#### THE GAME

- After opening up Atlantic Coast Conference play with a 31-6 win over Duke in Durham, N.C., on Friday, Sept. 29, #13/12 Miami travels to Doak Campbell Stadium in Tallahassee, Fla., for a rivalry matchup with Florida State on Saturday, Oct. 7. Kickoff is set for 3:30 p.m.
- The contest was slated for Sept. 16 but was postponed due to Hurricane Irma; both teams also had Week 2 games cancelled due to Irma.
- The game will be broadcast on **ESPN** with Dave Pasch (play by play), Greg McElroy (color) and Tom Luginbill (sideline reporter) on the call. Joe Zagacki (pxp) and Don Bailey, Jr. (color) are in the **560 WQAM** radio booth for their 16th season together, while Josh Darrow will handle the sideline. Jose "Chamby" Campos (pxp) and Jose Martinez (color) are broadcasting on **990AM ESPN Deportes**.

#### THE SERIES

- The Hurricanes carry a 31-30 all-time lead in the head-to-head series, including a 14-10 lead in games played in Tallahassee, Fla.
- Miami is looking for its first win against the Seminoles since 2009, when the Canes topped their rivals, 38-34, at Doak Campbell Stadium.
- Florida State has won each of the last seven matchups, including a one-point win at Hard Rock Stadium in 2016 (19-20).
- The last three matchups have been decided by a combined 10 points; Miami fell 19-20 in 2016, 24-29 in 2015 and 26-30 in 2014.

#### THE TEAM

- The Hurricanes extended their winning streak to eight straight games dating to 2016 with a 31-6 romp of host Duke at Wallace Wade Stadium on Sept. 29. QB **Malik Rosier** finished with 270 passing yards and two scores, and Miami's defense held Duke's offense to just two field goals.
- Miami climbed to #13 in the Associated Press poll and to #12 in the Amway Coaches Poll - its highest rankings since Oct. 2, 2016 (#10/#10).
- The Hurricanes were picked to win the ACC's Coastal Division in a media poll at the 2017 ACC Football Kickoff in Charlotte, N.C., in late July.
- For the first time since 2010, Miami entered the season ranked by both the Associated Press (#18) and in the Amway Coaches Poll (#18).

#### THE OPPONENT

- Florida State is under the direction of eighth-year head coach **Jimbo Fisher**, who has compiled a 79-19 mark since taking over in 2010.
- After posting a 26-19 win in its last game with Wake Forest on Sept. 30, Florida State is receiving votes in both the AP and Coaches polls.
- The Seminoles, who lost starting QB **Deondre Francois** to a season-ending injury Game 1 against Alabama, are led by WR **Auden Tate** (13 catches, 226 yards, three touchdowns), RB **Jacques Patrick** (175 rushing yards) and All-American DB **Derwin James** (18 tackles, 2 PBUs).

#### THE COACH

- Miami is in its second season under the direction of head coach **Mark Richt**; in his first season at the helm, the Hurricanes finished with a 9-4 record and won their first bowl game since 2006 with a 31-14 victory over West Virginia in the Russell Athletic Bowl.
- Richt, who grew up in nearby Boca Raton, Fla., played quarterback as a student-athlete at Miami and is a 1982 graduate of the university, was named the 24th head coach in the history of the Hurricanes football program on Dec. 4, 2015.

## QUICK HITS

#### CANES RENEW RIVALRY WITH NOLES

- #13/#12 Miami will play its second straight road game Sat., Sept. 30, taking on rival Florida State in Tallahassee, Fla.
- The game was originally slated for an 8 p.m. kickoff on Sept. 16 but was postponed due to Hurricane Irma; it was just the fifth weather-caused postponement in the history of Hurricanes football and second involving rival Florida State (2004 - Hurricane Francis).
- UM has a 14-10 all-time lead in road games in the head-to-head series.
- The Hurricanes are opening ACC play with back-to-back road games for the fourth time ever (2005, 2011, 2012).

#### MIAMI STARTS FAST, TOPS DUKE 31-6

- Miami jumped out to an early two-touchdown lead and cruised to a 31-6 win in its ACC opener at Duke on Sept. 29.
- Redshirt junior QB **Malik Rosier** finished 15-for-26 with two touchdowns and one interception. He added a rushing score.
- Senior WR **Braxton Berrios** became the first Hurricane WR since **Andre Johnson** in 2002 to catch a touchdown in each of his first three games of the season.
- Sophomore WR **Ahmon Richards** shined in his return, totaling 106 yards on three receptions with one touchdown.
- **Mark Richt** improved to 6-1 in games played outside of Miami during his coaching career at The U.

