• Carolina enters the 2017 ACC Tournament with a 26-6 overall record, 14-4 and first place in the ACC.

• The Tar Heels won the ACC regular-season championship for the 31st time (ACC record) and the 21st time outright (ACC record). Florida State, Notre Dame and Louisville tied for second place at 12-6, two games behind the Tar Heels.

• Carolina has won the ACC regular season championship in 1956, 1957, 1959, 1960, 1961, 1967, 1968, 1969, 1971, 1972, 1976, 1977, 1978, 1979, 1982, 1983, 1984, 1985, 1987, 1988, 1993, 1995, 2001, 2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2016 and 2017.

• Carolina has won 49 combined ACC regular-season and Tournament championships (31 regular-season and 18 Tournament). Duke is second with 38 (19 and 19).

• This is the 10th time the Tar Heels have won 14 regular-season ACC games and the sixth time they have accomplished that under head coach Roy Williams. UNC went 14-0 in 1957, 14-0 in 1984, 14-0 in 1987, 14-2 in 1993, 14-2 in 2005, 14-2 in 2008, 14-2 in 2011, 14-2 in 2012, 14-4 in 2016 and 14-4 in 2017.

• Carolina earned a double-bye and will play its first game in the quarterfinal on Thursday, March 9, at Noon against the winner of the second-round game between No. 8 seed Syracuse and No. 9 seed Miami.

• This is the 26th time the Tar Heels are the No. 1 seed in the ACC Tournament. Duke and NC State are second and third, respectively, with 17 and six No. 1 seeds in ACC history.

• This is the eighth time Roy Williams' teams are the No. 1 seed in the ACC Tournament (2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2016 and 2017).

• Roy Williams led UNC to the ACC regular-season championship for the eighth time in 14 seasons. No other coach or school has won more than three titles in that time.

• Williams has led Kansas and North Carolina to 17 first-place finishes in conference play in 29 seasons as a head coach.

• Carolina has 10 wins over teams currently ranked in the NCAA's top 50 (RPI). UNC's top-50 wins have come against Oklahoma State, Wisconsin, Monmouth, Wake Forest, Florida State, Virginia Tech, Notre Dame, Virginia, Louisville and Duke.

• UNC is 10-4 against the top 50. Villanova (10-2), Florida State (10-3) and Duke (10-6) also have 10 top-50 wins.

25-PLUS WINS

• Carolina has 26 wins. This is the 37th time in school history, including 10 times in Roy Williams' 14 seasons, the Tar Heels have won 25 or more games. Williams won 25 or more games 12 times in 15 seasons at Kansas, giving him 22 25-win seasons in 29 years as a college head coach.

20-PLUS WINS

• Carolina has won 20 or more games for the 59th time in school history and the 13th time in 14 years under head coach Roy Williams.

• Carolina has won 10 or more regular-season ACC games for the 41st time – Duke is second with 35 10-win seasons.

INJURY UPDATE

• Sophomore guard Kenny Williams is out for the rest of the season after having surgery on 2/21 to repair his right knee. As a result, the Tar Heels will finish the season having started only four games (NC State, Wake Forest, Boston College and Virginia Tech) and finished two with their full roster (NC State and Boston College); Tony Bradley was injured in the first half at Wake Forest and Theo Pinson was injured in the first half vs. Virginia Tech).

• Kenny Williams is the sixth Tar Heel who has averaged double-figure minutes played who missed games this year due to injury: Theo Pinson missed 19 games, Luke Maye missed five, Joel Berry II sat out two, Tony Bradley missed two, Isaiah Hicks did not play at Duke, and Williams is out for the year beginning with the game at NC State on 2/15.

ACC WINS BY TAR HEELS

• Seniors Nate Britt and Isaiah Hicks are tied for third in UNC history in ACC regular season and Tournament wins with 57.

• Britt and Hicks have played in 142 games as Tar Heels. The Duke game was their 72nd regular-season ACC game; they have been part of 51 regular-season ACC wins. They have also played in eight ACC Tournament games, including six victories.

• Danny Green and Tyler Hansbrough hold the UNC record with 58 ACC wins from 2005-09 (50 regular season wins and eight in the ACC Tournament).

• Green and Hansbrough played when the regular season was a 16-game league schedule.

As of 1/18/17, the University of North Carolina received a record number of first-year applications for the 12th consecutive year. UNC has received 40,792 applications, an increase of 13.7 percent over last year and the second-largest increase in the last 25 years.

The Carolina-Duke games on Feb. 9 and March 4 were the two highest-streamed college basketball games ever.

The first game in Durham was ESPN's highest-rated weeknight broadcast of the year, and the rematch in Chapel Hill last Saturday was the network's most watched college basketball game of the year. In fact, more than 4.1 million viewers watched the Tar Heel victory, more than any regular-season college basketball game in the last two seasons.

The TV ratings for Carolina's 90-83 win were up 24% from the second matchup in 2016.

TAR HEELS AS NO. 1 SEED

• The Tar Heels have earned the No. 1 seed 26 times. Duke is second with 17 No. 1 seeds; NC State is third with six.

• Carolina is 50-14 as the No. 1 seed, including 15-0 vs. No. 8 seeds and 5-0 vs. No. 9 seeds.

• This is the eighth time Roy Williams' teams are the No. 1 seed in the ACC Tournament (2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2016 and 2017).

• The Tar Heels are 15-4 as No. 1 seeds under Roy Williams, winning the title in 2007, 2008 and 2016. UNC lost in the 2009 semifinals without ACC Player of the Year Ty Lawson (injured toe) and the 2012 championship game without ACC Defensive Player of the Year and first-team All-ACC forward John Henson (injured wrist).

2016 ACC TOURNAMENT CHAMPIONS

• Carolina won its 18th ACC Tournament title with a 61-57 win over second-seed Virginia in Washington, D.C. The Tar Heels reached the finals with an 88-71 win over Pitt in the quarterfinals and a 78-47 win over Notre Dame in the semifinals.

• The 31-point win over the Irish was the largest margin of victory in a semifinal in ACC history.

• In the championship game, Joel Berry II scored 19 points, Justin Jackson had a key steal and layup and Carolina shot 51.1 percent from the floor. The Tar Heels did not turn the ball over in the final 17:52.

• Carolina held its three ACC Tournament opponents to a combined 175 points (58.3 per game) and a combined 62 for 167 from the floor (.371). Pitt, Notre Dame and Virginia combined for 29 assists and 39 turnovers. UNC held the opponents under 45 percent in five of the six halves and under 40 percent in three of the last four halves.

• The 175 points allowed were the fewest in the eight ACC Tournament championships won by Carolina since the shot clock was adopted. The previous low point total for three games was 1998, when UNC allowed 187 against NC State (46), Maryland (73) and Duke (68).

JOEL BERRY, ACC TOURNAMENT MVP

• Point guard Joel Berry II became the 18th Tar Heel to win Most Valuable Player honors (a total of 19 times) in the ACC Tournament. He was the first Tar Heel to win the award as a sophomore.

• Senior guard Marcus Paige and senior forward Brice Johnson both earned first-team All-ACC Tournament honors for the second straight year. Paige also was a second-team All-Tournament selection in 2013.

• Berry had a game-high 19 points in the championship vs. Virginia. He was 5 for 8 from the floor, including 3 for 3 from three-point range, and 6 for 6 from the free throw line.

• For the three games, Berry had 51 points (17.0 per game), eight assists and three turnovers. He had 20 points against Pitt, 12 vs. Notre Dame and 19 vs. Virginia.

