Three (3) Miami players earned 2017-18 All-ACC Academic Team honors: Endia Banks, Emese Hof and Kelsey Marshall.
- 6 HALF THE SQUAD**
Just six (6) of the Hurricanes' 12 players competed for Miami last season, while four redshirted and two are newcomers.

NEWS & NOTES

EMESE-ING

In the exhibition win over Nova Southeastern, Emese Hof had 30 points on 14-of-15 shooting. The numbers do not count because the game was unofficial, but the 93.3 percent mark would have set a school record (min. 10 FGA).

SEASON-OPENING SUCCESS

The Hurricanes are 37-9 in season openers, including 20-1 the past 21 years and 12-1 under Katie Meier, who is 15-2 in openers as a head coach. This is the third time Miami has opened on the road under Meier (2009, 2016).

BACK TO BALLING

Miami welcomes four players to the court this year who were on the roster in 2017-18, but did not compete, two of whom will make their team debuts. Beatrice Mompremier, a former top-15 recruit, is eligible after sitting out as a transfer from Baylor. Laura Cornelius, Miami's career 3-point percentage leader, and Rebecca Ripley are back from injury. The fourth, Khailea Prather, is currently out due to another injury, but is expected to return in 2018-19.

SUPER SOPHOMORES

Miami's four returning sophomores—Endia Banks, Mykea Gray, Taylor Mason and Kelsey Marshall—combined for 127 of a possible 128 games played last year and notched 64 combined starts. The group collectively averaged 29.6 points, 9.6 rebounds and 7.0 assists in 2017-18. Gray ranked second on the team in scoring (11.7), with Marshall fourth (8.0) and Banks fifth (7.7), while Banks placed first in assists (2.7) and Gray finished third (2.3).

ACC ACCOLADES

Last year, for the third time—first since 2011-12—three Hurricanes received ACC postseason distinction. Erykah Davenport was a Second Team All-ACC pick by the Blue Ribbon Panel and ACC Coaches. Mykea Gray earned All-Freshman Team honors from both and Kelsey Marshall got the accolade from the former. It was the first time, in any league, two Hurricanes made the all-freshman team and they were the third and fourth to do so in the ACC.

POSTSEASON PLAY

Miami has reached the postseason nine straight years, tripling the previous program record (2002-04) and well surpassing its total (six) from the prior 16 seasons. Additionally, the Hurricanes have made the NCAA Tournament seven times in the last eight years after making three appearances in the previous 17 seasons.

FIU

The Panthers' leading returning scorer is sophomore forward Shante Walker, who tallied 5.8 points per game last year. Coming off an 8-21 (5-11 C-USA) season, FIU was picked to finish No. 14 in Conference USA in 2018-19.

UPCOMING CAREER MILESTONES

Endia Banks is one made field goal away from 100 and three points from 250 . . . **Laura Cornelius** is 14 points away from 450 . . . **Myke Gray** is three made 3-pointers away from 50 . . . **Emese Hof** is two free-throw attempts away from 200 and four points from 750 . . . **Kelsey Marshall** is two points away from 250 . . . **Taylor Mason** is four points away from 50 . . . **Beatrice Mompremier** is nine rebounds away from 450 and 10 points from 550.

JUST KEEP DANCING

The Hurricanes are one of just 21 teams in the nation to reach the NCAA Tournament each of the last four seasons. Additionally, 2015-18 marked the first time in school history a Miami basketball team, regardless of gender, made the NCAA Tournament four straight years. Redshirt senior Khaïla Prather, who sat out last year due to injury, is looking to become the first Miami basketball player to be on five NCAA Tournament rosters.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

Four Hurricanes have older brothers who play(ed) college basketball. Kelsey Marshall's brother, Kyle, was a three-year starter at Butler and made the 2011 NCAA title game. Taylor Mason's brother, Nate, was a First Team All-Big Ten pick at Minnesota in 2016-17. Beatrice Mompremier's brother, Wadly, played at Ohio for three years and at Arkansas-Little Rock for one. Sarah Mortensen's brother, Daniel, was a CoSIDA Academic All-District pick as a junior at Barry last season and played his freshman year at Wright State. Both of Mortensen's parents also played basketball growing up. In addition, three other Miami players have direct relatives who play(ed) basketball. Emese Hof's parents both played and her sister, Roos, is a professional player in the Netherlands. Khaïla Prather's father, Craig, was a teammate of David Robinson at Navy and was on the 1986-87 team that went 30-5. Rebecca Ripley's mother, Jen, played at UMass Dartmouth. Seven of the 12 Hurricanes have a sibling and/or parent who played basketball in college and/or professionally.

