NORTH CAROLINA BASKETBALL 2013-14 SEASON IN REVIEW

♦ North Carolina (24-10, 13-5 ACC) tied for third place in the Atlantic Coast Conference, earned its 45th NCAA Tournament bid and advanced to the round of 32 in 2013-14.

ANOTHER 20-WIN SEASON

♦ North Carolina went 24-10 in 2013-14 and posted its 55th 20-win season.

♦ UNC won at least 20 games for the 41st time in the last 44 years (every season since 1970-71 except 2001-02, 2002-03 and 2003-04).

♦ The 2013-14 season marked Carolina's 10th 20-win season in a row under head coach **Roy Williams**, who has won at least 20 games 24 times in his 26 seasons as a head coach (and won 19 in the other two years).

♦ Carolina won at least 20 games for an NCAA-record 31 consecutive seasons from 1970-71 to 2000-01.

ALL-AMERICA HONORS FOR MARCUS PAIGE

♦ Sophomore guard **Marcus Paige** earned second-team All-America honors from the Sporting News after also being named first-team All-ACC and the ACC's Most Improved Player for the 2013-14 season.

♦ At 6-foot-1, Paige is the shortest player since **Larry Brown** (5-foot-11) in **Dean Smith's**

first season as UNC head coach (1961-62) to lead Carolina in scoring.

♦ Paige is the shortest leading scorer ever on a **Roy Williams**-coached team (the former record holder was 6-foot-2 Terry Brown on the 1990-91 Kansas team. Next-shortest, by the way, is former Tar Heel assistant coach and current UAB head coach **Jerod Haase** (6-foot-3) in 1994-95.

♦ Paige made 58.9 percent of Carolina's three-pointers in 2013-14, the second-highest figure in UNC history. The record share of made three-pointers at Carolina is **Hubert Davis** (59.0 percent) in 1991-92.

PAIGE AN ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA

♦ Sophomore guard **Marcus Paige** also was a standout in the classroom, earning second-team Capital One Academic All-America honors from the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA).

♦ Paige, a native of Marion, Iowa, is majoring in journalism and mass communications.

♦ Paige was the only ACC player recognized this year among the first-, second- or third-team Academic All-Americas in men's basketball.

♦ First-team honorees included Brayden Carlson (South Dakota State), Aaron Craft (Ohio State), Drew Crawford (Northwestern), Melvin Ejim (Iowa State) and J.J. Mann (Belmont).

◆ Jordan Dykstra (South Dakota State), Holton Hunsaker (Utah Valley), Dennis Ogbe (Tennessee Tech) and Kendrick Perry (Youngstown State) joined Paige on the second team.

◆ Paige was the only sophomore on the first three teams (10 seniors, two grad students, two juniors and Paige).

◆ Tyler Zeller was the most recent Tar Heel to earn Academic All-America honors. Zeller was a first-team selection in both 2011 and 2012. He was the overall Academic All-America of the Year as a senior in 2012 when he also earned ACC Player of the Year honors.

ALL-ACC HONORS

◆ Point guard **Marcus Paige** earned first-team All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors and was selected as the league's Most Improved Player in voting by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association and the head coaches.

◆ Forward **James Michael McAdoo** was named second-team All-ACC by the media and third team by the coaches.

◆ Sophomore forward **J.P. Tokoto** was selected to the All-Defensive team by both the media and the coaches.

◆ Forward **Kennedy Meeks** was voted to the All-Freshman team by both the media and coaches.

◆ Paige, a sophomore from Marion, Iowa, is the first ever recipient of the ACC's Most Improved Player award. He becomes the 46th Tar Heel to earn first-team All-ACC honors and marks the 73rd time a UNC player has made the first team. He is the first UNC sophomore point guard to make the first team since Phil Ford in

1976. CoSIDA recently named Paige a second-team Academic All-America.

◆ The media selected McAdoo to the All-ACC second-team for the second consecutive year. Paige's and McAdoo's selection marks the fourth straight year that at least two Tar Heels earned All-ACC honors. The junior from Norfolk, Va., leads UNC in rebounding at 6.6 per contest and is the team's second-leading scorer at 14.2 a game.

◆ Tokoto is the first Tar Heel to earn All-Defensive team honors since John Henson in 2011 and 2012.

◆ Meeks is the 19th Tar Heel to earn All-Freshman honors since the team was first selected in 1993.

PAIGE FINALIST FOR COUSY AWARD

◆ Sophomore **Marcus Paige** was among six finalists for the 2014 Bob Cousy Award, given annually to the nation's top point guard.