• Berry was 17 for 24 from the floor (.708), 7 for 10 on three-pointers (.700) and made 10 for 10 free throws in the three games.

- Justin Jackson has received first-team All-America honors from the Sporting News and second-team All-America honors from USA Today.
- Jackson is the 37th Tar Heel to earn first-team All-America honors a total of 62 times.
- The Sporting News' All-America first team includes Justin Jackson, UCLA's Lonzo Ball, Villanova's Josh Hart, Kansas's Frank Mason III and Purdue's Caleb Swanigan.
- Brice Johnson was a consensus first-team All-America in 2016. He was the 17th Tar Heel to earn consensus first-team All-America honors. Carolina players have won consensus first-team honors 26 times.
- This is the first time two different Tar Heels have earned first-team All-America honors in consecutive seasons since Tyler Hansbrough in 2008 and 2009 and Ty Lawson in 2009.
- Jackson is one of 10 semifinalists for the Naismith Trophy, which the Atlanta Tipoff Club presents to the National Player of the Year.
- The Naismith Trophy will be awarded at the Final Four on April 2 in Scottsdale, Ariz.
- Jackson is also one of 15 players on the final ballot for the John R. Wooden National Player of the Year Award.

COUSY AWARD FINALIST

- Joel Berry II is one of five finalists for the Bob Cousy Award, which the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame presents to the nation's best point guard.

- Other finalists include Lonzo Ball (UCLA), Jalen Brunson (Villanova), Frank Mason (Kansas) and Nigel Williams-Goss (Gonzaga).
- Carolina is the only school to have three winners of the Cousy Award – Raymond Felton in 2005, Ty Lawson in 2009 and Kendall Marshall in 2012.
- The finalists for the Julius Erving Award for the best small forward will be announced on Wednesday, March 8. Justin Jackson is currently on the list for that award.

ALL-ACC HONORS

- Justin Jackson earned first-team All-ACC honors and Joel Berry II was second-team.
- Jackson is Carolina's 75th first-team selection, the most in ACC history. Duke is second with 68.
- Jackson and Berry are the 142nd and 143rd Tar Heels to earn All-ACC honors. Duke is second with 142.

ACADEMIC ALL-ACC

- Sophomore Luke Maye earned Academic All-ACC honors for the second consecutive year.
- Maye is a business administration major.
- Maye's father, Mark, also was a two-time Academic All-ACC selection as a Tar Heel quarterback in the 1980s.

USBWA DISTRICT AWARDS

- Justin Jackson and Joel Berry II are two of the 10 players selected by the USBWA to the All-District III team.
- Jackson in the District III Player of the Year.
- Roy Williams is the District III Coach of the Year.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

- Joel Berry II and Justin Jackson have combined to win ACC Player-of-the-Week honors six times this season.
- Berry won four times for his play against Tulane/Chattanooga, the Maui Invitational, Clemson/NC State and Wake Forest/FSU.
- Jackson won following his 34-point performance against Kentucky and last week after averaging 22 points against Louisville and Pitt.
- Berry won National Player-of-the-Week honors twice in conference play, once for Clemson/NC State and sharing the award with Jackson for their play in January against Wake Forest and Florida State.

UNBEATEN AT HOME

- Carolina won all 15 games in the Smith Center this year and all 16 home games (including the win over Notre Dame in Greensboro). UNC also went 15-0 at the Smith Center in 2005 and 2011. This ties the most wins without a loss in a season at the Smith Center. UNC also was undefeated at the Smith Center in 1987 (13-0) and 1993 (12-0).
- This is the third time UNC has gone undefeated at home under head coach Roy Williams (also 15-0 in 2005 and 2011). His teams at Kansas had six perfect home records (1991, '95, '96, '97, '98 and '02).
- This is the 15th time since ACC play began

in 1954 the Tar Heels posted an undefeated record at home (1956, 1957, 1959, 1971, 1969, 1971, 1972, 1978, 1979, 1984, 1987, 1993, 2005, 2011 and 2017).

- The win over Duke on March 4 was Carolina's 200th against ACC teams in the Dean E. Smith Center. UNC is 200-53 in the Smith Center against ACC teams and 193-15 against non-ACC teams.
- Roy Williams is 105-4 in the Smith Center against non-ACC competition.
- The Tar Heels are 392-68 overall in the Smith Center.

ACC ROAD WINS

- Carolina went 5-4 on the road in ACC play this year. The Tar Heels posted a winning record in ACC road games for the 11th time in Williams' 14 years at UNC and the 40th time overall in 64 seasons.
- Williams has led UNC to a 75-42 record in ACC road games. That winning percentage of .641 is the second highest in ACC history behind Duke's Vic Bubas (.667).
- The win at Pitt on 2/25 was Williams' 75th ACC road win, which ties him with Gary Williams for the third most in ACC history behind Mike Krzyzewski (171) and Dean Smith (133).

• Carolina is 1-0 in the Barclays Center. The Tar Heels defeated UCLA, 89-76, on 12/19/15 in the CBS Sports Classic.

• Brice Johnson scored a game-high 27 points.
• Current Tar Heels Joel Berry II had 17 points, five rebounds, four assists and two steals; Isaiah Hicks scored 12 points; Justin Jackson had nine points and five assists; Kennedy Meeks was injured and did not play.

POSSIBLE OPPONENT:

UNC-SYRACUSE SERIES

- Carolina leads the series against Syracuse, 9-4 with wins in each of the last five games between the two schools.
- Carolina defeated the Orange, 85-68, in Chapel Hill on 1/16/17.
- The Tar Heels won all three games last year, including the national semifinals in Houston.
- The Tar Heels are 5-1 against the Orange since Syracuse joined the ACC prior to the 2013-14 season.
- Roy Williams is 5-2 against Syracuse as UNC's head coach. That includes a 5-1 record since SU joined the ACC and an 87-71 Syracuse win on 11/20/2009 in Madison Square Garden in New York in the Coaches vs. Cancer championship game.
- The two schools have played each other 13 previous times in nine different cities.
- Jim Boeheim has been the Syracuse coach in 11 of the previous 13 games in the series.
- The Tar Heels scored 45 points at the Carrier Dome in 2014 in the first ACC game between the schools, at the time the fewest in any game in Roy Williams' tenure as UNC's head coach. In the next five games, the Tar Heels have averaged 84 points and won those four games by an average margin of 12 points.

JANUARY 16, 2017 IN CHAPEL HILL

UNC 85, SYRACUSE 68

- Justin Jackson (19/10) and Kennedy Meeks (15/12) had double-doubles and Isaiah Hicks led with 20 points in an 85-68 win over Syracuse on 1/16.
- The win was the 800th in Roy Williams' career. He became the ninth coach to win 800 games as a Division I head coach.
- Carolina shot 56.7 percent from the floor in the second half, its highest percentage in any half since shooting 61.8 percent in the second half against Northern Iowa on 12/21.
- Syracuse made 11 of its first 14 shots from the floor in the second half (.786), then made 4 of its next 19 to finish the game.
- Carolina had 44 rebounds and out-rebounded the Orange by 20.
- The Tar Heels scored 20 second-chance points and 26 points off turnovers.
- Hicks led UNC with 20 points and added eight rebounds in a career-high tying 30 minutes.
- Hicks tied his career highs with eight made field goals and 13 field goal attempts (also was 8 for 13 against Chaminade).
- Meeks had six offensive rebounds and converted five into field goals.
- Theo Pinson led UNC with five assists in 14 minutes.

