WAKE FOREST HEADS SOUTH TO TAKE ON MIAMI

- Coming off a win over Georgia Tech on Wednesday, Wake Forest will look to make it two straight when the Demon Deacons travel to Coral Gables to take on the Miami Hurricanes on Saturday afternoon.
- Tip-off is scheduled for 1 p.m. at the BankUnited Center.

HOW TO CATCH THE GAME

- Wednesday's game will be televised regionally by Fox Sports. Rich Waltz (play-by-play) and Debbie Antonelli (color) will call the action.
- The game can be heard on the Wake Forest IMG College Sports Network and online at WakeForestSports.com. Stan Cotten (play-by-play) and Mark Freidinger (color) have the call.

LAST TIME OUT

- Wake Forest (12-14, 3-9 ACC) is coming off a 59-50 win over Georgia Tech on Wednesday in Winston-Salem. The Deacons erased a late three-point deficit with an 11-0 run, which was fueled by seven points from Travis McKie.
- McKie, Tony Chennault and C.J. Harris combined to go 8-for-8 at the free throw line in the final minute to help seal the win.
- McKie led the Deacons with his fifth double-double of the season, leading all players with 23 points and 11 rebounds.
- Harris saw his 24-game double-figure scoring streak come to an end, as he finished with eight points to go along with a season-high six assists.

TODAY'S OPPONENT

- Miami (15-9, 6-5 ACC) is coming off a 73-64 loss to North Carolina on Wednesday in Coral Gables. The loss was the second straight for the Hurricanes, who had a five-game winning streak stopped last weekend.
- Winston-Salem native Reggie Johnson leads Miami with 7.1 rebounds per game and is fourth on the team with 11.4 points per game as well.

SERIES HISTORY

- Wake Forest leads the all-time series with Miami, 8-5. The Hurricanes have won two straight and four of the past five meetings since 2008-09.
- Miami pulled out a 74-73 win in Winston-Salem last season, as Reggie Johnson hit two free throws with four seconds remaining. J.T. Terrell's would-be game-winning 3-pointer rimmed out at the buzzer.
- Miami's win last season was its first in six trips to the Joel Coliseum.
- The Deacons are 2-3 all-time at the BankUnited Center.

NEXT UP...

- Wake Forest will have the mid-week off before hosting Boston College on Saturday, Feb. 25, at 1 p.m. The Eagles are 8-17 overall and 3-8 in the ACC entering Thursday's game at Maryland.
- The Deacons will then host No. 5-ranked Duke for Senior Night on Tuesday, Feb. 28, at 9 p.m. The Blue Devils are 21-4 overall and 8-2 in the ACC entering Thursday's home game against NC State. Duke already posted a 91-73 defeat of Wake Forest on Jan. 19 in Durham.

LAST TIME OUT

Travis McKie posted a double-double of 23 points and 11 rebounds, and the Demon Deacons used a late run to earn a 59-50 win over Georgia Tech on Wednesday at the Lawrence Joel Coliseum.

McKie put together one of his best performances of the season, willing the Deacons back to the lead on two separate occasions and securing his fifth double-double of the season.

McKie was joined in double figures by Tony Chennault, who finished with 12 points and a career-high eight rebounds, and Nikita Mescheriakov, who scored 11 points to finish in double-digits for the second consecutive game.

C.J. Harris was held to just eight points but did contribute a season-high six assists to go along with four clutch free throws down the stretch. Harris had scored in double figures in 24 straight games, which was the 11th-longest streak by a Deacon since 1970.

Wake Forest held the early advantage, ending the first half on a 10-3 run, which was capped by a long jumper from Harris at the buzzer, to take a 24-17 lead into the break.

Georgia Tech quickly erased the deficit in the second half, starting the period with a 10-0 run over the first 2:11.

With the Yellow Jackets leading 41-38 at the seven-minute mark, the Deacons went on an 11-0 run over the next 3:13 to take an eight-point lead which they would not relinquish. McKie fueled the run with seven straight points to start.

McKie, Chennault and Harris combined to go 8-for-8 at the free throw line in the final minute to help seal the win.

As a team, Wake Forest went 19-of-20 from the free throw line for 95 percent on the night. The Deacons also out-rebounded the Jackets, 42-32, and won the turnover battle with 11 miscues compared to 14 for the visitors.