"BEA" AWARE

Beatrice Mompremier was one of four players, including the lone transfer, named to both the ACC Coaches' and Blue Ribbon Panel's ACC Newcomer Watch List in October. Since the preseason honor started in 2010-11, Mompremier is the first Hurricane to garner the recognition.

FAMILIAR WITH FIBA

Four Hurricanes—Laura Cornelius, Emese Hof, Beatrice Mompremier and Sarah Mortensen—have represented their home nations at the youth level in FIBA continental and/or world championships. Cornelius and Hof have also played for the Netherlands' senior national team. Additionally, Katie Meier has served as a head coach for the United States at the youth level, guiding the U19 team to the 2013 FIBA world title in Lithuania.

TV TIME

For the second straight season, each of Miami's games will be broadcast live, with three on RSN and two on ESPN2/ESPNU. Additionally, for the fourth consecutive year, all the Hurricanes' home games will be televised.

MAYOR JAMES

Miami's all-time leading scorer, Tamara James, was elected as the mayor of Dania Beach, Fla., on Nov. 6, 2016. A three-time conference scoring champion and four-time all-conference pick, James scored 2,406 points from 2002-06. A UM Sports Hall of Fame member and an ACC Legend, James was a 2006 WBNS Second Team All-American. One of two players in program history to lead the Hurricanes in scoring four times, James went eighth overall in the 2006 WNBA Draft to the Washington Mystics.

One of two coaches with over 250 wins at Miami, Katie Meier has led the team to a 202-93 (.685) mark since 2009-10, including 180-79 (.695) since 2010-11. Her 10 postseason appearances in 13 full seasons with the Hurricanes are just one fewer than the program's six other coaches combined for in 33 years.

HOME IN THE HALL

Katie Meier was a part of the University of Miami Sports Hall of Fame's Class of 2017. The fourth Miami basketball coach, male or female, to be inducted, Meier was joined by Ryan Braun, Jeremy Shockey and six others in the class. She is one of five female coaches in the UMSHoF, three of whom are still at Miami. Most recently, Chanivia Broussard (2000-04) became the 10th ex-Miami women's basketball player to make the UMSHoF, as one of nine Class of 2018 honorees, alongside Frank Gore, Devin Hester, John Salmons and five others.

MEIER'S PROCANES

Twenty of Katie Meier's players at Miami have played professionally: Diane Barnes, Maria Brown, Charmaine Clark, LaToya Drake, Keyona Hayes, Tamara James, Shenise Johnson, Suriya McGuire, Adrienne Motley, Laura Quevedo, Maurita Reid, Necole Sterling, Morgan Stroman, Renee Taylor, Jessica Thomas, Carla Williams, Jassany Williams, Riquana Williams, Shawnice Wilson and Stefanie Yderstrom. James, Johnson and Williams have played in WNBA regular season games. Motley was a draftee, while Hayes, Thomas and Wilson had WNBA deals.

ONE OF THREE

Miami, Notre Dame and Louisville are the lone teams in the ACC picked in the top five of the conference's preseason poll by the Blue Ribbon Panel and/or ACC Coaches in each of the past three years (2016-18).

GREAT EXPECTATIONS

Miami earned preseason top-25 rankings from four major outlets, checking in at No. 22 according to Athlon, No. 24 in the USA TODAY Coaches Poll, No. 25 in the Associated Press Poll and No. 25 per Lindy's.

THREE YEARS TO REMEMBER

During the 2015-16, 2016-17 and 2017-18 seasons, the Miami men's and women's basketball teams combined to go 139-59, good for a .702 winning percentage. The only better three-year span from a wins perspective between the two programs was 2010-13, when they combined to go 145-57 (.718). The stretch from 2015-18, which included a combined program record of 51 wins in 2015-16, also marked the first time in school history both teams made the NCAA Tournament in three consecutive years.

SWEDISH SUCCESS

In 2017-18, their first season as professionals, former Miami standout guards Adrienne Motley and Jessica Thomas teamed up to win a title with Luleå Basket in Sweden's top division, Basketligan dam. Motley and Thomas, who graduated together in 2018, combined for 3,125 collegiate points across their four overlapping seasons. Motley, a three-time All-ACC honoree, is now with RC Celta de Vigo in Spain, while Thomas, an All-ACC pick as a senior, now plays for Olympiacos BC in Greece.

