WEEKEND STORY LINES & NEWS

- Miami will make its final true road trip of the season from May 12-14 in Charlottesville, Va., for a series with host **Virginia**.
- The Canes trail the all-time series by a slight 24-26 margin, with Virginia carrying an 11-10 series lead in Charlottesville.
- Junior lefthander **Jeb Bargfeldt** (5-3, 2.45 ERA) will start Friday opposite Virginia southpaw **Daniel Lynch** (6-2, 5.11 ERA).
- UM wraps up the regular season with four home games before traveling to the ACC Baseball Championship in Louisville.
- Sophomore **Romy Gonzalez** leads the Hurricanes with 13 multi-hit games, 10 multi-RBI games, 10 home runs and 31 RBI.
- The Hurricanes **have not lost a weekend series** since March 30, having won **four of their last five** with one series split.
- Head coach **Jim Morris** has the **fifth-most wins** in Division I history (1,559), the **third-most** wins among active coaches, a **.695** winning percentage (**sixth** among active coaches), and **184** more wins than the next active coach - Mike Fox of UNC.
- The Hurricanes had four different players earn Preseason All-America recognition; **Michael Mediavilla**, **Jesse Lepore** and **Johnny Ruiz** were recognized by *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper* while **Carl Chester** was honored by *Baseball America*.
- The Hurricanes made their **25th trip to the College World Series in 2016**, finishing with a 50-14 record and a 21-9 mark in ACC play. Miami was the No. 3 national seed for the postseason, and won the **2016 ACC Regular Season Championship**.
- The Canes had **seven** players selected in the 2016 MLB Draft, including Chicago White Sox' first-round pick **Zack Collins**.

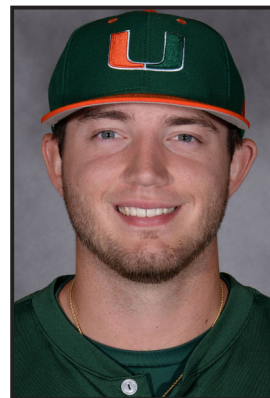

3 JIM MORRIS HEAD COACH

THE HURRICANES SKIPPER

It doesn't matter if his roster is full of rookies or veterans, University of Miami head coach Jim Morris continues to produce some of college baseball's most consistent and dominant teams entering his 24th season in Coral Gables. With a talented staff around him, Morris' Hurricanes are continually the class of collegiate baseball, having won national titles in 1999 and 2001 and the ACC Baseball Regular Season Championship in 2008, 2014 and 2016.

In his 23-season tenure at Miami, no program has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a college baseball-record 44 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 13 of Morris' 23 seasons in Coral Gables - including most recently in 2016, when Miami was awarded the No. 3 national seed for the NCAA postseason.

Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris has won 17 of 23 NCAA Regional appearances at UM, including a record 13 straight to start his tenure in Coral Gables. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 32 years - all 23 at Miami and his final nine at Georgia Tech.

A three-time national coach of the year and 2008 Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year, Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 1,055-442-3 (.707) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,559-686-4 (.695) Division I record in 35 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 39 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,690-725-4 (.701) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 23 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium's renovation prior to its reopening in 2009.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in 2016, as he led the program to its 25th College World Series appearance in history, its third straight ACC Coastal Division title and the program's second ACC Regular Season Championship in a three-year span.

Morris became just the sixth coach in the history of Division I baseball to reach the 1,500-win plateau when Miami topped Louisville 8-4 in dramatic fashion on March 18, 2016. Eight days later, Miami topped Clemson 5-4 in 11 innings - also in walk-off fashion - to send Morris to his 1,000th win at the helm of the Hurricanes.

Under his direction, the Hurricanes set the program record for fielding percentage with a sparkling .983 mark in 2016, a figure that ranked best nationwide. Seven Hurricanes were selected in the 2016 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft, including the program's first first-round selection since 2010 in catcher Zack Collins (No. 10, Chicago White Sox). Morris also helped guide two Hurricanes to a pair of major awards: Collins became the first Hurricane to win the Johnny Bench Award as the nation's top collegiate catcher in 2016, while Bryan Garcia set the program saves record and became the first Hurricane to win the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Award.

Morris entered 2015 as among the winningest active coaches in Division I baseball with 1,435 wins. He wasted little time in moving up the record books, moving into sole



possession of eighth place in all-time wins (1,439) on Feb. 15 with a 25-4 win over Rutgers and then seventh place with a 9-5 win over Louisville on March 7 (1,445).

Miami captured the 2014 ACC Regular Season Championship under his watch, recording 24 wins in conference play for the first time in program history.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that have gone on to play in the Major Leagues are Peter O'Brien (Kansas City), Chris Hermann (Arizona), Yasmani Grandal (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jemile Weeks (Boston), Danny Valencia (Oakland), Jon Jay (Chicago), Yonder Alonso (Oakland), Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Ryan Jackson (St. Louis), Pat Burrell (Philadelphia), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston), among many others. From his days at Georgia Tech include Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles), Jay Payton (Oakland) and Jason Varitek (Boston).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the international scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta.

