THE GAME

- Coming off a 27-14 loss at Boston College on Fri., Oct. 26, the Miami Hurricanes open their month of November with their annual Homecoming game and a matchup with Duke on Nov. 3. Kickoff for the contest - Miami's first at home in 28 days - is set for 7 p.m. from Hard Rock Stadium.
- The game will be broadcast on ESPN2 with Beth Mowins (play by play), Anthony Becht (analyst) & Rocky Boiman (field analyst) on the call. Joe Zagacki (play by play) and Don Bailey, Jr. (color) are in the 560 WQAM radio booth for their 17th season together, while Josh Darrow will handle the sideline duty. Jose "Chamby" Campos (pxp) and Joe Martinez (color) will carry the game on 990AM ESPN Deportes from Hard Rock Stadium.

THE SERIES

- Miami carries a dominant 13-2 lead in the all-time series between the two schools, including wins in four straight matchups dating to 2014.
- UM leads the all-time series 6-1 in games played at home, and has not lost to Duke in Miami in the modern era of Hurricanes Football (since 1979)
- The Hurricanes thumped Duke, 31-6, in last year's head-to-head matchup in Durham, N.C., in Miami's ACC opener; UM is 7-1 all-time in Durham.

THE HURRICANES

- Mlami dropped its second straight game on Oct. 26, falling to host Boston College, 27-14, in Miami's first game in Chestnut Hill, Mass., since 2012.
- Despite the loss, the Hurricanes remain ranked among the nation's best teams in multiple stat categories, including several on the defensive side.
- Miami is ranked No. 2 nationally in total defense at 261.5 yards per game. The Canes are ranked No. 4 in opponent yards per play (4.2) the most important metric when measuring defense in 2018, according to UM's defensive staff - and are also ranked No.1 in team tackles for loss (11.1 per game), No. 8 in team sacks (3.25), No. 7 in turnovers gained (18), No. 1 in third down defense (22.8%) and No. 2 in passing yards allowed (140.8).
- Among UM's top defensive performers against BC were DB Sheldrick Redwine (14 total tackles), DB Jaquan Johnson (10 total tackles) and LB Michael Pinckney (10 total tackles). TE Brevin Jordan (career-high eight catches) and RB DeeJay Dallas (168 all-purpose yards) paced the offense.
- DL Gerald Willis III was named a Midseason All-American by the Associated Press, ESPN and The Athletic, and a Midseason All-ACC pick by ESPN. • Miami returned 14 starters and 44 letterwinners from a 2017 team that won 10 games (10-3) for the first time since 2003 and advanced to the ACC Championship Game for the first time ever. The Hurricanes ended the year in the Capital One Orange Bowl for the first time since 2003.
- Miami's seven wins in ACC play (7-1) in 2017 were the most in program history, as the Hurricanes captured the ACC's Coastal Division title for the first time. Mark Richt was named ACC Coach of the Year in a year where UM finished with a perfect 7-0 home record during the regular season.

THE OPPONENT

- Duke is under the direction of 11th-year coach David Cutcliffe, who has compiled a 64-70 record in Durham and a 108-99 record as head coach.
 - Like the Hurricanes, the Blue Devils enter Saturday coming off back-to-back losses. They are off to a 5-3 start but fell to Pitt, 54-45, on Oct. 27.
- The Duke offense is led by QB Daniel Jones (1,457 yards, 13 TD passes), RB Deon Jackson (534 yards, five TDs) and WRs TJ Rahming (394 yards, 6 TDs) and Johnathan Lloyd (440 yards, 5 TDs). Defensively, Duke is led by LB Joe Glles-Harris (69 tackles) and DL Chris Rumph (7.5 TFLs, 3.0 sacks).

UM LOOKS TO CONTINUE HOME STREAK

• The Miami Hurricanes will look to rebound from a 27-14 loss at Boston College p.m. on ESPN2.

• Miami has won 13 straight games at home in the regular season and is 15-2 at Hard Rock Stadium under Mark Richt.

• The Hurricanes have won four straight games against the Blue Devils, and have not lost to Duke in Miami since 1976 in the very first meeting between the two programs.

Miami's defense continues to shine under third-year defensive coordinator Manny Diaz, who has shaped the Hurricanes' unit into one of the nation's elite during his tenure.

• The Hurricanes defense ranks among the nation's best in several categories, including No. 2 in total defense (261.5 vards per game), No. 1 in third down conversion percentage defense (22.8%) and No. 1 in tackles for loss per game (11.1).

. Willis was honored as a Midseason All-America first-team selection by the Associated Press and ESPN and was named a Midseason All-America second-team selection by The Athletic.

