- Miami will honor 18 student-athletes prior to its home game against Duke on Saturday.
- Sophomore running back Mark Walton has scored 24 touchdowns in 24 career games. He currently leads the team with 14 touchdowns this season.
- Mark Walton surpassed 1,000 yards rushing for the year, following his 120-yard effort this past weekend at NC State. The Hurricanes have had a 1,000-yard rusher in each of the past three seasons (Duke Johnson, Joe Yearby and Walton). The last time Miami had three straight 1,000-yard rushers was from 2000-02 (James Jackson, Clinton Portis and Willis McGahee).
- Wide receiver Ahmmon Richards broke Michael Irvin's 31-year single season freshman receiving yards record last week at NC State.
- Junior quarterback Brad Kaaya needs 276 yards passing to break Ken Dorsey's (1999-2002) all-time career passing yards record of 9,565 yards.

MIAMI TO HONOR 18 STUDENT-ATHLETES ON SENIOR DAY

- Miami welcomes Duke to Hard Rock Stadium on Saturday for its 2016 regular season finale. Kickoff is set for 3:30 p.m. and will air on ESPN2.
- Miami will honor Gage Batten, Kevin Carroll, Jamal Carter, Sr., Wyatt Chickillo, Adrian Colbert, Stacy Coley, Standish Dobard, Corn Elder, Frank Gabriel, Alex Gall, Danny Isidora, Rayshawn Jenkins, Hunter Knighton, Malcolm Lewis, Austin Pfenninger, Justin Vogel, Michael Welch and Marquez Williams
- Miami is 11-2 all-time against Duke. The Hurricanes have won 11 of the last 12 matchups against the Blue Devils.
- The series opened in 1976 with the Hurricanes falling, 20-7, in Miami. Miami's loss to Duke in 1976 is the only time the Hurricanes have lost at home to the Blue Devils.
- Miami defeated Duke 30-27 in 2015 thanks to a thrilling eight-lateral play, which was capped by Corn Elder dashing 75 yards to the endzone for the go-ahead score with no time remaining.

A LOOK BACK AT NC STATE: CANES CLOSE STRONG ON THE ROAD

- Miami's matchup with NC State marked the Hurricanes' 15th all-time matchup with the Wolfpack.
- With the win, Miami improved to 9-5-1 all-time against NC State.
- Miami's trip to NC State was its first since 2008 and the victory marks Miami's first in Raleigh, N.C., since 2004.
- With the victory, the Hurricanes have two winning streaks of three games or more in 2016.

- Senior wide receiver Malcolm Lewis, freshman linebacker Shaquille Quarterman, junior defensive lineman Chad Thomas and senior punter Justin Vogel represented the Hurricanes at the coin toss as Miami's captains.
- Miami's defense held NC State scoreless in the first quarter. The Hurricanes have held six of their opponents scoreless in the first quarter this season. Miami has outscored its opponents 75-44 in the first quarter this season.
- Miami outgained NC State 415-329 in total yards. The Hurricanes also limited the Wolfpack to just 5-of-17 on third down conversions, including 1-of-9 in the first half.
- The Hurricanes forced NC State to punt on each of its first five drives.
- Sophomore Mark Walton finished with 120 rushing yards and three rushing touchdowns on 19 carries. Walton has 14 rushing touchdowns on the season.
- Walton's 120 rushing yards put him at 1,005 rushing yards for the season, giving the Hurricanes three straight years with a 1,000-yard rusher (Joe Yearby in 2015 and Duke Johnson in 2014).
- Junior quarterback Brad Kaaya finished with 286 yards passing and went 22-of-38.
- With 164 passing yards in the first half, Kaaya moved past Logan Thomas (Virginia Tech) and Spencer Fischer (Duke) for 12th and 11th, respectively, on the all-time ACC career passing list.
- Sophomore wide receiver Ahmmon Richards led the Hurricanes with a game-high 96 receiving yards in the first half. He finished the game with 117 yards on a career-high nine catches and surpassed Michael Irvin's single season freshman receiving yards record. He currently has 849 yards for the year, which stands as the 10th-best overall single season total in program history. Richards also has had three consecutive games



with 100 receiving yards.