#### ROSIER IMPRESSING AS STARTING QB

- QB **Malik Rosier**, who was announced as Miami's starting quarterback during fall camp after winning a four-man battle for the spot, has started the season red-hot.
- Rosier leads all ACC quarterbacks in pass efficiency (167.0) and has thrown eight touchdowns compared to two interceptions in three games this season.
- Rosier is completing 65.5 percent of his passes (59-for-90) and has added two rushing touchdowns and 97 rushing yards.
- The Alabama native is the first Hurricane quarterback to start his career 4-0 since **Brock Berlin** did so in 2003. Rosier has 10 TDs and three picks in his four career starts.

## #13/#12 MIAMI SET FOR RIVALRY MATCHUP WITH SEMINOLES

- #13/#12 Miami (3-0, 1-0 ACC) will continue its road slate on Sat., Oct. 7 with a matchup against Florida State (1-2, 1-1 ACC) at Doak Campbell Stadium. Kickoff is set for 3:30 p.m. on ESPN.
- Miami is looking for its first win in the rivalry series since 2009, when the Hurricanes topped the Seminoles, 38-34, on a goal line stand on the final possession as time expired in Tallahassee.
- In last year's matchup at Hard Rock Stadium, the Hurricanes fought back in the fourth quarter with a late touchdown to set up a potential tie, but Florida State blocked the extra point attempt and held on to win, 20-19. The matchup was the third straight decided by five points or fewer.
- UM was scheduled to have played three road games by Oct. 7, but Hurricane Irma forced two changes: a cancellation at Arkansas State (Sept. 9) and the postponement of FSU (Sept. 16).
- Miami is looking to start its ACC schedule with a 2-0 record for the first time since 2013.

## LAST TIME OUT: HURRICANES DOWN DUKE IN DURHAM, 31-6

- Miami jumped out to a 14-0 lead in the first quarter and cruised to a 31-6 win over Duke in its Atlantic Coast Conference opener at Wallace Wade Stadium in Durham, N.C. on Sept. 29.
- QB **Malik Rosier** was red-hot from the outset, completing his first nine pass attempts and throwing for 155 yards in the first quarter alone. He finished with 270 yards and two TDs.
- WR **Braxton Berrios** recorded a touchdown reception for the fourth straight game dating back to 2016, the first such streak by a Miami receiver since **Phillip Dorsett** did so in 2014.
- In his first game of 2017 after a hamstring injury caused him to miss the first two, WR **Ahmmmon Richards** enjoyed a return to form with three receptions, 106 yards and a 49-yard touchdown.
- Miami became just the second team in the past five seasons to hold Duke without an offensive touchdown; the Blue Devils mustered just two field goals and Miami forced two turnovers.

## WALTON WATCH: 30 YARDS AWAY FROM JOINING ELITE COMPANY

- The only returning running back in the ACC who posted a 1,000-yard rushing season in 2016, junior RB **Mark Walton** is off to a sizzling start to 2017 with 403 rush yards in three games.
- With 1,970 career rush yards, Walton now sits in 12th place all-time at Miami; he entered the season No. 21 in all-time rush yards. His eight 100-yard rush games are tied for eighth-most.
- With 51 yards against Duke last time out, Walton moved from No. 14 to No. 12 in the record books, leapfrogging **Tyrone Moss** (2003-06, 1,942) and **Stephen McGuire** (1090-1992, 1,953). Next up in the record books, with 1,975 yards in 11th place, is UM legend **Frank Gore** (2001-04).
- Walton is 30 yards away from becoming the 11th Hurricane with 2,000 or more yards on the ground; **Duke Johnson** (2012-14) is Miami's all-time leader in career rush yards (3,519).
- Walton opened 2017 with a bang, recording 148 yards and two rushing touchdowns in Week 1. He followed that up with the seventh 200-yard rushing game ever in Week 2 vs. Toledo. Walton now has 28 career TDs in 29 career games and is tied for fifth in rushing TDs at Miami (26).
- In 2016, Walton became just the 10th running back in Miami history to rush for over 1,000 yards.
- The impressive feat marked the 11th 1,000-yard rushing season in Miami's and the third straight year the Hurricanes had a 1,000-yard rusher; **Duke Johnson** rushed for 1,652 yards in 2014 while **Joe Yearby** finished with 1,002 yards on the ground in 2015.
- The only player in Miami history with two 1,000-yard seasons is **Edgerrin James** (1997, 1998).
- **James Jackson** (1,006 in 2000), **Clinton Portis** (1,200 in 2001) and **Willis McGahee** (1,753 in 2002) recorded the only other stretch of three straight 1,000-yard rushers in Miami history.

