FLORIDA STATE TRAVELS TO PLAY AT NO. 25 MIAMI ON SUNDAY NIGHT

Florida State, which overcame as much as a 13-point deficit to defeat Clemson 60-57 on Thursday night in Tallahassee, travels to Coral Gables to face No. 25 ranked Miami on Sunday, January 27 at 6:00 p.m. at the BankUnited Center. The game will be televised nationally as part of ESPNU's wildly successful ACC Sunday night basketball package. The Seminoles' game against Miami marks their third game of the season against a ranked team and the next opportunity to gain their first win over a team ranked in either the top 25 of the Associated Press or USA Today's Coaches' Polls. The Seminoles were the winningest team in the ACC with six wins against nationally ranked opponents and have defeated 10 nationally ranked in the last three seasons. Following Sunday night's game against Miami, the Seminoles will play host to Maryland (January 30 at 8:00 p.m.) and No. 1 ranked Duke (February 2 at 2:00 p.m.) in the first of a pair of two-game ACC homestands during the remainder of the season.

FLORIDA STATE AMONG ACC'S WINNINGEST TEAMS

With 167 overall wins and 69 ACC wins, Florida State is the third winningest team in the ACC since the start of the 2005-06 season. The Seminoles average 22.3 overall wins and 9.4 ACC wins per season under 11th year head coach Leonard Hamilton since the start of the 2005-06 season.

FLORIDA STATE IN ACC PLAY

The Seminoles have won 17 of their last 24 regular season ACC games (.708 winning percentage) after finishing with a school record 12-4 conference record and in third place in the ACC standings during the 2012-13 season. The Seminoles also won two of their final three regular season games of the 2011-12 season and are the third winningest team in the ACC since the start of the 2005-06 season.

FLORIDA STATE ON THE ROAD IN ACC PLAY

Florida State enters Sunday's game at Miami with a 3-2 record in ACC play with two of its three wins coming on the road (at Clemson on January 5 and at Maryland on January 9). The Seminoles' two road wins allowed them to begin their ACC schedule with a 2-0 record for only the second time since joining the ACC for the 1991-92 season. The Seminoles also opened the 1999-00 ACC season with a 2-0 record. The Seminoles are the third winningest road team in the ACC since the start of the 2009-10 season.

SNAER BEING SNAER -- ANOTHER 3-POINT BUZZER BEATING, GAME-WINNING SHOT

All-American Michael Snaer capped off Florida State's incredible come-from-behind win over Clemson on Thursday night with the third buzzer beating 3-point shot of his career. He has hit two of his three shots at the buzzer (in wins over Duke in 2012 and against Clemson in 2013) and made his game-winning shot against Virginia Tech (in 2012) with 2.4 second remaining on the clock. In all three game-winning instances, Snaer helped the Seminoles recover from deficits of nine against Duke in Cameron Indoor Stadium, 13 against Clemson on Thursday night in Tallahassee and 15 against Virginia Tech at the Donald L. Tucker Center.

WHITE REACHES INTO DOUBLE FIGURES SCORING AGAIN

Junior forward Okaro White scored 10 points in Florida State's win over Clemson on Thursday night and has now scored in double figures in a career high 14 games this season. He tied his career high with 20 points (including 15 consecutive in the second half of the Seminoles' 65-62 win on the road at Maryland on January 9) and enters Sunday's game against Miami averaging a career-high 12.9 points scored per game.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Miami and gain a win over a ranked opponent for the first time this season. The Seminoles have defeated at least one ranked team in 22 consecutive years -- ever season since the 1982-83 season;
 ...Defeat Miami and gain a win over a ranked Miami team for the first time in school history -- it marks the first time the Seminoles will play Miami when the Hurricanes are nationally ranked;
 ...Defeat Miami and gain a win over a ranked team on its home court for the third time in the last two seasons. The Seminoles won at Duke (76-73 on January 21, 2012) and at Virginia (63-60 on March 1, 2012) last season.

FLORIDA STATE'S WIN TOTAL IN THE LAST EIGHT YEARS

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last eight years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played with 166 wins. The Seminoles average 22.3 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12) and 11-7 (2012-13).