- Senior wide receiver Stacy Coley increased his consecutive catch streak to 20 games.
- With his 54 yards receiving against NC State, Coley has 2,049 for his career and becomes just the eighth Miami receiver to record 2,000-or-more yards career receiving yards.
- Redshirt sophomore David Njoku also chipped in with three receptions for 44 yards in the first half. Njoku finished the game with six catches and 72 yards receiving.
- Senior offensive lineman Danny Isidora got the start at right guard to increase his consecutive start streak to a team-best 37 games.
- Senior Jamal Carter led the Hurricanes with 10 tackles (six solo), adding 0.5 TFLs and a pass breakup.
- Freshman Shaquille Quarterman recorded eight tackles (career-high seven solo).
- Senior Rayshawn Jenkins logged his 32nd career start. His 32 career starts are the most on the Miami defensive unit.
- Freshman Malek Young recorded his first career interception in the endzone, which put a stop to an eight-play, 64-yard drive.
- Sophomore Jaquan Johnson had his first career fumble recovery and finished with six tackles (three solo), including 0.5 TFLs.

MEET THE NEW GUY IN TOWN - MARK RICHT

- University of Miami Director of Athletics Blake James announced on Dec. 4, 2015 the hiring of Hurricane alumnus Mark Richt as the 24th head football coach at The U.
- Richt was officially introduced to the public at a news conference at the Shalala Student Center.
- Richt, born in Omaha, Neb., and raised in Boca Raton, Fla., returned to his alma mater after leading the University of Georgia football program for the previous 15 years. During that time he compiled a 145-51 overall record and an 83-37 mark in Southeastern Conference play.
- Richt won two SEC championships, six SEC East titles and nine bowl games, and finished the season in the Associated Press Top 10 rankings seven times.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- A win over Duke would hand Miami its fourth straight win. Miami has not won four straight games to close out the regular season since the 2002 campaign.
- Miami will be in search of its third straight win against Duke and its ninth in the last 10 years.
- The Hurricanes will be in search of their sixth straight win over the Blue Devils at home. Miami's lone loss to Duke at home came back in 1976.
- Kaaya will look to throw for 200-or-more yards for the 29th time his career. In 28 of his 36 career games, Kaaya has thrown for over 200 yards. He also has at least one touchdown in 31 career outings.
- Kaaya is 276 passing yards shy of moving past Ken Dorsey for first all-time on the Miami career passing yards list. Kaaya needs just 87 yards to move past T.J. Yates for 10th on the ACC's all-time career passing yards list.
- With 146 yards passing this weekend, Kaaya will become the first Miami quarterback to throw for over 3,000 yards in three straight seasons.
- Sophomore running back Mark Walton needs just 94 yards rushing to pass James Jackson (2000), Danyell Ferguson (1995) and Edgerrin James (1997) for ninth, eighth and seventh, respectively for rushing yards in a single season.
- Senior wide receiver Stacy Coley needs just one more receiving touchdown to move into a four-way tie for seventh on Miami's all-time single season receiving list for touchdowns.
- If running back Joe Yearby surpasses 100 yards rushing, it would mark the eighth time in his career in which he has passed the century mark and would tie him for eighth all-time at Miami with Frank Gore.
- Senior offensive lineman Danny Isidora will look to make his 38th consecutive start. Isidora's current consecutive start streak of 37 games is the team's longest.

- Miami's four losses this season have come by a combined total of 32 points (8.0 points per game average).

- Two of Miami's four losses have come by three points or less.
- Miami's loss at home against Florida State came by one point after the Hurricanes had their extra point attempt blocked late in the fourth quarter.

