BASKETBALL COACH

Bruce Hale

Hale this season moves into his sixth year with the Hurricanes as head basketball coach. Under Hale's coaching, the University of Miami cagers have been steadily rising into the national spotlight. Miami just missed making the NIT tournament last year and the year before, while last season his Miamians finished as the No. 1 scoring team in the nation. Also, for the past two years, Hale's Hurricanes walked off with the Florida Intercollegiate Conference championship. His five-year record at Miami shows 68 wins against 52 losses.

Hale was All-America in college at Santa Clara where he was graduated in 1941. He was a captain in the United States Air Force, playing on the Five By Five team at Miami Beach and later coaching the Wright Air Field Base to the service championship. He played professional basketball for 10 years and was on the All-World pro team of 1945. He coached the Chicago America Gears to the pro championship in 1946 and later played and coached the Indianapolis team in professional play.

HURRICANE BASKETBALL CLASSIC

Brigham Young, of Provo, Utah; Xavier, of Cincinnati, Ohio, and University of Florida will be the guest teams Dec. 28 and 29 when University of Miami is host to the second annual "Hurricane Basketball Classic" tournament in the Miami Beach Auditorium.

Xavier meets Florida and Brigham Young tangles with Miami in first round games Dec. 28. The following night, the two winning teams meet. Also on that night, the two losing teams of the opening round are booked to meet in the consolation game.

OUTLOOK BASKETBALL

If two of Miami's talented sophomores come through as anticipated, the University of Miami basketball team can be expected to be as strong as it was last year when the club reached new heights for Hurricane cage aggregations and led the nation's major colleges in scoring.

And if it so happens that three newcomers come through, the 1959-60 Hurricane quintet could be the best in UM history.

From last year's high scoring spectacular team, Miami lost only two starters—Joe Gardner, high scoring guard and best defensive man on the club, and Norman Nebel, starting forward who was a steady point-maker and a capable man off the boards. Also gone are two reserves, Jerry Davis, who gave Harry Manushaw some rest at center, and Ed. Contreras, a little used forward.

Returning are four truly brilliant juniors—Dick Hickox, who last year made honorable mention Associated Press All-America and UPI Little Man All-America; Harry Manushaw, sensational rebounding center and starter; Ron Godfrey, starting forward and great all-around performer, and Bruce Applegate, an invaluable "sixth man." Also back are two capable reserves, Martin Snider and David Landis.

Hickox, Manushaw and Godfrey are rated three of the greatest cage aces ever to play for the Hurricanes.

To fill in at Gardner's vacated guard post, Coach Hale was two talented men to pick from in Julie Cohen, a New Yorker, hailed as the best play-maker ever to come to the University of Miami, and Chris Stavreti, of Fort Wayne, Ind. Cohen is called a tremendous prospect by Coach Hale. The New Yorker is rated superior to the graduating Gardner as a ball handler, play-maker and defensive man, and his teaming with Hickox could give Miami two of Dixie's top collegiate guards.

Slated to fill in for Nebel at forward is six foot, six inch Dod Hammond, a Miamian who returns to the Hurricanes from the Armed Forces. He played on the U-M Frosh team before going into the service.

Jack Spisak, forward, and Bruce Shapiro and Ken Allen, guards, are all expected to help out with depth.

There is little doubt but that the Hurricanes will again have tremendous scoring power this season. It should have more poise than it did a year ago when Miami, in most games, had three or four sophomores on the floor at the same time, and hence had a tendency to get off stride at times.

Forwards

RON GODFREY, 6 feet 4, 175 pounds, 21 years old, junior, Physical Education . . . starred for Martins Ferry, Ohio, in high school for Coach Elmer Freese . . . made several opponent teams last year . . . Ron does everything well, being Miami's No. 2 man both in scoring and rebounding last year. He can fake and drive past his man, has a fine one-hand jump shot. A high school center, he now has made the transition to forward. Experience will help him this year. He scored 29 points on Tampa last year and had 20 rebounds against Western Kentucky.

