CAROLINA BASKETBALL 2012-13

STORYLINES:

TAR HEELS START TOUGH TWO-GAME ROAD SWING, AIM FOR SEVENTH WIN IN LAST EIGHT GAMES

◆ North Carolina (16-6, 6-3 Atlantic Coast Conference) will play the first of back-to-back, big road games against top competition when it visits Miami on Saturday afternoon at 2 p.m.

◆ The game will be televised nationally by ESPN from the BankUnited Center in Coral Gables, Fla. Dave O'Brien (play-by-play), Doris Burke (analyst) and Jeannine Edwards (reporter) will have the call. ESPN Radio also will carry the game nationally. Bill Rosinski (play-by-play) and Jim Spanarkel (analyst) will be on the radio mic.

◆ The Hurricanes enter Saturday's game ranked eighth in the nation in the Associated Press poll and 11th in the coaches poll with a record of 18-3. UM has posted a perfect, 9-0 record in the ACC, including a 68-59 win over Carolina in Chapel Hill last month. Most recently, Miami beat Boston College 72-50 in Coral Gables on Tuesday night.

◆ Starting Saturday, Carolina's next two games will be on the road against top-10 opponents that are the top two teams in the ACC. Miami is No. 8 in the AP poll. Duke is 7-2 in the ACC so far, ranked No. 4 nationally and coming off a win over NC State on Thursday night.

◆ After starting ACC play 0-2 in early January, Carolina has won six of seven games in the last month. The run started with a win at Florida State (Jan. 12), followed by back-to-back home wins over Maryland (Jan. 19) and Georgia Tech (Jan. 23). The Tar Heels lost at NC State (Jan. 26), then have bounced back with three straight wins at Boston College (Jan. 29) and at home over Virginia Tech (last Saturday) and Wake Forest (Tuesday).

◆ Carolina completed the first half of ACC play at 6-3. Five of UNC's remaining nine regular season ACC contests will come on the road, starting this weekend. In the second half of the conference slate, the Tar Heels will play road games against Miami, Duke, Georgia Tech, Clemson and Maryland and home games against Virginia, NC State, Florida State and Duke.

A LOOK AHEAD ...

◆ After Saturday's game, Carolina will visit Duke next Wednesday night.

◆ With a home game against Virginia (Feb. 16) and a matchup at Georgia Tech (Feb. 19) to follow Duke, three of the next four and four of the next six UNC games will be on the road.

ALTERNATE JERSEYS SATURDAY

◆ Carolina will wear an alternate away uniform design for Saturday's game at Miami, donning Carolina Blue Nike Hyper Elite jerseys and shorts as one of a select group of schools to wear commemorative uniforms on a one-time basis this season.

◆ On the jersey, an "NC" logo is centered on the chest in a style reminiscent of the jerseys worn by the 1999-2000 Tar Heels. The logo, numbers and lettering on the front and back of the jerseys are navy blue with white piping. The team is also slated to wear a Hyper Elite warm-up hoody for the first time.

◆ According to Nike, the Hyper Elite line offers "lightweight performance through sustainable materials. The short is made of 100 percent recycled polyester while the jersey is made from at least 96 percent recycled polyester -- an average of 22 recycled plastic bottles per uniform."

◆ Saturday's design follows several other special, one-time uniforms worn by the Tar Heels in recent years. In 2005 against Virginia, Carolina wore throwbacks based on the 1980s UNC uniforms. Three times during the 100 Years of Carolina Basketball celebration in 2009-10, UNC wore uniforms based on those of the 1957 NCAA championship team.

◆ In 2010, the Tar Heels wore silver uniforms against Florida State in the Smith Center. Last year's team wore special uniforms twice, including a blue camouflage design for the Carrier Classic against Michigan State and a silver design against Maryland that was the home version of the Hyper Elite uniform being worn this weekend at Miami.

THE SERIES VS. THE HURRICANES

◆ Carolina leads the series with the Hurricanes, 18-3, including a 9-2 advantage in Chapel Hill, a 7-1 edge on the road and a 2-0 edge at neutral sites. The Tar Heels are 5-0 in the BankUnited Center.

◆ Carolina has won 10 of its last 11 games against Miami, including 10 in a row prior to a Hurricane win in Chapel Hill last month. Last year, UNC beat UM twice (in Chapel Hill and Coral Gables).