YIPPEE KAAYA

- QB Brad Kaaya is in the midst of a junior season at Miami in which he has already posted career numbers that rank among the most prolific in program history.
- Kaaya was on the preseason watch lists for eight major honors: The Lombardi Award, the Manning Award, the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm, College Football Performance, the Davey O'Brien Award, American Football Coaches Association Good Works Team, the Wuerffel Trophy and the Maxwell Award.
- Kaaya's 9,290 career-passing yards are already the second-most in Miami history. His 3,238 passing yards as a sophomore in 2015 are tied for the sixth-most in a single season, while his 3,198 yards in 2014 are the eighth-most. He is the only QB with two individual seasons ranking in the top 10.
- His 9,290 passing yards rank 11th on the ACC all-time career list. Kaaya is one of only 13 signal callers in league history to pass for over 9,000 career yards. In addition, Kaaya is only quarterback in program history to throw for 2,800 yards-or-more in three straight seasons.
- With his three touchdown passes at Appalachian State, Kaaya passed legendary Hurricane quarterbacks Craig Erickson, Gino Torretta, Steve Walsh and Vinny Testaverde on the all-time touchdown pass list.
- Kaaya's 61 career touchdown passes rank third all-time in Miami history.
- Kaaya has thrown for 200 or more yards in 28 of his 36 career games and has 10 career 300-yard performances. His career high of 405 yards came at Florida State on Oct. 10, 2015. His 25 career 200-yard passing games are the most among active ACC quarterbacks.
- Kaaya's 10 career 300-yard passing games are ranked second behind Clemson's Deshaun Watson among active ACC players.
- Kaaya was one of just three players nationally to throw for 3,000-or-more yards, 10-or-more touchdowns and five-or-fewer interceptions in 2015.
- As a freshman in 2014, Kaaya was named the ACC Offensive and ACC Overall Rookie of the Year after a stellar first campaign with the Hurricanes.

CAN OF CORN

- Through 11 games in 2016, Corn Elder has totaled 63.0 tackles (48.0 solo), 4.5 tackles for loss, 3.0 sacks, one interception and 11 pass breakups.
- His 11 pass breakups are a team best. He also leads the team with 46.0 solo tackles.
- In the Hurricanes' home opener against FAMU, Elder picked off a pass and tallied a pair of tackles.
- In Miami's first road game of the year at Appalachian State, Elder tied a then career high with 7.0 tackles. He also tallied a sack, a tackle for loss, one pass breakup and one quarterback hurry.
- Against Florida State, Elder registered 6.0 tackles and one pass breakup.
- In the Hurricanes' matchup against North Carolina, Elder posted career highs in tackles (14.0) and solo tackles (11.0). He also tallied a pass breakup and a sack.
- Against Virginia Tech, Elder made six stops and had two pass breakups.
- Elder recorded a team-best 9.0 solo tackles and had a pass breakup versus Pittsburgh.
- On Nov. 12 versus Virginia, Elder recorded 5.0 tackles (4.0 solo), a sack, a forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

KOOL CANES

- Craig Kuligowski, who is widely regarded as one of the top defensive line coaches in the country, has already made an immediate impact in his first season at Miami. The Hurricanes currently are fourth in the nation in tackles for loss per game (8.6) and rank 23rd in sacks per game (2.73).
- Through 11 games, Miami has totaled 95 tackles for loss and 31 sacks. In 2015, the Hurricanes recorded 66 tackles for loss and 26 sacks for the entire season.
- Prior to arriving at Miami, Kuligowski spent 15 years at Missouri, where his defensive line units frequently ranked among the nation's best in tackles for loss and sacks.