POSSIBLE OPPONENT:

UNC-MIAMI SERIES

- Carolina leads the series against Miami, 20-7, including a 13-6 record since the Hurricanes joined the ACC prior to the 2004-05 season.
- The Canes have won five of the last seven games between the two schools over the last six seasons.
- Roy Williams is 16-7 against Miami. He was 2-1 as the head coach at Kansas and is 14-6 as Carolina's head coach.

JANUARY 28TH AT MIAMI

MIAMI 77, UNC 62

- Carolina shot 20.7 percent and scored just 22 points in the first half en route to a 77-62 loss at Miami on 1/28.
- The Tar Heels made 6 of 29 shots from the floor in the opening half, the second-worst shooting half in Roy Williams' 14 years as UNC's head coach. UNC shot 20.0 percent in the second half in a 78-58 loss at Georgia Tech on 1/16/11.
- Carolina made a season-low 21 field goals, scored a season-low 62 points and was out-rebounded for just the second time this year.
- Miami out-rebounded UNC, 41-36. Kentucky out-rebounded UNC by four.
- The Tar Heels scored 22 points on 42 possessions in the first half, a season-low points per possession of .52. UNC fared better in the second half, scoring 40 points on 41 possessions (.98).
- Bruce Brown led the Canes with 30 points, making four three-pointers and 10 of 13 from the free throw line.
- UNC's 62 points snapped an unprecedented

streak of seven straight ACC games with 85 or more points.

- The Tar Heels came into the game shooting 40 percent or better from three-point range in six of their previous seven games, but made 7 of 24 (.292).
- Justin Jackson led UNC with 21 points, but that was five more points than the rest of the starting five combined to score.
- Joel Berry II opened the scoring with a pair of free throws (UNC led 11-2), but was 0 for 8 from the floor. Kenny Williams was 1 for 8, Kennedy Meeks attempted a season-low three shots and had a season-low five points, and Isaiah Hicks was 3 for 6 from the floor.
- Carolina's bench was 0 for 10 from the floor in the opening half, but 9 for 9 in the second half.
- Nate Britt scored eight of his 10 points in the second half and Tony Bradley was 3 for 3 from the floor in the second after going 0 for 4 in the first.

LAST GAME:

UNC 90, DUKE 83 IN CHAPEL HILL

- Joel Berry II scored 28 points, Isaiah Hicks had 21 points and nine rebounds on Senior Night and Justin Jackson hit the go-ahead three-pointer in Carolina's 90-83 win over Duke.
- The win was Carolina's 14th ACC win of the season and was the 15th win in as many games in the Smith Center this season.
- Carolina shot 50.7 percent from the floor. UNC is 10-2 this year when it shoots 50 percent from the floor. It was the sixth time this year UNC shot 50 percent from the floor in both halves (Chaminade, Oklahoma State, Kentucky, Wake Forest, NC State and Duke).
- Duke made 28 free throws, which ties a season-high by an opponent this year (28 by Georgia Tech). The 35 free throw attempts are the most against UNC this year (previous 33 by Georgia Tech).
- This was the 15th time this year UNC scored 90 or more points, most since 2009 (16 times)
- Berry led UNC with 28 points, his second-highest scoring total this year and as a Tar Heel (31 at Clemson).
- Berry tied the UNC single-game record by making all five of his three-point field goals. It is the fifth time a Tar Heel has made at least 5 for 5 in a game – Jason Capel (6 for 6 vs. Clemson, 2001), Marcus Paige (5 for 5 at NC State, 2014), Hubert Davis (5 for 5 vs. Eastern Michigan, 1991), Davis (5 for 5 at Alabama, 1989) and Berry (5 for 5 vs. Duke, 2017).
- It was the ninth time this year Berry led UNC in scoring and it was his eighth 20-point game this year.
- Berry made all five of his threes in the first half. It was the second time this year he made five threes in a half – he made five threes in the second half at Clemson.
- It was the fourth time this year (all in ACC play) Berry made five threes in a game (7 at Clemson, 5 vs. Virginia Tech, 5 vs. Pitt and 5 vs. Duke).

- Jackson broke a 71-all tie with 5:56 to play with his only three-pointer of the game. He assisted on UNC's next two field goals by Hicks and Kennedy Meeks that gave UNC a six-point lead. Jackson finished with 15 points and four assists.
- Hicks had 21 points and tied his season high with nine rebounds. He scored a total of 20 points in his previous four games.
- Hicks was 7 for 9 from the floor – he made four field goals in UNC's previous three games.
- It was Hicks' fourth 20-point game of the season and the sixth of his career.
- Hicks scored his 1,000th career point. He is the 76th Tar Heel to score 1,000 points and the fourth on this year's team to reach 1,000 (Jackson, Berry and Kennedy Meeks). This is the fourth season UNC has had four 1,000-point scorers (2001, 2005, 2009 and 2017).
- Tony Bradley and Luke Maye combined for 16 points and seven rebounds in a combined 33 minutes off the bench. They each scored eight points.
- Theo Pinson had a game-high seven assists (Duke had eight). It was the sixth time in 13 games this year Pinson has led UNC in assists.

- Carolina is averaging 85.2 points per game, first in the ACC and 11th in the nation. The Tar Heels lead the ACC in scoring margin and are seventh nationally at 14.7 points per game.
- UNC is on pace for the fifth-highest scoring average in Roy Williams' 14 years as Carolina's head coach (behind 89.8 in 2009, 88.6 in 2008, 88.0 in 2005 and 85.7 in 2007).

- The last time Carolina scored 90 or more points more times in a season was 2008-09 when the national champions did it 16 times.
- The Tar Heels have hit the century mark five times this year. That's the most 100-point games in one season since 2008-09, when the national champions hit 100 nine times.

OFFENSIVE EFFICIENCY (as of 3/6)

- Carolina is fourth nationally in offensive efficiency (121.8) behind only Oklahoma State, UCLA and Villanova (KenPom's points per 100 possessions).
- UNC is the leader of five ACC schools that rank among the top 20 nationally in offensive

efficiency – UNC (4th), Wake Forest (9th), Duke (10th) and Notre Dame (16th).

• Carolina's offensive efficiency rating of 121.8 is its fourth-highest since KenPom began charting points per possessions in 2001-02.

- Carolina's opponents have the ninth-highest average points per possession of any team in the nation (in all of their games, not just against Carolina).
- Carolina has played 16 games this year in which it had a points per possession of 1.0 or better with a season high of 1.14 vs. Kentucky and 1.13 vs. Oklahoma State.
- Carolina's points per possession in its 25 wins is .99; the opponents' points per possession in UNC's six losses is .98.
- Carolina's defensive efficiency is 23rd in the country at 94.0 points per 100 possessions, fifth-best in the ACC behind Virginia (1st), Louisville (6th), Georgia Tech (8th), and Miami (19th). UNC had fallen to from the top 10 to 44th in defensive efficiency following the NC State game on 2/15.

85- AND 90-POINT STREAKS

- In January UNC won seven consecutive ACC games against Clemson, NC State, Wake Forest, Florida State, Syracuse, Boston College and Virginia Tech and scored 85 or more points in all seven games, the first time in school history the Tar Heels have scored 85 or more points in seven straight ACC games.
- It was the fourth-longest streak in ACC history in which a team scored 85 or more points in seven straight ACC games (regular season and Tournament included) and the third-longest such streak in one season.
- Carolina's 107 points vs. NC State, 93 at Wake Forest and 96 vs. Florida State marked the first time UNC scored 90 or more points in three consecutive ACC games since 1992 and the first time UNC scored 93 or more points in three straight ACC games since the 1986-87 season (only happened 12 times in ACC history).