## ROSIER LOOKING TO IMPROVE TO 3-0 IN HIS CAREER ON THE ROAD

- Redshirt junior quarterback **Malik Rosier** was announced as Miami's starting quarterback by head coach **Mark Richt** on Aug. 22, during the final week of Hurricanes fall camp.
- Rosier will be making just the fifth start of his career and third road start when he lines up under center versus Florida State on Oct. 7; his only other road starts both came at Duke (2015, 2017).
- Rosier became the first Hurricane QB to open his career with a 4-0 record since Brock Berlin did so in 2003. He leads the ACC in passing efficiency (167.0) with eight touchdowns and two picks.
- Rosier won a four-man quarterback race during training camp, besting redshirt sophomore **Evan Shirreffs** - who was named backup QB - and freshmen **N'Kosi Perry** and **Cade Weldon**.

## ROAD REGULARS

- Miami opened ACC play on the road for the eighth time in the past nine seasons, and will be opening ACC play with back-to-back road games for the fourth time ever and first since 2012.
- Since joining the conference in 2004, the Hurricanes are now 8-6 all-time in ACC openers.
- When opening ACC play on the road, the Hurricanes have an all-time record of 5-4.



## BERRIOS BALLING IN FINAL SEASON

- Senior WR **Braxton Berrios** has been one of Miami's top offensive threats in the first three games of 2017, and leads all wide receivers with 10 receptions, 192 yards and three touchdowns.
- Berrios had just 12 catches for 178 yards and two receiving touchdowns in all of 2016 (13 games).
- The North Carolina native had two receptions for 52 yards and a touchdown in a return to his home state last time out vs. Duke (Sept. 29), playing in front of more than 30 friends and family.
- Berrios posted his first career 100-yard receiving game in a win over Toledo on Sept. 23, catching five balls, including a career-long 55-yarder, for 105 yards with one receiving score.
- Berrios became the first Hurricane since Miami legend **Andre Johnson** in 2002 to record a touchdown catch in each of his first three games of the season.
- Berrios has a touchdown catch in each of the past four games dating to a win over West Virginia in the 2016 Russell Athletic Bowl, the longest such streak since WR **Phillip Dorsett** in 2014 (4).

## WELCOME BACK

- After missing the first two games of 2017 with a hamstring injury suffered during training camp, WR **Ahmmmon Richards** returned vs. Duke on Sept. 29, starting and totaling 106 receiving yards.
- It was the fifth career 100-yard receiving game for Richards, who added a 49-yard TD in the win.

## WHO'S ROCKING THE TURNOVER CHAIN?

- The University of Miami "turnover chain" made its debut Sept. 2 against Bethune-Cookman, when sophomore DB **Malek Young** was rewarded for his interception with an oversized sparkling "U" chain on the sidelines at Hard Rock Stadium.
- Miami has recorded five turnovers on defense so far, and six different student-athletes have worn the chain; Young, DB **Amari Carter** (forced fumble vs. Bethune-Cookman), DL **Ryan Fines** (recovered fumble vs. Bethune-Cookman), DB **Sheldrick Redwine** (recovered fumble vs. Toledo), LB **Michael Pinckney** (interception vs. Duke) and DL **Pat Bethel** (forced fumble and fumble recovery vs. Duke).
- The chain, which was the brainchild of Miami's defensive staff in an effort to reward players for creating turnovers, has since inspired an adidas-designed t-shirt and been the source of viral social media posts since making its debut on Sept. 2.

## BADG-O-MATIC

- Senior K **Michael Badgley**, who earned third-team All-ACC honors for the second straight year in 2016, has enjoyed a strong start to 2017, going 4-for-5 on field goals and 16-for-16 on PATs.
- Badgley, who was named to the preseason watch list for the Lou Groza Award, ranks third in Miami history in career made field goals (66). He hit a Miami-record 25 field goals in 2015.
- Badgley needs just seven field goals to tie **Carlos Huerta's** (1988-91) Miami career record of 73.
- Badgley 333 career points are the third-most in UM history; Huerta (397) owns the UM record. Badgley needs just four points to tie **Jon Peattie** (2003-06, 337) for second-most all-time.
- Badgley's lone miss this season came on a 53-yard attempt last time out vs. Duke (Sept. 29).