GETTING DEFENSIVE

- Under first-year defensive coordinator and Miami native Manny Diaz, the Hurricanes are holding opponents to just 4.81 yards per play - a figure that ranks 16th among teams at the FBS level.
- The Hurricanes rank in the top 25 nationally in four different defensive categories: scoring defense (No. 16/18.7), team sacks (No. 23/2.73), tackles for loss (No. 4/8.6) and total defense (No. 25/351.6).
- Miami has allowed 23 touchdowns in its last 46 quarters dating back to last season.
- Miami has held nine of its 11 opponents under its 2016 scoring average, including NC State last week.
- Miami has started and finished games strong, outscoring its opponents by a combined 149-74 in the first and fourth quarters of games.
- The Hurricanes have held three opponents scoreless in the second half this season (FAMU, North Carolina and Virginia).



- In its ACC opener against Georgia Tech, Miami's defense accounted for 12 points, as freshmen Shaquille Quarterman and Joe Jackson each returned a fumble for a touchdown.
- Through 11 games in 2016, nine players already have at least 5.0 tackles for loss. In 2015, just four players finished the season (13 games) with at least 5.0 tackles for loss.
- Against Appalachian State, Miami held the Mountaineers to just 2.6 yards per carry on the ground.
- Miami dominated FAU in the first half, as it held the Owls to just one yard rushing on 17 attempts. The Hurricanes also did not allow the Owls to convert one third-down conversion as they went 0-for-11. FAU finished the game with just 46 yards.
- The Hurricanes opened the year on a high note, as they held FAMU to just 43 second-half yards.

WHAT A DIFFERENCE A YEAR MAKES

- In 2016, Miami has made significant jumps in nine major defensive statistical categories. Listed below is a complete breakdown of the Hurricanes improvement on the defensive side of the ball.

MAKING HIS MARK

- Running back Mark Walton has rushed for over 100 yards in six games this season.
- With his 120 yards rushing this past weekend at NC State, Walton became the 10th Miami running back to surpass 1,000 yards rushing in a single season. It also marked the 11th time Miami has had 1,000-yard rusher (Edgerrin James surpassed 1,000 yards twice).
- Walton's three touchdown performance against NC State marked the fifth time in his career in which he has scored multiple touchdowns.
- On Oct. 12 at Virginia, Walton dashed for 111 yards on the ground.
- Against Pittsburgh, Walton rushed for 125 yards and a touchdown.
- Against North Carolina on Oct. 15, Walton rushed for 82 yards on a career-high 24 carries.
- Walton has more than doubled his 2015 rushing total of 461 yards. He currently leads the team with 1,005 yards on the ground.
- Walton scored a touchdown on the first play of the game at Appalachian State, as he raced 80 yards for the score. His 80-yard run was the longest of his young career.
- Walton's 80-yard touchdown run against Appalachian State is tied for the second-longest rush in the ACC this season.
- In 24 career games, Walton has scored 24 touchdowns (23 rushing, one receiving).
- On Sept. 10 against FAU, Walton rushed for a career-high 155 yards. He also scored a career-high four touchdowns against the Owls. His 155-yard output against FAU was the fifth highest rushing total in the ACC this season. In two career games against FAU, Walton has totaled seven rushing touchdowns.
- Walton got off to an impressive start to the 2016 season, as he rushed for a then-career-high 116 yards and had one touchdown against FAMU.
- Walton delivered an impressive first season with the Hurricanes as a freshman in 2015, ranking second on the team with 1,054 all-purpose yards and first with 10 total touchdowns.
- Walton's 10 touchdowns - nine rushing and one receiving - were tied with Stacy Coley (2013) for second-most by a Miami freshman since 2000.
- Walton, who had 461 rushing yards and 293 receiving yards, was one of just 11 freshman running backs nationally with eight-or-more rushing touchdowns in 2015.

AHMMON RICHARDS AMONG THE BEST UM FRESHMAN WRs ... EVER

- Freshman wide receiver Ahmmon Richards currently leads the Hurricanes with 849 yards receiving. His 849 yards are the most ever by a freshman wide receiver at Miami.
- His 849 receiving yards currently rank 10th all-time in a single season at Miami.
- His 19.74 yards per reception are tops among all FBS freshman nationally. Richards' 19.74 yards per reception are ranked 11th nationally overall.
- Richards' 849 yards receiving lead all FBS freshman nationally.
- Richards has been honored as the ACC Rookie of the Week twice this season.