SCORING LEADERS

- Small forward Justin Jackson (18.3 ppg) and point guard Joel Berry II (15.1) are Carolina's leading two scorers. The last time UNC's top two scorers were perimeter players was 1990-91, when small forward Rick Fox (16.9) and shooting guard Hubert Davis (13.3) were UNC's top two scorers.

Those 14 players entered the 2016-17 season with NBA career earnings of \$441 million.

This year, Brice Johnson became the 79th former Tar Heel to play in the NBA.

17 Tar Heels have won 32 total NBA championships as players. Michael Jordan won six; Rick Fox, Mitch Kupchak, Scott Williams and James Worthy won three apiece. Jordan was NBA Finals MVP six times and Worthy won in 1988. Kupchak won seven rings with the Lakers as General Manager and Assistant GM.

Jordan won the NBA's MVP award five times and Bob McAdoo won it once. Five Tar Heels have won NBA Rookie of the Year honors. 13 Tar Heels have made NBA All-Star teams. Seven Tar Heels have had their jersey retired by NBA teams.

figures in all games and in the 26 wins, but in the six losses only Justin Jackson (20.0) and Joel Berry II (11.3) are averaging double figures. The Tar Heels have scored 68.3 points in their six losses (16.4 below season average).

- Three different perimeter players have led UNC in scoring in 28 of the 32 games (Justin Jackson has been the top scorer 17 times, Joel Berry II nine and Kenny Williams twice.)
- Forward Isaiah Hicks led UNC in scoring three times (Hawai'i, Chaminade and Syracuse) and forward Kennedy Meeks topped the Tar Heels with 18 points vs. Northern Iowa.
- Justin Jackson leads the team with 28 double-figure scoring games.

JACKSON TOP SCORER

- Justin Jackson has scored 20 or more points 16 times, including 26 or more five times. The last player with more 20-point games in one season was Tyler Hansbrough, who had 21 in 2009.
- Jackson became the first Tar Heel to score 20 in four straight games since Tyler Zeller in the 2011 NCAA Tournament. Jackson's streak of 22 vs. BC, 26 vs. Virginia Tech, 21 vs. Miami and 20 vs. Pitt ended with 16 against Notre Dame.
- Justin Jackson has scored 29.1 percent of Carolina's points in its six losses and 20.1 percent in UNC's 25 victories.

• Four Tar Heels have scored their 1,000th career point this year – Kennedy Meeks, Justin Jackson, Joel Berry II and Isaiah Hicks became the 73rd, 74th, 75th and 76th Tar Heels to score 1,000 points. Carolina has more 1,000-point scorers than any other school in the nation.

- Hicks needed one point in the March 4 game against Duke to join the 1,000-point club (he scored 19).
- This is the fourth time in UNC history the Tar Heels have four 1,000-point scorers on the same team. The previous years include 2001 (Jason Capel, Joseph Forte, Brendan Haywood and Kris Lang); 2005 (Raymond Felton, Sean May, Rashad McCants and Jawad Williams); and 2009 (Wayne Ellington, Danny Green, Tyler Hansbrough and Ty Lawson).

43 POINTS AT VIRGINIA

- Carolina scored 43 points at Virginia on 2/27, its fewest under Roy Williams, its fewest against Virginia since 1945 and its fewest in any game since a 47-40 loss at Duke on 2/24/1979. Virginia came into that game No. 1 in the country in points allowed.
- It was the 10th time in the last 37 years the Tar Heels scored in the 40s (UNC is 4-6 in those 10 games).
- UNC's 43 points in Charlottesville are the Tar Heels' fewest against Virginia since 1945; remarkably, that came nine days after the Cavaliers scored 41 points in Chapel Hill, UVA's lowest output against the Tar Heels since 1947.
- Carolina has averaged 90 possessions per game in its 30 games this year other than the two games against Virginia. In those two games, UNC averaged 67 possessions.

REBOUND LEADERS

- Carolina leads the nation in rebound margin (13.0 per game), rebounds per game (43.8) and offensive rebounds (15.8 per game).
- Carolina is 26-2 when it out-rebounds the opponents (losses at Georgia Tech and at Virginia).
- Carolina is 0-3 when it is out-rebounded (losses vs. Kentucky, at Miami and at Duke).
- Carolina has a plus-16.5 rebound margin in its 26 wins and has the same number of rebounds as the opponents in its six losses. UNC's rebounding margin in ACC games was 12.1 per game.

RECORD-SETTING REBOUND MARGIN

- Carolina's rebound margin of 13.0 per game not only leads the nation but is the highest in school history.
- Carolina has led the nation in rebound margin two other times under Roy Williams (2008 and 2012). Since Williams became the UNC head coach in 2003, Michigan State is the only school to lead the country in rebound margin three times. UNC, Connecticut and Quinnipiac have led the nation twice in that span.
- Carolina's rebound margin of 13.0 is the

second-highest for any school in the country since 1980. Michigan State's margin in 2001 was 15.4, the largest since 1980.

- Carolina has 506 offensive rebounds, while the opponents have 691 defensive rebounds. The Tar Heels are getting 42.3 percent of their own missed shots. On the defensive end, UNC grabs 75.3 percent of the missed shots.
- Carolina has shot a higher field goal percentage than its opponents in 19 of 32 games but has more offensive rebounds in 27 games and has scored more second-chance points 27 times.

- The Tar Heels have scored 20 or more second-chance points 15 times this year: 28 at Hawai'i, 28 at Pitt, 27 at NC State, 26 vs. Chaminade, 25 vs. Tennessee, 25 vs. Florida State, 24 at Boston College, 22 vs. NC State, 21 vs. Chattanooga, 21 vs. Oklahoma State, 20 vs. Monmouth, Clemson, Syracuse, Virginia Tech and Pitt.

- Carolina made 8.4 three-pointers per game in its 14 ACC wins (the opponents made 8.6 per game in those 14 games). In UNC's four ACC losses, the opponents made 3.5 more threes per game.

HOME STRETCH, RANKED FOES

- The March 4 Duke game was the final game of an eight-game stretch in which six of the eight opponents (including Notre Dame, Duke, Virginia, Louisville, Virginia and Duke) were ranked in the AP poll. This was the first time UNC ever played an eight-game stretch against ACC opponents (regular-season and ACC Tournament) in which it faced six ranked teams.

ASSIST LEADERS

- Carolina leads the ACC and is fourth in the nation in assists (18.0 per game) behind UCLA, Purdue and Lipscomb.
- Carolina has 575 assists and 384 turnovers, (plus 191) while the opponents have 375 assists and 438 turnovers (minus 63). UNC is second in the ACC behind Notre Dame (and ninth nationally) in assist-turnover ratio.

2017 ACC LEGENDS ANNOUNCED ANTAWN JAMISON TO REPRESENT UNC

- National Player of the Year (1998) Antawn Jamison will represent the Tar Heels at the ACC Tournament in Brooklyn in the 2017 ACC Legends class.
- Jamison was the unanimous National Player of the Year in 1998, when he became the second Tar Heel and third player in ACC history to be named ACC Player of the Year, ACC Tournament MVP, NCAA Regional MVP and National Player of the Year in the same season.
- Jamison averaged 22.2 points and 10.5 rebounds in 1998, the first double-double by a Tar Heel since Mitch Kupchak in 1976. He is sixth at UNC in career rebounds with 1,027 and eighth in scoring with 1,974 points.
- He was the first player in ACC history to earn first-team All-ACC honors as a freshman, sophomore and junior. He led UNC to ACC Tournament titles and Final Fours in 1997 and 1998 and was voted the 1998 ACC Male Athlete of the Year.
- He played 16 NBA seasons and was an All-Star in 2005 and 2008. Jamison is one of only 40 players in NBA history to score at least 20,000 career points (20,042).