NOTABLE FROM THE GEORGIA TECH GAME

- The Deacons pulled down a season-high 18 offensive rebounds in the game. It was Wake Forest's most offensive boards since finishing with 19 against Kentucky in the second round of the 2010 NCAA Tournament.
- Wake's 17 second-chance points were a season-high.
- Wake Forest shot 32.7 percent (18-of-55) from the field to mark the Deacons' lowest field goal percentage in a win since shooting 30.0 percent (12-of-40) in a 47-40 win at Richmond on Dec. 22, 2005.
- Wake Forest utilized its fourth different starting lineup, as guard Chase Fischer started in place of center Ty Walker. It was Fischer's second start and his first during ACC play.
- Chase Fischer missed his first eight shots of the game but still hit a big 3-pointer that cut Georgia Tech's lead down to one (39-38) at the 8:21 mark of the second half.

WHAT'S UP NEXT FOR THE DEACONS...

- Following the Miami game, Wake Forest will have the mid-week off before hosting Boston College on Saturday, Feb. 25, at 1 p.m. The Eagles are 8-17 overall and 3-8 in the ACC entering Thursday's game at Maryland.
- Wake Forest already posted a win over Boston College last month in Chestnut Hill. The Deacons came away with a 71-56 win to move to 4-9 all-time against the Eagles and snap a two-game losing streak in the series.
- Following the Boston College game, Wake Forest will host No. 5-ranked Duke for Senior Night on Tuesday, Feb. 28, at 9 p.m.
- The Deacons will be looking to split the season series with the Blue Devils after suffering a 91-73 loss in Durham on Jan. 19. Duke is 21-4 overall and 8-2 in the ACC entering Thursday's home game against NC State.

WAKE FOREST LEADS ACC IN FREE THROW PERCENTAGE

- Wake Forest leads the ACC in free throw percentage in conference games at 76.5 percent (176-of-230). The Deacons are ranked third in all games at 73.3 percent (423-of-527).
- The Deacons have shot 70 percent or better from the line in five straight and seven of their past eight games.
- C.J. Harris is arguably the league's top free throw shooter, as he leads the ACC in conference games (93.9; 62-66) and is second in all games (84.7; 133-157).
- The league leader in all games, Seth Curry (86.4; 70-81) is averaging three fewer free throw attempts per game than Harris).
- Harris has made 41 of his last 42 free throws over the past eight games.

HARRIS, McKIE LOGGING MOST MINUTES AMONG ACC PLAYERS

- C.J. Harris and Travis McKie rank 1-2 in the ACC in minutes played this season. Harris is averaging 35.0 minutes, while McKie is averaging 34.6.
- McKie is the only player in the ACC to have played 900+ minutes this season.
- In conference games, Harris ranks third (35.6) while McKie is sixth (34.4).
- The only Deacon to ever lead the ACC in minutes played is Ishmael Smith, who averaged 36.8 minutes in 2009-10.

HARRIS' DOUBLE-FIGURE SCORING STREAK STOPPED AT 24

- C.J. Harris saw his 24-game double-figure scoring streak snapped on Wednesday against Georgia Tech. Harris finished with just eight points after going 2-for-8 from the field.
- Harris had scored in double figures in every game this season, marking the 11th-longest streak by a Deacon since 1970.
- Harris' streak marked the longest for a Deacon since Jeff Teague ended his career by scoring in doubles in 35 straight games between the 2007-08 season (4 games) and the 2008-09 season (all 31 games).
- Harris has scored 20+ points in a game nine times this season to rank second in the ACC behind Maryland's Terrell Stoglin (15).

MISCELLANEOUS STREAKS & STATS

- The Deacons have pulled down double-figure offensive rebounds in four of their past six games, including a season-high 18 vs. Georgia Tech.
- Wake Forest has gotten double-digit bench points in five of the last six games.
- Wake Forest's opponents are averaging 5.3 made free throws on an average of just 10 attempts over the past three games.
- Chase Fischer has hit at least one 3-pointer in 10 of his past 12 games.



ON THIS DATE

The Deacons have compiled a record of 11-5 on the date of February 11 (since 1955). Wake Forest has won its past three games on the date since 1995.

February 18, 1964

Wake Forest upset rival No. 4-ranked Duke at home with a score of 72-71. The win was part of an impressive record of 8-2 for the Deacons for the month of February. Frank Christie set an individual high for the season as he netted 25 points for Wake Forest.

February 18, 1969

Charles Davis helped lead Wake Forest to a victory over Clemson by going 17-19 from the free throw line. His performance from the line landed him tied for second all-time for the most free throws made in a single game in Wake history. Clemson's Butch Zateazio led all players with an impressive 46 points scored.