FRESHMAN PHENOMS

- Miami freshman linebackers Michael Pinckney, Shaquille Quarterman and Zach McCloud have made an immediate impact in their first seasons at The U.
- The three rookie linebackers have combined for 144.0 tackles, 18.0 tackles for loss and 5.0 sacks. They have combined for nearly 19 percent of the team's tackles this season.
- The Miami freshman trio has started at linebacker in the Hurricanes' last nine games. UM is the only school in the nation that has started three true freshman linebackers.
- Quarterman and Pinckney are ranked first (69.0) and fifth (50.0) on the team in tackles, while McCloud ranks 12th on the team in tackles (25.0).

THE SPECIALIST

- Through 11 games this season, punter Justin Vogel has lived up to his preseason all-conference honor. The Tampa, Fla., native has 54 punts for 2,380 yards. His 44.1 yards per punt average ranks second in the ACC and 24th nationally.
- Vogel has 21 punts that have landed inside the 20-yard line and has 15 that have gone over 50 yards.
- Vogel earned Preseason All-ACC honors after a stellar junior season in which he was recognized with All-ACC Third-Team honors by the media and All-ACC honorable mention from the league's coaches.
- Vogel averaged 42.5 yards per punt in 2015, while his 73-yarder against Clemson on Oct. 24 was the longest of any ACC punter in 2015. He totaled 13 punts of 50 yards or more last season.
- Vogel was one of 28 punters to be named to the watch list for the 2016 Ray Guy Award. Vogel is a three-time Ray Guy Award nominee and was a semifinalist for the award in 2014.
- After spending the 2013 season at Florida, Vogel averaged 42.8 yards per punt and 62.1 yards on kickoffs in 2014. He was named Third-Team All-ACC by Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association.

THE COLEY CONNECTION

- Wide receiver Stacy Coley has established himself as one of the Hurricanes' top pass catchers of all-time. In 47 career games, Coley has hauled in 154 receptions (second all-time) for 2,049 yards (eighth) and 19 touchdowns (tied for seventh).
- Coley's eight receiving touchdowns this season rank 34th in the NCAA and third in the ACC.
- He currently stands as the team's leading pass catcher with 49 receptions.
- Coley has caught a pass in 20 straight games.
- On Oct. 10, Coley was named ACC Receiver of the Week after he hauled in seven catches for 80 yards and two touchdowns against Florida State.
- Coley had a dominant freshman season in 2013, earning Freshman All-America honors and All-ACC recognition after leading the team with 1,461 all-purpose yards.
- After a quiet 2014, he returned to form in 2015. Despite missing two games with a hamstring injury, Coley finished second on the team in catches (47) and receiving yards (689).

- Coley's 79.2 yards-per-game average in conference play ranked second in the ACC last season.
- He caught at least three passes in each of his final nine games in 2015, and had 678 yards over that span.
- Following the 2015 campaign, he earned All-ACC Second Team (Coaches) and All-ACC Third Team (ACSMA) recognition.

