MIAMI STEPS OUT OF CONFERENCE FOR CONTEST WITH USF

► The Miami Hurricanes will step out of Atlantic Coast Conference competition and hit the road to take on the Bulls of USF. Kick-off is set for 3:32 p.m. at Raymond James Stadium. The game will be televised nationally on ESPNU.

► Travis Benjamin became the sixth player in school history to surpass the 2,000-yard receiving mark with his 18-yard reception in the first quarter against Florida State. The senior entered the FSU game needing only three yards to reach the milestone. The Belle Glade, Fla. native now has 2,024 career receiving yards.

► The Hurricane defense held Florida State without a first quarter first down. It was the first time since Oct. 25, 2008 against Virginia Tech that the Seminoles were held without a first-quarter first down.

► Not only was the Miami defense stingy with first downs during the first-quarter, for the game, the unit held Florida State to a paltry 259 yards of offense and 23 points. The only other opponent to hold the Seminoles to fewer offensive yards (246) and points (13) this season was Oklahoma.

► Miami's high-octane offense racked up 383 yards of total offense in the 23-19 loss to FSU. Entering the game, the Seminoles were limiting teams to 268.0 yards per game. Miami's production was the second-most yards gained on FSU this season, after Clemson's 443 yards in a 35-30 win.

► Last week, Miami's Lamar Miller became the eighth player in program history to surpass the 1,000-yard mark. Against Florida State last Saturday, Miller rushed for 92 yards on 22 carries. The redshirt sophomore now ranks fifth in UM history with 1,108 rushing yards in a season.

- ▶ Miami leads the all-time series, 2-1.
- ▶ The last meeting between these two was decided in overtime at Sun Life Stadium with the Bulls victorious 23-20.
- ▶ Miami won the last meeting at Raymond James Stadium 31-10 in 2009.

A CANES WIN OVER THE BULLS WOULD...

- ▶ Give the Hurricanes their second consecutive victory at Raymond James Stadium.
- ▶ Give the Hurricanes six wins and bowl eligibility.
- ▶ Be Miami's third non-conference victory.
- ▶ Give Al Golden his first victory over South Florida and his second road victory.

The COACHES

- ▶ Al Golden is in his first year as Miami's head coach and owns an overall record of 31-39. South Florida head coach Skip Holtz sports a career record of 85-59 going 13-10 in his second season leading the Bulls.

Scouting THE BULLS

- ▶ South Florida is coming off of its first win since a four-game slide, beating Syracuse 37-17 and now head back to Tampa, Fla. for a three-game home stand.
- ▶ The Bulls possess one of the nation's most potent offenses, ranking 17th nationally in total offense (469.2 yards/gm), and 25th nationally in rush offense, producing an impressive 203.8 yards/gm on the ground.
- ▶ Quarterback B.J. Daniels is having his best season thus far, sporting a 60.4 completion percentage and tossing for 253.4 yards/game, good for 27th nationally including 12 scores.
- ▶ Starting receiver Sterling Griffin has a team-high 70.4 yards/game and has pulled in two touchdowns to go along with it. He is targeted by Daniels over five times per game.
- ▶ Darell Scott splits the rushing duties with B.J. Daniels and has scampered for an impressive 5.7 yards per carry and has crossed the goal line a total of five times.
- ▶ Placekicker Maikon Bonani is accurate from within 40 yards hitting 11-of-13, but sees a dramatic drop-off in accuracy when attempting kicks over 40 yards hitting only 50 percent of the time.
- ▶ Redshirt sophomore linebacker DeDe Lattimore leads his team in both tackles and sacks, taking down 66 opponents and wrestling down the quarterback 5.5 times this season. He has also added 10 tackles for loss, an interception and two forced fumbles.

Up NEXT...

- ▶ The Canes return home for their season finale against Atlantic Coast Conference rival Boston College on Friday, Nov. 25 at Sun Life Stadium in Miami Gardens, Fla.