FLORIDA STATE VS. RANKED TEAMS

Florida State enters Sunday's game against No. 25 Miami with 27 wins over nationally ranked teams during the first 11 years of the Leonard Hamilton era in Tallahassee. Included in those wins are five wins over nationally ranked Duke teams including two when the Blue Devils were ranked No. 1 in the country at the time (March 1, 2006, 79-74 and Jan. 12, 2011, 66-61). Florida State has defeated four top five and five top 10 ranked Duke teams under Hamilton with three of the Seminoles' four all-time victories over the nation's No. 1 ranked team coming against Duke.

FLORIDA STATE MOVES BACK INTO ACC FREE THROW SHOOTING LEAD

Buoyed by its .900 percent shooting performance (18 of 20 and 14 of 16 in the second half) from the free throw line in its victory over Clemson, the Seminoles enter Sunday's game against Miami as the ACC's top ranked free throw shooting team and as one of only three teams in the league that is shooting 71 percent or better from the free throw line for the season. The Seminoles were six of eight from the free throw line in the final 6:31 of the game as they outscored the Tigers, 18-13, to win the game.

FLORIDA STATE IN ITS OWN ACC RECORD BOOK

Florida State shot a shining .900 (18 of 20) from the free throw line in its win over Clemson to mark the 12th time in its ACC history that it has shot 90 percent or better from the free throw line in a single game. It marked just the second time in its 22-year ACC history that Florida State shot 90 percent or better from the free throw line on 20 or more attempts. The Seminoles shot .950 percent from the line (19 of 20) in an 81-65 win over Georgia Tech on Feb. 3, 2004.

FLORIDA STATE VS. MIAMI – THE LAST TIME

Michael Snaer scored 20 points and Ian Miller had 18 to lead Florida State to an 82-71 victory over Miami on March 9, 2012 into the semifinals of the 2012 ACC Tournament against No. 2 seed Duke. Malcolm Grant had 19 points and Shane Larkin had 16 for Miami. Miami couldn't get it going in the first half against the Seminoles' man-to-man defense. Miami made only 9 of 32 shots (28.1 percent) in the first 20 minutes. Florida State led 37-26 at halftime after making seven 3-pointers in the half. Each team relied heavily on 3-pointers. Miami stayed close early in the second half with the help of 3-pointers by Malcolm Grant, Brown and Larkin. A three-point play by James gave Florida State a 60-52 lead, but Miami closed the gap to three points on another 3-pointer by Grant, followed by baskets by Brown and Kenny Kadji. Ian Miller's short jumper ended Miami's run and helped the Seminoles quickly push the lead to 11 points at 70-59.

FLORIDA STATE TO PLAY IN 2013 PUERTO RICO TIP-OFF TOURNAMENT

Florida State will play in the Puerto Rico Tip-Off Tournament Nov. 21-24, 2013 in San Juan, Puerto Rico. The Seminoles will be joined by Auburn, Charlotte, Georgetown, Kansas State, Long Beach State, Michigan and Virginia Commonwealth in the eight team tournament. It will mark the first time the Seminoles will play a tournament in Puerto Rico. Oklahoma State defeated NC State, 76-56, to win the championship of the 2012 Puerto Rico Tip-Off Classic.

ANOTHER COMEBACK WIN FOR FLORIDA STATE

Florida State outscored Clemson, 44-28 over the last 21:23 of Thursday night game in Tallahassee to earn the 60-57 win and its third ACC win of the season. The Seminoles trailed by 12 at halftime before rallying to gain the victory. It marked the third come-from-behind win after trailing at halftime for the Seminoles this season. Florida State rallied for three wins in 35 games in 2012 (against Duke, Georgia Tech and Saint Bonaventure) when they trailed at halftime.

.818 Junior Okaro White is shooting .818 from the free throw line (36 of 44) in the last two games. He is 12 of 13 from the field in scoring 19 points in the Seminoles' win over Louisiana Monroe on December 17.