BADG-O-MATIC

- Junior Michael Badgley enjoyed a prolific season in 2015, setting the Miami single-season record for made field goals (25) and besting the previous school record held by Jon Peattie (22, 2003). He entered 2016 on the watch list for the Lou Groza Award, which honors the nation's best kicker.
- He is a perfect 19-of-19 in field goal attempts from between 40-49 yards during his UM career.
- Badgley has connected on 45 extra points this season. His consecutive streak for PAT kicks made ended against Florida State at 72. He has now 118 PAT kicks made for his career. He is 16-for-21 in field goal attempts this season.
- This past weekend at NC State, Badgley was 2-for-3 as booted field goals from 31 and 22 yards.
- Against Virginia, Badgley was 2-for-3 in field goal attempts as he was good from 40 and 44 yards.
- On Nov. 5 versus Pittsburgh, Badgley was 3-for-3, connecting from 46, 48 and 25 yards out.
- Against Notre Dame, Badgley was 2-for-2 in field goal attempts as he connected on attempts from 43 and 38 yards out.
- On Oct. 15 against North Carolina, Badgley hit a pair of field goals from 47 and 22 yards out.
- Against Florida State, Badgley drilled two field goals, including a season-long 51-yarder. His 51-yard field goal against FSU is tied for the third longest field goal in the ACC this year.
- Against Appalachian State, Badgley connected on six extra points and a 44-yard field goal.
- Badgley tied a UM record when he hit a 57-yard field goal against Georgia Tech in 2015.
- The Summit, N.J., native set a school record when he hit five field goals against Nebraska in 2015, and would tie that mark later in the season with five field goals made against Pittsburgh.
- Badgley's 2.08 field goals per game average ranked first in Division I last season, while his 25 made field goals were tied for fourth-most in the nation. He ranked 16th in scoring (9.6 points per game).

THE SOUTH FLORIDA DUO

- Miami running backs Mark Walton and Joe Yearby have combined to rush for 1,595 yards this season.
- Louisville's rushing duo of Lamar Jackson and Brandon Radcliff are the only other rushing tandem in the ACC that have more combined yards than Walton and Yearby.
- Walton (1,005) and Yearby (590) have accounted for 91 percent of the Hurricanes rushing output this year.
- In addition, Walton (84) and Yearby (42) have combined for 126 points.
- Both Walton (Booker T. Washington) and Yearby (Miami Central) attended Miami-area high schools before joining the Hurricanes.

CONSISTENT CANES

- Offensive lineman Danny Isidora leads all Hurricanes with 37 straight starts.
- Fellow offensive linemen Trevor Darling and Nick Linder had their consecutive start streaks snapped at 27 and 22 games, respectively against Virginia.
- Corn Elder, Danny Isidora, Brad Kaaya, KC McDermott, R.J. McIntosh, Kendrick Norton, Michael Pinckney, Shaquille Quarterman, Mark Walton have started in every game this season.
- Miami's active all-time start leaders include offensive lineman Danny Isidora (37), quarterback Brad Kaaya (36), defensive back Rayshawn Jenkins (32) and wide receiver Stacy Coley (29).

TAKE THREE

- Miami is 18-1 since 2011 when forcing three-or-more turnovers, plus the Canes have won 63 of their last 67 games when recording at least three takeaways.

- Teams rarely beat Miami when scoring 10-or-fewer points.
- The Hurricanes are 161-2 in their last 163 games when holding opponents to 10 points-or-fewer, after winning 45-10 at Appalachian State. That run goes back to Oct. 1, 1977, ironically, a season that began with Miami holding its first two opponents to exactly 10 points apiece and still losing both of those games.
- The only 10 points allowed-or-fewer losses since: Nov. 8, 2003 to Tennessee (10-6) and Sept. 5, 2005 to Florida State (10-7).

#TIGHTENDU TRADITION ALIVE AND WELL

- Junior Christopher Herndon IV and redshirt sophomore David Njoku have played significant roles in the offense this season.
- Njoku (36) and Herndon IV (24) rank third and fourth on the team in receptions, respectively. Njoku (520) and Herndon IV (286) have combined for 806 yards receiving.
- Njoku's 36 receptions this season rank third and his 520 yards receiving rank fifth among ACC tight ends.
- Njoku and Herndon IV have combined for 27 percent of the team's receptions this year.
- Miami added two tight end signees in 2016: Jovani Haskins and Michael Irvin II.