WATSCO CENTER

After 13-plus years as the BankUnited Center, Miami's on-campus arena was renamed the Watsco Center prior to the 2016-17 season. Watsco, Inc., based in Miami, is traded on the NYSE and is the largest distributor of air conditioning, heating and refrigeration products with annual sales of over \$4 billion, 5,000 employees and nearly 600 locations in North America. Watsco has provided funding to Miami since the 1990s through its "Watsco's Kids" program, giving children in the community free access to performance arts, sports and other events at UM.

FACILITY UPGRADES

The Miami basketball facility has undergone a multimillion-dollar renovation over the past two-plus years. The project featured upgrades to the locker rooms, student-athlete lounges, office spaces, weight room, practice facility hallways and concourse. The coaches' offices and hallways of the facility now showcase highlights from great moments in program history, plus photos of select stars from both teams. Also on display are large-scale images of UM's ProCanes, as well as the newest Miami adidas gear. The players' lounge has a gaming center with couches and televisions. The walls of the practice facility show photos of celebrity Canes fans throwing up the U. Student-athletes have custom lockers and the sound system in the locker room, film room, lounges and coaches' offices were upgraded, too. The concourse features a variety of changes and new displays.

HERE TO STAY

On April 10, 2017, Miami Director of Athletics Blake James announced a three-year contract extension for Katie Meier through the 2023-24 season. In conjunction with her prior contract extension—released on Oct. 13, 2014—Meier announced plans to donate \$75,000 back to the school to go toward women's athletics, as well as challenged others to also donate.

TWO OF A KIND

A pair of ACC schools, Miami and Notre Dame, are the only programs to defeat each of the two top scorers in women's college basketball history, Kelsey Plum (Washington, 2013-17) and Kelsey Mitchell (Ohio State, 2014-18). The Hurricanes upset Plum's Washington team, 86-80, on March 20, 2015, in the first round of the NCAA Tournament in Iowa City, Iowa. Two seasons later, Miami defeated Mitchell's Ohio State team, 94-89, in overtime on Dec. 1, 2016 in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge in Columbus, Ohio.

ACC STANDINGS

Miami tied for sixth in the ACC last season. It marked the eighth straight year the Hurricanes ended top-eight in the standings and went to at least .500 in ACC play and. It was also the sixth time in the last eight seasons Katie Meier led Miami to 10-plus ACC wins.

Katie Meier completed her 13th season at the helm of the Hurricanes' women's basketball program in 2017-18. A well-known and respected figure in women's basketball with 17 years of head coaching experience, Meier has worked tirelessly to put her mark on Miami's program and to build a winning tradition.

In 2017-18, Meier guided her team to a ninth consecutive postseason, including a seventh trip to the NCAA Tournament in the last eight years and fourth straight trip to the NCAA Tournament for the first time ever. Miami also reached 20-plus wins for the eighth time in nine years and double-digit ACC victories for the sixth time in eight seasons, both program firsts.

Following the 2016-17 season, Meier was inducted into the University of Miami Sports Hall of Fame, becoming the fourth basketball coach, male or female, to garner the prestigious honor.

In January 2014, Meier was named a co-recipient of the 2013 USA Basketball National Coach of the Year award after leading the USA U19 team to a gold medal and perfect 9-0 record at the 2013 FIBA U19 World Championship.

All of her hard work was rewarded after the 2010-11 season when she was named the Associated Press National Coach of the Year - sharing the award with Connecticut's Geno Auriemma and Stanford's Tara VanDerveer.

That season, Meier led the Hurricanes into the NCAA tournament for the first time since 2004 and their win over Gardner-Webb in the first round was the first tournament win for Miami since 1993. The Canes entered the 2010-11 season with high internal expectations, but were picked eighth in the Preseason ACC Poll after a season in which they were the No. 12 seed in the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament.

However, the Hurricanes exceeded all of the outside expectations and, at one point, won 17 straight games. They were a perfect 20-0 inside the BankUnited Center and finished 12-2 in ACC play - earning their first regular season conference title since joining the league in 2004. As a reward, Meier was named the ACC Coach of the Year and later would be selected as the WBCA/RUSSELL ATHLETIC Region 2 Coach of the Year, as voted on by her peers.

Meier continued that success into the 2011-12 season, a year in which the Canes accomplished many firsts for the program.

Miami defeated Maryland - the eventual ACC Tournament champ - twice during the regular season, the first when the Terrapins were ranked fifth in the nation. It was the first time in program history that the Hurricanes had defeated a top-five team. Later in the year, UM ascended to its highest ranking ever, also at No. 5.