February 18, 1984

No. 13-ranked Wake Forest fell to No. 19-ranked Duke 77-79 in a tough overtime loss. The Deacons battled back from a halftime deficit of 43-23 to pull close at the end of the game. The loss snapped a six-game winning streak for the Deacons which included three overtime wins.

February 18, 1995

No. 14-ranked Wake Forest pulled off a strong win against No.18-ranked Georgia Tech at the Joel Coliseum. Four Deacons scored in double figures, led by Randolph Childress who had 15. The win was part of a 12-game winning streak for the Deacons that lasted from late January to late March.

February 18, 2004

Chris Paul led Wake Forest to a huge upset over Duke 90-84 to improve the Deacons record to 16-6 that season. The Deacons' bench played a major role in the game by contributing an impressive 32 points compared to a low of 13 from Duke's bench. The win was part of a spark that helped lead Wake Forest to their first Sweet Sixteen appearance since 1996.

- Ty Walker has had at least three blocks in eight of his past 11 games. Walker leads the ACC in blocks in conference games (3.3 bpg).
- Carson Desrosiers has had at least one block in all but two games this season.
- Travis McKie leads the team with seven charges drawn this season, while Nikita Mescheriakov is second with six.

WALKER, DESROSIER RANK HIGH ON CAREER BLOCKS LIST

- Wake Forest's current roster features two of the top 12 shot-blockers in school history. Ty Walker ranks seventh on the career list, while Carson Desrosiers is not far behind in 12th.
- Walker has 138 blocks in 67 career games, and Desrosiers has 105 in 57 games.
- Walker is two blocks behind Antwan Scott (1999-2002) for sixth place on the list. He could then surpass Josh Howard (2000-03) for fifth, but Walker likely cannot crack the top four at this point in his senior season.
- While every other player in the top 10 played at least 107 games in their college career, Walker has amassed his total in just 67 career games. He has averaged 2.1 blocks per game for his career, which is second in school history behind only Tim Duncan's average of 3.8 per game.
- Desrosiers, in just his second season on campus, has averaged 1.8 blocks per game which is good for third in school history behind Duncan and Walker.
- Walker ranks 21st in ACC history with 2.10 blocks per game. Desrosiers is 26th on the all-time list with 1.86 bpg. Duncan, who leads the list, Walker and Desrosiers are the only Deacons among the top 30 in ACC history.

HARRIS HITTING FREE THROWS

- C.J. Harris has missed just two free throws in his past nine games, going 52-for-54 for 96.3 percent during the stretch.
- Harris has made 41 of his last 42 free throws over the past eight games.
- Entering the NC State game on Feb. 4, Harris had made 24 straight free throws. However, he made his first two at NC State and then missed the third to snap the streak at 26.
- Harris has been the ACC's best free throw shooter in conference play, going 62-of-66 for 93.9 percent at the line.

WAKE FOREST 2ND IN ACC IN BLOCKS IN CONFERENCE GAMES

- Wake Forest has been one of the ACC's top shot-blocking squads in conference play this season, ranking second in the league with 5.7 blocks per game.
- The Deacons are fourth in the ACC in all games with 4.9 blocks per game.
- Wake Forest has two of the top shot blockers in ACC games. Ty Walker leads with 3.3 blocks per game, while Carson Desrosiers is eighth with 1.4 per game.
- Walker and Desrosiers have combined to block 56 shots (4.7 bpg combined) through the team's first 12 league games.
- Walker is second among active ACC players with 138 career blocks, trailing only UNC's John Henson (260). Desrosiers is seventh on the active list.

MCKIE FINDING HIS DOUBLE-DOUBLE GROOVE

- Travis McKie posted seven double-doubles as a freshman in 2010-11, but he waited until the 15th game (Virginia Tech) of the 2011-12 season to post his first of the year.
- McKie has been making up for lost time with five double-doubles during ACC play.
- McKie is averaging just under a double-double in conference play with 13.7 points and 8.9 rebounds.
- McKie ranks seventh among active ACC players with 12 career double-doubles.

C.J. HARRIS, TRAVIS MCKIE ENJOYING THEIR 20'S

- C.J. Harris and Travis McKie have nine 20-point performances this season a piece.
- Harris and McKie are tied for third in the ACC in 20-point games this season.
- McKie is fourth among active ACC players with 14 20-point performances.
- McKie's 20-point games this season include four games with a career-high 25 points.
- Harris entered the year with just two previous 20-point performances and now has 11 for his career.