 Willis has totaled at least 2.0 tackles for loss in four of eight games this season, and is tied for the ACC lead in tackles for loss with 14.0° he had 4.0 in the season opener vs. I.SU

HURRICANES LOOKING TO CONTINUE HOME DOMINANCE, HOST DUKE

- Following a 27-14 loss at Boston College last time out on Oct. 26, the Miami Hurricanes return to Hard Rock Stadium on Sat., Nov. 3 for their annual Homecoming game and a matchup with Duke at 7 p.m.
- The home game is the lone one in a four-of-five game road stretch that began at Virginia on Oct. 13.
- The Hurricanes will be looking for their 14th straight regular-season home win when they host the Blue Devils; UM's last loss at home in the regular season came all the way back on Oct. 15, 2016.
- Miami is 4-0 at home and has lost just twice at home in the regular season under Mark Richt (15-2).

LAST TIME OUT: MIAMI TRIPPED UP IN BOSTON, FALLS TO EAGLES, 27-14

- The Hurricanes dropped their second straight game last Friday in Chestnut Hill, Mass., falling to host Boston College, 27-14, in its first trip to Alumni Stadium since 2012 on Oct. 26; UM fell to 2-2 in ACC.
- Miami fell behind early and could not recover against the Eagles, who totaled 433 yards of offense the most in any game allowed by Miami this season - and outgained the Hurricanes, 433-305.
- Despite the game's outcome, several Hurricanes put together strong individual performances vs. BC.
 DB Shaldrid: Deducing finished with a career high 14 tackies including eight cole store. DB lagrage
- DB Sheldrick Redwine finished with a career-high 14 tackles, including eight solo stops. DB Jaquan Johnson (10) and LB Michael Pinckney (10) also posted double-digit tackle performances in the loss.
- Striker Romeo Finley wore the turnover chain for the second time with an interception vs. the Eagles.
- TE Brevin Jordan had a career-high eight receptions, while WR Darrell Langham caught a TD pass.
- QB Malik Rosier finished 19-for-36 for 150 passing yards; he added a team-high 71 rushing yards.

DEFENSE CONTINUING TO DOMINATE UNDER DIAZ'S DIRECTION AS D.C.

- The Hurricanes defense has continued to shine under third-year defensive coordinator Manny Diaz, who has molded Miami's unit into one of the nation's elite during his tenure as coordinator at UM.
- The most important metric to measure a college football defense in 2018, according to the UM staff philosphy, is opponent yards per play; Miami ranks No. 4 in FBS (4.2) and ranked ninth last year (4.6).
- In the NCAA rankings released Oct. 28, Miami was second in the nation and first in the ACC in total defense (261.5 yards per game); its 140.8 passing yards allowed per game was second-best in FBS.
- Miami's defense ranked No. 1 nationally in both third down conversion percentage (22.8%) and team tackles for loss (11.1), while the Canes' 18 turnovers gained were tied for seventh-most in the nation.

OFFSEASON FOCUS ON 3RD DOWN PAYING OFF FOR OFFENSE, DEFENSE

- After the very first day of fall camp, Mark Richt & staff stressed an emphasis on third downs on both sides of the ball, saying Miami practiced third downs on Day 1 as opposed to waiting til later in camp.
- The Hurricanes, who finished last year ranked 125th in third down conversion percentage on offense and 75th on defense, have benefited from the offseason focus; Miami is ranked No. 32 on offense on third down conversion percentage (43.6%) and ranked No. 1 nationally on the defensive side (22.8%).

HURRICANES HAVE BEEN A FORCE AT HARD ROCK UNDER MARK RICHT

- With a 28-27 win over Florida State in its last home game on Oct. 6, Miami won its 13th straight regular season game at home. The streak dates back to Oct. 15, 2016, its last loss (vs. North Carolina).
- Miami has a 15-3 overall record at Hard Rock Stadium since **Mark Richt**'s arrival prior to 2016, and finished last year with a 7-1 record at the venue including a perfect 7-0 mark in the regular season.
- Miami's 7-0 record at home in the 2017 regular season marked the first undefeated regular season at home since 2002; the Hurricanes finished a perfect 4-0 in ACC games at Hard Rock Stadium last year.
- The Hurricanes' lone loss at home in 2017 was at the Capital One Orange Bowl to Wisconsin, 34-24.
- In 17 regular season games at home under Richt's direction, the Hurricanes are averaging 40.0 points per game and allowing an average of 16.5 points, a positive differential average of 23.5 points/game.

ROSIER TO MAKE SIXTH START OF SEASON, 20TH OF CAREER SATURDAY

- On the ACC coaches call on Oct. 17, Mark Richt named **Malik Rosie**r starter for Miami's game at BC. Rosier, who entered in place of QB **N'Kosi Perry** at Virginia on Oct. 13, will start Saturday vs. Duke.
- The Hurricanes have posted a 14-5 record in games started by Rosier during his Miami career as QB.
- In his first season as Miami's starting quarterback in 2017, Malik Rosier set UM's single-season "touchdowns responsible for" record with 31 - besting Vinny Testaverde's previous record of 30 set during Testaverde's 1986 Heisman Trophy campaign. He threw for 26 TDs and rushed for five scores.
- The Mobile, Ala., native threw for 3,120 yards, setting the single-season total offense record at Miami (3,588) and finishing with a 10-3 record in 2017. He has compiled 12 TDs in 2018 (six rushing, six passing), and had a career-high five TD on the road at Toledo Sept. 15 (three rushing, two passing).
- Rosier has been responsible for 46 career TDs (12 rushing, 34 passing) in 32 career games at Miami.