BRUCE APPLGATE, 6 feet 3, 195 pounds, 21 years old, junior, Physical Education . . . played for Northside High, Ft. Wayne, Ind., under Coach Don Burick . . . He's such an invaluable "sixth man" that he probably will stay in that role, though he is capable of being a starter. He has a fine one-hand jump shot from any spot on the floor and is a tough man on the fast break. He does an excellent job on rebounds. Bruce had 18-point games against Florida State and Tulane last year and captured a dozen rebounds against Florida State in the season finale.

JACK SPISAK, 6 feet 3, 165 pounds, 20 years old, sophomore, Physical Education . . . played at Miami Edison under Coach Red Bogart. He is a good jump shot artist from in close and is an able man in rebounding. Jack rates as a good team player and could develop very well in the Miami style of basketball. He is counted on for important help as a depth man. As a freshman, Spisak scored 23 points in one game and three times went over the 20 mark.

Centers

HARRY MANUSHAW, 6 feet 7, 220 pounds, junior, Business Administration . . . Played at Horace Mann High, Gary, Ind., under Coach Keith Crown. He broke the UM rebounding record as a sophomore last year and there is little doubt but that this season will find him acclaimed the best center in all UM history. He averaged 15 rebounds and 12.6 points a game last year, even though he was not a regular in the early games. In his last five games, Harry went over 20 points in four games and 20 rebounds in three. He should be the backbone of the upcoming team and should get more than passing attention from the all-star team selectors. Manushaw scored 29 points on Loyola last season. He had 27 rebounds in that game and 27 against Florida State.

DOD HAMMOND, 6 feet 6, 220 pounds, 23 years old, sophomore, Business Administration . . . Played under Coach Bogart at Miami Edison High, making All-City and All-State. He played freshman basketball at Miami in 1955-56, showing plenty of aggressiveness and jumping ability, though his scoring was not outstanding. He spent the last three years in the Air Force and played a lot of basketball, sharpening his scoring ability tremendously. Dod also developed an outstanding jump shot. He is slated to play at forward but if needed, can help out at center as well.



Guards

DICK HICKOX, 5 feet 6, 160 pounds, 21 years old, junior, Physical Education . . . is another of Coach Don Burick's Northside High products at Ft. Wayne, Ind. . . . His sensational first year as a Miami guard earned him the UPI Little Man All-America acclaim and honorable mention from the Associated Press. His 453 point total broke the sophomore scoring record at Miami. He made 20 points or more 12 times and was deadly accurate both from the field and the free throw line. He is a potential All-America star. Dick hit for 30 points against both Florida Southern and Stetson last year, was in double figures in all but four Miami games, and never was under eight. He's also good on rebounds—he grabbed 10 against Florida Southern last season. He's an able ball stealer, a sharp passer and a flash on the fast break.

MARTIN SNIDER, 6 feet, 180 pounds, 25 years old, junior, Physical Education . . . played for Coach Russ Brown at Royal Center, Ind. . . saw spot service as a guard reserve a year ago and should help a lot in the pinches. He's the best passer on the squad, handles himself well on the court. Snider can hit from the outside and is a good man on the fast break. He didn't see too much service a year ago but is expected to play more often in the upcoming campaign. His best game last season was a nine-pointer against Florida and his best rebound effort of four was against the Gators in a second meeting between the rivals.

DAVE LANDIS, 6 feet, 170 pounds, 21 years old, junior, Business Administration . . . played at Providence High, Jeffersonville, Ind., under Coach Pete Murphy . . . Was out of action in 1957-58 and hence was somewhat rusty last season. He's one of the best outside set shots on the team and is sharp on free throws. He's a capable back court performer. Dave's best showing last year was a five-point performance against Pittsburgh in the Steel Bowl tournament. He grabbed five rebounds against Tulane in the Hurricane Classic.

He'll have to play in the shadow of mighty little Dick Hickox. On the frosh club last year, the fast moving Shapiro drove for 260 points, second high for his team. He picked up 33 points on one occasion last year.

