LARRAÑAGA BY THE NUMBERS

- 5 Coach Jim Larrañaga is one of five ACC coaches with a Final Four appearance to his credit. In 2006, Larrañaga became the first coach at a mid-major school to take his team to the NCAA Final Four in 27 years.
- 6 In 31 years of coaching, Jim Larrañaga has a winning record in the NCAA Tournament, a 7-5 mark in six appearances.
- 7 Larrañaga is no stranger to the ACC. In his seven seasons as an assistant coach at Virginia, the Cavaliers participated in the NCAA Final Four in 1981 and 1984, won three ACC Championships and finished in the Top 5 of the rankings.
- 10 The 2015-16 marks the 10th anniversary of Larrañaga's Cinderella run to the 2006 NCAA Final Four with George Mason. Both associate head coach Chris Caputo and director of operations James Johnson were on that GMU staff.
- 15 Larrañaga has made 15 postseason appearances in the past 26 years, including six NCAA tournaments.
- 32 Larrañaga is in his 32nd year as a head coach and has successfully transitioned three institutions into successful programs: Miami, Bowling Green and George Mason.
 - 500 Coach L is one of five ACC coaches with 500 or more wins.

LARRAÑAGA - WHY MIAMI?

Along with returning to the best basketball conference in the country, Coach L had a few personal reasons for accepting the head coaching job at Miami. Coach's grandfather was from Cuba, where he produced the Larrañaga [lare-en-YAH-ga] cigar. Coach's father was raised in Key West before moving to The Bronx, N.Y., getting married and raising six children. Coach L was raised in The Bronx, but vacationed to Florida as a boy. He also has owned a house in Sarasota - which he bought from Dick Vitale's daughter - and three of his siblings have retired to Florida.

MIAMI IN PUERTO RICO

Miami has played in four tournaments in Puerto Rico, posting a 11-3 overall record. In Miami's last appearance, the Canes won the 2007-08 Puerto Rico Tip-Off with victories over Marist, VCU and Providence.

THE LAST TIME OUT - MIAMI VS. NO. 16 UTAH ...

The Hurricanes improved to 9-20 against ranked opponents under head coach Jim Larrañaga. Entering the game, ranked teams were 55-3 against unranked teams so far this season (AP) ... Miami's 24-point win over Utah was its largest win in school history over a ranked opponent away from home. It was also the third-largest in Miami history, trailing 27 points over Duke in 2013 and 27 points vs. Wake Forest in 2009 ... Miami's win over No. 16 Utah was its first over a ranked opponent since its win at No. 4 Duke on Jan. 13, 2015 ... Three Hurricanes in the last 20 years have had 20 points and 12 rebounds against a ranked opponent: Tim James, Reggie Johnson and Tonye Jekiri. (AP) ... The Hurricanes' matchup with Utah was their first against Utah since Jan. 3, 1966. With the win over Utah, Miami improved to 2-0 all-time against the Utes ... Miami improved to 15-9 in neutral site games under head coach Jim Larrañaga ... Miami has scored 86 points-or-more in all four of its games this season ... The Hurricanes' last two victories have come by a combined total of 50 points ... Miami never trailed during the game ... Miami's bench outscored Utah's bench 23-18 ... The Hurricanes committed a season-low seven turnovers, while Miami forced Utah into a seasonhigh 16 miscues ... Miami outscored Utah 23-4 in points off turnovers ... Miami had three players score in double figures ... The Hurricanes outrebounded the Utes 34-25. Miami has outrebounded its opponent in three of its four games this season ... Redshirt senior Sheldon McClellan scored a season high with 27 points, connecting on 10-of-12 from the field. McClellan has now scored 16-or-more points in all four games this season ... Senior Tonye Jekiri scored a career-high 20 points and pulled down a game-high 12 rebounds to record his first double-double of the season ... Prior to Friday's game, no Miami player had surpassed 20 points ... The last time two Miami players scored 20-ormore points was in the Hurricanes' victory at Duke (1/13/15) ... Jekiri surpassed 10 rebounds for the third time this season ... Redshirt senior Angel Rodriguez totaled a season-high three steals. His three steals were more than Utah's entire team combined ... Jekiri and Rodriguez were a perfect 9-for-9 from the field in the first half.

LIGHT 'EM UP

Through four games this season, Miami is averaging 93.5 points per game. In Coach L's first four full seasons at Miami, the Canes scored 93-or-more points only one time, on Jan. 2, 2011 against UNCG, a 99-89 victory for UM. In those four seasons, Miami's highest ppg average was 70.7 in 2011-12, followed by 68.2 in 2014-15, 67.9 in 2012-13 and the lowest was 61.5 in 2013-14.