TY WALKER PROVING TO BE DIFFERENCE-MAKER IN THE POST

- Since returning from his University suspension that sidelined him for the first nine games of the year, Ty Walker has transformed himself into a defensive difference-maker in the post.
- In 17 games overall, Walker is averaging 4.6 points, 4.8 rebounds and 2.6 blocks in 20.4 minutes per game while shooting 47.9 percent (35-of-73) from the field.
- Walker has started 11 of the past 12 games after coming off the bench in his first five games of the year.
- Walker was a disruptive force in the Deacons win at BC on Jan. 21, finishing the game with six blocks and 11 rebounds.
- On Jan. 25 vs. Florida State, Walker's defensive presence kept the Deacons in the game early, as the senior tallied four blocks and four rebounds in 15 minutes before leaving the game with a concussion.
- On Jan. 11 at Maryland, Walker flirted with a triple-double with eight points, nine rebounds and eight blocks.

DEACONS AT THE LINE

- One of Wake Forest's strengths this season has been getting to the free throw line. The Deacons have attempted 577 free throws in 26 games for an average of 22.2 per game.
- C.J. Harris is second in the ACC with 6.3 free throw attempts per game.
- Wake Forest is 423-for-577 for 73.3 percent at the line. The Deacons are third in the ACC in free throw percentage after ranking second in the league last season (74.6%).
- Wake Forest's opponents have attempted 472 free throws for an average of 18.2 attempts per game this season.
- The Deacons are averaging 16.3 made free throws per game, which is almost four more than their opponents (12.6).

RANDOLPH CHILDRESS NAMED ACC TOURNAMENT LEGEND

Former Wake Forest great Randolph Childress has been named to the 2012 ACC Basketball Tournament Legends class, as announced by the league office last week.

Childress (1991-95) turned in one of the spectacular performances in the history of the ACC Tournament in his senior season, as the sharpshooting guard led Wake Forest to the 1995 ACC Championship by averaging 35.7 points and seven assists per game in the Tournament's three contests.

That year, Childress, playing for coach Dave Odom, saved his best for last, scoring 37 points and passing out seven assists. In the title game, he connected on the game-winning jump shot with only four seconds remaining in overtime as Wake defeated North Carolina, 82-80.

A second-team All-America selection in 1995, he was named first-team All-ACC in 1994 and 1995 and second-team All-ACC in 1993.

He scored 2,208 points during his career, which still ranks 18th on the ACC's career scoring list, and he made 329 3-point field goals, the fifth-highest total in ACC history.

He helped lead the Deacons to a four-year record of 85-39 which included four NCAA Tournament appearances and two trips to the NCAA Sweet 16. He was twice named to the ACC All-Tournament team in 1994 and 1995.

Selected as the 19th overall choice of the Detroit Pistons in the first round of the 1995 NBA Draft, he played two seasons in the NBA with Detroit and Portland. He then played 14 professional seasons in Turkey, France, Italy and Australia.

A native of Washington, D.C., he recently returned to Wake Forest to serve as the Assistant to the Athletic Director.

LARUE ADVANCES TO ELITE 8 IN SHOTS FROM THE HEART CONTEST

Rusty LaRue has advanced to the Elite Eight of the assistant coaches' bracket of CollegeInsider.com's "Shots From the Heart", a free throw shooting tournament designed to benefit the Skip Prosser Foundation and raise awareness for the grow-

ing problem of heart disease.

LaRue made all 25 of his free throw attempts in January to squeak past Valparaiso's Roger Powell, who made 24 of 25. LaRue has not missed a free throw in the first three rounds.

LaRue, who advanced to the Sweet 16 of last year's competition as well, takes on UL-Lafayette's Brock Morris for a chance to earn a spot in the Final Four.

Each coach shoots 25 free throws on their own. The first 20 shots earn a single point, shots 21-24 earn two points, and the final shot earns three points.

The coach with the highest number of points in the matchup advances to the next round. The tournament will feature one round per month leading up to the 2012 Final Four.

HARRIS REACHES 1,000 CAREER POINTS

- C.J. Harris scored 19 points on Jan. 31 against North Carolina to reach exactly 1,000 for his career. Harris currently has 1,057 points in 88 career games for an average of 12.0 ppg.
- Harris is one of 10 active ACC players with 1,000 career points.
- Harris is the 48th all-time Deacon, and the first since 2009-10, to reach 1,000 career points.
- Harris joins Jeff Teague (2009), Justin Gray (2005) and Eric Williams (2005) as recent Deacons to reach 1,000 points prior to their senior season.