WILLIS, JORDAN AMONG THOSE RECEIVING MIDSEASON RECOGNITION

- Redshirt senior defensive lineman **Gerald Willis III** and true freshman tight end **Brevin Jordan** were among those FBS players to receive national recognition for standout first halves of the season.
- Willis III was named to the Midseason All-America First Team by both the Associated Press and ESPN, and was named to the Midseason All-America Second Team by The Athletic. Willis III was named the best interior defensive lineman in the country through the first half by The Athletic's Bruce Feldman.
- Jordan was named a Midseason Freshman All-America by ESPN and a Midseason True Freshman All-America by 247Sports. In addition, both Willis III and Jordan were Midseason All-ACC picks by ESPN.
- Willis was also added to the Bednarik Award and Nagurski Trophy watch lists by midseason, while DBs **Jaquan Johnson** and **Michael Jackson** were named semifinalists for the Jim Thorpe Award.

BREAK OUT THE CHAIN AGAIN! TURNOVER CHAIN 2.0 IS HERE FOR 2018

- When sophomore DB Trajan Bandy pounced on a loose ball in the second quarter of Miami's game vs. Savannah State, the crowd turned to observe a familiar sight from 2017: the "Turnover Chain."
- But instead of last year's chain, which was modeled in the shape of the iconic "U" logo, Bandy was presented a brand new turnover chain to wear featuring a charm in the model of Sebastian the lbis.
- Turnover Chain 2.0 is comprised of more than 4,000 stones (compared to 900 last year), weighs roughly three kilograms (compared to two last year) and has an 8.5-inch charm (compared to 5.5).
- The Hurricanes defense totaled only 19 turnovers gained in 13 games in 2016 the season before the Turnover Chain's inception. Since, Miami has compiled 49 in just 21 games, averaging 2.33 per game.
- No Hurricane has worn the new chain more often than Bandy, who has rocked it four times on three interceptions and one fumble recovery. DB Sheldrick Redwine is second (three, all on interceptions).

BALLHAWKING SECONDARY RANKS AMONG NATION'S BEST UNITS

- Miami's defense, ranked second nationally in total defense, has been especially stout on quarterbacks, holding opponents to an ACC-low 140.8 passing yards per game the second-lowest mark in FBS.
- Led by three apiece from Trajan Bandy and Sheldrick Redwine, the Hurricanes have totaled 12 interceptions through the first eight games the eighth-most nationwide and second-most in ACC.
- Miami's team passing efficiency defense (98.38) is the sixth-highest nationwide and the best in ACC.
- The Hurricane secondary is anchored by three seniors and one rising sophomore safeties Jaquan Johnson and Sheldrick Redwine, along with cornerbacks Michael Jackson, Sr., and Trajan Bandy.
- Miami was one of just three teams to have two Thorpe Award semifinalists (Johnson, Jackson, Sr.)

DALLAS TAKING NEXT STEP AS ALL-AROUND THREAT AS SOPHOMORE

- Running back DeeJay Dallas has been a big factor in Miami's offense in 2018, and is second on UM
 with 423 rushing yards in eight games. He is averaging 5.5 yards per carry with three rushing scores.
- Last time out against BC (Oct. 26), Dallas had a game-high 168 all-purpose yards, including 138 kick return yards. He had a career-long 53-yard kickoff return and a 10-yard TD on a wildcat direct snap.
- Dallas totaled 349 all-purpose yards as a true freshman in 2017, including 217 rushing and 92 receiving.
- In a win over Toledo on Sept. 15, Dallas posted the first 100-yard game of his career (110) in Miami's 49-24 victory. Dallas has already far surpassed his 2017 true freshman mark of 217 rushing yards.
- Dallas did it again vs. UNC on Sept. 27, posting a career-high 114 yards on just 11 carries with one TD.
- Dallas' 17 rushes against the Rockets also marked a career high for the Brunswick, Ga., native.
- His 737 all-purpose yards are the second-most on Miami, trailing only WR Jeff Thomas' total of 793.
- Dallas, whose full first name is Demetrius, served as unofficial recruiting ambassador for the Hurricanes' "#Squad17" class. He was originally committed to Mark Richt when Richt was at Georgia.

JORDAN SETTING THE STANDARD AS TRUE FRESHMAN AT #TIGHTENDU

- Playing his first season of college football, TE Brevin Jordan has already emerged as a go-to target in the Miami offense; Jordan leads the Hurricanes in receptions (26) and is second in touchdowns (four).
- Jordan could be the next great one from a school who has produced several of NFL's top tight ends.
- Jordan was named a Midseason Freshman All-America and a Midseason All-ACC selection by ESPN.
- Jordan, who has 244 receiving yards and is averaging 9.4 yards per reception, has played in all eight
 games and made seven starts this year. He had a career-high eight catches last time out on Oct. 26.
- The Las Vegas native posted seven catches and two touchdowns in a win over Savannah St (Sept. 8).
- Jordan was ranked the No. 1 tight end in the country by ESPN.com and 247Sports and No. 2 by Rivals.