Spence NAMED BUTKUS AWARD SEMIFINALIST

- ▶ On Oct. 24, Miami linebacker Sean Spence was named as one of 12 finalists for the 27th Annual Butkus Award® honoring the nation's top college linebacker.
- ▶ Spence was again the Canes' leader on defense against Duke. The prolific linebacker racked up eight tackles to lead his team. The Miami native had five solo stops and two tackles for a loss of two yards.
- ▶ Spence has been the anchor of the defense all season and has amassed 89 total tackles (21st nationally), 13.0 tackles for loss (16th nationally) for 38 yards, three sacks for 23 yards and a forced fumble.
- ▶ No other player at a BCS institution has won defensive player of the week honors for their conference three times this season. Only Mike Taylor, a linebacker at Wisconsin, has won it twice.

Wieclaw NAMED LOU GROZA SEMIFINALIST

- ▶ The Palm Beach County Sports Commission has released its 20 semi-finalists for the 2011 Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award presented by the Orange Bowl Committee and Miami's Jake Wieclaw is among those receiving recognition.
- ▶ The New Lenox, Ill. native has converted on all 37 of his extra point attempts and has made 8-of-10 field goal attempts, with a season-long 43-yarder coming at North Carolina.
- ▶ On 55 kickoffs, Wieclaw has recorded three touchbacks and has limited the opposition to an average starting field position of the 23-yard line.

- Miller is second in the Atlantic Coast Conference with 110.8 rushing yards per game, ranking 15th nationally.
- Through the first four games of the season, Miller was the only back in America with a rush of 40-yards or more in every game. He did not extend that streak at Virginia Tech, but did have runs of 37 and 30 yards.
- Of his 11 career rushes/receptions of 25-yards or more, nine have come after halftime.
- Miller recorded 166 rushing yards on 18 carries against Virginia Tech, posting his fifth-straight game with at least 100 yards rushing. Miller is the first Cane to open the season with five-straight 100-yard rushing games. Willis McGahee started the 2002 season with 100-plus in four of the first five games. The last time a Cane recorded five-straight 100-yard rushing games was Clinton Portis in 2001.
- Miller has eleven plays of 25-yards or longer this season: 10 rushes and one reception.
- Until the Ohio State game (184 yards), Miller's output against Virginia Tech was a career best. The Hokies' run defense came into the 2011 meeting ranked No. 4 nationally against the run, giving up only 58.20 yards on the ground.
- Miller joins former Cane Frank Gore (2001-04) with eight career 100-yard rushing games. Edgerrin James (1995-98) is the all-time leader with 15 games of 100 or more yards on the ground.

When IT COUNTS

► You can only bottle up the electric Lamar Miller for so long. His career shows that the second half is clearly Miller Time. Not only do his biggest plays (especially runs) come in the second half, but nearly 60 percent of his career yards have come after intermission.

GSR SCORES SHOW CONTINUED SUCCESS OF MIAMI ATHLETICS

► In what has become an annual upward trend, student-athletes at the University of Miami continue to excel in the classroom at a record pace. According to the NCAA's Graduation Success Rates (GSR), Miami established a new athletics department-wide record with a GSR of 89 percent.

► Last year, the athletics department-wide GSR was at its then-record high of 86 percent.

► The athletics department has exceeded the NCAA average for GSR in each of the last seven years.

2,024—Against Florida State WR Travis Benjamin caught an 18-yard pass to put him over the 2,000 mark for his career. His total is sixth all-time by a Hurricane.

A GAME OF FIRSTS - FLORIDA STATE RECAP

► Redshirt-freshman TE Clive Walford reeled in the first touchdown of his career on a third-and-goal on a two-yard jump ball from Harris in the second quarter.

► Running back Mike James scored two touchdowns, marking the first time this season that he has scored multiple touchdowns in back-to-back games.

UM HAS NATION'S MOST EFFICIENT OFFENSE

► According to footballoutsiders.com, the Hurricanes have the country's No. 1 most efficient offense. Below is an excerpt from the site:

► The Hurricanes are averaging a pedestrian 385 yards per game (67th in the nation), but unlike some of the teams at the top of those stat sheets, they play at a very deliberate pace. They are maximizing value on the plays they do run (6.5 yards per play, 15th nationally) and possessions. Against Duke (No. 91 DFEI), Miami scored touchdowns on each of its first five offensive possessions, the fifth of which concluded with less than 10 minutes left in the third quarter. Garbage time hadn't officially kicked in at that point, but they were ruthlessly efficient against a weak opposing defense, as elite offenses must be.