The Hurricanes have proved to be formidable on the court in the BankUnited Center, as the 2011-12 season saw Miami go undefeated at home for the second consecutive season. Their 16-0 mark on the year pushed the Canes record home win streak to 40 straight games. Only Stanford ended the season with a longer active streak.

For her dedication to the University of Miami and the athletic department, Meier was signed to a two-year contract extension, securing the Wheaton, Ill., native through the 2017-18 season. Prior to the 2014-15 season, Meier received another extension, through the 2020-21 campaign, and donated \$75,000 back to the school to go towards women's athletics as well as challenged to community to contribute as well.

Meier earned another well-deserved extension after a 2016-17 season that included the Hurricanes hosting NCAA Tournament play for the first time since 1993. The new deal added three years to her contract, which now runs through the 2023-24 season.

Five people who have been assistants for Meier during her head coaching career have gone on to earn Division I head coaching positions: Lynn Bria (Stetson), Amanda Butler (Florida and Clemson), Darrick Gibbs (North Florida), Carolyn Kieger (Marquette) and Stephanie McCormick (Western Carolina). Additionally, 20 of Meier's players at Miami have gone on to play professionally after their college careers.

Through the 2017-18 campaign, Meier has a career record of 321-208, including a 252-163 mark at Miami.

A New Era

Hired April 19, 2005, Meier was appointed by then-Miami AD Paul Dee in front of national and local media, fans, alumni and support staff, signifying the beginning of a new era.

Following an unprecedented career as one of the greatest athletes to ever play in the Atlantic Coast Conference, Meier quickly established herself in the coaching ranks. Following an impressive four-year tenure as the head coach at Charlotte where she helped bring the 49er program into national prominence, Meier made it clear that her goal was to make Miami one of the premier women's basketball programs in the country.

Creating a Winning Program

In her first season, Meier wasted little time in making the first steps towards those goals. After receiving little attention in the ACC preseason polls, the Hurricanes posted an impressive overall record of 17-13. They fought through a conference that would send nine teams to the postseason, including three to the NCAA Final Four. Miami finished with a sixth-place, 6-8 record in ACC play en route to earning a berth into the second round of the 2006 Women's National Invitation Tournament.

During the season, Miami posted wins over ranked teams such as No. 25 Mississippi, No. 21 Boston College and No. 25 Virginia Tech, and nearly knocked off then-No. 1 Duke in double overtime. The Hurricanes also recorded wins over two eventual conference champions in Hartford (America East) and Oakland (Mid-Continent). Under Meier's direction, in 2005-06, standout Tamara James produced one of the greatest seasons ever seen by a UM player, becoming the Miami's all-time leading scorer. James was selected with the eighth overall pick in the 2006 WNBA Draft by the Washington Mystics.

In Meier's second season in 2006-07, the Hurricanes got off to a strong start, winning seven of their first eight games--including a 79-70 win over Indiana to claim the UM Thanksgiving Tournament title. On Dec. 1, Meier picked up her 100th career victory as the Hurricanes defeated Jackson State, 77-50.

Renee Taylor emerged as the ACC's leading scorer, upholding Miami's streak of producing the league's leading scorer in all three years it had been a member. The All-ACC Second Team selection a set school records in single-game scoring with 42 points at Houston. In addition, transfer Maurita Reid emerged as a defensive threat, tying the school record with 10 steals

versus Wake Forest and finishing among the ACC's leaders and NCAA's top 10 in steals per game.

The 2007-08 season, Meier's third with the Hurricanes, saw Maurita Reid continue her rise among the ACC elite. The senior was nothing short of impressive shooting beyond the arc and picking opponent's pockets. She hit four or more 3-pointers on 10 different occasions and finished the season with 110 steals, good for second in the conference and fifth in the NCAA. The Queens, N.Y. native led the team in points (15.3 ppg) and rebounding (5.6 rpg) and was named to the All-ACC Defensive Team.

With the No. 21-ranked incoming recruiting class, Meier and the Hurricanes saw significant improvement during the 2008-09 season. The freshman class was highlighted by McDonald's All-American Shenise Johnson of Henrietta, N.Y., and Riquana Williams from nearby Pahokee, Fla.

Johnson lived up to the hype, as she was the team leader on the season in points, rebounds, assists and steals. Under Meier's guidance, Johnson was named the ACC Rookie of the Week on three occasions and was named to the ACC All-Freshmen team as well as ACC Honorable Mention. The versatile guard/forward also led the U19 USA team to a gold medal finish in the 2009 World Championships in Bangkok, Thailand.