◆ Shabazz Napier of Connecticut won the award for 2014.

◆ Former Tar Heels **Raymond Felton** (2005), **Ty Lawson** (2009) and **Kendall Marshall** (2012) are among the previous winners of the award. Carolina is the only school with three Cousy Award winners.

CAROLINA'S NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

◆ North Carolina made its 45th NCAA Tournament appearance in 2014, grabbing the No. 6 seed in the East Regional and winning its opening game to advance to the round of 32 (third round).

◆ The 2014 Tar Heels were in the NCAA field for the 10th time in 11 years under head coach **Roy Williams**. Williams has made 24 NCAA Tournament appearances in 26 seasons as a head coach.

◆ Williams has led Carolina to a 29-8 (.784) record in the NCAA Tournament.

◆ The Tar Heels are tied for the third-most

NCAA titles by a program in history. UCLA has 11 NCAA championships, Kentucky has eight and UNC and Indiana have five.

◆ The Tar Heels are 21-6 in NCAA Tournament play in their last seven appearances (2007-08-09-11-12-13-14), advancing to the Elite Eight in 2007, 2011 and 2012, the Final Four in 2008 and winning the title in 2009.

UNC'S NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY IN SAN ANTONIO

◆ Carolina made its third NCAA Tournament appearance in San Antonio and is now 1-3 in NCAA play in the city after going 1-1 in 2014.

◆ The Tar Heels lost in the 1998 Final Four to Utah and in the 2008 Final Four to Kansas. Both of those games were played in the Alamodome.

◆ UNC is 1-1 in the AT&T Center, beating Providence and losing to Iowa State in 2014.

110 NCAA TOURNAMENT WINS

◆ UNC is 110-43 in NCAA Tournament games. The 110 wins rank second in NCAA Tournament history behind Kentucky's 116.

CAROLINA VS. THE 2014 NCAA FIELD

◆ Carolina played 14 games this season against 11 teams that were part of the 2014 NCAA Tournament field of 68. The Tar Heels went 8-6 in those games.

◆ Carolina picked up eight wins against 2014

◆ UNC had six losses to 2014 NCAA teams: No. 1 seed Virginia, No. 3 seed Duke, No. 3 seed Syracuse, No. 3 seed Iowa State, No. 6 seed Pitt and No. 7 seed Texas.

ROY WILLIAMS IN NCAA PLAY

◆ Carolina is 29-8 (.784) in 10 NCAA Tournament appearances under head coach **Roy Williams**.

◆ Williams has 63 all-time NCAA Tournament wins, second among all active coaches and third all-time (Duke's Mike Krzyzewski has 82 and **Dean Smith** had 65 at UNC).

◆ Williams' Tournament winning percentage of .741 (63-22) is fourth among active coaches and fifth all-time.

◆ Williams made his 24th NCAA Tournament appearance in the last 25 years in 2014. He took 20 teams in a row to the Tournament prior to missing the NCAA field in 2010. The first 14 of Williams' 24 NCAA appearances were at Kansas and the last 10 have been at Carolina.

◆ Williams' 20 straight NCAA appearances (1990-2009) was the second-longest streak in NCAA history, trailing only the 23 in a row by Carolina's **Dean Smith** (1975-97).

◆ Williams has coached in 85 NCAA Tournamen-

ment games, the third-most all-time behind Mike Krzyzewski (108) and **Dean Smith** (92).

24 STRAIGHT NCAA TOURNAMENT APPEARANCES WITH A WIN FOR WILLIAMS

◆ **Roy Williams** has won at least one game in each of his 24 NCAA Tournament appearances.

◆ Williams' 20 consecutive years with at least one NCAA Tournament victory from 1990-2009 are an NCAA record. Former UNC coach **Dean Smith** is second with 17.

CAROLINA IN THE EARLY ROUNDS

◆ Carolina has won at least one game in each of its last 12 NCAA Tournament appearances since a first-round loss to Weber State in 1999.

◆ That loss to Weber State in 1999 marked the only time in its last 29 NCAA Tournament appearances that Carolina has failed to win at least one Tournament game (since a second-round loss to Texas A&M after a first-round bye in 1980).

TAR HEELS AT THEIR BEST VS. RANKED FOES

◆ The Tar Heels were 5-3 in 2013-14 against teams ranked in the Associated Press poll.

◆ Carolina beat No. 1 Michigan State, No. 3 Louisville, No. 5 Duke, No. 11 Kentucky and No. 25 Pitt in 2013-14.

◆ The Tar Heels lost three times to ranked foes in 2013-14: at No. 2 Syracuse, at No. 4 Duke and to No. 9 Iowa State in the NCAA Tournament in San Antonio.