JULIE COHEN, 6 feet, 188 pounds, 20 years old, sophomore, Physical Education . . . Played at Erasmus High, Brooklyn, N. Y., under Coach Al Bedain . . . was a freshman at New York University two years ago and was highly regarded both as a play-maker and in scoring. He remained out of action last year to preserve three years of varsity eligibility. Cohen could become an all-time UM cage great. He will move in as a starter and Miami's hopes for another



big season rest very much on his coming through. He's fast, a sensational ball handler and a clever field general and one of the best team men on the entire squad.

CHRIS STAVRETI, 6 feet, 165 pounds, 20 years old, sophomore, Physical Education . . . Played at Southside High, Ft. Wayne, Ind., under Coach Don Reichert. Played at Central Michigan as a freshman and was at UM last year. Chris is a strong defensive player and has an excellent outside shot. He's capable of filling in for Hickox or Cohen, as the case may be, and will give the Hurricanes the additional depth at guard which they so sorely lacked last season. He's fast and an excellent ball handler.

KEN ALLEN, 6 feet, 19 years old, sophomore, Physical Education . . . coached by Red Bogart at Miami Edison High. Ken is an excellent floor man, drives in well but can score from outside. He topped the frosh in scoring a year ago, and had two 29-point games as a frosh.

MIAMI CAGERS, COACH HONORED

Coach Bruce Hale, Dick Hickox, Harry Manushaw and Ron Godfrey all won post season honors after the 1958-59 cage season. Hale was named "Basketball Coach of the Year" by the Florida Times Union. Hickox, who made All-State and All Florida Intercollegiate Conference, was also named to the first Small All America team of United Press International. Major college players of 5 feet 10 or under are eligible for this team. Dick also garnered Associated Press All-America honorable mention and missed being named the most valuable player in the Florida Intercollegiate Conference by one vote. Godfrey placed on the first All Conference team and Manushaw on the second, and both placed on the All-State selection.

FIRST TRIP TO NEW YORK CITY

University of Miami's basketball team makes its first trip to New York City this year when it meets Iona College on Jan. 6 in Madison Square Garden, as part of the Garden's basketball double headers, involving the nation's more colorful teams.

OUTLOOK SWIMMING

Although University of Miami will have greater depth on its 1960 team, the new talent is of uncertain quality and against such perennial powerhouses as Florida and Florida State, the Hurricanes can hope only to make it close.

Hal Mischner, fine sprinter and co-holder of the 50-yard free style mark, and William Harding, diver and all-around swimmer, have graduated, while William Lahde, a consistent back stroke winner, is out of school.

The big star of the team once again is Jack Nelson, member of the last United States Olympic swimming team. Nelson swam the butterfly in the Olympics and hasn't lost in the butterfly in dual meet competition since coming to the Hurricanes.

Jack also swims exceedingly well in the free style and will pick up many points there, too.

Frank "Rusty" Woods, with one year of experience, should take over where Mischner left off, while the improving Ronald Blackburn is another fine prospect in the sprints.

In the distance free style events, Eduardo Carrera is the top man—he should average eight points a meet in his final year.

Nelson Nichols and Pete Gross, breast stroke veterans, loom more formidable this year, while Dick Kirwick and Bill Snyder are expected to give help in the free style events.

Promising new material includes Harvey O'Loughlin, diver; Ira Goldbach, in the butterfly and distance free style events, and Irv Betrock, free style sprinter and butterfly swimmer. In mid-term, the team will gain Richard Mick, a breastroker who should help.

SWIMMING SKETCHES

JACK NELSON, sensational senior, breaks pool records just about every time he swims in the 200 yard butterfly event. He is unbeaten at that distance in dual meet competition for two years and is a good possibility for the 1960 U. S. Olympic team. Jack was on the 1956 Olympic aggregation. The powerfully built veteran is also a capable man in the free style events. He swims the butterfly leg on the medley relay team and usually swims one free style event, most often in the 400 yard relay. Nelson swam for Lafayette High, Lafayette, Ind., and now resides in Ft. Lauderdale. He is an air force veteran. Jack majors in Physical Education.