BLOCK PARTY

- The Miami Hurricanes have proven to be a force when it comes to blocking kicks and punts this season. Through 11 games in 2016, Miami has combined for eight blocks on special teams with three coming on punts attempts and five coming on field goal attempts.
- Miami is second in the nation in blocked punts and is ranked fifth in blocked kicks.
- Sophomore RJ McIntosh blocked his first career punt against FAU on Sept. 10. It marked the second straight week in which a Miami player had blocked a punt. Pat Bethel blocked a punt in the Hurricanes' season opener against FAMU.
- McIntosh also has blocked two kicks this season. His two blocked kicks are ranked fourth in the NCAA and first in the ACC.
- On Oct. 29 at Notre Dame, Miami freshman Zach McCloud blocked his first career punt.
- The Hurricanes are one of just 18 teams nationally that have blocked punts this season and one of just 65 teams that have blocked kicks this year.

BRINGIN' IT BACK WITH BERRIOS

- Miami's punt return attack ranks 11th in the country (12.89 avg.) in large part to the play of junior Braxton Berrios, who has played a key role in the Hurricanes punt return game this season.
- The North Carolina native ranks 10th in the country and third in the ACC in punt return average (12.8 avg.). He also is one of just six players this season that have returned a punt for a touchdown.
- His 41-yard punt return for a touchdown in Miami's season opener against FAMU was the first of his career. It also marked the first time a Hurricane had scored on a punt return since Corn Elder did so against Bethune-Cookman in 2015.
- Berrios also had a career-best 43-yard punt return, which set up the Hurricanes second touchdown of the night against Florida State.
- Berrios' punt returns of 43 (vs. FSU) and 41 (vs. FAMU) are ranked as the eighth and ninth longest punt returns in the ACC this year.
- Off the field, Berrios excels in the classroom with a team-best 3.986 grade point average in finance/entrepreneurship. He also has never received a grade lower than an A- since coming to college.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW

ZAGACKI AND BAILEY RETURN TO THE BOOTH FOR YEAR 15

- "Voice of the Hurricanes" Joe Zagacki and color commentator Don Bailey, Jr. are in the booth for their 15th year of Miami football on the radio.
- The radio team has broadcast 224 straight games together.

CREATING A TRUE HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE

- Through five home games this season, Miami has seen 294,038 fans pass into the newly renovated Hard Rock Stadium - a figure that ranks as the 41st in the nation.
- The Hurricanes have averaged 58,808 fans per game this season - good for 29th in the nation.
- Miami has seen more than 50,000 fans attend each of its first five games this season.
- The Hurricanes have never posted single game attendance marks of 50,000-or-more in each of their first five games.
- Miami sold out its home game against Florida State on Oct. 8.
- The Hurricanes currently have over 42,000 football season ticket holders.
- Since the hiring of head coach Mark Richt on Dec. 4, 2015, Miami has added 15,000 new season ticket holders.

#PROCANES CONTINUING TRADITION

- Miami currently has **43 #ProCanes on NFL rosters; 22 of 32** NFL teams had at least one former Cane on their roster, while the Indianapolis Colts lead all teams with four.
- Miami had two players selected in the 2016 NFL Draft: DB Artie Burns (1st round, PIT) and DB Deon Bush (4th, CHI).
- Miami had eight former student-athletes sign free agent contracts following the 2015 season: Rashawn Scott (MIA), Tracy Howard (CLE), Ufomba Kamalu (DEN), Calvin Heurtelou (HOU), Herb Waters (GB), Tyrion McCord (PIT) and Raphael Kirby (DET).
- The Hurricanes have had five or more players taken in the NFL Draft on 24 separate occasions since 1980.
- Ninety-five Hurricanes have been picked in the NFL Draft since the start of the 2000 season, a figure that is tied for second-most among all NCAA programs.
- Miami's 29 NFL first-round draft picks since 2000, including Artie Burns (No. 25 overall) in 2016, are the most among all NCAA programs.