.875 Junior Kiel Turpin has made 14 of his last 16 free throws (.875 percent) in the last 10 games. Most recently he made eight of nine attempts from the free throw line against Clemson on Thursday night and was a perfect two of two against North Carolina on January 12 in Tallahassee.

1.000 Sophomore Terry Whisnant is a perfect 10 of 10 from the free throw line for the season.

1 Junior Kiel Turpin led the Seminoles in scoring (16 points), rebounding (four rebounds and blocked shots (four) against Clemson on Thursday. It marked the first time in his career that he has led the Seminoles in scoring, rebounding and scoring, AND rebounding in the same game.

4 Florida State has won four of its last five games which have been decided by five points or less (79-76 over Charlotte, 71-66 over Clemson, 65-62 at Maryland and 60-57 over Clemson. The only game the Seminoles have not won when the game was decided by five points or less in the last four weeks was their 72-77 decision to North Carolina.

4 Leonard Hamilton has led Florida State to 20 or more in wins in a school record four straight seasons. The Seminoles average 23.8 wins in the last four years.

5 Florida State is looking to play in its school record fifth consecutive NCAA Tournament.

5 Junior Kiel Turpin has led the Seminoles in blocked shots five times this season including four of the last five games played – including both of the Seminoles' wins over Clemson this season. He averaged 3.0 blocks in two games against the Tigers.

8 Freshman Devon Bookert enters Sunday's game against Miami having made eight consecutive free throws in his last four games. He is shooting .900 percent (nine of 10) from the free throw line in the first five ACC games of his career.

11 Florida State is undefeated, 11-0, when it outscores its opponent.

14 All-American Michael Snaer enters Sunday's game against Miami with 1,318 points and is currently in 18th place in scoring in school history. He has moved up 14 positions on Florida State's all-time scoring list in the first 18 games of the season.

14 Junior Okaro White has scored in double figures in a team-leading and career high 14 times this season. He has now scored in double figures 33 times during his career including his 10 point performance in the Seminoles' win over Clemson on Thursday in Tallahassee.

WITH NINE-BLOCK PERFORMANCE AGAINST CLEMSON, SEMINOLES BACK INTO ACC LEAD

Led by junior Kiel Turpin's career high four blocked shots against Clemson, the Seminoles took over the ACC team lead for blocked shots with 95 and a 5.3 blocked shots per game average. In two games against the Tigers this season, the Seminoles blocked 14 shots – an average of 7.0 blocked shots per game. Florida State not only leads the ACC with a 5.3 blocked shots per game average for all game but it leads the ACC with a 7.0 blocked shots per game average in ACC play (five games).

FLORIDA STATE HAS LED THE ACC IN BLOCKED SHOTS IN THREE STRAIGHT YEARS

Florida State enters Sunday's game against Miami as the ACC leader in blocked shots with 86 and a 5.3 blocked shots per game average. The Seminoles are looking to lead the ACC in blocked shots for the fourth consecutive season. The ACC record for consecutive seasons ranked the ACC leader in blocked shots is five by Maryland (2000 -2004). Florida State is ranked as the ACC leader this season despite losing the school's third all-time leading blocked shot artist – Bernard James – to the NBA. James averaged 2.4 blocked shots per game and ranked third in the ACC in the blocked shots per game category in 2012. The Seminoles are led by Okaro White who is tied for ninth in the ACC in blocked shots with a career high 1.4 bpg average but do have four players with at least 11 blocked shots and 11 of 15 players who have blocked at least one shot this season.

SNAER IN FLORIDA STATE'S RECORD BOOK

All-American Michael Snaer enters Sunday's game against Miami needing only 20 points to move into 17th place in scoring (he is currently ranked 18th with 1,318 points) and needs only two assists to move into 25th place all time in assists (he is currently ranked 26th with 231 career assists. He is currently ranked eighth in school history with 169 career 3-point field goals made and needs only 21 made shots from the bonusphere to become only the fifth player in school history with 200 or more made 3-point shots.