◆ Miami's BankUnited Center is the only current ACC venue in which Roy Williams holds an undefeated record.

◆ Carolina has won its last five games at Miami, last losing in Coral Gables on Jan. 4, 2003, in the season prior to Williams' return to Chapel Hill as head coach.

◆ Roy Williams is 14-3 as a head coach against the Hurricanes, including a 12-2 mark at UNC and a 2-1 record at Kansas. At Carolina, Williams has a 6-2 mark against Miami in Chapel Hill, a 5-0 record in Coral Gables and a 1-0 mark in the ACC Tournament.

LAST MONTH IN CHAPEL HILL: MIAMI 68, UNC 59

◆ Kenny Kadji had 18 points and nine rebounds, Julian Gamble had 14 points and Shane Larkin and Durand Scott each scored 11 as Miami pulled away to defeat Carolina 68-59 on Jan. 14, 2013, in Chapel Hill.

◆ UNC shot 33.3 percent in the second half and 40.0 percent overall in the game while Miami shot 47.2 percent in the game and hit nine three-pointers.

◆ James Michael McAdoo led Carolina with 14 points and six rebounds despite shooting 5 for 14. Reggie Bullock had 11 points, six rebounds and five assists but shot 4 for 16 from the floor.

◆ Marcus Paige (10 points and five assists) and Brice Johnson (10 points on 5 of 8 shooting) both also reached double figures in points for the Tar Heels.

◆ After P.J. Hairston hit a three-pointer to pull UNC within one point at 56-55 with 5:00 to play, UM scored eight consecutive points in less than two minutes to build the lead back to nine points.

◆ Hairston's three-pointer marked Carolina's only points in a span of 7:24 late in the game as Miami went on a 13-3 run to seal the game. J.P.

Tokoto hit a field goal off a pass from Bullock with 9:08 to play. Carolina didn't score again until Hairston's three-pointer at the 5:00 mark, then didn't score again until McAdoo scored with 1:44 left and the Tar Heels trailing by nine points.

◆ The loss dropped the Tar Heels to 0-2 in ACC play for the fourth time in its history and sparked a run that has seen UNC win six of its last seven games to improve to 6-3 in ACC games.

◆ Tar Heel junior guard **Leslie McDonald** sat out the game due to a sore right knee.

LAST SEASON IN CORAL GABLES

◆ **Harrison Barnes** scored 14 second-half points to finish with 23 in the game, along with six rebounds, as Carolina won at Miami 73-64 on Feb. 15, 2012, in Coral Gables, Fla.

◆ The Tar Heels grabbed 24 offensive rebounds on its 43 missed shots in the game, scoring 23 second-chance points.

◆ Carolina won despite shooting 38.2 percent on the night, including 37.5 percent in the first half and 38.9 percent in the second half.

◆ The Tar Heels missed all five of their three-point field goal attempts in the first half and finished 5 for 18 in the game.

◆ UNC got zero points from its guards in the first half but **Reggie Bullock** scored 10 second-half points and **Kendall Marshall** had five (all at the free throw line). Bullock hit two key three-pointers in the second half, including one with 1:42 to play that gave UNC a nine-point advantage.

◆ Marshall had nine assists and two turnovers.

◆ The Tar Heels overcame a nine-point deficit to win.

◆ Miami led by eight points at 44-36 with 15:37 to play before the Tar Heels went on a 19-9 run to take control of the game.

LAST TIME OUT:

CAROLINA 87, WAKE FOREST 62

◆ **Reggie Bullock** scored 23 points and **James Michael McAdoo** scored 20 to lead Carolina to an 87-62 win over Wake Forest on Tuesday Feb. 5 in the Smith Center in Chapel Hill. The Tar Heels shot 62.1 percent in the first half and closed the half on a 15-1 run, taking a 20-point lead into the break.

◆ Carolina scored 87 points, its highest total in an ACC game this year (previous 83 at NC State). Carolina led by as many as 34 points late in the second half.

◆ It was the third time in the last four games that UNC has scored 80 or more points. UNC had not scored 80 or more in any of its first five ACC games this season.

◆ Carolina is now 155-65 against Wake Forest – 72-19 in Chapel Hill and 19-5 in the Smith Center.

◆ The game marked the first time that Bullock (23) and McAdoo (20) scored 20 or more points in the same game.

