#### THE GAME

- Coming off a 77-0 win over Savannah State in their home opener at Hard Rock Stadium on Sept. 8, the No. 21/20 Miami Hurricanes continue their month of September with a road tilt vs. Toledo at the Glass Bowl on Saturday, Sept. 15. Kickoff is set for 12 p.m. ET on ACC Network Extra.
- The Hurricanes have a 2-0 all-time record against the Rockets, including a 52-30 win at Hard Rock Stadium last season (Sept. 23, 2017).
- Miami is making its first-ever trip to the Glass Bowl and its first trip to the state of Ohio since a 2015 matchup at Cincinnati (Oct. 1, 2015)
- The game will be broadcast on **ESPN2** with Kevin Brown (play by play) and Andre Ware (color) on the call. Joe Zagacki (play by play) and Don Bailey, Jr. (color) are in the **560 WQAM** radio booth for their 17th season together, while Josh Darrow will handle the sideline duty on the flagship station. Jose "Chamby" Campos (ppx) and Joe Martinez (color) will carry the game live on **990AM ESPN Deportes**.

#### THE SERIES

- Miami has played Toledo only twice in history, including last season, when the Hurricanes emerged with a 52-30 win at home on Sept. 23, 2017.
- Prior to last season, UM had only played Toledo once, earning a 24-14 victory over the Rockets in a Nov. 21, 1987 game played at the Orange Bowl.

#### THE HURRICANES

- Miami returns 14 starters and 44 letterwinners from a 2017 group that won 10 games (10-3) for the first time since 2003 and advanced to the ACC Championship Game for the first time in history. The Hurricanes ended the year in the Capital One Orange Bowl for the first time since 2003.
- Miami's seven wins in ACC play (7-1) in 2017 were the most in program history, as the Hurricanes captured the ACC's Coastal Division title for the first time. **Mark Richt** was named ACC Coach of the Year in a year where UM finished with a perfect 7-0 home record during the regular season.
- The Canes are coming off a 77-0 win over Savannah State on Sept. 8, 2018 in their home opener; UM tied the program record for points in the win.
- Miami outgained the Tigers, 494-78, with nine different Hurricanes scoring touchdowns in the victory, including six Hurricanes who scored their first touchdowns of their careers. The 77-point margin of victory was the largest in Hurricanes' history, besting the previous record of 70 set in 2013.
- With three more touchdowns Saturday against Savannah State (one rushing, two passing), starting QB **Malik Rosier** has now been responsible for 39 touchdowns (eight rushing, 31 passing) in his 16 starts (12-4 record). He is 8-1 in starts at Hard Rock Stadium and 4-3 in starts away from home.
- Among Miami's breakout stars in the first two games has been sophomore WR **Jeff Thomas**, who leads Miami with 199 receiving yards and 365 all-purpose yards this fall. Thomas had a career-best 90 punt return yards and a 67-yard receiving touchdown last time out vs. Savannah State.
- Among Miami's top defensive performers through the first two weekends have been sophomore DL Jon Garvin (team-high 16 total tackles, team-high 6.0 tackles for loss), senior DB **Jaquan Johnson** (15 tackles) and senior DL **Gerald Willis III** (4.0 tackles for loss, one sack).

#### THE OPPONENT

- Toledo is under the direction of fourth-year head coach Jason Candle, who has amassed an impressive 22-7 record at the helm of the Rockets.
- The defending Mid-American Conference (MAC) champions, Toledo is led by QB Mitchell Guadagni, who threw for 265 yards and three TDs vs. VMI.

## QUICK HITS

#### CANES BATTLE ROCKETS AT GLASS BOWL

- The No. 21/20 Hurricanes play their first true road game of the 2018 season on Saturday, Sept. 15 at Toledo. Kickoff is set for 12 p.m. from the Glass Bowl.
- In last year's road opener at Duke (Sept. 29, 2017), the Hurricanes earned a 31-6 victory in an ACC matchup in Durham, N.C.
- Miami has won its road opener each season since 2014, when UM fell to Louisville on Sept. 1 in the Cardinals' first-ever game as an ACC football member; the Hurricanes have won three true road openers since.
- Miami has a 12-3 record at Hard Rock Stadium in Mark Richt's tenure, and has not lost a regular season game at Hard Rock since Oct. 15, 2016 - having won 10 straight regular season games there.