CAGER HAS BEEN TD MACHINE FOR CANES, TIED FOR ACC LEAD IN TDs

- WR Lawrence Cager is tied for the ACC lead with six receiving touchdowns and has been among UM's top targets in the end zone; he had the second multi-TD game of his career vs. Florida State (Oct. 6).
- Cager's six touchdowns this season already mark a career high; his previous high was three in 2017.
- Of Cager's 40 career catches, 10 have gone for TDs (25%), including six of 16 this year (37.5%); he has two of UM's three multi-touchdown performances this season, vs. FIU (Sept. 22) and vs. FSU (Oct. 6)
- Cager is tied for 31st-most receiving TDs in FBS and tied with UVa's Olamide Zacchaeus atop the ACC.

JACKSON AMONG FBS ACTIVE SACKS LEADERS, MIAMI D-LINE THRIVING

- Junior DL Joe Jackson, who is tied for second on Miami with 5.0 sacks this season, is one of just 11
 active FBS players with at least 20.0 career sacks; he is tied for fifth among Power 5 players with 20.0.
- Jackson has at least a half-tackle for loss in his last six games and is fourth on Miami with 9.5 TFLs.
- In addition to Jackson's strong play at defensive end, DL Gerald Willis III is tied for eighth in the
 nation and leads the ACC in tackles for loss (1.8 per game). He is tied with teammate Jon Garvin, who
 has matched Willis' tackle-for-loss total (14.0) and in a sophomore surge, has started all eight games.
- Since joining the ACC, Miami has never had two players with at least 14.0 TFLs in the same season.
- Willis III became the first-ever recipient of the Outland Trophy National Defensive Player of the Month.
- Miami's unit is under the direction of first-year line coach Jess Simpson, who arrived from the Atlanta Falcons. Simpson helped ATL rank ninth in the NFL in both total defense and rushing defense in 2017.

MIAMI ON PACE TO SHATTER SCHOOL'S SINGLE-SEASON TFL RECORD

- Playing in his first game since Nov. 26, 2016, DL Gerald Willis III delivered an overpowering
 performance vs. LSU, recording an eye-popping 4.0 tackles for loss the first such performance by a
 Hurricane defender since 2008. Miami combined for 8.0 TFLs in the game, setting the tone for 2018.
- There are only 10 players in the nation with at least 14 tackles for loss, and UM has two of them in Willis III (14.0) and DL **Jon Garvin** (14.0). UM's 89 TFLs are nine more than the next-highest FBS total.
- Since joining the ACC, Miami has never had two players with at least 14.0 TFLs in the same season.
- At its current pace over a 13-game schedule, Miami will total more than 144 TFLs, shattering the mark.
- UM has had six individual performances of 3.0 tackles for loss this year through the first eight games; Miami had six total in the first two seasons combined under Manny Diaz' direction (26 games).
- Willis, who was named ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week for his game vs. LSU, has not slowed down since; he is tied with Garvin for the ACC lead in tackles for loss per game, averaging 1. game.

CANES HAVE TWO-PRONGED RUSHING ATTACK IN DALLAS AND HOMER

- Miami's two-pronged running back attack in junior RB Travis Homer (569 rushing yards) and RB DeeJay Dallas (423 rushing yards) has provided a boost for the Hurricanes offense this season.
- Homer is averaging 5.4 yards per carry on 105 carries this season, while Dallas has posted similar numbers, averaging 5.5 yards on 77 carries. Homer has teh edge in receiving yards, 114 to 69.
- The two running backs have split reps over the past few weeks, with Dallas recording 100-yard rushing games vs. Toledo (Sept. 15, 110 yards) and North Carolina (Sept. 27, 114) and Homer doing it vs. FIU (Sept. 22, 114). Homer has four career 100-yard rush games while Dallas has two such games.
- Homer had a career-long 70-yard rush at Virginia (Oct. 13) in Miami's 16-13 loss in Charlottesville.

AFTER REDSHIRTING 2017, PERRY SEEING FIRST ACTION AT QB IN 2018

- After impressing vs. FIU (Sept. 22) upon entering at QB in UM's third series, QB N'Kosi Perry made the first start of his career vs. North Carolina (Sept. 27), finishing 8-for-12 for 125 passing yards & 1 TD.
- Perry threw three TDs and finished 17-of-25 for 224 yards and one pick in his action vs. the Panthers.
- Perry entered for Miami's third series vs. FIU and eventually compiled the longest scoring drives of 2018 by both yards (87) and time (7:11), and tied the season long for a scoring drive by play count (14).
- In his second start vs. Florida State (Oct. 6), Perry threw for a career-high four touchdown passes to help complete an epic second-half comeback. He played the first four series at Virginia (Oct. 13).
- The Ocala, Fla., native was a consensus four-star quarterback by 247Sports, ESPN, Rivals and Scout, and was rated as the third-best dual sport in the nation by ESPN and sixth-best by 247Sports.
- Despite making just three starts, QB N'Kosi Perry has already orchestrated UM's season-long drive by time (7:49, vs. FSU), tied the mark for plays (14, twice) and has second-longest in yards (87 vs. FIU).