## CONSISTENT CANES

- Hurricane returnees **Kc McDermott**, **Mark Walton**, **R.J. McIntosh**, **Kendrick Norton**, **Shaquille Quarterman** and **Michael Pinckney** were the only Miami players to start in every game in 2016.
- McDermott's 24-game consecutive start streak is the longest on the team.
- Pinckney missed his first start in the opener against Bethune-Cookman due to suspension from a targeting penalty incurred in the second half of Miami's 2016 Russell Athletic Bowl win.
- OL **Navaughn Donaldson** is the only freshman to start every game so far, all at right guard.
- Freshman WR **Mike Harley** has two starts, and grad transfer newcomer DB **Dee Delaney** has started all three games. WR **Dayall Harris** made his first career start vs. Toledo on Sept. 23.

## EIGHT IN A ROW

- The Miami Hurricanes have won eight games in a row dating back to Nov. 5, 2016, and have not lost since a 27-30 defeat at Notre Dame in South Bend, Ind. on Oct. 29, 2016.
- The eight-game winning streak is the longest for Miami since the Hurricanes won nine games from Nov. 17, 2012 - Oct. 26, 2013. It is the first exactly eight-game winning streak since the 2012-13 seasons (Nov. 24, 2012 - Oct. 26, 2013).
- UM's average margin of victory during its current eight-game winning streak is 21.0 points.
- Since taking over, Mark Richt has guided Miami to a 12-4 record and Miami's 12 wins have come by an average of 26.3 points. The four losses have come by an average of just 8.0 points.

## #TIGHTENDU TRADITION ALIVE AND WELL

- The Hurricanes were expecting a big year from senior tight end **Christopher Herndon IV**, and he has delivered so far, including a career-high eight catches, 65 yards and one score versus Toledo.
- Herndon hauled in 28 receptions for 334 yards and two touchdowns as a junior a season ago.
- In 32 career games, Herndon has made 18 career starts and totaled 56 receptions, 670 yards and four touchdowns. He started 12 of 13 games in 2016 and has started all three games this year.
- Sophomore **Michael Irvin II** has added to the mix, with two catches and 28 yards against Toledo.
- Herndon's tight end partner last season, **David Njoku**, was selected in the first round of the 2017 NFL Draft by the Cleveland Browns (No. 29 overall). He has two TDs with the Browns already.
- Njoku became the fifth Hurricane tight end drafted in the first round since 2000, joining **Bubba Franks** (2000), **Jeremy Shockey** (2002), **Kellen Winslow** (2004) and **Greg Olsen** (2007).

## DEFENSE LOOKING TO TAKE THE NEXT STEP IN 2017

- Miami shined on defense in 2016, its first season under the direction of defensive coordinator **Manny Diaz**, eliciting nostalgia from longtime Hurricanes fans with a standout unit.
- Miami's defense is tied for **second nationally in tackles for loss** (9.0 per game) and tied for 10th in sacks (3.33). The Hurricanes had season-high totals of six sacks and 11 tackles for loss vs. Duke.
- At the conclusion of the 2016 season, Miami was ranked No. 20 nationally in total defense (up from No. 69 the previous season), No. 9 in yards per play (No. 86 in 2015), No. 12 in scoring defense (No. 77 in 2015), No. 5 in tackles for loss (No. 105 in 2015), No. 22 in team sacks (No. 70 in 2015) and tied for No. 8 in defensive touchdowns allowed (No. 61 in 2015).

## 17 TRUE FRESHMEN PLAY IN THE OPENER VS. BETHUNE-COOKMAN

- The Hurricanes tied for the national lead with 17 true freshmen playing against Bethune-Cookman on Sept. 2. Both Georgia and LSU also had 17 true freshmen also play in their openers.
- In addition to starts by WR **Mike Harley** and OL **Navaughn Donaldson**, DL **Jonathan Garvin**, DL **DJ Johnson**, DL **Jonathan Ford**, WR **Jeff Thomas**, WR **DeeJay Dallas**, P **Zach Feagles**, OL **Corey Gaynor**, OL **Kai-Leon Herbert**, LB **Bradley Jennings, Jr.**, DB **Amari Carter**, DB **Trajan Bandy**, DB **Derrick Smith**, TE **Brian Polendey**, LB **De'Andre Wilder** and WR **Marshall Few** also saw time in the first game of their careers.