◆ Bullock scored 23, one off his season and career high. He made four three-pointers, the fifth time this season he made at least four threes in a game. He was 4 for 5 from beyond the arc. He had made 7 of 27 threes in the previous four contests. It was his third 20-point game this year and the fourth of his career.

◆ Bullock made 7 of 10 shots from the floor after making 3 of 13 last Saturday vs. Virginia Tech.

◆ McAdoo has now scored 20-plus points in consecutive games for the first time in his career. He has three 20-point games this year and in his career.

◆ McAdoo had four steals and is now UNC's leader in steals for the year with 33. He has 66 in 60 games as a Tar Heel.

◆ Point guard **Marcus Paige** had a season-high six rebounds, all in the first half.

◆ The Tar Heels forced 21 turnovers, a season high for Wake Forest.

◆ Carolina scored 26 points off the 21 Wake Forest turnovers, including 18 in the first half. The 26 points are the most by UNC off turnovers in an ACC game this year and its highest in a game since the Tar Heels scored 28 off turnovers against East Tennessee State on Dec. 8, 2012.

◆ Carolina shot 62.1 percent from the floor in the first half, its highest percentage in a half since shooting 71.9 percent in the second half against UAB on Dec. 1, 2012.

◆ The Tar Heels shot 51.6 percent from the floor for the game, its highest in an ACC game this year (first time in league play over 50 percent this year) and its highest in a game since shooting 52.9 percent against UAB on Dec. 1, 2012.

◆ **P.J. Hairston** returned to action after missing one-and-a-half games due to a concussion. Hairston scored 11 points and had two assists in 12 minutes.

TAR HEEL TIDBITS

◆ **P.J. Hairston** has scored 59 points in his last 58 minutes played.

◆ The Wake Forest victory on Tuesday was win No. 691 for head coach **Roy Williams**, who is now 691-175 overall, 273-74 at UNC, 111-42 in ACC regular-season play and 342-34 at home (140-17 at the Smith Center).

◆ **Williams** needs nine wins to reach the 700-win plateau.

◆ The 12-point deficit UNC overcame to beat Virginia Tech on Feb. 2 is the largest it has overcome to win a game this season.

◆ **James Michael McAdoo** has posted three double-doubles in the last four games and four in the last six outings.

◆ **J.P. Tokoto** has scored 23 points in the last five games after scoring just seven points in his first four ACC games combined.

◆ **Marcus Paige** out-scored Virginia Tech by himself, 8-5, in overtime in the Feb. 2 win over the Hokies.

◆ UNC is 145-14 (.912) in the **Roy Williams** era when shooting at least 38 percent from behind the three-point line, including a 10-1 mark this season.

◆ The Tar Heels are 34-3 since the start of the 2010-11 season when shooting at least 38 percent from three-point range (losses at Kentucky in 2011-12, at UNLV in 2011-12 and vs. Miami in 2012-13).

◆ Carolina leads the ACC in the following statistical categories: scoring (79.1 points per game), assists (18.3 per game), steals (8.3 per game) and offensive rebounds (15.0 per game). UNC is second in rebounding margin (+5.3) and assist/turnover ratio (1.4).

HAIRSTON RETURNS VS. WAKE FOREST AFTER MISSING TIME WITH CONCUSSION

◆ Sophomore **P.J. Hairston** was medically cleared on Tuesday afternoon and returned to the lineup that night against Wake Forest after missing the previous game and a half. The sophomore wing had 11 points and two assists in 12 minutes off the bench against the Demon Deacons.

◆ Hairston missed all of the Virginia Tech game on Feb. 2 and the second half of the Boston College game on Jan. 29 after suffering the concussion late in the first half against BC. He caught an inadvertent elbow from teammate **Dexter Strickland** while playing defense in front of the Tar Heel bench and fell to the floor with 4:04 on the clock.

◆ Hairston stayed on the floor for several minutes while being assisted by medical staff, then left the floor on a stretcher for precautionary reasons. He traveled home that night with the UNC team.

◆ Prior to his injury against BC, Hairston was having one of his best games of the season, scoring 14 points in 12 first-half minutes while hitting 4 of 4 three-pointers. He also had three assists and a steal.

VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

◆ Miami is ranked No. 8 in the Associated Press poll and No. 11 in the ESPN/USA Today coaches poll this week. The Hurricanes will be the fourth ranked foe to face the Tar Heels this season.