SNAER'S 3-POINT FIELD GOAL NUMBERS FOR HIS CAREER

All-American Michael Snaer enters Sunday's game against Miami in sixth place in the ACC with 36 3-point field goals made and tied for fifth in the ACC with near career-high .400 shooting mark from the bonusphere. He is averaging a career high 2.2 3-point field goals made per game and is one of only four players in the ACC who is averaging 2.2 made 3-point field goals per game or more. Snaer – the nation's current active leader in career game winning buzzer beaters -- will always be remembered for his buzzer-beating game-winning shots against both Duke (January 21 in Durham) and Virginia Tech (February 16 in Tallahassee) and now his third career game winning shot from the 3-point line which gave Florida State its 60-57 win over Clemson on January 24, 2013.

Junior Okaro White blocked one shot in the Seminoles' win over Clemson and enters Sunday's game against Miami in a tie for ninth in blocked with a career high 1.4 bpg average. He has blocked at least one shot in 10 straight games and has blocked 19 shots (1.9 bpg) since Florida State's win over Maine on December 9. With 25 blocked shots in the first 18 games of the 2012-13 season, White has blocked nearly as many shots this season (25) as he did in the first two seasons of his career (29).

WHITE HOT FROM THE FREE THROW LINE

Junior Okaro White is shooting .875 (21 of 24) from the free throw line in the last six game and is averaging 3.5 made free throws per game since making two of two attempts against Auburn on January 2. In two games against Clemson this season, White is a perfect four of four. He is shooting .750 from the free throw line (15 of 20) in five career games against Miami including a six of six performance against the Hurricanes in Florida State's 55-53 win on January 19, 2011 in Coral Gables.

BOOKERT COMES UP BIG AGAINST CLEMSON

Freshman point guard Devon Bookert was perfect against Clemson shooting the basketball – he made each of the eight shots he attempted – two from the field (one from 3-point range) and all six of his shots from the free throw line. He scored nine of his 11 points in the second half on his one made 3-point shot (that tied the game at 57 with 44 seconds remaining) and was a perfect four of four from the line in helping the Seminoles' mount their second half comeback to gain their third ACC win of the season.

DEVON BOOKERT SHOOTING STRAIGHT

Freshman Devin Bookert enters Sunday's game against Miami shooting .517 from the field, .533 from the 3-point line and .833 from the free throw line. Of the 98 points that he has scored this season – 30 (.306 percent) have come from two points range, 48 (.490 percent) have come from the bonusphere and 20 (.204 percent) have come from the free throw line. Bookert has made two consecutive 3-point shots (one against North Carolina and one against Clemson) and eight consecutive free throws (two at Maryland and six against Clemson) heading into the Seminoles' game at Miami.

BOOKERT IN DOUBLE FIGURES

Freshman Devon Bookert scored his ACC career high of 11 points in the Seminoles' 60-57 win over Clemson on Thursday night and has now scored in double figures four times – 15 against BYU (November 16), 10 against Louisiana Monroe (November 17), against Tulsa (December 29) and against Clemson (January 24). All of his double figure scoring efforts have come in Seminole victories.

BRANDON STARTING

Freshman Montay Brandon has started each of the Seminoles' last 17 games (each game since their win over Buffalo on November 12). His 17 starts is the most by a true freshman at Florida State since Chris Singleton started 34 games as a freshman during the 2008-09 season.

GILCHRIST GETTING INTO THE GROOVE

Junior Robert Gilchrist, who has played just 79 minutes in the first nine games of his career, has seen his playing time increase since the injury to Terrance Shannon who will miss an as of yet undetermined amount of time. He has played 26 minutes in the last two games including his career high of 17 minutes in the Seminoles' win over Clemson – five more than he had played during any of his first eight appearances for the Seminoles. Gilchrist has scored six points (four against Virginia and two against Clemson) in his last two appearances and earned his second career blocked shot in the first half of Florida State's victory over Clemson.