WISE GUYS

- University of Miami football juniors Braxton Berrios and Brad Kaaya were named to the 2016 College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-District™ Football First Team in District Four.
- Berrios, who sports a 3.98 grade point average majoring in finance and entrepreneurship was selected to the team for the second consecutive season. Kaaya was earned a spot on the team with a 3.33 grade point average in public relations.
- Both are now eligible for CoSIDA Academic All-America honors. The CoSIDA Academic All-America® Teams will be selected later this month.

CANES RECEIVE LEAD GIFT FOR INDOOR FACILITY

- The University of Miami announced earlier this fall the largest donation in the history of the Department of Athletics as the lead gift for a state-of-the-art football indoor practice facility.
- In honor of their mother, Carol, Jeffrey Soffer and Carol's other children, have made a \$14 million commitment towards the Carol Soffer Football Indoor Practice Facility.
- The 81,800-square-foot facility will feature two field-turf fields - one 80 yards long and an additional 40-yard field directly connecting to the Squillante Strength and Conditioning Center.
- The project includes a 20,000-square-foot football operations center with a mezzanine level that will house all of the football coaches' office space.
- Head coach Mark Richt also made \$1 million commitment towards the project.

MARK RICHT

HEAD COACH | FIRST SEASON AT MIAMI (16TH OVERALL) | 152-55 (.734)

Hurricane alumnus Mark Richt was named the 24th head football coach at the University of Miami on Dec. 4, 2015, by Director of Athletics Blake James.

The 2016 season marks Richt's first season in Coral Gables.

Richt, born in Omaha, Neb., and raised in Boca Raton, Fla., returned to his alma mater after leading the University of Georgia football program for the past 15 years, compiling a 145-51 overall record and an 85-40 mark in Southeastern Conference play, winning two SEC championships, six SEC East titles and nine bowl games, and finishing the season in the Associated Press Top 10 rankings seven times.

Richt's .745 winning percentage prior to the 2016 season, ranked eighth-best among active FBS head coaches.

Richt is one of only seven head coaches in SEC history to record four straight 10-win seasons (2002-05).

During his tenure on the sidelines in Athens, Ga., 77 of Richt's players were selected in the NFL Draft over the last 14 years, including eight chosen in the 2002 and 2013 NFL Drafts – the most Georgia players ever selected in a single year.

Off the field, Richt places a strong emphasis on academics and 292 Georgia players earned their degrees during his tenure.

Richt was the 2013 recipient of the Stallings Award given for commitment to humanitarian and community service efforts, and in 2010, he was named to the American

Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees.

Before his arrival at Georgia, Richt spent seven seasons as the offensive coordinator at Florida State. In his time in Tallahassee, the Seminoles finished in the nation's top five in scoring offense on five occasions, top 12 in total offense five times, and top 12 in passing offense five times.

The 2000 team, which played in the National Championship game against Oklahoma, finished the regular season ranked first nationally in total offense (549.0 ypg), first in passing offense (384.0 ypg) and third in scoring offense (42.4 ppg).

Richt sent six FSU quarterbacks into the NFL between 1987 and 2000. In 2000, Richt coached Chris Weinke to the Heisman Trophy, and in 1991, he coached Casey Weldon to the runner-up for the Heisman. Brad Johnson (now Richt's brother-in-law), was a Pro Bowl selection for Washington in 2000 and led the Tampa Bay Bucs to the Super Bowl title in 2003. Other Richt pro protégés include Danny Kanell (New York Giants), Danny McManus (Kansas City Chiefs) and Peter Tom Willis (Chicago Bears).

Richt played quarterback for the Miami Hurricanes under legendary head coach Howard Schnellenberger (1979-82).

He spent most of his career at Miami as a backup to former Pro Football Hall of Famer Buffalo Bills star Jim Kelly. In one of Richt's years at Miami, his teammates included Kelly, Vinny Testaverde and Bernie Kosar and quarterbacks coach Earl Morrall.

Richt is married to the former Katharyn Francis of Tallahassee, Fla. The couple has four children – Jonathan, David, Zach and Anya. Jon was married to the former Anna Cearley, in May 2010.