◆ Carolina is 1-2 against nationally-ranked opponents so far this season. The Tar Heels have lost to top-ranked Indiana on Nov. 27 in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge and 18th-ranked NC State on Jan. 26. UNC beat No. 20 UNLV at home on Dec. 29.

WINNING ON THE ROAD UNDER WILLIAMS

◆ Carolina has proven to be one of the best road teams in Atlantic Coast Conference annals under head coach **Roy Williams**, whose ACC road winning percentage of .658 is second-best in ACC history behind Vic Bubas of Duke (.667 from 1960-69). **Frank McGuire** of UNC and South Carolina is third at .618.

◆ Williams is 50-26 on the road in ACC play as the UNC head coach.

◆ This season, the Tar Heels are 2-2 on the ACC road with wins at Florida State and Boston College and losses at Virginia and NC State.

◆ Last year, the Tar Heels won their last seven ACC road games in a row to finish 7-1 on the road in the conference, the third time Carolina has won seven or more ACC road games under Williams. UNC went 7-1 on the road in 2006 and 2012 and 8-0 in 2008.

◆ Under Williams, UNC has gone 6-2 on the road in the ACC in 2004-05, 7-1 in 2005-06, 8-0 in 2007-08, 6-2 in 2008-09, 6-2 in 2010-11 and 7-1 in 2011-12.

◆ The 2011-12 season marked Carolina's 35th above-.500 road record in 59 ACC seasons (and its 46th season at .500 or better).

◆ Carolina has posted an above-.500 ACC road record in six of Williams' nine previous seasons as the head coach in Chapel Hill and has been at least .500 in seven of Williams' nine seasons.

WILLIAMS CLOSING IN ON 700 CAREER WINS

- ◆ Head coach **Roy Williams** has a record of 691-175 in his 25th season as a head coach. He needs nine victories to reach the 700-win plateau.
- ◆ Williams is 21st all-time and fourth among active coaches behind Mike Krzyzewski, Jim Boeheim and Bob Huggins (who is 20th in all-time wins).
- ◆ Williams is 273-74 in his 10th season at North Carolina, ranking seventh in ACC history for wins as a conference head coach. Virginia's Terry Holland is sixth with 326 wins as an ACC coach.
- ◆ Williams is 111-42 (.725) in ACC regular season play.

THREE-POINT SHOOTING

- ◆ UNC is 145-14 (.912) in the Roy Williams era when shooting at least 38 percent from behind the three-point line, including a 10-1 mark this season.
- ◆ The Tar Heels are 34-3 since the start of the 2010-11 season when shooting at least 38 percent from three-point range (losses at Kentucky and at UNLV in 2011-12).
- ◆ Carolina has attempted 20 or more three-point field goals in 10 of its first 22 games this season after doing so five times in 38 games in 2011-12.
- ◆ The Tar Heels' attempted a season-high 22 threes against Ohio in the 2012 NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 in St. Louis and have already matched or eclipsed that figure nine times in 2012-13.
- ◆ UNC has connected on 10 or more three-pointers in six games this season (10 at Long Beach State, 15 vs. Mississippi State, 13 vs. Chaminade, 10 vs. UAB, 11 vs. East Tennessee State and 13 vs. McNeese State). Last year, the Tar Heels hit 10 or more threes four times all season, including a high of 11 twice.
- ◆ UNC is 158 for 427 (.370) as a team from three-point range through 22 games in 2012-13, up from .335 in 579 attempts last season.
- ◆ The Tar Heels are fourth in the ACC in three-pointers made (7.2 per game) and are third in three-point accuracy at .362. **Reggie Bullock** is second individually in the ACC in three-point accuracy at .442, and **P.J. Hairston** is seventh at .391.
- ◆ Through 22 games in 2012-13, Carolina is shooting more three-pointers (19.4 attempts per game) than in any season in the **Roy Williams** era in Chapel Hill. The most long-range attempts the Tar Heels have averaged in Williams' nine previous seasons is 18.6 per game in 2004-05.
- ◆ The Carolina record for most three-point attempts in season is 822 in 2002-03 (an average of 23.5 attempts per game).