BOJANOVSKY ALSO GROWING MORE COMFORTABLE

Freshman Boris Bojanovsky is averaging 11.0 minutes played and 3.5 points scored in the last two Seminoles games against Virginia (seven minutes / four points) and Clemson (15 minutes / three points). His three points against Clemson came on a 3-point play with 1:23 left in the first half and could be considered one of the most important plays of the game. Bojanovsky scored on a lay-up and was fouled by Clemson's dynamic Devin Booker giving him his first foul. He then made the ensuing free throw to close the Seminoles' deficit from a game-high 13 to just 10. With two free throws from Florida State's Devon Booker with 59 seconds left, the two freshmen helped cut Clemson's lead from 13 points with 1:40 remaining before intermission to a manageable eight when the teams headed into the locker room. Bojanovsky's 3-point play was the beginning of a game ending 44-28 run in the final 21:23 of the game that spurred the Seminoles to the win.

TURPIN ENJOYS GAME FOR THE AGES

Junior Kiel Turpin scored 16 points (all in the second half), pulled down four rebounds (all in the second half) and blocked four shots (three in the second half) in helping lead Florida State to its 60-57 win over Clemson on Thursday night in Tallahassee. A clear illustration of Turpin's night shows that he scored more points in 17 minutes during the second half than he had in his previous six games (14 points in 72 minutes) and totaled as many blocked shots as he had in his previous four games (three blocked shots in 44 minutes).

TURPIN FROM THE FREE THROW LINE AGAINST CLEMSON

Junior Kiel Turpin scored eight of his 16 second half points against Clemson from the free throw line as he made a career high eight free throws on a career high nine free throw attempts. During his one game performance from the free throw line against Clemson, he increased his free throw shooting percentage by more than eight percentage points (from .583 entering Thursday's game to .667 entering Sunday's game) and established himself as one of Florida State's up and coming free throw shooters.

Seminole Recruiting Well

Two standout players – Xavier Rathan-Mayes (Scarborough, Ontario/Huntingdon Prep) and Jarquez Smith (Haddock, Ga./Jones County) – have signed National Letters of Intent to attend Florida State and play basketball for head coach Leonard Hamilton. Rathan-Mayes, the No. 24 ranked senior in the ESPN 100, is in second season at Huntington (W.V.) Prep. As a junior, Rathan-Mayes averaged 14.6 points, 4.5 assists and 4.0 rebounds per game while shooting 44 percent from 3-point range. Smith averaged a double double of 12 points, 10 rebounds and 5 blocked shots per game as a junior at Jones County High School. He earned All-Region First Team honors, was voted as the best defender in the region and selected to play in Georgia's North/South All-Star game. Smith led Jones County to the Georgia State AAAAA High School playoffs in 2012.

Hamilton Is The Only Coach In History

Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton is the only coach in college basketball history to be named as the Coach of the Year in both the ACC (2009 and 2012) and the Big East (1995 and 1999). Hamilton is the third winningest coach in Florida State basketball history and the second winningest coach in Miami basketball history.

Snaer is a Senior Class Award Candidate

Senior Michael Snaer is a candidate for the Senior CLASS Award - an award that focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. A total of 30 men's basketball student-athletes who excel both on and off the court have been selected as candidates for the 2012-13 Senior CLASS Award. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the Senior CLASS Award winner will be announced during the 2013 NCAA Final Four in Atlanta, April 6, 2012.

Snaer – ACC Player of The Week

Michael Snaer, who was named the Most Valuable Player of the 2012 Coaches vs. Cancer Classic, was named the ACC Basketball Player of the Week on November 19. Snaer averaged 16.3 points, 5.6 rebounds and 3.3 assists while making nine of 16 shots from the 3-point line as he led Florida State to a 3-0 record and to the championship of the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic. He recorded his second career double double in the Seminoles' win over BYU and averaged 28.3 minutes played in the Seminoles' three wins during the week. It marks the second time in his career that he has earned the award.

Thomas -- ACC Rookie Of The Week

Aaron Thomas, who averaged 17.0 points and 4.5 rebounds while shooting .500 from the field (11 of 22) and .857 from the free throw line (12 of 14) as he played 68 total minutes (34.0 mpg) in two Seminole wins was named the ACC Rookie of the Week on December 24, an award he shared with Oliver Hanlan of Boston College.