Miller CRUISES TO 1,000 YARDS

► Lamar Miller reached 1,000 rushing yards in Miami's ninth game of the season. Edgerrin James reached the milestone in the same amount of games in 1998. Only Willis McGahee in 2002 surpassed 1,000 yards quicker, when it took him only eight games.

Logging PLAYING TIME

► With two regular-season games remaining, four players are on track to play in a record number of games as Miami Hurricanes. Brandon Meriweather logged a UM-best 52 appearances from 2002-2006.

► Seniors Travis Benjamin (47), LaRon Byrd (49), Chris Ivory (48) and JoJo Nicolas (48) have played in a combined 192 games since 2008.

► Byrd has already joined the all-time list with 49 games played to tie for sixth-place all-time with seven others. He could finish his career with 51 appearances, good for a tie for second place.

Streak CONTINUES

► Former Hurricanes and current proCanes Jimmy Graham (New Orleans) and Devin Hester (Chicago) scored touchdowns in Week 10 of the NFL season.

► At least one former Cane has now scored a touchdown every NFL week since Week 15 of the 2002 season - a span of 149 straight weeks.

Honoring A LEGEND

► UM honored Russell Maryland in an on-field ceremony in the Sept. 17 contest against Ohio State to commemorate the defensive tackle's upcoming induction into the College Football Hall of Fame in December.

► Maryland finished his college career with 279 tackles, 25 tackles for losses and 20.5 quarterback sacks. He was the Jack Harding Most Valuable Player Award winner in 1990 and led the Hurricanes to four consecutive bowl berths, two national championships and an overall record of 45-3 during his career.

Canes OPEN NEW ERA UNDER GOLDEN

► Golden owns an overall record of 32-39 and is in his sixth season as a head coach.

► Golden arrived in Coral Gables after spending the last five seasons as the head coach at Temple University. Over five seasons at Temple, Golden took the Owls to unprecedented heights. Before his arrival, TU had just two winning seasons over its previous 26 years and had only won 22 percent of its games over the previous 30 years. Quickly, Golden made the Owls a contender, leading the team to a combined record of 17-8 his last two years there. The 2009 season marked Temple's first winning season since 1990, and Golden was rewarded with MAC Coach of the Year honors.

Harris' 69 career touchdown passes rank second in school history and fourth all-time among ACC passers. His career TD-to-Int ratio is 1.57-to-1.

The numbers above show that Harris is a slow starter as his TD-to-Int ratio in the opening half is just 1.16-to-1. However, in the second half, his numbers improve dramatically to 2.54-to-1.

Beyond that increase, Harris' red zone numbers are outstanding. When inside the opponent's 20-yard and facing a more condensed defense, the senior has:

That equates to an impressive 7.17-to-1 TD-to-Int ratio.

When the game is on the line and points are necessary in the red zone, Harris has proven to come through in the clutch.

Jacory SOARING

► Under the tutelage of offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach Jedd Fisch, Miami quarterback Jacory Harris has recorded career highs this season in several key statistical categories. Harris' 2011 QB rating (166.15), completion rate (64.2%), yards per attempt (9.0) and longest pass (77 yards) are all career highs.