#### UM NOTCHES FIRST SHUTOUT SINCE '15

- With a 77-0 win over Savannah State on Sept. 8, the Hurricanes posted their first shutout under the current coaching staff and first since a 45-0 win over Bethune-Cookman on Sept. 5, 2015.
- Nine different Hurricanes scored touchdowns in the win, with two student-athletes - TE Brevin Jordan and RB Lorenzo Lingard - scoring two touchdowns each.
- Miami's 77 points on Sept. 8 tied the program record for points - also set against Savannah State, in a 77-7 win in 2013.
- The Hurricanes' 77-point margin of victory was the largest in history, besting its previous high of 70 set in that same 77-7 win over Savannah State on Sept. 21, 2013.

#### "BREAK OUT THE CHAIN AGAIN!"

- Five different Hurricanes wore the new version of the "Turnover Chain" in Miami's 77-0 win over Savannah State on Sept. 8.
- Sophomore DB Trajan Bandy became the first Hurricane to rock the new chain - made with more than 4,000 stones (compared to 900 last year) and weighing nearly three kilograms (two kilograms last year) - when he recovered a Savannah State fumble in the second quarter.
- DB Jhavonte Dean, LB Waymon Steed, DL Scott Patchan and DB Sheldrick Redwine also wore the chain in Saturday's win.
- The new chain is modeled after Sebastian the Ibis, with the charm registering 8.5 inches in length (compared to 5.5 last year).

## #21/#20 MIAMI MAKES FIRST TRUE ROAD TRIP TO FACE TOLEDO

- No. 21/20 Miami will be playing its first true road game of the 2018 season when it travels to Ohio for a matchup with the Toledo Rockets. Kickoff for the game is slated for 12 p.m. from the Glass Bowl.
- The game marks a return trip to the Hurricanes, who hosted Toledo on Sept. 23, 2017 and topped the Rockets, 52-30. Miami trailed 16-10 at half, but outscored Toledo 42-14 over the final two quarters.
- UM carries a perfect 2-0 mark vs. the Rockets all-time, but has never played Toledo on the road. Prior to last year's matchup, the Canes had only played Toledo once: a 24-14 home win in November 1987.
- Since joining the ACC in 2004, Miami has played in the state of Ohio just twice - a game at Ohio State on Sept. 11, 2010 and a game at Cincinnati on Oct. 1, 2015; Miami fell short in both matchups.
- The Hurricanes check in at No. 21 in the Associated Press poll and were ranked No. 20 in the Amway Coaches Poll - Miami has appeared in both polls for the last 20 straight polls, dating to Jan. 10, 2017.

## HURRICANES SET RECORDS IN WIN OVER TIGERS IN HOME OPENER

- The Miami Hurricanes opened their 11th season at Hard Rock Stadium on Sept. 8 vs. Savannah State, capturing a 77-0 shutout victory to improve to 11-0 all-time in home openers at the stadium. Miami has outscored opponents 500-69 for an average margin of victory of 39.2 points in those 11 games.
- Miami's 77 points tied a program record for most points in a single game (also set against Savannah State, in September 2013), while its 77-point margin of victory was the largest in program history.
- The Hurricanes have not lost a home opener since 2006, when they fell to Florida State 13-10 at the Orange Bowl on Sept. 4, 2006. Miami has won 12 straight home openers since - each one since 2007.
- The 12 straight wins in home openers marks the longest such stretch in Hurricanes Football history.
- Saturday's win over Savannah State also marked the debut of the new and improved Turnover Chain.
- Since the start of the 2001 season, Miami has opened the season 10 times at home and seven times on the road; the Hurricanes are 9-1 in those home games. Miami opened 2018 in a neutral-site game.
- Since joining the ACC prior to the 2004 season, Miami has played a conference opponent in only three of its 15 home openers: Florida State twice (2004, 2006) and Georgia Tech once (2009).
- In the modern era of Miami Hurricanes football (since 1979), UM has opened the season at home 18 times and is 16-2 in those games. Miami is 29-10 in regular season openers dating to 1979.

## THOMAS SHOWCASING ELECTRIC PLAYMAKING ABILITY IN YEAR 2

- Sophomore WR **Jeff Thomas** showed off his skillset in a dominant performance in Miami's opener.
- Thomas started and made a number of acrobatic catches, hauling in a career-high five passes for a career-high 132 yards vs. LSU (Sept. 2); his previous highs were three receptions and 101 yards.
- Less than one week later against Savannah State (Sept. 8), Thomas once again showcased his electric speed in open space. Thomas hauled in a 67-yard touchdown pass on his only reception of the game and also finished with 183 all-purpose yards - including a career-high 90 punt return yards.
- Thomas, who led the Hurricanes with 22 plays of at least 20 yards in 2017, already has nine such plays (four receptions, three kick returns, two punts) - including four of the top five longest - in 2018. Thomas 67-yard touchdown was the longest play of the season for Miami and the fourth catch of at least 50 yards in his career; Thomas also hauled in a 50-yard reception in the opener against LSU.
- The East St. Louis, Ill., native was on the receiving end of the two longest pass plays for UM in 2017.
- Thomas' 132 yards vs. LSU in the Advocare Classic were the most in a game by a Miami Hurricane wide receiver since WR **Ahmmmon Richards** totaled 144 yards against Pittsburgh on Nov. 5, 2016.