WEEKEND NEWS & NOTES

CANES SET FOR TRIP TO CHARLOTTESVILLE

- After dropping a midweek game with **UCF** to cap a four-game homestand, Miami travels to Davenport Field for a weekend series with **Virginia** beginning Friday, May 12 (6 p.m., ACC Network Extra).
- Virginia leads the all-time head-to-head series by a slight **26-24 margin**, including an 11-10 lead in games played at Davenport Field. Miami dropped two of three in Coral Gables in the 2016 series.
- The game is a matchup of **two of the top three teams** in the **ACC Coastal Division**; Virginia enters in second place with a 14-10 record in conference play, while Miami is third with a 12-11 ACC record.
- Junior LHP **Jeb Bargfeldt** (5-3, 2.45 ERA) will oppose Virginia lefthander **Daniel Lynch** (6-2, 5.11 ERA) in the series opener Friday.

SECOND-HALF SUCCESS

- Miami has **not lost a series since March 30**, winning **four of its last five** and splitting a weather-shortened two-game set vs. FSU.
- After going 12-16 through the first half of the season, the Hurricanes have since posted a **12-8 record** and are **9-5 in their last 14 games**. Miami is 12-11 in ACC play, good for the sixth-best record in the ACC and third in the ACC Coastal.

WEEKEND REWIND: MIAMI TOPS WILDCATS

- The Hurricanes **won their fourth series in the last five tries** last weekend (May 5-7) at Mark Light Field, taking two of three games from visiting **Bethune-Cookman** in a nonconference series.
- Miami scored two runs in the seventh and plated the go-ahead run in the eighth to **come back for a 6-5 win** in Game 1. Sophomore **Romy Gonzalez homered twice** and sophomore closer **Frankie Bartow** recorded his **11th save of the year** in the win.
- Making his second start on the weekend staff, freshman **Greg Veliz** tossed six dominant innings to win the rubber match.

HEATING UP: CABEZAS SHINING IN BULLPEN

- Sophomore **Andrew Cabezas** has been Miami's top reliever. In the last 20 games, he has made 12 appearances, is **4-0** and totaled **31 strikeouts compared to six walks** in 21.0 innings with a **0.86 ERA**.
- Miami lefthander **Jeb Bargfeldt** has been the most consistent weekend starter for the Canes. In eight ACC starts, Bargfeldt is **4-2** with a **1.81 ERA**. He is holding ACC opponents to a **.188 average**.
- Junior **Hunter Tackett** broke out for a big weekend on the road at Boston College (April 28-30). Tackett batted a team-best **.545** (6-for 11) for the weekend and hit his first two homers as a Hurricane. He had one double, six RBI and a .615 on-base percentage.

THREE-TIME DEFENDING COASTAL CHAMPS

- Miami won its **third straight ACC Coastal Division title** in 2016, posting a **21-7 record in ACC play** to earn the division crown.
- The Hurricanes have won **67 ACC games in the prior three seasons** - the **most wins in a three-year stretch by any program since ACC expanded to a 30-game conference schedule** in 2005.
- Miami has won the ACC Regular Season Championship three times, most recently in **2016** when the Canes finished **21-7**.
- Since the beginning of the **2014** season, Miami has won **28 of its past 38 ACC series**. The Hurricanes went **8-2** in ACC series in **2014**, **7-3** in **2015**, **9-1** in **2016** and are **4-3-1** in **2017**.

• In his first season serving as closer, sophomore **Frankie Bartow** ranks **fourth** in the ACC with **11 saves**, including two vs. Pitt.

ROMY POWERING OFFENSE

• Sophomore infielder **Romy Gonzalez** leads Miami in **doubles** (8), **home runs** (10), **RBI** (31), **slugging percentage** (.492) and **steals** (11).

JEB! SHINING IN YEAR 1 AT MIAMI

• Junior **Jeb Bargfeldt** has been among Miami's top performers this season in his first year as a Hurricane. He transferred to UM after spending 2015 at **Wichita State** and 2016 at **Cisco College** (TX).
 • Bargfeldt has a **team-best 2.45 ERA** and has made 12 starts, all as a member of the weekend rotation. He is holding opponents to a .207 average, allowing just 18 earned runs in 66.0 innings.
 • Bargfeldt has been particularly impressive in ACC play; he has compiled a **1.81 ERA** and a **4-2 record** in eight conference starts, surrendering just nine earned runs in 44.2 innings.
 • The Owasso, Okla., native, whose father is the head softball coach at Tulsa, has the **fifth-lowest ERA in the ACC** (2.45) and the **fifth-lowest ERA** in conference play (1.81).

MIAMI IS #MLBU

• No school in the ACC has had **more players drafted than Miami**, which has seen **280** players picked into the professional ranks - including seven in 2016. Since 1990, UM has produced **179 draft picks** - 25 more than the next-highest ACC total (154, Clemson).

ONE OF THE GAME'S TOP SKIPPERS

• Jim Morris' **1,559** wins at the Division I level are **fifth-most** in the history of college baseball and **third-most** among active skippers.
 • Morris reached two major milestones in 2016 - he became the **fifth coach** to reach **1,500** wins on March 18 against Louisville and won his **1,000th game at Miami** on March 26 vs. Clemson.

• Miami has made College World Series trips in back-to-back seasons (2015 and 2016) thanks in large part to its **dominant play inside the confines of Alex Rodriguez Park at Mark Light Field**.

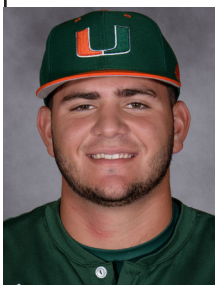