J12 AMONG THE BEST

- With his 225-yard performance against Florida State on Nov. 12, Jacory Harris remains in second place in Miami's all-time records book with 8,322 career passing yards, surpassing Gino Torretta and trailing only Ken Dorsey (9,565).
- Harris is among the nation's best quarterbacks with a passing efficiency of 161.15 - ranking 9th nationally. Harris has connected on 145-of-226 passes with 19 touchdowns and five interceptions.
- Harris entered the season ranked among Miami's top signal callers, appearing in six different career records categories.
- Harris is ranked second all-time in passing yardage, pass completions, pass attempts, touchdowns thrown and total offense, while ranking third in completion percentage. Harris is on track to upend Ken Dorsey in two categories, needing to complete 20 passes and attempt 78 passes to surpass Dorsey as the record holder. Last season he connected on 148 passes and attempted 270.
- He moved into sole possession of second place all-time in career passing TDs on Oct. 23, 2010 when he threw touchdown passes to LaRon Byrd, Travis Benjamin and Leonard Hankerson against the Tar Heels.
- With his TD pass against Florida State, Harris moved into fourth-place surpassing Darian Durant (North Carolina, 2001-04) on the ACC's Career TD passes list with 69. The senior is now only seven touchdown passes shy of Russell Wilson (NC State - 2008-10). NC State's Phillip Rivers is the all-time leader with 95.
- Harris passed Georgia Tech's Reggie Ball (2003-05; 8,128), with his 225-yard performance against the Seminoles, for 16th place on the ACC's career passing yardage stats, as he now has 8,322 career passing yards.

Four TO ENTER UM HALL OF FAME

► The University of Miami Sports Hall of Fame announced on Sept. 22 that four former Hurricane football players will be among those to be enshrined in its Class of 2012. Current Baltimore Ravens Ed Reed and Bryant McKinnie as well as Rich Mercier and Ray Bellamy - the university's first African-American football player - will be enshrined into the hall on March 29, 2012.

► Ed Reed (1998-2001)

Consensus First-Team All-America and All-BIG EAST selection in 2000 and 2001... Set UM career records for interceptions (21) and interception return yards (389)... His nine interceptions in 2001 is the second-highest single-season total in UM history... Recorded eight interceptions in 2000 (third-best in UM history).

► Bryant McKinnie (2000-2001)

Outland Trophy winner as college football's outstanding interior lineman in 2001... Named a First-Team All-American by *The Football News* in 2000 and a consensus first-team All-American by every national service in 2001, including the Associated Press, Football Writers Association, *The Football News*, *The Sporting News* and the Walter Camp and the National Football Foundations... The 2001 National Player of the Year by CNNI.com... The 2001 College Football Offensive Player of the Year by The Football News... Did not allow a quarterback sack during his entire UM career.

► Ray Bellamy (1967-1970)

Miami's first African-American football player... Endured hardships and led the way for future African-American athletes... In 1968, had 37 receptions for 549 yards and two touchdowns... Had eight receptions for 121 yards vs. Auburn in 1968... In 1969, caught 45 passes for 712 yards... Near-fatal auto accident limited his career... Was voted Miami's first African-American student body president in 1971.

► Rich Mercier (1995-1999)

First-Team All-America selection by *The Sporting News* in 1999... Two-time All-BIG EAST First Team selection (1998-99)... Team leader in pancake blocks in both his junior and senior seasons... Tied Mike Sullivan for the UM record in career starts (48)... Invited to play in the Senior Bowl, Hula Bowl, East-West Shrine Game and Florida Citrus All Star Gridiron Classic.

Harris AND HORN EARN ACC WEEKLY HONORS

► Jacory Harris became the first Hurricane in 2011-12 to win ACC Offensive Back of the Week (Nov. 7) for his standout showing in a 49-14 win against the Duke Blue Devils. Harris, who completed 14-of-20 passes for 202 yards and three touchdowns, posted his fifth 200-yard game of the season versus Duke. Harris became only the second quarterback in program history to throw for over 8,000 career yards (Ken Dorsey).

► Center Tyler Horn, the anchor of an offensive line that allowed no sacks against Duke, was awarded Co-Offensive Lineman of the Week (Nov. 7) honors for his efforts. Horn also helped pave the way for 265 yards on the ground, including four rushing touchdowns, against a stout Blue Devils rushing defense. Horn and the rest of the offensive line have allowed only 12 sacks through the Hurricanes' first nine games.

Canes EARN WEEKLY RECOGNITION AWARD

► Jacory Harris and Lamar Miller were named the latest Canes to earn accolades from the College Football Performance Awards. The duo earned Honorable Mention Players of the Week for their performances against Duke.

► Harris, who finished the game 14-for-20 for 202 yards and three touchdowns, was named Honorable Mention Quarterback of the Week.

► Miller, who paced a 265-yard ground attack by the Hurricanes with 147 of his own, was named Honorable Mention Running Back of the Week.