## BREAK OUT THE CHAIN AGAIN! TURNOVER CHAIN 2.0 IS HERE FOR 2018

- When sophomore DB **Trajan Bandy** pounced on a loose ball in the second quarter of Miami's game against Savannah State, the crowd turned to observe a familiar sight from 2017: the "Turnover Chain."
- But instead of last year's chain, which was modeled in the shape of the iconic "U" logo, Bandy was presented a brand new turnover chain to rock featuring a charm in the model of Sebastian the Ibis.
- Turnover Chain 2.0 is comprised of more than 4,000 stones (compared to 900 last year), weighs roughly three kilograms (compared to two last year) and has an 8.5-inch charm (compared to 5.5).
- Bandy wore the chain once last season after an interception against Notre Dame. DB **Sheldrick Redwine** picked off a Tigers pass in the game to earn the chain, which he wore three times in 2017.
- Three players wore the chain for the first time Saturday against Savannah State: LB **Waymon Steed** (fumble recovery), DL **Scott Patchan** (blocked punt recovery) and DB **Jhavonte Dean** (interception).
- Miami's four turnovers Saturday vs. Savannah State tied the season high from 2017, done four times.

## TRUE FROSH TIGHT END DUO MAKING AN EARLY IMPACT FOR MIAMI

- Two key members of Miami's #Storm18 signing class have played bigger roles than already was anticipated after junior tight end Michael Irvin II suffered an MCL injury during fall camp.
- Freshman tight end duo Brevin Jordan and Will Mallory, who became friends through the recruiting process and were ranked among the nation's best at the position, have been counted on early in 2018.
- Last time out against Savannah State (Sept. 8), Mallory opened the game's scoring with a two-yard touchdown pass - the very first catch of his career. Mallory made his first career start in the victory.
- Jordan, who started the season opener, had a dominant outing of his own against the Tigers, setting career marks in receptions (seven) and receiving yards (52) to go along with his first two touchdowns.
- Jordan was ranked the No. 1 tight end in the country by ESPN.com and 247Sports and No. 2 by Rivals, while Mallory was ranked the third-best tight end by ESPN.com. The two are roommates at The U.

## DEFENSE RECORDS FIRST SHUTOUT SINCE 2015 IN WIN OVER TIGERS

- The Miami Hurricanes' defense was able to compile its first shutout since the 2015 season opener against Bethune-Cookman (Sept. 5, 2015) in a 77-0 win over Savannah State on Saturday, Sept. 8.
- The shutout was the first under the current Miami staff, including defensive coordinator Manny Diaz.
- Diaz's last shutout as defensive coordinator came exactly six years to the day before Miami's win over Savannah State; as the coordinator at Texas, Diaz's Longhorns shutout New Mexico on Sept. 8, 2012.

## 26 HURRICANES MAKE THEIR DEBUTS IN HOME OPENER AT HARD ROCK

- 15 offensive Hurricanes made their career debuts on Saturday, Sept. 8 vs. Savannah State: QB N'Kosi Perry, QB Cade Weldon, WR Mark Pope, FB Realus George, Jr., WR Marquez Ezzard, OL John Campbell, Jr., RB Robert Burns, OL Zalon'tae Hillery, OL Cleveland Reed, Jr., RB Cam'Ron Davis, TE Nicholas Ducheine, OL Zach Dykstra, K Alejandro Cardenas, OL Sam York and QB Jarren Williams.
- 11 defensive Hurricanes made their career debuts in the same game: DL Nesta Jade Silvera, DB Gilbert Frierson, LB Waymon Steed, DB Gurvan Hall, Jr., DB James Murphy, DL Jordan Miller, LB Patrick Joyner, Jr., DB Nigel Bethel, DB Tyler Murphy, DB Colvin Alford and DL Tyreic Martin.
- The moment was not too big for several Hurricanes, who delivered impressive outings in their first career performances. Perry threw three touchdown passes while both Weldon and Williams rushed for one apiece. Lingard ran for two touchdowns, including a career-long 64-yard score. Silvera made the key play on a punt block that was returned for a touchdown, Steed recovered a fumble in the first action of his career and Joyner, Jr., helped cause the fumble in an impressive debut of his own.