O'KOREN NAMED ACC TOURNAMENT LEGEND FOR 2013

- ◆ Former Tar Heel forward **Mike O'Koren** (1976-80) was named UNC's 2013 ACC Tournament Legend, the ACC announced on Jan. 31.
- ◆ O'Koren will be honored at the ACC Tournament in Greensboro on March 14-17 along with fellow legends Gene Corrigan (former ACC commissioner), Gerry Ward (Boston College), Terrell McIntyre (Clemson), Tranjan Langdon (Duke), Tharon Mayes (Florida State), Mark Price (Georgia Tech), Gary Williams (Maryland), Mike Wittman (Miami), Dereck Whittenburg (NC State), Travis Watson (Virginia), Ace Custis (Virginia Tech) and Carl Tacy (Wake Forest).
- ◆ O'Koren, one of the most versatile players in Tar Heel history, was the centerpiece of **Dean Smith**-coached North Carolina teams that captured ACC Championships in 1977 and 1979 and earned NCAA Tournament berths in each of his four varsity seasons, including a Final Four berth and NCAA Championship Game appearance in 1977. During his four seasons in Chapel Hill, he helped lead the Tar Heels to a 94-29 record.
- ◆ He is still the only UNC player to have recorded at least 1,500 points (1,765), 800 rebounds (815) and 300 assists (348) in his career. He also had 183 steals and shot 57.2 percent from the field for his career. O'Koren was a three-time first-team All-America for the Tar Heels after the 1978, 1979 and 1980 seasons. He earned first-team All-ACC honors in 1978 and 1980 and was named first-team All-ACC Tournament in 1977 and 1979. At his best in the big games, O'Koren had 18 points and 11 rebounds, scoring UNC's final 10 points in a 71-63 win over Duke in the 1979 ACC Championship game.
- ◆ A first-round draft choice and the 6th overall pick in the 1980 NBA Draft by the New Jersey Nets, he played six seasons with the Nets and one with Washington Bullets before retiring with the Nets in 1988. In 407 NBA games he scored 3,355 points (8.2 avg.), had 1,391 rebounds (3.4 avg.) and 856 assists (2.1 avg.). A native of Jersey City, N.J., he currently lives outside of New York City in the Township of Washington, N.J.

CAROLINA AND KENTUCKY TO RESUME SERIES NEXT YEAR

- ◆ North Carolina and Kentucky have agreed to resume their men's basketball series beginning with a game in Chapel Hill next season.
- ◆ The two schools did not schedule a game this year, ending a 12-year stretch in which the teams met annually in the regular season.
- ◆ Carolina leads the series, 22-13, with the Tar Heels winning six of the last nine meetings.
- ◆ "I think it's a great series for both schools and our fans as well as college basketball fans period," says Carolina head coach **Roy Williams**. "North Carolina and Kentucky have great traditions and, regardless of who you pull for, fans mark this as a must-see game on the schedule."
- ◆ Carolina will play host to the Wildcats in the Smith Center on Dec. 14, 2013, and the teams will meet in Rupp Arena in Lexington in the 2014-15 season.

ON THIS DATE IN CAROLINA BASKETBALL HISTORY by Rick Brewer, UNC SID Emeritus

February 9, 1984: North Carolina 85, Virginia 72

Top-ranked North Carolina ran its record to 21-0 with an 85-72 win at Virginia. This marked the longest winning streak of Dean Smith's coaching career. Michael Jordan and Sam Perkins were the big stars, combining for 51 points. They made 21 of their 26 field goal attempts. Carolina led just 20-17 after 12 minutes of play. But, the Tar Heels outscored the Cavaliers 21-9 in the next eight minutes for a 41-26 halftime advantage. After the Cavaliers fell behind, they had to leave their regular zone defense. "Once we fell behind we had to play man-to-man," said Virginia Coach Terry Holland. "That gave Perkins and Jordan a chance to really open up. I don't think I've ever seen two players play as well on the same court at the same time." Perkins hit all five of his field goal attempts in the first half and added three free throws for 15 points. For the game, he hit 10 of 11 shots from the floor and all seven of his free throws for 27 points. Jordan was 11 of 15 from the field and added a pair of foul shots for 24 points. He had been somewhat questionable before the game due to a cold. "He's very tired right now," said Coach Dean Smith afterwards. "But, maybe he should get ill more often." The Tar Heels also got 11 points from Matt Doherty and 10 from Steve Hale. Perkins grabbed 11 rebounds and Brad Daugherty added 10 more. Perkins passed Billy Cunningham in this game to become Carolina's all-time leading rebounder with 1,072. Carolina was playing its fourth straight game without point guard Kenny Smith. He had suffered a broken wrist against LSU almost two weeks earlier. The 21-game winning streak surpassed the 20 consecutive wins posted by Smith's 1968 team. However, the Tar Heels would lose their first game of the year three days later at Arkansas. Charles Ballentine scored with four seconds left to give the Razorbacks a 65-64 win, the only loss Carolina would suffer during regular-season play.