TURPIN'S PROGRESSION FROM THE FREE THROW LINE AGAINST CLEMSON

Junior Kiel Turpin was eight of nine from the free throw line and Florida State was a nearly perfect 14 of 16 from the free throw line as a team in the Seminoles' game deciding second half win over Clemson. He made eight of the Seminoles' 14 free throws (57 percent) and attempted nine of the team's 16 free throws (56 percent) as they outscored Clemson by a decisive 14-8 margin from the line in the second half.

A BIG REASON FOR THE SEMINOLES' ADVANTAGE IN FREE THROWS AGAINST CLEMSON

Florida State's desire to take the ball at the Clemson post players in the second half of their 60-57 win over the Tigers on Thursday night became a factor in the Seminoles' overcoming as much as a 13-point deficit to win their third ACC game of the season. The Seminoles were in the bonus by the 16:45 mark (only three minutes and 15 seconds into the second half) and were in the double bonus just past the midpoint of the half at the 9:27 mark. With every foul becoming a two shot situation beginning at the 9:27 mark, the Seminoles were 10 of 12 from the free throw line and outscored the Tigers 23-13 to win the game. The Tigers' 10th foul was also the fourth foul on Clemson's Devin Booker.

TURPIN ON THE BLOCKS

Junior Kiel Turpin blocked a career-high four shots (three in the second half) in Florida State's victory over Clemson on Thursday night. His four blocked shots against Clemson doubled his previous career high of two blocked shots which have come five times during the first 18 games of his Seminole career.

WHISNANT HAS GONE MORE THAN A FULL YEAR

Sophomore Terry Whisnant enters Sunday's game against Miami shooting a perfect 1.000 percent -- 10 of 10 from the free throw line. It has been more than one full calendar year – since January 7 of 2012 against Clemson – since Whisnant has missed a free throw. Whisnant has made 14 of 16 free throws (.875 percent) for his career.

MILLER AMONG FLORIDA STATE'S ALL-TIME CHIEF THIEVES

Junior Ian Miller earned one steal against North Carolina on January 12, has four steals in the first five ACC games of the 2012-13 season and enters Sunday's game against Miami with a career high 1.2 steals per game average. For his three-year career as a Seminole, Miller averages nearly one steal per game with 57 career steals in 60 career games. For his career in ACC games only, Miller averages nearly one steal per game with 31 steals in 32 career conference games.

SHOOTING 50 PERCENT FROM THE FIELD IS AN ANOMALY AGAINST FLORIDA STATE

Florida State has been the top field goal percentage defense team in the country in the last three seasons as it has led the nation in that most important of categories twice since in 2010 and 2011. In the last five seasons and 154 games only five teams (just over three percent) have shot 50 percent or better from the field against FSU.

Turpin comes through for 'Noles

With power forward Terrance Shannon sidelined by a neck injury, Florida State junior Kiel Turpin hoped to step up Thursday night against visiting Clemson.

It took a little longer than he might have hoped, but Turpin did that and more – recording career highs in points and blocked shots -- in helping the Seminoles pull off a stunning 60-57 victory against the Tigers.

“Kiel is solid in a lot of ways,” FSU coach Leonard Hamilton said. “He just is one of the least experienced guys on our team. This is the most number of minutes he’s played, and obviously he stepped up and delivered.”

It didn’t look good early – for Turpin or the Seminoles.

The junior college transfer went to the bench with two early fouls and played only four minutes in the first half.

At halftime, his stat line featured mostly zeroes -- no points or rebounds. Not even a shot attempted.

With Shannon sidelined and Turpin plagued by foul trouble, FSU’s freshman post players – centers Boris Bojanovsky and Michael Ojo – has to man the middle for most of the half. Those two combined for three points and three rebounds in 17 minutes, and the Seminoles trailed by eight points at halftime.

But after a heart-to-heart with the injured Shannon, Turpin turned it up in the second half.

“After my two fouls, Terrance pulled me aside and was like, ‘You’ve got to step up,’” Turpin said.