## LINGARD POSTS LONGEST RUN BY TRUE FRESHMAN SINCE DUKE IN 2012

- With a 64-yard touchdown run Saturday against Savannah State, RB Lorenzo Lingard recorded the longest rush by a true freshman running back since Duke Johnson had a 65-yard rush against Duke in his true freshman season finale on Nov. 24, 2012 in Durham, N.C., which was also a touchdown run.

## JONATHAN GARVIN ENJOYING SOPHOMORE SURGE ON DEFENSIVE LINE

- The Miami Hurricanes' defensive line took a hit when three of its four 2017 starters departed this past offseason, but one of the players who has stepped up in his sophomore year has been end Jon Garvin.
- Garvin, who totaled just nine tackles as a true freshman in 2017, already has a team-high 16 tackles through the first two games; he set a career high with eight vs. LSU and matched it vs. Savannah State.
- Garvin, who had just 3.0 tackles for loss as a true freshman, already has a team-high 6.0 tackles for loss in 2018; he is the first player to have multiple games with 3.0 TFL since Denzel Perryman in 2011.
- The Lake Worth, Fla., native goes by "Neo" - his middle name and the name of his grandfather.

## RIGHT OFF TO STRONG START IN COACHING CAREER AT ALMA MATER

- Head coach Mark Richt's 20-8 start to his head coaching career at Miami is the fourth-best mark through 28 games in the modern era of Hurricanes football (since 1979).

## WILLIS DELIVERS DOMINANT PERFORMANCE IN RETURN TO THE FIELD

- DL **Gerald Willis III**, playing in his first game since Nov. 26, 2016, delivered an overpowering performance in the trenches against a talented LSU offensive line in the AdvoCare Classic on Sept. 2.
- Willis III posted a career-high eight tackles in his first career collegiate start (four solo), and recorded an eye-popping 4.0 tackles for loss – the first such performance by a Hurricane since 2008.
- Playing against his hometown team, Willis III – a New Orleans native - had one sack, one pass breakup and one QB hurry. For his efforts, he was named ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week.
- The last Cane to have 4.0 tackles for loss in a game was Marcus Robinson vs. Virginia Tech in 2008.
- Willis' performance was the eighth game of at least 3.0 TFLs since Manny Diaz' arrival in 2016.
- Willis III and DL **Jonathan Garvin**, who posted 3.0 TFLs of his own in the loss, became the first Hurricane tandem to each record at least 3.0 TFLs in a game since DL **Demetrius Jackson** (3.0) and DL **Courtel Jenkins** (3.0) did it in the 2016 season opener against Florida A&M on Sept. 3, 2016.
- Garvin had his second straight performance of 3.0 TFLs at home on Sept. 8 vs. Savannah State.

## MIAMI BATTLES BACK, FALLS TO #25/#24 LSU IN ADVOCARE CLASSIC

- Trailing #25/#24 LSU by a sizable margin at halftime, the Hurricanes could not complete a comeback in their 33-17 loss to the Tigers in the AdvoCare Classic hosted at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas.
- Miami outgained the Tigers, 342-296, but committed 11 penalties and two turnovers in the defeat.
- QB **Malik Rosier** finished with 259 passing yards, one rushing touchdown and another passing score. Rosier, making his 15th career start for Miami, threw two interceptions; one was returned for a TD.
- WR **Jeff Thomas** had one of the best performances of his career against the Tigers, starting and finishing with a career-best five catches for a career-high 132 yards with a long catch of 50 yards.
- DL **Gerald Willis III** delivered the best performance of his career against his hometown team, finishing with a career-high eight tackles, including four (4.0) tackles for loss and one (1.0) sack.
- DB **Jaquan Johnson** led UM with 11 total tackles while DL **Jon Garvin** added 3.0 tackles for loss.



## HIGHTOWER WOWS IN FIRST COLLEGIATE GAME, SCORES TOUCHDOWN

- Among Miami's most impressive freshman performers vs. LSU was WR **Brian Hightower**, who hauled in a 32-yard touchdown reception on a connection with QB **Malik Rosier** in the fourth quarter.
- Hightower, who saw significant action in the game vs. LSU, became the first Hurricane wide receiver to record a touchdown for his first collegiate catch since **Tyre Brady** vs. Nebraska in 2015.
- The last Hurricane, regardless of position, to have his first catch end up in a touchdown was FB **Marquez Williams** in 2016, who scored Miami's first touchdown of the season on a 4-yard reception.
- The very next week, vs. Savannah State (Sept. 8), TE **Will Mallory** managed the feat on a 2-yard TD.
- Hightower was a consensus four-star recruit ranked the No. 141 overall player in his class by ESPN.