◆ Carolina is the first team to beat the top four teams in the preseason AP poll since the AP began releasing a pre-season poll in 1961-62. The Tar Heels have beaten pre-season No. 1 Kentucky, No. 2 Michigan State, No. 3 Louisville and No. 4 Duke.

◆ Carolina is the first squad to defeat a top-ranked team and the defending NCAA champion in non-conference games during the same regular season since UCLA in 1986-87.

IN THE SECOND HALF OF ACC PLAY

◆ Carolina went 8-1 after the midway point of Atlantic Coast Conference play this season.

◆ The Tar Heels are 70-20 (.778) in the second half of ACC play in 11 seasons under head coach **Roy Williams**.

◆ Carolina went 8-0 in the second half of ACC play in 2007-08, 8-1 in 2013-14 and was 7-1 in the second half five times (during the 2004-05, 2005-06, 2008-09, 2010-11 and 2011-12 seasons). The Tar Heels also went 6-3 in 2012-13, 5-3 in 2003-04 and 2006-07 and 3-5 in 2009-10.

DOUBLE-DIGIT ACC WINS

◆ Carolina's went 13-5 in ACC play in 2013-14.

◆ Carolina has won 13 or more ACC games 12 times (1956-57, 1983-84, 1986-87, 1992-93, 1997-98, 2000-01, 2004-05, 2007-08, 2008-09, 2010-11, 2011-12 and 2013-14)

◆ Carolina has six 13-win ACC seasons under Williams (2004-05, 2007-08, 2008-09, 2010-11, 2011-12 and 2013-14).

◆ The school record for ACC wins in a season is 14, set on eight occasions — 1956-57 (14-0), 1983-84 (14-0), 1986-87 (14-0), 1992-93 (14-2), 2004-05 (14-2), 2007-08 (14-2), 2010-11 (14-2) and 2011-12 (14-2). Four of the eight 14-win ACC seasons in school history have come under head coach **Roy Williams**.

◆ The Tar Heels have posted double-digit ACC wins 38 times overall and nine times in the last 10 years under Williams.

◆ No other ACC school has as many 10-win ACC seasons as Carolina. Duke is second with 32.

12-GAME WINNING STREAK

◆ Carolina won 12 games in a row prior to losing the regular season finale at Duke on March 8. The 12-game run was UNC's longest winning streak since winning 13 in a row to begin the 2008-09 season.

◆ The 12-game winning streak came entirely against ACC opponents and was Carolina's longest regular season ACC winning streak since its perfect, 14-0 season in 1986-87.

◆ Carolina went 8-0 in the month of February, the fifth time in the last 50 years the Tar Heels went undefeated in February (also 1965, 1976, 1977 and 1997).

ON THE ROAD IN ACC PLAY

◆ The Tar Heels have proven to be one of the nation's top road teams in more than a decade under the tutelage of head coach **Roy Williams**.

◆ Williams's teams are 58-32 on the road in ACC play in 11 seasons, including a 5-4 mark this season (for UNC's eighth above-.500 road record in 11 years under Williams).

◆ Williams' ACC road winning percentage of .644 is second-best in ACC history behind Vic Bubas of Duke (.667 from 1960-69). **Frank McGuire** of UNC and South Carolina is third at .618.

◆ This season marks UNC's 37th winning road record in 61 ACC seasons.

◆ Under Williams, UNC has gone 6-2 on the road in the ACC in 2004-05, 7-1 in 2005-06, 8-0 in 2007-08, 6-2 in 2008-09, 6-2 in 2010-11, 7-1 in 2011-12, 5-4 in 2012-13 and 5-4 in 2013-14.

SHOOTING 50 PERCENT UNDER WILLIAMS

◆ The Tar Heels shot 59.6 percent from the floor in the March 8 loss at Duke, marking their first loss under head coach **Roy Williams** when shooting 50.0 percent or better.

◆ Carolina is 142-1 in 11 seasons under Williams when shooting at least 50.0 percent from the floor.

OVER 2,100 WINS

◆ The win over UNC Wilmington on Dec. 31 was victory number 2,100 in Carolina history.

◆ UNC has 2,114 all-time wins entering the 2014-15 season.

◆ The Tar Heels are the third school in NCAA history with at least 2,100 wins (along with Kentucky and Kansas).

AT THE FREE THROW LINE

◆ Carolina's team free throw percentage for 2013-14 was .626, the lowest figure in program history.