NBA TAR HEELS

- Fourteen Tar Heels are on NBA rosters.
- Vince Carter is playing in his 19th NBA season, which sets a record for most seasons played by a former Tar Heel in the NBA.
- Carter plays for the Memphis Grizzlies. Earlier this year he became the 24th player to score 24,000 career points in the NBA.
- Carter passed Allen Iverson on 2/15 to move into 23rd place in NBA career scoring.
- Carter is the fourth-leading scorer among active NBA players behind only Dirk Nowitzki, LeBron James and Paul Pierce.
- Pierce played for head coach Roy Williams at Kansas and was selected in the 1998 NBA Draft with Carter and Antawn Jamison.
- Every non-active player in the top 35 in NBA career scoring is a member of the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame (exceptions Kobe Bryant and Tim Duncan, who retired this year and are not eligible yet for the Hall of Fame).
- Tyler Hansbrough (Fort Wayne Mad Ants), Marcus Paige (Salt Lake City Stars, Utah Jazz), P.J. Hairston and J.P. Tokoto (both with the Rio Grande Valley Vipers, Houston Rockets) are playing in the NBDL.

- Carolina has signed four players to National Letters of Intent: Jalek Felton, a 6-4 guard from West Columbia, S.C.; Brandon Huffman, a 6-9 forward from Anchorage, Alaska; Sterling Manley, a 6-10 forward from Reynoldsburg, Ohio; and Andrew Platek, a 6-4 guard from Schenectady, N.Y.
- Felton attends Gray Collegiate Academy in West Columbia, S.C. He attended Mullins High School for three years.
- Huffman moved from Alaska to Raleigh where he attends Word of God Christian Academy.
- Manley attends Pickerington (Ohio) Central High School.
- Platek attends Northfield (Mass.) Mount Hermon School.

North Carolina 95, at Tulane 75

- Justin Jackson and Joel Berry II had career scoring highs -- Jackson with 27 and Berry with 23.
- It was the first time Berry and Jackson scored 20 in the same game as Tar Heels.
- Kennedy Meeks had a career-high 15 rebounds.

North Carolina 97, Chattanooga 57

- Carolina had 26 assists on 34 field goals.
- Carolina scored 33 points off 26 UTC turnovers (Tar Heels had 14 steals). That's more points off turnovers since UNC scored 33 against Chaminade on 11/21/12.
- Meeks had 14 points and a game-high 12 rebounds, Berry had 18 points, five assists and Kenny Williams scored a career-high 11 points and also had career highs in rebounds (6), assists (5) and steals (3).

North Carolina 93, Long Beach State 67

- It marked the first time UNC opened a season with three straight 90-point games since 1994-95.
- Berry tied his career high with 23 points.
- Jackson posted his third career double-double with 14 points and 10 rebounds.

North Carolina 83, at Hawai'i 68

- Carolina shot 63.3 percent from the floor in the second half, its highest percentage in any half this year. That followed a first half in which UNC shot a season-low for any half at 35.1 percent.
- Tony Bradley grabbed a season-high 13 rebounds, most by a UNC freshman since Meeks had 13 against Iowa State in the 2014 NCAA Tournament.
- Isaiah Hicks led UNC with 16 points and Nate Britt scored a season-high 13 points on 3 of 5 shooting from three-point range.

MAUI CLASSIC

North Carolina 104, Chaminade 61

- Carolina shot a season-high 57.8 percent from the floor and had a season-high rebound margin of plus 29 (52-23).
- It was the first time in four seasons that Hicks (22) and Meeks (20) each scored 20 points in a game.
- Hicks set a career scoring high with 22.

North Carolina 107, Oklahoma State 75

- Carolina shot 56.3 percent from the floor in the first half and 59.4 percent in the second half. Carolina also shot season-high percentages from three-point range (8 of 17, .471) and the free throw line (25 of 29, .862).
- Carolina held Oklahoma State to 75 points, 29.8 under the Cowboys' season average coming into the game.
- Berry set his career high with 24 points. Jackson had 22 points, eight rebounds, six assists and no turnovers.
- Carolina became just the third team in Maui Invitational history to score 100 points in consecutive games (Oklahoma in 1992-93 and Loyola Marymount in 1990-91).

North Carolina 71, Wisconsin 56

- Carolina won its fourth Maui Invitational title. The Tar Heels have won more games in the Maui Invitational than any school in the nation (18) and are second in titles with four. UNC has won the Maui Invitational in 1999-2000, 2004-05, 2008-09 and 2016-17.
- Carolina held Wisconsin to 56 points, the fewest ever in the championship game of the Maui Invitational.
- Joel Berry II scored 22 points vs. the Badgers and earned Maui Invitational MVP honors.
- Berry became the fourth Tar Heel and third UNC point guard in a row to win MVP honors. Berry averaged 18.0 points, 3.7 assists and 2.3 steals. He shot 19 of 30 from the floor (.633), 8 of 14 3FGs (.571) and 8 for 8 FTs (1.000).
- Meeks had a career-high 16 rebounds vs. Wisconsin and earned All-Tournament honors.

- Carolina became the first team to win 18 games in Maui in the Maui Invitational (plus one win in a mainland game).
- Roy Williams has won more games than any coach in Maui Invitational history (16 in Maui plus one on the mainland) and is the second coach to win at least four titles in Maui. Williams won the Maui Invitational at Carolina in 2004-05, 2008-09 and 2016-17 and at Kansas in 1996-97.
- Carolina advanced to the Final Four the other three seasons it won the Maui title and won the NCAA title the previous two times it won in Maui.

at Indiana 76, North Carolina 67

- Carolina shot a season-low 39.3 percent from the floor, scored a season-low 67 points and did not out-rebound an opponent for the first time this year.
- Jackson scored a game-high 21 points.
- The Tar Heels were just 10 for 28 from the floor (.357) and made eight turnovers in the first half when the Hoosiers built a 17-point and ultimately out-scored UNC, 41-29.

North Carolina 95, Radford 50

- The Tar Heels made six of their first 10 3FG attempts.
- The Tar Heels had a 26-5 edge in points off turnovers.
- Williams scored a career-high 19 points (16 in the first half) and set a career high with five three-point field goals.

North Carolina 83, Davidson 74

- Jackson tied his career high with 27 points and set a career high with seven three-point field goals made.
- Luke Maye had career-highs in points (10) and steals (3) and tied his career best with six rebounds. He scored all 10 points and grabbed all six boards in the opening half.
- Carolina shot a season-low 37.7 percent from the floor.
- Berry did not play due to a sprained left ankle.

North Carolina 73, Tennessee 71

- Carolina rallied from a 15-point deficit in the first half (13-28 and 15-30) and an eight-point halftime deficit (36-44). The 15-point comeback was Carolina's largest since 2/17/14 when UNC rallied from a 21-6 deficit at Florida State to win, 81-75. The eight-point halftime deficit was the largest in a UNC win since 3/12/11 when UNC trailed Clemson, 38-28, but won 92-87 in overtime in the ACC Tournament semifinals.
- Tennessee shot 65.4 percent from the floor in the first half. Carolina held the Vols to just 39.3 percent shooting from the floor in the second half.
- Nate Britt made a career-high five steals and tied his career high with seven assists.