## HURRICANES LOOKING TO GAIN STRENGTH IN YEAR 3 UNDER RICHT

- Miami enjoyed an impressive 2017 season under the direction of head coach **Mark Richt**, who guided the Hurricanes to 10 wins and a College Football Playoff ranking as high as No. 2 in his second year.
- The Hurricanes, who captured the ACC's Coastal Division for the first time in its history for a spot in the ACC Championship, earned an invite to the Capital One Orange Bowl for the first time in 13 years.
- Richt was named 2017 ACC Coach of the Year and was also named Walter Camp Coach of the Year.
- Miami had three players selected to the Preseason All-ACC Football Team: DB **Michael Jackson**, DB **Jaquan Johnson** and LB **Shaquille Quarterman**. In addition to his recognition by the conference, Johnson was selected to the Associated Press Preseason All-America First Team at safety.
- The Hurricanes return 3,120 of their 3,153 passing yards from 2017 (98.9%) and 1,697 of 2,090 rushing yards (81.2%), which accounts for a combined 91.8% of total offense returning heading into 2018.

## 10 TRUE FRESHMEN, 13 TOTAL SEE FIRST ACTION OF CAREER VS. LSU

- 10 true freshmen suited up for the first time in the season opener vs. LSU, while three others - redshirt freshman WR **Evidence Njoku**, DL **Tito Odenigbo** and OL **Venzell Boulware** - also debuted.
- 10 true freshmen made their debuts against LSU in the AdvoCare Classic: RB **Lorenzo Lingard**, WR **Brian Hightower**, DB **Al Blades, Jr.**, DB **DJ Ivey**, WR **Dee Wiggins**, TE **Brevin Jordan**, DL **Gregory Rousseau**, K **Bubba Baxa**, OL **DJ Scaife, Jr.** and TE **Will Mallory**.

## DEFENSE, TURNOVER CHAIN HAS DAZZLED UNDER DIAZ'S DIRECTION

- Defensive coordinator **Manny Diaz** has directed the UM defense into one of the nation's top groups in his two seasons at The U, and his 2017 unit ranked among the nation's elite in several categories.
- Miami got off to a good start in 2018, holding LSU to 296 total yards and just 140 passing yards. The next week vs. Savannah State (Sept. 8), Miami held the Tigers to just 78 total yards in a 77-0 win.
- Miami's defense ranked ninth nationally in opponent yards per play (4.5), one of the most important modern metrics when measuring a college football defense. In 2016, UM ranked No. 16 in OYPP (4.7).
- The Hurricanes led the nation in team sacks (3.38) and ranked third in team tackles for loss (8.8).
- One of college football's biggest storylines in 2017 was the emergence of Miami's "turnover chain," and after the Canes posted the ACC's best turnover margin in 2017, the chain will be back in 2018
- Miami's 31 turnovers gained were the third-most in the nation and most in the ACC, while its +1.00 average turnover margin (+13 for the season) was tied for the fifth-best mark in the nation.

## ROSIER RETURNS AFTER SETTING SINGLE-SEASON MIAMI TD RECORD

- In his first season as Miami's starting quarterback in 2017, Malik Rosier set UM's single-season "touchdowns responsible for" record with 31 - besting Vinny Testaverde's previous record of 30 set during Testaverde's 1986 Heisman Trophy campaign. He threw for 26 TDs and rushed for five scores.
- The Mobile, Ala., native, slated for his 17th career start on Sept. 15, threw for 3,120 yards, which were tenth-most in a single season in Miami history, compiling 26 touchdown passes and 14 interceptions.
- Rosier added 468 rushing yards to help set the single-season total offense record at Miami (3,588) in his first year as starter. In addition to his five rushing scores, Rosier's 26 touchdown passes were tied with Testaverde (1986) and Brad Kaaya (2014) for fourth-most in single season in Miami history.
- Rosier was named to the watch list for the 2018 Manning Award, honoring the nation's top QB.
- In 16 career starts at Miami, Rosier has compiled a 12-4 record; he made one start in the 2015 season.