The 2009-10 season was one of the most successful in program history. Under Meier's vision, the Hurricanes advanced to the WNIT Championship game. Miami posted a 22-14 overall record - the first 20-win campaign since the 2002-03 season and just the eighth all-time in history.

In her sophomore season, Johnson was joined by a healthy Riquana Williams and the duo racked up accolades throughout the season. Johnson was named first team All-ACC, while Williams garnered second-team honors. The tandem led Miami to a 5-1 WNIT record - the deepest postseason run in team history, with both earning all-tournament honors along the way.

Following the 2009-10 campaign, then-Miami AD Kirby Hocutt announced that Meier signed a contract extension through 2015.

Miami's success proved to be immediate, as it earned a conference regular season title in 2010-11 and returned to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in seven seasons.

Johnson and Williams turned out to be the All-America candidates that they were expected to become. In fact, Johnson was named to four different All-America squads and became the second player in program history to be named the conference player of the year (Frances Savage - BIG EAST - 1992). Johnson also garnered All-ACC Defensive Team honors for the second straight season and was named to the ACC All-Tournament Team. Williams, along with Johnson, was named First Team All-ACC and was the conference scoring leader, posting 21.7 points per game.

The duo combined for seven ACC Player of the Week accolades on the season as Williams took home the award on four occasions. No other team in the league was recognized more than twice for the weekly honor.

Miami's success continued into the 2011-12 season. The Canes finished second in the conference standings with a record of 14-2 and were 26-6 overall. UM also defeated the eventual conference tournament champion, Maryland, both times they played in the regular season.

Seniors Shenise Johnson and Riquana Williams continued to live up to the hype of being the nation's top backcourt duo as they were second and third in the league in scoring and each were again named First Team All-ACC. The accolade was the third straight honor for Johnson and the second for Williams. Johnson was also named to the All-ACC Defensive Team for the third consecutive season. Johnson earned a place on five different All-America teams, including the WBCA squad for the second straight year. Williams earned AP All-America third team recognition in her final collegiate campaign as well.

Unfortunately, junior forward Morgan Stroman, a former McDonald's All-American who was a Third Team All-ACC pick in 2010-11 after posting a team-best 11 double-doubles, suffered a season-ending injury midway through the conference schedule. However, junior guard Stefanie Yderstrom stepped up and ended the season with more 3-pointers than any other player in the league and was rewarded with a Third Team All-ACC nod.

Miami once again advanced to the NCAA Tournament as a No. 3 seed. The Canes traveled to Spokane, Wash., and defeated the No. 14 seed, Idaho State in the first round, but fell to host Gonzaga in the second.

The Hurricanes went to a school record third straight NCAA Tournament in 2012-13, earning a No. 8 seed. Miami dropped its first round contest to ninth-seeded Iowa, the host school, but picked up two top-10 wins during the season. Meier's Hurricanes defeated No. 6/7 Penn State and knocked off No. 5/4 Duke on senior day, marking the first win over a team in the top four of either poll in program history and the school's first win over the Blue Devils, who went 20-1 against ACC opponents that season, including winning the ACC Tournament. Stroman averaged 12.9 points and 8.8 rebounds, while Yderstrom posted 11.7 points per game, and both received First Team All-ACC honors.

After reaching the WNIT in 2014, Meier guided the Hurricanes back to the NCAA Tournament in 2015 and the 11th-seeded Hurricanes defeated No. 6 seed Washington in the first round, before dropping their second round matchup against third-seeded Iowa, the host school. The victory over the Huskies made Meier the first coach in program history to win an NCAA Tournament game in three different years.

Earlier in the 2014-15 season, Meier also led the Hurricanes to the program's first win over a team in the top four of the AP Poll. They defeated No. 4/4 Notre Dame, 78-63, the Fighting Irish's only loss in their first two years in the ACC. Sophomore guard Adrienne Motley went on to be named a consensus First Team All-ACC pick after averaging 16.9 points on 49.2 percent shooting. Meier also earned her 250th career win during the season.

In 2015-16, Meier led Miami to a 24-9 record to tie for the fifth-most wins in a season in program history. The Hurricanes defeated No. 14/10 Florida State, 74-56, to reach the ACC Tournament semifinals for the second time. Miami received a No. 5 seed the NCAA Tournament and made its fifth appearance in the field in the past six years.