Kentucky 103, North Carolina 100 (Las Vegas)

- It was the second time in UNC history and the first time in a regulation-length game UNC lost a game when it scored 100 points. Carolina had won 51 straight games when scoring 100 points.
- It was the 10th game in UNC history in which both teams scored 100 or more points and just the fourth in a 40-minute game.
- Carolina shot 53.0 percent from the floor, only the fourth time in 184 games UNC shot 50 percent from the floor under head coach Roy Williams and lost.
- Jackson scored a career-high 34 points, Berry had 23 points and seven assists and Maye set a career high with 11 points, scoring all 11 in the second half.
- Kentucky's Malik Monk scored 47 points, which ties the second most against UNC in history and is the most since Georgia Tech's Rich Yunkus scored 47 on 2/14/1970.

North Carolina 85, Northern Iowa 42

- The Tar Heels held the Panthers to 42 points, which equaled the fewest allowed by a Roy Williams-coached team at North Carolina.
- Carolina shot 61.8 percent from the floor in the second half, including 6 for 11 from three-point range, and Carolina committed only five turnovers for the game.
- Meeks led UNC with 18 points and eight rebounds. It is the first time this season he led the Tar Heels in scoring.

North Carolina 102, Monmouth 74

- Carolina scored 100-plus points for the fourth time in 14 games this year, grabbed a season-high 57 rebounds and made a season-high 33 free throws.
- The two teams combined for 52 fouls (27 on Monmouth, 25 on UNC) and 72 free throw attempts. It was a season high for fouls both by UNC and by an opponent.
- Jackson led all scorers with 28 points, making six three-pointers in nine attempts.

at Georgia Tech 75, North Carolina 63

- Carolina committed a season-high 20 turnovers, shot a season-low 33.3 percent from the floor scored a season-low 63 points.
- Carolina's points per possession was a season-low .64 for the game (season low .62 in the first half and .67 in the second half, which matched the previous low for a half at Indiana).
- The Tar Heels were 5 for 26 from three-point range. It was the fewest made threes in at least 25 attempts since UNC went 5 for 27 against Wake Forest in 2011.

North Carolina 89, at Clemson 86 (OT)

- Berry had career highs in points (31), field goals (12) and three-point field goals (7), scoring 19 of UNC's 23 points from 14:07 to 6:39 in the second half.
- Williams scored six of UNC's 12 points in overtime.
- Meeks tied his career high with 16 boards and had a career-best 10 offensive rebounds.
- Clemson shot 53.3 from the floor in the first half, but only 15 of 38 (39.4 percent) in second half and extra period.

North Carolina 107, NC State 56

- Carolina scored the most points ever in a UNC-NC State game and won by the largest margin in the series since 1921 in a 107-56 win.
- The game was postponed from Jan. 7 to Jan. 8 due to a snow and ice storm.
- The 51-point win was the largest ever by UNC in an ACC game (against any opponent). Previous was a 103-55 win over Florida State (48 points) on Jan. 24, 1998.
- UNC scored 56 points in the first half and allowed 56 in the game.
- Berry had 19 points, five rebounds, five assists and two steals, Jackson hit six 3FGs and scored a game-high 21 points, and Bradley and Maye combined for 19 points and 16 rebounds.

North Carolina 93, at Wake Forest 87

- It was the first time this season all five Tar Heel starters scored in double figures led by Jackson with 19, and Berry and Meeks with 18 each.
- Meeks posted his sixth double-double this year, attempted a career-high 18 shots from the floor, made a season-high nine field goals and added three steals and three blocks.
- It was the fourth time this year the Tar Heels shot 50 percent from the floor in both halves (and the first time since Kentucky on 12/17).
- Wake Forest had a points per possession of 1.18 in the second half, the highest for any opponent in a half this season.

Carolina 96, Florida State 83

- It was the first time three Tar Heels scored 20 points since 3/18/11 against LIU in Charlotte in the first round of the 2011 NCAA Tournament. Berry (26), Hicks (22) and Jackson (22) accomplished that vs. the Seminoles.
- Carolina out-rebounded the Seminoles, 56-34. This was the eighth time this year the Tar Heels have grabbed 50 or more rebounds. The previous high by an FSU opponent this year was 52 by George Washington.
- The Tar Heels entered the game No. 1 in the nation in rebounding margin and out-rebounded the Seminoles by 22. The previous high for rebounding margin against FSU this year was 10 when George Washington out-rebounded FSU, 52-42.

Carolina 85, Syracuse 68

- Jackson (19/10) and Meeks (15/12) had double-doubles and Hicks led UNC with 20 points.
- The win was the 800th in Roy Williams' career.
- Carolina shot 56.7 percent from the floor in the second half, out-rebounded the Orange by 20, scored 20 second-chance points and 26 points off turnovers.
- Hicks led UNC with 20 points and added eight rebounds in a career-high tying 30 minutes.

UNC 90, at Boston College 82

- Jackson scored 22 points and Meeks had 20 points and nine rebounds to lead Carolina to its fifth straight win at Boston College and the Tar Heels' 10th win in a row over the Eagles.
- Carolina scored 85 or more points in six consecutive ACC games for the first time in its history.
- It was the fifth time in the last six games and 11th time this season UNC scored 20 or more second-chance points (24 at BC).

UNC 91, Virginia Tech 72

- Jackson and Berry combined for 41 points, 10 three-pointers, eight assists and no turnovers. It was the first time since 1996 two Tar Heels made five 3FGs in a game.
- Carolina made 14 of 30 three-pointers, season highs in both categories.
- UNC out-rebounded the Hokies, 43-22, had 19 offensive rebounds to 18 defensive for Virginia Tech and scored 20 second-chance points.
- Meeks scored 15 points and grabbed a game-high 14 rebounds, seven on the offensive glass.

at Miami 77, UNC 62

- The Tar Heels made 6 of 29 shots from the floor in the opening half, the second-worst shooting half in Roy Williams' 14 years as UNC's head coach.
- Carolina made a season-low 21 field goals, scored a season-low 62 points and were out-rebounded (36-41) for just the second time this year.
- The Tar Heels scored 22 points on 42 possessions in the first half, a season-low points per possession of .52. UNC fared better in the second half, scoring 40 points on 41 possessions (.98).
- Jackson led UNC with 21 points, but that was five more points than the other four starters combined to score.

UNC 80, Pitt 78

- Carolina never trailed but held on for a two-point win as Jamel Artis missed a last-second three-pointer.
- Pitt made 13 three-pointers, most against UNC this year, and shot 55.6 percent, highest against the Tar Heels in the first 24 games.
- Jackson led UNC with 20 points, Berry hit five threes, and Hicks had 18 points and eight rebounds.
- Carolina shot 50 percent from the floor and committed only eight turnovers.
- Pitt had a points per possession of 1.35 in the second half and 1.18 for the game, both opponent highs in the first 24 games.