OUICK HITS

- As a team, Miami is hitting 51.9 percent from the field and 45.5 percent from three.
- Miami's bench has scored 30.5 points per game. The Canes' bench players have outscored the opponent's bench 122-88.
 - Miami is averaging 20.2 points off of turnovers, compared to 6.0 from the opponent.
- Miami trailed by only three points in its first two games, two points against Mississippi State and never trailed against Utah.
 - Five Hurricanes are averaging at least 9.8 points per game.
 - Six Canes pull down at least 3.0 rebounds per game.
 - Six players are averaging at least 21.0 minutes per game.
 - Seven Canes have knocked down a 3-pointer and 10 have attempted a three.
- Eight players are shooting better than 45 percent from the field and five are better than 45 percent from long distance.
 - Only Kamari Murphy (1 GP) has not scored double-digit points in a game.
 - Miami is averaging 10.0 threes made per game and 22.5 made free throws per game.
 - UM has assisted on 64 of its 122 shots (52.5%).
- Miami has won five early-season tournaments since 2000: 2014-15 Charleston Classic, 2010-11 Las Vegas Holiday Hoops Classic, 2009-10 Charleston Classic, 2007-08 Puerto Rico Tip-Off and the 2001-02 Paradise Jam (Virgin Islands).
- From the season opener on Nov. 13 to the championship game of the Tip-Off, Miami will play five games in 10 days.

MIAMI VS. RANKED TEAMS

- Miami last won back-to-back games over ranked teams in 2006, downing No. 14/12 Maryland 84-70 on Jan. 7, then No. 20 North Carolina 81-70 on Jan. 14.
- Miami has only won three games against ranked teams at neutral sites, including March 19, 2000 vs. No. 8 Ohio State (75-62), March 8, 2007 vs. No. 17/21 Maryland (67-62), and Nov. 20, 2015 vs. No. 16 Utah(90-66).
- The last time Miami won two-straight matchups against ranked teams was in 2014-15, when the Canes took down No. 8/7 Florida (69-67) on Nov. 17, 2014, then defeated No. 24/25 Illinois (70-61), on Dec. 2, 2014.

CANES HALF BY HALF SHOOTING

After a rough start in the first half of the first game of the season against UTRGV, Miami has shot 48 percent or better from the field, 47+ percent from three and 66+ percent at the line in each half.

- Miami won ACC regular season and ACC tournament championships in 2013.
- Miami has 29 overall road wins, the most in the conference, leading 28 from North Carolina and Virginia and 26 from Duke.
- Miami has posted a 7-5 combined record against Duke (3-2) and North Carolina (4-3).
- Miami has the fourth-most ACC wins (41) in league play, behind Duke (55), Virginia (52) and North Carolina (50).
- Miami has the fourth-most ACC road wins (19) in league play, behind Duke (24), North Carolina (23) and Virginia (21).
- Miami is tied for the fourth-most ACC home wins (22), behind Duke and Virginia (31), North Carolina (27) and tied with Florida State and NC State (22).
- Miami is one of four schools with six or more wins in the ACC Tournament: North Carolina 7, NC State 7, Miami 6, Florida State 6.
- Miami is one of six ACC schools with a winning record in the NCAA tournament: Duke, Louisville, Miami, North Carolina, NC State, Notre Dame.
- Miami's seeds in the ACC Tournament have been No. 1, No. 6 (2x) and No. 10.
- Miami is one of 10 ACC teams to make an NCAA tournament appearance.
- Miami played in the championship game of the NIT in 2015.
- One ACC Coach of the Year, one ACC Player of the Year, ACC Defensive Player of the Year, one ACC Tournament MVP, four ACC All-Tournament, one first-team All-ACC, one second-team All-ACC, three third-team All-ACC, five honorable mention All-ACC, one ACC All-Rookie Team and four ACC All-Defensive Team selections.
- Miami has the most lopsided win over Duke (27 points) and second-most lopsided wins over Boston College (27 points), North Carolina (26 points) and Florida State (24 points) of any ACC team.
- Miami has won eight ACC games by 20 or more points: Boston College (27, 22, 22 and 21), Duke (27), North Carolina (26), Florida State (24) and Virginia Tech (24).

IN THE FOUR YEARS PRIOR TO THE ARRIVAL OF COACH L (2007-11) ...