## GETTING DEFENSIVE

- Under first-year defensive coordinator **Manny Diaz**, the Hurricanes held opponents to just 4.75 yards per play in 2016 - a figure that ranked ninth among teams at the FBS level.
- The Hurricanes ranked in the top 25 nationally in four different defensive categories: scoring defense (No. 12/18.5), team sacks (No. 22/2.85), tackles for loss (No. 5/8.3) and total defense (No. 20/345.5). Miami held 11 of its 13 opponents under their 2016 scoring average, including West Virginia in the Russell Athletic Bowl on Dec. 28.
- Miami started and finished games strong in 2016, as it outscored opponents by a combined 166-95 count in the first and fourth quarters of games.
- In 2016, nine Miami Hurricanes had at least 5.0 tackles for loss on defense. In 2015, just four players finished the season (13 games) with at least 5.0 tackles for loss.

## SO CLOSE

- Miami's four losses in 2016 came by a combined 32 points (8.0 points per game average).
- Two of Miami's four losses came by three points or fewer (vs. FSU, 20-19, at Notre Dame, 30-27).
- Only one loss last season came by more than one score - a 16-37 defeat at Virginia Tech on Oct. 20. All three other losses were decided by seven points or fewer, while each of Miami's nine win in 2016 came by at least 14 points.



## RICHARDS A RECORD RECEIVER IN FRESHMAN SEASON

- Wide receiver **Ahmmon Richards** led the Hurricanes in 2016 with 934 yards receiving - the most ever by a freshman wide receiver at Miami and the sixth-most by any Hurricane ever.
- Richards missed the first two games of 2017 but recorded 106 yards on three receptions with one TD in his return vs. Duke on Sept. 29 - the fifth 100-yard receiving game of his career.
- Richards' 934 yards broke **Michael Irvin's** 31-year-old record of 840, set in 1985.
- Richards' 19.06 yards per reception were tops among all FBS freshman nationally. Richards' 19.06 yards per reception ranked 18th nationally overall, while his 934 receiving yards led all FBS freshmen nationally. Richards was honored as the ACC Rookie of the Week twice in 2016.
- After the year, Richards was named to the All-ACC Second Team and a Freshman All-American.

## CANES PLAYING IT "KOOL"

- Assistant head coach and defensive line coach **Craig Kuligowski**, widely regarded as one of the best line coaches in America, made an immediate impact in his first season at Miami in 2016.
- The Hurricanes finished the regular season fifth in the nation in tackles for loss per game (8.3) and ranked 22nd in sacks per game (2.85). Miami finished the 2016 season with 108 tackles for loss and 38 sacks. In 2015, the Hurricanes recorded 66 tackles for loss and 26 sacks.
- Miami's defense is tied for second nationally in tackles for loss (9.0 per game) and tied for 10th in sacks (3.33). Miami had season-high totals of six sacks and 11 tackles for loss vs. Duke.
- The Hurricanes defense posted 9.0 tackles for loss for 27 yards, including 4.0 sacks, in a 52-30 win over Toledo on Sept. 23. Senior DL **Trent Harris** tied a career mark with two (2.0) sacks.
- Following the 2016 season, Kuligowski was promoted to Assistant Head Coach/Defensive Line.

## OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

- Miami's offensive unit has proven to be an explosive unit over the previous four years. The Hurricanes' 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2016 offensive units all rank among Miami's top 10 for most total yards in a single season.
- That trend has continued in 2017; Miami currently has the No. 1 scoring offense in the ACC, averaging 46.5 points per game, and its 568.5-yards-per-game average on offense is also tops in the conference.
- The Hurricanes currently boast the No. 2 rushing attack (285.5 yards per game) and No. 6 passing offense (283.0) in the ACC.
- The 2016 Hurricanes' offensive attack ranked third in program history for most total yards.
- Miami also scored 446 points last year - a figure that ranks fourth in school history for a single season.

- In September 2016, the University of Miami announced the largest donation in the history of the athletics department as the lead gift for a state-of-the-art football indoor practice facility.
- In honor of their mother Carol, Jeffrey Soffer and Carol's other children made a \$14 million commitment towards the Carol Soffer Football Indoor Practice Facility.
- Head coach Mark Richt pledged \$1 million towards the facility and football alumnus and linebacker great Jon Beason was among those alumni to give to the project. Beason's gift was \$250,000.
- Miami had its groundbreaking ceremony for the \$34 million facility in May 2017.
- The 81,800-square-foot facility will feature two field-turf fields – one 80 yards long and an additional 40-yard field directly connecting to the Squillante Strength and Conditioning Center. The facility will be located on the current football practice grounds, and will feature interconnectivity to the Hecht Athletic Center and the Schwartz Center for Athletic Excellence.