## JOHNSON BACK FOR SENIOR YEAR AFTER CONSULTING IDOL ED REED

- After discussing his future with legendary Miami safety Ed Reed, Jaquan Johnson turned down the opportunity to enter the NFL Draft, choosing to return for his senior season with the Hurricanes.
- The Hurricanes are undoubtedly happy with his decision, as Johnson - a Preseason All-America first-team selection by the Associated Press, a Preseason All-ACC selection and a watch list member for three major defensive awards - led Miami with 96 tackles and tied for the team lead with four picks.
- In his first game of 2018, Johnson served as one of four captains and totaled a game-high 11 tackles.
- As a junior, Johnson was one of four defensive semifinalists for the Walter Camp Player of the Year.
- Johnson was named ACC Defensive of the Back three weeks in a row in 2017 (Nov. 6, Nov. 13, Nov. 20), becoming the first Hurricane player to ever be honored by the ACC in three consecutive weeks.
- The last ACC player to earn honors in three straight weeks was Deshaun Watson of Clemson in 2014.
- Johnson has totaled 160 tackles, four forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries and six interceptions in 39 career games at Miami - he has not missed a game since arriving to Coral Gables in January 2015.

## THREE-HEADED MONSTER AT LINEBACKER BEGIN JUNIOR CAMPAIGNS

- Miami's three-headed monster - junior linebacker trio Zach McCloud, Michael Pinckney and Shaq Quarterman - has started nearly every game together since arriving to UM as early enrollees in 2016.
- McCloud has started 23 of 28 games through the first two weeks of 2018. McCloud finished with 48 tackles (29 solo), 4.5 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks as a sophomore. He had six tackles last time out.
- One of Miami's most instinctive players, Pinckney started 11 of 13 games last season and ended up with 68 total tackles, 11.0 tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks. He had four tackles and 1.0 TFL last time out vs. SSU.
- Quarterman, who has started all 28 games for the Hurricanes in two seasons at The U, ranked second on the team with 83 tackles a sophomore in 2017. Quarterman had 2.0 TFLs and one sack last time out.

## TRUE FRESHMEN ALREADY MAKING AN EARLY IMPACT FOR MIAMI IN 2018

- Miami's recruiting class, nicknamed #Storm18, was ranked the consensus No. 1 class in Florida and a consensus top-eight class overall for the first time since 2012. It was ranked No. 6 nationally by Rivals.
- UM's recruiting class included 14 players ranked in the ESPN300, 12 in 247Sports' national rankings, 12 ranked in the Rivals 250, and 10 players who were either U.S. Army or Under Armour All-Americans.
- Miami's class was ranked No. 8 nationally by both 247Sports and ESPN and ranked the second-best class in the ACC by both organizations. 247Sports, ESPN and Rivals all had UM's class No. 1 in Florida.
- 10 members of the signing class enrolled early and took part in spring practice: QB Jarren Williams, RB Lorenzo Lingard, WR Brian Hightower, WR Dee Wiggins, DL Greg Rousseau, OL John Campbell, Jr., OL DJ Scaife, Jr., DB Gurvan Hall, Jr., DB DJ Ivey and DB Gilbert Frierson

## HOMER IMPRESSED IN FIRST SEASON AS STARTING RUNNING BACK

- After a season-ending injury to Mark Walton, RB **Travis Homer** stepped up and saw action in all 13 games last year. He took over starting duties four games into the year and shined in his primary role.
- Homer has a team-high 100 rushing yards through the first two games (5.0 yards per carry average).
- Homer rushed for 966 yards on 163 attempts (5.9 yards per carry) with eight rushing TDs in 2017.
- The West Palm Beach native, who was selected to the All-ACC Second Team in 2017, compiled 1,203 all-purpose yards and three 100-yard rushing games - including 170 in his first start vs. Georgia Tech.
- The Palm Beach native became the eighth Miami tailback to have recorded a 100-yard game in his first career start since 2000, and the fourth to do it in an Atlantic Coast Conference game.
- Homer's performance was just the 22nd game of 170 yards or more by a Miami back since 1980.
- Homer had the third 100-yard rushing game of his career vs. Notre Dame (Nov. 11) with 146 yards.
- The only offensive player to wear the turnover chain last year, Homer recovered a muffed fumble against Virginia on special teams. He played in 12 of 13 games as a true freshman in 2016.

## THOMAS SHOWCASED SPEED, BIG PLAY ABILITY IN FRESHMAN YEAR

- WR **Jeff Thomas** was a key contributor in his first season at Miami and was responsible for two of the three longest offensive plays of the season and four of the top-11 longest plays of the year.
- Thomas was Miami's best offensive weapon in the season opener, recording the second 100-yard game of his career on a career-high 132 yards. He finished with a career-best five receptions vs. LSU.
- Thomas had the two longest receptions of the season - a 78-yard touchdown against North Carolina and a 70-yard reception against Georgia Tech. He also had a 48-yard reception vs. Wisconsin in the Capital One Orange Bowl and a 48-yard touchdown reception against Syracuse.
- Thomas, who totaled 374 receiving yards on 17 receptions, averaged a team-high 22.0-yards per catch and 28.8 receiving yards per game. He played in all 13 games and made four starts.