“We can’t just have Bo and Ojo going at them. We need all three of you guys doing something productive. And I think that kind of got me going in the second half.”

In the second half, Turpin hit 4 of 8 shots from the field and 8 of 9 from the free-throw line.

He finished with a career-high 16 points, grabbed four rebounds and blocked a career-high four shots.

He played 17 minutes in the second half to finish with a career-high 21 for the game.

And during one stretch of nearly 10 minutes, Turpin almost single-handedly kept the Seminoles in the game, scoring 13 of FSU’s 16 points during that stretch.

“He played very well,” Clemson coach Brad Brownell said.

“Made big free throws. A couple of nice baskets when they needed them. He’s gonna be a good player.”

Perhaps most surprising about Turpin's performance was his shooting at the foul line. The 7-foot, 225-pounder came into the game shooting just 58.3 percent from the line. He had recorded only 24 attempts in 17 games, making 14.

But he made all but one of his nine attempts against the Tigers. The junior credited the improvement to recent work he has put in with associate head coach Stan Jones.

"At the beginning of the year, I wasn't making as many as I should, and we completely remade my shot," Turpin said. "Obviously that's helping me a lot."

Game 14 -- Florida State 71, Clemson 66

CLEMSON, S.C. - Okaro White scored 15 points, including two on a highlight reel dunk for the ages in the second half, to lead Florida State to a 71-66 victory Clemson in the ACC opener for both teams. The victory gave the Seminoles a much needed ACC win to start the conference slate of games and put them back in the win column. It was White's defensive play at the end of the ballgame that will be the lasting memory of his performance. Florida State led 38-25 at halftime but Clemson battled back to within a 66-63 score thanks to a strong second half. Down by just three and in possession of the basketball, White stole the inbounds pass from the corner with 16.9 seconds on the game clock before quickly being fouled and hitting two free throws. Then, after White's free throws had pushed FSU's lead to 68-63, Ian Miller nabbed the ensuing inbounds pass and sank 1-of-2 free throws before Clemson's Milton Jennings drilled a 3-pointer with four seconds left to cut FSU's lead back to just three at 69-66. Terrance Shannon, who led the Seminoles with eight rebounds and was 5-of-7 from the line, then sank two game-sealing free throws for the FSU victory. Shannon finished the game with 11 points and Miller added seven. Michael Snaer didn't score in the first half despite FSU's strong start to the game but finished with eight points, including a 3-pointer to start the second half that had given FSU a 16-point lead at the time. Terry Whisnant II was 3-for-5 from 3-point range and had 11 points of his own.

Game 15 -- Florida State 65, Maryland 62

COLLEGE PARK, Md - Okaro White scored 15 consecutive points for Florida State to fuel a second-half comeback that lifted the Seminoles past Maryland 65-62 at the Comcast Center ending the Terrapins' 13-game winning streak. Florida State rallied from a 12-point deficit to defeat the cold-shooting Terrapins, who went 10 for 32 from the floor in the second half. White finished with a career-high-tying 20 points, Michael Snaer scored 15 and Ian Miller added 12 for the Seminoles. Alex Len had 15 points and 10 rebounds, and Nick Faust scored 14 for Maryland. Down by nine at halftime and 39-27 with 18 minutes to go, the Seminoles got five points from Snaer in a 12-2 run that cut the deficit to 43-42 with 13 minutes left. After that, White took over. The 6-foot-8 junior scored on dunks, follow shots and drives before sinking two free throws to make it 57-51. Maryland, meanwhile, went nearly seven minutes without a point until Logan Aronhalt connected from beyond the arc with 7:54 remaining. But the Terrapins never led after a three-point play by White made it 53-51 with 4:05 to go. It was 59-51 before Maryland fought to 61-59 with 19 seconds left. Devon Bookert then made two free throws for Florida State, but Faust answered with a 3 to get the Terrapins within a point. After Snaer converted one of two foul shots, Seth Allen had a jumper blocked by Snaer and White, appropriately, finished the scoring with a free throw.