EDUARDO CARRERA, senior free style distance swimmer, is a Miami Senior High product who has improved steadily. A virus attack ruined what started out to be a promising sophomore career but he crashed through in fine fashion last year, being a consistent winner in the 220 and 440 yard free styles. He erased long standing 400 and 440 yard records during the 1959 season. Carrera is an all around swimmer, being a capable performer in the backstroke and the butterfly. He won the Cuban national 200 meter butterfly title in 1957 and the American 800 meter free style in 1956. Majors in Engineering.



NELSON NICHOLAS, senior, was Scranton, Pa. and Lackawanna conference champion at Scranton Central High. Nichols was best in the butterfly in high school, but swims the breaststroke for Miami. He won the event against Georgia last year and had a second against Florida. Nelson has shown improvement this year and could very well be a first place threat in virtually all meets. He swims the breaststroke leg in the medley relay event. Majors in



Arts and Science.

DONALD BLACKBURN, senior, did not swim in high school but since coming to University of Miami, has developed into a capable sprinter. While his best times of 24 seconds in the 50 and 54 seconds in the 100 left him short of first place finishes, in past years, he battled for those valuable seconds and thirds. Don adds strength to the freestyle relay team. He won seconds in both the 50 and 100 yard freestyle events against Georgia last year and had seconds in the 50 in the Homestead Air Force Base and East Carolina meets. With Hal Mischner gone, he will have a heavier burden this year. Donald is majoring in Engineering.

FRANK WOODS, junior from Coral Gables High, is a brilliant 50 and 100 yard sprinter. He holds a time of 23.5 in the 50 and has gone under 53 in the 100. Frank did not become eligible until the second semester last year, but came up with a fine 53.2 performance in the 100 to win against Homestead. He had a second against East Carolina in the same event, took seconds on the road at Florida and Florida State and second in the State

Intercollegiate. By the end of the season, Frank was finishing ahead of Mischner in the 100 consistently. He could be a heavy winner this year. Majors in Arts and Science.

PETE GROSS, senior, is a breaststroker and butterfly swimmer who attended Tamalpais High in Mill Valley, Calif. Pete picked up third honors in the breaststroke against Georgia and Homestead Air Force Base last year, but appears capable of doing better this season now that he has had more time to develop his breaststroke speed. Pete majors in Arts and Science.

RICHARD KERWICK, junior, is another who had no high school swimming experience, but has been developed into a capable performer by Coach Bennett. Dick is a freestyler who swam on a winning medley relay team against Georgia last year. He took a third in the 440 yard freestyle at Florida. Majoring in Business Administration.

IRA GOLDBACH, junior, did not compete in 1959. He was a capable 100 yard butterfly swimmer for Miami Beach High school where his best time was a creditable 1:02. Coach Bennett will use him to back up Jack Nelson, Miami's unbeaten butterfly ace. Ira is also strong in the freestyle distance events. Majoring in Arts and Science.

RICHARD MICK, sophomore, entered school in February last year, so does not become eligible until mid-term. In high school; he swam both the breaststroke and butterfly, winning city championships in the Astoria, N. Y. area. Richard is majoring in Business Administration.

HARVEY O'LOUGHLIN, junior, did not compete last season but will take over the diving spot this campaign. Coach Bennett looks for big things from Harvey—there's indication that Harvey will become a real threat in the diving competition. He was an excellent man in high school, competing for Ft. Lauderdale High. Harvey is majoring in Education.

IRV BETROCK, sophomore, won the Gold Coast 100 yard freestyle swim in 1958 for North Miami. He set a state record for the distance in the Miami-Berlin meet in 1956, and won his age group title in the 1955 city championships. Betrock swims both the freestyle and butterfly. Majoring in Arts and Science.