- Miami posted the ninth-most ACC wins (25) in the league, ahead of NC State (20), Virginia (21) and Georgia Tech (21).
- Miami recorded 83 overall wins, tied for sixth-most in the ACC.

McCLELLAN ON JERRY WEST AWARD WATCH LIST

Senior Sheldon McClellan is among the 20 players named to the watch list for the 2016 Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award, the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced.

As a junior in 2014-15, McClellan's 48.4-percent shooting was the second-best shooting percentage in the nation by a guard in the Power Five conferences, 18th-best shooting percentage by a guard in the nation, 90th-best shooting percentage in the nation among all positions, and the top shooting percentage by a guard in the ACC.

MIAMI PREDICTED TO FINISH FIFTH IN ACC

Miami was predicted to finish fifth out of 15 teams in the Atlantic Coast Conference this season, as announced by the league during Operation ACC Basketball in Charlotte, N.C., Oct. 28. North Carolina was picked to win the league, followed by Virginia, Duke and Notre Dame.

In 2012-13, the Canes were picked to finish fifth, then won the league's regular season and tournament championship. In all four of Larrañaga's seasons at Miami, the Canes have finished the season better than predicted at ACC media day.

MIAMI SETS SEASON TICKET RECORD

In just his fifth season in Coral Gables, Jim Larrañaga continues to set records with the University of Miami men's basketball team. Miami has nearly sold out the ticket allotment for all home games this season at the BankUnited Center. Currently only 376 seats remain for the 2015-16 campaign. If Miami sells out those remaining seats, this will be the first time in Miami athletics history a team has sold out their season. Due to the record season ticket sales, seats may not be available on a single-game basis.

Entering Coach Larrañaga's fifth season at The U, fans have bought approximately 5,100 season tickets, more than doubling the total number of season tickets sold in his first season in Coral Gables. When Coach L began his reign in Miami, fans bought 2,251 season tickets for the 2011-12 campaign. After a record-breaking season on the court in 2012-13, season tickets peaked at 3,674 for the 2013-14 year.

COACHING CHANGES FOR THE HURRICANES

After having the same assistant coaching staff his first four years in Miami, Larrañaga has two new assistant coaches in 2015-16 in Jamal Brunt and Adam Fisher, following the departure of Eric Konkol (Louisiana Tech) and Michael Huger (Bowling Green). Konkol had been an assistant with Coach L 11 seasons and Huger was an assistant coach for eight years and player for four seasons.

Due to the lack of turnover, Coach L has only had nine assistant coaches in the last 14 seasons. Five of his assistants left for a D-I head coaching job, and two others who have worked their way into head coaching jobs. In those 14 seasons, only twice two assistants left at the same time, 1996 (Stan Heath and Steve Merfeld) and 1989 (Jeff Snyder and Ricky Stokes).

Chris Caputo, in his 14th season on Larrañaga's staff and fifth in Coral Gables, was promoted to associate head coach in the summer of 2015.

In 2014, he participated in the Nike Elite 100, and he played AAU ball for the NY Lightning. AMONG UNIVERSITY OF MIAMI COACHES, LARRAÑAGA ...

- has the highest winning percentage of a Miami coach in the NCAA Tournament, a .667 mark with a 2-1 record.
- is one of two Miami coaches to post three 20-win seasons. Larrañaga has recorded three 20-win seasons in four years at Miami.
- .647 winning percentage is the best mark since Bruce Hale posted a .663 mark from 1955-67, including three seasons led by Rick Barry
- has led the Canes to 41 ACC wins in just four seasons. Miami won 43 ACC games the previous seven seasons.

CANES POST 20+-WIN SEASON

With a victory at Virginia Tech on March 7, 2015, Miami posted its third 20-win season in four years since the arrival of Jim Larrañaga. Since 2011-12, Coach L has tallied seasons of 20-13, 29-7, 17-16 and 25-13, for an average of 22.8 wins per season. Since joining the ACC in 2004-05, Miami posted three 20-win seasons before Larrañaga, 23-11 in 2008, 20-13 in 2010 and 21-15 in 2011.

MIAMI'S ROAD WINS RANK TOP 11 NATIONALLY

Miami was one of 38 teams in the country, and one of 11 teams from a Top 8 conference, to win 10+ games away from its home arena last regular season. Gonzaga led the way with 14 road and neutral site victories.