HARRIS MISSED WOFFORD GAME WITH GROIN INJURY

- C.J. Harris missed his first career game on Jan. 2 against Wofford, sitting out after suffering a groin injury late in the game against Yale on Dec. 29.
- The injury snapped Harris' streak of 76 straight games played. Harris has still started each of the past 57 games he has been healthy.

WAKE FOREST COMPLETES "JUDGMENT DAY" DURING OFFSEASON

Wake Forest completed The Program's "Judgment Day," during offseason workouts in September.

Judgment Day is a grueling two-day leadership training course led by a former U.S. Marine and a former Navy SEAL.

Day 1 was spent on the field at the Wake Forest Baseball Park, where the Deacons were put through various exercises to build leadership and cohesion within the team.

Day 2 began at 5 a.m. and was spent in and around the pool inside of Reynolds Gymnasium.

The Deacons were led through the workouts by CEO and founder Eric Kapitulik, who is a former Major in the U.S. Marine Corp, as well as former Navy SEAL Coleman Ruiz.

Kapitulik founded The Program in 2008 with the mission of providing organizations with the best leadership and team building development in the country.

WAKE FOREST-MIAMI SERIES HISTORY

WAKE FOREST-MIAMI SERIES HISTORY

- Wake Forest leads the all-time series with Miami, 8-5. The Hurricanes have won two straight and four of the past five meetings since 2008-09.
- Miami pulled out a 74-73 win in Winston-Salem last season, as Reggie Johnson hit two free throws with four seconds remaining. J.T. Terrell's would-be game-winning 3-pointer rimmed out at the buzzer.
- Miami's win last season was its first in six trips to the Joel Coliseum.
- The Deacs are 2-3 at the BankUnited Center in Coral Gables. The Hurricanes have won three of the last four meetings at the venue, including a 67-66 victory in Wake Forest's last visit in 2009-10.
- Wake Forest is 6-5 against Miami since the Hurricanes joined the ACC in 2004-05. The Deacons went 2-0 vs. the Canes in non-conference action with games during the 1939-40 season and 1990-91 campaign.
- The teams met three times in 2009-10, which includes their first-ever postseason matchup. Miami won in Coral Gables on Jan. 9, and then Wake earned the win in Winston-Salem on Feb. 2. The Hurricanes took the rubber match, upsetting the Deacons in the opening round of the ACC Tournament in Greensboro.
- The series started during the 1939-40 campaign when the Deacons defeated the Hurricanes, 46-17, on Feb. 5 in Wake Forest, N.C.
- In their final non-conference meeting, Wake Forest edged Miami, 72-66, on Jan. 28, 1991, at the Joel Coliseum. Randolph Childress had 23 points for the Deacons, while Rodney Rogers scored 19.
- Jeff Bzdelik is 1-2 against Miami in his head coaching career. Bzdelik suffered a 75-56 loss at Miami in his second season at UMB in 1987-88. Bzdelik picked up a 57-53 defeat of Miami in Seattle in his second game at the helm of the Air Force Academy in 2005-06.
- Miami head coach Jim Larranaga is 0-1 against Wake Forest, as his George Mason team suffered an 83-78 overtime loss at Wake Forest in the 2005-06 Preseason NIT.

WAKE FOREST VS. MIAMI - FEB. 9, 2011

Miami's Reggie Johnson scored 25 points and hit the game-winning free throw with four seconds remaining as the Hurricanes dealt Wake Forest a heart-breaking 74-73 loss on Feb. 9, 2011, at the Lawrence Joel Coliseum.

After a layup by Johnson stretched Miami's lead to three, J.T. Terrell responded with an off-balance 3-pointer as the shot clock expired to tie the game at 70-70 with 2:25 remaining.

On the next Deacon possession, Terrell hit 1-of-2 free throws to put Wake in the lead again at 71-70. Miami reclaimed the lead with two free throws of its own, and then C.J. Harris hit two free throws to put Wake back on top.

Johnson provided the final margin with a pair of free throws with four seconds left. The Deacons had a well-designed play to get a good look at a game-winner. Harris raced up the court and found Terrell for a 3-point attempt, but the ball rimmed out at the buzzer.

The loss overshadowed a great game for Harris, who poured in a career-high 24 points, including 17-of-18 performance from the free throw line. The 17 free throws were the most by a Deacon since Charlie Davis in 1970.