## RICHARDS WAS A RECORD RECEIVER IN FRESHMAN SEASON

- Wide receiver **Ahmmmon Richards** led the Hurricanes in 2016 with 934 yards receiving - the most ever by a freshman wide receiver at Miami and the sixth-most by any Hurricane ever.
- The Wellington, Fla., missed most of Game 1 and all of Game 2 with a leg injury suffered in the opener.
- Richards' 934 yards broke **Michael Irvin's** 31-year-old record of 840, set in 1985.
- Richards' 19.06 yards per reception were tops among all FBS freshman nationally. Richards' 19.06 yards per reception ranked 18th nationally overall, while his 934 receiving yards led all FBS freshmen nationally. Richards was honored as the ACC Rookie of the Week twice in 2016.
- After the year, Richards was named to the All-ACC Second Team and a Freshman All-American.

## CAROL SOFFER INDOOR PRACTICE FACILITY OPEN FOR BUSINESS

- On August 17, 2018, history was made at the University of Miami, as the Miami Hurricanes practiced inside the Carol Soffer Indoor Practice Facility for the very first time during fall camp.
- In September 2016, Miami announced the largest donation in the history of the athletics department as the lead gift for a state-of-the-art football indoor practice facility. In honor of their mother Carol, Jeffrey Soffer and Carol's other children made a \$14 million commitment towards the facility.
- Head coach Mark Richt pledged \$1 million towards the facility and football alumnus and linebacker great Jon Beason was among those alumni to give to the project. Beason's gift was \$250,000, as Miami alumni and former players teamed up to contribute more than \$2 million for the project.
- Miami had its groundbreaking ceremony for the \$34-plus million facility in May 2017.
- The 81,800-square-foot facility features two field-turf fields - one 90 yards long and an additional 40-yard field directly connecting to the Squillante Strength and Conditioning Center. The facility features interconnectivity to the Hecht Athletic Center and Schwartz Center for Athletic Excellence.

## MIAMI DEBUTED SPECIAL PARLEY UNIFORMS FOR OPENER VS. LSU

- Miami and adidas revealed environmentally-conscious alternate uniforms on Aug. 18 - the first-ever football unis featuring repurposed and upcycled materials, in partnership with Parley For The Oceans.
- Creating a unique look for the Canes, the Miami x Parley A1 uniform features "The U's" home jersey orange colorway that is accompanied by accents that are an ode to the cause to end plastic pollution.
- The jersey sleeve caps and the stripes white pants feature a wave print that fuses Miami's signature dark green with the EQT green colorway that adidas x Parley has become synonymous with.
- Subliminal tonal palm trees on the sides of the jersey pay homage to South Floridian landscapes and the environment that enriches the biodiverse local ecosystem. The literal thread tying the Miami jersey to Parley is continued in a green stitched pattern within the white block numbers.
- Starting August 27, the Miami x Parley A1 uniforms will be auctioned off with the proceeds going to the Rosenstiel School of Marine and Atmospheric Science to launch a fund for educational research.

## RIGHT RECOGNIZES MIAMI PAST, INVITES HONORARY CAPTAINS

- After his return to his alma mater, head coach Mark Richt instituted honorary captains - all of whom are Miami Football alumni - to speak to the team on the Fridays before home games in-season.
- The first honorary captain for the 2018 season was OL Dennis Harrah, who played at UM from 1972-74.
- In 2017, the list of honorary captain list included all-time Miami greats like QB George Mira, DB Bennie Blades, WR Reggie Wayne, DB Ed Reed and DB Antrel Rolle, among others.
- Richt's invitation to honorary captains further extends his dedication to his alma mater and the alumni who have passed through the program; in August of 2017, Richt hosted his first "The U Network" event dedicated to helping Miami Football alumni find jobs in their post-football lives.
- The job fair held on-campus, and added networking, has helped at least four players find work.
- Richt and his wife Katharyn donated \$1 million to the Carol Soffer Football Indoor Practice Facility.
- Hurricanes alumni combined to donate more than \$2 million towards the indoor project, including a \$250,000 donation from former linebacker Jon Beason.