WILLIAMS IN COACHES' CHARITY CHALLENGE

◆ Infiniti announced in January that it will once again partner with the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC), the NCAA and ESPN as the sponsor of the "Infiniti Coaches' Charity Challenge." North Carolina's **Roy Williams** is once again participating.

◆ Now in its third year, Infiniti, an official corporate partner of the NCAA, will make a \$100,000 donation to the winning coach's designated charity. The program, expanded last year, pits 48 NABC coaches from the nation's top NCAA Division I men's basketball programs in a fan-vote challenge, with the total Infiniti contribution again exceeding \$300,000.

◆ Fan participation will determine the ultimate winner over an eight-week period beginning January 14 by registering and voting on a custom microsite on *ESPN.com/Infiniti*. For the first six weeks, four brackets of 12 coaches will be paired against each other, with the winners from each group moving on to the next round in week seven and the final round in week eight. Fans can vote for one coach per region per day. The winning coach will be announced March 11, 2013.

◆ Williams' designated charity is the Lineberger Cancer Center at UNC Hospitals.

TAR HEELS HOST SPECIAL OLYMPICS CLINIC

◆ The Tar Heel team hosted a Special Olympics event on a day off on Sunday January 13, a day after winning at Florida State.

◆ Clinic participants learned the basics of the sport, played with and against current players, and had a dunk contest in an event that has become an annual highlight of the season for the Tar Heel players and coaching staff.

GUTHRIDGE NAMED TO N.C. SPORTS HALL OF FAME

◆ University of North Carolina tailback Kelvin Bryant and basketball coach **Bill Guthridge** are among four Tar Heels in the 11-person Class of 2013 that will be enshrined in the North Carolina Sports Hall of Fame.

◆ The 50th annual induction banquet is Thursday, May 2nd, at the Raleigh Convention Center.

◆ Joining Bryant and Guthridge in the Class of 2013 are former Tar Heel sports information director Bob Quincy and longtime photojournalist Hugh Morton, a UNC student in the early 1940s who went on to chronicle the history of Carolina and Atlantic Coast Conference athletics more than 60 years.

◆ Guthridge led the Tar Heels to two Final Fours in three seasons as head coach and was consensus National Coach of the Year in 1998. He won more games than any college head coach in history after two seasons and tied Everett Case for most coaching victories after three years. He played or coached in 14 Final Fours, more than any person in NCAA history. That includes two as a head coach at Carolina, 10 as a Tar Heel assistant coach, and one each as a player and assistant coach at his alma mater, Kansas State.

◆ The Parsons, Kan., native posted an 80-28 record in three seasons as Carolina's head coach. He directed UNC to the 1998 Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament championship and was named the ACC Coach of the Year.

◆ Guthridge was Dean Smith's assistant for 30 years. He joined the UNC staff in 1967 after five years as assistant to Tex Winter at Kansas State. In his 33 seasons at Carolina, the Tar Heels won two NCAA championships (1982 and 1993), played in 12 Final Fours, won the ACC Tournament championship 13 times and played in the ACC Tournament championship game a total of 22 times. He was a part of 867 wins in 33 seasons at Carolina and 960 college coaching victories overall, including 93 wins on the staff at Kansas State.

TAR HEELS DROP FROM NATIONAL POLLS

◆ Carolina is unranked in both the Associated Press and the coaches poll after being as high as No. 9 in both polls in November. UNC was ranked in the first seven installments of both polls to start this season before dropping out on Dec. 24.

◆ The Dec. 24 poll broke a run of 33 consecutive weeks in the AP poll for the Tar Heels (dating to Jan. 29, 2011).

◆ In **Roy Williams'** 10 seasons as the Tar Heel head coach, UNC has been ranked in the AP poll in 154 of 184 rankings. During the Williams era, Carolina has been unranked by the AP for six weeks in 2005-06, eight weeks in 2009-10, nine weeks in 2010-11 and seven weeks this season.