THOMAS SHOWCASING ELECTRIC PLAYMAKING ABILITY IN YEAR 2

- Sophomore WR Jeff Thomas has showed off his playmaking abilities through the first eight games.
- Thomas ranks 11th in FBS in average yards per catch and second in the ACC at a whopping 20.57 yards.
- In UM's road game vs. Toledo (Sept. 15), Thomas led Miami in all-purpose yards (171) for the third straight game. Thomas has led UM in all-purpose yards in four of eight games, including 124 vs. FSU.
- Thomas has a team-high 17 plays of 20-or-more yards in 2018 he had 22 such plays during 2017.
- Against LSU (Sept. 2), Thomas started and made a number of acrobatic catches, hauling in a career-high five passes for a career-high 132 yards; his previous highs were three receptions and 101 yards.
- Thomas once again showcased his electric speed vs. Savannah State (Sept. 8) when he hauled in a 67yard TD pass and finished with 183 all-purpose yards - including career-high 90 punt return yards.
- Thomas' 67-yard TD vs. Savannah State was UM's longest play of the season and the fourth catch of at least 50 yards in his career; Thomas also hauled in a 50-yard reception in the opener against LSU.
- The East St. Louis, III., native was on the receiving end of the two longest pass plays for UM in 2017.

JON "NEO" GARVIN ENJOYING SOPHOMORE SURGE ON DEFENSIVE LINE

- The Miami Hurricanes' defensive line took a hit when three of its four 2017 starters departed this past offseason, but one of the players who has stepped up in his sophomore year has been end **Jon Garvin**.
- Garvin, who totaled just nine tackles as a true freshman in 2017 is tied for fourth on the Hurricanes with 40 tackles; he set a career high with eight vs. LSU (Sept. 2) and matched it vs. Savannah State (Sept. 8).
- Garvin is tied for eighth in FBS and tied for the ACC lead with an average of 1.8 tackles for loss per game.
- Garvin, who had just 3.0 tackles for loss as a true freshman, already has 14.0 tackles for loss in 2018; he
- became the first Hurricane to have multiple games with 3.0 TFL since **Denzel Perryman** in 2011.

- Harley was named a team captain vs. North Carolina (Sept. 27) and made his first career start. He led all Hurricanes with 70 receiving yards, and tied a career-long with a 42-yard reception vs. UNC.
- The south Florida native ranks fourth on Miami with 15 catches for 173 yards in 2018 besting his personal totals from last season already (nine catches, 91 yards). He is averaging 21.6 yards per game.

JAQUAN BACK FOR SENIOR YEAR AFTER CONSULTING IDOL ED REED

- After discussing his future with legendary Miami safety Ed Reed, DB Jaquan Johnson turned down the opportunity to enter the NFL Draft, choosing to return for his senior season with the Hurricanes.
- The Hurricanes are undoubtedly happy with his decision, as Johnson a Preseason All-America firstteam selection by the Associated Press, a Preseason All-ACC selection and a watch list member for three major defensive awards - led Miami with 96 tackles and tied for the team lead with four picks.
- In his first game of 2018, Johnson served as one of four captains and totaled a game-high 11 tackles.
- Johnson missed games vs. FIU (Sept. 22) and North Carolina (Sept. 27) with a hamstring injury.
- He returned as a captain vs. Florida State (Oct. 6) and totaled a game-high 10 tackles in the win.
- Johnson has posted three straight games of double-digit tackles and leads the Hurricanes in total tackles despite playing in just six of eight games; he is averaging 9.0 tackles per game (54 total).
- The Miami native was named a semifinalist for the 2018 Jim Thorpe Award on Oct. 22.
- As a junior, Johnson was of four defensive semifinalists for the Walter Camp Player of the Year.
- Johnson was named ACC Defensive of the Back three weeks in a row in 2017 (Nov. 6, Nov. 13, Nov. 20), becoming the first Hurricane player to ever be honored by the ACC in three consecutive weeks.
- The last ACC player to earn honors in three straight weeks was Deshaun Watson of Clemson in 2014.

LINGARD POSTED LONGEST RUN BY TRUE FRESHMAN BEFORE INJURY

- With a 64-yard touchdown run on Sept. 8 against Savannah State, RB Lorenzo Lingard recorded the longest rush by a true freshman running back since Duke Johnson had a 65-yard rush against Duke in his true freshman season finale on Nov. 24, 2012 in Durham, N.C., which was also a touchdown run.
- Lingard, who saw action in seven games, suffered a knee injury leading into the BC game (Oct. 26) that required surgery, which happened that week; a timetable for his return has not been determined.

