

THE HURRICANES SKIPPER

It doesn't matter if his roster is full of rookies or veterans, University of Miami head coach Jim Morris continues to produce some of college baseball's most consistent and dominant teams in his 23rd season in Coral Gables. With a talented staff around him, Morris' Hurricanes are continually the class of collegiate baseball, having won national titles in 1999 and 2001 and the ACC Baseball Regular Season Championship in both 2008 and 2014.

In his 22-plus season tenure at Miami, no program has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a college baseball-record 43 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 12 of Morris' 22 seasons in Coral Gables - including most recently in 2015, when Miami was awarded the No. 5 national seed heading into the NCAA postseason.

Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris has won 16 of 22 NCAA Regional appearances at UM, including a record 13-straight to start his tenure in Coral Gables. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 31 years - 22 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

A three-time national coach of the year and 2008 Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year, Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 995-408-3 (.706) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,499-652-4 (.694) Division I record in 33 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 37 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,629-693-4 (.698) mark.


In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 22 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium's renovation prior to its reopening in 2009.

In 2015, Morris led the Hurricanes to their second straight ACC Coastal Division title, the 24th College World Series appearance in program history, and reached the 50-win mark for the 12th time in his 22 seasons.

Morris entered 2015 as among the winningest active coaches in Division I baseball with 1,435 wins. He wasted little time in moving up the record books, moving into sole possession of eighth place in all-time wins (1,439) on Feb. 15 with a 25-4 win over Rutgers and then seventh place with a 9-5 win over Louisville on March 7 (1,445).

Miami captured the 2014 ACC Regular Season Championship under his watch, recording 24 wins in conference play for the first time in program history. The conference win total set a new record for the program and tied the ACC's all-time single-season win total.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22. The Hurricanes, who have never missed the Atlantic Coast Conference Championship since joining the ACC in 2004, qualified for their 10th straight conference tournament under Morris and earned a Regional host spot for their 42nd consecutive postseason trip.



Morris has reached a number of other coaching milestones in his time in Coral Gables. His 1,000th Division-I game on April 4, 2004, at his old stomping grounds at Georgia Tech. He also achieved another milestone during the 2004 season, winning his 500th game at the helm of the Miami program. Morris' 500th win came just a few weeks following his 1,000th overall win as a Division-I head coach by beating Florida State 7-3 on April 17.

Over 150 professional baseball players have played under Morris during their college careers at Miami, Georgia Tech and DeKalb.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that went on to play in the Major Leagues were Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Pat Burrell (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), and Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston). Several more Hurricanes during the Morris tenure are right on the cusp of making the show, including Mike Rodriguez (Houston), David Gil (Cincinnati) and Jon Jay (St. Louis). Standout players under Morris from his days at Georgia Tech were Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jay Payton (Oakland A's) and Jason Varitek (Boston Red Sox).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the International scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta.

CANES OPEN ACC HOME SCHEDULE

• Miami welcomes fourth-ranked Louisville to Mark Light Field for an ACC series for the first time March 18-20; the Hurricanes trail the all time series 5-2, and lost two of three in the 2015 series in Louisville, Ky.

• The Hurricanes have won nine of their last 10 games overall and six straight home games heading into Friday's series opener. Louisville has won **10 games** in a row, and swept their **opening ACC weekend**.

• This weekend's series will pit the two ACC division champions from a season ago; Louisville captured the ACC Atlantic Division crown in 2015 with a 25-5 record, while UM won the **Coastal** at 22-8.

MILESTONES IN SIGHT FOR MORRIS

• With one more victory in 2016, head coach Jim Morris will become just the sixth coach in the history of Division I baseball to reach the 1,500-win milestone (1,499).

• Morris, who has won **995 games** during his illustrious 22-year-plus tenure, is five wins away from becoming the second coach in Miami history to reach 1,000 wins at the helm (Ron Fraser - 1,267).

• With 10 more wins, Morris will move past Larry Hays (1,508) as the fifth-winningest coach in Division I baseball history by victories.

• Since his arrival in 1994, Miami's 994 wins are sixth-most in D1.