The Canes have posted 10+ wins away from home in two of Coach L's four seasons at Miami. In 2012-13, Miami won 15 on the road, including five neutral-site games. Last year, Miami was 10-5 away from the BankUnited Center, with a 3-1 neutral-site record, in the regular season.

CANES IN NATIONAL STATS, VIA NCAA.COM

Miami was 13th in the country in turnovers per game (10.1), committing less than 15 turnovers in 35 of 38 outings.

The Canes knocked down 292 shots from 3-point range, good enough for 20th in the nation. UM hit at least seven shots from long range in 23 games, and tied a school record of 15 made in a game, going 15-of-25 at Virginia Tech on March 7.

UM shot 74.6 percent from the free throw line, which was the 22nd-best mark in the country. Miami drained at least 70 percent of its free throws in 28 games last year. The Canes' 544 free throws made were No. 39 in the NCAA.

Miami averaged just 15.6 fouls per game, a mark that was 22ndbest in the nation, grabbed 1317 total rebounds (29th) and posted a 1.27 assist-to-turnover ratio (44th).

CANES FINISH SIXTH IN ACC AFTER BEING PICKED 10TH

Miami finished sixth in the 2014-15 ACC rankings after being projected to finish 10th by the media at Operation Basketball in October. In each of Coach L's four seasons at Miami, the Canes have exceeded preseason expectations. In his first season, Miami was picked fifth and finished tied for fourth. In just his second season, UM won the ACC after being projected to finish fifth. A year ago, the Canes were selected 12th, but ended 10th.

The Canes and Notre Dame both made a jump of four spots: Miami from 10th to sixth and Notre Dame from seventh to third. Wake Forest and Virginia Tech were the only schools who were slotted in the correct spots. In order of preseason projections, here are the final mis-projections of each team: Duke -1, North Carolina -3, Louisville -1, Virginia +3, Syracuse -3, Pittsburgh -4, Notre Dame +4, Florida State -3, NC State +2, Miami +4, Clemson +2, Wake Forest +0, Georgia Tech -1, Boston College +1, Virginia Tech +0.

LARRAÑAGA POSTS FOURTH 25-WIN SEASON

With a 25-13 mark last season at Miami, Coach Jim Larrañaga has posted four 25-win seasons as a head coach. His first was a 27-8 mark at George Mason in 2005-06, when he led the team to the NCAA Final Four and in 2010-11 he was 27-7 with a 1-1 mark in the NCAA Tournament. At Miami, Coach L led the Canes to a 29-7 mark in 2012-13, winning the ACC regular season and tournament, then taking UM to the NCAA Sweet 16.

CARDIAC CANES - YEAR TWO

Miami played 16 games last season that were decided by five points-or-less. The Canes had five losses by a total of 22 points in the month of February. Three of those games were decided by a total of

five points. Miami and Georgia Tech each had 13 games decided by four points or less last season. Miami and Notre Dame led the ACC with nine wins in close games. In 2013-14, Miami led the ACC having played 13 games decided by five points-or-less or in OT.

COACH L NOTCHES CAREER WIN NO. 550

In his first victory against Syracuse, Coach Jim Larrañaga won his 550th career game. Larrañaga's 100th win came in 1991 against Kent State while at Bowling Green. While at George Mason, win No. 200 came in 1997 vs. Northeastern, No. 300 in 2003 against East Carolina and No. 400 in 2008 vs. William & Mary. In 2012, the Canes defeated Georgia Tech for Coach L's 500th.

MIAMI VS. RANKED OPPONENTS LAST SEASON

Miami was 3-6 against ranked teams last season, including 1-1 against top-5 teams and 2-2 against top-10 teams. Of the six losses, one was a double-overtime defeat against Virginia, and the Canes came up 6.1 ppg short in the other five outings. The Canes were 1-3 at home, 2-2 on the road and 0-1 at neutral sites vs. Top 25 opponents. See a complete list vs. ranked opponents since the arrival of Coach L on page 10.

THE HIGHLIGHTS OF 2014-15

On Jan. 13, Miami defeated eventual national champion then-No. 4 Duke, 90-74, at Cameron Indoor Stadium, ending Duke's 41game home winning streak, the longest active streak in Division I, and snapping Duke's 19-game ACC home game winning streak. UM was the only team to defeat Duke at home last season.

The Canes defeated then-No. 8/7 Florida on Nov. 17 in the O'Connell Center, led by Angel Rodriguez' 22 points in the final nine minutes, draining five 3-pointers in the last seven minutes to help Miami to the win. With the victory, the Canes snapped Florida's 33-game home winning streak and 25-game home non-conference winning streak at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center. The 33-game streak was the third-longest in the country, behind 34 from both Duke and Stephen F. Austin.