HURRICANES SET RECORDS IN WIN OVER TIGERS IN HOME OPENER

- The Miami Hurricanes opened their 11th season at Hard Rock Stadium on Sept. 8 vs. Savannah State, capturing a 77-0 shutout victory to improve to 11-0 all-time in home openers at the stadium.
- Miami's 77 points tied a program record for most points in a single game (also set against Savannah State, in September 2013), while its 77-point margin of victory was the largest in program history.
- The Hurricanes have not lost a home opener since 2006, when they fell to Florida State 13-10 at the Orange Bowl on Sept. 4, 2006. Miami has won 12 straight home openers since, a program record.

DEFENSE RECORDS FIRST SHUTOUT SINCE 2015 IN WIN OVER TIGERS

- The Miami Hurricanes' defense was able to compile its first shutout since the 2015 season opener against Bethune-Cookman (Sept. 5, 2015) in a 77-0 win over Savannah State on Saturday, Sept. 8.
- The shutout was the first under the current Miami staff, including defensive coordinator Manny Diaz.
- Diaz's last shutout as defensive coordinator came exactly six years to the day before Miami's win over Savannah State; as the coordinator at Texas, Diaz's Longhorns shutout New Mexico on Sept. 8, 2012.

THREE-HEADED LINEBACKER MONSTER IN MIDST OF JUNIOR YEARS

- Miami's three-headed monster junior linebacker trio Zach McCloud, Michael Pinckney and Shaq Quarterman - has started nearly every game together since arriving to UM as early enrollees in 2016.
- In a win over North Carolina (Sept. 27), the trio started, combining for 17 tackles, 5.0 tackles for loss, two sacks & one forced fumble. The trio has started alongside each other five of seven games in '18.
- McCloud has started 27 of 33 career games through the first seven weeks of 2018. McCloud finished with 48 tackles (29 solo), 4.5 tackles for loss in 2017. He led Miami with eight total tackles vs. UNC.
- One of UM's most instinctive players, Pinckney started 11 of 13 games last season and ended up with 68 total tackles, 11.0 tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks. He recorded a career-high 12 tackles at Virginia.
- Quarterman, who has started all 33 games for the Hurricanes in two-plus seasons, ranked second on the team with 83 tackles a sophomore in 2017. Quarterman was unblockable in a win vs. UNC, ending with 3.0 tackles for loss, two sacks, one forced fumble & five total tackles in a 47-10 victory.

KEEPING IT IN THE "U FAMILY"

- As is often the case at the University of Miami, a number of Canes have family ties to 'The U'
- Five Canes had fathers who suited up in orange and green: TE Michael Irvin II (father is Michael) II, DL Scott Patchan (Matt), DL Pat Bethel (Randy), P Zach Feagles (Jeff) & DB Al Blades, Jr. (Al, Sr.)
- WR Evidence Njoku is the brother of David, who was taken by Cleveland in the 2017 NFL Draft.
- QB Cade Weldon is the son of Casey Weldon, former guarterback at Florida State under Mark Richt.

TRUE FROSH TIGHT END DUO MAKING AN EARLY IMPACT FOR MIAMI

- Two key members of Miami's #Storm18 signing class have played bigger roles than already was anticipated after junior tight end Michael Irvin II suffered an MCL injury during fall camp.
- Freshman tight end duo Brevin Jordan and Will Mallory, who became friends through the recruiting
 process and were ranked among the nation's best at the position, have been counted on early in 2018.
- In addition to playing together on the field, Jordan and Mallory are freshman roommates at The U.
- In the home opener vs. Savannah State (Sept. 8), Mallory opened the game's scoring with a two-yard touchdown pass - the very first catch of his career. Mallory made his first career start in the victory.
- Jordan, who started the season opener, had a dominant outing of his own against the Tigers, setting career marks in receptions (seven) to go along with the first two touchdowns of his Miami career.
- Jordan was ranked the No. 1 tight end in the country by ESPN.com and 247Sports and No. 2 by Rivals, while Mallory was ranked the third-best tight end by ESPN.com. The two are roommates at The U.

HIGHTOWER WOWS IN FIRST COLLEGIATE GAME, SCORES TOUCHDOWN

- Among Miami's most impressive freshman performers vs. LSU (Sept. 2) was WR Brian Hightower, who hauled in a 32-yard TD reception on a connection with QB Malik Rosier in the fourth quarter.
- Hightower, who saw signification action in the game vs. LSU, became the first Hurricane wide receiver to record a touchdown for his first collegiate catch since **Tyre Brady** vs. Nebraska in 2015.
- Hightower made the first start of his career on Sept. 22 vs. FIU; he has 3 catches for 53 yards this year.
- The last Hurricane to have his first catch end up in a touchdown was FB **Marquez Williams** in 2016.
- Hightower was a consensus four-star recruit ranked the No. 141 overall player in his class by ESPN.