63 CONSECUTIVE NON-CONFERENCE WINS IN THE SMITH CENTER

◆ North Carolina's win over UNLV on Dec. 29 was its 63rd in a row against non-Atlantic Coast Conference opponents in the Smith Center.

◆ The Tar Heels' last non-conference loss in the Smith Center came on Nov. 29, 2005, to Illinois by a 68-64 score.

TAR HEELS DOT ALL-TIME MARCH MADNESS LISTS

◆ On Dec. 11 as a portion of its celebration of 75 years of "March Madness" at the NCAA basketball tournament, the NCAA announced its top 75 All-Time March Madness Players, 25 All-Time March Madness Teams and 35 All-Time March Madness Moments. Beginning in January, fans will be able to vote for the moments via the NCAA's website. Tar Heel players and teams dotted the NCAA's honorees.

◆ The six Tar Heels among the top 75 players included **Lennie Rosenbluth**, **James Worthy**, **Michael Jordan**, **Antawn Jamison**, **Sean May** and **Tyler Hansbrough**.

◆ The four UNC squads among the top 25 teams were 1956-57, 1981-82, 1992-93 and 2008-09. Only UCLA, with five teams, had more than Carolina's four. No other school had more than two and no other ACC school had more than one squad on the list.

◆ Jordan's game-winning shot to win the 1982 championship against Georgetown is one of the top 35 moments.

TAR HEELS IN 2013 HALL OF FAME TIP OFF TOURNEY

◆ UNC will compete in the 2013 Hall of Fame Tip Off Tournament in November with games to be played in both Chapel Hill and Uncasville, Conn.

◆ The Tar Heels are one of eight schools slated to play in the event, which will be hosted by the Naismith Basketball Memorial Hall of Fame that is based in Springfield, Mass.

◆ Carolina will be competing in the Naismith Bracket along with Fairfield, Louisville and Richmond. The Springfield Bracket includes Belmont, Hartford, Holy Cross and Hofstra. UNC will play host to games at the Smith Center on November 15 and 17, 2013, then travel to Connecticut to play games at the Mohegan Sun Arena on November 23rd and 24th.

◆ The Tar Heels previously played in the Hall of Fame Game in Springfield, Mass., in 1982-83 against St. John's, 1987-88 against Syracuse and 1996-97 against Arizona.

BRITT, HICKS & MEEKS SIGN LETTERS OF INTENT

◆ **Nate Britt**, a guard from Upper Marlboro, Md., **Isaiah Hicks**, a forward from Oxford, N.C., and **Kennedy Meeks**, a forward from Charlotte, N.C., have signed National Letters of Intent to attend UNC and play basketball. Head coach **Roy Williams** announced the Britt and Hicks signings on Nov. 16 and the Meeks signing on Nov. 24.

◆ Britt attends Oak Hill Academy in Mouth of Wilson, Va., where he plays for coach Steve Smith. He attended Gonzaga College High School in Washington, D.C., for three years where he played for coach Steve Turner. "Nate is a tremendous student-athlete in every sense of the word," says Williams. "His family emphasized both aspects and he is a true example for everyone. He is a leader on the court, someone who enjoys getting the ball to his teammates. However, he also can score himself. Nate's a wonderful kid and he's going to do a lot of wonderful things in our program."

◆ Hicks attends JF Webb High School in Oxford, where he plays for coach Leo Brunelli. "Isaiah is a wonderful young man who can do things both inside and outside that will be effective at our level," says Williams. "He can block shots and he can also get out on the floor and be a tremendous player. The people in Oxford were ecstatic when he came back to Webb last year and the people at UNC will be ecstatic with him as well."

◆ The 6-9 Meeks attends West Charlotte High School, where he plays for Coach Baronton Terry. "We are very pleased that Kennedy has chosen to attend UNC," says Williams. "He is a wonderful kid who has a very supportive family. He's done an excellent job in the classroom and has skills that will really help our team. He may be as good a passing big man as I have ever seen in half-court situations and he throws the outlet pass like Kevin Love did when he was in high school. He has great hands and can score inside."

FORD INDUCTED INTO COLLEGIATE BASKETBALL HALL OF FAME

◆ Georgetown center Patrick Ewing, Kansas legend Clyde Lovellette and North Carolina's star guard **Phil Ford** headlined a 10-man class inducted into the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame on Nov. 18.