◆ Only once previously in school history had the Tar Heels hit less than 65 percent of their free throws as a team (.629 in 1953-54). The lowest figure in 10 previous years under **Roy Williams** was .653 in 2009-10.

PAIGE SHOULDERED THE LOAD FROM OUTSIDE

◆ Sophomore **Marcus Paige** made 86 of Carolina's 146 three-point field goals in 2013-14 (58.9 percent). That is the second-highest percentage of UNC's three-pointers by a single player in school history.

◆ The only two previous seasons in UNC annals that one player had made at least 50 percent of the Tar Heels' three-pointers were 1991-92 (when **Hubert Davis** hit 85 of UNC's 144 threes for 59.0 percent) and 1996-97 (when **Shammond Williams** hit 95 of UNC's 188 threes for 50.5 percent).

WILLIAMS GETS WIN No. 300 AT UNC

◆ Head coach **Roy Williams** won his 300th game as an ACC head coach on Feb. 17 at Florida State.

◆ Williams is 306-89 (.775) through 11 seasons at UNC.

◆ Williams won his 300th ACC game in fewer games than any coach in conference history (in his 386th game as an ACC head coach).

◆ The fastest coach to 300 wins in ACC history (as an ACC head coach) had been **Dean Smith** in 406 games. Duke's Mike Krzyzewski did so in 412 games.

ANTAWN JAMISON SCORES 20,000TH POINT

◆ Former Tar Heel forward **Antawn Jamison** reached the 20,000-point threshold in his NBA career on Dec. 12.

◆ Carolina is the second school in the nation to have three former players score 20,000 points in NBA history with Jamison, **Michael Jordan** (32,292) and **Vince Carter** (active). Houston is the other school with Elvin Hayes (27,313), Hakeem Olajuwon (26,946) and Clyde Drexler (22,195).

◆ Carter/Jamison and Drexler/Olajuwon are the only pairs of college teammates to score 20,000 NBA points.

◆ Jamison is the 39th NBA player in history to reach 20,000 career points. Jordan is third all-time and Carter is 27th.

DEAN SMITH AWARDED PRESIDENTIAL MEDAL OF FREEDOM

◆ President Barack Obama presented the 2013 Presidential Medal of Freedom on Nov. 20 at the White House to a group that included former UNC men's basketball coach **Dean Smith**, President Bill Clinton, Oprah Winfrey and 13 others such as Chicago Cub Hall of Famer Ernie Banks, Washington Post editor Ben Bradlee, Senators Daniel Inouye and Richard Lugar, entertainer Loretta Lynn and astronaut Sally Ride.

BERRY, JACKSON & PINSON SIGN WITH UNC

◆ High school seniors **Joel Berry**, **Justin Jackson** and **Theo Pinson** signed National Letters of Intent on Nov. 13 to attend the University of North Carolina and play men's basketball beginning in the 2014-15 season.

◆ "We are ecstatic that these three young men and their families have decided to join our

"He is a true quarterback on the floor, but he has the ability to score as well. He's a leader and an excellent student. His teammates enjoy playing alongside him."

◆ Jackson is a 6-8 wing from Tomball, Texas. He plays for Coach Mike Decker for the Homeschool Christian Youth. "Justin has tremendous ability, but is getting better and better," says Williams. "He's 6-8 with perimeter skills. He performed well last summer against tough competition, including at USA Basketball events. He is slender at this point, but will be able to get stronger and can add a great deal to his body. But he has wonderful skills and is a great student."

◆ Pinson is a 6-6 wing from Greensboro, N.C. He plays for Coach Keith Gatlin at Wesleyan Christian Academy in High Point, N.C. "Theo's versatility is a big part of his game," says Williams. "He can do almost everything on the court and do it well. He can handle the ball,

◆ Thirteen of those 16 Tar Heels played for **Roy Williams**, who has coached 25 NBA first-round picks and 34 overall NBA players in 25 seasons as a head coach.

◆ The list of 16 Tar Heels in the NBA includes **Kendall Marshall**, a 2012 first-round pick who was traded to Washington and waived on Nov. 1, 2013. Marshall signed with the Delaware 87ers of the NBDL in the first week of December, then signed with the Los Angeles Lakers on Dec. 20 and made his Laker debut the next day.

◆ First-round pick **Reggie Bullock**, a rookie with the Los Angeles Clippers, is the 106th UNC player selected in the NBA Draft.

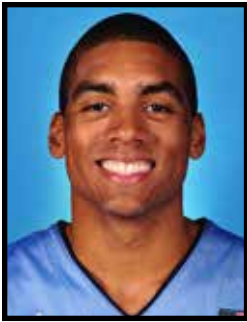