DEFENSE, TURNOVER CHAIN HAS DAZZLED UNDER DADE'S OWN DIAZ

- Defensive coordinator Manny Diaz has directed the UM defense into one of the nation's top groups in his two-plus seasons at The U, and his 2017 unit ranked among the nation's best in several stats.
- Miami's defense ranked ninth nationally in opponent yards per play (4.5) in 2017, the most important
 modern metric when measuring a college football defense. UM ranked No. 16 in OYPP (4.7) in 2016.
- The Hurricanes led the nation in team sacks (3.38) and was 3rd in team tackles for loss (8.8) in 2017.
- One of college football's biggest storylines in 2017 was the emergence of Miami's "turnover chain," and after the Canes posted the ACC's best turnover margin in 2017, the chain will be back in 2018
- Miami's 31 turnovers gained were the third-most in the nation and most in the ACC, while its +1.00 average turnover margin (+13 for the season) was tied for the fifth-best mark in the nation.

10 TRUE FRESHMEN, 13 TOTAL SEE FIRST ACTION OF CAREER VS. LSU

- 10 true freshmen suited up for the first time in the season opener vs. LSU, while three others redshirt freshman WR Evidence Njoku, DL Tito Odenigbo and OL Venzell Boulware - also debuted.
- 10 true freshmen made their debuts against LSU in the AdvoCare Classic: RB Lorenzo Lingard, WR Brian Hightower, DB Al Blades, Jr., DB DJ Ivey, WR Dee Wiggins, TE Brevin Jordan, DL Gregory Rousseau, K Bubba Baxa, OL DJ Scaife, Jr. and TE Will Mallory.

- After his return to his alma mater, head coach Mark Richt instituted honorary captains all of whom are Miami Football alumni to speak to the team on the Fridays before home games in-season.
- The first honorary captain for the 2018 season was OL Dennis Harrah, who played at UM from 1972-74.
- In 2017, the list of honorary captain list included all-time Miami greats like QB George Mira, DB Bennie Blades, WR Reggie Wayne, DB Ed Reed and DB Antrel Rolle, among others.
- Richt's invitation to honorary captains further extends his dedication to his alma mater and the alumni who have passed through the program; in August of 2017, Richt hosted his first "U Network" event dedicated to helping Miami Football alumni find jobs in their post-football lives.
- Richt and his wife Katharyn personally dedicated \$1 million to the construction of the Carol Soffer Indoor Practice Facility, which helped spurn more than \$2 million in gifts from former players.

CAROL SOFFER INDOOR PRACTICE FACILITY OPEN FOR BUSINESS

- On August 17, 2018, history was made at the University of Miami, as the Miami Hurricanes practiced inside the Carol Soffer Indoor Practice Facility for the very first time during fall camp.
- In September 2016, Miami announced the largest donation in the history of the athletics department
 as the lead gift for a state-of-the-art football indoor practice facility. In honor of their mother Carol,
 Jeffrey Soffer and Carol's other children made a \$14 million commitment towards the facility.
- Head coach Mark Richt pledged \$1 million towards the facility and football alumnus and linebacker great Jon Beason was among those alumni to give to the project. Beason's gift was \$250,000, as Miami alumni and former players teamed up to contribute more than \$2 million for the project.
- The 81,800-square-foot facility features two field-turf fields one 90 yards long and one 40 yards.

- "Voice of the Hurricanes" Joe Zagacki and color commentator Don Bailey, Jr. are in the booth for their 17th year on the radio the duo has broadcast 246 straight games together.

TRUE FRESHMEN ALREADY MAKING AN EARLY IMPACT FOR UM IN 2018

- Miami's recruiting class, nicknamed #Storm18, was ranked the consensus No. 1 class in Florida and a consensus top-8 class overall for the first time since 2012. It was ranked No. 6 nationally by Rivals.
- True freshmen have accounted for nine total touchdowns already, including two from RB Lorenzo Lingard and four from TE Brevin Jordan. TE Will Mallory and WR Brian Hightower each have one.
- Both Jordan (seven games) and Mallory (one game) have earned starts in the early going of their college careers, while DB **AI Blades, Jr**., was named special teams captain for UM's game at Toledo.
- UM's recruiting class included 14 players ranked in the ESPN300, 12 in 247Sports' national rankings, 12 ranked in Rivals 250, and 10 players who were either U.S. Army or Under Armour All-Americans.
- Miami's class was ranked No. 8 nationally by both 247Sports and ESPN and ranked the second-best class in the ACC by both organizations. 247Sports, ESPN and Rivals all had UM's class No. 1 in Florida.
- 10 members of the signing class enrolled early and took part in spring practice: QB Jarren Williams, RB Lorenzo Lingard, WR Brian Hightower, WR Dee Wiggins, DL Greg Rousseau, OL John Campbell, Jr., OL DJ Scaife, Jr., DB Gurvan Hall, Jr., DB DJ Ivey and DB Gilbert Frierson

