STORY LINES

- After a weekend trip to Chapel Hill, N.C. where Miami delivered No. 1 North Carolina its first loss of the season, the Hurricanes return home for a six-game homestand beginning Tuesday against Columbia University.
- Tuesday night's 6 p.m. contest at Alex Rodriguez Park will mark the first-ever matchup between the two programs.
- Veteran starters Eric Whaley and Bryan Radziewski will once again take the mound for Miami in its midweek set. Whaley was roughed up for five earned runs last time out, while Radziewski delivered another strong outing in a 9-2 victory over ILSU.
- The Hurricanes boast an impressive 6-1 record in midweek contests this season.
- Though their record stands at just 2-8 through their first ten games, the Lions recorded a win over reigning national champions Arizona in a three-game series, and also registered a victory in its trip to UCF this past weekend.
- After striking out a career-best 11 in the team's midweek win over UCF back on March 6, Radziewski struck out five Illinois State batters in the team's 9-2 victory on March 13. The southpaw currently boasts a team-best K:BB ratio of 20:2.
- Alex San Juan reached base seven times in the team's series with UNC, and ranks first on the team with a .348 average.

Starting Pitcher Notes:

- Whaley will be making his second start of the season Tuesday against Columbia. The senior was tagged for five runs and eight hits last time out against ILSU (March 12).
- Radziewski, who earned Freshman All-America honors in 2011, delivered a strong outing in a win over ILSU (March 13). He has allowed just one earned run in 12.1 innings of work.
- After pitching in the team's midweek series against Illinois State, neither starter traveled to Chapel Hill, N.C. for Miami's series with No. 1 North Carolina.

3 JIM MORRIS 2001, 1999 & 1994 COACH OF THE YEAR • 2008 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR



In his 20th season at Miami, no other program nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 40 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 19 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

- Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a .865-328-3 (.724) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,369-595-4 (.696) Division I record in 31+ years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 34 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,500-636-4 (.701) mark
- In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 19 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

- Jim Morris earned his 28th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2012 when he guided the Canes to one of 16 host sites for the first round of the postseason. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 19 seasons (1994-2012), winning 15 of his last 19 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.
- Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2012 Hurricanes to their 40th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five players from the 2012 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft: E.J. Encinosa, Eric Erickson, Steven Ewing, Peter O'Brien and Stephen Perez.

MORRIS IN 35th SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

- Morris currently has a 1,369-595-4 (.696) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,500-636-4 (.701) record over 30-plus years.
- Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.
- Morris entered 2013 as the fifth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball history with 1,354 wins. His impressive win total ranks him No. 12 all-time for any coach, regardless of division.
- Morris won his 1,500th game as a head coach in Miami's 4-1 upset of No. 1 North Carolina on March 15, 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.



JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

- The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with Miami in 11 of 19 seasons and led the Canes to 13 straight NCAA Regional Championships, an NCAA record.
- Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and 2001.

HOME SWEET HOME...

• After dropping its weekend series with No. 1 North Carolina on the road, the Miami Hurricanes will open up a six-game homestand Tuesday with a midweek set against visiting Columbia.

• The Hurricanes boast an impressive 12-3 record inside the friendly confines of Alex Rodriguez Park, including a 5-1 mark in midweek contests played in Coral Gables.

• Miami is hitting an impressive .296 as a team at home, led by junior Brad Fieger (.408, 15 RBI's), junior Alex Hernandez (.373, 14 runs) and senior Alex San Juan (.357, seven RBI's).

• Southpaw Bryan Radziewski, slated to start Wednesday's game two, has a 19:1 strikeout-to-walk ratio in his three starts at A-Rod Park this season.

NEWCOMERS FINDING THEIR WAY...

• Members of the Hurricanes 2012 recruiting class, ranked in the top 10 by *Baseball America* for the first time since 2006, have already made quite an impact in the early going.

• Freshman Christopher Barr made his first career start in the series finale against Duke (March 10), and has reached base a team-best total of 16 times in the six games since. He has hit first in the order for all six of those games.

• Freshman shortstop Brandon Lopez and junior second baseman Alex Hernandez, both key members of a class ranked No. 9 in the nation by *Collegiate Baseball*, have provided the Hurricanes with impressive defensive range up the middle. Each has started every game at his respective position.

• Freshman power hitter David Thompson leads the team in homeruns (two) and RBI's (18) entering Tuesday's opener against the Lions. He also leads the team with seven doubles.

STARTING OFF STRONG...

• Sophomore lefthander Chris Diaz has fared well in his new role of Friday night starter, delivering four quality starts in five chances this season. The Florida City, Fla., native ranks fifth in the conference with an ERA of 1.41, and matched a career-long with seven innings in a win over No. 1 UNC (March 15).