Miami opened the season 8-0, and on Dec. 1 was ranked No. 15 in the country by both the AP and USA TODAY.

Miami suffered 13 losses, including six games (four opponents) against nationally ranked teams. In those six games, the Canes led by at least 12 points twice: 12 points at No. 12 Notre Dame and 13 points at No. 12 Louisville.

Miami was one of 38 teams in the country, and one of 11 teams from a Top 8 conference, to win 10+ games away from its home arena last regular season. Gonzaga led the way with 14 road & neutral site victories.

Junior Tonye Jekiri led the Atlantic Coast Conference in rebounds (10.9 ACC only, 9.9 all games) and double-doubles (9) in ACC games. He is Miami's first player to average 10+ rpg in a season in ACC play.

POSTSEASON AWARDS FOR FOUR HURRICANES

Junior forward Tonye Jekiri was named to the 2015 Coaches and ACSMA All-Atlantic Coast Conference Defensive Team. Jekiri also joined Sheldon McClellan and Angel Rodriguez as honorable mentions on the 2015 ACSMA All-ACC Team.

Sophomore guard Davon Reed was named to the All-ACC Academic Men's Basketball Team.

Reed and McClellan were named to the five-player NIT All-Tournament Team.

LARRAÑAGA RETURNS HOME, NY COACHES IN NIT

Coach Jim Larrañaga returned to his roots for the NIT, playing in his home state of New York. Larrañaga grew up in the Parkchester neighborhood of The Bronx, playing high school basketball for Jack Curran at Archbishop Molloy High School in Queens.

Since 2000, only four coaches originally from the state of New York have led their team to the championship game of the NIT. In 2015, coach Jim Larrañaga is from The Bronx. In 2014, Larry Brown (Brooklyn) was the runner up with SMU. John Beilein (Burt) won the event in 2007 with West Virginia. In 2000, Matt Doherty (East Meadow) was runner up with Notre Dame.

COACH L IN MADISON SQUARE GARDEN

In Larrañaga's 31 years of coaching, he had never been the head coach of a team playing a game in Madison Square Garden, until March 31 against Temple. He played in the World's Most Famous Arena multiple times while playing college ball for Providence, and was an assistant coach for Virginia when the Cavaliers won the NIT in 1980. Larrañaga's final collegiate game as a Friar was played against UNC in 1971, an 86-79 loss for PC in the NIT Elite 8.

MARCH WAS HURRICANE SEASON

Miami was 7-1 in the month of March last season, and Jim Larrañaga is 19-8 in the month of March while coaching at Miami.

DID YOU KNOW ...

Coach L became the first Miami coach to win 20+ games in his first two seasons at UM and only the third of 12 UM coaches to post three 20-win seasons.

Former Cane Rick Barry was named one of the Greatest Players in NBA History.

Miami native and former Cane James Jones won the 2010-2011 NBA All-Star Weekend 3-Point Contest and the NBA Championship in the 2011-2012 and 2012-13 seasons.

Six-time NBA All Star Amar'e Stoudemire enrolled at UM in 2013 and took classes to earn his bachelor's degree.

UM is in its 12th season in the ACC.

Coach L led the George Mason Patriots to the 2006 Final Four with big wins over some of basketball's elite teams such as Michigan State, UNC and UConn. He was the first coach to take a mid-major to a Final Four in 27 years (Penn '79) when his team advanced in 2006.

In 14 years at George Mason, Larrañaga led the Patriots to five NCAA Tournament appearances (2011, 2008, 2006, 2001, 1999), including the 2006 Final Four.

Miami basketball received APR (Academic Progress Rate) Public Recognition Awards for being among the top 10 percent in APR in its sport. Miami ranks in the top 10 percent NCAA men's basketball with a 990 APR.

The Miami Department of Athletics recorded a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 89 percent. Miami's department-wide GSR is 16th overall among FBS programs. UM has exceeded the NCAA average GSR in each of the last 10 years.

The Canes have averaged 20.0 wins over the last 11 seasons.

The Hurricanes have made at least one trey in 907 of 913 games since the NCAA adopted the 3-point shot in 1986. The last time Miami was held without a 3-pointer was Feb. 26, 2014 at Virginia.

Miami has held 766 of its last 767 opponents to less than 100 points. North Carolina was the last team to score 100+, defeating UM 105-64 on Jan. 31, 2007.