HOMER IMPRESSED IN FIRST YEAR AS STARTING RUNNING BACK IN 2017

- After a season-ending injury to Mark Walton in the early part of 2017, RB Travis Homer stepped up and saw action in all 13 games last year. He took over starting duties four games into the year.
- Homer has posted 434 rushing yards through the first six games (5.2 yards-per-carry average) and had the first 100-yard rushing game of the season in a 31-17 victory over the FIU Panthers on Sept. 22.
- The 100-yard rushing performance was the fourth of his career; he had three such games in 2017.
- Homer rushed for 966 yards on 163 attempts (5.9 yards per carry) with eight rushing TDs in 2017.
- The West Palm Beach native, who was selected to the All-ACC Second Team in 2017, compiled 1,203 all-purpose yards and three 100-yard rushing games including 170 in his first start vs. Georgia Tech.
- The Palm Beach native became the eighth Miami tailback to have recorded a 100-yard game in his first career start since 2000, and the fourth to do it in an Atlantic Coast Conference game.
- Homer is Miami's leading active rusher with 1,579 rushing yards and nine rushing touchdowns.

HEAD COACH | THIRD SEASON AT MIAMI (18th OVERALL) | 169-61 (.735)

In just two-plus seasons as head coach, Mark Richt has made an indelible impact on his alma mater's football program -- both on and off the field.

Richt posted a 19-7 record over his first two seasons, the third best start in Miami history, and a stretch that included a 15-game winning streak -- UM's longest since 2002. The Hurricanes won 10 games in 2017, climbing as high as second in the College Football Playoff rankings. Miami captured the Atlantic Coast Conference's Coastal Division for the first time in its history and earned an invitation to the Capital One Orange Bowl for the first time in 13 years. Richt won 2017 ACC Coach of the Year honors and was also named the 2017 Walter Camp Coach of the Year.

The Hurricanes ranked first in team sacks per game (3.38), and ranked third the nation in turnovers forced in 2017 (31). Junior quarterback Malik Rosier accounted for 31 total touchdowns, breaking Vinny Testaverde's single-season school record, and helping Miami rank 15th in the nation in red zone offense (90.7 percent). Junior defensive back Jaquan Johnson had a breakout season, leading the team with 96 tackles, picking off four passes and earning ACC Defensive Back of the Week honors three times. Overall, 10 Hurricanes earned All-ACC honors, including kicker Michael Badgley, who was named first-team All-ACC.

Off the field, Richt has energized the program, from supporting the fundraising efforts for the Carol Soffer Football Indoor Practice Facility to launching The U Network, which assists former Hurricanes in networking and career placement after their playing careers have concluded. Miami was one of three schools, along with Stanford and Northwestern, to earn the 2016 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Academic Achievement Award. In addition, the Hurricanes ranked first among all FBS programs in 2016 in the NCAA Team Works Helper Helper Community Service Competition, and helped Miami finish first among Division I schools overall in 2018.

Richt was named the University of Miami's 24th head football coach on Dec. 4, 2015. His hiring provided immediate dividends as the Hurricanes posted a 9-4 record in his first season in Coral Gables. Miami then defeated West Virginia, 31-14, in the Russell Athletic Bowl for the program's first bowl victory in 10 years. The Hurricanes were ranked No. 20 in

the final Associated Press poll and No. 23 in the final Amway Coaches Poll – the program's first season-ending rankings since 2009.

Miami had 10 players earned ACSMA All-ACC honors in 2016, while quarterback Brad Kaaya became Miami's all-time passing yards leader. Freshman wide receiver Ahmmon Richards broke the 31-year-old freshman receiving record at Miami originally set by Michael Irvin, while sophomore running back Mark Walton became the 11th 1,000-yard rusher in program history.

Six Hurricanes were selected in the 2018 NFL Draft. Nine Hurricanes were selected in the 2017 NFL Draft, the most for Miami since 2006, including first-round pick David Njoku to the Cleveland Browns. Richt has had 99 of his players drafted as a head coach, including 14 first-round picks.

Richt, born in Omaha, Neb., and raised in Boca Raton, Fla., returned to his alma mater after leading the University of Georgia football program for the previous 15 years. He compiled a 145-51 overall record and an 85-40 mark in Southeastern Conference play. Georgia won two SEC championships, six SEC East titles and nine bowl games under Richt, and finished the season in the Associated Press Top-10 rankings seven times.

Richt's 164 career wins rank fourth among active FBS head coaches and his .744 winning percentage ranks as the seventh best among current FBS coaches with at least five years of experience. Richt is one of only seven head coaches in SEC history to record four straight 10-win seasons (2002-05).

Richt coached some of the greatest quarterbacks in Georgia history, including David Greene, a four-year starter who left Athens as the then-winningest quarterback in NCAA history with 42 career wins. Aaron Murray, also a four-year starter, is the SEC's all-time leader in passing yards (13,166) and touchdown passes (121). Matthew Stafford threw for 3,459 yards and 25 touchdowns (then a school record) as a junior for the Bulldogs.

Richt is married to the former Katharyn Francis of Tallahassee. The couple has four children – Jonathan, David, Zach, and Anya. Jon, the Miami quarterbacks coach, was married to the former Anna Cearley in May 2010. They have two daughters, Jadyn and Zoe.