LAST TIME OUT

• Miami improved to 12-2 in its nonconference schedule with a 5-2 win over UCF in Orlando on March 16.

• Righthander Jesse Lepore (5.0 + IP) earned a win for the third straight game, and CF Carl Chester had a career high-tying three hits.

• The road series win marked Miami's fourth in its last five ACC road trips dating to 2015, and the Hurricanes' fourth straight series win over the Hokies overall. UM is 28-8 all-time against Virginia Tech.

• Miami's offense led the way in the series win, connecting for 29 hits, seven doubles and four home runs. The Canes reached base at a .381 clip and hit a combined .293 over the weekend.

CLIMBING UP THE RECORD BOOKS

• Closer Bryan Garcia entered the year with the fifth-most saves in Miami history (25), and recorded back-to-back saves against Rutgers (Feb. 19-20); his sixth save of 2016 was vs. UCF on March 16.

• Garcia is chasing the all-time record for saves in a career, which is 39 - held by George Huguet (2001-2004). Garcia's 15 saves as a freshman in 2014 tied for the seventh-most in a single season.

 Garcia moved past Danny Graves (1992-94) for sole possession of fourth place (29), and needs three more to tie Robbie Morrison (1996 98) for third (34), six more to tie Rick Raether (1984-86) for second (37) and is eight behind Huguet for first (39).

LOOKING FOR A THREE-PEAT

• Miami won its second straight ACC Coastal Division title in 2015, posting a 22-8 record in ACC play to earn the division crown.

 The Hurricanes, who were picked to win the ACC Coastal Division once again in 2016, have won 46 ACC games over the 2014 + 2015 seasons - the second-best two-year stretch by any program since ACC expanded to a 30-game conference schedule prior to 2005.

· Miami has won the ACC Regular Season Championship twice, most recently in 2014 when the Canes finished 24-6; the Hurricanes won the ACC regular season crown & ACC Tournament in 2008.

HEATING UP

• Miami has won nine of its lat 10 games - key to that stretch has been junior Zack Collins (.483, 5 HR, 15 RBI), redshirt junior Edga Michelangeli (.457, 9 RBI) and junior Carl Chester (.421, 11 runs, four doubles, 5-7 SB).

• Leaders on the hill include junior Danny Garcia (0.00 ERA, 13.0 IP, 0 ER, 10 Ks), junior Bryan Garcia (1.12 ERA, 8.0 IP, 15 Ks, 3 saves) and sophomore Jesse Lepore (3-0, 2.70 ERA, 16.2 IP, 16 Ks).

CANES SWEEP JASPERS

 Miami cruised to a weekend sweep of Manhattan at Mark Light Field from March 4-6; the Hurricanes outscored the Jaspers 31-8 in the three-game series, while the staff recorded a collective 2.33 ERA.

• Among Miami's top performers at the plate against the Jaspers were Edgar Michelangeli (.750, 9-for-12, 3 RBI), junior Zack Collins (.625, 5-for-8, 1 HR, 5 RBI) & sophomore Carl Chester (.400, 4-for 10, 5 runs, 3 RBI); UM hit .371 as a team and recorded 39 hits vs. MC.

• Senior lefthander Thomas Woodrey delivered a brilliant start against the Jaspers in the series opener, tossing eight shutout innings, allowing two hits, one walk and striking out a career-best 10 batters.

 In 20 combined innings against Manhattan, Miami's starting pitchers went 3-0, allowed 11 hits, surrendered one earned run and totaled 18 strikeouts and just five walks (0.45 combined ERA).

• Miami's preseason ranking of No. 4 from *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper* was its **highest from the publication since 2005**; its No. 6 ranking from *Baseball America* was its highest from BA since **2007**.

DESTINATION: OMAHA

• Miami made its return to the **College World Series in 2015**, marking the program's first trip to Omaha, Neb., since **2008**. Miami's **24** College World Series trips are the **second-most of any program**.

• The Hurricanes have won **48 games** in the College World Series, the **fourth-most** of any program nationwide; Miami's **four national championships** (1982, 1985, 1999, 2001) rank **fifth-most**.