# MARK RICHT

**HEAD COACH | SECOND SEASON AT MIAMI (17TH OVERALL) | 157-55 (.741)**

Hurricane alumnus Mark Richt was named the 24th head football coach at The University of Miami on Dec. 4, 2015, by Director of Athletics Blake James.

Richt's 2016 season in Coral Gables was one to remember as he helped guide Miami to its first bowl victory in 10 years, as the Hurricanes captured the 2016 Russell Athletic Bowl, defeating nationally-ranked West Virginia 31-14.

Miami had 10 players earned ACSMA All-ACC honors in 2016, while quarterback Brad Kaaya became Miami's all-time passing yards leader under his tutelage. Freshman wide receiver Ahmmon Richards broke the 31-year-old freshman receiving record at Miami originally set by Michael Irvin, while sophomore running back Mark Walton became the 11th 1,000-yard rusher in program history.

In addition, four Hurricanes earned freshman All-America honors under Richt's watchful eye.

At the conclusion of the regular season, Miami was ranked No. 20 nationally in total defense (up from No. 69 a season ago), No. 9 in yards allowed per play (No. 86 in 2015), No. 12 in scoring defense (No. 77 in 2015), No. 5 in tackles for loss (No. 105 in 2015) No. 22 in offensive yards per play (No. 48 in 2015), No. 37 in offensive touchdowns (No. 80 in 2015), No. 37 in scoring offense (No. 71 in 2015) and No. 22 in team sacks (No. 70 in 2015).

Richt, born in Omaha, Neb., and raised in Boca Raton, Fla., returned to his alma mater after leading the University of Georgia football program for the previous 15 years. He compiled a 145-51 overall record and an 85-40 mark in Southeastern Conference play, won two SEC championships, six SEC East titles and nine bowl games and finished the season in the Associated Press Top-10 rankings seven times.

Richt's .736 winning percentage ranks fifth-best among active FBS head coaches. Richt is one of only seven head coaches in SEC history to record four straight 10-win seasons (2002-05).

During his tenure on the sidelines in Athens, 77 of Richt's players were selected in the NFL Draft over the last 14 years, including eight chosen in the 2002 and 2013 NFL Drafts – the most Georgia players ever selected in a single year.

Off the field, Richt places a strong emphasis on academics and 292 Georgia players earned their degrees during his tenure.

Richt was the 2013 recipient of the Stallings Award given for commitment to humanitarian and community service efforts, and in 2010, he was named to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees.

Before his arrival at Georgia, Richt spent seven seasons as the offensive coordinator at Florida State. In his time in Tallahassee, the Seminoles finished in the nation's top five in scoring offense on five occasions, top 12 in total offense five times and top 12 in passing offense five times.

The 2000 team, which played in the National Championship game against Oklahoma, finished the regular season ranked first nationally in total offense (549.0 ypg), first in passing offense (384.0 ypg), and third in scoring offense (42.4 ppg).

Richt sent six FSU quarterbacks into the NFL between 1987 and 2000. In 2000, Richt coached Chris Weinke to the Heisman Trophy, and in 1991, he coached Casey Weldon to the runner-up for the Heisman. Brad Johnson (now Richt's brother-in-law), was a Pro Bowl selection for Washington in 2000 and led the Tampa Bay Bucs to the Super Bowl title in 2003. Other Richt pro protégés include Danny Kanell (New York Giants), Danny McManus (Kansas City Chiefs) and Peter Tom Willis (Chicago Bears).

Richt played quarterback for the Miami Hurricanes under legendary head coach Howard Schnellenberger.

He spent most of his career at Miami as a backup to Pro Football Hall of Famer and former Buffalo Bills star Jim Kelly. In one of Richt's years at Miami, his teammates included Kelly, Vinny Testaverde and Bernie Kosar and quarterbacks coach Earl Morrall.

Richt is married to the former Katharyn Francis of Tallahassee. The couple has four children – Jonathan, David, Zach, and Anya. Jon, the Miami quarterbacks coach, was married to the former Anna Cearley, in May 2010.