UNC 83, Notre Dame 76 (Greensboro)

- Jackson led six Tar Heels in double figures with 16 points, Carolina out-rebounded Notre Dame by 19 and went on a late 8-0 run to beat the Irish, 83-76.
- The game was postponed a day to 2/5 and was played at the Greensboro Coliseum because of a water shortage in Chapel Hill that closed the University for almost two days.
- UNC led by 15 with 12 minutes to play, but Notre Dame cut the lead to 75-73 before a jump shot by Berry and a steal by Britt/dunk by Jackson ignited the 8-0 run.
- Carolina out-rebounded the Irish, 44-25, including a 17-7 edge in offensive rebounds.
- Tony Bradley had 12 points, five rebounds and three blocks.

at Duke 86, UNC 78

- Grayson Allen and Luke Kennard combined for nine three-pointers and 45 points and freshman Jayson Tatum scored all 19 of his points in the second half in an 86-78 Blue Devil win in Cameron Indoor Stadium.
- Justin Jackson led UNC in scoring for the 10th time in 13 games with 21 points. Joel Berry II was the only other Tar Heel to score in double figures with 15.
- Hicks (12.8 ppg, 5.6 rpg) strained his left hamstring in practice the day before the game and was unable to play. Sophomore Luke Maye started at power forward and scored eight points and had two rebounds in 20 minutes.
- Carolina shot 52.5 percent from the floor and committed only five turnovers. Duke shot 52.6 percent from the floor and made 13 three-pointers, the second time in three games an opponent made a season-high 13 three-pointers (Pitt).

UNC 97, at NC State 73

- The win marked the first time Carolina has beaten NC State twice in one season by 20 or more points since 1993.
- Carolina made a season-high 42 field goals and shot 56.0 percent from the floor, its highest in its first 13 ACC games this year.
- The Tar Heels scored 27 second-chance points and scored a season-high 60 points in the paint.
- Maye scored a career-high 13 points and added seven rebounds, Pinson made his first start of the season and tied his season high

with 12 points on 6 for 8 shooting from the floor and Berry scored a team-high 18 points and had a game-high six assists.

UNC 65, Virginia 41

- Virginia scored 41 points, the second-fewest by an opponent in the Smith Center (460th game), the fewest allowed by the Tar Heels in Roy Williams' 14 seasons as head coach, and the fewest UNC has given up to Virginia since 1/21/1947.
- Carolina out-rebounded the Cavaliers, 44-26 (plus 18).
- Virginia shot 27.8 percent from the floor, the lowest percentage by an opponent since Evansville shot 25.8 percent on 12/6/2011.
- Jackson led Carolina in scoring for the 15th time this year. Jackson had 20 points, 18 in the first half, and six assists.
- Jackson scored with 56 seconds left in the first half to give Carolina a 34-18 lead. That basket gave him 18 points and tied his scoring with Virginia's team scoring.

UNC 74, Louisville 63

- Carolina shot 37.1 percent from the floor – the lowest percentage the Tar Heels have shot in a win this season. The previous low in a victory was 37.7 percent against Davidson on 12/7. The Tar Heels made only three of their first 18 shots, but made eight of the next 12.
- Jackson led Carolina with 21 points. It was the 12th time in the last 16 games he led UNC in scoring.
- Meeks 14 points and 10 rebounds and Pinson tied his career high with 13 points.

UNC 85, at Pitt 67

- Carolina clinched a share of the ACC regular-season title and clinched its 11th winning record in ACC road games under Roy Williams with an 85-67 win on Senior Day at the Petersen Events Center.
- Carolina out-rebounded the Panthers, 48-28, and held Pitt to 39.6 percent from the floor and seven three-pointers (six less than when the teams met in Chapel Hill).
- Carolina pulled down a season-high 24 offensive rebounds and matched its season-high with 28 second-chance points.
- Carolina made 10 three-pointers and shot 41.7 percent from three-point range.
- Jackson led UNC in scoring with 23 points, Meeks had a double-double for the second straight game with 18 points and 10 rebounds, Berry had 19 points and made four threes, Hicks had a career-high six assists and Pinson had a game-high seven assists.

at Virginia 53, UNC 43

- Carolina scored 43 points, its fewest under Roy Williams, its fewest against Virginia since 1945 and its fewest in any game since a 47-40 loss at Duke on 2/24/1979.
- Carolina turned the ball over 12 times in the first half (only twice in the second half). In its previous seven games, UNC turned it over a game-high 12 times against Louisville on 2/22.
- Berry scored 12 points and was UNC's only

player in double figures. It was the first time only one Tar Heel scored in double figures since a loss to Miami on 1/8/14 (James Michael McAdoo had 12).

- Carolina's five starters combined for only 27 points.

UNC 90, Duke 83

- Berry scored 28 points, Hicks had 21 points and nine rebounds on Senior Night and Jackson hit the go-ahead three-pointer in Carolina's 90-83 win over Duke.
- Duke made 28 free throws, which ties a season-high by an opponent this year (28 by Georgia Tech). The 35 free throw attempts are the most against UNC this year (previous 33 by Georgia Tech).
- Berry tied the UNC single-game record by making all five of his three-point field goals. It is the fifth time a Tar Heel has made at least 5 for 5 in a game. Berry made all five of his threes in the first half.
- Jackson broke a 71-all tie with 5:56 to play with his only three-pointer of the game. He assisted on UNC's next two field goals by Hicks and Meeks that gave UNC a six-point lead. Jackson finished with 15 points and four assists.
- Hicks had 21 points and tied his season high with nine rebounds. He scored a total of 20 points in his previous four games.

Oxford, N.C.

2016-17: Shooting 59.7 percent from the floor • Scored in double figures 20 times • Carolina is 19-1 when he scores in double figures and 15-2 when he grabs six or more rebounds • Is fourth on the team in scoring (11.9) and second in rebounding (5.6) • Had 21 points in last game vs. Duke and a combined 20 points in the previous four games.

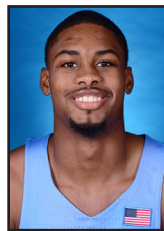

Has played in all 32 games at the '2/3' • Averaging 8.2 minutes per game (4.6 in conference play) • Has 25 assists and 13 turnovers • Scored on a drive to the basket in the first half in the win over Duke • Five points in 12 minutes at Miami, his longest outing in ACC play • Made his first ACC three-pointer and first since Davidson on 12/7 against Virginia Tech • Six points in six minutes vs. NC State • Had two steals at Clemson • Scored six points vs. Northern Iowa • Scored six points, had three rebounds and three steals in 17 minutes against Tennessee • That was more points than he scored in the previous four games combined • Tip-in basket with 50 seconds to play gave Carolina a 72-69 lead and provided the eventual winning points • Kept alive a missed shot that led to an offensive team rebound just moments before his put back basket • Hit a three-pointer, had two steals and was part

Injured his right knee in warmups before practice on 2/14 • Underwent successful surgery on 2/21 and will miss the rest of the season • Started the last 18 games and 22 overall prior to being injured • Third on the team in 3FGs made (27) • Made multiple three-pointers six times • Carolina's defensive player of the game against Indiana, Florida State, Syracuse, Boston College and Virginia Tech • Grabbed multiple offensive rebounds in nine games, including three or more five times • Scored in double figures six times with a high of 19 vs. Radford.

Played in 82 career games (three career starts – in the 2012 NCAA Sweet 16 and Elite Eight and Senior Night on 3/4/17 vs. Duke) with 41 assists and only nine turnovers • Entered the Louisville game at the two-guard in the first half with UNC trailing 14-12 and left with UNC ahead 19-16 – hit a shot and had an assist in a good two-minute stint • Jumper with 13:35 to play tied the Tennessee game at 50 • Played 15 minutes vs. Davidson and 12 minutes against Tennessee, his longest stints since he played 32 minutes vs. Ohio and 28 minutes vs. Kansas in the 2012 NCAA Regional • Career-high six points, all on free throws, and graded as UNC's top defender (second career defensive award) against Davidson • Had five points in the win over Chaminade • Inserted in the first half against the Silverswords and promptly hit a jump shot and assisted on a Justin Jackson basket • Started in place of an injured Kendall Marshall in the 2012 NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 against Ohio and Elite Eight vs. Kansas • Combined for 13 assists and no turnovers in those two games • Sat out the next two seasons to fulfill a Mormon mission.