◆ The Class of 2012 also included coaches Joe B. Hall of Kentucky and Dave Robbins of Virginia Union; players Kenny Sailors of Wyoming, Earl Monroe of Winston Salem State and Willis Reed of Grambling; and contributors Jim Host and Joe Dean.

◆ The first freshman to start the first game of his North Carolina career under Hall of Fame coach Dean Smith, Ford led UNC to the 1975 Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament championship and was the first freshman in ACC history to win the Everett Case Award as the most valuable player in the ACC Tournament. Carolina won 99 of 124 games with Ford, reached the NCAA tournament every year and advanced to the NCAA championship game in 1977. He scored 2,290 career points, was a first team All-ACC and All-America selection for his final three seasons and, as a senior, won the Wooden Award and was the consensus National Player of the Year.

CAROLINA NAMED TOP PROGRAM OF LAST 50 YEARS

◆ ESPN.com in August named the University of North Carolina men's basketball program the No. 1 program in the nation over the last 50 years. The ranking was based on a statistical formula devised by ESPN that took into account such achievements as winning national and conference championships, winning percentage, NCAA Tournament appearances, All-Americans and top NBA draft picks.

◆ ESPN.com selected a "starting five" for the Tar Heels that included guards **Phil Ford** and **Michael Jordan** and forwards **Tyler Hansbrough**, **Antawn Jamison** and **James Worthy**.

◆ UCLA was second in ESPN's rankings followed in the top 10 by Kentucky, Duke, Kansas, Louisville, Indiana, Syracuse, Connecticut and Arizona.

◆ Over the last 50 years, the Tar Heels have won NCAA championships in 1982, 1993, 2005 and 2009, an NIT title, 27 regular-season ACC championships and 16 ACC Tournament titles. Carolina has finished in the Top 10 in the final Associated Press poll 31 times in the last 50 years.

◆ The Tar Heels won 25 or more games 30 times and had nine 30-win seasons in that span.

◆ The Tar Heels have played in the NCAA Tournament 39 times in the last 50 years and in that time advanced to 16 Final Fours, seven championship games and won 101 NCAA Tournament contests.

◆ Four head coaches - **Dean Smith**, **Bill Guthridge**, **Matt Doherty** and **Roy Williams** — have directed the Tar Heel program in the last 50 years. Each of them won national coach of the year honors while at UNC. Smith and Williams are members of the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame.

◆ Eight different Tar Heels have earned National Player of the Year honors in the last five decades, including Ford (1978), Worthy (1982), Jordan (1983 and 1984), **Kenny Smith** (1987), **Jerry Stackhouse** (1995), Jamison (1998), **Sean May** (2005) and Hansbrough (2008). Ford, Jordan (1984), Jamison and Hansbrough each won consensus player of the year honors.

◆ NBA teams have selected 41 Tar Heels in the first round of the draft in the last 50 years. Four Tar Heels - **Harrison Barnes**, **Kendall Marshall**, **John Henson** and **Tyler Zeller** - were first round picks in the 2012 NBA Draft.

CAROLINA PICKED THIRD IN ACC PRESEASON POLL

◆ Defending regular season champion North Carolina grabbed third place in the 2012-13 preseason Atlantic Coast Conference poll, the ACC announced on Wednesday. The assembled media at ACC Operation Basketball, the conference's annual preseason media day, picked NC State to finish first and Duke to finish second.

◆ The Wolfpack earned 26 first-place votes on the 53 ballots and 601 overall points in the voting. Duke got 21 first-place votes and 589 points. UNC finished with 520 points. Fourth-place Florida State got the final six first-place votes and finished with 484 points overall.

◆ Leslie was named the Preseason ACC Player of the Year and Wolfpack freshman Andre Purvis is the Preseason ACC Rookie of the Year.

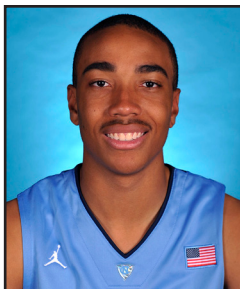

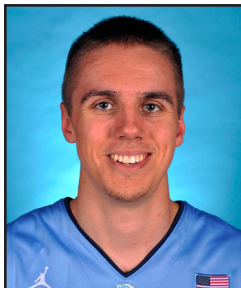