The 2015-16 campaign also saw the Hurricanes beat both Duke and North Carolina in the same year for the first time. The victory at North Carolina was good for the 200th of Meier's tenure at Miami. Adrienne Motley was also tabbed as a consensus First Team All-ACC honoree for the second straight year, in addition to garnering WBCA All-America Team Honorable Mention recognition.

In 2016-17, Meier guided the Hurricanes to a second straight 24-9 record. In the quarterfinals of the ACC Tournament, Miami again defeated a Florida State team ranked in the top 10, downing the No. 8/12 Seminoles, 56-54, to earn back-to-back semifinal appearances for the first time. The Hurricanes beat four top-25 teams, defeating three ranked teams – two of which were in the top 10 – away from home for the first time in the ACC era. Miami earned a No. 4 seed in the NCAA Tournament, hosting the first two rounds of play, and reached the second round for the fourth time in seven years.

Adrienne Motley and Jessica Thomas were both Second Team All-ACC picks in 2016-17, with Motley becoming Miami's fifth WNBA Draft pick. In addition, Motley, Thomas and Keyona Hayes formed the second Miami teammate trio to all reach 1,000 points and each signed a WNBA contract, the first time three Hurricanes in the same class did so.

Despite losing so many talented players to graduation and others to injury, Meier led the Hurricanes to a 21-11 finish in 2017-18 and surpassed 250 wins in her tenure with the program. Erykah Davenport, a Second Team All-ACC honoree, and Keyanna Harris became the first Miami seniors to make four straight NCAA Tournaments. Miami had two freshman all-league honorees for the first time since 1992-93 in the BIG EAST, as Mykea Gray and Kelsey Marshall both made the cut. The Hurricanes upended three top-25 foes, including a pair that reached the Sweet 16 in No. 14/15 Duke and No. 23/23 NC State.

Establishing Her Legacy as a Player

Meier's success as a coach is a direct reflection of her playing career as a standout at Duke University. A four-year letter winner for the Blue Devils under head coach Debbie Leonard from 1986-90, Meier's name is scattered throughout the Duke record books.

She currently ranks among the school's all-time career leaders in scoring average (16.2 points per game), steals (232), free throws made (447) and free throws attempted (624). She is also listed among Duke's leaders in career points (1,761), field goals made (653), field goals attempted (1,283), assists (409) and rebounding average (6.1 rebounds per game).

Meier wasted no time making her mark at Duke, earning ACC Rookie of the Year and Basketball Yearbook Freshman All-America honors in 1986. Meier injured her knee in 1988 during her junior season and ultimately missed the entire 1988-89 campaign while recovering.

Meier returned to Duke for her senior season in 1990 without missing a beat, earning Kodak/WBCA District 2 All-America and All-ACC first team accolades while being named the Blue Devils' most valuable player.

In 2002, Meier was honored by Duke for her efforts as a player when she was named to the inaugural induction class in the Blue Devils' Hall of Honor. That same year, Meier was named to the ACC's 50th Anniversary Team. In 2006, she was once again honored by the conference when she was named an ACC Legend at the 2006 ACC Women's Basketball Tournament.

Meier's success on the court was only outdone by her accomplishments in the classroom. She was named to the Dean's List from 1986-88. In 1988 she also earned GTE Academic All-America Second Team honors.

After receiving a bachelor's degree in English literature with cum laude honors in 1989, Meier went on to earn a master's degree in teaching English from Duke in 1990.

Following her career at Duke, Meier moved overseas to play three seasons with BBC Mini-Flat Waregem in Belgium from 1990-93. There, she helped lead her team to three First Division regular season titles and one Belgian Cup Championship. While in Belgium, Meier also spent time teaching classes of conversational English while coaching teams of 15- to 17-year-olds.

A native of Wheaton, Ill., Meier graduated from Wheaton Central High School in 1985 and in October 2009 was inducted into her high school's athletic hall of fame.

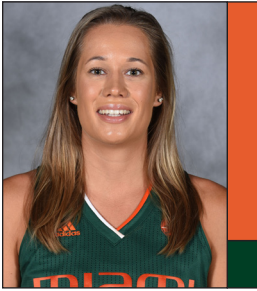

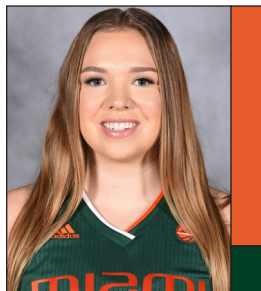