#32 – LUKE MAYE
Sophomore, 6-8, Forward
Huntersville, N.C.

Earned Academic All-ACC honors for the second time in as many years • The 14th Tar Heel to earn Academic All-ACC honors in multiple seasons • His father, Mark, also earned Academic All-ACC honors as a UNC quarterback in 1986 and 1987.

Averaging 5.0 points and 3.8 rebounds in 14.1 minutes per game • Is 23 for 43 from the floor (53.5 percent) in the last nine games • Averages 10.7 rebounds per 40 minutes • Seven games this year with at least six rebounds and scored in double figures three times (13 at NC State, 11 vs. Kentucky and 10 vs. Davidson) • Is 9 for 24 (.375) from three-point range (made two vs. Kentucky) • Carolina is 8-1 when has five or more rebounds.

2016-17: The ACC Player of the Year • Qualified to have his jersey number '44' hang in the rafters in the Smith Center • The 14th Tar Heel to win ACC POY honors (total of 15 times) and the first small forward to win the award since Larry Miller in 1967 and 1968 • First-team All-America by the Sporting News and USA Today second-team All-America • On the 15-player ballot for the Wooden Award • One of 10 semifinalists for the Naismith Award • Listed among the top 10 candidates for National Player of the Year by Sports Illustrated on 2/23 • Candidate for the Julius Erving Award, presented by the Basketball Hall of Fame to the best small forward in the nation • Two-time ACC Player of the Week • Co-NBC Sports National Player of the Week for his play against Wake Forest and Florida State.

ACC Rankings: Fourth in scoring (18.9) and second in 3FGs (2.9) in conference games • Seventh in scoring (18.3) and second in 3FGs per game (2.66) in all games.

Has the highest scoring average by a Tar Heel since Tyler Hansbrough scored 20.7 points per game in 2009 • Scored 20 or more points in 10 ACC games • Leads UNC in scoring at a career-best 18.3 per game (increase of 6.1 per game from last year) • Led UNC in scoring in 13 of the last 19 games and a team-high 17 times overall • Led UNC in scoring in six consecutive games from 1/21 to 2/9, the longest streak by a Tar Heel since Hansbrough (8) in 2008-09 • Leads the team in field goals made (6.6 per game), three-point field goals made (85) and minutes (31.5) • Second in assists with 84 • Shooting 45.2 percent from the floor, 38.5 percent from three-point range (up from .292 last year) and 75.5 percent from the FT line.

Sixteen 20-point games, most by a Tar Heel since Hansbrough had 21 in 2009 • Has scored 26 or more points five times • Has five games with 20 or more points and zero turnovers • Scored in double figures in a team-high 29 games (except Radford, Tennessee and at Virginia).

Made four or more three-pointers 11 times (did that one time in his first two seasons) and six or more 3FGs three times • Made seven 3FGs against Davidson and six vs. Monmouth and NC State • Made 85 three-pointers in 32 games, an average of 2.66 per game that is second in single-season UNC history (behind Shammond Williams, 2.71 per game in 1997) • Has made 22 more three-pointers in 32 games this year than he did in 78 games as a freshman and sophomore • Carolina is 12-3 when he makes at least three 3FGs.

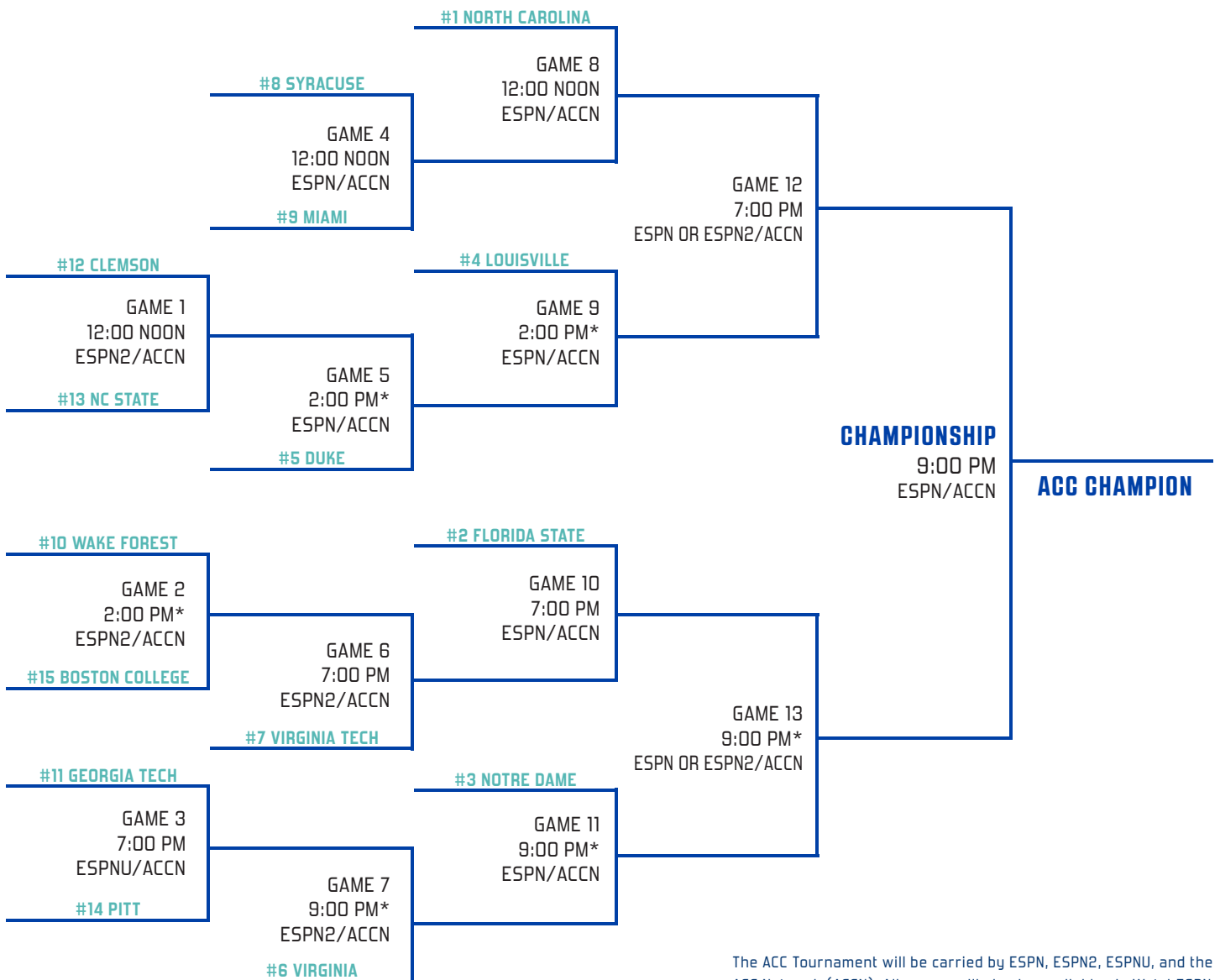