Terrell and Travis McKie chipped in 10 points apiece, with McKie also leading the Deacons with seven rebounds. Ty Walker had four blocks and went 4-for-4 from the field.

Miami went a perfect 16-of-16 from the free throw line in the second half to earn the victory. The Hurricanes also had an advantage on the glass, outrebounding Wake Forest 29-21, including 13-4 on the offensive glass.

The Deacons shot 53.8 percent (21-of-39) from the floor, their best shooting mark of the ACC season.

Ari Stewart sat out the game with the flu and was not in uniform.

WAKE FOREST AT MIAMI - JAN. 9, 2010

Miami's James Dews made a putback with 28 seconds remaining to send the Hurricanes to a 67-66 defeat of Wake Forest on Jan. 9, 2010, in Coral Gables, which marks the Deacons' most recent game at the BankUnited Center.

The Deacons led 66-65 after Ari Stewart made 1-of-2 free throws with 52 seconds left. The Hurricanes' Dwayne Collins missed a layup, but Dews grabbed the loose ball and laid it in for the the game-winner.

Wake Forest had three looks at the basket in the final 20 seconds but could not convert.

Miami had led by as many as nine in the first half, but Wake was able to cut the deficit to five at the half. The Deacons went up by five midway through the second period but saw that lead evaporate with a 12-1 Hurricane run.

L.D. Williams led the Deacons with 17 points on 7-of-10 shooting. Williams also pulled down six rebounds and tied his career-high with four steals.

Al-Farouq Aminu fell just shy of a double-double, pulling down a game-high 12 boards and scoring nine points.

Ishmael Smith scored 11 points and dished out seven assists in 39 minutes, while Gary Clark came off the bench to score nine points, hitting 3-of-4 from 3-point range.

Wake Forest shot 80 percent from the free throw line, as the Deacons went 20-for-25. C.J. Harris led the way with a 5-for-5 showing.

Miami shot 46.3 percent (25-of-54) from the field, including 6-for-19 from 3-point range for 31.6 percent.

WAKE FOREST VS. THE STATE OF FLORIDA

- Wake Forest is 47-34 all-time against Division I schools based in the state of Florida.
- The Deacons are a combined 31-25 against ACC foes Florida State and Miami.

- Bzdelik is in his second season at the helm of the Wake Forest basketball program. He was named the 21st head coach in Wake Forest history on April 14, 2010, bringing 32 years of coaching experience to the Demon Deacon bench.
- Bzdelik has been involved in coaching college and professional basketball since 1978, including nine seasons as a college head coach and three seasons as the head coach of the NBA's Denver Nuggets.
- The Mount Prospect, Illinois, native came to Wake Forest after spending three seasons as the head coach at the University of Colorado.
- Prior to Colorado, Bzdelik served two seasons as the head coach at the Air Force Academy where he guided the Falcons to a 50-16 record from 2005-07.

- After two seasons at UMBC, Bzdelik made the move to the professional ranks, joining the Washington Bullets as an assistant coach under Wes Unseld.
- Bzdelik joined Pat Riley's New York Knicks staff for the 1994-95 season before following Riley to the Miami Heat where he would spend six seasons from 1995-2001.
- Bzdelik is a 1976 graduate of the University of Illinois-Chicago, where he earned a bachelor's degree in physical education. Bzdelik earned four varsity letters in basketball at UIC, and he was named team MVP as a senior in 1975-76.
- Bzdelik also spent six years in the Army National Guard during the early to mid 1970s.
- Bzdelik is married to the former Nina Bernardzik, who was a standout volleyball player at UIC from 1974-76 and is a member of the Flames' Athletic Hall of Fame.

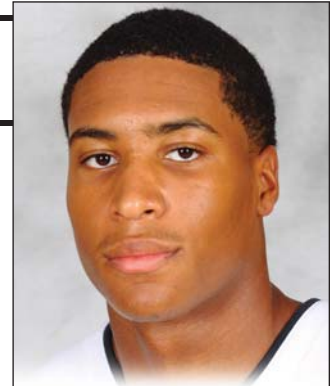

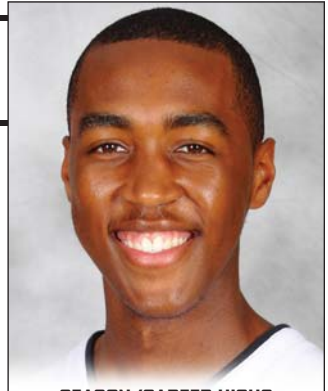
