7.6 average points per loss.

Since Jamie Dixon became head coach, only 25 of his 90 losses during his 10-year tenure came by 10 or more points:

Pitt's 23-point loss to Rutgers on Jan. 11, 2012 was its largest Big East regular season loss since Dixon became head coach.

Amazingly, Dixon has dropped 33 of his 90 career games by four points or less and 65 of his 90 losses by fewer than 10 points (72.2 percent).

DIXON AND NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

Combining his non-conference games, Dixon owns a 131-11 overall record vs. non-conference foes. Dixon won 45 consecutive games in November and December before dropping a contest at No. 7 Wisconsin on Dec. 16, 2006. He won his first 35 November games until a loss to No. 3 Texas in 2009.

UNDER 70 DEFENSIVE MENTALITY

Defense has been a key ingredient to Pitt's success over the last 13 seasons. Following are some defensive notes:

- Already in 2013-14, Pitt has held 12 of its 22 opponents under 60 points, 18 of 22 below 70 points and has yielded 40.6 percent (471-1161) shooting.
- In 2012-13, Pitt held 19 of its

- 33 opponents to 60 points or less and 29 of its 33 foes to 70 points or less. Against Pitt, opponents averaged a school-record low 56.0 points per game and shot just 39.2 percent (627-1598) from the floor.
- Since Jamie Dixon became head coach in 2003-04, Pitt has held 140 of its 180 conference regular season opponents to 70 points or less.
- Additionally, since Jamie Dixon became head coach, Pitt has held 294 of its 369 opponents to 70 points or less. Pitt's record is 280-89 during that span.
- Over the last 11 seasons under Dixon, Pitt has posted nine of the top-10 best defensive seasons in school history. That achievement has made it the best defensive era in school and Big East Conference history.
- When holding opponents to 60 points or less, Pitt is 198-14 over the last 13 years:

HOME SWEET HOME

In a Sports Illustrated poll in 2012-13, Big East Conference players voted Pitt's Petersen Events Center as the most difficult place to play in the league. Also, a 2009 AOL Fanhouse poll of Big East players rated Pitt's fans as the "Best in the League."

Pitt's Petersen Events Center was rated the sixth-loudest stadium in college basketball by ESPN The Magazine. Also, the Petersen Events Center ranked among the nation's top-10 in toughest places to play (7th, Bleacher Report), best gameday atmospheres (2nd, USA Today) and best overall college basketball arenas (8th, ESPN.com). The Oakland Zoo has also earned the reputation of being rated as the one of the nation's top college basketball cheering sections.

Here are some facts to support those statements:

- Pitt has won 196 of its last 222
 home games which includes a 40game home win streak from
 2002-04 and a 31-game home
 win streak from 2008-10.
- Over the last 12 seasons, Pitt is a combined 206-25 in home games. Its 19 home wins in 2003-04 set a school record for most home victories in a season.
- Pitt has lost just 24 times in the Petersen Events Center and sports a 192-24 record (.889) in the 12-year old arena. Louisville is the only opponent to defeat Pitt three times in the arena, Notre Dame, Georgetown, Cincinnati, West Virginia and Rutgers are the only opponents to defeat Pitt two times at the Petersen Events Center. Pitt has lost just three non-conference games to the likes of Bucknell, Long Beach State and Wagner.
- Pitt won its first 34 consecutive games in the Petersen Events Center. The 34-game win streak to open the arena ranks third all-time among winning streaks to open new arenas (51-UCLA in 1964, 41-Providence in 1971-72 and 34-Pitt, 2002-04).
- Pitt has won 84 of its last 104 league home games and is 78-21 against conference opponents in the Petersen Events Center (3-2 vs. ACC schools).
- Pitt recently won a school record 58 consecutive home games against non-conference opponents at the Petersen Events Center. Its 58-game win streak spanning from Jan. 2, 2005-Nov. 16, 2011 surpassed the previous record of 28 consecutive nonconference home wins at the Petersen Events Center recorded from Nov. 23, 2002-Jan. 2, 2005.
- Pitt owns a 110-3 record vs. nonconference opponents in the Petersen Events Center. Wagner, Long Beach State and Bucknell are the only three nonconference teams to defeat the Panthers there.
- Pitt has won 131 of its last 135 home games against regular season non-conference home opponents.
- For the first time in Petersen Events Center history, Pitt dropped four straight games during the 2011-12 season (Dec. 23,

- Wagner-Jan. 21, Louisville). It also lost back-to-back games at the Petersen Events Center on only five different occasions. Two of those occurrences happened during the 2004-05 season: Jan. 2, 2005 vs. Bucknell (69-66) and Jan. 5, 2005 vs. Georgetown (67-64); and Feb. 23, 2005 vs. West Virginia (70-66) and Feb. 26, 2005 vs. Connecticut (73-64). Pitt also dropped back-to-back games in 2012-13 against No. 8 Cincinnati (70-61) and Marquette (74-67 in OT).
- Pitt currently has a string of 219 consecutive regular season home sellouts dating back to a January 12, 2002 game at Fitzgerald Field House against Notre Dame (211 regular season games at PEC+the final seven Fitzgerald Field House games in 2001-02). All 212 regular season games at the Petersen Events Center have been sold out. Note: Pitt has played 216 games at PEC, four of those which were postseason (CBI).

PITT ACADEMIC NOTES

The following notes include academic achievements by the Pitt basketball program over the last 11 years:

- Achieved two consecutive top-10 percent ratings in the NCAA's Academic Performance Rankings in 2011-12 and 2010-11, one of only two Big East Conference basketball programs to achieve that honor (Pitt and Notre Dame).
- Over 80 percent of Jamie Dixon's players have graduated from the University of Pittsburgh. That number includes Lamar Patterson and Talib Zanna, both fifth-year seniors on the current 2013-14 team.
- Pitt consistently achieves high APR scores, ranked tied for second among Big East men's basketball programs in 2009 and 2011. Pitt has also ranked among the nation's top-20 percent of basketball programs in each of the last four years of APR rankings. In the report released during the summer of 2011, Pitt ranked among the nation's top-10 percent of all 336 men's basketball programs based on its APR between the 2006-07 and 2009-10 academic years.





- Pitt Basketball has earned a Team Academic Achievement Award in three of the last seven years. Pitt won awards in 2004, 2006 and 2008.
- Thirty-five (35) men's basketball student-athletes have earned their degrees over the last 11 years. No. 17 Duke set opponent season-highs for points (80), field goals made (28) and 3-point field goals made (13) in handing No. 18 Pitt an 80-65 home loss...The attendance of 12,944 set a Petersen Events Center and on-campus record for highest attended game...Duke used a 14-2 run that ended with an Andre Dawkins 3-pointer with 6:07 to go to give the Blue Devils a 64-51 lead...Dawkins hit another 3-pointer to give Duke a 67-54 lead, then Quinn Cook converted a drive and layup for a 15-point lead (72-57) with four minutes left...The last time Pitt gave up 80 points was on Jan. 5, 2011 at DePaul...Talib Zanna registered his 13th career double-double and seventh of the year...Lamar Patterson led Pitt in scoring for the 13th time on the year...Jamie Dixon dropped to 17-1 vs. members of the previous ACC...The loss snapped a 14-game home win streak and dropped Pitt to 12-1 at the Petersen Events Center on the year...The 15-point loss marked Pitts third largest loss at the Petersen Events Center..Duke visited Pitt for the first time since Jan. 12, 1974.