• After tossing a gem in a win over Duke (March 10), sophomore Andrew Suarez delivered another strong outing in the series finale against UNC (March 17). Suarez struck out a career-best seven batters through 6.2 innings of work, marking the second-longest start of his career.

SCOUTING THE LIONS...

• Columbia is off to a slow start in 2013, with a record of only 2-8 through its first 10 games.

• Though the Lions' season mark is under .500, their two wins came over reigning national champions Arizona (March 9, 8-4) and this past weekend against UCF (March 16, 5-4).

• Offensively, Columbia is powered by junior infielder Aaron Silbar (.333 AVG, 12 hits), senior Alex Black (.273, six RBI's) and junior Jordan Serena (10 runs scored, four doubles).

• On the hill, Columbia has been led starters David Speer (3.50 ERA) and senior Tim Giel (team-best 16 strikeouts).

GETTING DEFENSIVE...

- Miami's defense has been one of the many brightest spots on the season, boasting a .974 fielding percentage - the fourth-best mark in the Atlantic Coast Conference.
- Miami's 2013 infield features four newcomers: freshman first base platoon David Thompson & Christopher Barr, junior second baseman Alex Hernandez and freshman shortstop Brandon Lopez. Junior third baseman Brad Fieger completes the infield lineup.
- The play of the Hurricanes infield has been the catalyst for a majority of the team's 21 double plays - the second-most of any team in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY...

- Head coach Jim Morris and his staff have received nine quality starts from their pitching staff in 22 games this season.
- Sophomore Andrew Suarez has delivered back-to-back quality starts against Duke (March 10) and UNC (March 17), and ranks 17th in the ACC with a 2.73 ERA.
- Freshman LHP Thomas Woodrey went eight innings against Maine in his most recent midweek start (March 5), the deepest any pitcher has gone this season.
- Sophomore LHP Chris Diaz has delivered four quality starts in five opportunities in 2013, and tied a career-best with seven innings in a series-opening win over No. 1 UNC (March 15).

HEATING UP...

- Senior Alex San Juan is hitting a team-best .462 over the past five games, and reached base seven times against UNC - the most of any player.
- Since being inserted into the starting lineup March 10, Christopher Barr has team-best totals of eight hits, eight walks and seven runs scored over a span of six games.
- Senior reliever Eric Nedeljkovic has not allowed a run in nine appearances this season, and has struck out 12 batters in 11.1 innings.

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH...

- A number of the Hurricanes' most important contributors have been underclassmen, many of whom were part of a recruiting class ranked in the top 10 by national publications.

- Freshman OF Grant Heyman has shown glimpses of his power potential, including his first career triple in a matchup with Illinois State (March 12).

- Miami's midweek set against Illinois State ended the team's season-opening stretch of games inside the Sunshine State.
- 20 of the team's first 27 games will have been played at Alex Rodriguez Park at Mark Light Field.

Miami has taken special steps to remember "The Wizard of College Baseball," who helped guide the Hurricanes to over 1,200 wins and two national championships in his storied 30-year tenure as head coach.

During a special tribute night against Milwaukee on Feb. 23, head coach Jim Morris called for the "Grand Illusion," a trick play for which Fraser became instantly famous after the 1982 College World Series. A new outfield banner portraying the legendary coach was also unveiled by Fraser's wife Karen, his three daughters and five grandchildren during the game.

The Hurricanes are wearing patches in remembrance of Fraser; #1 patches adorn the right breast of each and every jersey, while #1 decals have been placed on the back of each player's batting helmet.

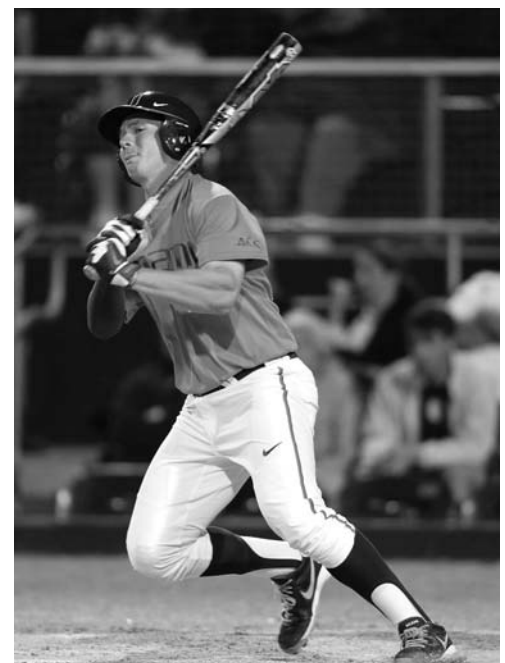