## MIAMI IN YEAR 3 OF 12-YEAR DEAL WITH ADIDAS

- In January of 2015, adidas & the University of Miami announced a landmark 12-year partnership making adidas the official footwear, apparel and accessory brand of UM through June 2027.
- The partnership, which made Miami one of adidas' 13 licensed NCAA programs at the time, began on Sept. 1, 2016 and includes investment, product and uniform development for all 18 UM programs.
- adidas unveiled Miami's 2015 new Primeknit football uniforms at the Fountainbleau Hotel.
- adidas partners hailing from the Miami football include NFL stars David Njoku of the Cleveland Browns, Jimmy Graham of the Seattle Seahawks, as well as Frank Gore of the Miami Dolphins.

# MARK RICHT

HEAD COACH | THIRD SEASON AT MIAMI (18th OVERALL) | 165-59 (.737)

In just two seasons as head coach, Mark Richt has made an indelible impact on his alma mater's football program -- both on and off the field.

Richt posted a 19-7 record over his two seasons, the third best start in Miami history, and a stretch that included a 15-game winning streak -- UM's longest since 2002. The Hurricanes won 10 games in 2017, climbing as high as second in the College Football Playoff rankings. Miami captured the Atlantic Coast Conference's Coastal Division for the first time in its history and earned an invitation to the Capital One Orange Bowl for the first time in 13 years. Richt won 2017 ACC Coach of the Year honors and was also named the 2017 Walter Camp Coach of the Year.

The Hurricanes ranked first in team sacks per game (3.38), and ranked third the nation in turnovers forced in 2017 (31). Junior quarterback Malik Rosier accounted for 31 total touchdowns, breaking Vinny Testaverde's single-season school record, and helping Miami rank 15th in the nation in red zone offense (90.7 percent). Junior defensive back Jaquan Johnson had a breakout season, leading the team with 96 tackles, picking off four passes and earning ACC Defensive Back of the Week honors three times. Overall, 10 Hurricanes earned All-ACC honors, including kicker Michael Badgley, who was named first-team All-ACC.

Off the field, Richt has energized the program, from supporting the fundraising efforts for the Carol Soffer Football Indoor Practice Facility to launching The U Network, which assists former Hurricanes in networking and career placement after their playing careers have concluded. Miami was one of three schools, along with Stanford and Northwestern, to earn the 2016 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Academic Achievement Award. In addition, the Hurricanes ranked first among all FBS programs in 2016 in the NCAA Team Works Helper Helper Community Service Competition, and helped Miami finish first among Division I schools overall in 2018.

Richt was named the University of Miami's 24th head football coach on Dec. 4, 2015. His hiring provided immediate dividends as the Hurricanes posted a 9-4 record in his first season in Coral Gables. Miami then defeated West Virginia, 31-14, in the Russell Athletic Bowl for the program's first bowl victory in 10 years. The Hurricanes were ranked No. 20 in

the final Associated Press poll and No. 23 in the final Amway Coaches Poll -- the program's first season-ending rankings since 2009.

Miami had 10 players earned ACSMA All-ACC honors in 2016, while quarterback Brad Kaaya became Miami's all-time passing yards leader. Freshman wide receiver Ahmmon Richards broke the 31-year-old freshman receiving record at Miami originally set by Michael Irvin, while sophomore running back Mark Walton became the 11th 1,000-yard rusher in program history.

Six Hurricanes were selected in the 2018 NFL Draft. Nine Hurricanes were selected in the 2017 NFL Draft, the most for Miami since 2006, including first-round pick David Njoku to the Cleveland Browns. Richt has had 99 of his players drafted as a head coach, including 14 first-round picks.

Richt, born in Omaha, Neb., and raised in Boca Raton, Fla., returned to his alma mater after leading the University of Georgia football program for the previous 15 years. He compiled a 145-51 overall record and an 85-40 mark in Southeastern Conference play. Georgia won two SEC championships, six SEC East titles and nine bowl games under Richt, and finished the season in the Associated Press Top-10 rankings seven times.

Richt's 164 career wins rank fourth among active FBS head coaches and his .744 winning percentage ranks as the seventh best among current FBS coaches with at least five years of experience. Richt is one of only seven head coaches in SEC history to record four straight 10-win seasons (2002-05).

Richt coached some of the greatest quarterbacks in Georgia history, including David Greene, a four-year starter who left Athens as the then-winningest quarterback in NCAA history with 42 career wins. Aaron Murray, also a four-year starter, is the SEC's all-time leader in passing yards (13,166) and touchdown passes (121). Matthew Stafford threw for 3,459 yards and 25 touchdowns (then a school record) as a junior for the Bulldogs.

Richt is married to the former Katharyn Francis of Tallahassee. The couple has four children -- Jonathan, David, Zach, and Anya. Jon, the Miami quarterbacks coach, was married to the former Anna Cearley in May 2010. They have two daughters, Jady and Zoe.
